CITRUS HEIGHTS, CA (MPG) - JustServe volunteers joined in the fun helping the Citrus Heights Chamber of Commerce raise \$10,000 for the Citrus Heights Police Activities League; an organization where Police Officers and personal volunteer their time to mentor children and youth.

This relationship between youth and police is especially important to Diane Ebbitt-Riehle, director of the Citrus Heights Chamber of Commerce. Having been involved with CHPAL for 6 years, Ebbitt-Riehle says “It a great organization that helps connect kids with Police Officers. When kids have a positive connection with Police Officers, it helps the kids stay on the right path.”

CHPAL is a non-profit organization

coupling sports and recreational activities for youth with drug and gang awareness education. While exercising their bodies and minds, youth discover new sports, confidence, awareness, respect, teamwork and patience.

Police Commander Kris Frey shares “The most significant impact I have witnessed with CHPAL in our community has been the positive relationships that have been developed through the years between the youth in our city and law enforcement, specifically Citrus Heights police officers. This commitment is detailed in the CHPAL mission statement: CHPAL ‘is committed to fostering positive relationships, based on trust and respect, between law enforcement and youth through activities and programs.’”

The Citrus Heights Chamber of Commerce works to support such organizations, as evidenced by the success of its 2nd annual Corn Hole Tournament Fundraiser held on February 18. The Citrus Heights Chamber also works with the Homeless Assistance Resource Team, HART, and the Rotary Club.

“Everyone at the event had a great time. What I liked most about the event is that it was family friendly. Parents were able to bring their kids and actually participate together. Mom and son, Dad and daughters, Grandma and Grandson. Mayor Middleton and her son, had a team, Police Chief had two teams with his sons, and the new City Manager brought his kids and had two teams.”

Microbusiness Grant Program to Make Big Local Impact

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Sacramento County encourages microbusinesses in the county that have been adversely affected by the pandemic to apply to receive relief grants of \$2,500. The new Microbusiness Grant Program is funded by the State of California’s Office of the Small Business Advocate (CalOSBA) and administered by Sacramento County. These new micro-business grants do not need to be repaid, and the application period will be open April 1-29, 2022.

Often operating as solopreneurs, freelancers and small business owners, a microbusiness typically receives less than \$50,000 in revenue annually and has fewer than five full-time employees. Examples of microbusinesses include hair and make-up stylists, interior design professionals, graphic designers, caterers, photographers and event planners. To be eligible, applicants also need to have experienced a 10 percent or greater reduction in revenue in the 2019 to 2020 tax years. A complete list of grant eligibility requirements is available on the Sac4Micro website.

“Sacramento County has more than 52,000 business establishments,” said Troy Givans, Director of Sacramento County Office of Economic Development. “Of those businesses, the microbusiness sector makes up approximately 67 percent countywide. The pandemic has been especially hard on our small business community, in particular, our minority-owned businesses. The County is excited to partner with CalOSBA to offer another resource to help the microbusinesses access funding to recover.”

Additionally, Sacramento County is partnering with the California Capital Financial Development Corporation, California Hispanic Chamber of Commerce, Sacramento Asian Pacific Chamber of Commerce, Sacramento Black Chamber of Commerce, Sacramento Hispanic Chamber of Commerce, Sacramento Metro Chamber and the Slavic Chamber of Commerce to provide in-language assistance and expand the program’s reach into underserved communities.

CSUS Award Season

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - History continues to be made at Sacramento State under first-year head coach Mark Campbell as two women’s basketball players have earned individual Big Sky Conference honors.

Graduate transfer guard Lianna Tillman and sophomore center Isnelle Natabou were both recognized Monday, March 7 for their achievements during the 2021-22 regular season.

Since arriving as a graduate transfer from the University of the Pacific, there has been little doubt that Tillman is the most valuable Hornet. Now 28 games later, Tillman has been acknowledged by the rest of the conference as the Big Sky Most Valuable Player.

The 5’9 guard from Lincoln High School in Stockton is the first player in program history to earn

the award. Tillman is a bucket getter. Regardless of if she’s scoring herself or finding an open teammate, the numbers don’t lie. The graduate transfer led the Big Sky in points (20.3 PPG) and assists (6.2 APG) this season.

Tillman ranks 17th nationally in points per game and 10th in assists per game. She is also one of only two NCAA Division I women’s basketball players to average at least 18 points and six assists per game along with University of

Iowa star Caitlin Clark who ranks first nationally in points and assists per game.

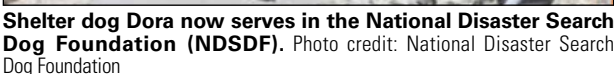
Natabou made quite the impression in her first season playing Division I, unanimously being named the Big Sky Newcomer of

way to their happy ending. Foster care providers provide temporary care outside of the shelter to animals such as those too young for adoption, needing to recover from an illness or injury, for behavior modification, or just because they need a break from the stresses of shelter life. Rescue group partners are also a huge help as they pull shelter animals who otherwise have a difficult time being adopted due to age, medical condition or the need for behavioral modification that cannot be resolved in a foster home. Shelter dog Dora, who arrived as a stray in 2016, was having a difficult time finding a forever home.



NDSDF is an organization based in Santa Paula, California that strengthens disaster response across America by rescuing and recruiting dogs

and partnering them with firefighters and other first responders to find people buried alive in the wreckage of disasters. They have been a long-time rescue partner of the Sacramento County's Bradshaw Animal Shelter.

"Groups such as NDSDF give dogs that have no chance of placement in a normal pet home an opportunity for a great outcome and a chance to truly thrive in the world," said Shasta Stratton-Quirk, who works on the shelter's foster and rescue team. "Because some dogs are not able to be adopted out through normal routes, it is the job of the foster and rescue team to find an outlet

where they can reach their true potential.

Dora's natural abilities made it clear that the NDSDF made the right choice in bringing her on the team. Six years later, the rescue partner is happy to report Dora is working diligently with the San Diego Fire Department and California Task Force 8 alongside her handler, Joe Zakar, and has truly gone from rescued to rescuer.

queen bedsheets, postage stamps and a gift card to Wal-Mart.

Best of all, these foster youth, disabled adults and homebound seniors got a reminder over the winter holidays that they were not forgotten.

More than 80 individuals and corporate sponsors from

businesses, government agencies, service groups and families donate gifts that allow the program to continue.

A team of 57 volunteers managed the pick-up, distribution, and delivery of gifts from community and private sponsors. The volunteers, many of whom return year

after year, spend three weeks in the warehouse organizing toys and gifts. In 2021, volunteers logged in almost 10,000 hours.

Donations come in other forms, too. Jackson Properties donated warehouse space; and Sourdough & Co., Roma 2 Pizza, Pizza Guys and Subway provided

lunches to hungry volunteers.

"This was our second year of taking precautions due to COVID-19, but we didn't let it stop us," said Tonja Edelman Volunteer and Student Intern Services Coordinator. "We required volunteers to be fully vaccinated and we wore masks, and we got it done. We are so thankful for our volunteers and for the contributions from local community partners that make the program possible."

The total cash value of the program – volunteers, donations, gifts - is estimated to be \$476,612.

And the look on gift recipients' faces? Priceless.

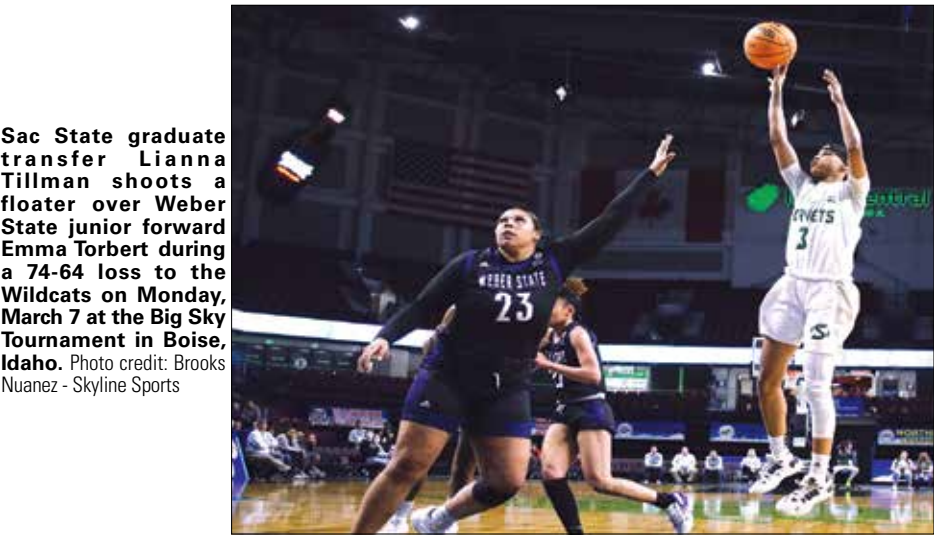

the Year. The 6’5 sophomore is the second player in school history to win the award, alongside Kim Sheehy in 2004-05.
She led the conference in rebounding (11.1 RPG) and field goal percentage (.639) while being sixth in scoring (14.6 PPG). However, that’s not all. Nationally, Natabou ranks 18th in total rebounds per game, 10th in offensive rebounds (4.3 ORPG) and fourth in field goal percentage.
The individual awards for Tillman and

Natabou continued with the All-Big Sky Conference selections. Tillman was unanimously selected to the first team and Natabou was chosen to the second team.
The Hornets’ (14-16, 10-11 Big Sky) season came to an end Monday night following a loss in the first round of the Big Sky Tournament to Weber State (11-19, 7-14) by a score of 74-64. Tillman scored a game-high 23 points and dished out four assists in her final collegiate appearance. Natabou had 10 points and six rebounds. ★

California’s Green Energy Mania Threatens Grid Reliability

California is failing at the government basics. Public safety, homelessness, roads, and water storage are all in shambles. But as long as that shameful list is, it’s about to get longer. With summer around the corner, when demand is at its zenith, our

energy supply will not be up to the task.
California’s headlong rush towards zero-carbon power will cost consumers through wildly expensive electricity rates and lower grid reliability. That’s a lose-lose for California families and businesses who want to avoid blackouts and avoid energy poverty.
Golden State politicians and Progressives – groups with an almost total overlap – live in dread fear of possible changes in weather decades in the future. Instead of planning for localized mitigations to deal with changing climate, they’ve decided to remake our entire energy sector, replacing affordable, dependable sources with their opposites.
A case in point is the closing of the Diablo Canyon nuclear power plant, scheduled to stop operations in 2025. Despite

disingenuous claims that PG&E is choosing to close this facility, they are being forced into closure by California regulators who can make relicensing extraordinarily time consuming and expensive.
How important is Diablo Canyon? It currently produces about as much power as all the rooftop solar in the entire state. And unlike solar and wind, this power is available on-demand, 24/7. PG&E, the plant’s owner, alleges it will replace all the lost power with so-called green, renewable resources, but what if it can’t?
The North American Electric Reliability Corporation (NERC), a non-profit dedicated to promoting grid reliability, thinks it won’t. NERC notes that California already has insufficient reserve power to meet demand during a heat wave. Closing Diablo Canyon will only

contribute to declining reserve margins, according to NERC.
All of that is to say that blackouts are coming when it gets hot in California, as it does every summer. Don’t be surprised when your AC won’t click on, or you’re burning candles for light in this supposedly advanced state. The blackouts are entirely predictable and a direct result of California energy policy making our grid unreliable by replacing on-demand resources with intermittent ones.
And remember, California is pushing people into electric cars through incentives and government decrees. Many people will be charging up those EVs when they get home from work, right after solar energy production peaks. We are creating dreadful imbalances that will lead to energy rationing in one of the wealthiest areas in the world.

Venture capitalist Marc Andreessen recently tweeted about the Ukrainian crisis and its effect on our energy markets and independence, “Build 1,000 new state of the art nuclear power plants in the US and Europe, right now. We won’t, but we should.” He’s right all the way around regarding energy independence and reliance on aggressive rogue states such as Russia for our energy.
But it’s the last line that hits closest to home in California. We need to reverse our green energy mania that prices electricity like a luxury good and guarantees blackouts. Dependable, affordable energy is within our grasp if we commit to predictable, on-demand resources such as nuclear and natural gas. We won’t, but we should.

It has been a busy few weeks in Sacramento County and in Washington, DC. That's why I wanted to send you a quick update on how I'm serving you in Congress.

Russian Invasion of Ukraine

I join Americans across the country in expressing outrage and horror at Vladimir Putin's unprovoked and deadly invasion of Ukraine. This invasion is not only an attack on Ukraine's sovereignty and independence, but also an assault on global peace, international law, and the values and freedoms we cherish as Americans.

As the world's longest-standing democracy, the United States must stand up for freedom and democracy worldwide. The Ukrainian people have now lived in a democracy for 30 years and have shown that they will not accept authoritarian leaders who seek to destroy and reverse the important progress they have made.

I was proud to visit Kyiv, Ukraine with a bipartisan Congressional Delegation in

February. During my visit, it was clear to me that the people of Ukraine want a future of freedom, sovereignty, and the ability to choose their own path forward. I spoke on the House floor about my visit to Ukraine—I encourage you to listen.

As Chairman of the House Foreign Affairs Subcommittee on Asia, I'm closely following the situation in Ukraine and am receiving regular briefings from U.S. officials.

I fully support the Biden Administration's decision to implement strong and severe sanctions on Russia, including on the country's oligarchs and financial institutions which have already isolated Putin from the world stage. We must also continue to support the Ukrainian people with humanitarian aid and military assistance.

Sacramento County is the proud home to one of the largest populations of Ukrainian Americans in the entire country. My office has been working around the clock to assist Americans trapped in Ukraine.

Backatcha Boomerangs

CITRUS HEIGHTS, CA (MPG) - Robert Harrington, a Citrus Heights entrepreneur, has quietly developed a reputation for hand crafted boomerangs which he sells through his Etsy and Ebay store. His company, Backatcha Boomerangs, promises his customers "many happy returns."

And they do.

Harrington, originally from San Bernardino, tends bar at the Thunder Valley Casino Resort, when he's not busily sawing out and hand painting his varied boomerang patterns from his Citrus Heights apartment.

The making of custom boomerangs is both a unique art, and a wonderfully challenging throwing sport among a growing number of enthusiasts. The overall history of the boomerangs isn't just confined to Australia where they became best known, he said.

Harrington has been teaching people, young and old to throw boomerangs since 1981 when he lived in Southern California. He's provided lessons to members of Boys and Girls Clubs, social charities and other organizations throughout the state.

Harrington stepped away from the full-time boomerang business to raise his family and has enthusiastically returned to a hobby and a business he loves. His wife Crystal adds her own decorative touch as the pair custom paints boomerangs to order.

"Each order is a collaborative one, as the customer must tell us whether they are right or left-handed, what color scheme they prefer, or even custom design what they might like," Harrington said.

In his Citrus Heights apartment, Harrington's spirit and imagination is still "back at the beach." The couple's décor is decidedly beach themed, and many of Harrington's boomerangs were on wall display.

Several unfinished boomerangs were also awaiting paint on his

dining room table, and the multiple coats of lacquer each will receive for durability before being shipped.

All of Harrington's hand-crafted boomerangs have smooth, flat edges for safe returns and a good hover for repetitive catches, he said. His most popular design is what Harrington calls his "little wing."

Harrington's boomerangs are made from locally purchased, individual sheets of five-ply, quarter-inch Baltic or finished Birch plywood. A five-foot by five-foot, individual sheet of plywood typically yields 130 individual boomerangs.

On average, Harrington said he makes about 300 boomerangs each month, and during spring and summer months, when there's good throwing weather, they tend to sell quickly.

In their order, the reason why Harrington specifically asks his customers whether they are left or right-handed is that determines how the leading edges of each boomerang are to be properly shaped for each thrower.

"I individually flight test each boomerang multiple times before they are sold," Harrington said.

Each Backatcha Boomerang also comes with written safety instructions.

Since boomerangs literally fly "back-at-cha", customers are urged to

always wear eye protection and throw from the same spot.

"Remember, you are always the target," Harrington's enclosed instructions caution.

An optional instructional DVD for \$5.00, and instructional videos are posted on YouTube. In the past, Harrington has also offered private lessons to local customers and may do so again.

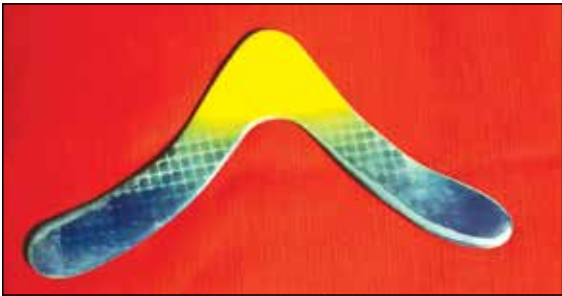
When Harrington isn't busy making boomerangs, he's often out throwing his designs in parks throughout Citrus Heights and nearby Fair Oaks. The curious sometimes become his customers.

A 60-yard throwing range, in a clear, well-lit location, free of people, trees or fences is highly recommended, Harrington said.

"I make all kinds of shapes and even lettered boomerangs in your first or last initial. Just give me a challenge to make yours," Harrington said.

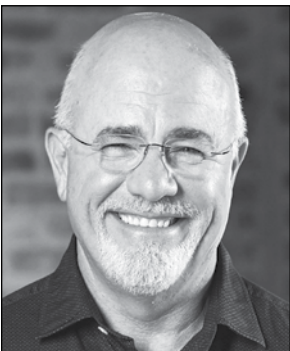

Feinstein Now Must Decide Whether to Retire

Whither Dianne Feinstein? California's senior U.S. senator, a California political fixture for more than a half-century, was facing a turning point even before her husband, financier and philanthropist Richard Blum, died on Sunday of cancer.

The Senate's oldest member at 88 and the state's longest serving senator has clearly fallen out of favor with voters, even her fellow Democrats.

A new poll by UC-Berkeley's Institute of Governmental Studies found that after years of steadily eroding popularity, just 30% of the state's registered voters now approve of her, including just 45% of Democrats. Meanwhile, 49% said they disapproved.

"The five-term senator now receives more negative than positive job ratings from strong liberals, women, voters of color, younger voters, as well as voters in Los Angeles County or the San Francisco Bay Area," the poll noted.

Feinstein has been a senator for nearly 30 years, following two decades of public service in San Francisco, including a stint as mayor. She was once one of the state's most popular politicians due to her centrist, pragmatic approach, and was the go-to person for California's interest groups with issues in Washington.

However, political polarization has left her drifting in political no-man's land, reflexively despised by Republicans because she's a Democrat and increasingly alienated from a leftward-drifting Democratic Party.

As Donald Trump's presidency widened the ideological divide, Feinstein' centrism, particularly her willingness to cross the Senate aisle and do business with Republicans, made her a pariah to the Berniecrat wing of her party. Four years ago, as she was seeking another Senate term, the state party endorsed rival Kevin de León.

Feinstein easily defeated de León in 2018 but her popularity continued its downward course, not only because she's out of step with her party but due to her age and media reports that she may be suffering the cognition effects of old age. She must now – and soon – decide whether to seek still another term in 2024.

Feinstein has said she's running again, but she would say that under any circumstances because that's what politicians do. Were she to announce retirement, her clout in the Senate, which already has waned somewhat, would vanish and there would be a feeding frenzy among California's ambitious Democratic politicians.

That said, it was at least a 50-50 bet that Feinstein wouldn't seek another term in 2024 even before the devastating poll and her husband's death. There's now a strong probability she won't run, approaching near-certainty.

As that probability sinks in, those ambitious politicians will be maneuvering to become her successor and all eyes will be on Gov. Gavin Newsom.

Newsom won't have any trouble winning re-election this year, barring some cataclysmic x-factor, but what then?

Had Trump won a second term in 2020, the door would have been open for Newsom to make a run for the White House in 2024. But with Joe Biden's victory – and more pointedly, Californian Kamala Harris' elevation from the Senate into the vice presidency – a 2024 presidential run by Newsom seems highly unlikely.

Newsom wears ambition on his sleeve and if he wants to extend his political career, the next logical move would be into the Senate, and there's no better springboard than a landslide re-election as governor this year.

Newsom is certainly not the only California politician who might want to succeed Feinstein. There are probably several dozen Democratic members of Congress who see a senator staring back when they look in the mirror, plus some other statewide officials and big city mayors.

It all hinges on whether Feinstein is ready for a well-earned political retirement.

Shooter Kills Four Inside Church

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - At approximately 5:07 p.m. on Monday, February 28, 2022, the Sacramento County Sheriff's Office Communications Center received a call from an employee of a church, located on the 2000 block of Wyda Way, stating a man with a gun was shooting inside the church. The caller had been upstairs inside the church when he heard shots fired. He then exited the sanctuary and called the Sheriff's Office. The first deputy arrived at the church at 5:09 p.m. with multiple units following. Deputies did not hear the sounds of shooting when they arrived but treated the scene as an Active Shooter Situation and immediately entered the building and began searching rooms.

Deputies located two adults and three juveniles inside building. Deputies triaged each subject, rendering aid before all five were pronounced deceased at the scene. The victims

were a 59-year-old male chaperone to the three female juveniles ages 9, 10 and 13. The shooter, 39-year-old father of the children, then turned the firearm on himself.

Seventy personnel responded from the Sacramento Sheriff's Office to the call as well as numerous regional law enforcement agencies. The Sheriff's Office is grateful to the community and our allied partners for their assistance. Investigators were on scene throughout the night collecting physical evidence, canvassing for witnesses and surveillance video.

The identity of the victims and shooter in this case will be released by the Sacramento County Coroner's Office.

Sacramento has one of the largest Ukrainian immigrant populations in the USA, and they are stepping up to help the besieged, freedom-loving people of Ukraine push back against Putin's aggressions.

While President Trump was our leader, Russia was in check. During the Bush and Obama Administrations, Putin successfully restored control over parts of the former Soviet Union, and now he's back on the battlefield because of Biden's weakness.

While Putin was able to ignore any consequences of crossing Biden, he underestimated the resolve of the Ukrainian people to remain independent of Russia. Their bravery and patriotism has been admirable and worthy of our respect and assistance.

One Sacramento resident who has a personal stake in the Ukraine's survival is local businessman and candidate for Congress Max Semenenko. With family under siege in his former country, Max is stepping up to inform Sacramentans on the circumstances that led to this invasion, and how to help the people of Ukraine persevere.

Below are Max Semenenko's observations:

"Vladimir Putin has shattered European security and is threatening nuclear war against any country that stands in his way. Putin's war against innocent Ukrainians is criminal and an attack on the fundamental principles of sovereignty and self-determination that underpin global security. NATO and the west have no choice but to recognize what's unfolding in Europe. The world must stop Vladimir Putin.

I was born in Ukraine, and I understand why Ukrainians want to join NATO: Peace, security, freedom. Ukraine declared independence in 1991, when the communist Supreme Soviet of Ukraine proclaimed that Ukraine would no longer follow the laws of USSR. What the people of Ukraine didn't do in 1991 was ask to remain a part of a Soviet Union. Nor did they want to continue living under Russian laws.

Putin claims Russians in Ukraine are estranged from their homeland, are under attack, and that Russia is coming to their defense. In 2014, Putin began issuing Russian passports to ethnic Russians in Crimea and areas in eastern Ukraine. Crimea was invaded and annexed to Russia soon after. Putin has since continued his asymmetrical form of cultural warfare in eastern Ukraine while arming and directing "Russian rebels" to fight a war of "independence" against Kiev.

I support heavy sanctions on Russia and engaging our allies to ban Russia from international banking and financial markets. The USA must step up aid for Ukraine's resistance, and when Vladimir Putin threatens nuclear retaliation, President Biden and our NATO allies must communicate our resolve to halt Russian aggression in equally strong terms.

This new reality demands a new posturing and resurgence of NATO forces into eastern Europe. We must immediately demonstrate by our actions that the United States and NATO will fight back and reverse any further Russian aggression.

The USA and our allies have blindly tolerated dependence on Russian energy supplies, in effect financing their wars. It's not too late to return the United States to its status as an energy independent nation, and as a Member of Congress that will be one of my priorities.

I am personally supporting and working with Revived Soldiers Ukraine, a non-profit that is providing aid to Ukrainian families and healthcare to wounded soldiers. You can join me and donate at www.rsukraine.org.

Please pray for peace - for the United States, our soldiers, and our leaders. Pray for the safety of our friends and allies facing the enemy, Ukrainian leaders, families, and those on the frontlines."
