City Places Revenue Measure on November Ballot

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - The Rancho Cordova City Council voted Monday night to place a local ½ cent sales tax measure on the November 2014 ballot for voters' consideration. If approved by voters, the measure would provide additional local funds to address community priorities.

A recently commissioned independent survey of Rancho Cordova residents shows as much as 67.9% are interested in a local revenue measure to enhance City services, facilities, and programs – well above the 50% needed for passage.

“Well-maintained streets, quality parks, and neighborhood safety are vitally important to enhancing our community’s character and property values,” said Rancho Cordova City Manager Brian Nakamura. “The City has had a balanced budget for 11 years. A local revenue measure would allow us to address community priorities quicker and in a significant way.”

Every Rancho Cordova household received a Community Feedback Survey to gather information about their priorities for the community.

Over the past several months, we have received extensive input from Rancho Cordova residents about what community services are important to them,” said Nakamura. “The City has received over 700 Community Feedback Surveys from the community.”

Priorities identified by the community include, among others: Increasing neighborhood police

Results from the 41st Annual Eppie's Great Race

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - Sacramento's Jim Michaels was both the fastest Overall, and the fastest Iron Man 50+ Division winner of the 41st Annual Eppie's Great Race (EGR) on Saturday, July 19, 2014, with a time of 1:55:25. Fair Oaks' Melanie Cleland won her second consecutive, Overall EGR Iron Woman title, as well as the Iron Woman 40+ Division, with an overall time of 2:01:32. And the Paul A. Garcia Open Division Relay Team winner was also the overall fastest Relay Team winner: Team “Don't Look Back,” crossed the Finish Line with an overall time of 1:36:18.

The 41st annual EGR, known as “The World's Oldest Triathlon,” was the first EGR since Eppie Johnson's passing in 2013. The late founder's bigger-than-life presence was acknowledged and felt prominently in Saturday's annual running, biking, and paddling event. Participants gathered at the Starting Line, cheering in his honor and bowing their heads in his memory during the Benediction just moments prior to the Race's start. Many participants then shouted Eppie's name and applauded when the starting horn was sounded, first at 7:58 a.m. for the Adapted Division, and then again at 8 a.m. for all other participants, by Eppie's

Grandchildren, E.J. and Athena Johnson.

Throughout and following the event, EGR participants gathered and had their photos taken next to Eppie's old, personal, kayak, memorial display of photos, and past Eppie's Great Race memorabilia collected by the beloved, late EGR Founder. Eppie's children, George Johnson (Eppie's Great Race Foundation Chairman) and Lisa Mangels, as well as Eppie's Grandchildren Alex, E.J. and Athena, all had leadership roles in this year's race, demonstrating to the 3,600+ participants, fans, and volunteers that the Johnson Family is committed to carrying on the EGR tradition in perpetuity.

“People have asked my sister and I how we plan to memorialize my Dad now that he's gone,” shared George Johnson,

The winner of the Youth award was Alex Stamas, who volunteers with the Leukemia & Lymphoma Society (LLS). Gloria Torres, an LLS volunteer and outreach and education coordinator at La Familia Counseling Center, Inc., accepted the award on Alex's behalf as he could not be present at the awards ceremony. Among Alex's accomplishments was that he won the LLS Man of the Year award by raising over \$125,000 on his own, more funds than any other team in the competition. As the winner of the Outstanding Youth Volunteer award, Alex will

receive the Margaret Einspahr \$500 scholarship.

Rancho Cordova Wins Award for Finance Report

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - The City of Rancho Cordova has received a Certificate of Achievement for Excellence in Financial Reporting from the Government Finance Officers Association (GFOA) for its 2014 comprehensive annual financial report (CAFR). The award is the highest form of recognition in the area of governmental accounting and financial reporting.

The GFOA judging panel said that Rancho Cordova's CAFR demonstrated a constructive "spirit of full disclosure" to clearly communicate its financial story and motivate potential users and user groups to read the CAFR.

The CAFR is the City's financial statements plus additional information that is not included in the basic financial reports. Patty Lohse, Rancho Cordova's Senior Accountant, coordinated this year's CAFR.

GFOA is a non-profit professional association that serves about 17,500 government finance professionals. Rancho Cordova has won this award every year since 2008. The judging panel included selected members of the GFOA professional staff and Special Review Committee, including individuals with expertise in public-sector financial reporting, financial statement preparers, independent auditors, academics, and other finance professionals.

There is a gentleman who is retired and picks up trash up along White Rock Road and its side streets because he feels it is his City. On Monday, I stopped and thanked a nice lady who was walking her dog on Zinfandel Drive and at the same time was picking up loose trash and litter that was trapped in the weeds next to the fences. She didn't have to do that but she feels it is her City, too. The week before July 4th, volunteers went along Coloma Road to pick up trash. Those volunteers were making sure that the thousands of people who would watch the 5K run and then enjoy the parade, wouldn't have to see rubbish and refuse along the side of the road because no one cared. These wonderful people make the time

to pick up a little bit of this and a little bit of that and it really makes a huge difference.

Another little bit of this and a little bit of that is talking about the little pot holes and chuck holes on Sunrise Boulevard. When you combine all the little bits of the road that has been eroding for years on Sunrise Boulevard, those little bits have combined to make Sunrise Boulevard feel like the beginning of the Indiana Jones ride at Disneyland. The holes are hard enough on cars and trucks but for motorcycles and bicycles, it is becoming very close to an unsafe place to ride. I've been tossed from a bicycle after hitting gravel or a pot hole in the road. We are fortunate that our Public Works Director, Cyrus Abhar, was able to receive the \$2 million grant that will be used to begin and finish our City's part of repairing and resurfacing Sunrise Boulevard.

At times, there are little bits of this and that which are very important to people because that is all they have. The economy is slowly recovering from what was almost another Great Depression. More people lost their homes and jobs during that 2007 to 2012 period of time since the Great Depression. That is why I said that at times the little things a person is able to keep or save is very important. The movie

"Fiddler on the Roof" had "a little bit of this, a little bit of that" words in them when a Tsarist Russian Jewish peasant, Tevye, talked about the few things they had (along with their traditions). Fortunately that kind of turmoil didn't happen here but for the people who had to walk away from their homes, it was a hard time . . . and it may still be.

We have many little material things that are very important to us at the time we collect them. And I know that if I have kept something and also write something about it, then in the future when it suddenly shows up when I'm looking for something else, its meaning will come back to me. I am looking out the window here at City Hall and am reminded of a cool wind that blew through when I was growing up. It was a breeze that cooled that hot and humid summer day in the Ohio Valley. It changed everything around me from what I was used to in the summer and brought that summer day up to a higher octave of enjoyment like music. Usually it is something material, but the little bits of this or that can also be a feeling like the people of Rancho Cordova continue to offer to each other. ★

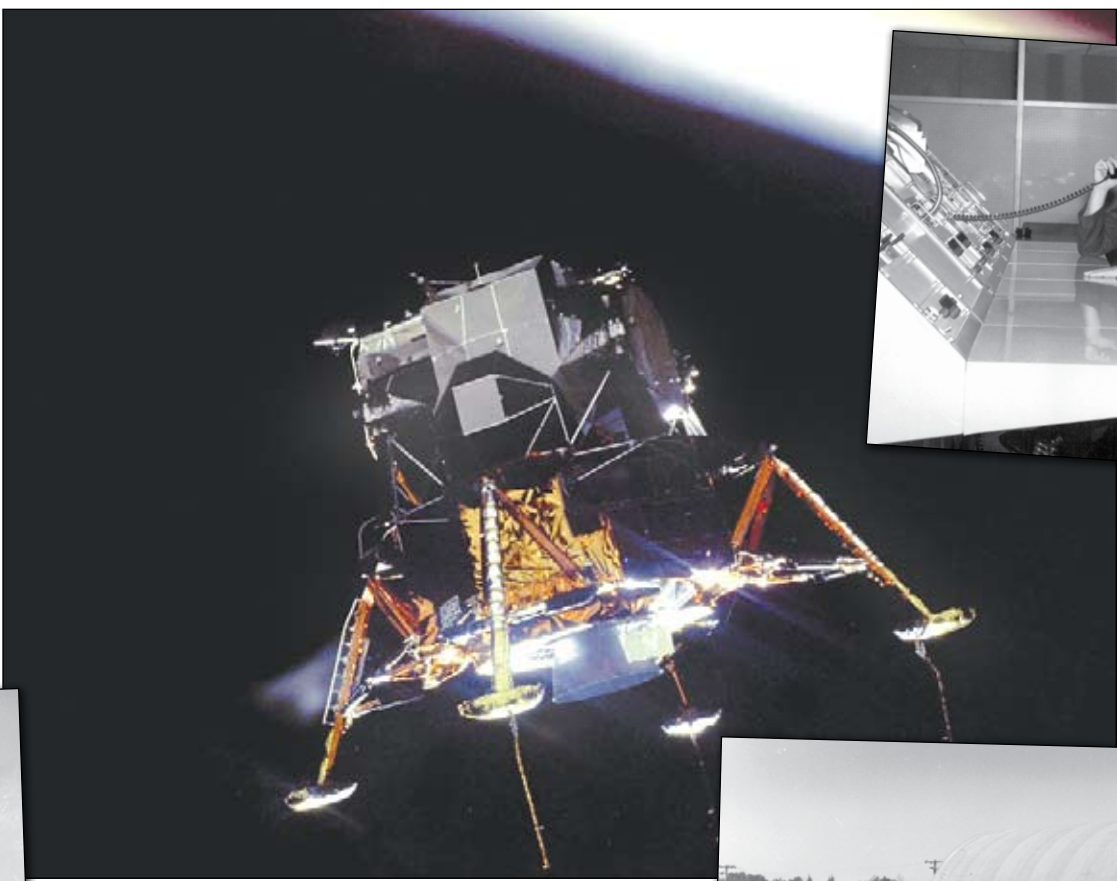

Our Connection to the Moon Landing, 1969

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - July 20th marked the 45th anniversary of the United States landing on the moon; it is important to remember the role Sacramento County played in that historic event. A part of the Saturn V Rocket that NASA launched in 1969, sending astronaut Neil Armstrong on his journey, was initially tested in Sacramento, California before being sent to Florida for launch into space. The Douglas Aircraft Company tested the third stage of the rocket known as S-IVB at its test site, the Douglas Aircraft Sacramento Test Facility, in

what is now Rancho Cordova at Sunrise Boulevard and Douglas Road. Testing of the S-IVB began in 1963 and was a significant component of the Saturn V Rocket in the future moon missions. NASA awarded the Douglas Aircraft Company the contract for the Saturn S-IVB lunar vehicle in 1963. This vehicle was needed to support the Saturn 1 program development of the Saturn V Launch Vehicle. The S-IVB was 21 feet in diameter and 59 feet in length, and would be the third stage of the giant Saturn 1B vehicle with a payload capacity of 37,000 pounds. The Saturn 1 vehicle's primary objective was to develop a large two-stage vehicle for use in earth

orbit operations. The S-IVB was a single stage liquid propellant (liquid oxygen and hydrogen) vehicle with a Rocketdyne 233,000 pound thrust engine capable of restarting in outer space. The S-IVB was manufactured at the Douglas Aircraft facility in Huntington Beach, California and shipped to the Sacramento Test facility by barge up the Sacramento River to a dock at Hood and then transported by back roads to the test facility. Wernher Von Braun, the chief architect of the Saturn V launch vehicle, visited the Sacramento Test Facility on multiple occasions.

The S-IVB stages travelled from the Bay Area up the Sacramento River on barges. Once they arrived at the specially built dock in Hood, they were transferred to flatbed trailers for the trip to the test site traveling at seven miles per hour on narrow county roadways and bridges. Workmen along the route had to lift telephone wires and trim trees to enable the stage to make the journey to the test center. Douglas tested nineteen S-IVBs at the test site between 1964 and 1971. Once the stage arrived at the test site, the stage was lifted from the flatbed truck and onto the test stand. Upon testing completion, the stage was initially transported by barge back to the Bay

Residents Vocalize Support for Higher Sales Tax

Bera Speaks in Support of Not My Boss' Business Bill

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - A potential new sales tax within Rancho Cordova's city limits that would help clean up stretches of blight along Folsom Blvd. and enhance public services received overwhelming support and feed-back from both Rancho Cordova city council members and residents at a July 21st Rancho Cordova city council meeting.

Residents will be faced with the decision to approve or reject a quarter-cent to half-cent sales tax in November that would be under local control and inject new revenue into long-term city goals. If the measure passes, community input would then be needed to determine priorities for how to spend the money.

Improving unsightly stretches of Folsom Blvd. was mentioned frequently during a public

hearing on the ballot measure, as well as enhancing the area by attracting new businesses to further boost income from the sales tax. A Resident Satisfaction Survey conducted by the city in December 2013 reported that 73 percent of residents polled were "very likely" or "somewhat likely" to support the sales tax.

Long-time resident, Meada Cashatt, spoke in favor of the sales tax but wants to see a sunset clause added to the measure for ensured accountability.

"Sometimes people go wacko with extra money," Cashatt said. "I would prefer to have limits."

Job training funded by sales tax revenue for unemployed locals is one idea that Cashatt recommended: "Get them on the payroll, then we'll see improvements in our underserved areas. Complaints are easy – positive activity is not."

While a local sales tax is not considered necessary, many residents and council members are in favor of one and see it as a guaranteed stream of funding for the city that would be safe from state and federal budget cuts. Council members expressed support for letting voters decide whether to pass the measure and encouraged community input.

"It's always been my opinion to ask the voters for the opinion," Council member Linda Budge said. "This is a classic time to ask them by the ballot box."

Council member David Sander said a new sales tax for the city would help maintain the city's balanced budget and "fiscally conservative" approach to funding projects.

"We ought to pay as we go," Sander said. "Local decisions with local funding is the priority."

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - Congressman Ami Bera, M.D. spoke out in support of the Not My Boss' Business bill Thursday. The bill would address the Supreme Court's misguided decision in Hobby Lobby v. Burwell.

"I look at this not as a member of Congress, but as a doctor," said Bera. "I took an oath to put my patients first and my job is to sit with my patient, answer her questions, talk about the risks and benefits of the various options available, and then to empower her to make the decision that best fits her life. That's why I'm proud to support the Not My Boss' Business Act, which ensures that employers can't pick and choose what health services women can receive. Health care decisions should be made between a patient and her doctor, not her boss."

The legislation, formally known as the Protect Women's Health from Corporate Interference Act of 2014 would explicitly prohibit for-profit employers that maintain a group health plan for its employees from using religious beliefs to deny employees coverage of

contraception or any other vital health service required by federal law.

Ninety-nine percent of sexually-active women use birth control at least once in their lifetimes, and the Centers for Disease Control declared it one of the Ten Great Public Health Achievements of the 20th Century. While the most common reason women use contraception is to prevent pregnancy, 58 percent of oral contraceptive users cite non-contraceptive health benefits as reasons for using the pill. Fourteen percent of birth control pill users, more than 1,500,000 women, rely on the birth control pills for only non-

contraceptive purposes.

House Republicans blocked the bringing the bill up for consideration twice this week. Senate Republicans also blocked companion legislation introduced by Senators Patty Murray (D-WA) and Mark Udall (D-CO) earlier this week.

Congressman Ami Bera, M.D. represents Sacramento County. Born and raised in California, Bera is a physician and the only Indian American currently serving in Congress. He's fighting to rebuild an economy that works for middle class families and to reduce our country's debt in a responsible way. One of Bera's first acts in Congress was to help lead the effort to pass the No Budget No Pay Act, which says if members of Congress don't pass a budget, they don't get paid. Dare to Live Without Limits

Anger, Resentment, and Bitterness

"Holding on to anger is like grasping a hot coal with the intent of throwing it at someone else – you are the one that gets burned."

There's a common misconception that our anger has a negative impact on someone else. In reality, anger, resentment, and bitterness, harm only you. Yet how often have you felt that your anger would hurt the offending person?

You have probably said to yourself, "that person makes me so angry!" However, no one has the power to control your emotions. How a person acts is up to them. How you respond is up to you. Although this is a simple concept, it's still common to feel as if another person is making you feel a certain way.

There are numerous sources of anger. Typically you feel anger when someone does something you don't like or in reaction to unfavorable circumstances. Even your own actions can cause anger; when you make a mistake or a bad decision. Bad luck also evokes anger. Feelings of anger are intensified whenever you believe you are powerless or unable to take mitigating action.

Anger, resentment, and bitterness cause many problems. They are often accompanied by sadness, depression, and anxiety. You may also feel tense, irritable, or frustrated. Your tolerance level drops and you tend to lash out at others. You are also more likely to blow things out of

proportion. Additionally, anger diminishes your ability to think clearly.

Whether it be with a spouse, significant other, relative, or friend, anger damages relationships.

Whenever you say things you don't mean or behave in a destructive manner, you alienate all those you come into contact with.

There are no benefits to harboring anger, resentment, or bitterness. It's to your benefit to be able to identify when you are experiencing these emotions and then immediately take corrective action to pull yourself out.

You need to be in touch with your feelings so that you know when you are getting angry.

Although this seems obvious, there are those who don't realize they're angry. This is because they are so used to living with a constant level of anger that it has become their normal emotional state.

It's important to understand your sensitivities. Once you detect anger, you must identify the source. Is it another person, your own actions, or circumstances? Remember that you can't go back in time so don't waste any energy lamenting the past. Once you recognize the origin of your anger, you can formulate a plan to dissipate it.

Don't take action when you are angry. The heat of the moment is the worst time to make decisions. Give yourself some time

to cool down. In many situations, the immediate rush of anger will diminish substantially if you allow a cooling off period. This strategy also gives you a chance to put things in perspective. When you are calmer, the offending issues will appear much more insignificant than you initially thought.

Next, determine whether you have any control over what made you angry. If it is something outside of your influence, all you can do is work on your response. You can't control your environment but you can control your reaction. Don't waste any time trying to change something you have no power over.

For those issues you do have some control over, take action. Doing so will immediately make you feel better. When you take action you are being proactive rather than passively waiting for things to improve.

With practice you will be able to substantially reduce any anger, bitterness, and resentment you experience. Regardless of where you are now, you can improve. It's an ongoing process. New Proof of Identity Regulations Proposed for DMV

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - The California Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) announced today that the Office of Administrative Law (OAL) has published the proposed regulations for AB 60—the new law requiring DMV to issue a driver license to applicants who can prove identity and California residence and meet all other licensing requirements, such as passing the written and behind-the-wheel driving exams.

“DMV is committed to successfully implementing this new law to increase safety on California roads and protect the high level of security in our licensing and identity verification procedures,” said DMV Director Jean Shiomoto. “We will carefully consider the public comments we receive on these proposed regulations and make revisions as necessary.”

State law requires motorists to prove identity and legal presence to obtain a driver license. Under AB 60, motorists who cannot prove legal presence must prove identity and California residency to obtain a license. The proposed regulations released today define the categories of documents DMV will accept to verify the identity and California residence of future applicants.

DMV anticipates continually updating a list of specific documents—for example eventually allowing a Mexican Consular Card as a sole means of proving identity—as DMV works with other governments to finalize methods of electronically verifying documents.

“These proposed regulations detail how applicants will be able to prove identity and California residency to obtain a driver license under AB 60,” Shiomoto added. “Although these regulations are not final, we encourage future applicants to begin gathering documents now that they will use to prove identity and

residency.”

The proposed regulations also describe a secondary process for applicants who are unable to produce the documents otherwise required to prove identity. Under that secondary review, applicants must interview with a DMV investigator who will attempt to verify the applicant’s identity. California is the first state in the nation to offer a secondary review process for applicants that lack typical identification documents to prove identity.

“As we prepare for the issuance of licenses in California, it’s important that those who will benefit from AB 60 begin to gather the appropriate documents in order to apply for a driver’s license,” said LA City Councilmember Gil Cedillo, a longtime advocate of increasing the number of Californians able to get a driver license. “I also highly encourage individuals to study for the written test and begin taking driving lessons. All of these things will make the process of attaining a driver’s license much easier.”

DMV encourages the public to review the proposed regulations and make comments. The public comment period begins on Friday, May 9, 2014, and closes 45 days later on Monday, June 23, 2014, at 5:00 p.m. Comments on the proposed regulations can be sent to Legal Affairs Division, P.O. After the public hearings, consideration of the public comment and any necessary revisions, DMV will deliver final regulations to OAL for review and approval. AB 60 requires the DMV to begin issuing licenses pursuant to AB 60, no later than January 1, 2015.

All future applicants will have to pass the standard written and drive exams, so DMV encourages future applicants to begin studying the California Driver Handbook available on the DMV webpage at www.dmv.ca.gov. For more information on AB 60, including sample interactive tests, webcasts, and information about public comment, visit: <http://apps.dmv.ca.gov/ab60/index.html>.

An applicant able to meet these identity and California residency requirements and all other requirements for licensure will be able to receive a driver license.

The VA Scandal: Should We Expand the Federal Failure?

Wikipedia has called it the Veterans Health Administration Scandal of 2014. An audit released in early June found that more than 120,000 veterans were left waiting or never got care, and that records were intentionally vague, misleading, and falsified. More recent reports, as announced by CNN, indicate that at least seven times in the last year, records that showed that veterans died while waiting for care were altered or rewritten by someone else; the changes listed the veterans as living, not deceased, essentially hiding their deaths.

In another report, CNN said that one veteran with a service-related psychiatric condition was in the facility for eight years before he received a comprehensive psychiatric evaluation; in another case, a veteran only had one psychiatric note in his medical chart in seven years. The story continues to unfold, as the Office of Special Counsel, an independent government agency that protects whistleblowers, is still investigating more than 50 whistleblower disclosures alleging patient health or safety at the VA nationwide.

At one level, the scandal suggests that the responsible government officials failed to perform their assigned jobs, and high-level administrators need to be replaced. At another level, however, the scandal suggests that, as Ronald Reagan once put it, “Government is not the solution to our problem. Government is the problem.”

We owe respect, honor, and care to our American veterans. This scandal demonstrates, however, that the current big-government solution has failed

our veterans. Data show that we currently have 21.6 million living veterans, some of whom require expensive and extensive medical care. It is embarrassing and humiliating that we have done so poorly on behalf of our military heroes. Our federal government has failed, big time.

My question today is this: Given that our federal government has shown ineptitude in serving 21.6 million living veterans, why is the federal government trying to expand their control of 21 million college students?

In a recent meeting, the president of one of the six regional independent accrediting agencies said, “The federal Department of Education wants to regulate practically everything.” The Chronicle of Higher Education (CHE) reports (June 26, 2014) that Senate Democrats have put forward a 785-page bill to renew the Higher Education Act. The article reports that “Senator Tom Harkin of Iowa, the bill’s sponsor and chairman of the Senate education committee, said he wanted

to add provisions to reform accreditation.” Another June 26 article in the CHE quoted Ted Mitchell, the undersecretary of education, who called for the federal government to take over monitoring functions currently being handled by the accrediting agencies.

The current accreditation system, primarily functioning under these six regional accreditors, is not a perfect system. The accreditation guidelines and standards continue to evolve and improve. Yet, it is fair to ask whether the federal government would create a better system. If the federal government continues to take greater control over the accreditation of America’s unique and diverse educational system, will the federal government do a better job than the independent accrediting agencies?

The failures of the federal government in handling veterans’ medical care, for 21.6 million living veterans, raises serious questions about the federal government’s ability to monitor the higher education of 21 million students. My vote is to allow the independent accrediting agencies, on the basis of the strength of these independent and experienced bodies, to continue their work. I have no assurance that the federal government would do as well. ★

Whose Bottom Line?

As we approach the time when families get away from the normal hustle and bustle of their daily routines to take time to celebrate the birthday of our Nation, it's worth noting that many California families will be dealing with more than just the heat of the day that we've come to expect.

Our families will also be facing significant costs as California's average statewide gas price comes in at a blistering \$4.12, lower than only Alaska and Hawaii. That's not the worst of it. The recently passed California state budget not only funds the high-speed rail project, but also looks to increase gas prices by another 12 cents. Yes that is right. Not only are Californians assessed a sales tax, gas tax and excise tax every time they put gasoline in their cars, California now wants to tack on another 12 cents to the price of a gallon of gas. In fact, two different letters were sent to the Governor and the Chair of the California Air Resources Board; the proponents of the tax, and nearly half of the State Assembly members, Republicans and Democrats alike, jointly asked for this new tax increase to be dropped. Unfortunately, as previously mentioned, a select few of our locally elected state representatives failed to join the effort to stop this new tax.

But travel is not the only financial burden facing Californians this year, as the Legislature is also considering a tax on fireworks. During the budget negotiations this year, our elected officials were seeking

another revenue source to fund state government, and this would come on the backs of California families who purchased fireworks on the fourth of July. The sad part about this new tax is that it comes on the heels of the increased sales tax imposed by the voters of California through Proposition 30.

Wasn't Proposition 30 supposed to solve our deficit problems, and in addition, help our education system stave off disaster? Schemes such as the proposed fireworks tax are exactly the opposite way government should handle funding a problem.

Most Frequently Asked Questions

For years people have asked me questions about Trusts. And because of the overwhelming response to my recent article "Why a Revocable Trust?", I am sharing those questions and my answers below:

1. QUESTION: What can a trust do that a will cannot?

A: A trust can provide for someone to be legally authorized to handle all of your financial affairs related to your support and care in the event that you become disabled or incompetent; a will has no effect until you die. A Trust, along with appropriate Powers of Attorney and Powers of Attorney for Health Care can prevent the need for a Court appointed Conservator to run your life if you become incapacitated.

2. Q: Can I provide a trust for my grandchildren in a Revocable Living Trust?

A: This is a very frequent question and it can easily be accomplished. A trust for the benefit of grandchildren can be set up within a Revocable Living Trust if you want to be certain that they receive a part of your Trust Estate. Assets do not have to be distributed outright to the beneficiaries of a trust. They can be held in trust for educational purposes of for a gradual distribution over a period of time or in many other ways other than as an out-right distribution.

3. Q: Can I leave part of my estate to take care of someone who is an alcoholic or who might just waste it if given to them all at once?

A: Yes, you can create a trust within your trust to care for such a person. Disbursement of funds can be at the discretion of your successor trustee or in increments that you specify or in any other manner which you think appropriate for the beneficiary involved.

4. Q: I have a disabled adult child who receives Medi-cal benefits and SSI. Can I leave him something in my Trust so that he will not lose his government benefits?

A: Yes. Absolutely- you can set up a Special Needs Trust for the child providing that it can be used only for the Special Needs that are not provided for by government programs but which will improve quality of life. These items can include: incidental spending money, travel funds, personal items such as radios and televisions, paid companions, training programs and special equipment not available through government programs and all kinds of goods and services not provided by government benefits.

5. Q: Can anyone else change the terms of my trust?

A: Generally speaking only you can change the terms of your trust. If you are married, you and your spouse can change the terms of the trust. But it is possible, but not common, for a person, in writing, to authorize a successor Trustee to change the terms of a Trust and in some cases it is legally possible to authorize an agent under a power or attorney to modify a trust. These are unusual situations however, and most trust do not authorized others to modify the trust except under very specific conditions usually related to obtaining long term care government benefits.

6. Q: Will my assets held in a trust help me to qualify for the Medi-Cal benefits of long term care (convalescent hospital) if I need it?

A: Your trust does not help you qualify for Medi-Cal Long Term Care Benefits. Remember the trust is revocable so the assets are still yours and will be counted when you apply for Medi-Cal Benefits. A Revocable Living Trust does not help you qualify for Medi-Cal Benefits.

Keep the questions coming and I'll try to answer them.

Around the Horn

• Pittsburgh's Andrew McCutchen has followed up his first MVP season in 2013 with a remarkable first half. He entered the All-Star break with 58 walks and 115 hits, both best in the National League. His 115 knocks are tied with Miami's Casey McGehee. If he continues this pace during the second half and leads the NL in both categories, he will become just the third player since expansion in 1961 to lead his league in both hits and walks in the same season. Only Carl Yastrzemski with the Red Sox in 1963 and Lenny Dykstra of the Phillies in 1993 have accomplished that.

• The AL East, considered rather mediocre for most of the season thus far, threw its collective weight around over the weekend. What will likely be a three-team race to the finish could become a five-team affair as the Rays and Red Sox are improving. Over the weekend, the division won 12 of its 15 games. The Yankees swept the Reds, the Red Sox dismissed the Royals and the Rays were rather rude guests of the All-Star Game hosts Minnesota by sweeping three from the Twins. Toronto took two of three from the Rangers and the current division leader Baltimore lost two of three to AL West leader Oakland.

• While first-half division leaders Baltimore, Detroit, Oakland, Washington, Milwaukee and the Dodgers can take comfort that most division leaders at the All-Star break do, in fact, win their respective divisions, chances are great that at least one of the six will not. Since the current six-division format began in 1994, in only one season — 1996 — have all six division leaders at the All-Star break gone on to win their divisions. Milwaukee is our most likely candidate to fail this season. And this past weekend really jumbled the picture, especially in the National League.

• Speaking of the NL, as much as the three-division format has provided a multitude of down-to-the-wire races in recent seasons, if the National League played by pre-1969 rules, here is what the standings would look like after the first weekend beyond the All-Star break.

Weekend on Tap

Los Angeles Dodgers at San Francisco
The Dodgers and Giants will stage another installment in their long-standing rivalry dating to their days in New York prior to moving west in the 1950s. San Francisco leads the series this season 7-3, and you have to go back to 2009 to find a season in which Los Angeles got the better of its rivals. The Dodgers' best two starting pitchers are slated to pitch this week-end. Righthander Zack Greinke should pitch on Friday, followed by Clayton Kershaw on Saturday. Hyun-Jin Ryu is scheduled for Sunday night. The Giants will counter with Tim Lincecum on Friday and Ryan Vogelsong on Saturday. With Matt Cain now on the disabled list, the Sunday starter for San Francisco is undecided. Greinke owns two of the Dodgers' three wins over the Giants this season.

Boston at Tampa Bay
The two American League East rivals are fighting to get back into the playoff race, and neither can afford to fall behind the Yankees, Blue Jays and Orioles any further. With both wild cards likely to come out of the AL West, winning this division may be the only way into the post-season for the Rays and Sox. The Rays' David Price is scheduled to start on Friday night. It will be his first appearance against Boston since his involvement in a skirmish that also included David Ortiz. There is no love lost between those two All-Stars. On the field, three of the teams' nine meetings this season resulted in walk-off wins, and another two games were decided by one run. The Rays have won five of nine so far.

Athlon Spotlight

Hall of Fame Welcomes Special Class

The 2014 Hall of Fame class, featuring three players and three managers, promises to be one of the best classes of all-time. With a decidedly Atlanta flavor, the induction ceremonies scheduled for Sunday, July 27, will likely draw the largest crowd ever, at least since Tony Gwynn and Cal Ripken were enshrined in 2007.

Pitchers Tom Glavine and Greg Maddux, along with John Smoltz, anchored the pitching staffs for the Braves during the team's tremendous run throughout the 1990s. Their manager, Bobby Cox, will also be inducted as one of three managers going into the Hall this summer. Cox joins Joe Torre, who played nine years for the Braves and managed the team for three seasons in the early 1980s, and Tony La Russa.

Frank Thomas, a two-time MVP for the Chicago White Sox, rounds out the class.

Thomas, a former tight end at Auburn and known as the Big Hurt, faced Maddux four times and Glavine three times. He fared much better against the lefty Glavine with a hit and two walks. He was 0-for-3 with a walk and two whiffs against Maddux.

Glavine faced 14 Hall of Fame hitters totaling 575 plate appearances. He held the group to a .279 average and 10 home runs. Maddux faced 13 members of the Hall (528 plate appearances) and held the group to a .276 average. In 51 plate appearances against Hall of Fame pitchers, Thomas batted just .133 with one home run courtesy of Goose Gossage.

There was very little debate about the six candidates elected. Glavine, Maddux and Thomas were elected by the BBWAA, all three in their first years of eligibility. The three managers were elected by the veterans committee, also in their first years of eligibility by the committee.

More than 50 Hall of Famers are expected to be in attendance this weekend at Cooperstown, N.Y., the home of the Hall of Fame and Museum. The ceremony is slated to begin at 1:30 ET on Sunday.

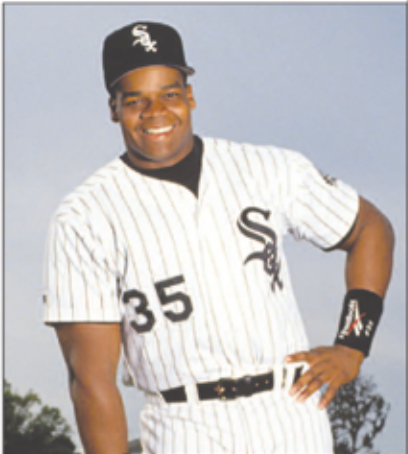

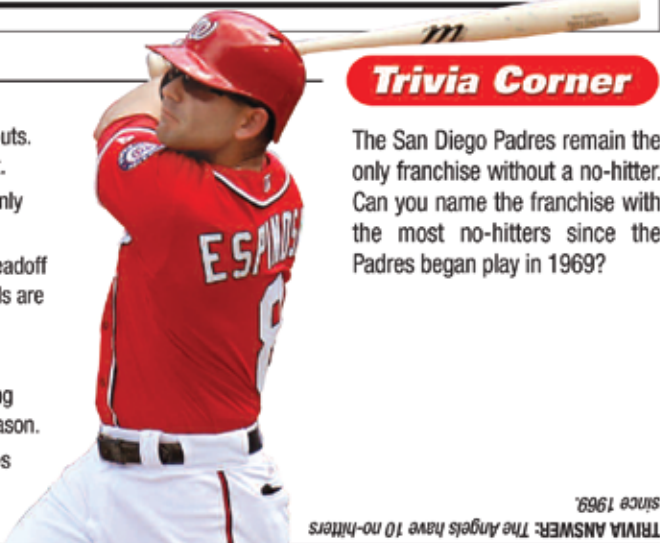

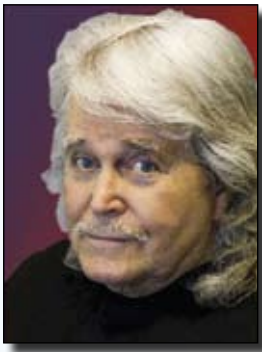
