Restoring the Past

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - Many local residents still fondly remember warm summer nights spent at the Sunrise Drive-In Theater which was located at 8149 Greenback Lane in Fair Oaks and owned by Fred Gabriel and June Cranor.

The Sunrise Drive-In which opened

with great public fanfare on July 3, 1963, and parking capacity for 1,258 cars, with a showing of “The Greatest Show on Earth,” starring James Stewart and Elizabeth Taylor, closed to the public in 2004 to make way for a residential development.

Another popular local drive-in had also met the same fate. The

Operation: HOT SPOTS Nails More Bad Guys

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - District Attorney Anne Marie Schubert has announced the results from the 5th annual “Operation: Hot Spots,” a coordinated countywide sting operation aimed at reducing the demand side of human trafficking by targeting sex buyers and sex exploiters.

Community-based organizations from the Sacramento Together Against Human Trafficking coalition voiced the need to crack down on sex buyers who fund and sustain the sex trafficking trade. In response, DA Anne Marie Schubert led the effort to organize this countywide operation, with a commitment from local law enforcement agencies to conduct operations throughout the year to reduce sex trafficking.

The District Attorney’s Office created training videos for law enforcement agencies featuring experts on human trafficking victims (adults and juveniles), suspect tactics/manipulations, conducting trafficking investigations, and insights on evidence collection for prosecutions. Education was also provided on our community resources and the services available to victims of human trafficking. Victim advocates are involved in the sting operations to assist with intervention and service referrals for individuals victimized by human traffickers.

In October 2021, the Sacramento County Sheriff’s Office, Sacramento Police Department, Folsom Police Department, Parole, Probation, District Attorney’s Office, California Highway Patrol and FBI worked collaboratively to conducted street and hotel operations targeting sex buyers. The operation included law enforcement postings of fake decoy prostitution ads.

The results were:
261 sex buyer responses to fake decoy ads; 22 citations of sex buyers for soliciting for prostitution – court dates are in January 2022; 1 charged with human trafficking of a minor; 1 charged with pandering; 2 opened investigations into pimping and pandering; 2 arrests for carrying a loaded firearm registered to another.

Those convicted of soliciting another for the purpose of buying sex or agreeing to engage in an act

Raising Cane’s Chicken Keeps Moving Ahead

CITRUS HEIGHTS, CA (MPG) - Construction of the new Raising Cane’s drive-thru restaurant at 7800 Greenback Lane in Citrus Heights in front of Hobby Lobby is nearing completion with a targeted opening date of Sunday, December 12, according to a company spokesperson.

A Raising Cane’s personnel recruiting representative conducting crewmember job interviews for during an on-going hiring event being held in a mobile office building in the nearby Lowe’s parking lot referred press inquiries to Champion Management, LLC in Addison, TX. Specific questions which were asked of Raising Cane’s marketing department concerning hiring, a scheduled opening date and what distinguishes the restaurant chain from its local competition were answered by Russell Ford, senior vice president of marketing for Champion Management, LLC on behalf of the company.

In all, Raising Cane’s

expects to hire around 200 crewmembers for its Citrus Heights restaurant, Ford said.

The Baton Rouge, Louisiana-based Raising Cane’s will be its first restaurant in Citrus Heights. The fast-food chain specializes in chicken finger meals and emphasizes a limited menu which helps crew members produce high-quality food which is served quickly.

We do one thing – quality

chicken fingers – and we do that one thing better than anyone else, according to the company statement.

Raising Cane’s founded in 1996, has at least three other local sites in the works, including one now under construction in Roseville. The restaurant has over 530 restaurants in 28 states.

We view Sacramento as a major opportunity. There is tremendous room for growth in the market, and

all of Northern California in general. We have plans for around 10 locations in the area over the next two years. This includes restaurants in Stockton, Elk Grove, Davis, Lodi, Roseville, Arden-Arcade, Natomas, in addition to two restaurants within the city of Sacramento itself, said Raising Cane’s in its press statement.

The new 3,172 square-foot, single story

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - For many independent artists and makers, 2020 was a devastating blow because of all the COVID-19 related event closures.

Now there is a feeling of hope amongst many of these small businesses because they are able to once again participate in events like the Sacramento Harvest Festival, happening November 19-21 at Cal Expo.

“In 2020, we had a temporary rebrand to ‘Harvest Market’ which allowed us to operate under the same regulations that Farmer’s Markets did,” said Nancy Glenn, owner of the Harvest Festival Original Art and Craft Show. “We did unfortunately lose some exhibitors who couldn’t weather the storm, but we are starting to see that many of our exhibitors are finally beginning to feel optimistic about the future.”

The Sacramento Harvest Festival boasts thousands of American handmade crafts, including original art, jewelry, pottery, clothing, specialty foods, home décor and much more. Throughout the weekend there will also be strolling entertainment, delicious festival foods, artist demonstrations and more.

Citrus Heights Drive-In, which opened on August 3, 1950, with Randolph Scott in “The Cariboo Trail” & Arthur Singleton in “Beware of Blondie,” closed in the fall of 1979, according to Larry Fritz, president of the Citrus Heights Historical Society. Its entrance was directly across Auburn Blvd. from Twin Oaks Avenue, right behind Harris Welding. The site is now the home of Auburn Oaks Apartments.

Bulldozers soon cleared the lot where a busy Sunrise Drive-In snack bar once stood. The once bright orange neon marquee sign which welcomed theatre goers at the gate, was taken down by workers of Western Sign Company of Sacramento where it sat for 16 years outside, exposed to the elements in their back storage lot in Diamond Springs.

Brought into the workshop for some much-needed attention, work on the historic Sunrise Drive-In sign helped keep workers of Western Sign Company busy for much of 2020 during the pandemic, said Todd Johnston, sales and marketing representative for the company.

“The sign had been there so long we’d almost forgotten about it,” Johnston said. He turned to the internet to research the history of the Sunrise Drive-In Theatre and soon got in touch by telephone with Orangevale artist and historian BJ Nartker, who had produced a one-hour video documentary about the history of the old drive-in on YouTube.

“Johnston gave me a call that he had the original Sunrise Drive-In sign and had watched the documentary which my company (BJ Nartker Productions) had made. I was floored and went over to Western Sign as soon as I could

to see it,” Nartker said.

Nartker and his wife Cindy had interviewed the original owners Fred and June Gabriel for the original documentary and had created a painting depicting classic cars at sunset in the parking lot of the Sunrise Drive-In.

The couple developed a friendship with the Gabriels who had owned the Sunrise Drive-In through the years before his family moved to Washington State in 2011. When he returned to Orangevale, he sadly learned that both the Gabriels had passed away.

“They were great people,” Nartker said. “They recognized

that times were changing when fewer and fewer people wanted to go to the drive-in for entertainment.”

Nartker has a few keepsakes from the old drive-in including a car speaker given to him by Fred Gabriel, which has the name Sunrise Drive-In engraved on it. He furnished several photos for use with this article, including photos of the snack bar, a ticket stub, and of the parking lot at sunset.

“I’m delighted that the sign has been preserved. Seeing it restored brought back a lot of memories for me. I’m proud of the work Todd and Western Sign put into restoring the sign.”

Nartker said he remembered going to the Sunrise Drive-In with his family when it first opened. “We were regular customers through the years. I had a chance to buy the snack bar’s original pizza ovens when it

closed, and I still regret not doing that.”

He remembered the sound of owner Fred Gabriel’s booming voice coming through the loudspeaker encouraging customers to visit the snack bar and as a young adult, introduced himself to him.

Nartker’s own 8 mm home movies form a behind-the-scenes glimpse of the original Sunrise Drive-In snack bar as attendants busily pour fountain drinks and fill orders for customers eager to get back to the latest movie feature.

Once Johnston watched Nartker’s original 2019 documentary and learned the drive-in’s history, he grew eager for Western Sign to take the time and effort to thoroughly restore the vintage sign to its original glory. Workers soon discovered that much of the sign’s original metal was very badly rusted and

needed replacement, Johnston said.

“I think our shop put about 300-400 hours in fabrication and metal work on that sign to get it back in shape,” he said. Once it was sandblasted, the refurbished Sunrise Drive-In sign received a new coat of bright orange paint closely matching the original color. New lettering was hand applied.

“The original globe was in pieces, so we had to source that from a supplier in Reno, Nevada,” Johnston said. New neon was supplied by Bo Hooks, owner of TN Hooks in Rancho Cordova, a specialty sign shop which put eight hours into its lighting fabrication. Hooks, which has been in business for over 22 years, also did neon work for most of the Mel’s Diners in the Sacramento area and specializes in the restoration of antique neon signs.

“It was an honor to work on it,” Hooks said. “It now looks great.”

“We kept much of its original character of the sign intact,” Johnston said. “We discovered a bullet-hole in the metal and left that in.”

For now, the newly restored Sunrise Drive-In sign is on display at Western Sign Company in Diamond Springs, Johnston said. It’s available to be seen for interested groups by appointment.

The Sunrise Recreation and Park District (SRPD) hosted their 7th annual Arts and Crafts Fair at Rusch Park

Having to make up for sales lost in 2020, being right next to Rusch Park proved an advantage this year as many shoppers automatically followed the signs between the two fairs. Usually a two-day event, co-chair Jackie Charleston, said this year was still very successful with funds raised going to missions.

There was a healthy serving of Fall and Thanksgiving creations and even a White Elephant

sale. But the main course was definitely Christmas with colorful handmade creations of all sizes and shapes.

A fan favorite of this sale is always the table full of homemade baked goods with new confections appearing every year.

A Confusing Array of Sports Betting Measures

Memo to California voters: Prepare to be confused because you could be facing four competing ballot measures next year to legalize sports wagering.

Indian tribes that now have a monopoly on casino gambling in California, big on-line sports betting corporations, horse racing tracks, and local poker parlors are jousting for control of what could be countless billions of dollars in bets on sporting events.

Following a 2018 U.S. Supreme Court ruling that made sports betting legal, a number of other states have accepted it, and the major professional sports leagues, which condemned sports betting for decades, have struck deals with major on-line betting operations.

However, years of efforts in the California Legislature to fashion a system acceptable to all stakeholders fell short. The legislative stalemate meant – as it often does in California – a shift to the alternative arena of ballot measures.

Major casino-owning tribes struck first with a measure that would extend their gambling monopoly to sports wagering, qualifying it for the 2022 ballot.

In reaction, three other

initiatives are in the works, each of which would benefit its sponsor in some way, but it's not certain that all will make the ballot. Although the election is a year away, the calendar for qualifying measures is fairly advanced and sponsors will have to hustle to make it – which means spending millions of dollars for professional signature-gathering campaigns.

The tribal measure already ticketed for the ballot would require sports wagers to be placed either in existing casinos or in locations owned by the tribes. It also would allow sports wagers at major horse racing tracks – an obvious ploy to dampen potential opposition – but would not allow on-line bets on sports events.

The measure, if passed, would block DraftKings and FanDuel, the two major on-line wagering outfits that yearn to operate in California. But it also includes a sly legal attack on the local poker parlors, which have long feuded with the casino tribes, and the cardrooms struck back with a measure of their own that would allow them to accept sports wagers.

Very quickly, DraftKings and FanDuel pledged millions of dollars for a third measure that would allow them to operate in California and have drawn support from some big city mayors by promising that their proposal would provide money to deal with homelessness.

Finally, three casino-owning tribes, two of which have backed the

original tribal measure, are floating a fourth measure that would allow on-line betting controlled by the tribes. It's a hedge against the DraftKings-FanDuel measure because it assumes that given a choice between wagering on-line or driving to a casino to place a bet, betters would prefer the former.

Millions of dollars are already being spent by the sponsors of the four measures and they've commenced hostilities with dueling public relations campaigns in advance of what promises to be a tsunami of television and on-line advertising to persuade voters to choose one over the others.

It would surprise no one if hundreds of millions of dollars are spent on the campaigns next year, because the millions would be pocket lint compared to the billions of wagering dollars that would flow through the hands of whichever interests can claim legal authority.

That said, it's also possible that the campaigns will be short-circuited by a political deal. Those who sponsor ballot measures can remove them from the ballot if their demands are met by legislation.

Given the years of legislative stalemate on the issue, it's difficult to see the competing interests agreeing to divvy up the pie, but it's not an impossible resolution.

of buying a person to engage in an act of prostitution, face a maximum penalty of 180 days in county jail, will be subject to search and seizure, and may be ordered to stay away from the involved locations or known "stroll" areas.

"Human traffickers and sex buyers have remained a significant public safety threat throughout the COVID-19 pandemic," said DA Anne Marie Schubert. "We are committed to continuing sting operations through the Sacramento Together coalition to target sex traffickers and buyers as well as maximize our efforts to protect and serve victims of sexual exploitation."

Sacramento Together is a coalition of more than 30 community-based organizations, law enforcement, state and local public agencies, meeting regularly and working together to combat human trafficking and exploitation in our community.

The coalition works to combat human trafficking and exploitation by working together to treat, educate and remove children and young adults from life threatening situations. Working collaboratively, the coalition coordinates and maximizes community response efforts as well as all of our regional assets to better serve victims of sexual and labor exploitation. Social Security Matters


About Paying Social Security Tax While Still Working

Dear Rusty: Upon being let go in 2009 at age 65 from my full time job of 30 years, I immediately applied for Social Security for my wife and I to live on while seeking employment. Not finding anything full time, I ended up working part time for the past 9 years driving a school bus for an hourly wage. Even though my wife and I are collecting Social Security, my wages are still being taxed for it. While I don't feel this is fair, the real rub (to me) is the fact that my Social Security payroll deductions for the past nine years do not seem to be resulting in an increase in the amount of Social Security we receive. Meanwhile, a friend, who is our age and a business owner, mentioned the amount he is taxed for SS as a sole proprietor is somehow being returned to him from time to time. Therefore, could you please explain what's happening here and whether we are due some kind of adjustment? **Signed: Working Still at 74**

Dear Still Working: I cannot comment on your friend's assertion that as a sole proprietor business owner his self-employment SS tax is somehow being


"returned to him from time to time." I can, however, tell you that the rules for business owners are the same as for those who do not own a business, except that a business owner pays both the employee and employer portion of Social Security employment taxes.

Essentially, the only way paying into Social Security now (via payroll taxes or self-employment taxes) will increase your SS benefit amount is if your income in any recent year is more than your earnings in any of the 35 highest earning years over your lifetime used to compute your SS benefit. When your Social Security benefit was originally computed, all years in your lifetime earnings history through age 59 were adjusted for inflation and the highest earning 35 years were selected to develop your "average indexed monthly earnings" (AIME). A formula was applied to your AIME to determine your "Primary Insurance Amount" or "PIA," which is the amount you get if you claim benefits to start in the month you reach your full retirement age (FRA). If you claimed at age 65, your SS benefit was slightly reduced from your PIA because you claimed before your FRA.

Although you have been and are still working part time, and you're paying into

Social Security while doing so, your personal SS benefit will not increase unless your current earnings are more than any of those in the 35 years originally used to determine your benefit when you claimed. The inflation adjustment influences your past years' earnings more than you might expect; for example, \$50,000 earned in 1990 would require more than \$125,000 in today's earnings to change your benefit. Remember that your contributions to Social Security while you are working do not go into a personal account for you. All who work are required to pay into Social Security, and the money paid is used to help pay benefits to those already receiving Social Security. And that doesn't change when you start collecting SS – if you continue to work you must still pay Social Security tax and the money you pay goes to help pay benefits for all recipients.

Joint Statement from Agencies Regarding Pfizer Vaccine for Children

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - The California Health and Human Services Agency Secretary Dr. Mark Ghaly, and Director of the California Department of Public Health and State Public Health Officer Dr. Tomás J. Aragón, issued a joint statement on the Western States Scientific Safety Review Workgroup's recommendation to administer Pfizer-BioNTech COVID-19 vaccines for children ages 5-11.

"Vaccines are how we end this pandemic, and the ability to vaccinate more children who have remained vulnerable to COVID-19 strengthens our fight against this deadly virus. Californians ages 5-11 can now get the same robust protection that has helped save countless lives. The vaccine has been administered safely to millions of people ages 12 and up, and federal and state medical experts agree that the clinical trials have been rigorous in demonstrating that the vaccine is safe and effective for children ages 5-11. Last year's winter surge was devastating in our state, and it is critically important that all eligible Californians supercharge their protection against COVID-19 ahead of the winter months. By getting more family members including children ages 5-11 vaccinated, we can celebrate the holidays safely and help avoid preventable hospitalizations and deaths."

California will begin vaccinating children ages 5-11 today with 500 organizations across the state receiving their first shipments through next Monday. The state was allocated 1.2 million pediatric doses from the federal government with adequate supply to vaccinate all newly eligible Californians becoming available in the coming weeks. The state has more than 4,000 locations ready to vaccinate children ages 5-11 as supply increases and is leveraging existing infrastructure and partnerships used to administer vaccines to teens and young adults. This includes working closely with medical providers, local health departments, schools, community partners and others to administer vaccines safely and equitably through mobile clinics and vaccine pop-ups in the hardest-hit communities across the state.

Parents are encouraged to call their child's health care provider to schedule a COVID-19 vaccine appointment. Parents can also visit MyTurn.ca.gov or call the hotline at 833-422-4255 beginning tomorrow to find a nearby vaccination site. The COVID-19 vaccine is free for all Californians regardless of insurance and immigration status. All Californians are strongly encouraged to get vaccinated or complete their vaccination series, get a booster when eligible, and get a flu vaccine, which can be administered at the same time.

The Citrus Heights Police Department has a strong partnership with the San Juan Unified School District and their Safe Schools program. Together, we are committed to protecting the health and safety of our students as our top priority through awareness, education, and training.

CHPD would like to encourage parents to talk with their children about the dangers of handling or ingesting unknown substances. With the dangers that some illicit substances pose, parents are encouraged to contact their local law enforcement agency before attempting to handle them. ★

DO YOU HAVE QUESTIONS ABOUT REAL ID?



The DMV has answers! Changes to the deadline, limited-time fee waivers, and a simplified application process have all been recently announced. Read below for details on how to get your REAL ID.

Q: I Paid The Fee To Renew My Driver's License Online Last Year, But Offices Were Closed Due To COVID-19, So I Couldn't Get a REAL ID. Will I Have To Pay A Fee Again To Upgrade To The REAL ID This Year?

A: No! For a limited time, customers who have recently renewed a driver's license or identification card that is not federally compliant will be able to upgrade to a REAL ID for free! If you paid a fee to renew a driver's license or ID card between since March 2020, you will qualify but you must act now – the free REAL ID upgrade is only available until the end of the year.

The DMV is offering this free upgrade as a part of their continual efforts to accommodate customers who faced barriers due to COVID-19. It's important that everyone who is eligible and wants one can get a REAL ID. In May 2023, anyone flying domestically, visiting a military base or other federal facility will need a form of federal ID, like a REAL ID, to do so.

The process to get a REAL ID is also easier than ever – it is now possible to begin the REAL ID application and upload your documents online before visiting a DMV office to complete the process. Making your visit at the window 10 minutes or less.

Q: Which documents will I need to get a REAL ID?

A: The DMV has made it easier than ever to get a REAL ID. Recently the DMV also announced that you no longer need to supply your social security card – just your social security number. To apply, you will need to provide ONE identity document that includes your date of birth and your full name – like an original or certified birth certificate, or a valid US passport. You'll also need to provide TWO documents that show your name and address to prove you're a California resident. You can use cell phone and utilities bills, your mortgage, bank statements, or even your vehicle registration.

You can start your application online today and find a complete step-by-step checklist of all approved documents at REALID.dmv.ca.gov. If you upload your documents online before visiting a DMV office to complete the process, your time at the window will be 10 minutes or less.

Senator Dahle: California Must Focus on Supply Chain Crisis

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - In response to the Senate Select Committee on Ports and Movement hearing Wednesday, November 3, Senator Brian Dahle (R-Bieber) issued the following statement:

“The current port crisis will take time to resolve, but with the holiday season fast approaching, we

need to focus our efforts on it more intensely. I’m calling for a single, lead point of contact to keep all stakeholders on track and bring all parties to the table for new ideas and solutions. Secondly, the California Air Resources Board (CARB) and the local air districts haven’t stopped, delayed, or paused their regulations that are in direct conflict with the reality of resolving our port crisis. These regulations are failing to recognize the gravity of this situation and the reality that the supply chain is fully interrupted. Without the necessary materials, goods, and infrastructure it is impossible for California companies to meet the fast approaching deadlines. Without CARB publicly stating their cooperation, I am certain that we will

see excessive fines and penalties on all companies and ports involved in this current goods movement crises. Lastly, we need to ensure the safety of our truckers, dock workers, ship crews, and everyone else who are working tirelessly to tackle the Mount Everest of containers awaiting them on the more than 70 ships currently parked offshore to unload products for all Americans.”
