

**Experts to Discuss Groundwater Strategies for California's Severe Drought**

*Special Report from Groundwater Resources Association of California*

**SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG)**

- As parched California faces another severe drought with no end in sight, water resource experts from local, state and federal governments will gather in Sacramento to discuss groundwater management strategies during this prolonged water crisis. Groundwater Resources Association of California (GRA) in partnership with the U.S. Society for Irrigation and Drainage Professionals (USCID) will host a two-day issues forum in Sacramento.

"With roughly 30 percent of water delivery being provided by groundwater it is essential this valuable resource is managed properly," said GRA President Ted Johnson. "Another issue of significant concern is how the drought exacerbates the possibility of contaminated groundwater. With less water available to dilute the contaminants, the threat to public health increases," stated Johnson.

The conference titled, "Groundwater Issues & Water Management: Addressing Sustainability & Drought" will be held March 4-5, 2014, at the Lions Gate Hotel at McClellan Park. Speakers will address a wide range of issues that are linked to groundwater resources and management challenges including the interaction between surface and groundwater as well as water recycling, groundwater recharge, salts and nutrients, contaminants and well maintenance.

It is reported that at last count, 10 communities have less than 60 days of water and water deliveries to 750,000 acres of farmland and 25 million people have been halted. Recently Governor Jerry Brown declared a state of emergency due to the dwindling water supply which was followed by a visit from President Barack Obama who provided \$200 million in relief dollars.

"The length and severity of this current drought is unpredictable," said Johnson. "California needs to prepare for the worst, hope for rain and be smarter about water management and usage. Our groundwater is a key part of California's water supply, and that is what will be discussed at the conference."

## Congressman Bera Tours Sacramento County Farms and Businesses Impacted by Drought

**SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG)** - Congressman Ami Bera recently toured local dairy and cattle farms in Elk Grove and Rancho Murieta, as well as companies in Folsom that rely on the local clean water supply, to survey and bring attention to the local impacts of California's drought. Bera brought a representative from the United States Department of Agriculture Natural Resources Conservation Service along for the farm tours so that the federal agency could learn more about the drought's impact on Sacramento County.

"California's historic drought is hurting many Sacramento



County small businesses and individuals, but our entire local economy," said Bera. "I'm doing

everything I can to both help those being affected in the short term, and to find long-term solutions for securing water access and storage that add to our water supply rather than taking from it."

Bera visited Walter Hardesty Beef, Van Steyn Dairy, and Van Vleck Ranch. The ranchers raised concerns about having to cull their herds to stay afloat as production costs rise. Though ranchers are no strangers to drought, the current drought conditions are worsened, the say, by several dry years in a row. The Sacramento County Farm Bureau helped arrange the tours.

# Batter Up! Senior Softball Capital of the World

## SACRAMENTO REGION (MPG)

- Sacramento is the "Senior Softball Capital of the World". This is what Larry Campbell, the Commissioner of the Golden Seniors Softball League would tell you. And he is convinced this statement is true. The Golden Seniors Softball League includes many areas that are within 60 miles of the city of Sacramento. The region they cover is not just where they play their games, at the baseball park in Carmichael Park, off of Fair Oaks Blvd, and Grant Avenue. The region covers the cities where they travel from to get to their games. The players come from Penn Valley near Grass Valley, Placerville, Marysville, and Magalia, near Paradise, Elk Grove and South Sacramento, Roseville, Lincoln, and Davis, as well as all of the Sacramento metro area.

This large region is the Senior Softball Capital of the World! It started with the introduction of baseball in New York in 1847. Baseball had several creators, but it was Alexander Cartwright

who conceived the standardized rules for this new unorganized

game. The introduction of those new rules enabled baseball to be

played by consistent guidelines in many different cities and communities. His rules included the layout of the diamond, the foul lines, the distance between bases and the pitcher's plate, the number of balls and strikes, etc. The standardized games grew in popularity, so much so that it became America's favorite pastime sport. So, after Baseball began to flourish in New York in 1847, what happened in our state in 1848, just one year later?

Gold was discovered in Northern California. This discovery created a steady influx of young men, including Alexander Cartwright. Thousands of young men made the hard journey across the plains to Northern California, where Sutter's Fort,

located in Sacramento, was the hub. Alexander Cartwright was among the early gold miners. He was in our area for several years before moving on to Hawaii. It is believed that he must have introduced baseball to the gold miners, who were in need of an occasional break from the hard and tedious work of gold mining. California became a new state in 1849

Sacramento has a long history of being a strong baseball town. Baseball has always been very popular in Sacramento schools and with the Sacramento Solons. The Sacramento Solons were a minor league baseball team based in Sacramento, California. They played in the Pacific Coast League during several periods (1903, 1905,

1909-1914, 1918-1960, 1974-1976). The current Sacramento River Cats began play in West Sacramento in 2000.

Introducing: the first Golden Senior Softball team: 1976- They were the world's 1st weekly baseball league of four teams of 80+ years/ age players. At that time, the only teams at their senior level of play who would play against them were young women's teams and leagues. In appreciation and honor of those 1976 young women's teams who helped them get started, the 75+years/ age league invites all female softball players of any age who want to join them on Thursday AM to please come and feel welcome. The league's mission is to have more fun while playing softball with many friends who have senior aches and pains like they do, and to try to remember their turn at bat while socializing. The Golden Seniors Softball League consists of three different levels of players.

As baseball players age, their game evolves into fast pitch softball, then co-ed slow pitch softball, and finally senior slow pitch softball. 



## Here Are a Few Follow-ups...

VFW and other Veterans' organizations use of the Riverview Elementary School as their office and address. Another option is that they can use what was the multi-purpose room for their meetings, etc. They have to go to the Folsom Cordova Unified School District (FCUSD) official site on-line or go to the FCUSD office and get the "Facilities Use Application Form." The form is headed with "Application for the Use of School Facilities" and when completed, they can use the school. I will pass on more news as I receive it.

Another program that is moving forward is the "Veterans Village" at Mather. We have put Phase 1 together as much as we can at the moment. We are now waiting for both the Continuum of Care award which helps with program operation and the 9% Tax Credit application which can't be submitted until March

5th. Mercy Housing, the Veterans Resource Center, Sacramento County, and the City of Rancho Cordova are working together to begin building Phase 1. When Phase 1 is actually begun, then Phases 2 and 3 will follow much faster. Getting something started seems to be the hardest part of any project.

Phase 2 will have a smaller budget than Phase 1 or 3, but \$3.5 million isn't exactly peanuts. We are looking for help from some of our businesses in Rancho Cordova who have shown strong support for Veterans. If companies like AeroJet can provide grants or support in Washington D.C., it will definitely help. When the finances are there, we will be able to get some of the homeless Veterans off the streets. ★

# Sacramento Baroque Soloists Seduce With The Chaconne

**SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG)** - Traveling from the New World to Spain and then to spread throughout Europe, the musical form chaconne--with its hypnotic bass line--became an accompaniment and provocation for dancing. Sacramento Baroque Soloists explore the scope of this seductive, mystical dance along with its counterparts, the passacaglia and the bergamasca, in their last concert set of the season, March 15, 16, and 22.

The Soloists will be joined by soprano Anne-Marie Dicce, who will perform vocal chaconnes of Monteverdi and Charpentier, as well as selections from Handel's Nine German Arias. The ensemble will also perform chaconnes,

passacaglias, and bergamascas by Uccellini, Merula, Lully, and Purcell.

Dicce is a co-founder of the early music group Bach Collegium San Diego and performs regularly with that group as a soloist. She returns to her native Sacramento to perform for the first time with Sacramento Baroque Soloists.

Dicce will be joined by Sacramento Baroque Soloists violinists Lisa Marie Lawson and Marieke Furnee, cellist and guitarist Michael Lawson, and harpsichordist Ellen Schinnerer Deffner.

Sacramento Baroque Soloists, formed in 2001, is Sacramento's leading instrumental baroque

ensemble. The group performs on period-style instruments music written between 1600 and 1800. In their twelfth season, the Soloists expanded to three venues, adding the popular Harris Center in Folsom.

# Humor, Intrigue, Romance, Science Abound In "Arcadia," Opening Feb. 28 At ARC Theatre

# Congressman Bera Tours Sacramento County Farms and Businesses Impacted by Drought

Bera also visited Kikkoman Soy Sauce manufacturing plant and Gekkeikan Sake factory in the City of Folsom. Both companies located in the area because of its direct access to clean surface water and agricultural products in the valley. Both companies are conserving water in ways that have yet to impact production, but have concerns if the drought situation does not improve. The drought is anticipated to cause price increases for the agricultural products that are essential to the production of soy sauce and sake, such as rice, soy, and wheat.

In addition to the tours this week, Bera held a Drought Resources Workshop Tuesday with representatives from the USDA and Small Business Administration to inform local famers and small business owners about the resources available to them from the federal government. Those who were unable to attend the workshop

Bera is also working in Congress to preserve Sacramento County's water supply. He has helped lead the fight against the misguided Bay Delta Conservation Plan to build tunnels under the Delta, and a recent partisan water grab bill. Both would take already-scarce water from Sacramento

County and send it to other parts of the state. He also voted in January to reauthorize the Emergency Drought Relief Act and helped secure funding for upgrades to the Folsom Dam that will increase its water storage capacity to help during future dry periods and give us greater flood protection. ★



### ORDINANCE NUMBER 13/14-1

#### ORDINANCE OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE CORDOVA RECREATION AND PARK DISTRICT LEVYING SPECIAL TAX WITHIN COMMUNITY FACILITIES DISTRICT NO. 2014-01 (MONTELENA)

WHEREAS, on November 20, 2013, this Board adopted a Resolution entitled "Resolution of the Board of Directors of the Cordova Recreation and Park District of Intention to Establish Community Facilities District" (the "Resolution of Intention"), and has conducted proceedings (the "Proceedings") to establish "Cordova Recreation and Park District Community Facilities District No. 2014-01 (Montelena)" (the "CFD") pursuant to the Mello-Roos Community Facilities Act, Chapter 2.5 of Part 1 of Division 2 of Title 5, commencing with Section 53311, of the California Government Code (the "Act") to finance certain municipal services (the "Services") as provided in the Act; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to notice as specified in the Act, and as part of the Proceedings, the Board has held a public hearing under the Act relative to the determination to proceed with the formation of the CFD and the rate and method of apportionment of the special tax ("Special Tax") to be levied within the CFD to finance the Services, and at such hearing all persons desiring to be heard on all matters pertaining to the formation of the CFD and the levy of the Special Tax were heard, substantial evidence was presented and considered by this Board and a full and fair hearing was held; and

WHEREAS, upon the conclusion of the hearing, this Board adopted its "Resolution of the Board of Directors of the Cordova Recreation and Park District of Formation of Community Facilities District" (the "Resolution of Formation"), pursuant to which it completed the Proceedings for the establishment of the CFD, the authorization of the levy of the Special Tax within the CFD and the calling of an election within the CFD on the propositions of levying the Special Tax and establishing an appropriations limit within the CFD, respectively; and

WHEREAS, on January 15, 2014, a special election was held among the landowner voters within the CFD at which time such voters approved such propositions by the two-thirds vote required by the Act, which approval has been confirmed by Resolution of this Board.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDAINED BY the Board of Directors of the Cordova Recreation and Park District, acting as the Board of Directors of the Cordova Recreation and Park District Community Facilities District No. 2014-01 (Montelena) (the "CFD") which hereby orders as follows:

1. By the passage of this Ordinance, the Board hereby authorizes and levies the Special Tax within the CFD pursuant to the Act, at the rate and in accordance with the rate and method of apportionment of Special Tax set forth in the Resolution of Formation which rate and method is by this reference incorporated herein. The Special Tax is hereby levied commencing in Fiscal Year 2014-15 and in each fiscal year thereafter to pay for the Services for the CFD, as contemplated by the Resolution of Formation and the Proceedings and all costs of administering the CFD.

2. The District's District Administrator or designee, or an employee or consultant of the District, is hereby authorized and directed each fiscal year to determine the specific Special Tax to be levied for the next ensuing fiscal year for each parcel of real property within the CFD, in the manner and as provided in the Resolution of Formation.

3. Exemptions from the levy of the Special Tax shall be as provided in the Resolution of Formation and the applicable provisions of the Act. In no event shall the Special Tax be levied on any parcel within the CFD in excess of the maximum Special Tax specified in the Resolution of Formation.

4. All of the collections of the Special Tax shall be used as provided in the Act and in the Resolution of Formation, including, but not limited to, the payment of costs of the Services, the payment of the costs of the District in administering the CFD, and the costs of collecting and administering the Special Tax.

5. The Special Tax shall be collected in the same manner as ordinary ad valorem taxes are collected and shall have the same lien priority, and be subject to the same penalties and the same procedure and sale in cases of delinquency as provided for ad valorem taxes; provided, however, that the Board may provide for other appropriate methods of collection by Resolution(s) of the Board. In addition, the provisions of Section 53356.1 of the Act shall apply to delinquent Special Tax payments. The District Administrator is hereby authorized and directed to provide all necessary information to the Auditor/Tax Collector of the County of Sacramento in order to effect proper billing and collection of the Special Tax, so that the Special Tax shall be included on the secured property tax roll of the County of Sacramento for Fiscal Year 2014-15 and for each fiscal year thereafter until no longer required to pay for the Services or until otherwise terminated by the District.

6. If for any reason any portion of this Ordinance is found to be invalid, or if the Special Tax is found inapplicable to any particular parcel within the CFD, by a court of competent jurisdiction, the balance of this Ordinance and the application of the Special Tax to the remaining parcels within the CFD shall not be affected.

7. The Chairperson shall sign this Ordinance and the Clerk of the Board shall cause the same to be published immediately after its passage at least once in a newspaper of general circulation circulated in the District.

8. This Ordinance shall take effect 30 days from the date of final passage.

**RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG)** - In addition to winning the Capital Athletic League title, the Cordova High School boys basketball team landed a first-round playoff game.

The Lancers earned the No. 8 seed in the CIF Sac-Joaquin Section Division II playoffs. Cordova (18-8) hosted Rocklin, the No. 9 seed that finished in third place in the Sierra Foothill League on Wednesday at the Lancers' gym. The Thunder (15-12) and Lancers did not face each other during the regular season. "They have good size, well-coached team," said Cordova head coach Fletcher Johnson of Rocklin. "They can run, they like to bang inside, rebound and kick it inside. They get outside, and run and pass well."

Behind SFL champion Del Oro, which went 10-0 for the title, the league was a battle among the other five schools that included Rocklin, Johnson noted.

"I thought it was a very strong league," Johnson said. "That league is real competitive with some good rivalries. They (Rocklin) are playoff tested, and they are ready."

Teams are battling for their playoff lives in the first two rounds. Boys and girls

receive a Nor Cal playoff berth. The Nor Cal playoffs start after the section title games are played March 7 and 8.

"In the playoffs, you play one game at a time," said Johnson, who is in his third year as head coach

If Cordova defeated Rocklin, it will play the Folsom-Grace Davis/Vallejo game. The Lady Lancers stayed within striking distance of the Lady Titans after three quarters, 46-32. But the chances of a fourth quarter rally was stopped by the Titans, who held the Lancers to seven points while scoring 15 for the win.

### El Camino 55, Cordova 43

In the Feb. 11 home game, the visiting Eagles jumped out to a 16-10 lead, and 30-22 at half-time. The Lancers were within striking distance, but the Eagles held them to nine points in the third quarter while scoring 11 that helped secure the win. Cordova was led by Curney with 10 points. Ware followed with eight points, Alyssa Wilson and Nikki Jones had six points each, Midori Mekata and Newton five each, and Leila Cooper three.

### Looking back and forward

Although Cordova still had a shot of a Sac-Joaquin Section

playoff berth until the third to final league game of the season, Bradley feels his players gained confidence that will carry over into their lives on and off the court.

"It didn't turn out the way we wanted to," said Bradley, "but the girls became more confident."

Bradley loses three seniors on this year's team - Newton and her sister Monae Newton, and Kayla Hontz. There are 12 players on this year's team. Next school year, Cordova returns to the Sierra Valley Conference for all sports as part of the section's league realignment cycle for 2014-18. The Lancers played in the SVC from the mid-1990s to 2010 when it was Division II. But the conference is D-IV, although school enrollment numbers are used to determine which division a school will play in for basketball playoffs. Cordova will join Rosemont, Union Mine, El Dorado, Galt and Liberty Ranch, Galt's second high school, in the SVC.

"We're excited about next year," Bradley said. "(Returning to the SVC) should benefit us. We should be fine." ★

## Prime Time Players

**MARCUS SMART, OKLAHOMA STATE**  
Smart was sensational in his return from a three-game suspension, scoring 16 points and adding 10 assists, six steals, three rebounds and two blocks in Oklahoma State's much-needed 84-62 win over Texas Tech on Saturday. Then, on Monday night, Smart scored 17 points and had eight rebounds, seven assists and five steals in the Pokes' 76-54 victory at TCU. The Cowboys, once ranked in the top 10, had lost seven straight games — the final three with Smart serving a suspension for pushing a fan in the final seconds of a loss at Texas Tech on Feb. 8.

**MONTREZL HARRELL, LOUISVILLE**  
Russ Smith hit the game-winning shot, but Harrell, a sophomore forward, was Louisville's best player as the Cardinals recorded a 58-57 win at Cincinnati in a battle of American Athletic Conference heavyweights. Harrell scored 21 points and grabbed 10 rebounds — his seventh double-double of the season — to help Louisville move into a tie with Cincinnati (in the loss column) in the American.

**KENNY GAINS, GEORGIA**  
Gains poured in a career-high 27 points (on 9-of-14 shooting) to lead Georgia to a dominating 73-56 win at South Carolina. The Bulldogs have won five of their last six and sit alone in third place in the SEC with a 9-5 record in league play.

**DEANDRE KANE, IOWA STATE**  
Kane continues to make a strong case for Big 12 Player of the Year honors. The senior guard scored 20 points, grabbed six rebounds and handed out five assists in Iowa State's 71-60 win at TCU. A fifth-year transfer from Marshall, Kane is averaging 16.3 points, 6.6 rebounds and 6.0 assists.

**STEPHEN HOLT, SAINT MARY'S**  
Holt enjoyed a career day, scoring 35 points — nearly half of his team's total — to lead Saint Mary's to a 76-54 win at Santa Clara. The senior guard, who scored only seven points in a loss to San Francisco two days earlier, hit 14-of-17 from the field (including 4-of-6 from 3-point range).

**JABARI PARKER, DUKE**  
Parker scored 19 points — the final two on a huge bucket in the lane with 1:31 remaining — and grabbed 10 rebounds to help Duke beat Syracuse 66-60 at the Carrier Dome. This was the second meeting of the two ACC powers in the last three weeks. Syracuse won the first game, 91-89 in overtime.

**LEVI RANDOLPH, ALABAMA**  
Randolph scored a total of 24 points as Alabama went 1-6 in a season-killing seven-game stretch from Jan. 30-Feb. 20. The junior guard scored 33 on Saturday night to lead the Crimson Tide to an 80-73 win over Missouri. Randolph connected on 11-of-15 from the field, including 5-of-7 from 3-point range.

**NIK STAUSKAS, MICHIGAN**  
Stauskas delivered in the clutch to help Michigan complete the season sweep over Michigan State. The sharp-shooting guard scored a game-high 25 points (on 9-of-13 shooting) and also had a team-high five assists to lead Michigan to its 11th Big Ten win of the season. Stauskas, who leads the team in scoring (16.7 ppg), had 19 points in the Wolverines' win in East Lansing in late January.

**DELON WRIGHT, UTAH**  
Utah snapped a two-game losing streak and moved back to one game under .500 in league play (7-8) thanks to a big game from Wright. The junior guard scored 22 points, grabbed nine rebounds and added six assists as the Utes coasted to an easy 86-63 win over Arizona State in Salt Lake City.

**T.J. WARREN, NC STATE**  
Warren, the ACC's leading scorer, scored 31 points to help NC State post a 71-64 win over Virginia Tech in Blacksburg. A sophomore forward, Warren connected on 3-pointers on the Wolfpack's first two possessions and scored 17 of his team's 35 points in the first half. He is averaging 23.3 points and 7.1 rebounds.

**CAMERON BAIRSTOW, NEW MEXICO**  
Bairstow was dominant in the Lobos' biggest win of the season. The senior forward scored 26 points (on 11-of-18 shooting) and grabbed nine rebounds to lead New Mexico to a 58-44 win over San Diego State in a showdown of the top two teams in the Mountain West.

**TERRAN PETTEWAY, NEBRASKA**  
Petteway is making a strong push for first-team All-Big Ten honors. The sophomore swingman scored 29 points on Sunday to lead surging Nebraska to a 76-57 win over Purdue. Three days earlier, Petteway scored 26 in the Huskers' 80-67 victory over Penn State. Nebraska has won five straight games and is now 8-6 in the Big Ten.

**JOEL EMBIID, KANSAS**  
Embiid, the potential No. 1 pick in the 2014 NBA Draft, filled up the stat sheet Monday night in Kansas' 83-75 win over Oklahoma. The freshman center scored 12 points (on only five field goal attempts) and had 13 rebounds, three assists, three blocks and four steals to help the Jayhawks secure no worse than a share of their 10th straight Big 12 championship.

**CINCINNATI AT UCONN**  
Cincinnati is tied (in the loss column) with Louisville atop the American Athletic Conference standings with three games to play. This team continues to struggle shooting the ball (33.1 percent from 3; 47.2 percent from 2), but a tenacious defense always gives the Bearcats a chance to win. UConn lost at home to SMU on Sunday, but the Huskies had won their previous four games. An NCAA Tournament bid is certain barring a late collapse.

**LOUISVILLE AT MEMPHIS**  
Here's another key game in the American on Saturday. Louisville is playing as well as any team in the nation of late. The Cards have won six straight, five by 15 points or more. Senior guard Russ Smith is providing scoring from the perimeter, and sophomore Montrezl Harrell is doing work around the basket. This will be a huge test for talented young Memphis big man Austin Nichols.

**UMASS AT DAYTON**  
Dayton would love to add another quality win to its NCAA Tournament résumé. The Flyers will have two chances this week, with a trip to Saint Joseph's on Tuesday and this home date with UMass on Saturday. The Minutemen picked up a huge win on Friday night, knocking off VCU at the Mullins Center in Amherst. Derek Kellogg's team should have nothing to worry about on Selection Sunday.

**LSU AT FLORIDA**  
LSU has the talent to be in the NCAA Tournament, but the Tigers lack the profile to earn an at-large invitation. That can change if they somehow find a way to beat No. 1 Florida in Gainesville. LSU will need a big game from the underrated Johnny O'Bryant, and the Tiger guards will have to shoot the ball well from the 3-point line. An upset is not out of the question.

**TEXAS AT OKLAHOMA**  
This is an intriguing battle between two over-achieving teams that are jockeying for position in the rough-and-tumble Big 12. Texas played its way out of the league title chase last week by losing at Iowa State and Kansas, but the young Longhorns have proven that they belong in the NCAA Tournament. Oklahoma lost at Kansas Monday night, snapping a two-game winning streak that included wins at Oklahoma State and vs. Kansas State at home.

**SYRACUSE AT VIRGINIA**  
Surprising Virginia could be in position to wrap up the outright ACC title at home on Saturday. Not bad for a team that in December scored 38 points in a loss at home to Wisconsin; lost at Green Bay; and lost by 35 at Tennessee. Syracuse suffered its first two setbacks of the season last week, dropping a shocker in overtime to Boston College before losing at Duke on Saturday night. The Orange have not played well over the last three weeks.

**SAINT LOUIS AT VCU**  
This game in Richmond begins a tough closing stretch for Saint Louis, which has yet to lose a game in the A-10. After playing VCU, the Billikens host Dayton before ending the regular season with a home date vs. UMass. VCU has struggled of late, losing three out of four following a 7-1 start in league play. All three losses, however, have been on the road. The Rams will be ready for Saint Louis.

**MINNESOTA AT MICHIGAN**  
Minnesota's once-solid NCAA Tournament résumé isn't looking so good nowadays. Heading into Tuesday's home game against Iowa, the Golden Gophers had lost six of eight, with the wins coming against non-NCAA teams Indiana and Northwestern. A split this week against Iowa and Michigan might keep the Gophers in the discussion, but Richard Pitino's team could really use a sweep. Michigan is one game up on Michigan State in the loss column in the Big Ten, and the Wolverines, by virtue of a season sweep, own the tie-breaker.

**PITTSBURGH AT NOTRE DAME**  
Pittsburgh had 16 wins by mid-January and reached the 20-win mark in early February, yet the Panthers are not a certain NCAA Tournament team. With three of their final four on the road — including this never-easy trip to South Bend — the Panthers could be sweating a bit on Selection Sunday.

**IOWA STATE AT KANSAS STATE**  
Here's another tough test (for both teams) in a Big 12 that features very few easy outs. Iowa State beat K-State in Ames in late January, but it will take a huge effort to knock off the Wildcats at the Octagon of Doom. Kansas State is 7-0 at home in league play, highlighted by an overtime win over Kansas on Feb. 10.

**KANSAS AT OKLAHOMA STATE**  
Despite losing seven straight in league play recently, Oklahoma State's NCAA Tournament hopes are still very much alive. The Pokes beat TCU Monday night to improve their league record to 6-9. Beating Kansas at home on Saturday would be huge, but it's not a must-win. O-State still has other opportunities to pick up quality wins — vs. Kansas State and at Iowa State to close the regular season followed by at least one game in the Big 12 Tournament.

# Shocking: A No. 1 seed for Wichita

Do the Wichita State Shockers deserve a No. 1 seed?

**Mitch Light:** It's easy to look at the Shockers' gaudy record (29-0 through Monday night) and assume they will be a No. 1 seed in the NCAA Tournament. But it's not that simple. Take a look at Wichita's résumé: Gregg Marshall's team has only one win against a sure-fire NCAA Tournament team — at Saint Louis on Dec. 1. The Shockers have a few other decent wins — vs. Tennessee, BYU, Alabama and Davidson — but only one of those teams (BYU) is ranked in the top 50 of the RPI. That being said, it will be difficult for Wichita State — assuming it remains undefeated — to not be a No. 1 seed because there aren't many great teams in college basketball this season. The Shockers picked a good season to be great.

**David Fox:** If Wichita State gets to Selection Sunday undefeated, no question the Shockers deserve a No. 1 seed. And depending on what happens in other leagues, you could make a case a one-loss Wichita State should be a No. 1 seed. We saw last week how tough it is to remain perfect when Syracuse lost at home to an awful Boston College team. Since Wichita State's scare against Missouri State on Jan. 11, the Shockers have defeated teams by an average of 15.5 points. Even teams like Florida and Arizona have played down to overmatched opponents in recent weeks. Even if the Missouri Valley isn't as strong as it normally is, give credit to Wichita State for never even offering a glimmer of hope for an upset for most of the season.

**Braden Gall:** Do I think Wichita State is one of the best four teams in the nation? No. Do I think Wichita State will finish unbeaten in the regular season and conference tournament? Yes. And if the Shockers can finish the season unblemished then they will absolutely deserve the right to be a No. 1 seed. This team has depth, experience, talent and coaching, and it has non-conference wins over Saint Louis, BYU and Tennessee. Will I be picking WSU to

make it back to the Final Four regardless of seeding? No. But an undefeated regular season is a special story that deserves a spot on the first line of the bracket.

**Do you believe in North Carolina?**

**Light:** North Carolina has proven to be a solid top-15-ish team that is capable of advancing to the Sweet 16, but I don't believe this team is good enough to string four wins together in the NCAA Tournament and reach the Final Four. There have been some positive signs over the last month — Marcus Paige is playing well; Leslie McDonald has shown he can be a 20-point scorer; James Michael McAdoo has played with aggression — but this is still a

flawed team that struggles to shoot the ball (especially from the foul line).

**Fox:** To me, the most telling moment of North Carolina's run in the second half this season wasn't the win over Duke. It was the 105-72 rout of Wake Forest two days later. Wake isn't a great team, but the Demon Deacons were good enough to beat North Carolina in early January when the Tar Heels were searching for an identity. And after the Duke win, this was the kind of game Carolina would have dropped early in the season. The Heels responded with a convincing win. This isn't one of Roy Williams' finest teams in Chapel Hill, but at least it has dropped the Jekyll and Hyde act from early in the season.


