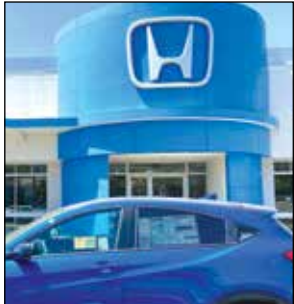

**CITRUS HEIGHTS, CA (MPG)** - For the first time since 2019, “The Best of Citrus Heights” Awards will be held in person, with the event scheduled for August 4th from 5:30-7 p.m. at Future Honda off Auburn Blvd.

The Citrus Heights Chamber of Commerce has been hosting the event since 2005. Citrus Heights was the first chamber in the area to hold such an event, according to

Executive Director Diane Ebbitt, who started the awards nearly 17 years ago. Surrounding cities such as Carmichael, Fair Oaks and Orangevale later followed suit.

“I wanted to have another way (for) our businesses to network,” Ebbitt told the Citrus Heights Messenger. “But also, I wanted a way to appreciate the businesses here in Citrus Heights. I think it’s important that our businesses are recognized here in our city as being a good business. (It is a way to) thank you for

being here in Citrus Heights.”

There are 37 categories to vote on in this year’s “Best of” Awards. Categories include automotive parts & repair, beauty services, dentist or orthodontics, health & fitness, residential and commercial real estate, restaurant, veterinarian and pet services and many more!

## Voting has Officially Begun

**SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG)** - Voter Registration and Elections (VRE) has begun delivering Vote by Mail (VBM) ballots to the U.S. Postal Service for distribution to all currently registered voters in the County for the June 7, 2022, Statewide Direct Primary Election.

Voters may use any Ballot Drop Box throughout the County to return their ballot. VRE has a drive-through Ballot Drop Box in the Election’s Office parking lot at 7000 65th Street, Sacramento. This Ballot Drop Box is open 24 hours a day, 7 days a week until 8:00 p.m. on Election Night.

Voters are encouraged to return their ballots early and sign their pink VBM envelope in order for their ballot to be counted. Information on the days and hours of operation for Ballot Drop Boxes or upcoming Vote Centers is available on the VRE website at <http://www.elections.sacounty.gov> or use the direct links in the Key Election Dates below. No postage is necessary for voters returning their ballots by U.S. Mail using the pink Vote by Mail envelope.

### Key Election Dates

**Monday, May 9:** Mailing of ballots to all registered voters has begun. Voted ballots may be returned in any of the Ballot Drop Boxes located throughout the County.

**Monday, May 23:** Close of voter registration for this election. Voter registration forms must be postmarked by this date or delivered to the VRE Office at 7000 65th Street, Suite A, Sacramento, CA 95823 by 5:00 p.m. Online voter registration must be completed before midnight on this date at [www.registertovote.ca.gov](http://www.registertovote.ca.gov).

**Tuesday, May 24:** Conditional Voter Registration (CVR) begins.

**Saturday, May 28:** 11 Day Vote Centers open.

**Tuesday, May 31:** Last day a Vote by Mail (VBM) ballot can be mailed to you. After this date, VBM ballots are only available at the VRE Office or at any of the 87 Vote Centers.

**Saturday, June 4:** All Vote Centers open throughout the County.

**Tuesday, June 7:** Election Day. ★

Investigation into Stabbing  
of 2 Juveniles and 1 Adult

**CITRUS HEIGHTS, CA (MPG)** - Memorial Day will be celebrated on May 30, this year. Memorial Day, not to be confused with Veterans Day, is a day of remembering the men and women who died while serving in the United States Armed Forces. Veterans Day on the other hand celebrates the service of all U.S. Military veterans. Memorial Day, formerly known as Decoration Day, originated after the American Civil War in 1868 to commemorate the Union and Confederate soldiers who died in the

Civil War. The end of May seemed to be appropriate since many spring flowers are available. By the 20th century Memorial Day had been extended to honor All Americans who have died in all wars in the past 247 years.

Every year, Sylvan Cemetery in Citrus Heights honors those that gave their lives in the defense of their county. We take time to salute the over 3 million men and women that have died in military service defending our country since 1775.

This year the Memorial Day service will be held on Monday, May 30, 2022, at Sylvan Cemetery,

7401 Auburn Blvd, Citrus Heights, beginning at 10:30 a.m. with a march through the historical section of the cemetery, stopping briefly at each flag station to read a prayer and salute the flag. The march will conclude at the gazebo where there will be a one-hour ceremony from 11 a.m.-12 p.m.

On Thursday, May 26, we will be placing a cross and small American flag on each grave of the 1400 Veterans that are buried here at Sylvan Cemetery. These will remain from May 26th-31st. Any and all volunteers are welcome to help on these days. We will start at 8:00 a.m. ★

**Citrus Heights Police Department**

**CITRUS HEIGHTS, CA (MPG)** - On May 15, 2022, at approximately 4:30 a.m., the Citrus Heights Police Department received 911 calls regarding a stabbing outside a business on the 6100 block of Auburn Blvd. in Citrus Heights. Two juveniles (16 yo & 17 yo) and one adult were stabbed multiple times and are receiving medical attention at an area hospital.

While this investigation is ongoing, Citrus Heights Police

Department has learned that this altercation occurred following what appears to have been an argument between parties. Investigators are in the process of obtaining witness statements and collecting evidence.

The suspect is (possibly) a white or Hispanic male adult approximately 6 feet tall, skinny, with facial hair and a short haircut. He may be accompanied by a white female adult wearing glasses.

CHPD investigators are at the location, processing the scene and collecting

evidence. A section of E/B Auburn Blvd. at Greenback Ln. is temporarily closed.

member, you may be nominated to be voted for,” Ebbitt explained. “When you are nominated, there are a few benefits that you will receive. There’s an opportunity on ‘The Best of Citrus Heights’ website to advertise, to get your name out there, to let people know that you want to be recognized among their peers.”

“Let’s say you’re on this website to be voted for, and then as they scroll through it, they’re going to see other businesses they may want to vote for also. It is a way to be recognized among their peers.”

Sylvan Corners Pet Hospital, River City Chiropractic and Diana Miller Photography are a few local businesses that have been apart of the chamber for years. All three businesses have participated and won multiple times in “The Best of Citrus Heights” Awards.

Ebbitt created the event to encourage Citrus Heights citizens to shop and love local. The tagline and hashtag #LoveLocal are a partnership between the city and the chamber to get more people to shop at small businesses.

“Especially now because with COVID, that’s what we’re really trying to express is to shop local,” Ebbitt said.

Due to the coronavirus pandemic, the “Best of” Awards were held virtually the last two years. Chamber Board Member Amanda Camacho, who is a professional realtor and owns a local painting company with her husband, joined the chamber in 2019.

“‘Best of’ during my year as president was actually during the pandemic, so we had it virtually. Which actually was really fun because we got to think of other creative ways (to host it). But this will be my first year in person,” Camacho said. “So, I’m excited, one, to do it in person to network. But from my past experience I think it’s just fun for the people in the community to have a little bit of recognition and shoutouts and it’s a good way to kick off the middle of the year for the rest of the year.”

# Council Recognizes National Police Week

**CITRUS HEIGHTS, CA (MPG)** - At the May 12 meeting, the Citrus Heights City Council issued several proclamations, recognizing National Public Works Week, Building Safety Month, and National Police Week.

Councilmember Steve Miller said that this is the 62nd annual National Public Works Week and this year’s theme is “Ready and Resilient.” Miller read the proclamation, stating, “Public Works professionals focus on infrastructure, facilities, emergency management, and services that are vital to the sustainability and resiliency of our communities and to the public health, quality of life, and well-being of the residents and businesses of Citrus Heights.”

The City of Citrus Heights recognized the hardworking and dedicated professionals who provide these essential services, and General Services Director Regina Cave accepted the proclamation.

Miller also read the proclamation recognizing May as Building Safety Month: “Our city is committed to recognizing that our growth and strength depends on the safety and essential role of our homes, buildings, and infrastructure. Both in everyday life and when disasters strike, our confidence in the resilience of these buildings that make up our community is achieved through the devotion of vigilant guardians ... who work year-round to ensure the safe construction of buildings.”

Modern building codes are in place to protect our buildings from the impact of natural disasters, and the Council recognized the professionals who work to ensure those codes are upheld. Chief Building Official Greg Anderson accepted the proclamation.

Councilmember Bret Daniels read the proclamation recognizing May 15 – 21 as National Police Week. Since 1962, this week pays special tribute to law enforcement officers who have lost their lives in the line of duty “for the safety and protection of others,” said Daniels. These officers have “a vital role in safeguarding the rights and freedoms which are guaranteed by the constitution, and in protecting the lives and property of our citizens.”

Councilmember Daniels said it’s important that citizens understand the challenges, duties, and responsibilities of police officers and express gratitude for their “dedicated service and courageous deeds” and their contributions to “the security and well being of all our people.”

Citrus Heights Police Department (CHPD) Operations Commander Kris Frey said he was “humbled” to accept the proclamation and “thankful for the Council’s ongoing and continued support for both the police department and for public safety within our community.” Frey said that May is a solemn month for law enforcement officers as they take time to observe memorial services across the county “to honor the brave women and men who paid the ultimate sacrifice by laying down their lives while protecting their respective communities.”

Economic Development and Communications Manager Megan Huber and Interim Administrative Services Director Bill Zenoni presented Council with an update on the Small Business Covid Recovery Grant Program, funded through the City’s American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) award.

The City was awarded a total of \$15.6 million of the federal funding, with the first installment of \$7.8 million received last May and the final installment

expected by the end of this month. Last June, the Council allocated \$5.3 million to restore 22 vacant positions in the CHPD. This January, the Council allocated \$320,000 for the Small Business Covid Recovery Grant Program, which was open for applications from February 24 through March 26.

To be eligible, businesses had to be licensed in Citrus Heights with fewer than 20 employees, be operational in March 2020 through the present, earn less than \$3 million in annual revenue in 2019, and show at least 25% revenue loss in either 2020 or 2021.

The program awarded grants through a tiered system: Businesses with gross revenue in 2019 of \$1,000 to \$100,000 were eligible for \$2,000, those who earned between \$100,000 and \$1 million were eligible for \$10,000, and businesses with revenues between \$1 million and \$3 million could receive \$15,000. When the Council authorized the program, their priorities were a streamlined and expedited application process and robust outreach efforts. Huber explained that applications were available online and in hard copies in multiple languages, and staff members were available to assist with the process in person, on the phone, and virtually. They also conducted direct outreach to local businesses as well implementing comprehensive promotion of the program online and through email lists and social media.

The City received 69 applications, and 33 businesses met the eligibility requirements and received grant funding, with payments issued on April 25. Nine businesses received \$2,000 grants, 20 received \$10,000 grants, and four received \$15,000 grants—for a total of \$278,000 in funding for small businesses. There are still unexpended funds from the allocation that are available for future consideration by the Council.

Zenoni explained that as staff reviewed the applications, they reached out to business owners if anything was missing — working to get the required information to ensure eligibility for as many businesses as possible. Of the 36 businesses that applied but were determined to be ineligible for the program, 22 did not meet the 25% revenue loss requirement. The rest were disqualified for other reasons, such as not operating within Citrus Heights, not being a small business, or missing the necessary tax documents.

Councilmember Daniels said he was disappointed that so many businesses were not eligible because they didn’t meet the 25% revenue loss requirement, and he asked how many were close to meeting that mark. Zenoni said that 17 of the 22 disqualified businesses (77%) had less than 10% revenue loss.

Councilmember Miller thanked staff for administering the program so quickly and efficiently.

Vice Mayor Tim Schaefer said that hearing how many businesses were disqualified due to lower revenue losses showed that the program “really covered the bases,” and helped the businesses they were trying to help: “I think the way the program was structured was well done.”

Mayor Porsche Middleton said, “We want the businesses to recover in our community, so thank you for ... standing it up so quickly. I know that it was a push, and as a Council I know we appreciate you doing that work.”

The Council will discuss further ARPA funding allocations at the May 26 meeting. ★

promote safety in the community, including bicycle, traffic, and tobacco safety. Their colorful "Escape the Vape" vehicle was a favorite of all. Educational materials for parents and youth were available, warning them of the dangers of vaping which will lead to smoking.

A fully decked out fire truck, an ambulance from Sacramento State's Pre-Hospital Paramedic Program, and two former military vehicles refitted for education and

protection of officers and the public in a police emergency were available for exploration, with staff to answer all questions. Free bicycle helmets and car seats were handed out to parents.

Moore's Martial Arts in Citrus Heights, provided self-defense information for students and how kids can warn adults of 'stranger danger' when in a potentially dangerous situation.

Larissa Aguilar, CHPD Chief Security Officer explained the event was

funded by a California Office of Traffic Safety (OTS) grant which provides funds to do outreach programs like the fair and enforcement operations. The three E's of the program include Engineering for the radar speed signs throughout the city, Education outreach, and Enforcement, including not only citations given but also a high traffic officer visibility to help deter traffic violations. They also reach out to neighborhood associations.

A new highlight of the

fair was Sami Circuit's Sami Kane. His motto, "If you're moving, you're doing it right," is one of the main messages of his program. A victim of bullying himself until age 15, he knows how important self-esteem is. A motivational speaker for 12 years, he works with over 200 schools and after school programs in the state of California. His goal is to instill self-esteem and self-respect in students, many of whom are having a hard time these days. His mantra of "never give up" echoes throughout his presentations and

workouts. He says his videos combine exercise and movement, along with positive reinforcement throughout. The pulsating, high energy music as heard at the fair helps students remember the message.

COVID proved to be a blessing to Kane's business. When it hit, he had to totally change and adapt to survive. Instead of traveling to live events reaching fewer audiences, he now sells his videos to school districts, schools, and after-school programs. He films once a week and reaches four times more students

than in-person. He believes in what he is doing so others will believe in themselves. "Kids need it so badly," he said. Check Sami out on YouTube, for kids and adults.

Lieutenant Jason Baldwin said of this year's safety fair, "I'm pleased with the turnout of kids and parents and urge them to continue to ask questions about their health safety, traffic safety, pedestrian and bicycle safety, and if they have questions about any rules or to get some training, contact the CHDP for the resources they're looking for." ★

**LAS VEGAS, NV (MPG)** - Each April, football players from around the world have their dreams realized and shattered over the course of three stressful days known simply as the National Football League (NFL) Draft.

The 2022 NFL Draft was held April 28-30 in Las Vegas, Nevada as several Northern California hopefuls anxiously awaited through 262 picks for their names to be called. The Sacramento region only had one player fulfill his dream of hearing his name called this year. However, the Northern California region had six prominent players agree to terms on professional contracts as undrafted free agents.

Cornerback DaRon Bland out of Fresno State heard his name called on the draft's final day and was selected with the 167th pick by the Dallas Cowboys. Bland played high school football in Modesto at Central Catholic before committing to play collegiately for Sacramento State beginning in 2017. Bland recorded 92 tackles (26 assisted), three interceptions, two forced fumbles, one fumble recovery and one sack in 30 games played over three years with the Hornets.

Bland shined as a junior at Sac State, earning first team All-Big Sky Conference honors as a defensive back and the Hornets' Outstanding Defensive Back Award. Following the pinnacle of his Hornets career, Bland transferred south to Fresno State where his brother, Keane, previously had run track.

In one season with the Bulldogs, Bland had at least one tackle in every game and tallied 45 total (11 assisted) in 13

games which ranked fifth on the team, second among all defensive backs and first among all cornerbacks. Bland also had five pass break ups, two interceptions, one tackle for loss, one forced fumble and one quarterback hit.

The 6-foot-2 Modesto native's play on a bigger stage going from the NCAA Division I Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) to the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) impressed the Cowboys enough for them to spend a fifth-round pick on him rather than risk attempting to sign him as an undrafted free agent.

For those who are not fortunate enough to hear their names called, the final pick of the draft isn't necessarily the end of the road. Each year, many undrafted players are signed as free agents from teams around the NFL, Canadian Football League (CFL) and now even the recently resurrected United State Football League (USFL) immediately after the draft concludes.

One of the first NorCal natives to sign with an NFL team as an undrafted free agent was tight end Stone Smartt from Old Dominion University. The Sacramento native who played high school ball at Del Oro in Loomis agreed to a deal with the Los Angeles Chargers.

Smartt is a versatile player that offers L.A. flexibility, similar to New Orleans Saints' do-it-all Swiss army knife type player, Taysom Hill. The 6-foot-4 Smartt spent the first half of his college career as a quarterback before converting into a wide receiver. With his weight at 232 pounds and given height, Smartt could become a formidable tight end in the NFL.

The next tight end from Northern California to sign an

NFL contract was Tucker Fisk who played at Davis Senior High School before going on to play in the PAC-12 Conference at Stanford. Fisk, who split time in college between tight end, defensive end and special teams, reached an agreement with the Atlanta Falcons.

The 6-foot-4 Davis native could provide flexibility for Atlanta given his ability to play on all sides of the ball. Fisk earned the Jack Huston Award in 2021, which "goes to the player exemplifying aggressiveness, exceptional performance and unheralded efforts."

Tucker has followed the same path as his dad, Jason, who played football at Davis and Stanford before moving on to the NFL. Jason Fisk was a seventh-round pick of the Minnesota Vikings in the 1995 NFL Draft. The Davis native played defensive tackle for five teams during his 12-year career, recording 386 tackles, 19 sacks, four forced fumbles and three interceptions. Tucker will now attempt to top his father's accolades in the league.

Joining Fisk in Georgia was another Davis product, except this 309-pound rusher played collegiately for the Aggies. Bryce Rodgers was a defensive lineman at UC Davis for five seasons dating back to 2016, earning All-Big Sky second team honors during his senior season in 2021. Rodgers led the Aggies defensive linemen in tackles with 18 (10 assisted) while adding two sacks, two quarterback hurries, one forced fumble and one blocked kick.

Fisk and Rodgers may be teammates for the first time, but they may already have several mutual friends and acquaintances after each played football in Davis and Palo Alto. Fisk

started in Davis before moving to Palo Alto. Rodgers did the opposite growing up in East Palo Alto before migrating to Davis.

Rodgers was not the only former Aggie agreeing to terms with a National Football Conference (NFC) South division team, as punter Daniel Whelan signed with the Saints. Whelan currently holds the UC Davis record for longest punt average (44.01 yards) in a career and a single season average record (46.25) that he achieved in 2021.

The Irish All-American is "arguably the greatest punter in Aggie history," according to UC Davis Athletics. Whelan earned All-America first team honors from four organizations in 2021: Stats Perform, AFCA, HERO Sports and Phil Steele. The 6-foot-6 Irishman was also named to the All-Big Sky Conference first team and a finalist for FCS Punter of the Year after the shortened 2021 spring season.

Whelan will be competing with third-year punter Blake Gillikin for the starting job. Gilikin is ranked second all-time in career punting average (43.03) at Penn State. However, Whelan's average in college was nearly one full yard longer, which may have led to the Saints organization deciding to sign him.

Rodgers and Whelan were not the only former Aggies to agree to terms with a professional football team. Offensive lineman Kooper Richardson, who spent his first four collegiate seasons at UC Davis, signed with the Saskatchewan Roughriders of the CFL. Richardson was adaptable for the Aggies splitting time at tackle, guard and center.

Before coming to UC Davis,

Richardson played at Folsom High School for his dad, Kris, who was the Bulldogs' coach until 2019 when he became the assistant head coach and offensive line coach at Sac State. Richardson played two more seasons for the Aggies but ultimately deciding to transfer to Sac State to play for his dad again in his final year of eligibility. The 6-foot-5, 295-pound lineman earned All-Big Sky second team honors in 2021.

In a draft that was widely considered to be "weak" when it came to quarterbacks, Vacaville native Carson Strong expected to hear his name as one of the 262 called, but the moment never arrived. Strong, who attended Vacaville High School, was not drafted due to medical concerns over his knee according to the NFL Network. Strong agreed to terms with the Philadelphia Eagles who, if Strong stays healthy, could have gotten a steal of a prospect.

The 6-foot-4 Strong started for three seasons at the University of Nevada, Reno where he completed 852 of 1,252 (68%) attempts for 9,368 yards and 74 touchdowns in 31 total games. In 2021, Strong earned Mountain West Conference Offensive Player of the Year honors after tossing 366 of 523 (70%) passes for 4,175 yards and 36 touchdowns.

Two players from Sacramento to keep an eye on who were expecting to be signed but have not yet been are Grant Union High School alumni, center Orlando Umana and safety TieNeal Martin. Umana played collegiately at The University of Utah and Ole Miss. Martin began his college career at Yuba College before transferring to the University of Tulsa. ★

# Students Compete as Finalists in Regional Environmental Contest

**Center for Land-Based Learning News Release**

**SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG)** - The Caring for Our Watersheds proposal writing contest challenges students to research their local watershed, identify an environmental concern and develop a realistic project to address that concern in their community.

Students with the top ten proposals of 315 that were reviewed presented their ideas to a panel of judges at the final competition. First place is \$1,000 cash to the winning team and \$1,000 cash to the winning team's school. In total, over \$27,000 in prize and implementation money is available to students and schools who participate in the program. Finalists were from the following schools: Foresthill High School, George Washington Carver School of Arts and Sciences, Grant Union High School, Mira Loma High School, Sierra Academy of Expeditionary Learning and The MET Sacramento. Caring for Our Watersheds is a joint program of Nutrien and the Center for Land-Based Learning.

Mira Loma High School students Clara Nordahl, Celina Chen, Nora Ransibrahmanakul, and Benjamin Hartman and placed first, second, third and fifth respectively, in the 2022 Caring for Our Watersheds contest.

Nordahl's proposal is to advocate for passage of the 2022 California Plastic Waste Reduction Regulations (CPWRR) Initiative and a reduction in the consumption of single-use plastic. She plans to raise awareness and garner support for the initiative by creating informational posts and colorful infographics to share online through public social media platforms.

Chen's proposal is to organize an electronic waste collection program at school and coordinate with Sacramento Regional Conservation Corps for pick-up and transport to the recycling facility. She will also produce and distribute an informational pamphlet on the environmental impact of E-waste and

tips for proper disposal/ recycling. Ransibrahmanakul's proposal is to initiate a school program that teaches sustainability and innovation through the hands-on experience of maintaining a vertical hydroponics system in the classroom. She will install the system and create educational modules explaining the science of hydroponics and the potential benefits of this new agricultural technology.

Hartman's proposal is to reduce mask pollution by providing and encouraging the use of biodegradable masks. While still providing the same level of protection, biodegradable masks will not persist in the environment as long as the single-use polypropylene masks.

Nordahl won \$1000, Chen won \$900, Ransibrahmanakul won \$800, and Hartman won \$600 in the competition. They also won equal matching amounts for their classes at Mira Loma High School.

Arana Katasema, Jaiden Gonzales, Bernie Xicotencatl and Bella Marroquin won \$350 in the

competition. They also won an equal matching amount for their class at George Washington Carver School of Arts and Sciences. In addition, the team is eligible for \$1000 in project implementation funds. In total, students compete for over \$6,000 cash rewards and participating schools are eligible for over \$11,000 cash rewards. Nutrien also provides \$10,000 in funding to help implement students' ideas.

The team's proposal addressed an issue that has never been seen before in this contest but was very relevant to them as Resin artists. Their project aimed to promote the use of an eco-friendly art material, Ecopoxy, as an alternative to synthetic resins currently used by many artists. Some synthetic resin products can be harmful to the environment and have adverse effects

on human/ animal health. The team created a website and blog and hosted a booth at the Sacramento Earth Day Festival to display their art made of Ecopoxy and educate the public.

"The purpose of the contest is simple," says Nutrien's Senior Manager of Community Relations and Investment, Rose Lecky. "Our goal is to encourage students to learn about their local watershed and be inspired to make improvements to the land, air and water. With community and school support, we have seen the creativity and determination students have for protecting and preserving the environment. It's inspiring when they turn their ideas into reality."

Each year more projects are implemented with the help of community resources and environmental organizations. Anyone who enters the contest is eligible for funding to complete his/ her

project. "Seeing students implement their projects is truly impressive. Caring for Our Watersheds not only encourages youth-led ideas, but helps make them happen," says Beth Del Real of Center for Land-Based Learning.

# Defendants Convicted of 13 Total Counts of Child Sexual Assault

**SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG)** - David Belmares was convicted by a jury of nine counts of child sexual assault and his brother, Jared Belmares, was convicted of four counts of child sexual assault. A family member of the defendants operated a foster care and daycare out of her home. Over a period of years between 2011–2013, the defendants molested children who were in the daycare. At the time of the abuse, the defendants were adults and the children were all under the age of 10 years old. Both defendants had previously molested several young girls who were in foster care at the home from 2008-2011, but information about the daycare abuse did not come to light until later disclosures by the children. David Belmares faces a maximum sentence of 68 years to life in prison and Jared Belmares faces a maximum sentence of 40 years in prison. Sentencing is set for June 3, 2022, at 9:00 a.m. in Department 33 before the Honorable Laurel White. ★

# Car Chase on I-80 ends in Citrus Heights


