RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - There will be no shortage of

giggles – or free bike helmets -- this weekend when Kids Day in the Park celebrates its 25th Anniversary at Hagan Park in Rancho Cordova.

Sponsored by the City of Rancho Cordova, Sacramento County and a host of other sponsors, Kid's Day has exploded to become one of the largest children's events in the region.

Organizers said they are working to assure it will be more fun than a barrel of monkeys on Saturday, April 26 at Hagan Park as Kids Day celebrates " Happy

Birthday Kids Day" and provides a rollicking day of free activities, health screenings and parent resources.

Honored earlier this year by the Sierra Sacramento Valley Medical Society with its "Community Medical Service Award," Kids Day will also be the place for children to earn a free bicycle helmet by completing a safety course offered by the Rancho Cordova Police Activities League.

Up to 1,000 free bicycle helmets have been provided by the Sierra Sacramento Valley Medical Society Alliance, through a community grant aimed at improving wellness in the region, an will surely be a highlight of this year's

Kids Day was begun a quartercentury ago and has grown and evolved into a community-wide celebration of children which last year attracted more than 6,000 visitors. This year's event will feature crafts and games, children's entertainment and the popular Police Activities League (PAL) Bike Rodeo during which dozens of bicycles donated by the Sheriff's Toy Project and safety helmets from the Alliance and UC Davis Trauma service providers will be given away to lucky children.

Great children's health is an objective of Kids Day, and organizers are working with health providers from Sacramento

County and the Folsom Cordova Unified School District to present free hearing, vision and school readiness screenings for toddlers, reaching deep into the community to get kids off to a healthy start in the education.

Kids Day runs from 11 a.m. to 3 p.m. Saturday, April 26 with no admission charge. Free parking is available nearby. Normal park entry fees apply for those who chose to park inside the park.

Crocker Art Museum Wins Prestigious **National Award**

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG)

Sacramento's Crocker Art Museum received a Best Show award for excellence from the AICA-USA, one of 63 national sections comprising the International Association of Art Critics (AICA International), a non-governmental organization headquartered in Paris, France.

Organized by William Breazeale, Ph.D., curator at the Crocker Art Museum, with guest curators Michael Duncan and Christopher Wagstaff, "wAn Opening of the Field: Jess, Robert Duncan, and Their Circle", which first opened at the Crocker Art Museum, won an AICA-USA award for best thematic national show outside New York. "An Opening of the Field" reveals the complex interplay between poetry and art in the mid-century Bay Area cultural scene.

Announced earlier today, the awards recognize excellence in art criticism and curatorial achievement in the conception and realization of exhibitions by galleries, museums, and related cultural institutions. Eighteen first and second-place winners in nine categories were selected from more than 140 exhibitions nominated by AICA-USA's national membership of more than 400 critics, curators, and scholars.

"We are thrilled to receive this award for our provocative and powerful exhibition, and especially to be recognized for excellence amongst our peers from the National Gallery of Art in Washington, D.C.; the Philadelphia Museum of Art; the Hirschhorn Museum and Sculpture Garden in Washington, D.C.; and, the Museum of Modern Art Chicago," said Lial A. Jones, Mort and Marcy Friedman Director of the Crocker Art Museum.

Artist Jess Collins, known simply as Jess, and the poet Robert Duncan joined their lives in San Francisco in the early 1950s. In an era of unacceptance, these men formed one of the most fascinating artistic partnerships of the 20th century. At the epicenter of a remarkable circle of friends, Jess and Duncan shared an enduring, collaborative genius that inspired and changed the creative vision of a generation of artists and writers.

This is the first exhibition to explore the couple's rich artistic production and relationship. Through more than 140 individual and collaborative works of art and personal letters drawn from private and public collections, this exhibition also looks at their influence and unique position as precursors of Postmodernism. A companion catalogue includes

Food Literacy Center Expands, Holds Open House Celebration

Local Nonprofit Invites Community To Celebrate New Office, Staff And Name Change

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - Craft stations, cooking demos, wine and small bites will abound at the open house celebration of Food Literacy Center's expansion into a new space on the second floor of the Medical Society building at 5380 Elvas Avenue, Sacramento, from 5:30-8 p.m. on May 1. Guests will have the opportunity to meet Food Literacy Center's students, who will be cooking and serving bites. Guests also can meet the center's food literacy advocates, board members and staff, tour the office and try food literacy activities ranging from tasting plant parts such as edible flowers to learning about sugar. RSVP to elaine@californiafoodliteracy.org.

"Our new office is a milestone symbolic of how far we've come," said Amber Stott, founding executive director. "Our progress has been a team effort. and for those who haven't yet met the team or experienced our fun approach to food literacy, our open house is your chance."

The event also celebrates Food Literacy Center's expansion of staff. The organization has two paid staff and will begin looking for a program manager in the next month. With the expansion, the local nonprofit also changed its name from California Food Literacy Center to Food Literacy

"While we remain devoted to teaching food literacy in the

Sacramento region, we also offer the most comprehensive food literacy curriculum in the country, and we receive speaking and teaching requests from across the United States," Stott said. "We are the central resource for food literacy, and we want our name to reflect that."

Thanks to community support and a strong volunteer base, the center has been able to expand despite a \$130,000 annual budget.

"It was quite an accomplishment for a three-year-old nonprofit to raise \$130,000 in one year," Stott said. "When you compare that to larger local

nonprofits whose budgets range from \$1.5-12 million, we are doing a lot on a small budget. With 70 active volunteers and a hardworking staff, we know how to stay focused, lean and hit our goals. But if we want to make sure all kids have access to food literacy, we need to double our budget in 2014."

Leaders of the center will discuss growth plans further at the open house on May 1.

Food Literacy Center was established in July 2011 to educate and inspire low-income children to eat healthy food. Students learn fruit and vegetable appreciation, how to read nutrition labels, basic cooking skills and environmental impacts of their food choices. The nonprofit also runs the Food Literacy Academy, which trains community members as food literacy advocates. To date, the nonprofit has 70 active volunteers and serves 2,400 kids annually. After just three months of food literacy education, 70 percent of students request the foods they have tasted in class, including broccoli, celery and oranges. Ninety-two percent of K-1st grade students say healthy food tastes good, and 88 percent of children understand how to read a nutrition label. To make a donation: www.californiafoodlit-

Rancho Cordova Recognized for Citizens Financial Report

City Finds Better Way to Tell Residents About Finances

- Recognizing that financial reporting documents are not always the easiest for residents to read, the City of Rancho Cordova changed the way it reported financial accomplishments to citizens. In 2012, the City created a new Citizens' Financial Report. The new report is a colorful, easy-to-read, and graphic-based four page document that was distributed in the City's quarterly newsletter that reaches every City address.

"We wanted to produce a financial report that was short, informative, and interesting to read," said City of Rancho Cordova Finance Director Donna Silva. "We were hoping that people would read it at the breakfast table and that it would spark conversation about the great things happening in our community."

The City's innovative approach to reporting appears to have worked. The California Association of Public Information Officers (CAPIO) recently recognized the Citizen's Financial Report with the organization's top honor, the Excellence in Communications Award. The award recognized the City in the Special Innovation category for demonstrating leadership, innovation, and success for its Citizens' Financial Report.

Each year, the City is legally required to produce a Comprehensive Annual Financial Report (CAFR), a 200-plus page document that deeply details the financial operations of the City. The CAFR is effective at relaying complex financial information to industry professionals, but does little to help the common citizen understand the finances of a government. The City has been recognized in the past with the Certificate of Achievement for Excellence in Financial Reporting for their CAFR documents - an industry staple for well-run finance departments.

"After being recognized by our peers for financial reporting, we felt compelled to innovate a better way of sharing information with citizens," said Silva. "I am very proud that we have been recognized for producing a communications document out of financial information. That may just be a first for local government."







Largest Marijuana Bust in Citrus Heights History

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG)

- At about midnight on April 9th, marijuana, cash, weapons and ammunition were seized in the biggest drug case in Citrus Heights history. The Citrus Heights Police Department's Special Investigations Unit (SIU) and the Post-Release Community Supervision (PRCS) enforcement team were responsible for the investigation that led to the raid and the arrest of two suspects.

"This is by far the largest drug case we've ever had here in Citrus Heights," said CHPD Chief Boyd.

In total, 858 pounds of marijuana with a street value of approximately 2.5 million dollars was seized from an El Dorado Hills residence. The firearms consisted of four semi-automatic handguns, one semi-automatic rifle and two semi-automatic restricted/assault rifles.

The El Dorado Hills residence appears to be the base of the packaging and distribution operation and is suspected to have been in operation since September of 2013. It was not the grow location, which is currently unknown.

31 year old Citrus Heights resident, Jeremy Zahn, was arrested for transportation of marijuana, possession of marijuana for sale, and violation of his PRCS condition. He was booked at the Sacramento County Jail. A second suspect, 23 year old Lindsay Loya of Laverne, CA, was arrested on Tuesday, April 22nd in Los Angeles County on Sacramento County warrants for transportation of marijuana and

possession for sale of marijuana. An arrest warrant has also been issued for a third, unnamed suspect, who is still at large.

The task force believes that Loya and the third suspect were the main players and that Zahn was working for them.

"At this point, the case has been submitted to the Sacramento County District Attorney's office, but the investigation is continuing," said Chief Boyd.

A traffic stop on the 8300 Block of Oak Avenue approximately six to eight weeks prior, led to the raid of the El Dorado Hills residence. Officers found approximately 48 pounds of packaged, vacuum sealed, processed marijuana in the back of Zahn's vehicle. The packages consisted of three sealed boxes and all were prepared to ship to out of state addresses. The traffic stop was a result of an on-going SIU/PRCS enforcement team investigation involving Zahn, and led to the issuing of arrest warrants and a search warrant for the El Dorado Hills residence. The SIU and PRCS joined forces with the United States Department of Justice Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives and the United States Postal Inspection Service within 24 hours of the traffic stop.

Approximately 810 pounds of marijuana was discovered at the El Dorado Hills residence, much of which was hidden behind a false wall. Two large safes contained additional marijuana, seven firearms, ammunition, high capacity magazines, and \$464,850.00 in US currency.

Evidence seized during the search indicates the suspects had been shipping marijuana outside of California.

The Citrus Heights Police Department's SIU/ PRCS enforcement team was created in the spirit of agency cooperation, regionalization, and collaboration in response to prison realignment. The unit is a multi-agency team consisting of a Citrus Heights Police sergeant and detectives, a detective from the Folsom Police Department, and a full time assigned Probation Officer from the Sacramento County Probation Department. The mission of the

team is to monitor Post–Release

Community Supervision offenders. The task force routinely checks on offenders at home and at work, conducts surveil-Corrections Partnership. lance and gathers and follows

ulations and became effective on October 1, 2011. PRCS is a new status in addition to probation and parole, and requires that a County agency supervise any convicted felon released from state prison with a committing offense that was non-violent, non-serious, and not a high-risk sex offense, or inmates committed after admitting one serious or violent prior. The Sacramento Probation Department has been designated by the Board of Supervisors as the supervising County agency for the PRCS offender group. The Citrus Heights Police Department's investigation is on-going. Anyone with informa-

June 3 Primary is Only 39 Days From Now

The clock keeps ticking and the June 3rd primary is only 39 days after you read this issue of the "Rancho Cordova Grapevine Independent". As I said last week, approval of Proposition 41 will let us finish Proposition 12 that we passed overwhelmingly tive years ago with a bond that will help our veterans purchase housing. The other proposition, Proposition 42, was put on the ballot by the Legislature. What I have heard is that information from local agencies' (special districts, counties, and cities but not State agencies) must be given to the public because it is the public's right to know what their government is doing.

I'm not sure why the Legislature DIDN'T include themselves in this proposition, but what they DID include was transferring the cost of complying with the California Public Records Act from the State to local governments. In other words, paying the cost of \$10s of millions of dollars to comply with the law would no longer be

imposed upon the State. It would be up to the special districts, counties, and cities to come up with the \$10s of millions of dollars instead. It would be worth your while to read up on the propositions before you make a decision. The Public Records Act would be incorporated into the California State Constitution by Proposition 42 and would force local government agencies to pay the cost of all requests in full. George Bernard Shaw said, "A government that robs Peter to pay Paul can always depend on the support of Paul." I guess "Paul" is another name for the State government.

Usually in election years, it isn't hard to find someone outside of stores asking for your signature on whatever proposition they may be working on. Sometimes they are volunteers and other times they are paid signature gatherers, trying to get enough qualified signatures to put a proposition on the ballot. On April 17th, there was someone trying to get signatures for a proposition that would legalize marijuana. I'm not sure if it



4th election, but I have to admit that I don't have time to put my signature on a proposition that would put a controlled substance on the streets.

As most residents of Rancho Cordova know, our City Council has denied permits to anyone who is trying to open a marijuana shop in our city limits. Federal law still shows marijuana as an illegal drug and until the law is either changed and/or removed, it will remain listed in the City of Rancho Cordova as an illegal drug. There are many smart people here who know they shouldn't have to depend on a drug. I like Bill Cosby's idea: "A word to the wise ain't necessary - it's the stupid ones that need the advice.

Keith Dale Miller

Keith Dale Miller, (May 3, 1942 - April 13, 2014), devoted father, brother, English teacher, counselor, and coach, died Sunday, April 13, after a short bout with Pick's disease (a fast acting form of dementia). He was 71.

Mr. Miller inspired and shaped the lives of thousands of students, athletes, and fellow teachers. He began his 38 year career teaching and coaching basketball at Mitchell Jr. High school in 1965. He led the Mitchell Marauders to several championships. After 18 vears of teaching, he earned his Masters Degree and moved to Mills Jr. High as a counselor for 10 years, then moved to Cordova High as head counselor for 10 more years, before retiring in 2003.

Mr. Miller was born in Woodward, Oklahoma, the first of four, to Walter Miller, an auto mechanic, and Gene (Morris) Miller. He grew up in several towns with his mother, moving between cities in California and Oklahoma, while his father



fought in WWII. Once Walter returned from the war, they moved back to Woodward, in time to live through the deadliest tornado in Oklahoma history in 1947.

As a young boy in the 1940's, he loved listening to the Roy Rogers radio show and faithfully wore his Roy Rogers outfit, complete with cowboy hat, chaps, vest, guns, and spurs, which began his long lasting devotion to westerns. Collecting precious baseball cards (that his mother would famously give away later) and playing the game itself, were the driving forces

discovered his lifelong love of basketball and would devote the next 25 years to the sport, playing throughout jr. high and high school in Stockton, CA and back to Woodward, yet again. A basketball scholarship took him to Magic Valley Christian College in Idaho, and finally Pepperdine University, in Los Angeles, where he graduated with a degree in English.

Mr. Miller wil be terribly missed and forever remembered for his eternal sense of humor, his passion for reading, his lifelong love of the Bible and Christian faith, and his unending devotion to his family, children and grandchildren.

Mr. Miller is survived by three children: Michael Miller, Sandra Headley, Christopher Miller; brother, Ken Miller; sister, Lynne Gaumer. He is also survived by four grandchildren, and one great-grandchild.

Battle of the Wilderness Civil War Reenactment at Gibson Ranch Park

NORTH SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - May, 1864: "General Grant, promoted to commander of the Union Armies, planned to engage Lee's forces in Virginia until they were destroyed. North and South fought in an inconclusive battle in the Wilderness. Lee inflicted more casualties on the Union forces than his own army incurred, but unlike Grant, he had no replacements."

-Library of Congress, American Memory

May 4-May 22, 1864 marked a grueling battle that served as the crossroads of the Civil War and led to the conclusion of combat within America. The field of battle was 2100 square miles of Virginia wilderness with towering trees, thick underbrush, and swamps of brackish water. Each day, the resounding sounds of gunshots and booming cannon blasts rang through the region, including the sleepy community of Spotsylvania, VA.

General Grant and his Union men were camped on one side of the Rapidan River while General Lee's Confederate Army was on the other side. The exchange of black powder musket fire caused massive, uncontrollable underbrush fires which burned to death wounded Union and Confederate soldiers alike before their comrades could rescue them.

Not believing that General Lee could reach the area until May 5th, Grant intended to advance to the West, consolidate troops and position his forces to attack the Confederates. Alerted to General Grant's movements, Lee quickly devised a daring scheme to charge ahead and assault Union forces unexpectedly from the east. So began the infamous Civil War Battle of the Wilderness.

On Saturday, May 3rd and Sunday, May 4th, Gibson Ranch Park will host a Civil War Reenactment of the Battle of the Wilderness, with all the thrilling anticipation of the original

conflict. This is the second year Gibson Ranch Park has been transformed into a living history destination for Civil War battles, featuring the National Civil War Association's professional reenactors. The Ranch's gently rolling hills and other natural amenities provide the perfect venue to recreate one of America's most politically charged struggles, initiated 150 years ago.

The event will showcase life during the Civil War with living history camps, Civil War music and dancing, a mix of modern day and period food vendors, crafts representing the 1860s and a historical fashion show. Kids' activities will be held in "Civilian Town."






