## Gearing Up for Ukraine

**CITRUS HEIGHTS, CA (MPG)** - More than 4,000 donations of new or used supplies were collected on Saturday, April 16, 2022, at a donation drive hosted by Sunrise MarketPlace, to assist Deep Roots of Ukraine. The new nonprofit is collecting items that are needed to help protect Ukrainian citizens volunteering to join the fight to save the country.

The event took place from 11 AM to 3 PM at MarketPlace at Birdcage in the Sunrise MarketPlace Business Improvement District. Civilian Ukrainians are in need of protective military gear and medical supplies to help them survive. For four hours a steady stream of supporters drove up, and walked up

with cash, checks and many of the requested donations including new and used military protective combat gear.

Anatoliy Gavrylyuk and Alex Romanayuk, co-founders of Deep Roots of Ukraine, have taken their need to help their fellow Ukrainians fighting the war to a new height. Although both are United States citizens, they have deep roots in their mother country. They had been participating in other people's fundraisers and on social media with a 'thumbs up' in response to posts on the plight of their people. They began to realize it was not enough. When they would ask for donations, the first question was, "who are you with?"

Having also traveled recently

to the Mexican border to the airport at Tijuana to help the thousands of refugees arriving at the airport from Ukraine, they noted the locals charging them fifty to one hundred dollars for the short drive from the airport. Seeing this, they rented a van to transport the refugees. But it was still not enough.

They realized they needed to be more proactive and Deep Roots of Ukraine was born. About a month ago they contacted Mayor Porsche Middleton and the City for help establishing a nonprofit. The city referred them to Kathilynn Carpenter, Executive Director of the Sunrise Marketplace, known for sponsoring events in the community to help make Citrus Heights a better place to

## Grand Jury Finds Board of Supervisors Ignored Health Officer During Covid Crisis

**SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG)** - An extensive investigation into the handling of the COVID-19 crisis by the Sacramento County Office of Public Health (OPH) has led the Grand Jury to find that the County Board of Supervisors ignored its Public Health Officer for five months before finally engaging in any sort of dialogue regarding the County's COVID-19 activities and its impact on County residents.

The Grand Jury's report states that when the pandemic hit Sacramento County, the OPH responded immediately. However, despite asking for assistance early on, Public Health Officer Dr. Olivia Kasirye was allowed to appear before the County Supervisors only after Board members received a confidential email from Dr. Kasirye. That communication detailed the range of the OPH pandemic response efforts and the enormous burden being borne by staff and volunteers committed to protect the community.

The exemplary level of service and commitment exhibited by Dr. Kasirye and OPH staff and volunteers made the critical difference in the County's rapid and effective COVID-19 response, the Grand Jury investigation found. In stark contrast, the Board's apathy during the most significant public health emergency in over a century, one that impacted every resident of Sacramento County, delayed needed OPH program funding and undercut public health order enforcement. Under such emergency circumstances, OPH response efforts and funding instead should have been the Board's first priority.

In the face of an overwhelming public health emergency, Dr. Kasirye and OPH staff were well prepared to carry out COVID-19 pandemic response activities, according to the Grand Jury's findings. OPH utilized its dedicated staff, along with a volunteer corps of professionals, issuing and enforcing COVID-19 public health orders in coordination with its state and federal counterparts. ## City Council Discusses Drive-Thru Businesses, Passes Fireworks Ordinance

**CITRUS HEIGHTS, CA (MPG)** - At the April 14 meeting, the Citrus Heights City Council considered whether to make permanent the urgency ordinance for fireworks regulation and enforcement that was passed unanimously last year.

The urgency ordinance imposes a \$750 fine for social hosts who allow illegal fireworks on the property. Any subsequent violation results in a \$1,000 fine. The ordinance also includes a time of use restriction for legal fireworks, with any use between 11:00 PM and 9:00 AM incurring the same fine. The urgency ordinance is set to expire this June, so by adopting a permanent change to the ordinance now, the Council would ensure a consistent policy remains in place.

Councilmember Bret

Daniels took issue with time of use violations receiving the same fine as illegal fireworks use. He said that while he is bothered by fireworks set off late into the night, he doesn't feel that those violations are in the same category: "Those two violations are definitely two different things in the level of severity." He said it "seems to be a little extreme" and asked that the Council consider a smaller fine for the time of use violations.

Councilmember Steve Miller agreed that a smaller fine would be more appropriate for legal fireworks violations.

Vice Mayor Tim Schaefer said that many cities have banned all fireworks, and as a result they don't have much of an issue with illegal fireworks. He said that imposing the fine tells the public "Don't take advantage," because if people

are able to follow the rules, then the Council won't have to consider a total ban. "Personally, I think that things are a little out of control right now, and I don't have an issue with a heavy fine for after-hours use," said Schaefer.

Mayor Porsche Middleton said she thought the fines were appropriate as written in the ordinance: "It's just a way for folks to know that we're serious about this." She said it was best to "come out strong," so violations should be fined across the board.

Councilmember Jeannie Bruins was on the fence at first, but then agreed that it was best to remain consistent with the existing urgency ordinance and maintain the same fees as written.

Councilmember Daniels motioned for approval of the ordinance with the change to a \$250 fine for afterhours violations,

which was seconded by Miller. The motion failed 2-3, with Bruins, Schaefer, and Middleton dissenting.

Councilmember Bruins motioned that the urgency ordinance be adopted permanently as written. The motion was seconded by Vice Mayor Schaefer and passed 3-2, with Miller and Daniels dissenting.

The Council also reviewed drive-through facilities and related policies—an item requested for discussion by Vice Mayor Schaefer.

There are 70 drive-through locations in the city—which include restaurants, coffee shops, pharmacies, carwashes, and banks—and 49 of those existed prior to the City's incorporation. Most of the drive-throughs are located at major intersections.

Existing regulations in the general plan discourage a concentration

# Starbucks Relocates to Sunrise Village Plaza

CITRUS HEIGHTS, CA (MPG) - A spell of rainy weather last week didn't deter Starbucks regular customers from checking out the grand opening of a new drive-thru coffee shop in the Sunrise Village Plaza at 7887 Madison Avenue at the corner of Sunrise Boulevard on Thursday morning, April 14.

The coffee shop relocated from the Quail Pointe Shopping Center on Madison Avenue. Starbucks is the first new tenant in a new 5,500-square-foot commercial building, built by Level 5 Builders, who are based in Folsom. The building will also welcome a new Firehouse Subs next door later this summer.

The new Citrus Heights Starbucks, approximately double the size of its former Fair Oaks location, was built on the site of the former Coco's Bakery near the corner of Sunrise Boulevard and Madison Avenue in Citrus Heights.

"We're excited to be in our new location. The move went smoothly, as we closed for business on Tuesday, April 12 and were ready Thursday morning to welcome our first new customers," said Starbucks supervisor Danielle Walker. "The white and green trimmed location has a modern, spacious feel, with new interior seating and furnishings throughout. Outside patio seating is now also available."

Staff members were training in the operation of the new drive-thru which wraps around the building from Madison

Avenue. Earlier this spring, JoAnne's Fabrics and Crafts completed its move into its new location as part of the first phase of a \$15-20 million remodel and expansion project for the center, which is owned by the San Francisco-based Merlone-Geier investment company.

Next to the new JoAnne's will be a planned 50,000-square foot sports club, owned by an Irvine-based corporation which operates the LA Fitness chain of health clubs.

The 20,000-square-foot commercial space between the existing Rite Aid pharmacy and the new City Sports Club is shown on current construction plans as either a Home Goods or grocery store, but an official tenant has yet to be named by the developer.

In the next phase of the construction project, the former Lyon's restaurant which is also located in the Sunrise Village Plaza will be demolished, said Kevin Meyer, president of Level 5 Builders, who provided a recent project update.

The Citrus Heights City Council approved plans to renovate Sunrise Village Plaza in February 2020. The project owner-developer, Merlone-Geier is completing the overall project in scheduled phases over several years. New signage and landscaping are featured in the overall design.

In all, the redevelopment project, when complete, will add 18,000 square feet to the existing 150,000-plus square foot retail plaza, according to a Merlone-Geier project brochure. ★

live and do business. They provided the venue, advertising flyers and paid for radio spots.

Anatoliy has a former classmate who is a volunteer soldier, fighting the war in the Ukraine, who asked him for protective gear for himself. They are not provided anything by the military. He thought if they could get a list and provide gear for hundreds of their fellow warriors, that would be a real help. The commander in chief of artillery division of the Ukrainian military heard of their work and sent them an official, stamped list of all they needed to help protect the border at Belarus while the military's main focus remains

to protect Kyiv. Thanks to this event they will now be able to provide

more tactical gear and medical items for the fighting volunteers.

Items can be purchased at Sacramento Black Rifle and used military

surplus stores. One titanium bullet proof vest was donated by a retired

police officer. Their goal is to provide 200 vests to the volunteers.

Gavriyuk himself is going through the process of applying to Washington, D.C. to return to Ukraine as an American citizen fighting alongside his brothers. It is a long process, and he must fund all of his costs and realize that there will be no negotiations for his release if he is captured. He is willing to take the risk for his mother country.

Gavriyuk said this is just the beginning and the organization hopes to collect and deliver more supplies over the coming weeks and months.

# Next Hornets Coach Introduced

**SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG)** - Journeyman coach David Patrick was introduced as the new Sacramento State men’s basketball coach on Tuesday afternoon, April 15, at the Hornet Athletic Center.

Patrick is the 15th head coach in program history. He most recently served as the associate head coach for the men’s basketball team at the University of Oklahoma last season.

“It’s a dream come true for me,” Patrick said Tuesday at his introductory press conference. “(My family and I) have always wanted to come back to California in the right situation. I was in a good spot at Oklahoma (and) had no reason to leave unless it was for a great opportunity. When you see Sac State after being in NorCal for a long time, I just thought it was somewhere that was untouched, somewhere that could really blossom.”

Patrick takes over for interim coach Brandon Laird, who stepped in for Brian Katz after he retired days before last season began following 13 seasons due to a health issue. The Hornets won five of their last seven games to end the season and had 11 total wins, the most wins for any first-year Sac State head coach in the Division I era. Laird spent 11 years with the Hornets program.

According to a report from The State Hornet, the student news organization at Sac State, Laird and Katz were unhappy with the mishandling of the coaching staff’s departure by the Sac State Athletics Department.

Sac State Athletic Director Mark Orr has known Patrick for years, dating back to their days together at Saint Mary’s College. Patrick served as an associate head coach for the men’s basketball team from 2006-2010 while Orr was Director of Athletics and Recreation.

“The previous staff left great character here, that’s where it starts at,” Patrick said. “The talent is one thing but high character kids is what you want to be around. I can get the players, that’s not the hard part. It’s the character, it’s guys that wanna win and guys that wanna win at a high level. And we’ll do that here, I promise you that.

“We’re going to recruit from the inside out. We’ll recruit here locally and then build out from nationally and internationally.”

It didn’t take long for Patrick to get started

recruiting from the NCAA transfer portal.

On Monday, April 14 he signed 6-foot-9 Australian forward Hunter Marks, a three-year starter who is transferring from Hartford. Several college basketball reporters were surprised Marks signed with the Hornets rather than a high-major school, indicating that the new Sac State coach got a steal of a prospect. Four days later Patrick reunited with Callum McRae, a 7-foot-1 Kiwi center who is transferring from UC Riverside.

Patrick brings many years of college coaching experience at several different stops with him to Sacramento. Since 2006 when Patrick retired from his playing career overseas, he has been an assistant coach at six collegiate programs.

In 2018, he got his first head coaching job at UC Riverside, where he spent two seasons. Patrick made an impact in his short stint with the Highlanders, as he currently holds the best two-year start in school history with a 27-38 (.415) record. In his second season at UCR, he led the team to a 17-15 record, which is the most wins in the program’s Division I era.

“This isn’t a steppingstone job for me,” Patrick said. “I’ve got two girls that are (in)

tenth grade and sixth grade, we’re not trying to jump spots. If you look at my resume, I’ve kind of moved a little bit the last year or two but that’s not what we’re about. We’re about staying somewhere and staying here to make it last.”

With his experience, Patrick has brought in some great players over the years. He has recruited 19 players who have gone on to play professionally with 11 of them playing in the NBA. Seven of those players were selected in the NBA Draft and four were first round picks.

In 2016 while Patrick was at LSU, his godson Ben Simmons was selected with the first overall pick in the draft by the Philadelphia 76ers. Simmons has gone on to become the 2018 Rookie of the Year, a three-time All-Star and has been selected to the All-Defensive First Team twice during four seasons in the league.

“I am so excited for coach Patrick to take on the role as head coach at Sacramento State,” Simmons said in a Sac State news release. “He is one of the most underrated coaches and recruiters in the country. When I went through the recruiting process, there was never a doubt that I wanted to be coached by him. He is more than a coach,

he is family. He cares deeply about his players, not only as it relates to basketball, but also life.”

Other current NBA players that Patrick has coached include Desmond Bane of the Memphis Grizzlies, Moses Moody of the Golden State Warriors and Patty Mills of the Brooklyn Nets. The 46-year-old Patrick has coached on five NCAA Tournament teams, four NIT teams and was an assistant coach on the Australian men’s national basketball team that won bronze at the 2020 Summer Olympics.

“I think if you win in the classroom, you win on the floor,” Patrick said. “This degree will help you longer in life because the ball is going to stop bouncing at some point. And this is a lifelong deal with me. I want to be at their weddings, when they have children, this is about a life term relationship, not just the four years that I’m going to be with these student-athletes.”

Patrick said that he is going to rely on his older players and prioritize playing defense and rebounding.

“Everybody wants to shoot and play offense,” Patrick said. “But they’ll tell you the first day of practice every morning we’re starting with bricks and getting after it. I promise you we’ll be one of the best defensive and rebounding teams not only in the Big Sky (Conference) but in the country, I guarantee that.”

The new Sac State men’s basketball coach addressed the size of the Nest at his introductory press conference. The 1,012 seat multi-purpose gymnasium that the Hornets play in is one the oldest and smallest venues in all of NCAA Division I college basketball.

“The gym doesn’t matter, it’s the people,” Patrick said. “If you’re going somewhere for just the gym, you ain’t going for the right reasons. (If we) get a real trust and relationship with these student-athletes, it doesn’t matter where they play at.”

Patrick will now attempt to do something that no Sac State basketball team, men’s or women’s, has ever done: Win a Big Sky Conference Championship and advance to the NCAA Tournament.

“People say, ‘Why Sac State? Why would you take (the) Sac State (head coaching position)? You’re at a Power Five job.’ But I see this place being somewhere you can compete for Big Sky Championships yearly,” Patrick said. “I promise you we’ll win a lot of games here over at Sac State.” ★

# City Council Discusses Drive-Thru Businesses, Passes Fireworks Ordinance

of auto-intensive services while ensuring that drive-through businesses are allowed where they are compatible with the surrounding area. The Planning Commission reviews applications for new drive-through businesses, and the process includes a traffic study to make sure the queue doesn’t back up into the public roadway.

Quick-service restaurants, which include those with drive-throughs, generate a significant amount of sales tax revenue for the City. In 2021, approximately \$1.5 million in sales tax revenue came from restaurants, and more than half of that total (\$760,000) came from the quick-service sector. And while many restaurants experienced steep declines during the pandemic, drive-through sales remained consistent.

While drive-throughs are popular and convenient, there are associated challenges. The amount of space needed for the vehicle queue can limit the land uses for the surrounding area, making it difficult to approve residential or mixed-use development nearby. And drive-throughs generally offer lower-wage jobs, impact air and noise quality, and can have a negative community perception.

Staff explained that the Council could opt to maintain the current policies on drive-throughs, or they could implement more regulations or even impose a temporary moratorium or a permanent

ban on new drive-through businesses.

Vice Mayor Schaefer said he is “big fan” of the restaurant Raising Cane’s, and he was excited when the popular chain opened a location in Citrus Heights. But he said that constituents reached out to him with concerns about the traffic congestion caused at the Greenback and Birdcage intersection due to the drive-through restaurant’s popularity. Schaefer cited other popular drive-throughs, including In-N-Out Burger and Chick-fil-A, that have similar traffic issues. He asked, “How can we manage this better?”

Councilmember Bruins said she wants to ensure that Citrus Heights remains committed to being a “business friendly community” where it is easy to do business. “I am typically in favor of less restrictions than more restrictions,” she said. Bruins also thought the traffic issues at Raising Cane’s were isolated to the first weeks after they opened, due to the public’s excitement about the popular chain coming to Citrus Heights. She said the traffic volume has stabilized and that the Council shouldn’t “overreact to something that was a single event in time.”

Councilmember Daniels said he doesn’t want to limit development of drive-throughs since these businesses provide a significant amount of tax revenue. And he doesn’t want to discourage businesses from buying property in Citrus Heights due to concerns that their

ability to develop it would be restricted.

Councilmember Miller said, “We can’t be talking about being a business friendly city and then turn around and talk about moratoriums on how they conduct their businesses.” While he said he’d support more work on planning the traffic circulation of these types of businesses, he said, “When our zoning allows for this type of business, denying that is unacceptable to me.”

Vice Mayor Schaefer agreed that they don’t want a perception that the City isn’t friendly to businesses, “but we also have community members, and we want to listen to the community.” He said people reached out to him with concerns, so he felt it was his responsibility to bring this issue forward.

Mayor Middleton said it’s also important to remember that these locations are private property and are not owned by the city. So, while the City should ensure that a business is a good fit for the location, additional restrictions shouldn’t be imposed.

Councilmember Miller added that while he has seen complaints on social media about the number of drive-throughs in the city, he only heard directly from one community member, who sent an email opposing any moratorium. Miller said it seemed to be “much to do about nothing.”

The drive-through item was for discussion only and to provide general direction to staff, so no action was taken by the Council. ★

4. creating a nonprobate transfer or modifying a nonprobate transfer in a manner that affects the disposition of property subject to the transfer, without the written consent of the other party or an order of the court. Before revocation of a nonprobate transfer can take effect or a right of survivorship to property can be eliminated, notice of the change must be filed and served on the other party.

You must notify each other of any proposed extraordinary expenditures at least five business days prior to incurring these extraordinary expenditures and account to the court for all extraordinary expenditures made after these restraining orders are effective. However, you may use community property, or your own separate property to pay an attorney to help you or pay court costs.

The Sacramento Life Center's licensed Sac Valley Pregnancy Clinic includes a primary clinic and mobile clinic that provide all services for free, including pregnancy tests, STD tests, ultrasounds, pap smears, well woman exams, patient advocacy for men and women, education and resource referrals. Staff also assists patients in signing up for Medi-Cal Presumptive Eligibility for Pregnant Women and provides a wide range of baby supplies through its onsite baby needs closet, including diapers, clothes, formula, wipes and more. The nonprofit also offers a 24-hour hotline and program for women who have

experienced pregnancy loss.

In 2018, the Sacramento Life Center achieved accreditation by the Accreditation Association for Ambulatory Health Care, which ensures the group has met nationally recognized standards for the provision of high-quality health care. enforcement efforts aimed at protection were stymied by lack of cooperation from local County law enforcement agencies.

"The Grand Jury is dumbfounded that the County Board of Supervisors seemed completely disconnected from the Office of Public Health

in the midst of the crisis our community faced," states Jury Foreperson Deanna Hanson, "And, it is simply irresponsible to think that Sacramento will never face another situation that needs immediate attention."

With an eye toward the future, the Grand Jury recommends that the County Board of Supervisors, the

County Executive and the County Office of Public Health jointly develop a public health emergency response plan, designed to recognize and meet the immediate requirements of OPH to implement future public health orders and best ensure the safety of Sacramento County residents. ★

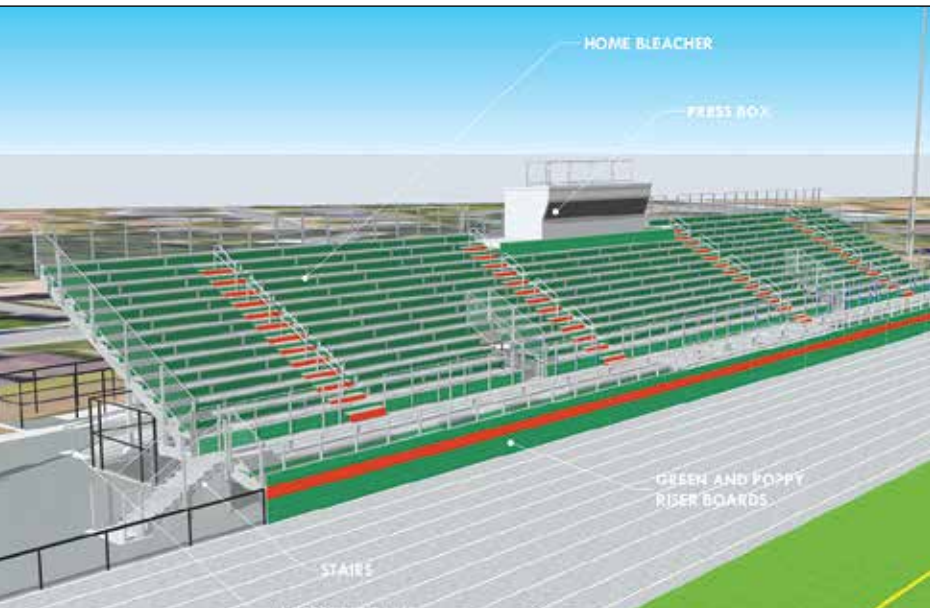

# FINALLY!

Mesa Verde High School to build new sports facilities

CITRUS HEIGHTS, CA (MPG) - A new state-of-the-art stadium is going to be built at Mesa Verde High School, something students have never had in the school’s nearly 50-year history.

The new stadium is Mesa Verde’s “signature project” which each school in the San Juan Unified School District is allotted. As part of Measure N, each school in the district gets to choose something to be upgraded using bond fundings of approximately \$4 million. The plan for a new stadium was voted for on Oct. 29, 2014, over a new cafeteria.

According to the district website, the project will include five components. First, construction of a brand-new sports stadium including a synthetic track and field. Second, building new bleachers, press box and a concessions and restroom building. Third, adding LED sports lighting. Fourth, renovating the existing parking lots and tennis courts. Fifth and finally, conducting other much-needed exterior site improvements.

Construction for the renovated stadium is expected to begin this spring and will be completed approximately by fall of next year, according to SJUSD Director of Facilities Nicholas Arps. At a recent community meeting held on Thursday,

April 7, citizens of Citrus Heights discussed the stadium plans that have been in place since 2014.

Members of the community expressed concerns to representatives from Verde Design, a landscape architecture and civil engineering firm, about lighting, noise and increased traffic that the stadium would create. Many residents near the stadium fear that the new project could affect the value of their once quiet homes.

Representatives from the SJUSD have made an effort to minimize sound levels by analyzing decibels. Additionally, the reps have begun strategizing how to cut down on traffic in residential areas and reduce the glare stemming from the lighting of stadiums by implementing the newest lighting technology.

When the SJUSD and Verde Design were drafting plans for the project, one of many proposals included building the stadium away from the homes by the school. However, the allotted funds did not allow for such a plan to come to fruition, as having to reconstruct the locations of the existing fields was out of the budget.

For years, the Mavericks have had to play all five home games at other sites, due to not having an on-site stadium to play in. Starting in 2023, Mesa Verde will officially be ready to play at home under the lights. ★
