City Ends Fiscal Year with Surplus

CITRUS HEIGHTS, CA (MPG) - At the October 28 meeting, Interim Administrative Services Director Bill Zenoni provided the Citrus Heights City Council with a financial update on the City's general fund. The budget for the 2020-2021 fiscal year, which ended in June, included an expected shortfall of \$3.7 million, with plans to utilize a line of credit to cover the gap. However, the City actually ended up with a surplus of \$3.6 million.

The surplus can be attributed to higher-than-expected revenues as well as lower expenditures. Maintaining staff vacancies saved a significant amount of money on expenditures, and federal funding awards helped bolster the revenue stream and fund operating costs at the Citrus Heights Police Department. Sales tax revenues were also higher than expected, because although local sales decreased due to COVID-19, online sales increased enough to cover, and exceed, the difference in

The Council also moved forward with an amendment to the residential solid waste collection and recycling services agreement with Republic Services. The service changes and proposed rate increases are a result of unfunded organics recycling mandates required by California's Senate Bill (SB) 1383 to reduce methane gas production.

Weekly garbage collection and bi-weekly recycling collection will continue, while green waste will increase to weekly a collection that must now include organic food waste. The cost of the organics recycling program will total approximately \$2 million per year, due to the costs of additional trucks, processing services, customer outreach and education, and administration services to monitor the program.

Collection rates for Citrus Heights residents have increased much slower than the Consumer Price Index (CPI), which allows for a maximum of 3.5% increase each year. Current rates are only about a dollar higher than in 2010, but increases will be necessary to maintain current services and cover the additional mandated services.

Most Citrus Heights customers subscribe to the 64-gallon carts, which will cost \$23.61 per billing cycle in January 2022. When the organics recycling program is implemented in July 2022, the cost will increase to \$29.80. Additional scheduled increases will occur each January throughout the contract, with the rate hitting \$35.40 by 2027. Even with the increases, City staff said Continued on page 4

Continued from page 1 rates in Citrus Heights will still be among the lowest in the region.

Affected property owners can protest proposed fee increases under Prop 218, and the public hearing on this issue is set for January 27, 2022. If a majority of account holders submit written protests, the City cannot impose the fee. But if the City does not comply with the SB 1383 requirements, the state can impose significant financial penalties – up to \$10,000 per day.

Councilmember Bret Daniels called the mandate "ridiculous." He acknowledged that it needed to pass but said he would vote no "symbolically."

The motion passed 3-2, with Daniels and Tim Schaefer dissenting. Mayor Steve Miller said, "I wanted to vote no, too." Councilmember Bruins agreed: "I think we all did."

Councilmembers Daniels and Bruins brought forward an item suggesting that Council approve a resolution supporting citizens' choice regarding the COVID-19 vaccine.

Section 1 of the resolution stated that the Council "encourages people to make an informed decision, assess risk and make the best decision for themselves and their families including the right to determine if they should receive the COVID-19 vaccine."

Section 2 specified that the Council "encourages families to voice their opposition and concerns regarding mandates for students to be vaccinated or wear a mask."

Section 3 expressed support for "all employers, including private sector, education, public agencies, including the City of Citrus Heights, to allow employees the choice as to whether or not to be vaccinated."

Daniels said, "The virus is real, the vaccine can be effective, and if you want to take one you should. And if you don't want to take one, you shouldn't have to."

Councilmember Schaefer said he believes in the vaccine, but "I also believe in liberty."

Vice Mayor Porsche Middleton didn't think this issue merited an official resolution from the Council: "We don't need a mandate or a resolution saying that you can do whatever you want to do. We live in America."

Mayor Miller spoke passionately against this resolution, stating that he agreed with making an informed decision, but he believes that decision should be informed by doctors and not conspiracy theories. He pointed out that in addition to protecting yourself and your family, getting the vaccine helps protect anyone you come in contact with, including young children and other vulnerable people who cannot be vaccinated.

Miller took further issue with the wording of Section 2, which seemed to specifically support "opposition" to mask and vaccine mandates in schools. "This language does not sound like a resolution promoting choice; it sounds like the Citrus Heights City Council is providing direction to you to oppose measures to keep our children safe." He pointed out that public K-12 schools already have an array of vaccine requirements before students are eligible to attend: "You have the choice to have your children vaccinated or not. Like all the other vaccines, if your kids are not qualified for a valid exemption, and you choose not to have them vaccinated, there are consequences to your choices."

Regarding Section 3, Miller said, "Citrus Heights does not have a mandate policy. We have no plans for such a policy." And he said it is not within the Council's purview to make suggestions for other agencies and businesses: "Instead, I support their choices to keep their students, customers, and employees safe."

Miller called the resolution "a huge disserve to the men and women on the front lines who have carried the world through this pandemic." He expected our country to "come together" to protect each other during this time, and the rampant misinformation about masks and vaccines "is keeping us from fully opening our businesses, hospitals, schools, travel, entertainment venues, on and on."

He encouraged anyone doubtful about the vaccine to talk to their doctor before making their choice. "We can do better than this," he said.

Councilmember Bruins seemed swayed by Mayor Miller's words, saying that it helps to hear other perspectives. She suggested setting the resolution aside to reconsider, or moving forward with only Section 1, but Councilmember Daniels didn't think Section 1 was enough on its own.

Councilmember Schaefer agreed that the language in Section 2 was too "adversarial," and the consensus was to change to more neutral wording regarding mask and vaccine mandates for students, from "voice their opposition" to "voice their position."

Vice Mayor Middleton didn't think Section 3 was necessary, and so Daniels changed his motion to include just Section 1 and the amended Section 2. It passed 4-1, with Mayor Miller dissenting.

Farmers Lose Two Skirmishes in California Water War

The most important battleground in California's perpetual war over water is the Sacramento-San Joaquin Delta.

Dozens of Northern California rivers and streams coalesce in the Sacramento and San Joaquin rivers, which join to form the Delta estuary and whose waters then flow into San Francisco Bay.

The state's massive water infrastructure was consea was wasted. The web of reservoirs and canals diverts rejected their proposal and river and Delta water to farms in the Sacramento and San Joaquin Valleys and domestic users as far south as San Diego.

However, in recent decades environmental groups and their allies, such as Indian tribes and fishermen, have demanded reductions in diversions, arguing that they severely damage habitat for fish, such as spawning salmon, and other wildlife.

The conflict has been played out in multiple arenas - the Legislature, Congress, federal and state regulatory agencies and the courts. It's been trench warfare with ask the State Water Board to long periods of stalemate, resume all activities necesoccasional gains by one side or the other and periodic objectives established by the

attempts at armistice.

Water Resources Control Board was poised to impose some limits on diversions that the agricultural industry saw as draconian particularly since the state was also beginning to regulate farmers' ability to pump groundwater to fill gaps in surface water supplies.

Govs. Jerry Brown and Gavin Newsom wanted to head off a full-fledged legal showdown by urging "voluntary agreements" on river flows acceptable to both farm water agencies and the water board and negotiations have been underway for several

One such agreement affecting the Sacramento River and its tributaries appears headed for adoption, but this month, the draft of a second affecting the San Joaquin River hit structed on an assumption a huge roadblock. In a letter that water left to flow to the to the river's major diverters, the Newsom administration said it would urge the water board to resume direct regulation of San Joaquin flows.

Environmental Protection Secretary Jared Blumenfeld and Natural Resources Secretary Wade Crowfoot told the San Joaquin districts that "at this point it is clear that despite considerable efforts, proposed voluntary actions by water agencies on the San Joaquin River tributaries have fallen short of needed flow and habitat improvements, and viable proposals are not being offered at this time."

The two administration officials added, "We will sary to implement the flow

2018 Bay-Delta Plan for the A few years ago, the state Lower San Joaquin River and its three major tributaries, the Stanislaus, Tuolumne, and Merced rivers."

Although Blumenfeld and Crowfoot said the San Joaquin agencies could reenter the process "if they propose necessary levels of additional water flows and habitat," their rejection letter sets the stage for political and legal warfare. San Joaquin Valley farmers see the water board's pending actions as severely damaging their ability to continue operations.

Dave Eggerton, executive director of the Association of California Water Agencies called the administration letter "very concerning" because of the potential for all-out legal war.

However, as news of the letter spread in the water community, environmental groups celebrated. They had long viewed the "voluntary agreement" process as a tool to subvert stricter regulation necessary to protect habitat.

They scored another win last week when Fresno Superior Court Judge D. Tyler Tharpe refused to validate a very controversial water supply contract that the huge Westlands Water District obtained from the Trump administration. In his ruling, Tharpe cited procedural irregularities, including violation of state open meeting laws.

Thus, as drought grips California, the battles over the state's very limited supply of water seem destined to intensify.

Every ten years, following the Census count, the resulting census data is used to geographically define electoral districts, at all levels of government, through a process called redistricting. Redistricting ensures that each of the electoral district boundaries have about the same number of people and comply with the federal Voting Rights Act of 1965.

Redistricting is important because it determines which neighborhoods and communities will be grouped together for the purposes of electing a Board member.

Sacramento County residents are encouraged to participate in the redistricting process. Residents can sign up for Redistricting news stories, information and upcoming meetings via email or text. People can also view past and upcoming meetings at the Redistricting Meetings webpage and are encouraged to checkin for additional upcoming workshops and hearings.

Families Now Receiving October Child Tax Credit Payments

WASHINGTON, D.C. (MPG) - The Internal Revenue Service and the Treasury Department announced that millions of American families are now receiving their advance Child Tax Credit (CTC) payment for the month of October.

This fourth batch of advance monthly payments, totaling about \$15 billion, is reaching about 36 million families today across the country. The majority of payments will be issued by direct deposit.

Under the American Rescue Plan, most eligible families received payments dated July 15, Aug. 13 and Sept. 15. Future payments are scheduled for Nov. 15 and Dec. 15. For these families, each payment is up to \$300 per month for each child under age 6 and up to \$250 per month for each child issued, the IRS resolved a techniages 6 through 17. The vast majority will be issued by direct deposit.

Here are more details on those payments:

• Families will see the direct deposit payments in their accounts starting Oct. 15. Like the prior payments, the vast majority of families will receive them by direct deposit.

• For those receiving payments by paper check, be sure to allow extra time, through the end of October, for delivery by mail. Those wishing to receive future payments by direct deposit can make this change using the Child Tax Credit Update Portal, available only on IRS.gov. To access the portal or to get a new step-by-step guide for using it, visit IRS.gov/childtaxcredit2021.

• Payments went to eligible families who filed a 2019 or 2020 income tax return. Returns processed by Oct. 4 are reflected in these payments. This includes people who don't typically file a return but during 2020 successfully registered for Economic Impact Payments using the IRS Non-Filers tool on IRS.gov or in 2021 successfully used the Non-filer Sign-up Tool for advance CTC, also available only on IRS.gov.

• Payments are automatic. Aside from filing a tax return, including a simplified return from the Non-filer Sign-up Tool, families don't have to do anything if they are eligible to receive monthly payments.

• Families who did not get a July, August or September payment and are getting their first monthly payment this month will still receive their total advance payment for the year. This means that the total payment will be spread over three months, rather than six, making each monthly payment

The IRS is currently sending letters to some Americans reminding them it is not too late for families who haven't filed a 2020 income tax return

 including those who are not normally required to file because their incomes are too low - to sign up for advance CTC payments. Most low-income families can get these monthly payments. The IRS urges families who normally aren't required to file a tax return to visit IRS.gov for more information on how to file a return and receive their

Update on Sept. advance Child Tax Credit payments

In September, the IRS successfully delivered a third monthly round of approximately 36 million Child Tax Credit payments, totaling more than \$15 billion. Given the new components of this program, the IRS continues to work hard to make improvements and deliver payments timely.

After the September payment was cal issue, which the agency estimates caused fewer than 2% of CTC recipients not to receive their September payment on the scheduled payment date. Payments have since gone out to affected individuals.

The impacted group primarily included taxpayers who recently made an update to their bank account or address information using the IRS Child Tax Credit Update Portal. In particular, the issue affected payments to married taxpayers filing jointly where only one spouse made a bank account or address change, which usually results in payments being split into two (between the existing account or address and the new account or address).

In some of these cases, the split payment caused a delay in making payments, and further caused individuals to receive slightly more than the correct payment in September. To address this, the payment that each spouse receives in October, November and December will be reduced slightly to adjust for the overpayment. For each taxpayer receiving a payment, the typical overpayment was \$31.25 per child between 6 and 17 years old and \$37.50 per child under 6 years old. This will result in about a \$10 to \$13 reduction per child in the three remaining monthly payments.

The IRS will send letters to affected individuals with this information. The IRS continues to closely monitor this program and the agency appreciates the patience of those whose payments were affected.

The IRS encourages partners and community groups to share information and use available online tools and toolkits to help non-filers, low-income families and other underserved groups sign up to receive these benefits.



I can't even imagine what it would be like to have a chaplain and officer come to my door, or know that his wounds were so bad, he would never be whole again. "The Reluctant Candidate"

Ever notice that we treat our elected officials very kindly? We call them the "Honorable." stand when they walk in. We ask them to sit at the head table. We may curry favor with them for future gain. However, while we should absolutely treat people kindly and with respect, we may be planting the seeds of our own problems with this under-

lying deference! Electeds begin to think "I'm all that, plus a bag of chips!" You see, they begin to believe their own public relations messaging. Within the State Capitol we call it "memberitis". Per Matthew 23:6, "They love the place of honor at banquets and is on a continuum. I have the most important seats in the synagogues." They think they are "hot stuff", rather than simply as our elected employees which is how we should treat them. Respectfully, honestly, but as our employees who we hold accountable as their employers.

The result of this favorable treatment is we have people running for office for all the wrong reasons! Not everyone, but many seek fame, ego, power, or privilege, rather than run as a public servant. Asking candidates why they are seeking office, sure why." They know that it may be unlikely for them to win – but simply running brings exposure and notoriety. It's almost a game.

admitted to me, "I'm not to be picked – and this is not an unrealistic scenario. Now, I wonder why are they so eager to be in power? And, if so eager to gain power, won't they be eager to stay in power - to do whatever it takes to play the political games to win again and again? 60 Years to Life for Sexual Assault

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - The Honorable Ernest Sawtelle sentenced Patricia Lane to 60 years to life in state prison. On August 19, 2021, a jury convicted Lane of four counts of child sexual assault and found true a multiple victim enhancement.

Lane sexually assaulted four young boys when they were between the ages of 4 and 11 years old. The victims were adults when they disclosed the sexual abuse. Their testimony was heart wrenching as were the victim impact statements made at sentencing.



SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - Did you know that more than half of all homes in Sacramento County were built before 1980? Houses built before 1978 are likely to have lead in the paint. Not to mention that lead can be found in numerous other items around the home including plumbing, dirt, traditional home/folk remedies, imported cosmetics like surma, imported herbs and spices, imported or antique ceramic pottery, some toys and costume

Occupational sources that can bring lead exposure at home include being a construction worker, mechanic or electrician, or spending time at a shooting range.

Lead is dangerous to young children, as even low levels can cause behavioral problems and learning disabilities. The good news is that lead poisoning is 100 percent preventable. Learn how to prevent lead poisoning at the Sacramento County Childhood Lead Poisoning Prevention website or the California Department of Public Health Childhood Lead Poisoning Prevention Branch

Through the generosity of the Citrus Heights Messenger, this column serves to provide an update about matters affecting the community of Citrus Heights.

The rush to release prisoners from our jails and prisons was initially a response to court orders to reduce prison overcrowding, but lately it's become a radical as victims and abandoning actual victims and their families. Now we are facing the placement of sexually violent predators (SVPs) that some bureaucrats decided are

fit to rejoin society. Other than the primary risk of creating more victims to sexual violence, there are additional concerns that counties have no input in whether or not an SVP can be placed in their communities. Recently, the San Diego County Board of Supervisors took a definitive position on the state's policy for how SVPs are placed. Knowing that Sacramento County has faced its own battles to keep SVPs out, I intend to join San Diego's example and bring an item before the Sacramento County Board of Supervisors to demand more say in the dangerous practice of placing violent sexual predators in our neighborhoods.

nection to Sacramento County, but the courts were considering placing him here anyway. When such risky placements are proposed, community members can, and thankfully did, voice their opposition to having an SVP dropped in their neighborhood, but no formal avenue exists for such decisions. What San Diego County proposed, and what I will be proposing, is a change in the state law that dictates how SVPs are placed that gives the counties a formal role in the process.

Currently, an SVP is effort to recast criminals a person that has been convicted of one or more violent sex crimes, has a diagnosed mental disorder, and is likely to engage in violent, criminal behavior. At the discretion of the courts and California Department of State Hospitals, SVPs can qualify for conditional release (CONREP). CONREP allows SVPs to live in a community with supervising and treatment requirements dictated by the court. They have daily contact with a Liberty Healthcare regional coordinator and must wear a GPS bracelet at all times. After a year of CONREP, SVPs can then petition the court for unconditional release. While the protocols of CONREP seem thorough, and I am sure Liberty Healthcare and all involved agencies want to keep communities safe, how can any community or parent feel safe knowing that an SVP is down the street? 

In all things, the County leaders can make better decisions about their communities than someone from a completely different county. Especially when that decision is where to place an SVP with no ties to the County to influence the area. For that reason, I am joining San Diego in asking our County Chief Executive Officer (CEO), to oppose the placement of any SVPs in Sacramento County until the welfare and institutions code (WIC) is amended to give local jurisdiction a formal role in release and placement of SVPs. That includes the authority to veto their placement in our county

entirely. It is unfair that any of our residents should have to fear the placement of known sexually violent, mentally ill criminals with no mechanism for their local officials to stop it. I will bring this before our board before the end of the year so that Sacramento County, and hopefully other counties to follow, can join the effort to formalize our authority in this process and we can protect our communities.

Rehabilitation and redemption are important values, but support for crime victims and protecting our communities should be our top priority.

Counting Blessings and Giving Thanks

CITRUS HEIGHTS, CA (MPG) - As we move into the holiday season the Sunrise Christian Food Ministry has much to be thankful for. Beginning with their beautiful new bright blue delivery truck, made possible by community support and donations then followed by a close second with lessons learned from COVID-19 and what has turned out to be a "blessing in disguise."

According to volunteer coordinator, April Jacek, at the beginning of the pandemic the food ministry, located at Advent Lutheran Church at 5901 San Juan Avenue, was immediately forced to make drastic changes to their distribution system to keep all involved safe, while maintaining the highest level of sanitation and service to their clients. Eighteen months later, these changes have led to a much more efficient, faster, personal and dignified food distribution system. Gone are the days of standing in long lines and carrying off heavy food boxes, rain or shine.

Sunrise Christian Food Ministry, which is supported by the Sacramento Food Bank, was able to pivot to a drive-thru distribution model, where clients remain in their vehicle as volunteers greet, register and provide food, all from the comfort and safety of their car. The food closet provides clients with a prepacked TEFAP emergency food box and when available, fresh produce, dairy, bakery items and frozen meat.

The continued success of the food closet is thanks to its over 100 weekly volunteers and the support of local faith communities, service organizations, grocers, and community. As a result the Sunrise Christian Food Ministry can now serve two to three times more clients, from the 50-70 pre-Covid households per day up to more than 200 households per day, at their peak. Additionally, these numbers

are expected to grow by 40 percent by the end of December, according to the Sacramento Food Bank.

Turkey Giveaway

Planning is now in the works for the annual holiday turkey distribution to take place on November 18 and November 19, 9am-3pm, NO TICKET OR ADVANCE REGISTRATION IS NEEDED. Regular food distributions will be suspended as thousands of frozen turkeys, plus a bag of holiday food, are provided to families in the

Many hands will make light work during this special event including those from both inside and outside of Citrus Heights. One special partnership, new for this year, is with the Sacramento State Community Engagement Center. On November 19, the CEC will be coordinating over 40 volunteers to help distribute turkeys while at the same time, providing their students a handson service learning experience.

A special thanks to the Sacramento Public Library and Sylvan Oaks Library for donating four deaccessioned laptops for future use as well as for the turkey giveaway.

The food closet recently had the chance to host a Volunteer Appreciation luncheon with 80+ volunteers attending. This was a special time for board members as well as Rocky Peterson, Director, to give thanks while providing the history of the food closet.
