All Aces for Old Crow

MCCLELLAN, CA (MPG) - California Aerospace Museum's Old Crow Café does not serve crow of any vintage. Closest item on the menu is chicken Caesar salad. But museum management last week had plenty to crow about when famed WW II veteran C.E. (Bud) Anderson declared the café open. Adding ribbon-cutting to his many triumphs, the greatest generation hero laughed at a restaurant being named for the P-51 Mustang

he flew over Germany.

"I used to say we named Old Crow in honor of one of the most intelligent birds in the sky," said the 99-year-old. "But – for all my former drinking buddies – I can say it was named for good old sour mash Kentucky Bourbon. It wasn't a top-shelf brand, but in those days, it was all we pilots could afford."

The "ace" honorific is generally ascribed to wartime pilots who down five enemy aircraft. Anderson is one of the few aviators to achieve triple-ace legend. In the final year of the

war, he and his Mustang vanquished 16 and a quarter enemy planes (the quarter-kill came from the defeat – shared with four fellow fighters – of a low-flying Luftwaffe bomber).

A model of Anderson's famous Mustang graced the café opening at McClelland. Retired Cal Trans planner Jerry Severson fashioned the one-third size replica from wood and aluminum. "I worked 1300 hours on it, as a tribute to Bud Anderson," explained Severson, who trots the mini-Mustang out for patriotic

Redistricting Begins in Sacramento County

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - The process for redrawing boundary lines for each of the five supervisorial districts in Sacramento County has begun.

Every ten years, following the Census count, the resulting census data is used to geographically define electoral districts, at all levels of government, through a process called redistricting. Redistricting ensures that each of the electoral district boundaries have about the same number of people and comply with the federal Voting Rights Act of 1965.

Redistricting will look different this year than in years past. This year, the County will comply with the Fair Maps Act, which revised the criteria and

process used by counties and cities when they adjust electoral district boundaries. The Fair Maps Act intends to maximize public participation and increase transparency in the redistricting process by requiring substantial public hearing and outreach requirements for adjusting district boundaries.

To that end, Sacramento County's Redistricting 2021 webpage is live and will be a vital resource for County residents to learn more about redistricting, the importance of public participation in redistricting and how to participate in the process.

The website also includes current district and other important Sacramento County maps for reference, as well as past and future meetings/hearings, FAQs,

and an explanation of the Sacramento County Redistricting Process (with printouts of the process available in ten languages).

Redistricting is important because it determines which neighborhoods and communities will be grouped together for the purposes of electing a Board member. Residents have the opportunity to provide input on what kind of boundaries should be drawn to best represent their community. Redistricting is based on the idea of "one person, one vote" which makes sure all people can be represented fairly, and how district lines are drawn influences who is elected.

Sacramento County residents are encouraged to participate in the redistricting process. Residents can sign up for Redistricting

news stories, information and upcoming meetings via email or text. People can also view past and upcoming meetings at the Redistricting Meetings webpage and are encouraged to check in for additional upcoming workshops and hearings.

The Board of Supervisors will work directly with County staff and redistricting consultants to engage the public through workshops, hearings, community meetings, mapping tools and public outreach to complete the redistricting requirements and adopt new boundaries.

Sacramento County will schedule public workshops in all five supervisorial districts, virtual workshops, and Board of Supervisors presentations about redistricting, the process,

County Supervisors Vote to Implement Laura's Law

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - The Sacramento County Board of Supervisors voted unanimously on May 18 to implement "Laura's Law" - state legislation authorizing the courts to order outpatient treatment for individuals with a mental illness who may be a danger to themselves or others.

"Laura's Law" was named after 19-year-old Laura Wilcox, who was killed in 2001 while working as a receptionist at the Nevada County Department of Behavioral Health. Her killer was a former patient of the county's outpatient mental health clinic, who had been diagnosed with severe mental illness. After the incident, Laura's parents chose to advocate for assisted outpatient treatment (AOT) for individuals who meet strict legal criteria.

AOT permits courts to order treatment for those 18 years or older who suffer from a serious mental illness, are unable to survive safely in the community without supervision and meet at least one of the following criteria: Been hospitalized two or more times in the last 36 months due to mental illness; Demonstrated violent behavior toward themselves or others in the last 48 months; Has been offered treatment on a voluntary basis and refused it; Or, is deteriorating.

"We acknowledge that this is a complex issue with proponents on each side of this decision," said Ryan Quist, Behavioral Health Director. "We are committed to engaging with all of our stakeholders in a community planning process to minimize concerns and design the best program for Sacramento County."

California counties previously had the option to "opt in" to the program and that has been done in most of the larger counties. Sacramento County has historically not opted in to providing AOT services.

The process changed, however, with the passage

Tips for 2021 Graduates to Prepare for a Fiercely Competitive Job Market

Colleges may return to normalcy in a few months as the rollout of COVID-19 vaccines continues. Meanwhile, in sharp contrast to that positive news, millions of college students will graduate this spring facing bleak employment prospects.

The COVID-19 pandemic caused unemployment to soar in 2020 and is expected to affect the job market for graduates again this year. Some labor analysts see the pandemic perhaps having this ripple effect on graduates for years to come. These sobering trends are why students should expand their preparation for the job market and know what action steps they need to take, says Vince Thompson (www.meltatl.com), founder and CEO of the marketing agency MELT and author of Building Brand You: How To Use Your College Experience To Find And Win Your First Job.

“Thanks to COVID-19, if you’re in college right now or recently graduated, you’re facing the toughest job market in our lifetime,” Thompson says. “With so many people unemployed and displaced, people will be willing to take a lesser job for a lesser salary just to get back in the market.

“To use a fishing analogy, it’s going to take a lot of casts to get a few bites for interviews and ultimately land the job. But don’t let that discourage you. Instead, let it inspire you to grow and learn what you need to know to set yourself apart from other candidates. It’s all about positioning yourself

by building your resume, brand, and your network. And being enthusiastic about the process.”

Thompson suggests the following tips for soon-to-be graduates as they prepare for a fiercely competitive job market:

Build your brand. The job market is so competitive that companies are looking for far more than candidates with a high GPA. “Hiring managers often seek well-rounded young people who can communicate, collaborate and create,” Thompson says. “They’re looking for people who have been active outside the classroom as well – in clubs, the community, volunteer work, etc. All of these aspects are part of your

brand. Also, the new litmus test in the job market will be, ‘What did you do to improve yourself and others during COVID? Or did you do nothing and feel sorry for yourself?’ Employers are going to be looking for those intangibles.”

Organize your marketing playbook. “Utilizing a complete marketing playbook means leveraging your abilities and interests on social media platforms,” Thompson says. “This is where you display your public brand. Your profile, posts, photos, and videos reflect what you’re about. It’s key that your presentation and message are consistent on each platform that you use.”

Expand your networking. “Today, about 75

percent of new hires happen through networking,” Thompson says. “Build a target list of people to contact at companies that are hiring. Join discussion groups on LinkedIn that can expand your contacts and your knowledge. Connect with thought leaders and ask them questions to gain insight.”

Upskill. “Companies want young people who are versatile and able to learn new skills quickly,” Thompson says. “Research skills required in fields that you’re pursuing and get credentialed through online training programs. If opportunities are far fewer in your chosen field, research where your best skills apply in other industries.”

Prepare for virtual interviewing. “When you interview in person, your body language, enthusiasm, handshake and small talk help build a connection with the interviewer,” Thompson says. “Being interviewed on a screen demands that you be fully engaged, establish a rapport, have continual eye contact and express yourself clearly.”

“How you stand out from the crowd has always been the differentiator in hiring,” Thompson says. “It’s much a bigger crowd now for fewer jobs, so the importance of preparation in all facets has never been more important.”

last year of AB 1976, which requires counties like Sacramento to hold public hearings at the Board of Supervisors about whether to “opt in” or “opt out,” and if a County chooses to “opt out,” they have to provide specific reasons. The deadline for Counties to have a hearing and formally decide is July 1, 2021. In Sacramento County, the program is estimated to cost \$2.5 million annually. The Board of Supervisors and Sacramento County Behavioral Health Services will meet again in September to determine funding.

Community Input

In March, Sacramento County Behavioral Health Services virtually hosted informational sessions and solicited community input via a brief survey for community members to hear input on whether to implement or opt out of Laura’s Law/AOT. 280 individuals participated in the survey. Nearly three-quarters of participants indicated that they think Sacramento County should implement Assisted Outpatient Treatment (AOT) (73 percent), 15 percent of participants indicated that they think Sacramento County should opt-out of AOT, and 12 percent of participants indicated that they were neutral or unsure about the decision.

Court Requirements of AOT

AOT is a court-ordered outpatient treatment service for adults, ages 18 years and older, who have a serious mental illness and a

history of (a) psychiatric hospitalizations, (b) incarcerations, or (c) acts, threats or attempts of serious violent behavior towards themselves or others. Consumers must first be offered voluntary treatment within the past 10 days. The court cannot order involuntary administration of medications. Family members, roommates, treatment providers and law enforcement may request an investigation to determine whether the consumer meets criteria. Only the County mental health director or his or her designee may file a petition with the court. The person named in the petition has a right to a defender appointed by the court. If a judge finds that the individual meets the criteria, the AOT order would be for a 180-day treatment period, not to exceed 180 days. After 180 days, the director of the AOT program can apply for an additional 180 days of treatment. If the consumer is not compliant with treatment, the consumer can be transported to a hospital and held up to 72 hours. After 72 hours, the same hospitalization inpatient criteria such as being a danger to self, others, or gravely disabled. Sacramento County Behavioral Health Services provides a full array of culturally competent and linguistically proficient mental health services to individuals of all ages. Services include prevention and early intervention, outpatient services, case management services, crisis intervention and stabilization services, and inpatient psychiatric hospitalizations. ★

mapping tools and other information beginning in June and running through the rest of the year. The County will receive 2020 Census data from the state as early as September 30, 2021. The original plan was to deliver the data to states on or before March 31, 2021; however, COVID-19 significantly impacted Census operations which caused the nearly six-month delay in data delivery. The County must adopt final maps no later than December 15, 2021, which means the County will have approximately six weeks to complete its

redistricting work – a very compressed timeframe. **Timeline for Redistricting Work** May-September 2021: Hold public hearings and community workshops about the Redistricting, the process, mapping tools tutorials and other redistricting information. October-November 2021: Draft map preparation and review. November-December 2021: Map adoption. Nov. 17: First reading of County ordinance adopting final district maps. Dec. 2: Second reading of County ordinance adopting final district maps. ★

The Weight of Memorial Day

All Aces for Old Crow

For the second year in a row, Memorial Day may look a little different than in years past. However, the spirit of the day, along with our memories and emotions, remains the same. For countless families across the nation, Memorial Day is a stark – and often painful – reminder of those loved ones who were never afforded the opportunity to be honored as veterans.

Their sacrifice is a true expression of selfless service – something no one would pick for themselves. Whether they volunteered to fight in a war, served at a time of peace or never expected to wear our nation’s uniform until their draft number came up, they represent the best America has to offer.

We feel their losses, from the sacred and silent hills of Arlington National Cemetery to the many other final resting places worldwide. Far too many mothers, fathers, siblings and children feel the immense weight of seeing an empty chair at the table year-round.

This fall marks the 20th year we’ve been at war, longer than any American conflict that came before. About 2.7 million Americans have served in Iraq and Afghanistan, over half of whom deployed more than once. Those returning veterans are now our fellow community members, neighbors and friends, who can speak of the bravery and sacrifices known only to those who witnessed it firsthand.

There are also incredible accounts of courageous heroes who cannot speak for themselves. For example, Sgt. 1st Class Alwyn Cashe will become the first black service member to receive the Medal of Honor for actions in Iraq or Afghanistan.

At 35 years old, and on his second deployment to the war-torn country following the 2003 invasion, Cashe didn’t hesitate to sacrifice himself to save his fellow soldiers. His Bradley Fighting Vehicle had struck a

roadside bomb and was soon engulfed in flames. Drenched in fuel and under enemy fire, Cashe entered the blaze not once but three times to pull others out of the vehicle.

Cashe sustained second- and third-degree burns to more than 70% of his body, but despite his severe injuries, he insisted on being the last soldier on a medical evacuation helicopter.

Four of those soldiers perished, and Cashe succumbed to his injuries 22 days later, joining the ranks of those taken away far too soon.

While it is impossible ever to know what was going through his mind in those chaotic yet critical moments following the attack, we may catch a glimpse of what it could have been by listening to Medal of Honor recipient Army Capt. Florent “Flo” Groberg. With another soldier’s help, Groberg put himself between a suicide bomber and a dismounted patrol in Afghanistan in 2012. Although Groberg thankfully survived, four soldiers were killed.

Groberg has said, “In combat, there might be a moment where you have to make a decision that will more than likely dictate whether or not you live or die. When you are willing to put yourself in front of that bullet, in front of that suicide bomber, in front of that mortar, in front of anything that is going to kill you for your men – that’s love.”

We know Cashe loved his soldiers – he made the ultimate sacrifice for them. The harsh reality of war, and military service in general, is that, sadly, not everyone will make it home.

As we gather together – whether safely in person or online – let us honor the memory of those heroes no longer with us, and let us strive to live up to the example set by such selfless patriots today and every day.

parades and civic events. “I’d read about his exploits and I loved his never-say-die pilot spirit. I’d never dreamed I’d meet him. But it turned out he lived less than a mile from me in Auburn. First time I saw Bud was when a statue was being dedicated to him at Auburn airport. He saw my airplane, came right over and asked where I wanted him to sign it. He’ll talk to a 90-year-old veteran or a six-year-old kid and show them the same respect. Despite what he’s done, he’s the nicest, most humble man you ever know.”

Few so humble can garner groupies. In recent years, Aerospace Museum supporter Kelly Kreeger recruited dozens of kids to form the Bud Anderson Super-Fan Club. These aviation buffs regularly show up to applaud their hero at the many civic events he graces. Kelly Kreeger also assembled a massive collection of items relating to the pilot’s stellar career. After she died in an aircraft accident last year, her estate bequeathed this trove to the museum she loved. Much Kreeger Bud-abilia decorates the new café.

“Kelly strongly believed in science, technology, engineering and mathematics (STEM) education,” said museum director Tom Jones. “She was one of the museum’s greatest volunteers and supporters. It’s wonderful

we’ve got her artifacts together in the café. It’s a priceless opportunity to honor Kelly’s legacy and Bud’s legacy at same time.”

Some honors will be edible. “We’re gonna name sandwiches for both of them,” predicted Tom Jones. “And we’re planning a special Bud Anderson plate.”

Admission to the California Aerospace Museum is not required to sample Old Crow cuisine. Located at 3200 Freedom Park Drive, McClelland, the café is open Thursday through Sunday, from 9 am to 3 pm. Put yourself in this situation. After only three months of schooling your teacher informs your parents that you don't have the intellectual capacity to pursue an education. So you are taken out of school.

But you have an insatiable curiosity and want to make a living discovering and inventing. Would your dreams be condemned? Might you be laughed at? Probably. However, Thomas Edison did reasonably well with only three months of schooling and an "inferior" mind.

Ponder the plight of this poor fellow. He had a radical new concept for transmitting information. His ideas were so preposterous that his friends and family tried to have him locked up in a psychiatric institution. Undeterred, in the 1890's, Guglielmo Marconi proceeded to successfully develop the radio.

Are you routinely chided or ridiculed for your dreams, desires plans or goals? If so, take a look at the people offering their negative opinions. Are they experts in the areas

that you are striving for? Have they already accomplished what you are trying to do? Are they presenting their "advice" because they want you to succeed? If the answers are no, why would you ever allow their criticisms to deter you?

How do you fly against criticism? Believe in yourself and your goals. You don't need approval. You aren't obligated to convince anyone that your ideas are worthwhile. Often, it's prudent to keep your aspirations mostly to yourself. Seek out others who are also working towards their dreams and form a motivational group to help each other.

When you succeed, some people will tell you they knew you could do it. Others will insist you must have been lucky or were in the right place at the right time. These will be the very same people who were convinced you'd never make it.

Use criticism to feed your determination and strengthen your resolve. Make it the wind that will propel you to new and exciting achievements.

Newsom Transforms Taxpayer Protection into Welfare

California actually has a government spending limit, hard as that may be to believe, and Gavin Newsom is making a mockery of it, just as his predecessor did.

In 1979, a year after signing off on the revolutionary Proposition 13, voters passed Proposition 4, implementing the “Gann Limit,” which would peg California’s state spending to the 1978-79 level and only let it grow adjusted for inflation and population. State revenues above the voter-approved limit can be reckoned with several different ways, including refunding half of the excess revenues to taxpayers, with the other half going to schools.

Newsom is choosing the refund path for this year’s massive Gann Limit excess, which is currently estimated at \$16 billion dollars. But instead of sending their money back to the taxpayers in relation to how much they paid, giving everyone a slice of the rebate in proportion to their tax contributions, Newsom is turning the program into a giant transfer payment scheme.

Paul Gann, the father of Prop. 13 and the namesake of this taxpayer protection plan, would be dumbfounded by Newsom’s willful misunderstanding and shameless appropriation of his taxpayer-protection initiative.

The wealthiest taxpayers in this state, the top five percent, paid nearly 70-percent of California income taxes last year. Those citizens were also supposed to get relief from the Gann Limit. Instead, they get nothing.

Newsom is sending rebates to the bottom two-thirds of tax filers only. What about the top-third, who paid a whopping 97-percent of the total income taxes in 2018, for example? In Newsom’s redistribution plan these top payers are simply out of luck, even though it’s their payments providing the bulk of the excess. And before you shout, “tax the rich!” understand that in that same tax year, we are talking about people making \$60,000 a year.

It’s great that the Governor wants to help taxpayers during the pandemic, even though it was state policy that caused so much of the damage to small businesses and killed so many jobs. If the governor and legislature want to make more direct payments to citizens out of the general fund, after Gann Limit refunds have been fairly distributed, be my guest.

In fact, I challenge Governor Newsom and the legislature to find ways to make the state more affordable and livable for all citizens, starting with lower taxes on personal income, on business income, on gasoline, and by eliminating green energy mandates that

have forced our electricity prices up 9-times faster than the national average over the past decade. These steps would help every day of the year, not just on the day he announces his budget.

Getting money back into the hands of job-creators – by lowering costs and equitably rebating the Gann Limit dollars – would actually fuel a California rebound.

But to repurpose a taxpayer protection act, approved by voters, into a new tax and welfare plan, is bad-faith politics and speaks to why Newsom is facing a recall.

Governor Brown’s 2017 budget dodged the Gann Limit by magically reclassifying \$22 billion in spending as neither state nor local, as required by the original Proposition, making it disappear, along with the hopes of fiscal conservatives.

Brown would not adhere to the mandates of the 1979 Gann Limit reform; he tricked his way past the law and shafted taxpayers along the way. Apparently, Governor Newsom was watching and learning, waiting for his own opportunity to betray the intent of California’s voters.

Mission accomplished. Newsom’s plan is ugly political alchemy, where he mutates a rebate program into a new tax on the homeowners, small business owners, teachers, police and other middle-class people who will be paying the taxes they will never get back. He should refund ALL taxpayers according to their tax payments and quit manipulating the Gann Limit for his political needs. ★

\$25 Million Grant Program Included for Veterans

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Along with historic investments in small businesses, housing, education, infrastructure and climate change, Governor Newsom’s California Comeback Plan includes the establishment of the *Veterans Support for Self Reliance* grant program. Administered by CalVet, this funding will support California’s most vulnerable veteran population, including aging veterans and veterans with disabilities who have experienced chronic homelessness.

The Governor’s plan, if approved, will provide a higher level of on-site supportive services, such as

in-home support to help with habitability; peer specialists to encourage veterans to engage in mental health care; and geriatric social workers to identify behavioral issues related to early onset dementia or similar cognitive issues.

“We are grateful for Governor Newsom’s leadership regarding support for our most vulnerable veterans. This program closes a crucial gap in care for veterans who are in need of supportive services for daily living, yet do not meet the level of skilled nursing or assisted living,” said CalVet Secretary, Dr. Vito Imbasciani.

Steve Peck, President of the California Association of Veterans Service Agencies said that supportive services have always

played a vital role in effectively serving veterans and ensuring housing stability. “The California Association of Veterans Service Agencies applauds Governor Newsom for his investment in supportive services for veterans’ housing,” added Peck. “This is an unprecedented opportunity to provide much-needed additional support.”

The program is proposed as a three-year competitive grant that CalVet will administer to qualified grantees who serve veterans through permanent supportive housing. The program will primarily target those projects supported by U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development–VA Supportive Housing, also known as HUD-VASH. ★

SMF, Beale AFB Team Up for Training

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - It’s not uncommon for anyone traveling through Sacramento International Airport (SMF) to see a military aircraft, from nearby Air Force bases, operating on our runways and in our airspace.

Military cargo planes like the giant Lockheed C-5 Galaxy cargo plane, as well as the smaller and much more nimble Northrop T-38 Talon trainer, frequently use SMF and Mather Airport (MHR) for training.

“We are very proud to partner with our military colleagues and we are happy to provide them this opportunity,” said Cindy Nichol, Director of Airports, Sacramento County Airport System.

Other military aircraft, including the Boeing C-17 Globemaster III, the McDonnell Douglas KC-10 Extender, and the Boeing KC-135 Stratotanker can also be seen conducting pattern

and approach training exercises at SMF and Mather.

This is done for a variety of reasons, the most important being pilot familiarization for both military and commercial use airports.

Operating from a military airfield and into a commercial airport can provide a different environment for both military pilots and commercial aviation personnel. For the pilots of these aircraft, it’s important to interact with civilian air traffic controllers and with civilian airfields in general.

“The reality is they need that training because they don’t just use specific military airfields,” said Joe Conklin, SMF Senior Airport Manager. “They have to be very familiar with different types of airport environments. It’s important for them to understand that process.”

Recently personnel from Beale AFB flew a T-38 into SMF to conduct

a familiarization exercise with SMF staff to share valuable information by taking a first-hand look at a T-38. SMF does not have a T-38 to train with, so SMF Airport Fire, Operations and Sherriff’s deputies took the opportunity to educate themselves on things like how to release a canopy, make safe the ejection system and a variety of other life safety items.

“Should an incident ever occur at any of our Airports, this face-to-face and hands on training will make the response and recovery on both sides more efficient. It is important to sit down and talk about the needs and requirements on both side in advance; during any emergency is not the time to build those relationships,” said Sheri Thompson-Duarte, Deputy Director, Operations & Maintenance.

Further site visits by aircraft from Travis AFB are currently being planned. ★

Shooting Investigation

A RESOLUTION DECLARING THE INTENTION TO LEVY ASSESSMENTS FOR FISCAL YEAR 2021-22, PRELIMINARILY APPROVING THE ENGINEER'S REPORT, AND PROVIDING NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING OF THE MISSION OAKS RECREATION AND PARK DISTRICT PARKS AND RECREATION MAINTENANCE AND IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT

WHEREAS, the Mission Oaks Recreation and Park District, Parks and Recreation Maintenance and Improvement District was authorized by an assessment ballot proceeding conducted in 2006 and approved by 68.78% of the weighted ballots returned by property owners, and such assessments were levied by the Advisory Board of Directors by Resolution No. 2006-04 passed on May 2, 2006; and

WHEREAS, on April 13, 2021 by Resolution No. 2021-02, the Board ordered the preparation of an Engineer's Report for the Parks and Recreation Maintenance and Improvement District (the "District") for fiscal year 2021-22; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to said Resolution, the Engineer's Report was prepared by Francisco and Associates, Inc., Engineer of Work, in accordance with 22565, et. seq., of the Streets and Highways Code (the "Report") and Article XIIID of the California Constitution; and

WHEREAS, said Engineer's Report was filed with the Secretary of the Board of Directors and the Board of Directors has reviewed the Report and wishes to take certain actions relative to said Report.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Advisory Board of Directors of the Mission Oaks Recreation and Park District ("Board") that:

SECTION 1. The Report for the "Parks and Recreation Maintenance and Improvement District", on file with the Secretary of the Board, has been duly considered by the Board of Directors and is hereby deemed sufficient and approved. The Report shall stand as the Engineer's Report for all subsequent proceedings under, and pursuant to, the foregoing resolution.

SECTION 2. It is the intention of this Board to continue to levy and collect assessments within the District for fiscal year 2021-22. Within the District, the existing and proposed improvements ("Improvements") are generally described as the installation, maintenance and servicing of public facilities, including but not limited to, landscaping, sprinkler systems, park grounds, park facilities, landscape corridors, ground cover, shrubs and trees, street frontages, playground equipment and hardcourt areas, senior and community centers, drainage systems, lighting, fencing, entry monuments, basketball courts, tennis courts, running tracks, swimming pools, other recreational facilities, security guards, graffiti removal and repainting, and labor, materials, supplies, utilities and equipment, as applicable, for property owned and maintained by the Mission Oaks Recreation and Park District. Installation means the construction of recreational improvements, including, but not limited to, land preparation, such as grading, leveling, cutting and filling, sod, landscaping, irrigation systems, sidewalks and drainage, lights, playground equipment, play courts, recreational facilities, and public restrooms. Maintenance means the furnishing of services and materials for the ordinary and usual maintenance, operation and servicing of said improvements, including repair, removal, or replacement of all or part of any improvement; providing for the life, growth, health and beauty of landscaping; and cleaning, sandblasting and painting of walls and other improvements to remove or cover graffiti. Servicing means the furnishing of electric current or energy for the operation or lighting of any improvements, and water for irrigation of any landscaping or the maintenance of any other improvements.

SECTION 3. The District consists of the lots and parcels shown on the assessment diagram of the District on file with the Secretary of the Board, and reference is hereby made to such map for further particulars.

SECTION 4. Reference is hereby made to the Report for a full and detailed description of the Improvements, the boundaries of the District and the proposed assessments upon assessable lots and parcels of land within the District. The Engineer's Report identifies all parcels which will have a special benefit conferred upon them and upon which an assessment will be imposed.

SECTION 5. The maximum assessment is subject to an annual adjustment tied to the Consumer Price Index-U for the San Francisco Bay Area as of December of each succeeding year (the "CPI"), with a maximum annual adjustment not to exceed 3%. Any change in the CPI in excess of 3% shall be cumulatively reserved as the "Unused CPI" and shall be used to increase the maximum authorized assessment rate in years in which the CPI is less than 3%. The maximum authorized assessment rate is equal to the maximum assessment rate in the first fiscal year the assessment was levied adjusted annually by the minimum of 1) 3% or 2) the change in the CPI plus any Unused CPI as described above.

The change in the CPI from December 2019 to December 2020 was 2.00% and the Unused CPI balance is 1.61%. Therefore, the maximum authorized assessment rate for fiscal year 2021-22 is increased by 3.00% which equates to \$57.78 per single-family equivalent benefit unit. The estimate of cost and budget in the Engineer's Report proposes assessments for fiscal year 2021-22 at \$52.07 which is less than the maximum authorized assessment rate.

SECTION 6. The public hearing shall be held, before this Board at Mission Oaks Community Center, located at 4701 Gibbons Drive, Carmichael, California 95608 as follows: on Tuesday, June 8, 2021 at the hour of 6:00 p.m. for the purpose of this Board's determination whether the public interest, convenience and necessity require the improvements and this Board's final action upon the Report and the assessments therein. As of the date of this notice, social distancing measures are in effect due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Parties interested in participating in the June 8, 2021, public hearing should visit the District's website at <https://www.morpd.com/advisory-board-meetings> for current information on how to provide public comment. The Secretary of the Board is hereby authorized and directed to cause a notice of the hearing to be given by publishing a notice once, at least ten (10) days prior to the date of the hearing above specified, in a newspaper circulated in the District.

Social Security Matters

Will Applying for SS Disability Hurt SS Retirement Benefit?

Dear Rusty: My husband turns 65 later this month. He has started having health issues - so much so that we are thinking about talking to his doctor about Social Security Disability. How would this affect him in applying for his Social Security benefits? Should we exhaust disability efforts before applying for his retirement benefits? **Signed: Concerned Wife**

Dear Concerned Wife: In order to qualify for SS Disability Insurance (SSDI) benefits, your husband's disability must be considered total and must be expected to last for at least one year. And that will need to be substantiated by medical evidence from his doctor. So, having a discussion with his doctor is the right first step.

Since SSDI benefits are based upon your husband's full retirement age (FRA) benefit amount, if he is awarded SS disability it



would have no effect on his FRA benefit amount. In fact, if he is awarded SSDI benefits, they will automatically convert to his regular SS retirement benefit (at the same amount) when he reaches his FRA. SSDI benefits are replaced by SS retirement benefits once FRA is attained.

So, should your husband exhaust disability efforts before applying for his SS retirement benefit? Provided that his doctor will support that he is totally disabled and expected to remain so for at least a year, your husband should apply for SSDI online at www.ssa.gov/applyfordisability. This will establish a base date which will be used to establish a disability onset date, which is what his SSDI benefit will be based upon if later awarded. You should be aware that it takes several months to receive an initial SSDI determination, and that about 2/3rds of all SSDI applications are denied. But there is an appeals process in place which can be used in the event of an initial denial and if he believes that is an

unfair decision.

It is also possible for your husband to claim his personal early SS retirement benefit at the same time he applies for SSDI, so he can get some early SS income flowing while his SSDI application is being considered. Then, if his SSDI is later awarded, his smaller SS retirement benefit (reduced for claiming before his FRA) will be replaced by his higher SSDI benefit, and his higher SSDI amount will automatically become his SS retirement amount when he reaches his FRA. However, if your husband's SSDI is not awarded, his reduced SS retirement benefit will be his permanent benefit amount (except, of course, for annual Cost of Living Adjustments).

No, Israel Is Not an Apartheid State

The charge of apartheid is the new blood libel.

As Hamas rains rockets down on Israel, members of the Squad in Congress and other left-wing enemies are using the occasion to amplify their accusation that Israel is an "apartheid state."

This is a transparent attempt to delegitimize – and isolate and ultimately destroy – the Jewish state by associating it with a racist regime that the world united to squeeze out of existence.

Rashida Tlaib, the Democratic congresswoman from Michigan, says that Israel is "promoting racism and dehumanization" under an "apartheid system," and Rep. Ilhan Omar of Minnesota refers to "Israel's apartheid government."

The charge is given a patina of legitimacy by Human Rights Watch, which recently issued a 213-page report devoted to the allegation, and other anti-Israel organizations that understand the accusation's potential power to define Israel out of the circle of advanced democracies.

It doesn't take much moral discernment to understand, even if one takes a harshly critical view of how Israel conducts itself, that it is nothing like an apartheid regime in South Africa that depended on a rigorously

enforced system of racial repression.

The Arab minority in Israel (about 20% of the population) may face obstacles, but it is not treated like black South Africans.

Rep. Alexandria Ocasio-Cortez of New York and her ideological compatriots tweeted the other day, "Apartheid states aren't democracies," which nailed the point, just not the way they intended.

Israel is a democracy that affords its Arab citizens full rights. They vote in elections and Arab parties sit in parliament. These parties obviously have a profoundly different worldview than the Zionist parties, which has been a barrier preventing cooperation between them. But this year, in a first, Arab parties were part of the negotiations over forming a new government before they broke down.

Arab Israelis are full participants in Israeli society. There are Arab justices on the Supreme Court. About 20% of doctors in Israel and about half of pharmacists are Arab. Roughly 17% of students seeking an undergraduate degree are Arab, a number has roughly doubled over the last decade.

As Steve Kramer of The Times of Israel puts it, "They arguably are the most free Arabs in the Middle East."

Then, there are the Palestinian territories, where there is a marked lack of democracy courtesy of the Palestinians themselves.

Palestinian president Mahmoud Abbas, who is still serving a four-year term that began about 15 years ago, cancelled new elections scheduled for May 22. He found a way to blame Israel

for this move, of course, but the bottom line is that his party, Fatah, feared Hamas would win, as it did in the last Palestinian election back in 2006.

The Palestinians have made postponing elections into a high political art, in keeping with the lack of democratic accountability in other neighboring Arab states.

How Israel should handle the threat of another terror state devoted to its destruction arising on its borders is, any fair-minded person should concede, an inherently difficult question.

It has offered the Palestinians a state twice, in 2000 and 2008, to no avail.

Israel evacuated the Gaza Strip entirely in 2005. It can't be blamed for Hamas winning the elections in 2006, taking over Gaza in a coup against Fatah a year later, and misgoverning the territory ever since, with an emphasis on using it as a base from which to wage war against Israel.

Much is made of its border controls in Gaza and the West Bank, but a border isn't a denial of citizenship rights, rather a demarcation between two societies. If the Palestinians would ever accept the right of Israel to exist and embrace a program of peaceful development, they'd get their own sovereign state.

Instead, they want to wipe Israel from the map, and are getting an assist from purveyors of the malicious lie that Israel is morally indistinguishable from the old, racist South Africa. *Rich Lowry is editor of the National Review.*

I will retire effective May 1 and now my wife and I are going to travel the US in the new Winnebago that is sitting in our driveway. I am an insulin dependent diabetic and will need easy access to a pharmacy while traveling, I am concerned that with COVID-19 it will not be easy to receive care and if there is an emergency, I do not want a hassle to receive medical care for me or my wife.

Please give me your thoughts on what would be a good Medicare option for me and my wife

Due to COVID-19 and issues in the oil industries many are retiring early or taking retirement packages by their employer. Planning your Medicare is an important part of planning your retirement because one wrong move can cause you thousands of your hard-earned retirement dollars.

Many new to Medicare miss a special window of opportunity when they first enroll in Medicare Part B whether turning 65 or past 65 and retiring from work. This special time is called the Medigap/Medicare Supplement Open Enrollment period and lasts for 6 months beginning the first day of the month in which you are 65 or older and enrolled in Part B. During this special period, an insurance company can't use medical underwriting because of any health problems.

Joseph, if you enroll in the special 6-month window, being an insulin dependent diabetic will not affect you enrolling in a Medicare Supplement.

Touring the US may be another reason to choose a Medicare Supplement because there is not a network and if the healthcare provider or facility is accepting Medicare, then you can receive your care there.

Also, you will want to take time when picking your Medicare Part D plan because you will want access to a nationwide pharmacy that is not only in your Lake Charles area, but also in other parts

of the country.

Another option for both healthcare and prescription drugs is a Medicare Advantage plan which may or may not offer the flexibility of easy access to healthcare providers in various areas of the country.

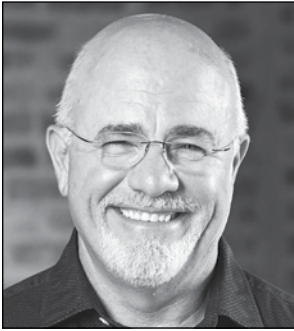

3. A Medicare Advantage Plan must provide all your Part A and Part B benefits and some Medicare Advantage Plans have Part D prescription drug plans included.
4. A Medicare Advantage Plan may have a zero to low dollar premiums.
5. With a Medicare Advantage plan, you may have different co pays, co-insurances or deductibles to pay and have maximum out of pocket expenses to meet.

I'm almost out of debt, and I live on a budget, but looking toward the future it seems like it will be very difficult to save up for a down payment on a home. I live in Chicago, and property prices are very expensive. I have a friend in Georgia who suggested I buy a less expensive property there, then fix it up and flip it to make the money I would need for a down payment. What do you think of this idea?

When you take on the kind of work you're talking about, you need to oversee what's happening every step of the way. You're working out details, keeping an eye on the crew, and having to handle a dozen other issues tied to the project. Plus, you can't just walk up to a house or see it online, buy it, and expect to

come out ahead in the deal.
People who flip houses for a living professionally eyeball dozens, sometimes hundreds, of properties to buy just one. It's not an easy way to make money, and it's definitely not something I'd recommend doing from a distance. In short, I wouldn't do it, Erik. Fixing and flipping properties is a hands-on business, and trying to do it from 700 miles away would be a nightmare.
Just keep on working the budget and save as much as you can. I'd consider getting a part-time job for a while to add to the down payment fund before I'd try to fix and flip a house that far away.

Dahle is Studying the Effects of Forest Fires on Wildlife Habitats

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Senator Brian Dahle (R-Bieber) appealed to the California State Senate Committee on Appropriations to pass legislation Monday, May 10, that would require the Department of Fish and Wildlife to use their time and resources to study the effects of wildfire damage to local wildlife and their habitats.
Wildfires are an unfortunate and devastating reality for California residents. Last year alone we saw over 4 million acres burned and

destroyed. One thing that many of us forget is that the devastation and cost is not exclusive to humans. Many animals and vegetation are also subject to the devastating losses of their natural habitats.
Senate Bill 592 proposes that the Department of Fish and Wildlife, in coordination with Cal Fire and the appropriate local representatives, put a portion of their resources towards studying the impact that these catastrophic fires have had on California wildlife and their habitats.
“The genuine goal of this bill is to establish a baseline of information to understand the true impacts of wildfire to our habitat and wildlife,” said Senator Brian Dahle. “Only then can we know the real cost of wildfires, and begin to address a solution that encompasses all affected.”
The hope is that we can use the findings of these studies to better

protect and conserve our wildlife and forests going forward.
It is important to understand how these events impact ecosystems, biodiversity, and protected species in the state. Knowing where we went wrong and how we can correct our mistakes in the future may save the lives of many helpless creatures.
The Senate Appropriations Committee voted to send SB 592 to suspense for a hearing at a later date.
SB 550 (Dahle), which would subject the Legislature to the same laws and regulations imposed on California businesses, was also heard and placed on suspense.
Senator Brian Dahle represents California's 1st Senate District, which contains all or portions of 11 counties, including Alpine, El Dorado, Lassen, Modoc, Nevada, Placer, Plumas, Sacramento, Shasta, Sierra, and Siskiyou. ★

Inflated Job Numbers Prop Up Bullet Train

Whenever politicians spend large sums of taxpayer money on pet projects, they invariably overstate their supposed economic benefits, particularly creating oodles of “good-paying jobs.”

They all do it, using a deceptive assumption that if one worker works one day on the project, it’s counted as a “job.”

Ralph Vartabedian, a reporter for the Los Angeles Times who – thank goodness – specializes in telling us what’s really happening, or not, in the state’s woe-begone high-speed rail project, punctures its job creation myth in a recent article.

Vartabedian cites a banner on a bullet train viaduct in Fresno claiming “5,000 jobs and counting” but reveals that while consuming many billions of dollars, the project has employed only about 1,000 construction workers at any one time.

“The boast of 5,000 jobs refers to the number of workers dispatched from union halls,” he wrote. “Each time a worker is sent to a job site, whether for one day or hundreds of days, it counts as a job for the purpose of the banners.”

“Rail authority Chief Executive Brian Kelly

defended the worker count as a valid measure of progress, saying the authority has been doing it for years.”

In other words, since inflated job numbers have been used for years, Kelly would have us believe it’s a valid practice.

In fact as Vartabedian discovered from analyzing bullet train data, “hourly workers have received about \$265 million of the \$6.1 billion that has been spent on construction, representing just 4%. Of the total \$8.1 billion spent on the project, the labor portion is even smaller, 3%. The \$265 million is less than what the rail authority spends every three months.”

The much-inflated job creation claims are important because construction union support has been one of the most important factors in keeping the project alive despite lacking a rational justification.

The original vision, backed by voters, was for a statewide north-south system of high-speed travel, but no one ever came up with a plan for financing such a system, which would cost upwards of \$100 billion.

The Fresno structures, dubbed “Stonehenge” by local critics, are part of a very limited stretch in the San Joaquin Valley, financed by some state bonds, a federal grant and a share of proceeds from the state’s auctions of greenhouse gas emission permits. At the moment, it would run from a few miles north of Fresno to a few miles north of Bakersfield.

Gov. Gavin Newsom came close to killing the project after taking office in 2019, only to back-track under pressure from construction unions.

Newsom then declared that he wants to expand the current project northward a few miles to Merced and southward a few miles to Bakersfield, assuming that someday it could be connected to the Bay Area and Los Angeles. But that also added billions of dollars to the projected costs.

Newsom’s latest budget proposal would appropriate \$4.2 billion from remaining voter-approved bonds to advance his version of the project and mentions “potential federal funds” to fill the remaining financial hole – a reference to President Joe Biden’s ambitious infrastructure program.

However, Newsom’s plan doesn’t sit well with some legislative leaders who would prefer improving commuter transit. Some bullet train money has already been shifted to electrifying the Caltrain commuter service on the San Francisco peninsula, and Southern California lawmakers, led by Assembly Speaker Anthony Rendon, want similar diversions for their region.

The commuter projects would probably use inflated job creation claims as well, but at least they would be serving real needs, rather than a unrealistic pipedream.

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - “Leave the ladders to us,” says Chris Anderson, owner of Student Services in Roseville. “From professionally trained and friendly technicians to industry-leading equipment – we’re bringing exterior house cleaning to new heights,” Anderson said.

Anderson transferred from Sierra College and graduated from U.C. Santa Barbara in 2018, debt free. He decided to return home to Roseville to expand his business into new 55+ residential communities throughout the area, tapping into resources including the Small Business Development Center, Sacramento Entrepreneurship Academy, StartupSac, and HaneyBiz to obtain practical new business advice.

Utilizing these free or low-cost business development resources, Anderson welcomed professional

coaching and business connections which nurtured his entrepreneurial bug. Since 2019, his first full year in business, his company, Student Services grew 280 percent and is set to double that pace by the end of 2021.

“Much of the specific services we provide are ladder-related, because for the adult senior market, getting up on a ladder to do something around the house is likely the last thing they want to do,” Anderson said. “The catch is, they often need a ladder in order to do their home maintenance and often don’t have one.”

“The mission of Home Heroes will be to come to the rescue of homeowners,” Anderson said. “We help provide maintenance for their residential property so they can maintain the level of personal independence in the place they truly love the most.”

Many of the 20 different planned 55+ senior residential communities in the greater Roseville area were built on specific single story floor plan models. Pricing is based on the physical model of the residence and on the

level of cleaning detail the customer may require, Anderson said.

Anderson said he cherishes the relationships which he’s built with his regular, older customers, many of whom are widowed, or live alone, providing a valuable service to them as well as companionship. Since his company involves ladder work, all his employees are covered by a general liability insurance policy and worker’s compensation when in the field, he said.

“We also use the latest cleaning technologies to ensure time-efficient, thorough, and safe services. Equipment such as water-fed poles and safety equipment like fall protection ensure that we complete our work safely with minimal ladder use,” he said.

Anderson encourages homeowners to stick to a regular exterior cleaning schedule. “After a long winter, all sorts of dirt, moss, and other nasty substances can collect on your roof, windows, and solar panels. Cleaning your gutters, windows, and solar panels regularly extends their life and adds curb appeal to your home,” he said.

“There’s plenty of work and we’re hiring additional employees,” Anderson said. “It’s hard to find applications right now, but we want to spread the word that we’re growing and actively adding staff.” His company has three college interns from the University of California system and a team of Sacramento State students who are helping with sales and marketing.
