CITRUS HEIGHTS, CA (MPG) - Thursday, December 16th, saw the culmination of the six-week Operation Holiday Cheer (OHC) program. The day began as 32 adopted families

Caltrans Hero Awarded State's Highest Honor for Public Servants

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - The State of California has awarded Caltrans Highway Maintenance Leadworker Royce Hiner with a Governor's State Employee Medal of Valor for courage in the face of danger. Hiner received the Silver Medal of Valor for risking his life to save another.

"Many honorable servants to the state of California risk danger as part of their everyday duties. But occasionally someone goes beyond the line of duty to display extraordinary courage in the face of danger," said Caltrans Director Toks Omishakin. "Royce Hiner is one such public servant. We honor and thank him for his bravery and are proud to have him in our Caltrans family."

Hiner was traveling to a routine maintenance call on July 25, 2018, on Interstate 5 near Corning, when he encountered a van that was on fire. He stopped to help the driver, who was frantically trying to put the fire out. Hiner advised the driver to stay clear from the van as he worked to free a dog that was still in the vehicle. He was pulling the man away from the vehicle when it suddenly burst into flames. Hiner ensured the man remained safe until first responders arrived at the scene.

The State Employee Medal of Valor Award is the highest honor California bestows on its public servants. Governor Edmund G. Brown Sr. presented the first awards in 1959. Today nearly 700 state employees have earned that honor for displaying bravery, courage, and selflessness in the face of danger. ★

Firefighting is Lifesaving

Sac Region's Fire Trove Harkens Back to 1850s

WEST SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - The Sacramento Regional Fire Museum has been in West Sacramento for the last three years. Located at 3650 Industrial Blvd., the items in this museum hold firefighting history from the Sacramento Valley—from Fairfield, Dixon, Davis, Yuba City, Citrus Heights, Sacramento, Auburn and other parts of the valley. Pioneer Mutual Hook and Ladder Society was established in 1990 with the intent of building this museum in honor of the Mutual Hook and Ladder Company, which was the first organized Sacramento Fire Company and was formed in 1850.

Their Mission Statements reads, “The Pioneer Mutual

not the only items. A wide range of equipment is also included in the museum, like identification, signaling lanterns. In the 1830's these lanterns were Kerosene powered. Each

Some other equipment includes trumpets that were used for the Fire Chief to shout orders on the ground at the scene of a fire. There are leather buckets that were used to carry water by hand. There are old metal buckets that eventually replaced the leather ones. There is also the evolution of fire extinguishers. Originally for fire extinguishers, there were Carbon Tetrachloride Grenades for putting out small fires. These were a small, colored, glass ball or bulb, about the size of a large orange, that were filled with a non-flammable Carbon Tet. They were generally resting in a wire hoop and attached to the wall, near the door. When a fire broke out, the grenade was thrown at the base of the fire, the glass would break, and the Carbon Tet would evaporate very quickly and extinguish the fire. These were eventually found to have toxic vapors and have been banned since the 1940's.

There are many types of extinguishers, hydrants, nozzles, hoses, lights, hooks, tools, cables, gas masks, horns, hats, badges, and bells. It's really quite amazing... and impressive that they have been able to collect these items. They even have a “Life Net”. A Life Net is that big round device that fire fighters would hold so that people could jump out of high-rise fires. It was invented by a civil war veteran, named Thomas F. Bowder. Originally he called it “Bowder Life Saving Machine”. The life net became obsolete in the 1980s.

Within the museum there are areas that are set up to

look like the typical firefighter's dorm as well as the command center. Do you remember when there used to be those red and white “Fire boxes” around town that would activate a fire alarm, dispatching the Fire Department? Well, this museum not only includes those fire boxes, but it includes Sacramento's emergency system... in working order.

This actual system was used until the 1990s. It is amazing, and not at all what I would expect. Though I don't know what I would have expected, I can promise you that it wasn't this! Each section has bells at the top and each section was from a specific area of town. When a handle was pulled in a fire box an alarm would go off in that section of the emergency system, which would send a message on a tickertape. They would take that information and go to a giant “Rolodex” where they would look up the address of the alarm location. The alarm system is the only one that they know of on the West Coast.

The museum costs \$10 for adults with discounts for Seniors and \$5 for kids 12 and under. You can also rent the museum to hold a party or other gathering. It was recently rented for a Memorial with about 300 people that attended. They have memberships of different levels and accept donations to support the cost of maintaining the museum. Hook and Ladder Society/ Sacramento Regional Fire Museum is dedicated to the preservation of fire service history in the Sacramento Region by collecting, restoring significant artifacts, documents, equipment and other pieces for preservation and display, and providing education to the public on fire safety and the fire service in general, by conducting educational programs of its own or partnering with other fire service organizations.”

The fire museum contains a hand pulled hose reel and hose cart from the late 1800s. In addition, it holds a 1912 horse drawn ladder unit that was used for service in Sacramento. the water with a Waterous rotary gear pump. Waterous still manufactures fire pumps to this day. This was Fairfield's primary piece of fire equipment and its service area was Dixon.

Just a few of the vehicles go on to include a 1914 Tractor unit from Dixon, a 1915 vehicle from Winters, a 1921 pumper and a 1924 pumper that was Sacramento's former Chemical Engine #2. They have West Sacramento's original fire engine from 1946. The vehicles alone are an amazing collection. Further, it includes vehicles from the 1920s, 1930s, 1940s and 1950s. It holds Hook and Ladder Trucks, Pumpers and Chemical Wagons. There is even a 1953 Ambulance. The only place I've seen an ambulance that looks like the one in the museum was

possible by the generosity of many donors /adopters, including local businesses, service organizations, churches, volunteers, and community members.

“Shop with a Cop” joined the OHC program this year. Thirty-seven kids were selected and each received gift cards, and backpacks filled with toys, a bicycle helmet, and a Christmas stocking, all provided by the Rotary Club of Citrus Heights and Stone’s Gambling Hall.

It was also the afternoon of the traditional Sayonara Drive Citrus Heights Police Department (CHDP) Wave Parade. At about 3 p.m. streets surrounding the Sayonara Center were blocked as the police caravan arrived with sirens blaring and lights flashing. It was quite a sight as excited children and their families and

Center staff formed a welcoming committee. They took videos and held up signs as more than a dozen police vehicles including the CHPD command post and marked and unmarked police vehicles passed by. The vehicles then lined the street in front of the Sayonara Center and beyond. It was controlled chaos as over 100 toys and stuffed animals were distributed to all the kids who attended the parade.

Police Chief Alex Turcotte, Commander Jason Russo and Commander Chris Frey joined other CHDP officers and staff, hugging happy children and handing out gifts. Mayor Porsche Middleton and councilmember Jeannie Bruins met parents and mingled with the delighted young ones. Sayonara Center Director Julie Habeeb and her staff helped with the event. Larissa

Aguilar, CHPD Public Information Officer said they all received “a ton of gifts.”

CITRUS HEIGHTS, CA (MPG) - Certified Professional Coach and Certified Behavior Analyst MaryJane Lopez-Taff was the invited speaker at the Citrus Heights Chamber of Commerce luncheon for December.

According to her website, Taff Enterprises is “a Leadership and Personal Development company focused on giving new entrepreneurs [the] tools to achieve balance in their business and home lives.” Taff has lived in Citrus Heights for over 20 years and has been working since 2012 with entrepreneurs and small business owners, using her coaching methodology, “Spark Your Brilliance,” to help individuals seeking a higher purpose in life.

Listening, according to Taff, is extremely important on the road to success at the personal level as well as the community level. Through her experience in Toastmasters as District Director and other clubs such as Citrus Heights Women’s Club, she learned that “when she listens, she can create change.”

Taff sees a need for improvement in Citrus Heights in providing options as to how people can connect with their government. That is why she is running for the

Citrus Heights City Council, District 2 seat.

She says, “we need to follow parliamentary procedure to take the right steps so all can be heard and feel heard.” She would like to have town hall meetings, learning more about people, clubs and other service organizations.

In an interview with the Messenger, she said, “We need transparency, to let all who want to voice their opinions and needs [to] do so. Not just be a city that decides to do things, begins making plans to carry it out, then tell the people when it’s too late and they can’t object or try to stop the project, etc...”

Taff says, “many citizens don’t know how local and other governments work and how things get done in a city. We need classes and education... When there is a hot button issue, there needs to be more discussion and work out decisions with [the] input of all.”

“I’m not negative; I’m a peacemaker,” said Taff. She said her “vision is to contribute to the community and see a venue for art, music and movement, perhaps a community arts center.”

Big Utilities Winning Battle Over Solar Power

The emails arrived just minutes apart on Monday.

The first, from a group called Affordable Clean Energy for All, proclaimed “CPUC Takes Steps to Fix the Unfair Customer Cost Shift Created by 25-Year-Old Rooftop Solar Program.”

The second, from a rival organization, the Environment California Research & Policy Center, countered with “California Public Utility Commission fails Californians by gutting bedrock solar program.”

Both were reacting to release of a California Public Utilities Commission draft ruling that would reduce the payments from utilities to owners of rooftop solar power systems when they feed excess juice back into the grid. It would also require those owners to pay a monthly fee for using the grid.

The release capped months of political jousting between the state’s major utilities, backed by their employees’ unions, and the solar power industry, which has allies among environmental groups, over how solar energy will develop as the state attempts to drastically reduce its carbon footprint. Will it

emphasize individual solar installations controlled by consumers or large solar panel farms controlled by utilities and their suppliers?

The big utilities – Pacific Gas and Electric, Southern California Edison and Sempra Energy – are pushing the policy change. They argue that since rooftop solar arrays are mostly owned by upper-income Californians, the current policy, in effect, gives them a subsidy, of as much as \$3.4 billion a year, from the pockets of less affluent ratepayers. They also contend that since owners of solar panels use the grid, they should pay something to maintain it, hence the \$57 monthly fee.

The companies that install personal solar systems counter that the new policy proposal would make them less affordable to middle- and low-income homeowners. They and their environmental allies also contend that changing the rules would have the overall effect of reducing solar generation and thus hamstringing California’s efforts to wean itself from carbon-based energy.

Both sides have waged public relations and media campaigns to sell their messages, but so far, with the release of the draft, the utility-led faction is prevailing, which is not surprising given the CPUC’s historic slant. While it regulates utilities, supposedly to protect consumers, the commission also has an implicit duty to make sure that power companies are financially healthy enough to attract investors and borrow money for system

improvements.

Clearly, the utilities – and their unions – see the growth of personal solar systems as a potential threat to their financial future. Reducing that threat, rather than creating more equity, is their true motive for seeking a change of policy. Likewise, while their solar industry rivals also claim equity as their motive, the proposal would make it more difficult to sell rooftop systems, more than a million of which are already operative. So their underlying motive is also financial.

The full CPUC is expected to vote early next year, but the battle is not over and it now shifts to Gov. Gavin Newsom, who appoints its members. He’s already nominated a new chairperson, Alice Reynolds, who is now his energy advisor and will take the new position before a final vote on the policy.

Politically, therefore, it is very clear that the revised solar policy will only be adopted if Newsom wants it to be adopted. Setting aside the major interest groups in the conflict, it involves two sub-factions that have close ties to the governor – unions and environmentalists – although the latter are also divided into pro and con camps.

The full CPUC is likely to adopt the proposed policy change and if there’s political fallout, Newsom will feel it as he seeks re-election next year.

On the heels of a new statewide mask mandate and the continued declaration of a COVID-19 state of emergency, it feels necessary to once again advocate for a population left seemingly voiceless throughout this saga. Children often report symptoms of shortness of breath, headache, nausea, vomiting, syncope, fear, anxiety and depression as a result of masking up. Some children who have extenuating circumstances such as autistic disorder, cerebral palsy, lung disease or hearing disorders, suffer a great trauma from masking. If we genuinely wish to unburden students from the social, mental and physical impacts of the pandemic, we need to let them remove their masks.

I am sure we have all had conversations where someone or both people had to pull their masks away from their faces so the other person could understand what was being said. Imagine doing that through an entire school day. Masks make it difficult to hear or understand what someone is saying, but they also cover facial expressions. Children need to see a smile, a frown, or a silly face as part of their social development. They also need to show their expressions to feel seen and understood. The hindering of their social development has potentially severe long-term consequences. As things like depression and anxiety are already

becoming more prevalent in our society, stunting the emotional growth of an entire generation seems like a dangerous decision to make. As we approach two years of this crisis, we need to think about how we may be creating new, potentially worse, problems.

If masks are intended to prevent the spread of the virus, there are alternatives to masking children such as classrooms getting better ventilation and being provided with air filters. The health and safety of children should remain a priority, but that means every aspect of their health. When a child walks into their classroom, they should be entering an environment where they can learn, feel safe, and express themselves meaningfully.

Let adults shoulder the burden of government mandates and states of emergency and leave the children out of it. I sincerely hope that our Governor, our teachers, and all school officials would agree that the well-being of children should be a priority and that we can take on a little extra risk for ourselves to protect them.

The Failure of ‘Latinx’

What the progressive culture elite wants, it usually gets. Single-sex bathrooms changing overnight to all-gender or non-gender bathrooms? Done. Illegal immigrants becoming known as undocumented persons? But of course.

So, when it was decided in the precincts of fashionable opinion that the term “Latino” would be retired in favor of “Latinx,” one could have been forgiven for thinking that this hideous neologism would, like so much else in American life, go from a fringe cause to mainstream soon enough.

But a funny thing happened on the way to the Latinx ascendancy – Latinos have rejected the term, at the same time that a big swing toward the GOP among these voters has highlighted the perils of high-handed cultural politics for the Democrats.

Latinx may end up being a woke experiment that failed, showing the vast gap between the identity-politics-obsessed progressives earnestly talking to one another in seminar rooms and on social media and the Hispanics in whose name they presume to speak.

Latinx is a project cut from the same cloth as the endless extension of LGBTQ, which, as of this writing, is now more properly and comprehensively rendered as

LGBTQQIP2SAA.

The alleged problem that Latinx was invented to fix is that is Spanish has gendered nouns. This means that using the male Latino as an adjective to describe men and women of Latin American ancestry, let alone transgender and non-binary people, is supposedly exclusionary, hateful and downright dangerous. As a handbook on the terminology by a Princeton scholar explains, “To default to the masculine gender promotes interpersonal violence against women and non-binary individuals.”

Latinx rose from the ashes of its predecessor neologism Latin@, an attempted amalgamation of the -o at the end of the Latino and the -a at the end of Latina. But no one knew how to pronounce the word. It was deemed insufficiently woke because the “o” was supposedly graphically dominating the “a” (yes, this is how some people think). And it caused confusion on social media where the at sign is used to tag someone.

Enter Latinx, which is only slightly less ridiculous.

As Giancarlo Sopo of The Daily Wire, who has been on a one-man crusade against the rise of the term, points out, Latinx is incomprehensible to any Spanish speaker without some knowledge of English. Most Spanish-speakers don’t think there is something desperately flawed about their language, or that Spanish grammar is a proto-hate crime. The Real Academia Espanola, Spain’s official institution charged with

maintaining the integrity of the language, has ruled against the -x appendage.

Out in the real world, “Latinx” polls even more poorly than Joe Biden does. A Politico poll found that only 2% of Hispanics prefer the term, while 68% opt for Hispanic and 21% favor Latino or Latina. The term is considered offensive to 40% of respondents and 30% said that they are less likely to support a politician or group using it.

Rep. Ruben Gallego, an Arizona Democrat, tweeted in reaction to the poll that he forbids his staff from using Latinx in official communications. “When Latino politicians use the term, it is largely to appease white rich progressives who think that is the term we use,” he wrote. “It is a vicious circle of confirmation bias.”

Still, elite media outlets and other institutions susceptible to progressive influence, as well as many elected Democrats, have dutifully defaulted to the term. It’s one thing if an individual prefers to be called Latinx (or, the even more cutting-edge Latina/o/x or Xicanx), it’s another thing to apply the term to a large group of people who have no interest in being called a name that makes no sense to them.

The pushback is a heartening sign of the limits of elite cultural power, and of the lack of interest of most Latinos in being pawns in the ever more strained and obscure progressive politics of perpetual victimology.

Are You ‘Aged Out’ of Owning a Business?

Commentary

Two drivers behind “The Great Resignation” have been unhappiness and boldness – people thinking they can find a more fulfilling job at a different company, or a new career altogether, and then going for it.

One example is the surge in new entrepreneurs. The pandemic has brought out a record number of them. And a high percentage of those who recently quit their jobs say they’re planning to start their own business.

Yet others who consider being their own boss hesitate, and one reason is age. Are they too old, or too young and inexperienced, to start and run a new business or buy and operate an existing company? These are valid questions, but the current economic climate is favorable for entrepreneurship no matter one’s age, says Stuart Robles (www.briggscapital.com), co-author of The New World of Entrepreneurship: Insiders’ Guide to Buying and Selling Your Own

Business in the Digital Age.

“With the great economic reset from the pandemic working its way through the American economic system, there have been many losers and some big winners along the way,” Robles says. “But the biggest winners will be those individuals who step into the entrepreneurial ring in 2022.

“This includes hard-working Americans in the middle. Now is their time. There are historic opportunities for those poised to start a business or become partners in one. Tremendous amounts of money are available – in venture capital and other investment vehicles. Chaos has created disruption and new niches for businesses. The markets are overheated and returns are unpredictable with interest rates rising next year. So a great place folks can put their money is in private businesses.”

Robles cautions, however, that historically failure rates for new businesses are high, and learning how to

navigate the sometimes rough waters is essential to success. He offers these tips for first-time entrepreneurs:

Bring the bucks to match your boldness. Without sufficient growth capital, promising plans for start-ups or initiatives for existing companies die on the launching pad. “Many first-time buyers or start-up entrepreneurs do not consider the follow-on cash

of influence in the sector and trolling through their connections. “These are absolutely key undertakings in your quest,” he says. “The experienced players involved in start-ups admire those founders who whittle and cajole others to do their bidding for no apparent up-front compensation.”; **Be ready for long hours.** The pace, demands, and hours required of a business owner necessitate honest self-reflection before taking the leap, Robles says. “You really have to critique yourself physically for the rigors ahead,” he says. “We often recommend a physical exam before an acquisition to fully evaluate your health. Find time to get away and exercise. And having a smooth life on the home front, with no static for your long absences, is a must for longevity.”; **Be a storyteller.** Robles says the message you convey about your business should combine passion and uniqueness, so it connects with people. “Learn to turn your dull widget into a fascinating oracle of

the industry,” Robles says. “Show the fire and enthusiasm that will be welcomed by the established players. They can cut years off your learning curve and provide contacts and vendors that you would stumble past in your ignorance.”; **Don’t give away too much too soon on social media.** Announcing to the world your intentions right out of the gate is not a good idea, Robles says, because rivals will intervene. “Better to let them eye you with wary but benign interest and not try to block you before you’ve hardly advanced the ball,” Robles says. “Until your strategy starts impacting the marketplace, keep your plans to yourself and your key players. Social media posts and press releases pushed through paid wire services are most often read by your competitors rather than your customers.”

“Every seven to 10 years, America faces an economic crisis, but these jolts set the stage for innovation and profits for new entrepreneurs,” Robles says. “Now is one of those times.” ★

Council Still to Approve Small Business COVID Recovery Grants

CITRUS HEIGHT, CA (MPG) - At a recent meeting, the Citrus Heights City Council considered next steps for allocating the federal American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funding to support COVID recovery in Citrus Heights. The City’s total funding award is \$15.6 million. The first installment of \$7.8 million was received in May 2021, and \$5.3 million was allocated in Phase 1 to restore staffing at the Citrus Heights Police Department. The final \$7.8 million installment is expected in May 2022, but the current available funding totals \$2.4 million.

Economic Development and Communications Manager Megan Huber said Phase 2 will focus on COVID recovery grants for small businesses in Citrus Heights, in addition to a separate funding category for the recovery of the travel, tourism, and entertainment industry, which has experienced significant impacts throughout the pandemic.

Huber said that new and renewed business licenses increased in 2021, “which means there is great entrepreneurship activity happening. Small businesses are staying resilient and active.” Citrus Heights has a majority of small businesses, with 87% of businesses having fewer than 20 employees. Huber said a review of business licenses showed 1,518 commercial businesses and 1,666 home-based business, which is a high level of home-based

businesses for a city of this size.

At the beginning of December, the economic development department distributed a business survey to determine the level of COVID impact on local businesses. The survey is still ongoing, but Huber said preliminary results show that the biggest COVID impact to businesses has been reduction in revenue, with almost 70% of businesses reporting at least 15% revenue loss.

Citrus Heights Chamber of Commerce Executive Director Dianne Ebbitt spoke at the meeting, sharing the struggles of local business owners: “Our businesses are hurting because of the COVID pandemic. They struggle every day to keep their doors open ... It’s been devastating to our businesses.”

“These businesses need help,” said Ebbitt, “Making the ARPA funds available to the Citrus Heights businesses would help lift a huge burden.”

Scott Angel of STORE Capital, the group that owns 8505 Auburn Blvd. – better known as the vacant Studio Movie Grill site – submitted a comment to the City Council, stating that the stalled project negatively impacts the surrounding businesses. STORE Capital foreclosed on the location in mid-2021, after Studio Movie Grill declared bankruptcy and abandoned the project in 2020.

Angel said that ARPA funds earmarked for travel, tourism, and entertainment would help revitalize the site by enabling them to attract a quality tenant to complete construction of the project

and operate the site. He said completion of the plans would “bring the community together at the new entertainment venue – creating job opportunities, additional tax income for the municipality, and will benefit the existing shopping center by bringing new patrons to the area.”

One of the neighboring businesses in that shopping center is Big Lots, and that property and much of the surrounding parking lot is owned by Red Mountain Group, which owns 122 properties in 20 states. Graham Allchorn, one of the owners, said they have been feeding money into that property to “shore up” the site, but they can’t continue to do that indefinitely. He said Big Lots has seen a \$1.5 million loss of revenue with decreased sales, and ARPA funds could help keep that business open.

Huber said they’ll design the grant application process to be as simple as possible: “We know that our small businesses are busy out there just looking to survive, and we do not want to give them a huge chore of an application process.”

To be eligible for the small business recovery grants, businesses must have no more than 20 full-time employees, earned \$3 million or less in annual revenue in 2019, and experienced a net revenue loss of at least 15% in either 2020 or 2021.

The grant amounts would be determined through a tiered approach, so businesses with \$1,000 to \$100,000 in annual revenue in 2019 would receive a \$5,000 grant; those with revenue

between \$100,000 and \$1 million would receive \$15,000; and businesses with revenue over \$1 million would get \$25,000. However, for home-based businesses, which makes up the majority of businesses in Citrus Heights, the recommendation was for a flat grant amount of \$500.

Huber suggested an initial application period of 30 days, with the possibility of subsequent rounds if the funds aren’t exhausted in the initial round. Businesses would submit applications and supporting documents, including business license certificate, W9, and tax returns from 2019 and 2020 or 2021. The City would then review the applications to determine eligibility and applicable grant amount.

The funding for travel, tourism, and entertainment would target businesses such as bowling alleys, movie theaters, performing arts venues, and event venues. Huber said this would be a request-based program to ensure the most effective COVID recovery response. She recommended a 60-day application period, with finance committee review and Council approval. This program would give priority to vacant sites that are causing blight and need capital investment for COVID recovery.

The totals for each category would be \$1.4 million for the small business recovery grants and \$1 million for the travel, tourism, and entertainment grants.

Vice Mayor Tim Schaefer expressed concern that the grants would be used to “cure” the

checkbooks of business owners without any positive impact to the City. However, Interim Administrative Services Director Bill Zenoni explained that the federal guidelines stipulate that the funds are to help businesses impacted by COVID, and that the grants might not bring any tangible results beyond the businesses remaining open.

Councilmember Bret Daniels pointed out that if each of the 1,500 commercial businesses received just \$1,000 each, that would exhaust the \$1.4 million planned for this program. He said, “I think our number’s too low there, actually.” While he acknowledged the importance of revitalizing the Studio Movie Grill site and the surrounding shopping center, he doesn’t want to see so much of the funding concentrated on just one area. He said he’d like to see more money allocated toward the small business grant category to “rescue” as many businesses as possible.

Huber said, “There’s no way to know the true demand of something like this, which means, we’re designing the path as we’re walking down it.” She said they’re prepared to make adjustments depending on the level of demand.

The Council will consider approval of the detailed program guidelines for small business recovery grants at the January 13 meeting, with the program expected to launch mid-January 2022. Guidelines for the travel, tourism, and entertainment program will be presented to Council in February or March 2022. ★
