**CITRUS HEIGHTS, CA (MPG)** - The parking lot of the newly opened Green Acres Nursery and Supply at 6128 Greenback Lane in Citrus Heights has been packed since a soft opening a week ago.

Opened just in time for spring gardening season, house plants, vegetables and herbs, roses, and fruit trees have been selling briskly. The new store is the sixth location for the family-owned Sacramento-based business.

The new gardening and nursery center occupies the former Antique Trove mall which sat vacant for many years. Its 24,297-square-foot building features an additional acre of outdoor and greenhouse space.

"First-time customers are honestly enthusiastic, that there's a knowledgeable, friendly, full-service garden center now open in their community, said store manager Joann Golden.

"Many people are getting their spring gardens started, and herbs, and veggies have been selling well," she said. "Flowers and flowering plants have also been popular."

"We have between 70 and 80 current team members who are committed to the gardening success of our customers," Golden said. "We're hiring, and candidates can find information on our website."

The store is about 75 percent stocked at this time. A greenhouse is under construction with more inventory which continues to arrive daily, Golden said. Customers can also shop online and pick up their merchandise curbside.

"It's a happy place to work, Golden said. The new business is the first

dedicated nursery in the Citrus Heights area since the closure of Capitol Nursery on Madison Avenue in 2012.

"In time we hope to offer the Citrus Heights community informative workshops and events related to gardening which we've held in our other locations before," she said.

Green Acres offers a wide variety of plants, trees, soils and pottery,

## Silver Dragon Restaurant Relocates to Fair Oaks

**SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG)** - Silver Dragon, a popular Chinese restaurant for over 30 years in the Sunrise Village in Citrus Heights, has found a new home at 8116 Madison Avenue in the Fair Oaks Plaza.

The restaurant closed on Jan. 24, 2021, leaving loyal patrons without their favorite dishes until its new location opens later this summer. Owners of Silver Dragon were unavailable for comment, but evidence of exterior construction at the restaurant is underway.

The new location is in a shopping plaza on the southeast corner of Madison Avenue and Fair Oaks Boulevard, next to Caffè Italiano Ristorante.

# Citrus Heights Little League Invites You to Register!

**CITRUS HEIGHTS, CA (MPG)** - The Spring 2021 season of Citrus Heights Little League played its first game on April 7th, and if you are interested in participating there are still some players needed to complete the teams.

Little League Treasurer and parent of three little leaguers, Courtney McConnell, said, “The Little League could not have the usual formal opening to the season due to Covid-19 but the games are permitted to be played.”

McConnell said the sports venue is sanctioned to be played if they follow CDC guidelines: “We can’t have crowds of more than 25 people and people need to stay with their families-not mixing-and maintaining 6 feet apart or wearing a mask... normally our crowds are about 50 people.”

McConnell said kids are gathering to play at different levels in the league at Rusch Park, McDonald Field and Madera Park in Citrus Heights. The league has openings in the Minors 9-10 year-old category and Junior 13-14 year-old

category.

McConnell said her son, Morrison, “is stoked to be playing this year” since all games were cancelled in 2020 due to the pandemic. “They only got to practice last year, but no games were ever played.”

The league, which usually begins in March, will be a few weeks shorter this year closing on May 29th with final tournaments extended until June 19th.

its closure last January. According to the sign left by its owners, a lease for the location could not be renewed, as Sunrise Village is undergoing major renovation. The restaurant’s former location and commercial businesses in the Citrus Heights shopping plaza have since been gutted, awaiting new tenants.

In Citrus Heights, Folsom Palace Asian Cuisine & Bar is planning to open a third restaurant at 5450 Sunrise Blvd., Suite E, in the Sunrise MarketPlace business improvement district. The restaurant has locations in Folsom and Eldorado Hills and will

open in the location of the former PizzaRev, a pizza franchise restaurant. Adjacent restaurants in the same retail center are Dos Coyotes, Nation’s Giant Hamburgers, and Menchie’s Frozen Yogurt.

An initial building permit has been submitted to the Citrus Heights planning department, said Alison Bermudez, city planner. “We reviewed their initial request and have sent it back with our notes.”

The building permit submission was filed by Leck Soungpanya, doing business as Leck Associates.

A spokesperson for the restaurant could not be reached.

Kathilynn Carpenter, executive director of the Sunrise MarketPlace business improvement district, confirms the restaurant is in the early permitting stage, with an opening date not yet set. Business incorporation documents have been filed for “Folsom Palace Sunrise Inc.,” with an address of 5450 Sunrise Blvd, Suite E.

According to the company’s web site, the business has been in the food and restaurant industry for over 20 years. Its dine-in menu features popular entries such as moo shu pork, curry beef or chicken and various seafood offerings prepared with low sodium, less oil and no MSG. ★

# That’s Why Doctors Call Us Patients

For the past month I have been engaging with my eye doctor. I’ve had two cataracts removed which isn’t a serious thing in itself. But what goes into this surgery is what baffles me.

The first time I went to the eye doctor, he scheduled me for a 9:15 appointment. No problem. The Gracious Mistress of the Parsonage got me there 15 minutes ahead of time to make sure I wouldn’t be late.

An hour later, I finally got in to see the doctor. I think he is, on the side, trying to develop patience in my life.

On the first visit, I had to wear a mask, and it’s no problem for me. If it makes other people feel happy, so be it. I’m just not real happy about wearing a mask.

As I was sitting waiting for my appointment, the lobby began filling up with new patients. An old guy sat next to me, and we nodded heads. I went back to what I was doing.

In a few minutes, I begin to smell something rather disgusting. I didn’t want to look over to the guy next to me, but I did not smell that before he sat down, so I decided that I could not take that stench any longer.

I got up to get a drink of water prepared for us, washed my hands, and then sat at another place.

This time an older woman came in and sat two seats away. Again I nodded my head, smiled, and went back to reading.

Then I smelled that smell again. This was getting to be rather ridiculous. I can understand some old man smelling that bad, but I was a little confused as to why this woman smelled like that.

As I was thinking, a terrible thought rumbled in my head. This thought cannot be true, I said to myself. But what if this stench is not coming from the outside but rather from the inside of my mask?

That idea was preposterous, and I wanted to throw it out as quickly as possible. But you know how it is; a thought will haunt you until you pay attention to it.

Cautiously, I pulled my mask down, took a deep smell of my breath and almost passed out. That stench was my breath.

The problem was that my mouth was in close proximity to my eyes of which the doctor was going to be working on. Something had to be done before the doctor

called me in.

As I was thinking of this, the nurse walked into the room and called my name and took me into the surgical room.

I tried keeping my mouth closed as much as possible, hoping that a closed mouth and several masks would work.

The doctor finished his surgery, and just as he was going out the door, he turned and looked at me and said, “Are you sure you didn’t have any breakfast? Smells like you ate garbage this morning.”

My patience deflated right there.

“Be patient therefore, brethren, unto the coming of the Lord. Behold, the husbandman waiteth for the precious fruit of the earth, and hath long patience for it, until he receive the early and latter rain” (James 5:7).

Patience doesn’t come easy, but it does have a wonderful reward attached to it.

Have you ever had one of those kinds of days when you think everything, and everyone is ganging up on you? This is the way Jehoshaphat feels in 1 Chronicles chapter 20. Three enemy nations gang-up on him. He was overwhelmed. Have you ever had a day like that? Just a little bit overwhelmed? When you feel overwhelmed, when you’re stressed out, when you’re at the end of the rope, you’ve got one of two alternatives. You can panic or pray.

Philippians 4 “Don’t worry about anything. Instead pray about everything. Tell God what you need and thank Him for all He has done.” The Bible says you’ve got two alternatives – panic or pray. You can decide what you’re going to do this next week. You’re going to have problems this next week – I guarantee you. You’re going to have problems. You’re going to either panic or pray.

What battle are you’re facing today? Can’t think of a battle? Let me say it like this “What’s got you worried?” It may be the Coronavirus, “When am I going back to work? How will I pay next month’s bills? Or maybe you think, “Am I ever going to have a baby? ... Am I ever going to get married? ... Am I ever going to get the job I want? ...” What do you do when you’re worried and overwhelmed? Jehoshaphat did six things that reduced his worry and increased his peace; we’re going look at these over the next few days. The first is...

**Pray and ask God for help.** Before you do anything else you go directly to God. Do not pass Go. Do not collect \$200. Go directly to God. Verse 3 says this: “Jehoshaphat was afraid, so he decided to ask the Lord what to do.” Too often when we pray, we treat prayer like it’s the last resort. Like it’s the last thing you do instead of the first choice, the first thing you do.

Sometimes someone will say, “All we can do now is pray.” Then somebody will go, “Has it come to that?”

# Social Security Matters

## When Can I Get Benefits from My Ex-spouse?

**Dear Rusty:** I know that I am able to get Social Security from my ex-husband. We were married for 16 years and I have not remarried. I will be 60 soon and he is 63. I do not know if he is retired yet, as we do not speak. Please advise when I can collect and how to go about the process. **Signed: Divorced Lady**

**Dear Divorced Lady:** Since you were married to your ex for more than 10 years and haven’t remarried, you may be able to collect a spousal benefit from your ex-husband when you are 62 years old. Your eligibility will depend upon the amount of your own personal Social Security (SS) benefit compared to your ex’s benefit amount, but you cannot collect an ex-spouse benefit before age 62. To be eligible for a benefit from your ex-spouse, you must also claim your personal SS (from your own lifetime work record), and when you claim your own benefit an ex-spouse benefit will be given, if you are entitled to one.

To be eligible for a benefit from your ex-spouse, your



personal Social Security retirement benefit at your own full retirement age (FRA) must be less than 50% of the benefit your ex-husband would get at his FRA (note that FRA amounts are used for this determination, regardless of the age at which either of you claim SS). If your FRA benefit amount is less than half of his FRA benefit amount, then you will be entitled to a “spousal boost” to bring your total payment up to your spousal entitlement. But taken at age 62, both of those amounts will be reduced.

Your full retirement age is 67, and if you claim any SS benefit before that it will be reduced. At 62, your personal SS retirement benefit will be cut by 30% and your spousal boost will also be reduced. So, at age 62, the total amount of benefit you could get (your own benefit plus your spousal boost) would be about 32.5% of your ex-husband’s FRA benefit amount. Nonetheless, if you are comfortable with these benefit reductions, you can claim at age 62 (or any age thereafter) by contacting Social Security or, when the time comes, apply online at [www.ssa.gov/applyforbenefits](http://www.ssa.gov/applyforbenefits). You will need to provide

SS with a copy of your marriage certificate and your final divorce decree, and you will need to know your ex-husband’s Social Security number (SSN). If you do not know his SSN, you’ll need to provide his parents’ names and his date and place of birth.

If you wish to find out in advance whether you’re entitled to an ex-spouse benefit and how much it is estimated to be, you can contact Social Security at 1.800-772-1213, or call your local SS office (find the local office number at [www.ssa.gov/locator](http://www.ssa.gov/locator)). Please note that all Social Security offices are temporarily closed to public access due to the pandemic, so calling them is your best current option to get an estimate of your spousal benefit.

One final caution: if you claim SS before your full retirement age and you are working, you’ll be subject to Social Security’s “earnings test” which limits how much you can earn before they take back some of your benefits.

*Through the generosity of the Citrus Heights Messenger, this column serves to provide an update about matters affecting the community of Citrus Heights.*

This summer the Sacramento County Board of Supervisors will have a big decision to make regarding whether or not to implement “Laura’s Law.” I want to take this opportunity in my monthly article to explain to you what this law is, why this is coming before the Board of Supervisors, and why it is such a big deal.

Laura’s Law is named for 19-year-old Laura Wilcox, who was a college student working in a Nevada County mental-health clinic in 2001, when she and two others were shot and killed by a man with untreated severe mental illness. After the incident Laura’s parents chose to advocate for assisted outpatient treatment (AOT) for individuals who meet strict legal criteria and who, as a result of their mental illness, are

unable to voluntarily access community mental health services.

Since then, California counties have the option to “opt in” to the program, and that has been done so far in most of the larger counties. To date, Sacramento County has been one of the few larger counties who has not opted in and has never held a public hearing at the Board of Supervisors regarding whether or not to implement the program.

This process changed however with the passage last year of AB 1976, which requires counties like Sacramento to hold public hearings at the Board of Supervisors about whether we will “opt in” or “opt out”, and if we choose to “opt out” we have to provide specific reasons for this to the State. The deadline for Sacramento County to have this hearing and formally decide will be July 1st of this year.

Earlier this month a mentally ill homeless man assaulted a child on Freeport Blvd. in Sacramento, only to be released back into the public in less than 24 hours – and this was after he had been captured and released previously for assault and battery

of another woman. As a former emergency room nurse, I understand firsthand that there are people living in our community who cannot take care of themselves, and they desperately need help.

People like this should be able to get help before more crimes are perpetrated in our communities – it’s the compassionate and safe way to move forward. I do not know how I will vote on this issue when it comes before me as I want to have an open ear to both sides as well as be able to fully comprehend the fiscal impacts, but I do know this is a growing problem and we should be handling this problem better than we are right now.

The 2021 funding round is the tenth in the 17-year history of the funding program, which has awarded more than \$1.1 billion over that time. The SACOG board also acted to recommend nearly \$12 million in funding in the regional Active Transportation Program.

The unanimous vote by the SACOG board meant 74 projects were approved to receive funding from two programs: the Regional Program and the Community Design Program. The flexible Regional Program funds cost-effective transportation projects that realize the performance benefits of the **Metropolitan Transportation Plan/Sustainable Communities Strategy** and the Community Design Program provides funding to local governments to build place-making projects in their communities. Funded projects help implement SACOG Blueprint principles such as a mix of land uses, preservation of natural resources, or housing and transportation options.

“These projects have risen to the top through a rigorous, competitive process and I’m confident they will advance the transportation goals and aspirations for communities throughout the Sacramento region,” said SACOG board chair Bonnie Gore, a Placer County supervisor.

Changes to this year’s funding round process meant that more weight was given to the priorities submitting agencies gave to their projects. The performance-based recommendations largely ended up reflecting what the submitting counties, cities, and agencies said were most important to them as well as meeting regional priorities that will help meet our regional goals. For example, in the Maintenance and Modernization program, staff recommend funding for 19 of the 20 top priority projects.

The Regional Program comprises two key categories, Maintenance and Modernization and Transformative, intended for larger projects. An example of a Transformative project is the **\$21.9 million awarded to SacRT to go toward the purchase of 16 new light rail vehicles**. The new vehicles will have low-level boarding at every doorway, spacious

seating design, and feature improved accessibility with wider aisles, built-in storage, and areas for bicycles.

In the Maintenance and Modernization category, SACOG awarded \$3.75 million to Yuba City’s Walton Avenue project. The City will install sidewalks on the west side of Walton Avenue, creating a complete sidewalk path, pave dirt shoulders for the addition of a buffered bike lane, upgrade traffic signals, upgrade battery backup systems to improve safety during power outages, and repair pavement for a 2.3-mile section of Walton Avenue. The project will promote safety of non-motorized users and pedestrians and encourage increased walking and bicycling among students, especially along a primary walking route to Andros Karperos Middle School and Lincoln Elementary, while providing urgently needed pavement maintenance.

A good example of the Community Design category is the **\$3 million awarded to Sacramento County for a “complete streets” project on Greenback Lane in Orangevale**, from Walnut Avenue to Chestnut Avenue. The streetscape improvements include wide, separated sidewalks, continuous bike lanes, a bus turnout, converting an existing, two-way turn lane into a median with trees and landscaping, traffic signal improvements and signalization, and installing trees and monuments. The award builds on the **momentum in the community** stemming from the energy and outreach of community volunteers, including private investment coming into the area, and the possibilities of infill housing.

In the Active Transportation Program, the top-scoring project is design work and right of way for the **last mile of a five-mile continuous facility for cyclists and pedestrians along the Placerville Drive corridor, which was recommended for a \$1.2 million award to the City of Placerville**. When complete, the community will be able to cycle and walk the full length of Placerville, serving residents not just with a physical link to jobs, but with a social connection between neighborhoods that deepens the community’s cohesion and sense of place.

# DWR Adjusts State Water Project Allocation Following Dry Winter

### California Department of Water Resources

**SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG)** - As California experiences a second consecutive dry year, the California Department of Water Resources (DWR) announced an adjustment to its initial State Water Project (SWP) allocation for the 2021 water year. The department now expects to deliver 5 percent of requested supplies this year, down from the initial allocation of 10 percent announced in December.

Initial allocations are based on conservative assumptions regarding hydrology and factors such as reservoir storage. Allocations are reviewed monthly and may change based on snowpack and runoff information. They are typically finalized by May.

“We are now facing the reality that it will be a second dry year for California and that is having a significant impact on our water supply,” said DWR Director Karla Nemeth. “The Department of Water Resources is working with our federal and state partners to plan for the impacts of limited water supplies this summer for agriculture as well as urban and rural water users. We encourage everyone to look for ways to use water efficiently in their everyday lives.”

Ongoing drought conditions require the coordination of federal, state and local agencies. Today, the U.S. Bureau of Reclamation, which operates the Central Valley Project, is also expected to adjust its initial CVP water supply allocation accordingly. The State Water Resources Control Board mailed early warning notices to approximately 40,000 water right holders urging them to plan for potential shortages by reducing water use and adopting practical conservation measures.

As a result of the persistent drought conditions, and in accordance with its permit for the long-term operation of the State Water Project, DWR has submitted a revised Drought Contingency Plan to the California Department of Fish and Wildlife. The plan provides updated hydrologic conditions and outlines areas of concern for the joint

operations of the State Water Project and the Central Valley Project, water quality, and environmental impacts.

DWR does not anticipate the need to pursue a Temporary Urgency Change Petition (TUCP) to allow for temporary changes to the water quality and outflow requirements for the Sacramento-San Joaquin Delta.

The severity of the situation is particularly evident in the North State. Lake Oroville is currently at 53 percent of average. The Feather River watershed, which feeds into Lake Oroville, has seen significantly less precipitation this year than normal, on track for its second driest year on record. Following a below average 2020 water year, California’s major reservoirs are at 50 percent of capacity.

California is better prepared for drought than in the past. Following the 2012-2016 drought, DWR enacted many programs focused on managing the state’s water through a strategic, integrated approach with a strong emphasis on water use efficiency and conservation. The state provides assistance and tools to local water agencies to help them reduce their drought vulnerability. DWR’s Water Use and Efficiency Branch (WUE) provides agencies and individuals assistance for improving water use efficiency and developing and meeting efficient water use requirements.

The 5 percent allocation amounts to 210,266 acre-feet of water, distributed among the 29 long-term SWP contractors who serve more than 27 million Californians and 750,000 acres of farmland.

Allocations represent the amount of SWP water that DWR will deliver for the year and are reviewed monthly based on several factors, such as water in storage, environmental requirements, and rain and snow runoff projections. For 2020, the initial SWP allocation was 10 percent and the final allocation was 20 percent in May.

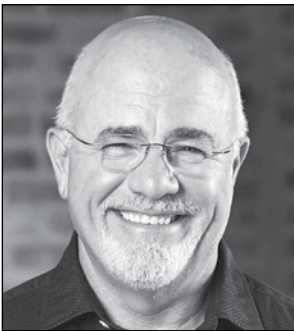

The last thing I'll suggest may sound a little

strange, but trust me on this one. Right now, your daughter also needs some kind of physical activity on a regular basis. Exercise stimulates the mind, and she really needs that right now. It'll also be great for her body.

This young lady has been through a stressful experience. She needs some understanding and support right now. At the same time, you don't want to let her slide into bad habits and participate in promoting negative behavior. Step in, help her get her life back on track, and get her out in the world again. All three of you will be glad you did!

# Ask Toni

## HELP!!! My Sister with Cancer Loses Medicaid!!



Toni King

**Toni:**  
My 60-year-old sister who had no health insurance or Medicare was granted Medicaid in January last year. She was granted Medicaid because she had stage 3 breast cancer with lymph-nodes that were removed. She just learned from her Doctor that her Medicaid had been cancelled effective May 1st. My sister has not received anything from Medicaid stating that she was cancelled, and we cannot get anyone at Medicaid to tell us what the problem is. She was being paid \$703.00 as a disability check and recently she got a raise to \$1,431 for Social Security Disability which she has recently qualified to receive effective April 1st. When she went to Social Security to apply for Social Security Disability no one said she would get an increase in her \$703 monthly Medicaid check.

Someone told me about what you do to help people who do not know where to go or what to do. This is overwhelming because my sister cannot receive her chemo treatments any more due to not qualified for Medicaid. Can you tell me what I need to do? Thanks, Gray from Jackson, MS

Oh My... Gray:

I do not get very many problems like this, but after talking with you this week, I wanted to inform my readers about this Medicaid issue. People need to know how vitally critical and important it is, when you qualify for Medicaid to be sure you stay in the monthly income and asset bracket that qualifies you for Medicaid. One dollar (\$1) too much and you can LOSE your Medicaid benefits and will have to pay 100% out of your pocket for your medical expenses.

Gray, my heart ached when you said, "you would have helped your sister with some of her expenses because of her disability check raised from \$703

to \$1,431, but you could not pay the \$2,600 per chemotherapy treatment with 8 treatments in a cycle that totaled over \$20,800. She lost her Medicaid for only \$400.00." And that you considered the state had given your sister a "death sentence" because her doctor is not giving her chemo since the medical facility is not getting paid.

Here is what I would advise you to do to help your sister:

1. Ask how you can have her Social Security discontinued from the \$1,431 to the original amount of \$703 for Medicaid, so that she can be in the correct income bracket to qualify for Medicaid. Who knows maybe there is a loophole somewhere?
2. Talk to the cancer facility where your sister was receiving her medical care and chemo treatments. Find out if there is a non-profit fund set up for situations like your sister's. See what grants or philanthropic organizations help in this type of emergency.
3. Contact the American Cancer Society area office and explain about her serious situation and how time is slipping away with her not receiving her chemo treatments. She needs help NOW!!

My main goal in writing this week's column is to make the public aware to how important it is when you qualify for Medicaid, whether you are under 65 with no health insurance or are over 65 and have Medicare, that you must stay within the financial limits... *One dollar (\$1) too much and you lose your Medicaid benefits and must pay 100% out of your pocket for medical expenses.*

# Kiefer Landfill Accepting Treated Wood Waste

**SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG)** - Treated wood, or pressure-treated wood, has been treated with a chemical preservative to protect it from decay. It is considered hazardous waste by the state of California. Fence posts and decking material are the most common household uses. It is also found in guardrail posts, railroad ties and pilings. On Jan. 1, the state law that allowed disposal of treated wood waste in California landfills expired. As a result, acceptance of treated wood waste at the Kiefer Landfill – and for landfills across the state – was suspended.

The Sacramento County Department of

Waste Management and Recycling applied for and received a variance from the state to accept the material.

Customers are asked to keep treated wood waste separate from any other items in their load. Regular Kiefer Landfill facility fees will apply.

Commercial haulers are required to obtain a California Department of Toxic Substances variance. For information, visit the Department of Toxic Substance Control website.

**SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG)** - Public safety dispatchers, often the first assistance people reach in an emergency, provide a crucial link between the California Highway Patrol (CHP) and the public. California legislation enacted in 2020 reclassified public safety dispatchers as "first responders." The new classification acknowledges their vital role in the state's emergency response chain.

"As recognized first responders in California, our CHP public safety dispatchers and operators remain resilient in times of crisis," CHP Commissioner Amanda Ray said. "They are devoted professionals who provide the timely handling of all calls for services and are the lifeline between the public and emergency services."


The CHP employs more than 700 dispatchers who provide critical services to communities

throughout California. In 2020, these dispatchers who work out of one of the 24 CHP communications centers statewide handled more than 4.9 million 9-1-1 calls from the public.

In emergency situations, dispatchers must instantly determine the correct response to ensure the safety of all parties involved. They are also in constant communication with patrol officers, looking up license plates, driver license numbers, and running criminal record checks on wanted subjects.

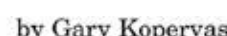

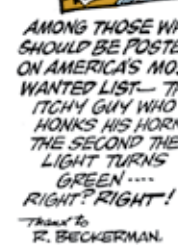

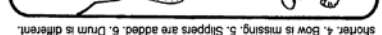

# Mayor Addresses Councilmember’s Reecent Controversial Comments

CITRUS HEIGHTS, CA (MPG) - At the Citrus Heights City Council budget study session on April 8, City Manager Chris Boyd asked Councilmember Tim Schaefer to clarify his prior comments (from February 11) that he believed the serious budget issues were presented as retaliation for voters not passing Measure M – the sales tax increase that would have brought additional revenue to Citrus Heights to fund city improvements and staff salaries at the Police Department and City Hall. Councilmember Bret Daniels objected to the

question, calling it “highly improper dialogue,” and the meeting moved on without an answer from Councilmember Schaefer. Mayor Steve Miller offered a statement on April 9, addressing the issue: “Despite consistent and comprehensive budget updates and materials provided by city staff, Councilmember Schaefer has made multiple false accusations of inaccurate financial reporting and ‘reprisatory and misleading’ action by city staff in response to the failure of Measure M. Not only are Councilmember Schaefer’s comments false, these unfounded allegations have the dangerous potential to erode the trust of our community that we value and work hard to diligently protect.” Mayor Miller further stated, “I fully support City Manager Boyd asking clarifying questions during the budget study session in order to publicly correct Schaefer’s irresponsible and false accusations.” During the study session, the

Mayor had agreed that the improper dialogue needed to stop, but he clarified that the comment “was directed at Councilmember Schaefer.” He wrote, “As Mayor of the City of Citrus Heights, I will not stand for the continued disparagement of our City Manager and hardworking staff, a team of highly dedicated individuals who genuinely care about our community.” “Our current budget situation has been forecasted since our city’s incorporation, and despite this long known monumental challenge, City Manager Boyd has worked relentlessly to lead our city through this critical time.” “I ask Councilmember Schaefer to cease his reckless and false allegations so that we can focus on the critical task at hand of continued fiscal prudence.” The Citrus Heights Messenger reached out to Councilmember Schaefer for comment, but no response was received by press time. ★
