

CITRUS HEIGHTS, CA (MPG) - The Citrus Heights Surgery Center, in affiliation with Dignity Health and United Surgical Partners International (USPI), hosted a grand opening event today to give community members, medical staff and media their first look at a new 16,000 square-foot ambulatory surgery center in Citrus Heights. Unanimously approved by the Citrus Heights Planning Commission, the \$13 million project will provide patients in Citrus Heights with a range of outpatient specialty surgical services.

The new state-of-the-art Citrus Heights Surgery Center will be utilized for outpatient general surgery, otolaryngology, orthopedics, gastroenterology, pain management, podiatry and procedures. This is a joint venture between Dignity Health, USPI and local physicians. The facility will feature three operating room beds, three treatment bays and 11 recovery unit beds for patients undergoing same-day surgeries. The surgery center is expected to have approximately 70

physicians on its medical staff.
"Providing high quality, compassionate care is what Dignity
Health is known for and where we

provide that care continues to vary as technology and the needs of our community evolve," said Michael Korpiel, President of Dignity Health Mercy San Juan Medical Center. "By partnering with USPI, the ability to increasingly provide care in an outpatient setting is made possible thanks to significant advances in surgical techniques, medical technology, and pain control which results in many benefits to patients including faster recovery times, significant cost savings and historically fewer complications."

\$34.7 Million Awarded for Local Transportation Projects

Caltrans News Release

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) -Caltrans announced it is awarding \$34.7 million in state and federal funds to cities, counties, tribes and transit agencies throughout California – including \$25 million funded by Senate Bill (SB) 1, the Road Repair and Accountability Act of 2017 - to plan sustainable transportation projects that reduce greenhouse gas emissions, improve the state highway system, enhance access to safe walkways and bike paths, and increase natural disaster preparedness.

"These grants are funding the planning for sustainable and more resilient transportation projects that will prepare the state for rising sea levels, wildfires and other climate related impacts," said Caltrans Interim Director Steven Keck. "By collaborating with local communities, we are working together to achieve both our climate goals and an equitable transportation infrastructure for people who rely on transit and intercity bus service."

In total, Caltrans will allocate:

\$18.4 million in Sustainable Communities Competitive and Technical Grants to 57 local, regional, tribal and transit agencies for climate change adaptation, transportation and land use planning, and natural disaster preparedness. This includes more than \$4.5 million to fund planning for 14 projects that improve safety and access for people who walk and

\$3.8 million in federally funded Strategic Partnership Grants to 10 projects that will plan for zero-emission mediumand heavy-duty vehicles, sustainable goods movement, wildlife connectivity, intercity bus systems and other sustainability initiatives;

bike;

\$12.5 million – all from SB 1 – in Sustainable Communities Formula Grants to metropolitan planning organizations to further regional transportation plans and sustainable community strategies. This grant will be awarded later this spring.

Caltrans awards transportation planning grants each year through a competitive process to encourage local and regional projects. Applications are evaluated on how they further Continued from page 12

Through the generos-Messenger, this column serves to provide an update about matters affecting the community of Citrus Heights.

It may be hard to realize this, but we are already well into 2022. I say this because I find myself reading headlines that make me feel like I am still living in late 2020. As has been the case throughout the COVID-19 pandemic, the rules are made up and the data does not matter. After months of a reinstated, statewide mask mandate, Governor Newsom announced the mandate would be lifted on February 15th. Shortly after, I was elated to see the county's public health officer would follow the state's lead and lift our mask mandate as well. The vexing thing about these decisions however, is that the originally stated thresholds for freedom from such manirrelevant to the process.

I think it is great that the requirement of masks indoors is being lifted ahead of schedule but it just goes to show how subjective all of the benchmarks are. At the time the county's mask mandate was reinstated, we were told that it would be lifted when we dropped below a case

rate of five per 100,000. we are sitting at a table in a When the announcement came that the mask mandate would be lifted, we sat at 63.8 cases per 100,000 which is obviously significantly higher than the previous goal. Again, these guidelines and benchmarks are clearly subjective, and it makes me wonder why ity of the Citrus Heights any of these false goal lines have continued to be identified – especially when the science we are all supposed to be following continues to change.

Case in point, Sacramento County's most recent mask mandate was put in place to help slow the spread as cases spiked. While the mask mandate was in place however, we saw our highest case rates of the entire pandemic. At the same time, the death rate remained far below what we saw at its peak. With numbers like those, it would seem the mask mandate achieved essentially nothing.

On March 8, 2020, Dr. Fauci made a comment on 60 Minutes, "There's no reason to be walking around with a mask..." - then on April 3, 2020, he and the CDC directed us to wear a mask. As time progressed, we were told to wear 2 masks, that children must dates have again been mask while playing sports outdoors, and that cloth masks don't work but N95 masks do. We were told that if we get the shot, we can take off the mask and travel, then we were told to put back the mask because it turns out the vaccine does not prevent contracting or transmitting the disease. We've been told we must wear a mask indoors, but if Rancho Murieta.

restaurant, we can take the mask off. Children who are not at-risk are required to wear a mask, while adults who are at-risk can go without a mask.

We clearly have a long way to go to regaining common sense and normalcy. Lifting mask mandates only for the vaccinated did not work last time but that is what we are doing again. As the virus changes and we watch case rates of both the vaccinated and unvaccinated rise and fall together, it is becoming more evident that the need for emergency declarations and knee jerk mandates need to be left behind. Instead, we need to do as we have with all other viruses that mutate too often to be eradicated – we must learn to live with the virus while minimizing its impact on society.

At this point, the only things we should be hearing about mask mandates is when we are discussing studies of how they have impacted our health, the total well-being of students, and how we can better respond to similar outbreaks in the future.



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

WASHINGTON, DC (MPG) -Representative Ami Bera, M.D (D-CA) released the following statement after being selected to serve on the Conference Committee for the America COMPETES

"I am honored to be appointed by Speaker Pelosi to serve on the Conference Committee the America COMPETES Act. This legislation presents a once in a generation opportunity to invest in America to ensure that the United States remains a leader on the global stage and that the and partners across the American worker can compete and succeed in the global economy of the 21st century.

America's greatest assets have long been our innovation, our ingenuity, and the American people. By investing in these once again, we will lay the foundation for our country's success and prosperity for generations to come, while unleashing our potential to outcompete any nation on earth. I am proud to be a part of reinvesting in those assets yet again.

As a senior member

of the House Science, Space, and Technology Committee, I look forward to the opportunity to strengthen provisions in this legislation that will ensure the United States remains the undisputed leader in science and technology. As Chairman of the House Foreign Affairs Subcommittee on Asia, the Pacific, Central Asia, and Nonproliferation, I will leverage our active engagement with allies

Indo-Pacific to ensure this bill invests in American diplomatic, economic, and security partnerships in a way that demonstrates our enduring commitment to the region.

The Conference Committee will include members from both the House and Senate, tasked with resolving the differences between the House-passed America COMPETES Act and the Senate-passed United States Innovation Competition Act (USICA). Representative Bera voted to pass the America COMPETES Act in February 2022. The legislation included several critical provisions authored by Bera.

Suspect Arrested in Connection with Drive-by Shooting in Stockton

CITRUS HEIGHTS, CA (MPG) - The Stockton Police Department said in a statement released that a suspect was arrested in Citrus Heights in connection with the shooting of a 9-year-old girl in Stockton in early April. David Price (39) was identified as the suspect who was responsible for a drive-by shooting on Van Gough Lane. The arrest came after several shootings and gun-related incidents occurred in Stockton with other 9-year-old kids in the last month.

According to the department, the arrest took place on April 20 and included the participation of the U.S. Marshals Task Force. It took several hours for authorities to remove Price from the Summerfield Place Apartments near Sunrise Boulevard in Citrus Heights. Additionally, five handguns were seized at the scene.

World's Most Extreme Pro-Abortion Transportation Tax Initiative **Bill Signed as World Recoils**

Those are the names given to five children allegedly killed by an abortionist near or at term – whose remains were recently recovered in the Washington, DC, area by pro-life activists. The five were among 115 babies' bodies allegedly discarded by an abortion clinic and scheduled to be incinerated at a Maryland power plant.

The extremely graphic, gruesome, and deeply disturbing images of those five children have now been made public.

The Progressive Anti-Abortion Uprising organization, whose members turned the remains over to authorities, said in a press release, "Their late gestational ages as well as their apparent sustained injuries potentially show violations of the Partial Birth Abortion Act as well as the Born Alive Infants Protection Act which are federal crimes."

Pro-life activists and members of Congress are calling for full investigations. In contrast, Democrat lawmakers in states across America are working to rapidly pass laws granting immunity for the slaughter of babies in the womb up to birth, and in some cases after birth up to 28 days!

Democrats are feeling the pressure to enshrine radical abortion rights now out of fear that the U.S. Supreme Court decision in the pending case of Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health Organization will reverse its infamous 1973 pro-abortion decision of Roe v Wade. Since Roe, abortion has taken the lives of at least 63 million children in America and has been the number one cause of death worldwide for many years.

In Colorado, only three days after news broke about the 115 aborted baby corpses in Washington, progressive Democrat Gov. Jared Polis brazenly signed into law North America's most extreme pro-abortion law, all the while celebrating the new law's grant of absolute unrestricted freedom to kill innocent babies.

Among the disturbing provisions of new Colorado law (deceptively called the "Reproductive Health Equity Act"):

Unborn babies are explicitly stripped of any rights under state law.

All babies can be aborted at any time up to birth with no civil or criminal legal consequences for anyone.

Minors are empowered to obtain unlimited abortions with no parental notification.

While a number of Republican-led states have passed laws protecting the unborn in anticipation of Roe's reversal, Democrat led states are following Colorado's lead. California and Maryland are even considering measures allowing babies to be killed after birth outright legalizing infanticide. It's a strategy to create abortion 'sanctuary' states ahead of the possible overturn of Roe.

Children are a gift from God (Psalm 127:3), and shedding innocent blood is an abomination to Him (Prov. 6:16-19).

In the Bible, Israel was forbidden from worshiping the false god Molech (Lev. 18:21), a practice which involved child sacrifice. Biblical scholars believe Molech's priests would place live infants into the outstretched arms of the idol, which had been superheated by fire, cooking the child to death. The sacrifice was committed to earn prosperity from the false god.

How different are Colorado and other Democratcontrolled states these days from the cult of Molech? In just 50 years, activists have gone from claiming a "right" of abortion (not found in the U.S. Constitution), to demanding taxpayer funding and enthusiastically supporting the death of babies up to and well after birth.

Is the outright butchery exposed in images of aborted children in Washington any different than the detestable ritual of child sacrifice to Molech? Consider recent reports of women happily taking abortion pills on the Supreme Court steps while taunting pro-life activists - all for the attention of the adoring left-wing media.

The overturn of Roe is far from certain. But even if it is ultimately retracted by the High Court, states under Democrat control (like Colorado) will still be abortion havens. Americans who value the sanctity of life and want unborn babies protected must continue to stand for truth, insist that lawmakers protect life, work for the election of genuinely pro-life candidates, and resist all attempts to legalize the barbaric practice of child sacrifice.

If you saw my last column ... "More Tax Please", you are aware of the recent court opinions which are now allowing politicians to take dusty, previously failed tax proposals and repackage them as new "citizen initiatives". And, by doing so, local government is bypassing the constitutional requirement for a two-thirds voter approval, and letting a "citizen initiative" for a new tax pass by only a simple majority vote requirement. SO MUCH EASIER TO PASS NEW TAXES!!

And also with this new method, local governments do not even have to bother with those pesky things like public hearings, keeping the public informed, and having reasonable public debate!! That darn public, don't they know the political elites know what is best for them? (sarcasm)

As I said before, now any special interest group with enough cash can push taxes that benefit themselves. If I can convince the bare majority to tax others for some "feel good" topic, then I'm the winner and feel no pain. And, so it is with a half

percent, 40 year, transportation sales tax hike for Sacramento County. First proposed in 2016 and voted down; then resurfaced in 2020 to be pulled off the ballot at the last moment when the Sacramento Transportation Authority realized it would again miss the two-thirds threshold for passage.

Their consultant said the tax increase would not pass if there was any organized opposition to it. At that time, the Sacramento Taxpayers Association (SacTax) led the community wide coalition to oppose that proposal. The coalition consisted of business, agriculture, social groups and others - including the NAACP and the National Action Network; and the reasons to oppose the tax hike have not changed too much in the past two years.

First, it is still a bad time to propose a new tax. Although the pandemic appears to be subsiding, the county's economy is still weak. One third of SMUD customers are either behind or have stopped paying their bills altogether. And small family businesses are still closing their doors. Inflation is raging. The cost of food and fuel is way up! This proposal has been kicking around for years, but county leaders seemingly cannot read the room that homeowners, renters and businesses are struggling.

Second, while we likely need roadway improvements because of age and deterioration, local governments, and especially Sacramento, have a history of neglecting infrastructure and instead fund fancy new projects or programs until roads, sidewalks, and other infrastructure start to fall into disrepair. It is only then they run to taxpayers for more money. We believe that historic neglect and lack of prioritization shouldn't be rewarded.

Third, this is a highly regressive tax falling disproportionately on the shoulders of the working poor and the middle class, hence the historic opposition by the NAACP and NAN.

As a concluding comment, the proponents of this half-percent tax increase are well aware of the broad spectrum of community concern and opposition of over the past years ago. Yet, as President of the Sacramento Taxpayers Association, nobody has reached out to us to even discuss digging up this sad proposal from the grave. That just gives the impression that the powers at hand simply scoff at the community at large, and simply want to take the easier path for themselves by holding out their hand for more money from us with the hope that they can beguile the public most of the time.





Training Facility Requires More Investment

Training Facility on 3801 Zinfandel Drive in Rancho Cordova, CA.

Approval would authorize that building at the existing training facility could commence Phase 3 of the development of the 53-acre site, purchased by Sac Metro Fire in 2008-approximately 2.7 miles from their headquarters.

Earlier in the year, on March 30, 2022, Cooley submitted a one-time state funding request for \$44 million to begin construction at the Zinfandel First Responder Training Facility in order to make it a "central hub" and help increase the resiliency of trainees. Cooley said the proposal, which is expected to be voted on in June of this year, has "strong bi-partisan support... [including] the Governor who encounters large-scale disasters in his watch."

Assemblymember Cooley wrote in a letter submitted to the Assembly Budget Subcommittee, "The unprecedented demands currently placed on emergency responders, combined with the lack of adequate training facilities, are increasing the risks faced by local first responders."

"This facility will facilitate joint training in firefighting, urban search and rescue, and mutual aid coordination, including enhanced skills in interoperability of fire equipment, by Northern California fire agency personnel," added the office of the assemblymember.

According to Sac Metro Fire Chief Todd Harms, the property signaled for the increased development, located adjacent to Mather Airport in Sacramento County, is strategically placed at a good junction near the intersections of Highways 50, 99 and Interstates 5 and 80 and "is a perfect location for resources to be staged for anything on the northern side of California."

Assemblymember Cooley wrote in his letter, "The training facility would be available to public safety agencies in the Sacramento region and throughout Northern California... The size and scale of the facility, after the completion of Phase 3, will accommodate large scale multi-agency and multidisciplinary coordinated training, which is not possible with existing facilities in the region."

Specifically, the funding would go to commence construction by adding: A) 40,000-50,000 square foot multi-purpose Administration/Classroom/ Staging Building; B) 1,000 square foot Outdoor Classroom/Storage/Restroom/ Decontamination Structure; C) 4-acre **Emergency Vehicle Operations Course** (EVOC); D) Multi-Story Training Tower.

Gov. Brown Pushed for Softer Treatment of Violent Felons

It's an election year and crime has emerged as a major campaign issue, so it's no wonder that the horrendous shootout between two gang factions in downtown Sacramento that left six people dead has led to much political fingerpointing.

Republicans, who have become virtually powerless in California, quickly pointed the finger of blame at Gov. Gavin Newsom because one of the alleged shooters, Smiley Martin, had served just five years of a 10-year prison term for spousal abuse due to the state's recently loos-

ened parole standards. "In California, you can do the crime and skip the time. Criminals see little to no consequences for crime, and that needs to change," said Senate Republican leader Scott Wilk. "If we are to restore order and safety to our communities, a good place to start is ensuring early release credits are not given to violent and dangerous felons for simply breathing."

In response, Newsom's office has said the state prison system was merely implementing authority to grant more generous "good time" credits to inmates that voters authorized when they passed Proposition 57 in 2016.

Prison authorities had adopted the new rules on an expedited basis without the chance for public input, but after a lawsuit was filed and a judge tentatively ruled against the process, they reversed themselves and have allowed a period for comment.

The politician who should bear the onus for allowing the alleged shooter and other violent criminals to serve only portions of their sentences is former Gov. Jerry Brown, who wrote Proposition 57 and more or less tricked voters into believing that it would benefit only felons who committed non-violent crimes.

Brown's stated aim was to undo some of the tough sentencing laws he signed during his first stint as governor nearly four decades worked.

He closely guarded details of the "Public Safety and Rehabilitation Act of 2016" until just before submitting it as an amendment to a pending ballot measure dealing with juvenile justice, thereby virtually eliminating any chance for opponents to influence "title and summary" processing by the Department of Justice.

The measure, a constitutional amendment, declares that "any person convicted of a non-violent felony offense and sentenced to state prison shall be eligible for parole consideration after completing a journalist for nearly the full term for his or her primary offense" and made it easier for them to reduce the "full term" with more

generous credits for good behavior.

However, it did not define or list "non-violent felony offenses." Instead, Brown's campaign referred to a section of the Penal Code that listed 23 particularly violent offenses, such as murder. Any crime not on the list would be considered non-violent for purposes of parole.

Indirectly, therefore, dozens of serious crimes would be considered non-violent for parole purposes. They include assault with a deadly weapon, soliciting murder, intimidating or harming a crime victim or witness, resisting arrest that injures a police officer, violent elder or child abuse, arson with injury, human trafficking and several forms of manslaughter.

Ironically, as Proposition earlier, saying they had not 57 was being debated, Kamala Harris, then the attorney general, released a report revealing that violent crime had increased by 10% in 2015 and she counted several crimes considered to be non-violent under Brown's measure.

> Nevertheless, Brown's campaign for Proposition 57 continued to insist that only non-violent felons would benefit and voters passed the measure handily. Two years ago, voters also rejected a measure that would have added a number of obviously violent crimes to the 23 that Proposition 57 had specified.
