

Affording the Affordable

61% of Renters Unable to Afford Modest Two-Bedroom Apartment



The housing bubble burst and the ensuing foreclosure crisis have not made housing more affordable to lower-income households. . One million low- income households in California do not have access to an affordable home, and not one county or legislative district in the state has an adequate supply of homes affordable to extremely

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - A new report released today finds that the typical renter in California earns nearly 30% less than what is required to rent a modest, twobedroom apartment.

The typical renter in California earns \$18.50 an hour, which is \$7.54 less than the \$26.04 hourly wage needed to afford a modest unit at Fair Market Rent.

\$26.04 is California's 2014 Housing Wage, revealed in Out of Reach 2014, a report jointly released by the National Low Income

Housing Coalition, a Washington, DC-based research and advocacy organization, and Housing California.

Every year, Out of Reach provides this figure, referred to as the Housing Wage, and other housing affordability data for every state, metropolitan area, combined non-metropolitan area, and county in the country.

An estimated 61% of renters in California do not earn enough to afford a two-bedroom

apartment at the Fair Market Rent. "California is short one million affordable homes for working families. Unless we act to replace the state housing finance tools we've lost as bond funds dried up and redevelopment was eliminated, record-setting rent increases and increased homelessness will be the new normal in California. It's time for action to dedicate a long-term source of state funding to build affordable homes for Californians in need, including

families, seniors, veterans, and people with Continued on Page 2 Get Ready for a Highway 50 Headache

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) -Caltrans is scheduled to rehabilitate a section of

U.S. Highway 50, known as the W/X Viaduct, in 2014. Built in 1968, this section of freeway is comprised of two 2,530 foot-long parallel structures that carry six lanes of traffic over city streets, freight, and light rail lines in downtown Sacramento. These structures have extensive cracking on the deck and are in need of rehabilitation in order to enhance safety, reduce recurring maintenance costs, and increase the life of the concrete decks.

The project broadly includes: 1) Placing a 4-inch concrete deck on top of the existing deck and tying it to the girders 2) Repairing cracks in the existing deck 3) Adding steel column

able. Many of these items have been covered with water for the past few years. This is the first of many large-scale volunteer events of the year for ARPF, which exists to "support the preservation and enjoyment of the American River Parkway by fostering environmental education, stewardship and volunteer opportunities" along the 23-mile section of the American River, that begins at the confluence of the Sacramento River and extends east to the Nimbus

Fish Hatchery. Cyclists, runners, picnic-goers, water enthusiasts and nature lovers are some of the groups who enjoy the parkway for various recreational activities.



disabilities," said Sen. Mark DeSaulnier, Chair of the Senate Transportation and Housing Committee and author of the California Homes and Jobs Act. "SB 391 is a critical part of the solution to spur creation of affordable homes and reduce the number of homeless Californians."

Working at the minimum wage in California, a family must have 3.3 wage earners working fulltime, or one full-time earner working 130 hours to afford a modest two-bedroom apartment. Even with the upcoming twopart minimum wage increase in California, too many workers will be left without an affordable

The national Housing Wage is \$18.92 in 2014. This year, California is the second mostexpensive state in the nation for renters.

With the elimination of

redevelopment that provided \$1 billion in state investment for affordable homes each year and the exhaustion of funds from the state's voter-approved housing bonds, California's affordability crisis will only grow worse unless legislators act to identify new sources of state investment.

An important piece of the solution to California's affordable homes crisis is the California Homes and Jobs Act (SB 391), which dedicates investment to public-private partnerships that will build 10,000 safe and affordable single-family homes and apartments each year for Californians in need. This state investment of approximately \$500 million per year would leverage another \$2.79 billion in federal, local, and bank dollars to build affordable rental and for-sale homes for families, seniors, veterans, and people with disabilities. At the same time, this investment would

reduce homelessness, and result in significant savings to taxpayers. SB 391 is a wise investment for all of California, creating 29,000 jobs annually, primarily in the beleaguered construction sector and help businesses attract and retain the talent that fuels California's economy.

The California Homes and Jobs Act is endorsed by more than 600 organizations and hundreds of individuals who know that building homes and creating jobs is a business imperative, a public-safety issue, and critical to helping California's budget live within its means.



SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - On March 17th Assemblyman Ken Cooley (D-Rancho awarded Cordova) Sacramento County District Attorney Jan Scully with the California State Assembly's 2014 Woman of the Year Award. Earlier this year, Assemblyman Cooley nominated Scully for the award for her work as Sacramento's chief criminal prosecutor and as a principal victim rights advocate in the region.

"20 years ago, in her first year as Sacramento County District Attorney, Jan was selected as "Woman of the Year" by the late Assemblywoman Barbara Alby. It is a great privilege to honor Jan as Woman of the Year on the Floor of the Assembly again as she closes out two decades of outstanding service to the people of Sacramento," said Cooley.

"Jan has spent her entire life in Sacramento, and has dedicated her career as a prosecutor to putting criminals behind bars and protecting her community," said Cooley. "Her more than 30 years of service has made Sacramento a truly safer place. From prosecuting child abusers and murderers to establishing greater ties with the community, this honor only touches on the outstanding work she has done for us."

After graduating from law school in 1979, Scully began working as a deputy district attorney in Sacramento County. During her career, she supervised various prosecution teams including sexual assault, child abuse, and felony trials. Scully was first elected as the Sacramento County District Attorney in November 1994, and over the past 20 years has led her office in building stronger ties with residents and community leaders, focusing to

help solve quality-of-life issues.

"It is truly an honor to

receive this award and I thank Assemblyman Cooley for his nomination and ongoing support of my work as district attorney," said Scully. "I am proud to be among the many women who have broken new ground, forged new paths and served to inspire future women leaders across all sectors and segments of

our society."

In 1995, Scully established a Citizens Cabinet, a group of community leaders who advised her on matters of policies and programs. In 2001, she established the District Attorney Multi-Cultural Community Council, with community leaders from the area's diverse ethnic, racial, and cultural communities, to help bridge the gap between their communities and the criminal justice system. In addition, Scully's leadership in community engagement received national

attention for her Community Prosecution Unit's success in working with local coalitions to reduce crime at the neighborhood-level.

"Jan Scully has an outstanding record of putting bad people behind bars and making the results of their actions less grievous for their victims. She has always spent the extra time needed to better work with and engage her community," said Cooley. "She is truly a role model for young women, and us all, to be more thoughtful in our roles as citizens, and act on issues that will make our neighborhoods and community better than they are."

Led by the California Legislative Women's Caucus, the Woman of the Year ceremony highlights the work of woman leaders in California, and continues the importance of recognizing their contributions during Women's History

be found at http://www.arpf.org. "Weather" you like it or not, volunteers are the life blood of keeping the American River Parkway clean. There are some who camp along the river and abuse the Parkway with contaminations of many sorts. Think of how all 28 miles of the Parkway would look if the tons of trash weren't picked up by the volunteers. It would be very sad indeed.

In addition to new flowers, new leaves on trees, and the new birth of many animals, spring also seems to bring a continued campaign for candidates for almost all State and Federal offices. I said almost because United States Senators are elected for six years and don't have to campaign as much as the others do. In addition to Senators, when was the last time you heard about a judicial campaign? Some judges are elected for 12 years! For all intents and purposes, all other campaigns have been expanded to two year freefor-alls between candidates of all political parties. That includes the Presidential campaign.

Instead of what seems to be a perpetual political campaign for almost all political offices that you hear about, what if campaigns were limited to two-thirds of the year or three-quarters of the year? I thought about one-half of a year for campaigns, but some candidates are chosen for the November elections in the June primary elections so one-half of a year wouldn't work for them. Now we are talking about all campaigns being limited to the year of the election.

If this would happen, let's see how that could affect some jobs. The President would not have to worry about campaigning for the next six years because they could not be elected for another term. Therefore, the President would have all six years to work and do the job they were hired to do. They would even have the ability to focus on the points and goals that got them elected! Currently, it seems the first two years the President is both learning the job and working; then next two years, they are campaigning. If they are re-elected, they have two years to work and then both work and campaign for their party's next candidate.

Congressmen are elected in November and in January, we start getting emails asking for money for their next campaign - this is the same for California Assembly Members. When the people of California changed the term limits to 12 years for the State Assembly (six two-year terms) and 12 years for the State Senators (three four-year terms), it changed the dynamics of some State offices. We will have to see how that works out, but it may work out better because the elected officials will have time to learn and do their jobs before they are lame ducks. When you think about it, there are very few times at a carnival when there isn't a line of ducks that are targets. Seems to fit doesn't



casings for seismic strengthening.4)Improved traffic operations throughout the project area. The service life of the structure decks will be extended to about 20 years, which will significantly reduce maintenance expenditures. The completed project will also provide widening at the shoulders, new joint seals, new concrete barriers and railings, energy-efficient lighting standards, and enhanced safety. Project Schedule: The project is broadly organized into two Stages: Stage 1 - May 2 -22, 2014: Eastbound Highway 50 Stage 2 – May 28 – June 17, 2014: Westbound Highway 50. Two-way traffic will flow on the opposite side of the roadwork.

The following ramp closures will occur: Stage 1: 11th Street On-Ramp, 16th Street On-Ramp, Southbound Highway 99 connector ramp from eastbound Highway 50, Eastbound Business 80 connector ramp from eastbound Highway 50, Stage 2: 16th Street Off-Ramp, 10th Street Off-Ramp, Connector Ramp from westbound Business 80 to westbound Highway 50, Connector Ramp from northbound Highway 99 to westbound Highway 50.

Here is some key information: Where is the work happening? The closure will take place in Sacramento on the elevated section of U.S. Highway 50 known as the W/X Viaduct, south of downtown, between 18th and

24th Streets. When does the project start? Traffic-interfering work on the project will occur in two stages: •Stage 1: May 2 - 22 (Eastbound US Highway 50) •Stage 2: May 28 – June 17 (Westbound US Highway 50) Non-traffic interfering work will take place through the spring, summer and fall of 2014.

Will the whole highway be closed? Only one direction of the freeway will be closed at a time. Two-way traffic will be diverted to the westbound lanes of Highway 50. Alternate routes are available here for maps showing alternate routes and detours to go around the project work. Will the highway be closed at night too? Work will continue 24 hours a day on each side of the highway until it is resurfaced.

Will there be any ramp closures? During Stage 1 (May 2 - 22), the following ramps will be closed: •11th Street On-Ramp •16th Street On-Ramp Connector ramp from eastbound Highway 50 to southbound

Highway 99 •Connector ramp from eastbound Highway 50 to eastbound Business 80.

During Stage 2, the following ramps will be closed: •16th Street Off-Ramp •10th Street Off-Ramp •Connector ramp from westbound Business 80 to westbound Highway 50 •Connector Ramp from northbound Highway 99 to westbound Highway 50.

Why is this project happening? Age and heavy use have caused extensive wear and cracking. The roadbed, which was built in 1968, needs to be completely resurfaced in order to reduce recurring maintenance costs, and increase the life of the concrete deck. The existing highway deck will be sealed with a protective coat to minimize future cracking and a new four-inch thick slab of concrete will be applied and secured to the girders.

What impact will this project have on traffic? There will be significant traffic delays on the Viaduct, as well as on other freeways and roadways serving the Sacramento area. Plan your commute route now using the alternate route maps to avoid confusion when the project starts. Commuters can help to reduce traffic congestion by temporarily changing work schedules to avoid rush hour, carpooling, reducing unnecessary trips, and using other forms of transportation such as biking, walking, or Sacramento Regional Transit (Light Rail and bus) system.

Is the W/X Viaduct structure safe? The W/X Viaduct is safe to drive on. There are no structural problems — only the top surface deck needs work to be resurfaced. Although there are no safety problems with the Viaduct, the completed project will also enhance future safety and traffic operations by creating wider shoulders and installing new joint seals, new concrete

barriers and railings, new energy efficient lighting standards, and steel column casings for seismic strengthening.

Will there be construction during the State Fair? No – there will be no closure during the month of

Will there be closures over Memorial Day Weekend? The highway will be open over Memorial Day Weekend. Work on the eastbound side is scheduled to be completed by May 22nd, before the Memorial Day Weekend. Westbound work will resume after the weekend, on May 28th.

What does the non-traffic interfering work include? Some work will take place underneath the viaduct to strengthen the supporting columns for earthquake preparedness. This work will not require any road closures.

What will Highway 50 look like after the closure? The existing highway deck will be sealed with a protective coat to minimize future cracking and a new four-inch thick slab of concrete will be applied and secured to the structure. The completed project will include wider shoulders, new joint seals, new concrete barriers and railing, new energy-efficient lighting, and steel column casings for seismic strengthening.

Florida, the No. 1 overall seed in the NCAA Tournament, didn't dominate during the opening weekend but played well enough to advance to the Sweet 16 for the fourth straight season. The Gators were never seriously threatened in a 67-55 win over Albany in the Round of 64, but coach Billy Donovan made it known he was not pleased with his team's effort. Florida played better in its 61-45 win over Pittsburgh, but this veteran team — the Gators start four seniors - will need to be at its best on Thursday against UCLA. The Bruins are highly skilled on offense and have won five straight games.

Underdog – Dayton

The Flyers rewarded their passionate (and loyal) fans with the school's first trip to the Sweet 16 since 1984. Dayton opened the NCAA Tournament with a thrilling win over in-state rival Ohio State - a school that refuses to play the Flyers during the regular season - and then responded with a two-point win over Syracuse two days later. Archie Miller's team secured an at-large invitation by winning nine of 10 games heading into the A-10 Tournament, but not much was expected from the Flyers in the NCAAs. Now, they are one win away from a trip to the Elite Eight.

Florida vs. UCLA - part four

For the fourth time in the past nine seasons, Florida and UCLA will meet in the NCAA Tournament. The Gators have gotten the best of the Bruins, winning the previous three games by an average of 11.3 points. They beat UCLA 73-57 in the 2006 National Championship Game, 76-56 in the '07 Final Four and 73-65 in the '11 Round of 32. The Quote

The Cays are an elite defensive team that prefers to play at a slow pace, but they are not without skilled offensive players. Guard Malcolm Brogdon averaged 14.8 points in ACC games, and forward Joe Harris is a 40.5 percent 3-point shooter. This team is capable of scoring some points - just ask Memphis.

Underdog - UConn

It's hard to label a team that won a national championship as recently as 2011 as a true underdog, but UConn is the lowest-seeded team remaining in the East Region. The Huskies will lean heavily on guard Shabazz Napier, who has been brilliant in the NCAA Tournament. He scored 24 points in the overtime win over Saint Joseph's in the Round of 64 and then poured in 25 points (in only 25 minutes) in UConn's impressive 77-65 win


