Sacramento Spare the **Air Season** Underway

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - The Sacramento Metropolitan Air Quality Management District (Sac Metro Air District) and the air districts of the Sacramento region launched the 28th annual Spare the Air season on Sunday, May 1.

The region's Spare the Air program runs each year from May 1 through Oct. 31, and a Spare the Air alert is issued when the Air Quality Index (AQI) for ground-level ozone pollution is forecast to meet or exceed 126, rendering air quality unhealthy for sensitive groups. Air pollution affects everyone. Even healthy people can experience health impacts from polluted air, including respiratory irritation or breathing difficulties during exercise or outdoor activities. In addition to its harmful health effects, air pollution impacts businesses, the economy, and the environment. Small changes can make a big difference in our community. During the past two years, the Sacramento region saw a vast improvement in air quality. Residents of Sacramento, Placer, Yolo, Solano, and El Dorado counties are encouraged to consider teleworking, taking transit, driving a low or zero emission vehicle, or using other active transportation options such as walking, biking, or riding a scooter when possible. By making individual efforts to reduce air pollution, we can come together as a community to make a much larger impact on air quality in our region and combat climate change. Please follow these tips to continue to improve the region's air quality: Download the free Sacramento Region Air Quality app to view daily air quality forecasts and real-time air pollution readings for Sacramento, Placer, Yolo-Solano and El Dorado counties. Drive less to help reduce vehicle emissions, especially on a Spare the Air Day Telework at least once per week, if possible. Use active transportation, such as riding a bike, walking, or taking a scooter for your errands, or as a way to commute to work. Take public transit or carpool to reduce the number of single-passenger vehicles on the road. Use a zero-emission hybrid or electric vehicle. - At the April 28 meeting, the Citrus Heights City Council issued proclamations recognizing April as Fair Housing Month and April 30 as National Therapy Animal Day.

Councilmember Bret Daniels said research shows that therapy animals improve people's mental health by "decreasing fear, anxiety, loneliness, and isolation" and that the bond between person and animal plays an essential role in improving overall wellbeing by bringing "comfort and healing to those in need."

The proclamation was presented to Ms. Buxton and her dog Quincy, who both volunteered through Pet Partners to work with children at Shriner's Hospital. "It's really a great program," she said, "so thank you all."

April is recognized as Fair Housing Month to mark the enactment of the federal Fair Housing Act of 1968, which prohibits discrimination in the sale, financing, or renting

of any dwelling. Vice Mayor Tim Schaefer read the proclamation, stating that "every American has the right to live in dignity and safety without fear of discrimination."

The proclamation was presented to representatives of Project Sentinel and Sacramento Self-Help Housing, which both work to protect equal housing opportunities and help people in need find safe, affordable housing.

Gary Goodman of the Sacramento-Yolo

Mosquito & Vector Control District spoke at the meeting to remind everyone that mosquito season is starting. In addition to being a general annoyance, mosquitoes are also vectors for disease, such as West Nile Virus, which originates in birds and is passed to humans through mosquitoes.

But Goodman said they implement control measures throughout the region to reduce the mosquito population and lower the risk of disease

transmission. Mosquitoes breed in stagnant water, so technicians identify breeding areas in the community, set traps, and introduce chemical controls and biological controls (such as fish that feed on mosquito larvae).

Any water standing for more than three days can become a mosquito breeding site, so residents can help by checking for standing water in their own yards, like in bird baths, planters, or unmaintained

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
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Latest Citrus Heights Rising Rent Report

CITRUS HEIGHTS, CA (MPG) - Welcome to the May 2022 Citrus Heights Rent Report.

Citrus Heights rents increased over the past month. In this report, we'll evaluate trends in the Citrus Heights rental market, including comparisons to cities throughout the state and nation.

Citrus Heights Rents Increase Sharply Over the Past Month

Citrus Heights rents have increased 2.3% over the past month and have increased sharply by 12.1% in comparison to the same time last year. Currently, median rents in Citrus Heights stand at \$1,697 for a one-bedroom apartment and \$1,897 for a two-bedroom. This is the fourth straight month that the city has seen rent increases after a decline in December of last year. Citrus Heights' year-overyear rent growth lags the state average of 15.9%, as well as the national average of 16.3%.

Rents Rising Across Cities in California

Throughout the past year, rent increases have been occurring not just in the city of Citrus Heights, but across the entire state. Of the largest 10 cities that we have data for in California, all of them have seen prices rise. The state as a whole logged rent growth of 15.9% over the past year. Here's a look at how rents compare across some of the largest cities in the state.

Looking throughout the state, San Francisco is the most expensive of all

California's major cities, with a median two-bedroom rent of \$2,761; of the 10 largest California cities that we have data for, all have seen rents rise year-over-year, with Santa Ana experiencing the fastest growth (+22.5%).

San Diego and Anaheim have both experienced year-over-year growth above the state average (18.8% and 18.6%, respectively).

Many large cities nationwide show more affordable rents compared to Citrus Heights

As rents have increased sharply in Citrus Heights, a few large cities nationwide have seen rents grow more modestly. Compared to most large cities across the country, Citrus Heights is less affordable for renters.

Citrus Heights' median two-bedroom rent of \$1,897 is above the national average of \$1,319. Nationwide, rents have grown by 16.3% over the past year compared to the 12.1% increase in Citrus Heights.

While Citrus Heights' rents rose sharply over the past year, many cities nationwide also saw increases, including Phoenix (+23.3%), Las Vegas (+21.9%), and Tucson (+21.9%).

Renters will generally find more expensive prices in Citrus Heights than most large cities. For example, Kansas City has a median 2BR rent of \$1,186, where Citrus Heights is more than one-and-ahalf times that price.

swimming pools. People can also call to report any areas with a lot of mosquitoes.

Vice Mayor Schaefer asked whether there are ever difficulties accessing backyard swimming pools that are identified as breeding sites. Goodman said that they are usually able access to 95% of those sites without any problems, but if a resident refuses access, the District has "abatement authority" and can get a search warrant through Sacramento County, and then police officers will escort the technicians into the backyard. "We try not to go to that point, because it just becomes a little more confrontational and that's not exactly what we're looking for," said Goodman. But he explained that most people comply without an issue since it is a free service, and the technicians only need access to the yard for a few minutes to put the controls in place. He said,

"Most people are very receptive to that."

Lt. Jason Baldwin, patrol watch commander and traffic and SWAT team commander for Citrus Heights Police Department (CHPD), asked the Council to consider approving a miliary use ordinance for the department.

With the passage of AB 481 in September 2021, law enforcement agencies are now required to get approval through an official ordinance before they can acquire or use military equipment, which is defined as items such as unmanned aerial or ground vehicles, armored vehicles, command and control vehicles, and pepper balls, as well as less-lethal shotguns, projectile launchers, and flashbangs.

Many of these items are used by CHPD to resolve or de-escalate situations that might otherwise become lethal force incidents. Other items defined as military equipment include foundational equipment like rifles, which CHPD uses to address lethal threats from a greater distance to increase officer safety.

The CHPD asked Council to adopt a military equipment use ordinance so that officers can continue using what they deem to be vital equipment. According to the CHPD, these items are field-tested tools used by law enforcement agencies throughout the country to enhance the safety of both officers and citizens.

The proposed policy outlines the maximum number of each type of military equipment that CHPD may acquire, use, deploy, and maintain at any given time. The department's current inventory will be reported annually to City Council as required by AB 481.

There were no public comments submitted for this item, and it was unanimously approved by the Council without discussion. There is no fiscal impact associated with this ordinance.



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Sacramento County Project Roomkey Houses Hundreds

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) -Project Roomkey (PRK) was launched in Sacramento County in April 2020 in response to the growing concern of vulnerability to COVID-19 our unhoused population was facing. PRK was introduced as a statewide solution to an emergency situation and the County, City of Sacramento and Sacramento Steps Forward pooled their resources to bring it to fruition.

The program was intended to be shortterm, to allow for the COVID-19 virus to run its course and then ramp down the sheltering efforts as community efforts lessened. As we now know, the program has been running for nearly two years and has served more than 2,000 people – having provided isolation for persons who contracted the virus and private units for people to safely shelter in place. As a result, of these efforts, hundreds of people have exited to stable and safe locations.

Due to the unexpected duration of COVID response, state and federal dollars were made available for use to extend local PRK efforts. With state and federal funding running out, the threat of COVID-19 waning due to increased vaccination rates and lower transmission rates, Sacramento County and its many partners are ramping down the prevention and isolation units and working closely with community providers to transition PRK participants into longterm housing solutions.

The PRK program was never intended as a long-term solution to homelessness and is not a sustainable sheltering model as the program is incredibly expensive – more than \$4000 per person a month and relies on resources that were only available due to the community-wide shutdown. Hotels that offered up their space need to resume their place in tourism, and Goodwill employees reimagined as shelter staff need to return to their chosen field of work.

Project Room Key by the Numbers through January 2022:

Total sheltered: 2,051; Total exited to stable housing: 425; Total exited to temporary housing or emergency housing: 361; Still in PRK motels: 335; Average length of stay: 7.5 months; 88% have been there for more than a month; 63% have been there more than 3 months; 27% have been there over 6 months; 21% have been there over a year.

For a full report on the demographics, numbers and exits from the PRK program through January, read the latest report on the Sacramento Steps Forward website. intensified across PRK to ensure connectivity to community-based programs that will carry them well beyond their time at PRK. With the closure of the first site, County staff and partners have ensured all participants had a safe place to transition to. At the February presentation of the rampdown plan there were 121 participants at La Quinta, of those: 55 participants have moved to the two remaining PRK motels; 53 participants will receive 21-day motel vouchers (which will be extended when housing has been identified and participants have continued to work on next steps with their community-based housing provider); 6 have moved into housing; 2 chose to exit voluntarily; 5 were exited for egregious program rule violations.

Federal Reimbursement Funding Extension

DHA was recently informed that FEMA's non-congregate shelter reimbursement will be extended until June 30, 2022 (formally scheduled to end March 31, 2022), and the CA Department of Social Services has also confirmed that Counties can request additional Emergency Solutions Grant funding for continued PRK efforts. As such, DHA will be reevaluating the closure dates of the final two motel locations in concert with our partners from the City, Sacramento Steps Forward and SHRA, who provide critical re-housing supports for those in PRK, and will determine how best to use the funding options now accessible for this purpose.

Shelters and housing programs

The programs, services and funding offered through the County of Sacramento is dynamic, but below is a partial list of the programs the County funds to help shelter, house and care for our community members experiencing homelessness. The programs are often a collaboration between many County departments, including Human Assistance; Health Services; and Child, Family and Adult Services.

Sheltering (Capacity per night)

Emergency Family Shelters: 40 families; Mather Interim Shelter: 140 individuals; North A Street Shelter: 80 adults; Scattered Site Shelters: 115 people; Domestic Violence Shelter: 162 women/children.

Transitional Housing (Capacity per night)

Adolfo Transitional Housing for Foster Youth: 68 youth households; Mather Family Transitional Housing: 25 families; Youth Transitional Housing: 12 Youth.

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ProjectAttain! Joins Effort to Improve Rural Higher Education and Workforce

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) -CivicLab announced this week that ProjectAttain!, a social impact organization focused on increasing educational attainment among working-age adults across Northern California, has been chosen as one of five rural partnerships across the U.S. to participate in a twoyear initiative to improve higher education and workforce systems. Supported by Ascendium Education Group, ProjectAttain! will receive training, technical assistance, and direct financial support valued at \$150,000 to develop and implement system-level strategies that create pathways to prosperity for rural, low-income learners.

Sacramento-based

ProjectAttain! joins a cohort of four other partnerships from Florida, Indiana, New Mexico, and Texas that will meet virtually and in person to share ideas, resources, and receive technical assistance.

"We are thrilled to be selected to participate in this national program," said Dr. Jenni Murphy, founder of ProjectAttain! and dean of the College of Continuing Education at Sacramento State. "ProjectAttain! exists to help adults who opted out of their education for one reason or another get back on track with achieving their goals. Our efforts to support systems change in education and workforce development will be bolstered exponentially through our collaboration with CivicLab and by working in collaboration with the other partner programs across the country."

More than 810,000 adults across Northern California's 25 counties make up this initiative's territory, possess some college, vocational training, or high school credits, but have not completed their degree, certificate, or diploma. In the six-county Sacramento region alone, more than 400,000 individuals face the same circumstances. The Public Policy Institute of California predicts the state will have a shortfall of at least 1.5 million individuals with bachelor's degrees by 2030. Additional data indicate the shortfall increases to over 3.3 million when factoring in certificates. ProjectAttain! aims to learn CivicLab's state-ofthe art processes to develop processes that will ultimately dissolve this issue in California's north-state.

"This often overlooked and underinvested population deserves the opportunity to finish what they started," said Evan Schmidt, Valley Vision CEO and ProjectAttain!'s Executive Director.

"ProjectAttain! is here to help those who have paused their education find their way back because we know that employers, economies, and communities benefit when more adults complete their education."

CivicLab's initiative launched in February 2022 with ProjectAttain!'s guiding team, comprised of leaders in workforce and education, attending a two-day Stakeholder Engagement Process Learning Lab at CivicLab's headquarters in Columbus, Indiana. The ProjectAttain! team will return in April 2022 for CivicLab's System Building Lab to improve plans for making lasting change. "Though many partnerships are deserving of this recognition and support, ProjectAttain! demonstrated they had the relationships, capacity, and capability to make real change," said Dakota Pawlicki, director of Talent Hubs at CivicLab.

ProjectAttain! was selected through a national call for proposals. Each partnership in the cohort includes higher education institutions, nonprofit organizations, public agencies, private-sector partners, and other local stakeholders who work together to improve education and workforce outcomes. To be selected, partnerships were required to submit plans that both improve outcomes for their residents and make lasting changes on higher education and workforce systems during the two-year grant period.

"Rural communities have largely been left out of national initiatives designed to improve postsecondary education and workforce outcomes," said Kirstin Yeado, program officer at Ascendium. "Ascendium is pleased to help build the systems necessary to ensure more learners from low-income backgrounds earn degrees and credentials."

ProjectAttain! began in 2018 as a bold idea that mobilized area leaders to shed light on working-age adults with some college but no degree. ProjectAttain! has grown into a dynamic nonprofit bringing together organizations, talent, and seed funding to serve as a catalyst for equitable social mobility and economic growth for all working-age adults returning to complete a formal educational credential at the diploma, certificate, or degree level. \star

Do You Have an Uncashed Sacramento County Check?

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - Currently, the County has nearly 6,000 uncashed checks, totaling more than \$2.1 million. How does this happen and could this be your unclaimed money?

If a Sacramento County issued check goes six months without being cashed by the rightful payee, the information becomes available in a PDF document on the Unclaimed County Warrants (checks) webpage. The data is also searchable on the County's Open Data portal.

Think you might have an uncashed check with Sacramento County? Here are quick and easy ways to find out:

From the Unclaimed County Warrants webpage, scroll through the check numbers on the Unclaimed Warrant listing PDF document (use the Find feature [Ctrl+F] to search names or other terms in the PDF).

Go to the Sacramento County Open Data portal. Once on the portal, click the "Finance" icon; click the "County Outstanding Checks" link; then either use the "filter" cone-shaped icon for specific value sorting, or the column headings for alpha/numeric listings to get ascending or descending sorts.

If you find your name or business on the data listing, go to the Unclaimed County Warrants webpage to find out about the documentation and information needed to validate that you are the rightful payee to receive the funds.

More Unclaimed Monies

The Revenue Recovery Division of the Department of Finance has unclaimed payments that are a result of not having a current address for the recipient. On the Open Data portal, under the Finance category, check out the Revenue Recovery Unclaimed Payments data and search for your name. If you locate a claim due to you, contact Revenue Recovery at (916) 875-7815, and provide the following information:

- Claimant's Name
- Date of Birth
- Address (Current and Previous)
- Phone Number
- Amount of the claim
- DRR Account Number
- Court Docket Number
- Date of Order
- Defendant's Name
- Proof of Identity (Driver's License or ID Card)
- Proof of Payment: Copy of check, money order receipt or credit card confirmation number
- Information regarding the incident (case information)

Sacramento County makes this data easily available on its websites, Open Data Portal and other measures to ensure the information is accessible and the monies go to the rightful payees.

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

The exciting lobby renovation and redesign will allow for a better flow for visitors arriving at and departing from the Museum with easy-to-follow wayfinding signage. As a focal centerpiece to the refreshed lobby, the large interior wall that first greets visitors will feature eye-catching railroading images and compelling video plus provide resourcerich and regularly updated information about new exhibits, related content, directional information and more. Periodically, the front desk check-in area, public access points and pathways will need to be adjusted and/or visitors may be redirected through the main hallway or through the East Theater to arrive at the Transcontinental Railroad Gallery. All elevator and stairs will still be accessible for public use throughout the duration of the renovation process.

While subject to change, the first phase of the lobby renovation is scheduled for completion by the end of 2022 and the full multi-phase project by the end of 2024.

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - Fire season seems to start earlier and earlier, and the Sacramento County Department of Regional Parks has already initiated its multi-pronged plan to reduce fire risk, defend wildlife habitats and protect our natural resources and the neighborhoods adjacent to the parks.

For its 2022 Fire Fuel Reduction Action Plan, the Department of Regional Parks has lined up sheep and goat grazing contracts, is utilizing maintenance crews to maintain fire breaks, and is issuing fuel break maintenance permits to properties bordering Park properties.

"Thanks to the additional funding we were allocated in the last round of budget hearings, we were able to increase - and get a head start on - our fire fuel reduction efforts this year," said Liz Bellas, Director of Regional Parks. "Our maintenance crews have already begun targeted herbicide treatments and removing fire fuels in the areas they can reach, and the goat and sheep grazing will begin shortly for the areas our manned crews can't reach."

To decrease the number and size potential of wildfires in our parks system, the techniques used will be applicable for each area and will include: Firebreaks – A combination of mowing, soil discing and targeted herbicides will be used where appropriate to create perimeters around open fields, along fence lines and behind neighborhoods. This work is scheduled to be completed by end of June.

• Ladder Fuel Hand-Crews – In limited, hard-to-reach areas, hand-crews will remove vegetation that allows the potential for a fire to climb up or move into urban areas.

Grazing – There are hundreds of acres of undeveloped or protected land in our Regional Parks. Goats and sheep are ideal for vegetation management and are great at eating down weeds, bushes and grass that manned crews cannot get to. Grazing is expected to occur between April and the end of June.

 Annual Encroachment Permits - Residents who live adjacent to Regional Parks' properties are able to apply for free annual encroachment permits

to maintain a fire break behind their property line. These allow residents to string-trim grass and weeds for up to 50 feet beyond their private property line. To request a permit, provide your name, address and contact information to Regional Parks at parksinfo@SacCounty.gov.

Additionally, the Ranger Division will continue its increased education and enforcement efforts related to illegal fires and cooking along the parkway in an effort to reduce the number of new fire outbreaks.

Visitors to Sacramento **County Regional Parks** should be aware of the following regulations:

- Open flame fires are not allowed and barbequing is only permitted in designated picnic areas.
- Smoking is only allowed in developed picnic areas, asphalt surfaces, golf courses and levee tops along the American River Parkway.

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

FAIR OAKS, CA (MPG) - On Monday, April 18, 2022, at approximately 6:56 p.m., Sheriff's Communications Center received several separate calls regarding a shooting that just occurred at the park located on the 11,000 block of Fair Oaks Boulevard. The callers advised that someone had been shot and was lying in the parking lot. Additional callers stated the shooter, an adult male, left the park on foot traveling northbound through the park to Madison Avenue across the street and into the City of Citrus Heights. Deputies responded to the park and located an adult male suffering from at least one gunshot wound to the upper body. Deputies pronounced the subject deceased at the scene. Deputies then responded to the north side of Madison Avenue and located a second gunshot victim who

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Ask the DMV – Let the DMV Simplify Your Wedding Season

Did you know that the most popular time for weddings is from May through October? Whether you're headed to the altar, moving into a new home, or heading to a wedding out of state, learn how the DMV can help make wedding season more convenient and less stressful.

Q: I just got married and want to change my last name. What are the steps to do so? Do I have to visit a DMV office to get my name updated on my ID?

A: To change your name with the DMV, you'll first have to change your name with the local Social Security Administration (SSA) office. The DMV electronically verifies your name, birth date, and social security number with the SSA. After you've changed your name with the SSA, you'll need to complete a driver's license or identification card application, a process you can start online. Next, you'll need to visit a local DMV office to provide evidence of your name change and pay the application fee. At the time of this transaction, you'll also be required to surrender your current driver's license.

A name change is also an opportunity to apply for a REAL ID instead of a standard driver's license. For more information, visit realid.dmv.ca.gov.

- Q: I'll be moving into a new home after getting married. Do I need to visit a DMV office to change my address?
- A: You can change your residence or mailing address online in the DMV's Change of Address System. However, you cannot use this online service if you: Do not already have a California driver's license or identification card, do not have a social security number, have an army post office or fleet post office address, have an address outside of the US. or, have applied for but not yet received your REAL ID. For those, you must complete a change of address form and mail it to the address listed on the form.
- Q: My best friend is getting married out of state next summer and my passport has expired. Can I use it instead of a passport to fly to the wedding?
- A: Yes! A REAL ID is a federally accepted form of identification and may be used to board domestic flights and to enter secure federal facilities, such as military bases and federal courthouses. One benefit of a REAL ID is that it allows you to carry a single piece of identification that serves a dual purpose, as opposed to having to keep up with both a driver's license and a passport during travel, a time which is often already very busy and hectic. Starting May 2023, a standard driver's license/ID will become federal noncompliant, meaning you will not be allowed to board an airplane or enter secure federal facilities using it.



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Tyranny on Hold

Although more than three-quarters of California adults are vaccinated against COVID-19, opinions are more divided when it comes to vaccinating children. That sentiment played out Thursday (April 14, 2022) when first, the author of a bill that would have mandated vaccines for all children pulled the legislation, and then again when state health officials pushed back the date of their student vaccine mandate.

It was a striking shift for a state that had been the nation's first to announce a planned K-12 COVID-19 mandate.

The bill by Sen. Richard Pan, a Sacramento Democrat who chairs the Senate Health Committee, would have granted no personal belief exceptions to the requirement that all children get the COVID vaccine to attend school or childcare. In sidelining his own bill, Pan said the focus needs to be on making sure families can access the vaccine for their children.

Within hours, the California Department of Public Health announced it will not begin the process of adding the COVID-19 vaccine to the list of mandated childhood vaccines for K-12 public and private school students because it has not been approved by the federal Food and Drug Administration. Previously the state had intended to require it for the upcoming 2022-23 school year, but now that won't happen until at least July 1, 2023.

The health department said in a statement that even after COVID vaccines for kids receive full approval, it would also consider the recommendations of a Centers for Disease Control vaccine advisory committee and the American Academy of Pediatrics and American Academy of Family Physicians before issuing a school vaccine requirement.

Support for Pan's bill has been

wavering for several weeks. Last month, another member of the Senate Health Committee, Democratic Sen. Connie Leyva of Chino, told the group Stand Up Ontario, in the Inland Empire, that she was not going to vote for the bill.

She said she told Pan, "I just don't think it's the right time. We are too divided in the community," she said. "I think this bill is too divisive."

GOP political consultant Mike Madrid said legislators pull bills for many reasons, including a lack of support or because there is another way to reach the same goal.

"If a better way to solve it is access without the acrimony of mandate that is fine," he said. "The point isn't to disagree, it's to get to a point where we have public health protections."

Pan's bill was one of eight aggressive COVID-19-related bills introduced as part of a slate from the Legislature's vaccine working group, made up of Democratic legislators. Among the bills still alive in the Legislature are proposals that would punish doctors who share misinformation, require schools to continue regular COVID testing and change how the state's vaccination registry works. Also still in play: a bill that would allow 12to 17-year-olds to get vaccinated without parental consent.

The COVID vaccine is fully authorized for those older than 16 and can be given to children as young as 5 under an emergency authorization. It has been available since last year, but the uptake has been slow. About two-thirds of 12- to 17-year-olds have been vaccinated, but the numbers are much lower for kids 5 to 11, with only about one-third vaccinated.

Citing the low COVID vaccination rate among children, Pan said a mandate is not a priority until the state can make the vaccine more accessible. He said that in his experience, as a pediatrician, when parents ask about vaccinations they want to see their child's doctor. But most doctor's offices don't offer the vaccine for COVID-19 and are referring families to drug stores or vaccination sites that are not child-centric.

"The challenge is that we are

not getting vaccines into essentially the places where people normally get vaccines for their children," he said, referring to pediatricians' offices. "We still have a long way to go."

A Berkeley IGS poll released in late February found that two-thirds of California voters supported requiring the COVID-19 vaccine for K-12 students. But there is a big split along party lines: Democrats and liberals overwhelmingly support a mandate while only about a quarter of conservatives and Republicans do.

Among parents, two-thirds said they felt having their kids vaccinated was essential or important, while 26% percent said it was "either not too or not at all important." This question did not address the mandate.

Pan's was the second of the working group's bills to be sidelined by its author. A proposal to require all people who work, including contractors, to be vaccinated was also pulled.

Critics have been pushing back, arguing that the bills are burdensome and infringe on health and privacy rights – and no bill was more controversial than Pan's. Many parents who opposed it said that parents should get to choose whether to vaccinate their children, especially when the vaccine does not fully prevent transmission and it's still unclear how long it is effective.

"We did not feel it was the appropriate policy for children with respect to COVID-19 at this time," said Christina Hildebrand, head of A Voice for Choice. The group advocates for parental choice and has worked since 2015 to keep personal belief exemptions for various vaccines in place. She points to the low rate of COVID vaccination among 5- to 11-yearolds as a reason to hold off on a mandate.

"Those parents have had ample opportunity to get their children vaccinated but the parents are hesitant," she said.

Pan said it's difficult to require something that two-thirds of young children have yet to receive. "Mandates are good at getting you to that final bit when we are at 80 percent and have to get to 90, not when you are below half," he said. "If you are that far behind there's a reason. Some of it is people have questions and want to get them answered, and they want to hear from the person they have been going to for a long time to get vaccinated."

Madrid said the bills signal the possibility of future vaccine mandates as the world becomes more globalized and pandemics happen more frequently.

"There is an appetite to have more protection for public health and not less," he said. "You give it a year and study how you can make it work if you are going to pass legislation this broad and sweeping. You have to make sure you get it right the first time."

Pan said the mandate is not dead. He intends to watch the vaccination rates and said it could be something he brings back later.
