Packathon Honors 9/11 Victims

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - Move America Forward (MAF), a non-profit organization dedicated to serving our troops on the front will be gathering dozens of volunteers in Sacramento to commemorate the 20th anniversary of the 9/11 terror attacks by holding the 4th annual Packathon Memorial. They will be shipping over 2001 care packages and hand-packing 911 more with local volunteers, military families, and active-duty military from the Sacramento area.

All are invited to join in this important event at 3105 Fite Circle, Suite 108, Sacramento, (Bradshaw exit off of Hwy 50) from 10 a.m. to noon on 9/11.

MAF plans to deploy about 20-30

volunteers throughout the day starting at 10 a.m. and will not halt work until they reach their goal of shipping over 2001 packages overseas and hand packing another 911 more. The care packages are meant to honor the 20th anniversary of the 9/11 terrorist attacks.

Melanie Morgan, Co-Founder and Chairwoman of Move America Forward started the group in 2004 to thank American troops for their important missions in Iraq and Afghanistan. "In the 20 years since we deployed to Afghanistan our troops never faltered, never lost a fight, and even when losing dear friends, never lost faith. Our brave troops succeeded in ousting the Taliban, destroying Al Qaeda, and sent all our enemies into hiding. Time and again, our troops proved

victorious on every battlefield." Melanie Morgan went on to say, "To all troops who served in Afghanistan, you accomplished your mission and we the American people, always and forever, thank you for your exemplary service and sacrifice."

World Trade Center Tower 2 Survivor and MAF Ambassador, Richard Hannaford will be present at this event. His day will begin at the West Sacramento 9/11 Flag Display at 5:46 a.m. at the exact time the first plane hit North Tower (1 WTC) of the world trade center 20 years ago that started what we would know as 9/11 - the most horrific terror attack ever on American soil, which killed almost 3,000 innocent Americans. Hannaford was working for a major financial firm

U.S. Army Troops to Support NIFC in Wildfire Response

U.S. Army North (Fifth Army) News Release

SAN ANTONIO, TEXAS (MPG)

- At the request of the National Interagency Fire Center, approximately 200 U.S. Army Soldiers will support a wildland fire ground response operation in Northern California. U.S. Army North (Fifth Army), U.S. Northern Command's Joint Force Land Component Command, will provide operational command of the active-duty military ground forces in support of federal and state efforts.

"This request marks the fortieth time federal military ground forces have been mobilized to support wildland firefighting response efforts in a decades-long interagency agreement," said Lt. Gen. Laura J. Richardson,

ARNORTH and JFLCC commander. "We had a very active fire season last year, employing ground forces from both the Army and Marine Corps in California, and are proud to once again support NIFC and the state."

The supporting units, the 23rd Brigade Engineer Battalion and the 2-3 Infantry Battalion, both from the 1-2 Stryker Brigade Combat Team, 7th Infantry Division, I Corps, assigned to Joint Base Lewis-McChord

(JBLM), Washington, will assist with wildland fire response efforts on the Dixie Fire in the Lassen National Forest, Lassen Volcanic National Park and Plumas National Forest.

Beginning Monday, Aug. 30 at JBLM, the Soldiers will be outfitted with wildland fire personal protective

equipment during NIFC-led training, which will cover the basics of wildland fire suppression and firefighter safety. Upon completion of training at JBLM, the Soldiers will deploy to Northern California to conduct additional fireline training prior to serving as hand crews assisting with wildfire suppression on the Dixie Fire.

"The rigorous training and certification process our Soldiers undergo, prior to operating in a fire-fighting environment, will ensure that once deployed, they will safely augment federal wildland fire fighting capabilities in order to protect lives, natural and cultural resources, and property," said Maj. Gen. Xavier T. Brunson, I Corps and JBLM commander.

While providing support, the Soldiers will be

accompanied by experienced wildland fire strike team leaders and crew bosses.

The JFLCC, through USNORTHCOM, is the primary Department of Defense organization for coordinating defense support of civil authorities to help federal partners, like NIFC, respond to natural or man-made disasters.

In addition to the U.S. Army activation, eight U.S. Air Force C-130s equipped with Modular Airborne Fire Fighting Systems are currently fighting fires from the air, providing wildfire support across Western states.

Board of Supervisors Appoints County Executive

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - Following a Closed Session Board meeting, the Sacramento County Board of Supervisors unanimously agreed to appoint Interim County Executive Ann Edwards as County Executive. The appointment is effective Sep. 14, 2021.

Edwards is the first woman appointed to the County Executive position.

"I am pleased to announce that the Board of Supervisors voted unanimously to appoint Ann Edwards as County Executive," said Board Chair and Fourth District Supervisor Sue Frost. "Ann has proven to be an outstanding Interim County Executive and has provided stability to the organization, improved communication and built trust within and outside of the organization."

Edwards' accomplishments in her seven month tenure as Acting/Interim County Executive include increasing transparency in the budget process, organizing a process for a spending plan to provide assistance to both the County and the community with the American Rescue Plan Act funds and increasing engagement with local government and community-based organizations.

"I appreciate and thank the Board for the trust and support they have shown me," said Edwards. "I commit to looking at the County organization in new ways, to pursue a commitment to diversity, equity and inclusion, increase public transparency and engagement and enrich the County's organizational culture."

Edwards' current and upcoming initiatives include the formation of a Public Safety and Justice Agency, increased public engagement in and a new budget process for FY 2022-23 and implementing implicit bias training countywide.

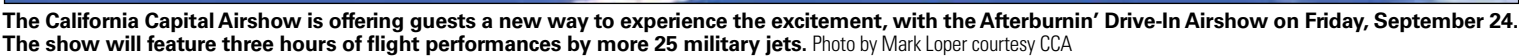
Edwards has served as Acting County Executive since December 2020 and Interim County Executive since February 2021.

Kathy and her husband Bill launched the community marching band back in 2005, bringing together musicians of all ages ranging from age 7 to 70. The band is well known for its numerous performances throughout the community and Sacramento region.

While hearts are heavy from the tremendous loss to the community, comfort comes from the great legacy she leaves behind. After a recent band gathering paying tribute to Kathy, Band Director Kody Tickner shared with us:

In their honor, the facility has been named The Bill and Kathy Cook Performing Arts Center. The band will host its first practice on September 13, 2021.

on the 84th Floor of South Twin Tower on the morning of September 11, when the first plane hit the North Tower, prompting Rich to gather friends, colleagues, and complete strangers to begin evacuating. Rich was in the middle of evacuation when the South Tower was hit just 17 minutes later. If not for his immediate decision to evacuate, Rich would have perished

in the South Tower like so many other friends and unfortunate innocent victims that day.

Social Security Matters Does Paying SS Tax Now Increase My Benefit?

Dear Rusty: I started drawing my benefits at age 62 due to being laid off from my job at age 60. I have continued working part time and been paying Social Security and Medicare taxes ever since. I am now 66. I have been told that even though I continue to pay these taxes, it will not help increase my monthly social security benefit. Is that true? Signed: Working Beneficiary Dear Working Beneficiary: Paying into Social Security and Medicare through “FICA” taxes withheld from your paycheck doesn’t change your Social Security (SS) benefit amount. Those taxes aren’t held in a separate personal account for you; rather they are used to pay benefits to all those who currently collect SS benefits, and to help offset healthcare costs for current Medicare enrollees. From its inception decades ago, Social Security has been a “pay as you go” system where all those working help pay for all those currently collecting benefits. And if you happen to work even after you start collecting Social Security benefits, the FICA tax you pay still goes to help pay benefits for you and for millions of others also collecting Social Security.



Of the 7.65% FICA tax you pay, 6.2% goes to Social Security and 1.45% helps fund Medicare (your employer pays the same amounts). The 6.2% SS tax you pay to Social Security isn’t deposited into a personal account which determines your benefit payment. Instead, your benefit is determined using your earnings record for the 35 years over your lifetime in which you earned the most (with early years adjusted for inflation). Your average earnings in those 35 years are what determines your benefit amount, not how much you paid in FICA tax. Thus, continuing to pay FICA taxes because you are still working won’t affect your Social Security benefit amount. And because of the way the program is structured, you don’t need to worry about how much you contributed to Social Security in taxes; you will continue to receive Social Security for as long as there are people working and contributing to the program (for the rest of your life) - those now working pay for Social Security benefits now being paid. What could, however, affect your personal SS benefit amount now is your earnings level while working. Even after you start collecting Social Security benefits, if your current earnings from work are more than any of those in the 35 inflation-adjusted years used to originally

compute your benefit, that benefit will be recomputed and increased as appropriate. And just in case you’re wondering, studies have shown that, on average, SS beneficiaries usually recover everything they paid into the system within about 5 years. Said another way, over your lifetime you’ll almost certainly get back much more in benefits than you paid in FICA SS taxes. The payback time is more for those who are self-employed (because they must pay both employee and employer portions of FICA), but Social Security is, nevertheless, a pretty good deal which pays a guaranteed retirement benefit for as long as you live after benefits start. So, what you were told is correct. Paying FICA taxes now won’t help increase your monthly benefit amount. But high earnings now, which are more than any in those 35 inflation-adjusted years used to compute your SS benefit, will. You connect with your inner strength as you realize that you already have within you what you need to be successful. This self-reliance is a tremendous asset which is often overlooked. Too many people look instead to external factors they erroneously believe are responsible for their success or failure. You also realize how much you are capable of accomplishing. SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - District Attorney Anne Marie Schubert announced the Sacramento District Attorney’s Office is taking efforts to address an epidemic increase in fentanyl related deaths, based in large part on counterfeit prescription pills which contain fentanyl.

The national fentanyl epidemic has hit the Sacramento community, and has increased during the pandemic. From January 2020 to July 21, 2021, there have been 140 fentanyl related deaths in Sacramento County. People in Sacramento are now dying from fentanyl overdoses at virtually identical rates to homicides. These tragic deaths span all age groups from young kids to seniors.

The District Attorney’s Crime Lab, which tests all narcotics seized by local law enforcement agencies, found that 92% of oxycodone pills on the street are counterfeit. Of those pills, 75% are straight

fentanyl. Counterfeit pills are virtually impossible to distinguish from a prescription pill. The Crime Lab is discovering an alarming rate of not only counterfeit oxycodone, but also counterfeit OxyContin, Percocet, Xanax and Adderall.

DA Schubert is leading the effort to respond to the fentanyl epidemic with an extensive public outreach campaign.

The main focus of the response will be county-wide Public Service Announcements (PSAs) highlighting the theme of “1 Pill Can Kill.” Several of the fentanyl related deaths involve teens and young adults targeted on social media who ingested a pill, or on occasion half a pill. Key messages of the PSAs include: 1) If you didn’t get it from a pharmacy – it’s fake; 2) A very small amount of fentanyl is deadly – one pill can kill; and 3) Fake pills are being pushed through social media.

DA Schubert has requested funding from the County Board of Supervisors as part of the federal American Rescue Plan Act to pay for guaranteed, premier PSA placements across social media, TV/Radio, billboards, public transit and print publications among other advertising platforms.

Until funding is secured, the DA’s Office will roll out the PSAs on the office

social media sites and donated advertisement platforms. Clear Channel Outdoors supports the awareness campaign and will donate digital billboard space when available throughout the county. There are additional opportunities for free PSA placements on social media.

The Sacramento County Office of Education and local school superintendents support the fentanyl awareness efforts and will distribute PSA materials to students, administrators, parents/guardians as well as student and parent groups. Other partnerships are being formed across the medical industry.

“I was alarmed as we watched the Coroner Office’s statistics on fentanyl related deaths rise and the corresponding rise in counterfeit pills containing fentanyl discovered at our Crime Lab,” said DA Anne Marie Schubert. “An epidemic of this magnitude requires a multi-disciplinary response involving schools, public health, community-based organizations, healthcare, the faith-based community and law enforcement. The most powerful tool we have is information, so our efforts are focused on awareness and prevention efforts to save lives.”

Sen. Nielsen Comments on Hearings on EDD Reform Postponed Indefinitely

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) – Sen. Nielsen issued the following statement regarding the indefinite postponement of a joint legislative hearing on the mismanagement of the Employment Development Department (EDD) scheduled for Aug. 24:

“There are hundreds of thousands of Californians struggling to put food on the table and keep a roof over their heads because of Governor Newsom’s gross mismanagement of the EDD.

“Most of these folks lost their jobs because of the governor’s mandated shutdowns, and can’t get through to the EDD to get their unemployment benefits, but the EDD has paid out an estimated \$31 billion in fraudulent claims.

“As the LA Times recently reported, ‘As of July 31, there was a backlog of 216,000 claims that had not been approved within 21 days. The week ending on that date saw the EDD receive 3.4 million calls — it was able to answer only 248,000 of them.’

“Clearly, the governor is trying to dodge the massive negative news coverage this important informational hearing would have generated ahead of the recall election.

“This is outrageous political gamesmanship.”

In July 2021 alone, Nielsen’s office worked with 479 constituents in Senate District 4 who are having problems with EDD. For six months in a row, the office has had record-breaking numbers of EDD cases:

February – 274; March – 275; April – 306; May – 447; June – 475; July – 479. ★

Rep. Bera Urges President Biden to Extend Afghanistan Withdrawal

WASHINGTON, DC (MPG) - Representative Ami Bera, M.D. (D-CA) Chairman of the House Foreign Affairs Subcommittee on Asia, the Pacific, Central Asia, and Nonproliferation, released the following statement on President Biden’s decision to continue with the August 31 U.S. withdrawal

from Afghanistan.

“While I commend the Biden Administration and our brave men and women in uniform for safely evacuating over 70,000 individuals from Afghanistan thus far, there’s still more work to be done, and more evacuations to take place.

In just the past week, my office has received and forwarded to the State Department for immediate action over 7,000 requests from individuals seeking to leave Afghanistan. These heartbreaking pleas have come from Americans, our Afghan partners, and family members with loved ones who are unsafe in Afghanistan. Sadly, many of these individuals have not yet been safely evacuated

out of Afghanistan, and time is running out.

We must not let a self-imposed August 31 deadline get in the way of completing our mission of protecting our citizens and our allies. That’s why I strongly urge President Biden to extend the withdrawal deadline as necessary to complete U.S. evacuation operations.”

Representative Bera represents Sacramento County, home to the largest population of Afghan immigrants in the country. He wrote to President Biden on August 17 urging him to extend the August 31 deadline. Bera has long called on the Biden Administration to expedite the Afghan SIV process and evacuate our allies out of the country before the withdrawal of U.S. troops. ★

Citrus Heights Police Department

CITRUS HEIGHTS, CA (MPG) - At approximately 6:35 pm, the Citrus Heights Police Department received 911 calls related to a shooting near the intersection of Lichen Dr. and Camelwood Dr. When officers arrived on scene they located an adult male lying in the roadway suffering from multiple gunshot wounds. Life-saving efforts were attempted by officers as fire and medical personnel were responding to

the scene. Medical personnel arrived on scene and transported the male to a local hospital where he later succumbed to his injuries.

Citrus Heights Police Department Detectives responded to the scene to investigate this incident. Working collaboratively with our community members and the Sacramento County Sheriff’s Department, Detectives were able to identify the involved subjects related to the shooting. Detectives are continuing to follow-up on investigative

leads. Because this is an ongoing investigation, additional information is not currently available. This appears to be an isolated incident with no reason to believe there is any additional threat to the general public as all involved subjects are believed to have known each other.

Larry Elder’s Critics may be Helping Him Succeed

“The enemy of my enemy is my friend” is an ancient proverb thought to date from a 4th century BC Sanskrit writing on statecraft.

The most graphic example of its application occurred in World War II, when Soviet Russia, which had a “nonaggression” pact with Nazi Germany, was suddenly attacked by its erstwhile ally.

Overnight, the Soviet Union’s dictator, Joseph Stalin, was transformed from enemy to a partner of the U.S. and Great Britain in their war against Germany and its dictator, Adolf Hitler. Militarily, it was the best thing that could have happened for the Western allies because had it not happened, Hitler might easily have triumphed.

Something like that is happening in California as Gov. Gavin Newsom fights off a campaign to oust him from office via a September 14 recall election.

With voting underway, Newsom’s campaign has shifted from defending his gubernatorial record to attacking the leading Republican candidate to succeed him, talk show host

Larry Elder. Pro-Newsom editorialists and the second place Republican, former San Diego Mayor Kevin Faulconer, have joined Newsom’s assault on Elder.

The overall theme of the attacks is that Elder’s extreme right-wing views make him unacceptable as an officeholder, and the drumbeat quickened last week when Elder’s former girlfriend accused him of being verbally abusive and even, at one point, waving a gun at her.

“I, for one brief moment, believed that he intended to shoot me. I was in fear for my life,” Alexandra Datig said, adding: “At the same time, I’m also very fearless and, having grown up around guns, I didn’t take it seriously.”

Elder, of course, denied the gun allegation, but immediately, his critics turned from saying he shouldn’t be governor to demanding that he drop out of the contest.

The Sacramento Bee declared that Elder’s “misogynistic attitudes toward women and the damning allegations revealed this week about how he treated his ex-fiancee Alexandra Datig are disqualifying, and make him wholly unfit to be California governor. Elder must drop out of the race immediately.”

“Elder’s backwards positions harm women’s rights and the livelihoods of California families,” Faulconer said in a late Friday afternoon statement. “Elder’s lack of judgement and character flaws threaten the success and credibility of this historic recall

movement – Californians will not vote to recall one dysfunctional governor if it means replacing him with another.”

So what effect will this barrage of criticism from Newsom, Faulconer and pro-Newsom media have on Elder and the recall drive?

Newsom obviously hopes that focusing on Elder and the supposedly terrible fate that would befall California should he become governor will not only change the subject but motivate Democrats to vote against the recall. Democratic voter apathy is, polls indicate, the prime reason Newsom is in danger of losing his office.

However, the focus on Elder could also make it more likely that he would, in fact, become governor should the recall succeed. Voters who favor the recall could easily conclude that if Newsom, the media and Faulconer are ganging up on Elder, perhaps he’s just the man to lead the revolt against the political status quo.

That’s what happened in 2016 when Donald Trump emerged from the Republican pack to become the GOP’s presidential nominee. The more Trump was attacked for his many personal shortcomings, the more attractive he became to angry Republican voters. The rest, as they say, is history.

Elder may be, as his critics say, unfit to be governor. However, like Trump, he probably loves the attention because his enemies are making him more friends.

The Media’s Finest Hour

It’s not a good sign when a White House chief of staff to a Democratic president wants to re-tweet favorable news coverage and all he can find is the least credible and most slavishly loyal commentators on the internet.

The Afghanistan fiasco has created that most disorienting and discomfiting experience for a progressive administration – a serious bout of critical media coverage immune to White House spin and determined to tell the unvarnished story of an ongoing debacle.

The White House and its allies have lashed out at what they are portraying as an insular, pro-war media ignoring its many successes in the Afghan evacuation.

This, like Ron Klain’s tweeting, is a sign of desperation and of a feeling of outraged betrayal that usually dependable allies have, on this story, switched sides. Say it’s not so, CNN.

The White House is unfamiliar with what it’s like to be on the receiving end of the kind of media feeding frenzy that Florida Gov. Ron DeSantis experiences every other day (almost always involving spurious storylines).

But on Afghanistan, Joe Biden in effect set out to test how much shameless incompetence and dishonesty the media would accept. The answer? Not nearly enough.

The press is blatantly

biased and has become even more so over time, repeatedly propagating false narratives that have shredded its credibility. Still, there are limits beyond which even it can’t be pushed.

Biden said that the Afghan withdrawal wouldn’t be another Saigon within weeks of Saigon-like scenes of a hasty evacuation of the U.S. embassy, of terrified Afghans clinging to a U.S. transport plane, of desperate Afghans passing their infants over the barbed wire to Western soldiers guarding the Kabul airport.

There is no number of look-on-the-bright-side briefings that are going to overcome these indelible images, and even a journalist who tilted heavily toward Biden in 2020 and supports his agenda was going to be hard-pressed to look away.

The contradiction in Biden’s case for withdrawal was also too stark to ignore. He originally justified his pullout because the Afghan government and military were capable of defending the country without us, then he justified his exit because the government and military collapsed so quickly. Which was it?

Much of what Biden has said in his remarks and press conferences has been vulnerable to instant fact checks. When he said that Americans weren’t having trouble getting through to the airport, reporters could immediately attest that it wasn’t true.

Who was everyone supposed to believe? Biden’s misleading assurance, or CNN reporter Clarissa Ward’s compelling report from outside the Kabul airport that she was threatened

with a whip for not covering her face and her producer nearly pistol whipped? Ward said it was “mayhem” and “a miracle that more people haven’t been very, very seriously hurt.”

The complaints from the administration and its most committed journalistic supporters that the coverage has been unfair and the product of a press biased toward interventionism ring hollow.

It is certainly true that the East Coast media has more cosmopolitan attitudes than the rest of the country, but it’s hardly full of committed foreign policy hawks. The press didn’t notably dissent from President Barack Obama’s pullout from Iraq in 2011 or his nuclear deal with Iran. It has steadfastly favored the so-called peace process in the Middle East.

It’s not as though only the American media has noticed Biden’s ineptitude, either. If anything, our foreign allies have been harsher about the humiliating mess Biden has stumbled into (former British prime minister Tony Blair called it “imbecilic”) than journalists here at home.

Since he won the Democratic nomination last year, Biden has been the subject of relentless favorable press coverage forgiving his lapses and enthusiastic about his alleged accomplishments. It was hard to see what he could do to lose media support, even for a time, and then he botched his withdrawal.

Stessa News Report

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - When the COVID-19 pandemic hit America and sent people fleeing from small apartments in the biggest cities, it immediately propelled rent and home prices in opposite directions. However, despite quickly escalating home prices, there are still many places across the country where the typical monthly mortgage payment is on par or below market rent, offering opportunities for both prospective home buyers and real estate investors.

There is plenty of evidence to confirm that homes are indeed getting more expensive, especially in relation to rental units. Just before the start of 2020, home and rent prices were growing at the same rate: 3.7% year-over-year, according to the Federal Reserve’s tracking of the urban rent and home price indexes. Within months, however, rental costs experienced an uncharacteristic cooling off that slowed growth to less than 2% annually by April 2021. Meanwhile, the effects of the pandemic nearly quadrupled the growth rate of home prices, catapulting it to 14.6% by April 2021.

While at first glance these trends might indicate the relative unaffordability of owning when compared to renting, record-low mortgage rates have dramatically pushed down the monthly costs associated with homeownership. Long gone are the days of 15% interest rates from the early 1980s; they’ve been below 5% for an entire decade, and at the start of 2021, the 30-year mortgage rate set a new all-time record low at

2.65%. For potential buyers who have been able to save enough for a down payment or for investors looking to maximize cash flow on a rental property, affordable options still exist in a wide range of markets.

Outside of the trendiest destinations, like Idaho, Utah, and other hotspots in the Northwest and Northeast, market rents are actually higher than the monthly mortgage payment and associated property taxes for a median-priced home. When factoring in mortgage payments and property taxes compared to rent, the range of affordability favoring owners encompasses more than half the nation, including all of the South and some states beyond.

Homeowners and investors get the best deal in West Virginia, where a mortgage payment and property taxes is about half as costly as renting, as well as in Mississippi and the states surrounding it, most of which are more than 30% cheaper to own on a monthly basis. Even other high-growth states like Texas and Florida register 8.6% and 19% discounts for owners.

Note that the comparison only factors in mortgage payments and property taxes. Other costs, such as insurance, HOA fees, and maintenance, also influence the affordability of owning versus renting or the cash flow associated with a rental property investment. But the data serves as a reliable directional indicator of where owning is most comparable, or even preferable, to renting.

To find the metropolitan areas where it’s cheaper to buy than rent, researchers at Stessa analyzed data from Zillow, the U.S.

Department of Housing and Urban Development, and the U.S. Census Bureau. They calculated the percentage difference between owner payments for a median-priced home and median rent estimates. Owner payments include the mortgage and associated property taxes based on a current 30-year fixed mortgage with a 20% down payment.

The result is that homeowners could save as much as 35% in large metros monthly or even more in smaller locations, potentially pocketing hundreds of dollars each month.

The analysis found that in the Sacramento metro area, homeowners pay 18.6% more on mortgage payments and property taxes each month than renters spend on rent. **Out of all large U.S. metros, Sacramento is the 9th most expensive for homeowners compared to renters.** Here is a summary of the data for the Sacramento, CA metro area:

Difference between monthly owner & renter payments: +18.6%; **Median monthly mortgage & property taxes:** \$2,115; **Median monthly rent:** \$1,783; **Median home price:** \$516,489.

For reference, here are the statistics for the entire United States:

Difference between monthly owner & renter payments: -12.9%; **Median monthly mortgage & property taxes:** \$1,221; **Median monthly rent:** \$1,402; **Median home price:** \$287,148

One Arrested for EDD Fraud Totaling More Than \$535,000

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - A joint investigation by the California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation (CDCR) and the Sacramento County District Attorney's Office resulted in a search warrant executed on August 23, 2021, at the Natomas home of Allison Illahi. During the course of the search, officers found a large cache of narcotics, extended magazines, ammunition, evidence of EDD fraud, and a ghost gun. A ghost gun is a gun assembled from non-traceable parts. These guns contain no serial number and are often altered to fire in a fully automatic mode.

The seized narcotics included 1.2 lbs. of methamphetamine, 19.8 grams of fentanyl, 28 grams of heroin, 24 grams of cocaine, and approximately 400 oxycodone pills. Officers also located evidence of weapons trafficking including an unregistered firearm, 42

illegal extended magazines, a large amount of ammunition, a bulletproof vest, and other firearm conversion kits. Additionally, officers found 14 fraudulent EDD cards, a large amount of EDD paperwork, and a notebook with the personal identifying information for more than 30 victims. Law enforcement has determined that the suspect obtained more than \$536,000 in fraudulent EDD funds.

The Sacramento District Attorney's Office charged Allison Illahi with five counts of drugs sales, 40 counts related to EDD fraud, 42 counts of possessing extended magazines, and one count of gun trafficking. According to District Attorney Anne Marie Schubert, "We continue to see staggering amounts of fraudulent EDD activity combined with illegal firearms in our communities. This dangerous combination undoubtedly has fueled a dramatic increase in violent crime throughout the state. Sacramento's law enforcement agencies will continue to partner together to investigate EDD fraud and the havoc it brings to our community."

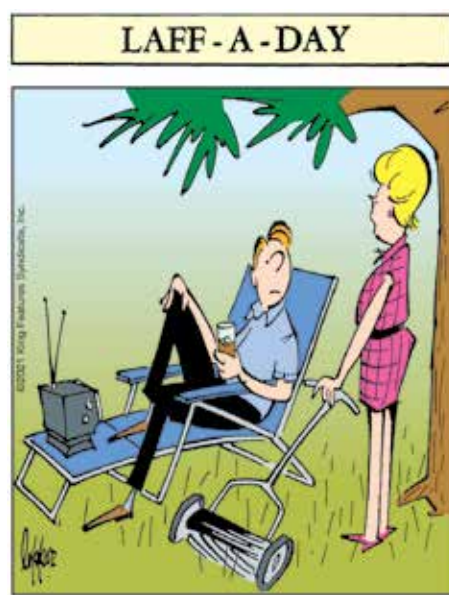

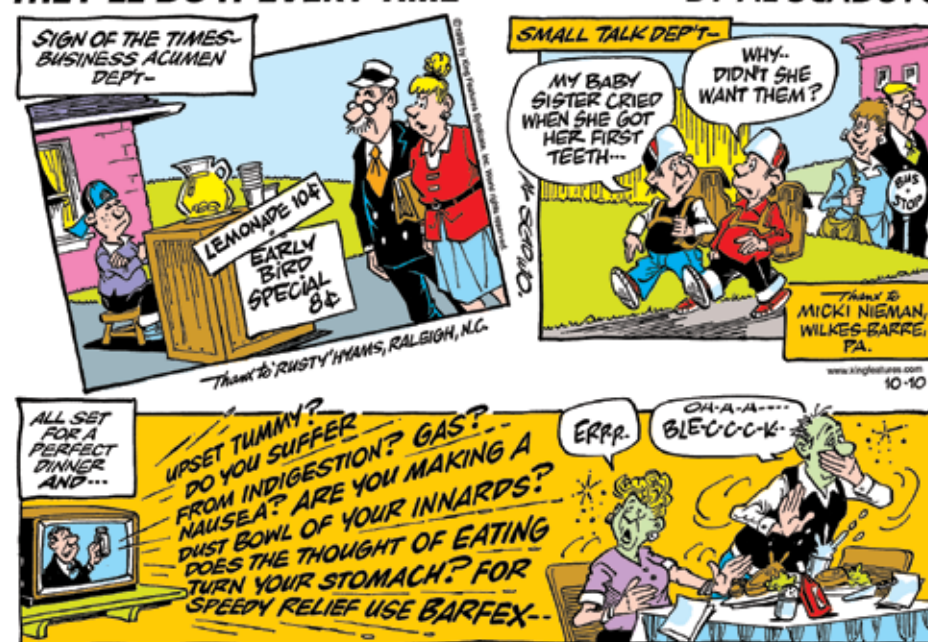

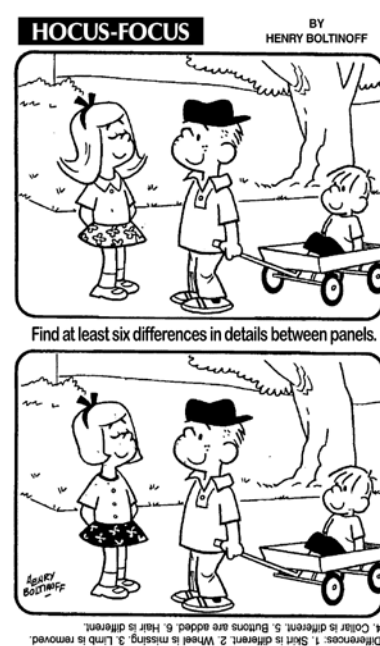

Husband Passed Away...
Why Is My Medicare Monthly Premium \$545?



Toni King

Toni:

I have been reading your articles regarding COVID-19, being laid off and enrolling in Medicare properly but I have not read an article on how to lower the Medicare monthly premium if you are not making that amount of income due to a life event such as your spouse passing away.

I turn 65 in September and have enrolled in Medicare. I received a letter from Social Security stating that I must pay \$475.20 for Part B and \$70.70 for Part D, totaling over \$545.90 monthly because the IRS states that my income was \$345,000 in 2019.

Since my husband passed away this February, I only have my Social Security check of \$2400 a month to pay bills, not my husband's income anymore.

How do I inform Social Security that I am no longer making this amount of income and bring my Medicare premium to a lower, affordable amount?

Thanks ... Gwen from Destin, FL

Gwen:

Do you want to wait 2 years for the IRS to inform Medicare that your income has decreased due a "Life Changing Event" such as death of a spouse, being laid off/working part-time or recently divorced or do you want to let Medicare know **now** that you have had a "Life Changing Event, because you or your spouse are no longer earning that amount of income?

During a Toni Says® Medicare consultation, we hear about the Medicare Part B and D premium problems from those on Medicare who have had various types of "Life Changing Events" mentioned above or have decided to retire. People believe that everyone pays the same amount for their Medicare Parts B and D premium. Those days are long gone!

If your income as an individual is over \$88,000 or married is over \$176,000; your Medicare Parts B and D premiums will be more. Social Security explains in the letter

that is mailed to you, how they arrived at the Part B and D premiums based on your "Modified Adjusted Gross Income" (MAGI) from your last filed tax return.

Your MAGI was over \$330,000 and the table used in the letter you received from Social Security shows what the Part B and Part D premium adjustment (*nice way of saying it's going to cost you more*) will be, whether you are filing single or married.

Most retirees do not realize that they have **special situations** also known as "Life Changing Events" that can lower your "income related monthly adjusted amount" (IRMAA).

Below are a few of the life changing events that can make your income go down:

- You have gotten married or **divorced**, or your **spouse has died**.
- You or your spouse have **stopped working** or have reduced your hours.
- You have lost property that you were making money from due to a disaster or other event beyond your control; or
- You or your spouse's benefits from an insured pension plan stopped or went down

Use form SSA-44 titled "Medicare Income-Related Monthly Adjusted Amount - Life-Changing Event" and attach the original documents or certified copies to verify your change in income. Call your local Social Security office to discuss the filing of this form.

Once Social Security is satisfied with the evidence, it will update its records and correct Part B and Part D premiums to what your current income is.

**Social Security reviews your income each year and will adjust your Part B and D premiums to your new income level the next year and again you will want to keep filing SSA-44 form until that year's income is to the lower amount.
