## Relief Funds Received at Last

### City of Citrus Heights

**CITRUS HEIGHTS, CA (MPG)** - The City of Citrus Heights received its first tranche of Federal ARPA funds for COVID-19 recovery on Wednesday, May 19, 2021, and staff met with the City Council Finance Committee to discuss preliminary interpretation of the Treasury's spending policies and share community engagement ideas. Citrus Heights staff

applied for the ARPA funds as soon as applications opened and the City is one of the first in the region to actually receive its funding. The first half of the one-time COVID-19 relief funds comes to \$7,838,486 for Citrus Heights, with the second payment anticipated in May 2022. "I'm proud of how hard our finance team has worked on both the application and our preliminary ARPA spending

guideline interpretation," said interim City Manager Chris Boyd. "In the wake of our current budget situation, this Federal support is exciting, but these are a one-time funds with very specific guidelines. Staff are working diligently to seek clarification to ensure Citrus Heights leverages the recovery funds as best we can. A huge part of our efforts will include engaging the community – a process that needs to

start with education, so everyone can weigh-in on realistic spending options." The City's finance team is working with Congressman Ami Bera's office and the Treasury to get clearer direction on ARPA spending regulations, in hopes of launching a community engagement campaign to outline applicable spending opportunities, receive feedback, and more. *Continued on page 3*

## 15 Indicted in Cocaine and Heroin Trafficking Conspiracies

**SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG)** - A federal grand jury returned a 45-count indictment today against 15 defendants for a conspiracy to traffic cocaine, cocaine base, and heroin in the Sacramento area, Acting U.S. Attorney Phillip A. Talbert announced.

The indictment charges the following defendants: Tyrone Anderson, 40, of Sacramento; Maurice Bryant, 51, of Antelope; Yovanny Ontiveros, 41, of Sacramento; Alex White, 61, of North Highlands; Jason Tolbert, 44, of Sacramento; Andre Hellams, 38, of North Highlands; Michael Hampton, 57, of Vallejo; Steven Hampton, 61, of Sacramento; Wilmer Harden, 52, of Elk Grove; Charles Sidney Carter, 34, of Sacramento; Bobby Conner, 50, of Sacramento; Jerome Adams, 54, of North Highlands; Dwight Haney, 49, of Sacramento; Arlington Caine, 47, of Rio Linda; and Mark Martin, 62, of Sacramento.

The indictment charges Bryant, Anderson, Carter, Conner, Adams, Haney, Caine, Martin, White, Hellams, Tolbert, Steven Hampton, and Michael Hampton with conspiracy to distribute and possess with intent to distribute at least 5 kilograms of cocaine and 280 grams of cocaine base. The indictment also charges Anderson and Ontiveros with conspiracy to distribute and possess with intent to distribute heroin. During and in furtherance of these conspiracies, the indictment charges certain defendants with distributing cocaine and cocaine base, possessing with intent to distribute cocaine and cocaine base, possessing with intent to distribute heroin, possessing firearms as felons, and using communication facilities to facilitate drug trafficking offenses. ## Cash for VAX!

Newsom offers big bucks for Californians who get their shots

For Californians who are insufficiently compelled by civic duty and self-preservation to get vaccinated, Gov. Gavin Newsom is offering another reason to get the jab: cold, hard cash. This afternoon, Newsom announced a \$116.5 million "Vax for the Win" program, the largest inoculation lottery program in the country. The money will be split among dozens of lucky Californians: \$1.5 million to each of 10 "grand cash prize" winners who will be picked by random draw on June 15, and \$50,000 each to 30 "Fridays for 30" winners to be selected by random draw on June 4 and June 11. The remaining \$100

million will be divided up in \$50 retail gift cards among the next 2 million Californians to complete their vaccine regime. "These are real incentives," the governor said at

a press conference. "And these are an opportunity to say thank you to those not only seeking to get vaccinated, as we move forward, but also those that have been vaccinated."

According to the most recent state vaccine data, a little more than half of all Californians over age 12 have been fully vaccinated. Another 13% have received *Continued on page 12*

# Women’s Empowerment Receives \$45k in Grants from Kaiser and State Farm

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Women’s Empowerment in Sacramento recently received a \$25,000 grant from Kaiser Permanente Northern California Community Benefit Programs and a \$20,000 grant from State Farm to fund employment readiness and paid job training for Sacramento women experiencing homelessness. The grant from Kaiser also will support Women’s Empowerment’s recovery and domestic violence learning and support groups. The grant from State Farm also will fund financial literacy curriculum. Women’s Empowerment is celebrating 20 years of helping women experiencing homelessness find homes and

jobs. The group celebrated its 1,700th graduate in March. “This is a milestone year for Women’s Empowerment, and we would not be here without the generous funding of local companies and foundations that are committed to ending homelessness for women and children in Sacramento,” said Lisa Culp, founding executive director, Women’s Empowerment. “We are grateful to Kaiser and State Farm for recognizing the important work we do and for understanding that new barriers continue to arise for women experiencing homelessness. # 15 Indicted in Cocaine and Heroin Trafficking Conspiracies

19, 2021, law enforcement seized over 5 kilograms of cocaine, a kilogram of heroin, a half kilogram of cocaine base, and multiple firearms.

“This investigation and indictment results in the dismantling of a network of long-time leaders and organizers in a regional cocaine, heroin, and crack cocaine distribution chain that stretches beyond the Eastern District of California, through Southern California, and into Mexico,” said Acting U.S. Attorney Talbert.

“This criminal organization utilized an interstate drug pipeline that reached far beyond the Sacramento region,” said DEA Special Agent in Charge Wade R. Shannon. “These arrests underscore our commitment to rid communities of drug trafficking networks and the poison they peddle.”

“The FBI is proud to partner with its local, state, and federal Strike Force partners to disrupt and dismantle violent criminal organizations that threaten the safety of the communities we serve,” said Special Agent in Charge Sean Ragan of the FBI Sacramento Field Office. “Together, we are stronger, leveraging seamless communication and our individual strengths to identify and disrupt illegal drug distribution networks.”

“The success of this indictment highlights the importance and necessity of law enforcement partnerships across the spectrum,” said Special Agent in Charge Tatum King, who oversees HSI operations in Northern California. “Strong partnerships among federal, state and local law enforcement agencies are critical to apprehending those that profit from the purveyance of dangerous drugs to our communities.”

This case is the product of an investigation by the Drug Enforcement Administration, the Federal Bureau of Investigation, Homeland Security Investigations, the U.S. Marshals Service, the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms, and Explosives, the U.S. Forest Service, the U.S. Postal Inspection Service, the Bureau of Land Management, the California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation, the California Department of Justice, the California Highway Patrol, the Sacramento County Sheriff’s Office,

and the Sacramento Police Department. Assistant U.S. Attorneys Cameron L. Desmond and Aaron D. Pennekamp are prosecuting the case.

If convicted of the conspiracy to distribute and possess with intent to distribute cocaine and cocaine base charge, Bryant, Harden, Anderson, Carter, Conner, Adams, Haney, Caine, Martin, White, Hellams, Tolbert, Steven Hampton, and Michael Hampton face a maximum statutory penalty of life in prison and a \$10 million fine. If convicted of the conspiracy to distribute and possess with intent to distribute heroin charge, Bryant and Ontiveros face a maximum statutory penalty of 20 years in prison and a \$1 million fine. Any sentence, however, would be determined at the discretion of the court after consideration of any applicable statutory factors and the Federal Sentencing Guidelines, which take into account a number of variables. The charges are only allegations; the defendants are presumed innocent until and unless proven guilty beyond a reasonable doubt.

This prosecution is part of the Organized Crime Drug Enforcement Task Forces (OCDETF) Strike Force Initiative, which provides for the establishment of permanent multi-agency task force teams that work side-by-side in the same location. The Sacramento Strike Force is a co-located model enables agents from different agencies to collaborate on intelligence-driven, multi-jurisdictional operations to disrupt and dismantle the most significant drug traffickers, money launderers, gangs, and transnational criminal organizations. The specific mission of the Sacramento Strike Force is to identify, investigate, disrupt, and dismantle the most significant drug trafficking organizations (DTOs) and transnational criminal organizations (TCOs) shipping narcotics, firearms, and money through the Eastern District of California, thereby reducing the flow of these criminal resources in California and the rest of the United States. The Sacramento Strike Force leads intelligence-driven investigations targeting the leadership and support elements of these DTOs and TCOs operating within the Eastern District of California, regardless of their geographic base of operations. ★

# New beanheads coffee Opening in Citrus Heights

**CITRUS HEIGHTS, CA (MPG)** - If you describe your palate, not by the quantity, but the genuine quality of coffee you drink, you might describe yourself as a “beanhead.”

A new beanheads coffee, with its distinctive uncapitalized brand name, a combination coffee shop and wholesale coffee dealer, is under construction at 6001 San Juan Avenue at Sperry Drive in Citrus Heights, and scheduled to open by early July, its owner said.

Until then, Tim Snipes, owner and wholesale coffee roast master, is using social media to invite customers to visit his online store at <https://beanheads.coffee/> and use coupon code “CITRUSHEIGHTS” at checkout to take 50 percent on any of its fresh roasted coffees for home delivery until his Citrus Heights store opens.

“My mission with beanheads is to make craft coffee both accessible and approachable. I want people to feel comfortable here, whether they’re ordering a decadent sweet coffee confection, or a pure, exotic single origin pour over,” Snipes said.

“There won’t be a wrong way to order coffee here. Additionally, we’ll also have a light food menu for breakfast and lunch, including panini and flatbread pizzas,” he said.

Snipes said he’s been in the coffee business off and on since the mid-90s. “My father retired from the U.S. Post Office in 1993 and bought a mobile coffee cart that we would take to events and street corners in Sacramento,” he said.

“Eventually I started roasting under the beanheads label, and that evolved after a few years into a new business setting up coffee carts in hospitals across California, which was going well enough until the pandemic last year basically shut us down. So, with this new beanheads store in Citrus Heights, I’m starting over,” Snipes said.

beanheads intends to launch a subscription club giving members early access to limited coffees, discounts on beans and other merchandise. He said he’s looking to develop a wholesale program to return beanheads coffee to the office coffee service market where he said it once thrived.

“We chose Citrus Heights because,

while there is clearly a strong demand for quality coffee here, the city is underserved by local coffee brands,” he said.

“To my knowledge, beanheads will be the city’s first ‘third wave’ coffee shop,” he said. The “third wave” of coffee is a movement to produce high-quality coffee. It considers coffee an artisanal food, like wine, rather than a retail commodity.

Eleven different coffee varieties are available for sale on beanhead’s website including a “Coda Di Volpe,” the tail of the fox – is a phrase used in Italian coffee culture to describe a visually perfect shot of espresso. Priced from \$13.50 for a 12-ounce bag, other popular choices include Black Pearl, Bold Spear, Monkey Warrior, Exultation, and a decaf version of its Foxtail variety.

A featured 12-ounce micro-lot packet of Ethiopia Kochere Debo offers “explosive flavors of watermelon, raspberry and nectarine, while boasting an exceptionally clean profile.”

“I’m excited to bring our coffee to Citrus Heights and to be a part of this community,” he said.

# Republicans Prioritize Results-Driven Water Package

**SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG)** - Where water flows, food grows - or it should – but in California hundreds of thousands of acre feet of water go straight to the ocean in a wet year because Democrats have refused to prioritize the needed infrastructure for dry years. Initially, Governor Newsom only catered to his chardonnay and brie buddies this year by declaring a regional water emergency for only two wine counties in Northern California, leaving the state’s \$30 billion agriculture industry high and dry.

Due to increased pressure from Senate Republicans to prioritize and include more drought-stricken counties,

today the governor finally relented and added 39 more counties to that list. Fresno Republican Senator Andreas Borgeas has been leading the effort to include more counties within the drought declaration to relax regulatory restraints and allow for the transfer of water to food producers.

For decades, Democrat legislative leadership has failed to build the infrastructure needed to capture water in a wet year, so California has little water to spare. The situation is so dire, Senate Republicans want to ensure that any drought measures passed by the legislature either save water or increase the water supply.

“Californians should not be in a drought, but due to Democrats’ lack of

investment in water storage and critical water infrastructure, we are. Senate Republicans appreciate the governor heeding our call for emergency drought relief, but this declaration does nothing to remove regulatory roadblocks that hold up shovel-ready water projects,” said Senate Republican Leader Scott Wilk (R-Santa Clarita). “Our farmers and residential users deserve a clean, reliable source of water.”

In a letter to Democratic leadership, Senate Republicans outlined several key solutions that will help California in the next 12 to 24 months, including investment in water infrastructure and lifting red tape that are holding up shovel-ready water projects. ★

# We Must Prioritize Unemployment Fund Debt

**SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG)** - The U.S. Treasury released its guidance on how states can use their share of the State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds, which were part of the American Rescue Plan passed by Congress earlier this year. Under the guidance provided today, states can use their portion of the more than \$350 billion allocated by Congress on myriad COVID-19 related activities, including paying down a state’s Unemployment Insurance (UI) Fund debt.

“While we are all celebrating a record \$75.5 billion surplus, we cannot forget the state also has a \$20 billion UI Fund debt. Now that we have clear guidance from the U.S. Treasury how the \$26 billion in unallocated federal aid California will receive can be used, the California Business Roundtable is calling on Governor Newsom and state leaders to prioritize paying down the state’s record UI Fund debt with these federal funds,” said Rob Lapsley, president of the California Business Roundtable.

California’s UI debt is now more than \$20 billion, and it is growing at approximately \$1.2 billion per month. The current debt is more than double the debt the fund incurred

during the Great Recession. That debt took more than 10 years to pay off. Given the boom-bust cycle of the California budget, it is likely the current debt could not be paid off at our existing pace before another recession would drive the fund into further debt. This situation would result in constantly rising employment taxes just as businesses are struggling to rehire their workers, and undermines the fiscal integrity of a key element in California’s income safety net.

“Addressing the UI Fund debt is a critical part of the state’s economic recovery. The massive debt is a looming threat for every business in California. If unaddressed, the debt will lead to an automatic tax increase on every business in the state at a time when they can least afford it. California businesses already pay the highest UI Fund payments, plus a 15 percent premium that was added to pay off the last debt. Businesses did not cause this recession and should not bear the burden of paying off this debt,” Lapsley continued. “Businesses need certainty more than ever right now, not even more threats of higher taxes. The governor and Legislature should take action now and help ensure businesses reopening after more than a year of closure can afford to stay open well into the future.” ★

But do we really understand what it takes to keep it going? **Dr. Susan Smith-Jones** gave me some insight on my POPPOFF Radio Show recently. According to **Dr. Jones**, our cardiovascular system is made up of heart and blood vessels. It transports oxygen and other nutrients to all organs and tissues in our body. And it removes carbon dioxide and other waste products. If the arteries, veins, and capillaries were all laid out end-to-end, would you believe it would extend as far as 60,000 miles long? And the heart is pumping blood throughout. So maintaining healthy circulation is a must.

Here's the important news. **Dr. Jones** told me the quality of foods we eat has a tremendous bearing on our circulatory health. High-fiber, plant-based foods like fruits, veggies, legumes, nuts, and seeds offer the essential vitamins, minerals, and nutrients the body and circulation need to survive. Why? Atherosclerosis is when plaque builds up along the walls of our arteries. Risk factors that can contribute to plaque buildup include high blood pressure, high cholesterol, tobacco use, diabetes, unhealthy diet, low levels of physical health activity, and being overweight or obese. Atherosclerosis can gradually make the arteries narrower, affecting the amount of blood flowing through them. So the organs and tissues may lack oxygen. When atherosclerosis affects the heart arteries, it's called coronary heart disease. Other arteries can also be affected as well...peripheral artery disease. That can affect blood flow to your

legs, feet, arms, and hands. Sometimes an artery may become completely blocked by plaque or a blood clot. Then a heart attack or stroke can occur.

She went on to point out that nitric oxide is a molecule that's produced naturally by our body, and it's important for circulation because it supports vasodilation, meaning it relaxes the inner muscles of the blood vessels, causing them to widen and increase circulation. Some of the best food sources of nitric oxide include beets, celery, lettuce, carrots, green beans, collard greens, parsley, cabbage, and spinach. Here are a few more foods that support healthy circulation...cayenne pepper, pomegranate, onions, cinnamon, garlic, salmon, beets, turmeric, leafy greens, citrus fruits, walnuts, tomatoes, berries, and ginger.

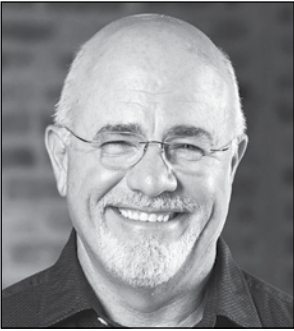

Assemblyman Kiley Responds to Newsom's False Claims about Jobs Report

By Joshua Hoover, Office of Assemblyman Kevin Kiley

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Assemblyman Kevin Kiley (R-Rocklin) responded to Governor Gavin Newsom's claim that California is leading the nation's economic recovery.

"Does Governor Newsom really look around and think we're creating 40 percent of the nation's jobs?" Assemblyman Kiley asked. "California's economy continues to struggle as much as any state in the country. Yet rather than face this reality and correct course, the Governor is presenting us with a Potemkin village."

The facts outlined in the April jobs report paint a dismal economic picture for California. The state's 8.3 percent unemployment rate is unchanged from March and the second highest in the nation, well above the national rate of 6.3 percent; Florida's rate is 4.8 percent. The overall number

of unemployed Californians went down a mere 3,200. In addition, the labor force participation rate declined in California while increasing nationally.

Despite these sobering facts, Governor Newsom is citing the jobs report as evidence "California is continuing to lead the nation's economic recovery," claiming that California created nearly 40 percent of the nation's new jobs in April. In fact, the "unadjusted" figure is 14 percent.

California's poor economic performance in 2021 is a result of conscious planning by the Governor. His January budget proposal forecast 8.5 percent unemployment for the year and predicted jobs would not return the "prepandemic" levels until 2025.

"As the Legislature debates the budget in the coming weeks, I'll continue to advocate for a fundamental course correction that sets high expectations for a swift recovery and

unleashes California's full economic potential." This includes: Taking a science-based approach to school openings rather than being 50th in the country, so parents can return to work. Taking a science-based approach to business openings rather than being 50th in the country, so businesses can resume operations without fear of further shutdowns. Taking a science-based approach to masking rather than ignoring the CDC's guidance. Structuring unemployment assistance to incentivize a return to work. Forgiving all COVID-related fines, penalties, and license revocations. Providing liability protection for businesses, while reforming PAGA and other litigation traps. Offering meaningful tax relief such as Net Operating Loss carrybacks. Removing arbitrary barriers to work such as Assembly Bill 5. Addressing the "surplus" with durable tax reform rather than arbitrary one-time payments. ★

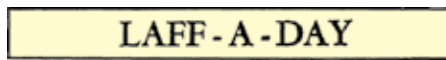

# Can California Shut Down Failed Projects?

We human beings hate to admit failure. Even though our brains may know when some endeavor has failed, our emotions and our egos may drive us to continue trying to make it work.

Indeed, the syndrome has developed its own linguistic phrases, such as “throwing good money after bad,” or “sunk costs,” or “cutting our losses.”

Private businesses are usually – but not always – willing to shut down or sell off ventures that don’t pan out. Ford Motor Co. famously jettisoned the Edsel, a car named after the beloved son of founder Henry Ford, when the car failed to attract enough buyers. But the Boeing Co. stuck with an elongated version of its 737 jetliner even after two crashed and killed 346 people, and is still trying to make it acceptable.

Government officials are generally less willing to admit failure, perhaps because, unlike business executives, they have no personal financial stakes in outcomes. Their guiding, albeit informal, rule is that launching new programs enhances one’s standing while shutting down those that fail just angers their stakeholders.

California’s recent history

is replete with examples of programs and projects that deserved merciful deaths but have continued to soak up billions of dollars in taxpayer money.

The woebegone bullet train project is the most spectacular. Voters were promised a statewide network of high-speed trains when they passed a \$9.95 billion bond issue in 2008. Thirteen years later, we have only a few concrete structures in the Fresno area — no track, no trains and no certain date when even a relatively short segment will be operative despite the many billions of dollars spent, or wasted, so far.

It would take a book – a thick book – to fully describe all of the state government’s highly touted, very expensive digital information projects that have failed to deliver the promised benefits. While it lacks the scale of the bullet train and the failed information technology projects, Calbright may fall into the same category.

It’s former Gov. Jerry Brown’s pet project – an online community college that would offer high-quality, low-cost instruction to help working Californians upgrade their job skills.

Tens of millions of dollars have been sunk into Calbright over the past few years but it’s actually provided instruction only to a few dozen students — at an enormous per-student cost, of course.

Last month, State Auditor Elaine Howle catalogued Calbright’s failures, declaring that “A primary reason...is that

its former executive team failed to develop and execute effective strategies for launching the college.”

If Calbright doesn’t shape up by next year, Howle told the Legislature, it should be axed. Five days before Howle issued her report, the state Assembly voted unanimously for legislation that “makes the California Online Community College Act inoperative at the end of the 2022-23 academic year.”

To be fair, the legislation, Assembly Bill 1432, does not merely reflect an unwillingness to continue a project that has fallen short of its lofty goals. The bill is sponsored by the union that represents faculty at the state’s 115 local community colleges and it opposed Calbright from the onset, fearing that it would undermine the existing system.

However, Calbright’s obvious shortcomings made it vulnerable to a political death sentence. The fight over its fate now shifts to the state Senate, or perhaps will be decided when legislative leaders and Gov. Gavin Newsom negotiate a final 2021-22 budget deal behind closed doors this month.

If Calbright is jettisoned, perhaps it would mark a new willingness to stop throwing good money after bad. Now how about that bullet train to nowhere?

one of two shots.

That still leaves more than 12 million Californians unvaccinated.

The percentage vaccinated varies wildly by race and income. Among Californians living in the top quarter of the healthiest ZIP codes, 76.6% have received at least one dose. In the least healthy quarter in the state's "Healthy Places" Index, the share is only 52.1%.

"Some Californians weren't ready to get their COVID-19 vaccine on day one, and that's okay. This program is designed to encourage those who need extra support to get vaccinated and help keep California safe," Dr. Tomás Aragón, director of the California Department of Public Health, said in a statement.

H.D. Palmer, a spokesperson for the state Department of Finance, said the lottery funding will initially come out of the state's emergency operations account, but will be repaid with the state's multi-billion dollar allotment of federal relief funds.

"The cost of not getting vaccinated is exponentially, incalculably higher," Newsom said.

The governor noted that Californians who have already been inoculated will be entered into both the \$1.5 million and \$50,000 contests. When the state rolled out its MyTurn website as a one-stop-shop for vaccine appointments, most Californians turned elsewhere. But the state also maintains a confidential registry of all vaccine recipients. The names of winners will be kept confidential unless they volunteer to have them released, said Newsom.

Republican Gov. Mike DeWine of Ohio was the first to launch a statewide cash-for-vax lottery program in mid-May. Nearly 3 million Ohioans entered and a 22-year-old recent college grad was the first winner on Wednesday. According to one analysis, vaccinations jumped by 40% in the week after DeWine's announcement.

Since then other state governors have followed suit. Colorado is offering a total of \$5 million to the newly inoculated. West Virginia has tempted vaccine-hesitant young residents with

savings bonds and New York has dangled the possibility of a tuition-free public university education.

But California's cash giveaway is the biggest yet.

For Newsom, the program represents a political win-win. The governor has vowed to ease most of California's COVID restrictions by June 15. The more vaccinated Californians, the more likely it is that the reopening process will go off without another surge in cases and hospitalizations. That, in turn, would be good news for the state, but also a governor who is hoping to survive an all-but-certain recall election later this year.

In a Public Policy Institute of California poll released this week, 57% of likely voters said they oppose removing Newsom, while 40% said they supported the recall. In the survey, 61% approved Newsom's handling of the coronavirus pandemic and 75% gave the state excellent or good marks for vaccine distribution.

Earlier this month, the governor went on a statewide tour announcing various goodies from his latest revenue-rich budget proposal – a convenient mix of policymaking and politics. Handing out even more cash to Californians in the name of public health can't hurt the governor's political image either.

Republican John Cox quickly accused Newsom of trying to "buy votes before the recall."

Based on the nearly 20 million Californians who have received at least one dose now, the odds of winning the \$1.5 million prize are 1 in 2 million – 100 times better than the chances of winning the Powerball or Mega Millions jackpots, but for far less money.

Newsom said the administration consulted with researchers at UCLA's COVID-19 Health and Politics project in putting the program together.

According to research conducted by political scientist Lynn Vavreck, lead researcher at the project, about a third of survey respondents said they were "more likely" to get a COVID vaccine if offered a cash prize of \$50 to \$100. That's compared to other tactics, including pro-vaccine public messaging from

celebrities.

"Those types of message treatments did not work, but changing people's material condition – giving them a little bit of money or telling them they don't have to wear a mask anymore – made them more likely," Vavreck told CalMatters.

But for a minority of survey respondents – about 15% – the offer of cash backfired. That's consistent with some criticisms made of these lottery programs noting that some vaccine skeptics could falsely interpret a cash reward program as an indication that the vaccine presents a risk that has to be compensated.

Peter Chin-Hong, an infectious disease physician at the University of California San Francisco, said that different people remain unvaccinated for very different reasons – a lack of social pressure, inconvenience, concerns about common side effects and more unfounded and outlandish safety concerns – so a single policy isn't likely to convince them all.

A possible cash incentive "will move the needle for the people on the fence," he said. "The people who are watching and waiting, who are not necessarily opposed to the vaccine but waiting to see people they know get it...that group will probably be most moved."

Earlier this month, the federal Centers for Disease Control and Prevention announced that fully vaccinated Americans can largely dispense with mask-wearing and social distancing – providing a powerful incentive for many. Though California has been reluctant to adopt more coercive measures, such as a statewide vaccine passport requirement, the reopening rules allow fully vaccinated people to attend larger events. Also, state and local governments have imposed selective requirements on certain Californians – public university students are likely to be required to have their shots, though prison guards are not.

# Multiple EDD Bills Get Senate's Nod of Approval

**SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG)** - Senate Republicans announce the passage of Senate Bill 39, Senate Bill 58, and Senate Bill 390 by the Senate. These bills address some of the critical lapses in security at California's Employment Development Department that have contributed to the rampant fraud in unemployment insurance claims this last year. Senate Republicans have made it a priority to correct some of the glaring issues at the agency that resulted in billions of dollars in fraud and ensure the agency is better prepared for the next economic downturn.

These include: **SB 39**, authored by Republican Senator Shannon Grove, would require the EDD to cross check prison inmate records with unemployment claims to prevent benefits from going to prisoners. **SB 390** would require the EDD to establish and routinely revise a recession plan to increase the department's efficiency during an economic downturn. Republican Leader Scott Wilk, Senator Rosilicie

Ochoa Bogh, Senator Brian Jones, Senator Melissa Melendez, and Senator Jim Nielsen are co-authors of SB 390. **Senate Bill 58**, authored by Republican Leader Wilk, would require the EDD to immediately end the practice of including full social security numbers on its most frequently mailed documents. SB 58 passed the Senate earlier this month and is in the California State Assembly awaiting consideration. **SB 232**, authored by Republican Senator Nielsen, would implement all of the State Auditor's recommendations from the previous three audits of EDD. It is scheduled for a floor vote in early June.

"Government completely failed its unemployed citizens this past year and now the governor has failed to prioritize fixing the problems in his budget. It is just heartbreaking to hear from families teetering on the edge simply because their claims are lost in some bureaucratic black hole. These issues need to be addressed and corrected as soon as possible to ensure they do not happen again," said Senate Republican Leader Scott Wilk (*R-Santa Clarita*). ★
