RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - Twenty-seven years has gone by in a flash! The Cordova Community Food Locker first opened its doors on April 1, 1987.

Cordova Community Food Locker has distributed more than 15,506,424 meals to those in need in the community. This has been possible because of the support of many caring individuals and organizations including Rancho Cordova's local churches; local service clubs like the Kiwanis, Rotary, Moose, and many others; the Rancho Cordova City Government; and local businesses. Rancho Cordova's community has provided food, paper and plastic bags (not a little thing, always in need), funding and volunteers.

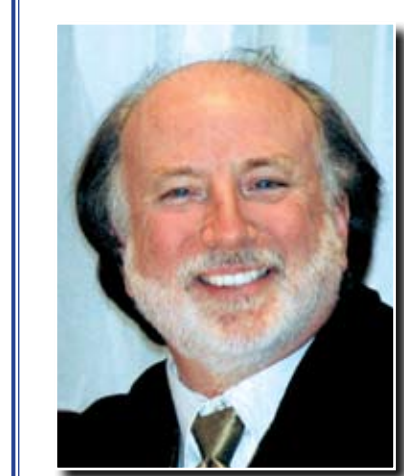

Teaching, Learning ...

are quite a few people who will remember him because he taught in Mitchell Middle, Rancho Cordova Elementary, and Cordova Gardens Elementary Schools. There should always be a way to make a space better than when you found it.

Teaching and learning – or is it learning and teaching? Sort of like which came first: the chicken or the egg? The answer of course is "I don't know." If you ask a teacher, they will always say they learn from their students while they are teaching them. And while students learn at different paces, some sooner than others, what I learned in the past still holds true. On the average, children learn to read from kindergarten to third grade (K-3); then from fourth grade on, they read to learn.

I hope California Legislators and the Governor learned something this year when they were able to compromise and passed the water bond. It will serve them and the people of California well if they did. Our children can learn from their teachers and from each other if they are taught early in life to listen. Little kids learn early in life that there are things they like and are willing to argue and/or fight for it, but they will benefit as they grow older if they are able to give as well as to get.

I received a nice email from Bonnie Sato about my column in which I talked about getting our children involved in helping clean up our schools, neighborhoods and our City. Her husband, David Sato, was a teacher in Rancho Cordova for 40 years and he had a slogan, "Leave the space better than you found it," which he passed on to his students. He followed that slogan wherever he went. There

or California American Water. Now the State is demanding conservation by everyone. Going on with learning, I have read some of Michael Josephson's articles in his "CHARACTER COUNTS!" where he talks about teaching our children. Henry Adams said, "Teachers affect all eternity." Sadly, the way we select and reward schoolteachers and coaches shows how much we undervalue their crucial role in shaping the character and destiny of our children. But even worse, we tend to forget that the first and by far the most important teachers are those engaged in parenting . . . Yes it's important to help kids become smart and competent, but as Teddy Roosevelt said, "To educate a person in the mind but not the morals is to educate a menace to society." Josephson continues that "parents need to be attentive and dedicated to assuring that their children have the tools to lead truly good lives, lives with purpose and meaning and value. That means we need to teach, enforce, advocate, and model the best we want our children to be."

The drought is affecting many plants, trees, and people in a very negative way. Last week's Grapevine INDEPENDENT front page headline was "Water Rules Take Effect". Those rules being the ones that were implemented by the State Water Resources Control Board: no washing down the driveway, no using a hose if it doesn't have a shut-off nozzle, no watering landscapes if water runs into the gutter, and no water for fountains unless the water is recirculated. So now, even though we were asked by some of our water purveyors to cut our water usage down 20%, there weren't demands to do so by the Golden State Water Company

When was the last time you heard a reporter, an elected official, or anyone else who is able to get a microphone to their lips say anything about parents have the first and most important job in the lives of our children. It is usually the teacher's fault or the school district's fault, or the State's fault because they didn't put more money in the schools. Parents, who are THE FIRST and MOST IMPORTANT TEACHERS, need to be reminded that they are the most responsible for the well-being of their children. ★

Congressman Ami Bera Addresses the Rancho Cordova Chamber of Commerce

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - On Friday, August 15th, Congressman Ami Bera spoke to the members of the Rancho Cordova Chamber of Commerce. Bera has his district office in Rancho Cordova which he praised for its development and held out as an example for the region to follow: "Rancho Cordova developed as a great place to live and a great place to work. ... There are more people driving here to work every day than there are leaving. This is a model of how we should work as a region."

Bera fielded questions about Alzheimer's, college tuition fees, and creating jobs for college graduates. He also spoke about the success of his No Budget No Pay act and his current efforts to make it permanent. He said if that's what's required to get the people's duly elected representatives to do their constitutional duty, then it has to happen.

Congressman Bera also talked about the lessons he learned while growing up: the American values of service and giving back to the next generation. He praised the quality of his own education in the

California public school system, which he credited with being the best in the country if not the world. His diverse education included metal shop and woodshop, the kinds of classes that are missing from most schools today because they're not part of the testing culture of the current educational system. Because of that, local companies can't always find the skilled employees they need; kids aren't graduating high

school with diverse skills like they used to. "We have to get back to that context where there are multiple career paths."

Bera wants this generation to leave more, not less, to the next generation. He said we've got to create the framework of opportunity that allows people to get ahead if they work for it; it's the American Dream. "We have to get back to sense of who we are." ★

Repeat Nuisance Service Call Solution Sought by City

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - Some local businesses and homeowners could face hefty fines if the Rancho Cordova City Council adopts a new law outlining how many service calls to the city for their property would be considered a nuisance, including animal and code violations.

The proposed ordinance, Article 16 of No. 22-2014, would charge property owners with repeat nuisance service call fees if they exceed a set limit of calls to the city for various code violations within a certain time frame. While property owners could be fined for excessive calls to their property related to gambling, gang activity, and use of firearms, city staff at an August 18th city council meeting said that valid calls for medical emergencies, welfare checks, and domestic violence would not be counted.

According to a report prepared by city staff, last year several properties accumulated between 200 to more than 400 calls to the police, including one single-family home with 37 calls. While people may be cited for criminal or nuisance conduct, currently there is no legal recourse for the city to recover costs for multiple calls to a single property.

Staff said that the service calls would be reviewed first

to determine if they qualify as excessive. If they were found to be excessive, the property owner could be required to meet with a city representative to identify solutions before implementing fines. Vice Mayor Robert McGarvey noted that sometimes calls to a property were false alarms and that those need to be separated from actual nuisance calls.

"If it's people who are causing the problems that's completely different," McGarvey said.

Councilmember David Sander, who first brought the proposal to the Growing Strong Neighborhoods Committee, said the ordinance would ease up the financial burden that taxpayers face when one property owner is not in compliance with the law.

"That is every taxpayer subsidizing a bad tenant," Sander said. "Just turn up the fines and you get their attention."

Local resident and city council candidate James Feci expressed concerns during public comment about the potential leeway for future city council members to impose excessive fees on residents since the ordinance does not have a specific base fee for violations.

"I'm really on the fence on this," Feci said. "It seems very vague, the set amount. You aren't going to be here forever. Should there be another perspective on this?"

The council is expected to have a final vote on the ordinance at their next regular meeting scheduled Sept. 2nd. ★

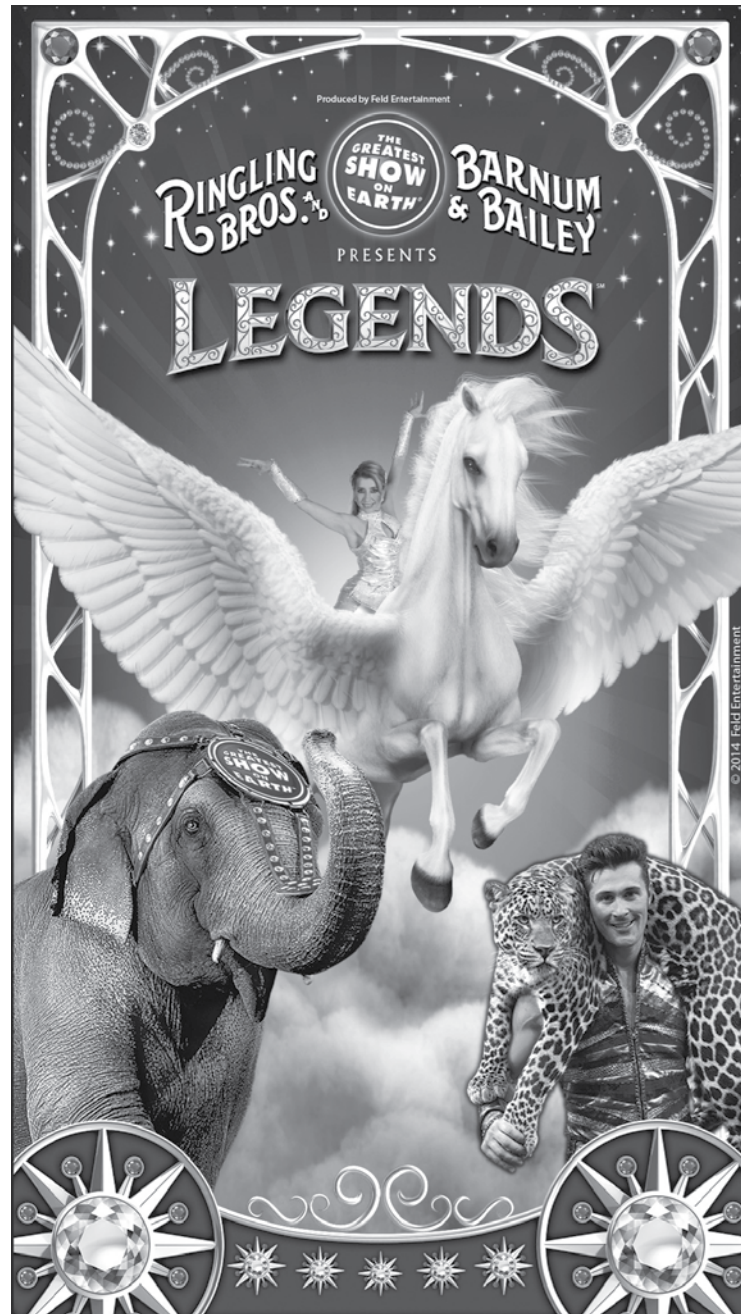

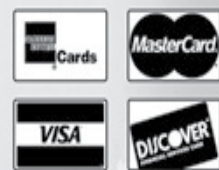

CA Water Bond Won't Create New Water

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - Food & Water Watch is disappointed with the \$7.5 billion water bond passed by the State Legislature and Governor Brown, now slated for the November ballot. While this bond will not solve California's water problems, it will stick taxpayers with serious debt. The bond prioritizes \$2.7 billion of taxpayer dollars on wasteful dam projects: spending money to pour more concrete won't create a drop

of new water or increase water use efficiency. An investment in dams is an investment in private interests, not in the public interest.

"In addition, the bond would funnel taxpayer money to purchase more water for big agriculture interests on the west side of the San Joaquin Valley where corporations are exporting water-intensive crops grown on toxic soil. Meanwhile, the Brown administration has yet to take serious action to promote

water efficiency and stop the over-pumping of our groundwater.

This bond measure fails to respond to the current drought and relies on solutions from the last century.x

Clearing the Confusion

I want to set things straight about long term care and Medi-Cal benefits for payment of Long Term Care.

Despite a widespread misconception about long term care, there is no such thing as a State Nursing Home and there is no such thing as a State Medi-Cal Nursing Home and we do not relegate our aging seniors to the backroom of some forgotten County hospital. Long Term Care is a fully funded Federal program called Medi-Caid (Medi-Cal in California) and it is not funded with diminishing State funds. It is a Federal Program administered by the states and it is funded largely by the Federal Government although there is a State component to its cost.

Long Term Care is for persons who simply cannot care for themselves and need to be residing in a Skilled Nursing Center where a registered nurse is on duty 24 hours a day; no budget cut will ever be passed to put any of these people out on the street.

The truth is all Nursing Homes are privately owned with no State or County ownership and over 92% of them are in the Medi-Caid, (Medi-Cal) program. A person receiving Medi-Cal benefits may be sharing a room with a privately paying patient where the private pay rate is anywhere from \$7,000.00 to \$9,500.00 or more per month. By Federal Law,

the care of a person receiving Medi-Cal payment for benefits cannot be less than the care given to anyone else, including the private pay patients.

And you do not have to run out of money to qualify for Medi-Cal benefits. I repeat, you do not have to run out of money to qualify for Medi-Cal benefits. You do not have to be indigent to qualify for these benefits. But you do have to plan ahead if you want to qualify for benefits and protect your assets.

Although the Department of Health Services will not tell you how, and most financial advisors do not know how, it is possible to plan ahead. Even if your spouse, your mom or dad or grandparent one is close to needing long term care, or even in long term care, it is possible to qualify for long term care Medi-Cal benefits with proper actions.

A Trust won't do it; a divorce won't do it; just giving your assets away won't do it, nor will trying to build up enough savings to pay for it. Even long term care insurance doesn't cover it all, if at all.

But, proper planning can solve the long term care problem just as proper planning can solve the "avoid probate" problem.

To avoid Court probate, people are planning ahead with revocable Trusts. By planning ahead they avoid the high cost

of Probate Court, and avoid the long delays of Probate Court.

Planning ahead for long term Medi-Cal benefits care can also bring great benefits:

1. Between husband and wife, it can qualify one for long term care benefits and protect family home and assets from after-death claims.
2. As a single person, it can qualify that person for long term care Medi-Cal benefits and protect the family home and most of the assets from after-death claims.

Remember, there is no such thing as a State or County Medi-Cal home or any kind of a Medi-Cal home at all. Medi-Cal beneficiaries reside side by side with all other residents of a nursing home and discrimination of any kind is totally illegal and not practiced.

Planning ahead is not simple because the Medi-Cal regulations are complex and sometimes even a little hard to believe. However with planning, a healthy spouse does not need to become impoverished because the other spouse needs nursing home care and no one needs lose their home to after death Medi-Cal long term care claims.

The super-sub for the Pirates has been a season saver in Pittsburgh. The All-Star has made 44 starts in the outfield, 21 at third, 13 at second and three at short. He's also started up and down the lineup, batting everywhere but cleanup, eighth and ninth.
