RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - Capital Christian Center's high school will soon have new track and field amenities.

Ground was recently broken on a multi-million dollar master plan at the

"mega church" complex in Rosemont (Sacramento). Construction will renovate the stadium and add an all-weather football field and track. Baseball diamonds, tennis courts and a fitness center are included in further project phases.

Last week's groundbreaking marked

DUI Checkpoint Results

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - The Rancho Cordova Police Department Traffic Unit conducted a DUI/Drivers License Checkpoint on May 30th within the city limits between the hours of 7:00 p.m. and 2:00 a.m. DUI checkpoints are a proven enforcement tool effective in reducing the number of persons killed and injured in alcohol involved crashes. Research shows that crashes involving alcohol drop by an average of 20 percent when well-publicized checkpoints are conducted often enough.

Officers checked for signs of alcohol and/or drug impairment, and proper licensing. They attempted to delay motorists only momentarily. A total of 416 vehicles were checked. Citations were issued to 18 drivers, nine to drivers with no licenses or suspended licenses, and the rest were for miscellaneous violations. Four drivers were given field sobriety tests, and there were no DUI arrests.

"Over the course of the past three years, DUI collisions have claimed 2 lives and resulted in 39 injury crashes harming 56 of our friends and neighbors," said Sgt. Lane of the Rancho Cordova Police Department Traffic Unit.

According to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA), checkpoints have provided the most effective documented results of any of the DUI enforcement strategies, while also yielding considerable cost savings of \$6 for every \$1 spent. Checkpoints are placed in locations that have the greatest opportunity for achieving drunk and drugged

Fifi, the World's Only Flying B-29 Superfortress

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG)

- The name Fifi always had a specific connotation for me. It brought to mind a small, well groomed purse dog—until I flew with the Commemorative Air Force on Thursday, June 5th. When I hear the name Fifi now, I think of the huge, silver Boeing B-29 Superfortress bomber that carried us from Modesto to Mather, the only airborne sister plane of the Enola Gay, which dropped the first Atomic Bomb on Hiroshima on August 6, 1945, and Bocks Car, which dropped a second bomb on Nagasaki three days later.

One of 3,970 B-29s, Fifi was built just a few weeks before the end of WWII. She was never intended for battle even though she was equipped to carry nuclear payloads; she served as a training vessel. The Air Force kept her in service until 1954 when she was lent to the Navy; this could have been the end for Fifi. She was forgotten, left to sit in the Mojave desert until 1971 when Vic Agather, a WWII Army Air Forces veteran, rescued her from her next planned transfer—to the scrap yard. Agather named the B-29 Fifi

after his wife.

Fifi was fully restored and approved for flights in the mid-70s, and except for a brief grounding in 2006 for repairs, has been touring and flying ever since.

One of Fifi's most noticeable features is her glass nose, which provides an amazing view. Sitting here in a little fold-down seat, so close to the glass you can reach out and put your feet on it, gives a full view above, left, right, and most dramatically, below. Looking down on the landscape gliding gently below the plane from this vantage point is a unique and exhilarating experience.

There are blister windows in the mid- and tail-sections of the plane, and each provides amazing views because the windows,

and therefore your head, extend beyond the main body of the Superfortress. The midsection has one on each side where the scanners, who monitor the engines, are stationed, and both the mid- and tail-sections have blister windows above for the gunners. Even though B-29s were designed to fly higher than other aircraft, they could reach altitudes exceeding 30,000 feet, they were equipped with defensive artillery.

Sitting in the gunner’s seat was a powerful experience; hands on the controls, swiveling in the chair, it was easy to imagine enemy

planes closing in on the B-29. This may be a result of watching WWII movies on TV while growing up, and it may also have been helped along by the P-51 Mustang, ManO’War, flying off my left shoulder as I held the tail gunner’s position.

The crew areas can be pressurized although they weren’t on Thursday’s flight. A long tunnel connects the midsection crew area and the cockpit. Crawling through that tunnel is the only way to move between those sections when airborne. It was easy to traverse, but surprisingly, powerfully windy. The tail gunner’s section could only be entered or exited during unpressurized flight; when pressurized, the tail gunner was on his own, isolated from the rest of the crew.

ManO’War, a P-51 fighter, flying off my left shoulder as I held the tail gunner’s position.

A B-29 on a bombing mission required 11 crew members: pilot, co-pilot, flight engineer, bombardier, radio operator and navigator in the front section; two scanners, a gunner and radar operator in the midsection; and a tail gunner in the back who also operated the auxiliary power unit.

When the engines start for the long “pre-oiling” process, the plane shakes and the decibels

go as high as 110. Ear plugs are required gear for flying in Fifi. In flight, she burns 400 gallons of fuel per hour.

The Commemorative Air Force crew consists

entirely of volunteers, and each one of them is an enthusiastic fan of Fifi. David Oliver, Fifi’s pilot for this flight, has been flying with Fifi for four years. “The goal is preservation, education, and honoring our veterans,” said Oliver.

The Crew isn’t alone in its enthusiasm. Fifi landed at Mather Airport to a crowd of fans and reporters, and even Metro Fire came out to admire the Superfortress in person. There was also a group of flight students waiting for her; they wiped her down with clean cloths, collecting grease and grime to take home as souvenirs. ★

While I was driving by that five foot monument on the empty lot next to the Church of Christ on Coloma Road the other day, I noticed (for the first time) that the historical plaque was missing. The plaque was placed there a while back to remind us that part of our history, the Williamson Ranch home, used to be there. The plaque may be one of those things that we are so used to seeing every day that it isn't really "seen." So when there is a difference like the missing plaque, it may not be noticed as our minds tell us that we are seeing the plaque as usual. Anyway, I stopped and took a picture, then went on to City Hall. I was fortunate that Council Member Linda Budge was there when I arrived. She said the plaque had been stolen but that she is in the process of having it replaced. Learning about what had happened that quickly was good luck for me because I was ready to begin calling people and sending emails to find out what had happened to the plaque. Don't be afraid to ask around if something seems to be out of place or is missing.

Did You Notice?

I am writing this column the day after the primary election, and while we all noticed something about the election results, I noticed that the voters passed Proposition 42 by over 60% of the vote. I read the information we were given by the Secretary of State and decided to vote no. There wasn't much attention paid to the Proposition before the election and even the "League of California Cities" just said it was "concerned." The real problem with the Proposition was that the State was able to pass on another cost to cities, counties, and special districts that the State was supposed to reimburse to the cities, etc. I have the City's Finance Director looking into how much it is going to cost Rancho Cordova. I know cities like L.A. and San Francisco will be paying much more than us. The Commission on State Mandates ruled that the State was fiscally responsible for that mandate and many others that the State Legislature tells us we have to enforce. But since 2002, when a court ruled that California is responsible for reimbursing cities, etc. when the State sends out mandates, the State has not paid out any money to comply with the ruling. I guess I noticed this because it is another bill your City has to pay and it should be paid for by the State. Something about the election results that is really great

to notice will be the building of Phase 1 that will be 50 permanent housing apartments for the Veterans Village on the south side of the Infirmary building at Mather. According to Reed Flory, the City's Housing Services Administrator, the Tax Credit Staff Report recommends approval of our request for \$13.48 million in tax credits. That award – plus 5 other grants already in hand – completes all of the needed financing. Mercy Housing of California, our developer/partner, is required to break ground within 180 days of the Tax Credit Board's formal action approving our request scheduled for June 11th. Completion of construction is expected in 12 to 14 months. More information about Phase 2 of the Veterans Village is the work needed to completely clean and refurbish the Infirmary building into a temporary place for Veterans to get off the streets and get the help they rightly deserve. The new owners of the old K-Mart shopping center are working now, there are new owners of where Wishing Well was located, the Folsom Lake College campus is under construction, and the new Performing Arts Building at Cordova High is also under construction. I think I'll stop here and catch my breath. ★ From Vice Mayor Bob McGarvey, God bless, and see you next time.

the half-way point in a “Let Us Play” campaign to raise nearly \$4 million. The center’s elementary, middle and high schools believe sports are fundamental to education, and the Capital Christian Cougars have excelled to championship levels in soccer, track and field.

“The whole community will benefit from our all-weather football field and track,” said High School Principal Abdiel Alvarez. “This will enable us to serve the community more effectively.”

Current construction should be finished in time for 2014 events. The new amenities will be named for Sacramento builder Joseph Benvenuti, his wife Nancy, and the Arcade couple’s family.

Dedication ceremonies also recognized other supporters of Sacramento’s largest church. The family of business leader Chuck Massie funded the 1970s stadium, now outgrown by a 1000-strong school enrolment. Recent “Let Us Play” donations included one individual’s

\$500,000 check for a new rest-room and snack bar quarters. “That kicked off a series of gifts that will allow work to be completed in an amazingly short period,” said Alvarez. “Our schools have become an important institution. It’s wonderful that people want to help us.”

Builder Joe Benvenuti, himself the son of a missionary, worshipped at Capital Christian for over 60 years. His great grandchildren now attend his schools.

“What Joe did for Sacramento and for his church is generally unknown but incredible,” said Alvarez. “His family maintains his legacy by giving back. Naming this project after Joe and Nancy continues a tradition of honoring great philanthropists who were friends of our church.”



VA Health Care’s Socialist Paradise

For the left, the Department of Veterans Affairs is how health care is ideally supposed to work. No insurance companies, no private doctors, no competition -- just the government and the patient.

The VA is an island of socialism in American health care. It generally provides adequate care -- to a limited universe of people and for only certain conditions -- but has long been plagued by scandal. It is perhaps the worst bureaucracy in the federal government. As with all such single-payer-type systems, the cost of the notionally free health care is in the rationing, in this case the wait times that have had desperately ill vets hung out to dry for months.

The usual Obamacare excuses don’t apply here. The existence of the VA isn’t

politically controversial. No one is trying to repeal it, or “sabotage” it. What we’re seeing is simply unaccountable bureaucracy in action.

When the benchmark was created for VA facilities to get vets appointments within 14 days, meeting the goal was easy: All it took was logging appointments dishonestly to hide the wait time. This is how poorly performing government bureaucracies have met goals from time immemorial; it’s why, on a much more vast and monstrous scale, Soviet five-year plans were always such runaway successes on paper.

The VA system worked for everyone but the patients -- and the whistle-blowers. The daughter-in-law of a Navy vet in Phoenix who died after never getting follow-up for his “urgent” case was told, in lines that perfectly capture the spirit of socialized medicine: “It’s a seven-month waiting list. And you’re gonna have to have patience.”

But the bureaucracy acted with alacrity when its reporting scheme was at risk. In St. Louis, the former chief of psychiatry says he was put under administrative investigation when he complained about wait lists. A whistle-blower who worked in Fort Collins, Colo., alleges that she and a colleague were transferred when they refused to hide wait times.

So far, the VA affair is running the usual course of Obama administration scandals,

with the requisite denial and lack of accountability. VA Secretary Eric Shinseki has referred to the incidents as “isolated cases” (even though 26 facilities are now under investigation). No one has been fired.

The White House has reverted to its default position of maintaining that it doesn’t know much about what’s happening in the vast government it always wants to make bigger. Spokesman Jay Carney seemed to suggest that the president first heard about the scandal on CNN.

Of course, the problem with wait times and the trustworthiness of the VA’s own reporting wasn’t news. The Government Accountability Office has been warning of it since 2000. It headlined a December 2012 report, “VA HEALTH CARE: Reliability of Reported Outpatient Medical Appointment Wait Times and Scheduling Oversight Need Improvement.”

The VA obviously isn’t going anywhere, but the scandal should be the occasion for making it more transparent and accountable, and giving vets more choices. As of now, it represents a case study in how a bureaucracy tends to its own interests, even at the expense of veterans relying on it for matters of life and death.

Tapia Named CAL's MVP

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - Eight members of the Cordova High School baseball team, who helped the Lancers to win a share of the Capital Athletic League title, were honored for their achievements by the league.

Six players were named to the all-CAL first team. Leading the way was senior Zach Tapia, who was named the league's MVP. On defense, Tapia played third base, first base and the outfield, and pitched in which he had a 5-2 record with a 3.47 ERA, and struck out 36 batters. He also had a .917 fielding percentage. On offense, Tapia batted .214.

"His biggest asset was his pitching," said Cordova head

coach Guy Anderson of Tapia, a two-sport athlete who was the quarterback on the Lancers' foot-ball team last fall. "The last half of the season, he came on real strong. He finished with that great victory against Whitney (in season finale last month that gave the Lancers a share of the league title)."

Also selected to the all-CAL first team was Jerome Brown, Nigel Robinson, Dominic Gentry, Jared Harris and Tylor Myers.

Brown batted .368 that included four triples to lead the Lancers, stole 27 bases and had a .948 fielding percentage. Robinson had a .367 batting average that included 13 RBIs and six doubles. On defense, he

had a .977 fielding percentage.

Gentry batted .295 and 16 RBIs, plus an .867 fielding per-centage. Harris had a .362 batting average, and an .870 fielding percentage. Myers bat-ted .259, produced 10 RBIs and a .971 fielding percentage.

Selected to the league's hon-orable mention list was Riley Roberson and Logan Appino. At the plate, Robson went .214, plus 14 RBIs and .939 fielding percentage. Appino batted .328, along with 13 RBIs and .924 fielding percentage.

"The kids exceeded, I think, what they were able to do this year," said Anderson of the 15-player squad. "They came together as a team, and they played very well down the

stretch. It seemed like every ball game, somebody contributed."

Anderson was named CAL's Coach of the Year. During the season, Anderson won his 900th career high school varsity base-ball win that puts him second all-time among California's most winningest high school varsity baseball coach.

Cordova finished its final sea-son in the CAL with an 11-4 mark to share the title with Whitney, and 17-11 overall.

To cap off the season, Anderson, who completed his 42nd season as the Lancers' head coach, noted all 15 players on his squad were named MVP of the team at the team's recent awards banquet.

Optimist All-Star Baseball game



The almost triple digit heat didn't keep the neighborhood from turning out in large numbers mainly because of the highly anticipated splash pad water feature. This feature was installed thanks to the passage of ballot Initiative Measure S by the voters in the neighborhood community.

The Ribbon Cutting celebration which was put on by the CRPD staff featured music, balloons, refresh-ments and kind words from Jim Rodems, District Administrator, Lee Garrison, CRPD Vice-Chair, Ken Cooley, Assemblymember District 8, Don Nottoli, Sacramento County Supervisor, Linda Budge,

Councilmember City of Rancho Cordova, Laura Taylor, CRPD Park Planning & Development Manager, and Chad Kennedy, Landscape Architect with O'Dell Engineering. Also in attendance was Rick Sloan, CRPD Board Secretary and Brian Danzl, CRPD Board Member.

In 2006 the CRPD and the Developer, River-West Investments, agreed to the concept of the parcel for a 6.5 acre park. River-West was the owner and builder of the turnkey park throughout design and construc-tion. The District took possession of the park on May 30, 2014. River-West hired O'Dell Engineering to design the park in March 2012. Park Planners on staff at the time had seen presentations by Mr. Kennedy, of O'Dell Engineering about the inclusive play concept and decided this park was a great candidate for it. Design, budgeting, bidding and set-ting up contracts took about a year. The park construction also took about a year to complete at a cost of \$2.5 million.

The park also features a walk-ing trail around the perimeter that is about 1/4 mile long, a hopscotch court etched into the concrete pave-ment, a half basketball court and a very unique play area with swings, spinning toys, slides and musical instruments such as drums, verti-cal chimes, and a xylophone. There is also a sand box with a spigot for making wet sand for sand castles and an elevated section so that wheel chairs can pull up and play in the sand at waist height.

But the best feature by far this hot summer day was the spray pad which shot water up from a variety of locations and cooled off all that ran through it for hours. The spray pad can be activated by stepping on a button in the center from 10 am until 7 pm daily. This new CRPD Park is definitely worth coming out to expe-rience for everyone. Father's Day. A day that could mean so much more to so many more dad's. If we only knew.

Yes, it's seems like it was just yester-day that my son was born. Where did twenty years go?

And it seems like it was just the day before that my father passed away as we held hands and I looked into his eyes for the last time. Where did twenty seven years go?

I remember one late afternoon, just after a storm had passed, driving on the 680 freeway with my son. He was sit-ting in the passenger seat (which was actually legal back then). I noticed he was staring at the clouds for some time, holding my hand. With a great deal of certainty, he said matter-of-factly, "Dad, God is a hand. He just reaches down and holds you."

Profound. He was only about four years old. I just let the moment sink in, not saying a word for miles.

On another trip about a year later, on a day that followed a particularly rough week, we shared another of those spir-itually special moments. Again, as he sat next to me, he just patted the top of my right hand with his in that way that a son does. He turned and looked at me and said "This you're the dad and I'm the boy."

It was just yesterday that I took him

to his first baseball game at the Oakland Coliseum. Thank God for cameras. All he wanted to be for years after-wards was a big league baseball player. It drove him to be a fan-tastic player, and an even bet-ter teammate. All those days coaching and practicing now seem like a blur, but what a blur!

Years later we made base-ball trips to the Midwest and New York. When I had

learned that they were closing old Yankee Stadium I was determined to get him there. We spent a week in New York. It was dad with his grown son just hanging out in the Big Apple. And we got to see the Yankees sweep the Twins. A treasure I'll never forget.

When it came time for buying his first car, he did all the research. He checked things out online, then made his deci-sion. A good deal, but he did learn what "As Is" means real fast.

We once made a trip to Fort Bragg for a long weekend. We stopped in for din-ner at a fancy restaurant. I mentioned to the staff where we were from, and that I had returned after many years to share their great food with my son. The owner, chef and the waitress all helped coach him on "how to act in a nice res-taurant, especially went taking a young

lady out for dinner." It was really a kick to see him enjoy it.

I remember going to my first profes-sional basketball game with my dad. Somewhere I still have the ticket stub. The Warriors and John Havlicec's Boston Celtics at the Cow Palace. It was awesome. I think I was eight.

I remember the times my dad spent coaching me. I didn't know until years later that he was an All-League star in high school and three-time league cham-pion. I didn't know he was also a track and field star.

I remember many of our family camping trips. His pancakes, scrambled eggs, and burnt toast. I remember how we would all play games and cards on the old wooden camp tables under dim lights and blankets.

One Sunday, my dad and I and a

bunch of family friends went to a 49er's and Ram's game at Candlestick Park. It was so much fun, because my team, the Rams, came back and won in the fourth quarter. I often say I was a Rams fan as a little kid just so I could get more of his attention for rooting for the other team.


There were days I would go with him to run errands and meet his buddies. I learned over the years that he got into just as much trouble goofing off as I did. It made our relationship so special to know those things about him.

I remember my dad's passing. Almost every little detail. Especially sitting in the room with him alone for the hour after he passed. Silent. Serene. Relief. Joy. Great appreciation.

Rarely a day goes by that I do not think about my dad. I know I would give a year of my life to spend just one more day with him.

Never does a day pass that I do not yearn for seeing my son. He is off fin-ishing college, then off to the rest of his life soon after.

I guess the message here is, life changes in an instant. Don't miss it. Make it a Happy Father's Day.

Around the Horn

- The Tampa Bay Rays ended Sunday with a 24-40 record, the worst in the majors. The last time the club could claim the worst record was back in 2007 when the team was known as the Devil Rays.
- When the Yankees signed Japanese pitcher Masahiro Tanaka to a seven-year, \$155 million deal over the winter, they knew they were getting a future star, but feared he might need a year or so to adjust to life in the major leagues. But the righthander has made 12 starts and owns a 9-1 record with a 2.02 ERA. He has a 0.957 WHIP and 92 strikeouts in 84.2 innings. His 12 quality starts to begin a career is the second-longest streak since 1912. Steve Rogers of the Montreal Expos began his career with 16 quality starts in 1973.
- How hot have the Blue Jays been? Since May 11, the team won 20 of 26 games and built a lead of 5.5 games in the American League East after being 3.5 back on May 11.

AL Player of the Week

Adrian Beltre, Texas
While injuries have depleted the Rangers' lineup this season, there is nothing wrong with Beltre now. In six games last week, he had five multi-hit games and drove in eight runs. The third baseman is now 15 hits shy of 2,500 for his career and 16 home runs short of 400.

AL Pitcher of the Week

Felix Hernandez, Seattle
King Felix is clearly in midseason form for the Mariners. Seattle has won Hernandez's last seven starts, and opponents scored a total of 15 runs in those seven games. Last week, the ace struck out eight with no walks in a win at Yankee Stadium. The righthander followed that performance with seven shutout innings at Tampa Bay in which he whiffed a career-high 15 but was saddled with a no-decision.

NL Player of the Week

Jonathan Lucroy, Milwaukee
The Brewers' catcher is making a case to be the starter for the National League in the All-Star Game. Last week, he batted .480 with two home runs. He scored eight runs in the seven games, including the only run in Sunday's 1-0 win at Pittsburgh.

NL Pitcher of the Week

Jordan Zimmermann, Washington
The Nationals are beginning to come alive in the NL East and pitching is leading the way. Zimmermann was absolutely terrific last week with 17 scoreless innings. After eight shutout innings vs. Philadelphia, he tossed a two-hit shutout at San Diego, allowing just two hits without a walk and 12 strikeouts.

Best Players Drafted at Each Slot

MLB has held an annual free agent draft for 50 years now. The first, in 1965, featured Rick Monday as the first-ever player drafted. The draft has no doubt had the single greatest impact toward creating parity in the major leagues. Prior to the draft, clubs basically bid for players individually, leaving the rich to get richer. The 2014 Draft was held last week, and another generation of stars will soon begin their professional careers. With that in mind, here are the best draft picks at each position in the first 30 picks.

- No. 1 Ken Griffey, Jr., Seattle, 1987

Obviously, there have been numerous No. 1 overall selections of note. The best player? I'll go with Griffey ahead of Chipper Jones and Alex Rodriguez.
- No. 2 Reggie Jackson, K.C. A's, 1966

For 25 years, Steve Chilcott was the only No. 1 selection not to make the majors. For some reason the Mets thought he would turn out better than Reggie. Oops. Of the four No. 2 picks prior to 2010 who failed to make the majors, two were Blue Jays.
- No. 3 Robin Yount, Milwaukee, 1973

The Hall of Famer spent his entire career with the organization that drafted him and promoted him to the majors at age 18. Yount's long-time teammate Paul Molitor, drafted four years later, is a close second. Current stars Evan Longoria, Manny Machado and Eric Hosmer were all taken at No. 3.
- No. 4 Dave Winfield, San Diego, 1973

The University of Minnesota star was drafted by the Minnesota Vikings, the Atlanta Hawks and the Utah Stars of the old ABA. Winfield skipped the minor leagues on his way to the Hall of Fame. Barry Larkin, Kevin Brown and Thurman Munson are runners-up. The Orioles have had six No. 4 picks: Gregg Olson, Jeffrey Hammonds, Adam Loewen, Brian Matusz, Dylan Bundy and Kevin Gausman.

- No. 5 Dwight Gooden, N.Y. Mets, 1982

It's likely that either Buster Posey or Ryan Braun (both owners of MVP trophies) will unseat Gooden at some point.
- No. 6 Barry Bonds, Pittsburgh, 1985

The skinny kid out of Arizona State was a can't-miss prospect. Derek Jeter hasn't been too bad either. The Nationals have done well at this spot recently with Anthony Rendon and Ross Detwiler.
- No. 7 Frank Thomas, Chi. White Sox, 1989

The big tight end from Auburn quickly became the Big Hurt and Big Star in Chicago. Troy Tulowitzki, Clayton Kershaw and Prince Fielder were also No. 7 selections.
- No. 8 Todd Helton, Colorado, 1995

Once a starting quarterback for the Vols (ahead of Peyton Manning), and a closer for a College World Series team, Helton has little competition for this honor. Interestingly, Wade Townsend, a right-handed pitcher out of Rice, went No. 8 in back-to-back years to Baltimore and Tampa Bay.
- No. 9 Kevin Appier, K.C. Royals, 1987

The picking gets slim here, but Appier edges Barry Zito by virtue of 169 wins to 165. Mark Kotsay has played in the most career games with 1,914.
- No. 10 Ted Simmons, St. Louis, 1967

It's difficult to ignore Mark McGwire's 583 home runs, but Simmons was an impact catcher with close to 2,500 games. Madison Bumgarner is a good bet to take over from Simmons in the near future.
- No. 11 Andrew McCutchen, Pitt., 2005

The All-Star centerfielder is being chased by teammate Neil Walker, drafted a year ahead of McCutchen, and George Springer, who made his major league debut last month.

- No. 12 Nomar Garciaparra, Boston, 1994

Kirk Gibson would be the choice for most dramatic moment, and Jered Weaver will likely be the best once he approaches 200 wins.
- No. 13 Manny Ramirez, Cleveland, 1991

If this were the 13th round, the choice would easily be Albert Pujols, but Ramirez is the best at the 13th overall spot. Paul Konerko, Frank Tanana and Garry Templeton deserve a nod. Chris Sale is rising quickly.
- No. 14 Jason Varitek, Seattle, 1994

Stats wise, it would be easy to pick Derrek Lee or Tino Martinez or even Jason Heyward. Jose Fernandez may be the man of the future once he recovers from Tommy John surgery.
- No. 15 Jim Rice, Boston, 1971

The Anderson, S.C., prepster was in the bigs to stay by 1975. Chase Utley worked out pretty well for the Phillies.

- No. 16 Lance Berkman, Houston, 1997
