RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - Children from Robin Mitchum's fourth grade class didn't need a dictionary to learn the meaning of the word 'manure' at last week's field trip to Soil Born Farms. The children gathered around a large mound of compost. They were encouraged to reach in, grab a handful, and sniff. Afterward, Soil Born Farms' instructor told them what was in their hands. Groans of "eww, yuck" rose in the fragrant air.

Thanks to a partnership between the Rotary Club of Rancho Cordova Sunrise, and Guy Galate, Soil Born's Education Director, this class of eager fourth-graders got to learn how the best soil produces the best produce. After spending time helping prepare one of the raised beds for planting, the class walked down to the river. Many students, all from Rancho Cordova Elementary, saw the river for the first time.

Michele Ranieri, the Community Outreach

Coordinator, connects the community to the farm. Many Cordova High students work at the farm after school. After completing a two-day class on construction, students and community members helped build a chicken coop. Lumber and fencing for the coop was donated by local businesses. The Sunrise Rotary Club stepped up with a financial contribution, enough to feed the chickens for an entire year.

Now there is one number to connect with Sacramento County service; on the web, by mobile app or by phone; the number is 311.

"We believe we are one of the few counties in California to bring 311 to an unincorporated area, and this service will enhance our efforts to revitalize some of Sacramento's core neighborhoods," said County Executive Bradley J. Hudson. "Residents can report concerns directly to 311 and representatives will do the rest."

Customer service representatives are available every day except holidays to answer questions, route calls, and manage cases for verification and resolution. Never remember another County number again... call 311!

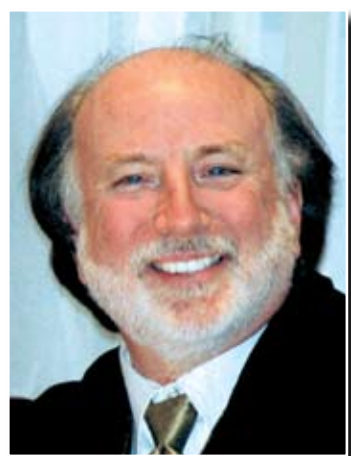

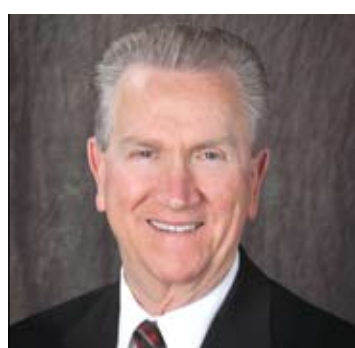

A few things are coming up that have been discussed in the past and while they aren't "new" topics, final decisions are coming closer. I am an alternate member of the Board of the Sacramento Regional County Sanitation District (SRCSD) and the Sacramento Area Sewer District (SASD). Additional costs that will be passed on to you and me over the next few years are a result of the decision that was made by the State Water Resources Control Board in 2010 that was initially going to triple our monthly bill from \$20 a month to approximately \$60. The staffs of those two boards have been working on reducing the costs by using pilot programs to reach the required water cleaning goals but at the same time, are working to cut the eventual bill to half it was initially. We will keep you informed about the progress that is being made on cutting our sanitation (sewer) costs.

Something else that is on everyone's mind is the drought. The rains that are coming late in the regular rainy season are beginning to make a bit of a dent in the disastrous drought we were seeing at the end of January. Now the experts on TV say that the rain we are

getting isn't really getting us out of the drought, but I would like to think that every rain drop we get is helping. Like many other people, I watch the water levels in Folsom Dam and other Northern California reservoirs going up. All of them are beginning to improve it seems, so let's hope the current trend of more rain will continue. We don't need to have more forest fires and not have much water to help put them out.

For those who are members of the Mather ICFAPP club (I Can't Find A Place to Park club), there is good news. The three-story garage is open and will be a great help for the VA Hospital at Mather for the patients, visitors, and people who are there for appointments, etc. Driving around and around and around may have been something to do to pass your time, but most people weren't happy members of the ICFAPP club. The garage was less than half full yesterday. So if you need to go the Mather Hospital, you won't have to worry about making sure you have a full tank of gas. In June, there will be a grand opening of a new Mental Health building at the Mather VA Hospital complex that will benefit those who need the help. That is only one of the new buildings that are either completed or are coming close to being completed at the VA complex for our Veterans. There will be more information as it becomes available. I am looking for some pictures of Mather Hospital of the past and pictures of the Mather complex of the present. And since Mather AFB was part of Rancho's past, this new

part of Rancho Cordova's present is unbelievable.

The Veterans who are coming to Mather Hospital and clinics have increased in number every year for the last 18 years. With the Veterans who are coming back from Afghanistan and Iraq as well as the Gulf War, these numbers aren't going to go down for quite a while. Following are some dates of U.S. participation that are rather staggering. WWI: April 6, 1917 to November 11, 1918; WWII: December 7, 1941 to December 31, 1946; Korean War: June 25, 1951 to January 31, 1955; Vietnam War: February 28, 1961 to May 7, 1975; Lebanon/Grenada: August 24, 1982 to July 31, 1984; Panama: December 20, 1989 to January 31, 1990; and Gulf War/War on Terrorism: August 2, 1990 to present.

Hard to believe isn't it, that that much of each generation is in some way or another connected to a war? I have used the following quote in the past, but looking at the news today about one country's troops going into another country, I have to again quote President Ronald Reagan, "All of us denounce war - all of us consider it man's greatest stupidity. And yet wars happen and they involve the most passionate lovers of peace because there are still barbarians in the world who set the price for peace at death or enslavement and the price is too high." ★

Anderson Gets 898th Career Victory in CAL Opener

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - In recent practices, members of the Cordova High School baseball team have worked on hitting the ball to the opposite field.

That proved to pay off handsomely in the Capital Athletic League opener at Mira Loma on March 28. Lancer outfielder Jerome Brown went 3-for-4 that included two triples – both going deep into right field – as that led to Cordova posting a 3-1 victory.

The win gave Cordova (1-0 in CAL, 4-5) head coach

Guy Anderson his 898th varsity career win, with a chance to win his 900th career game as early as today. Most right-handed batters in baseball usually hit the ball to left or center field.

But the extra time spent in the batting cage hitting the ball into right paid off for Brown, a senior.

“We had worked on opposite field hitting,” Anderson said.

Taylor Myers (2-for-4, RBI) and Trevor Tipton (2-for-4) helped the Lancers’ hitting attack in the game, as the squad finished with eight hits. Riley Robson contributed with a hit.

Cordova scored a run each in the first, third and seventh innings. Mira Loma scored its lone run in the bottom of the seventh inning.

On the mound, Robson, a junior, went the distance, giving up only six hits and striking out three Mira Loma batters.

“He did a real good job,” said Anderson on Robson.

Anderson is thinking about the Lancers’ next game, although the 900 wins is around the corner.

“We take it one game at a time,” Anderson said.

In a non-league game at the

Tigers’ field on March 25, the Lancers had four hits; Robson, Myers, Brown and Jarrett Harris had a hit each. Robson’s hit was a double.

On Monday, Cordova’s CAL home game against Rio Americano was postponed because of rain. On Wednesday, because of field conditions, Cordova’s home game against El Camino was also washed out.

The Lancers were scheduled to make-up their game against Rio Americano on Thursday, weather permitting. If this game was played, and the Lancers won, Anderson could be looking at his earliest chance to win his 900th Friday – when Cordova plays at Antelope in a CAL game.

Tomorrow – Saturday – Cordova would host Rio Americano if they couldn’t play on Thursday. Anderson said that the game would be played in the morning, but a time was not set as of press time.

Should the Lancers and Raiders play Saturday, Anderson could be looking at his 900th career win at this time, too. ★



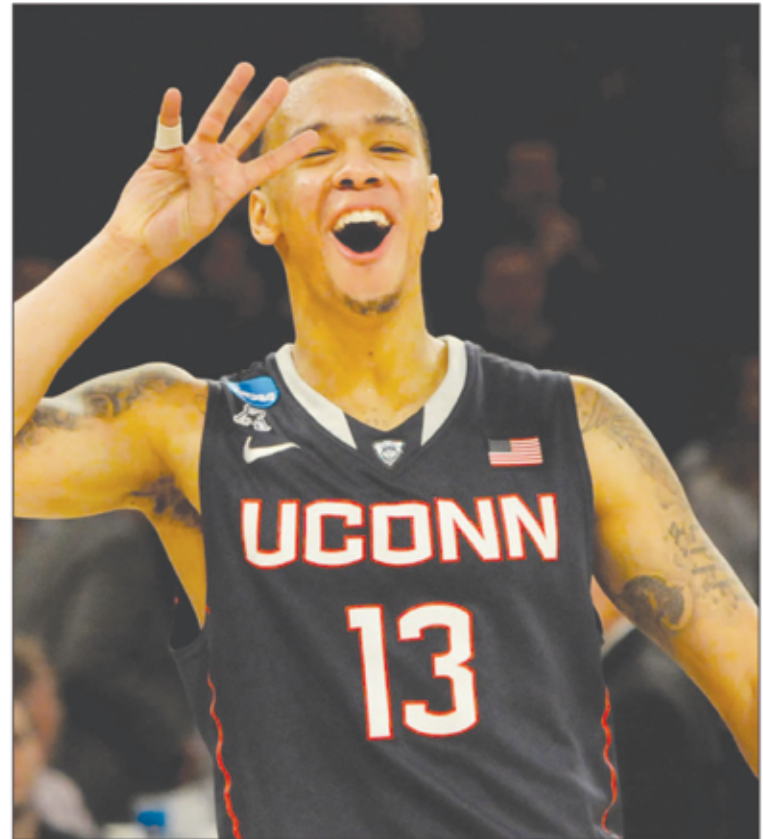

Family Dog Rescued From Fire, One Dog Perishes

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - Just before 3pm, Metro Fire crews responded to the 5600 block of Luce Lane for a report of visible flames from a duplex. The first two engines arrived less than four minutes after dispatch, and found one unit filled with thick, black smoke. The back bedroom of the unit was well involved in fire, so they immediately initiated fire attack. Bystanders informed crews that the residents had two dogs, so while actively fighting the fire, crews were searching for the pets.

As the fire was being contained, the crew on the first arriving engine found one of the dogs under the kitchen table, in significant respiratory distress. The dog was quickly pulled outside, where firefighters put a special Pet Mask on the dog and began supplying him with 100% oxygen. He was transported to a local veterinary hospital, and at the time of his arrival, the outcome was very uncertain.

Within a couple of hours, crews learned that they had actually saved the dog, and he is expected to make a full

recovery. With the help of the oxygen, quick transport, and treatment by the vet, the dog came home while crews were still mopping up. Seeing him struggling to live, and then later reunited with his loving family, was truly amazing."

Twenty-two firefighters from

Metro Fire worked to extinguish the fire, while protecting the adjoining unit. Due to aggressive fire fighting, the fire was contained to the unit of origin, saving the other unit from any damage.

Metro Fire Arson Investigators were on scene, with the cause currently under investigation. Tragically, the other dog did perish in the fire, though no civilians or firefighters were injured. ★

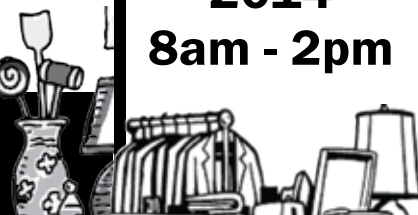
