**CITRUS HEIGHTS, CA (MPG)** - Cory and Gina Dewees, owners of Parrotopia at 5910 Auburn Boulevard, Suite 9 in Citrus Heights welcomed and sheltered parrots in their home for years before opening their Citrus Heights store last February.

Their store, which celebrated its first anniversary, is a place "where a parrot will always have a second home."

The couple, young parents of an active two-year-old son, were past volunteers at Parrot Planet, located in the same business plaza which closed in December 2018.

The closure of Parrot Planet left local parrot and exotic bird owners with just The Bird Shop in Roseville

as their only other alternative for food, grooming and supplies, she said.

"Northern California is home to a large parrot and exotic bird population," Dewees said. "We wanted to create a new business which would share our love for these birds as we welcomed our new customers."

Parrotopia is a family-owned business, with both co-owners committed to the well-being of their feathered friends and responsible parrot ownership. Colorful parrots regularly take in the action from the owner's shoulders as customers browse the store.



"Our vision was to specialize in the supplies and services both owners and potential parrot owners need, always keeping in mind that we are advocates of the parrot first," she said.

Parrotopia offers a variety of hand-fed baby parrots and "second-chance"

## SacRT Survey Asks for Community Feedback to Plan for Future Service

**SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG)** - The Sacramento Regional Transit District (SacRT) is asking for feedback from the public to help plan future transit service by taking a brief online survey. Travel patterns and work schedules have changed over the last year, and SacRT is gauging rider and community interest in riding transit as more vaccines become available and COVID-19 cases drop. SacRT will use the data to help update its Short Range Transit Plan, and planning standards and metrics for measuring success on the system overall.

The online survey is available at [sacrt.com/survey](https://sacrt.com/survey) and will be open until Monday, March 29, 2021. Survey participants have chance to win a gift card, SacRT swag or a monthly transit pass.

The COVID-19 pandemic has demonstrated the vital role public transit has played in the Sacramento region for continuing to get people to essential jobs, medical facilities, grocery stores and other services. SacRT has been operating at approximately 100% pre-COVID service levels since the end of August 2020 to reduce transportation barriers and ensure equitable transit for disadvantaged and underserved communities. SacRT is planning on expanding three SmarT Ride service zones in April and is monitoring school district plans for in-person learning to resume bus service for students.

In September 2020, SacRT conducted a two-week online rider survey on transit ridership during the COVID-19 pandemic. As a result, 313 total responses were provided on how they have been affected and their current and future plans for transit use. ## Council Approves \$10,000 for Chamber of Commerce Sponsorship

**CITRUS HEIGHTS, CA (MPG)** - At the March 11 meeting, the Citrus Heights City Council considered granting a \$10,000 sponsorship to the Citrus Heights Chamber of Commerce. Meghan Huber, economic development and communications manager for the City of Citrus Heights, explained that the money would come from the City's Economic Development Support Fund, which is designed to fund activities that "further our goals of diversifying our local economy and growing our business community."

The Economic Development Support Fund is allocated \$150,000 annually from the General Fund, and the current funding has already

been accounted for in the 2020-2021 Budget. The Chamber submits one of the few consistent annual requests for funding from the Economic Development Support Fund, and the City has partnered with the Chamber for the last six years as a diamond-level sponsor.

In 2020, the Chamber's top goals were to hire an executive director, increase membership, increase member participation, increase communication with members, increase the number of directors on the Board, and create a signature event for the Chamber. "Then COVID hit and just turned our world upside down. ... But the Chamber did not turn upside down," said Diane Ebbitt-Riehle,

who was hired as the Chamber's interim executive director last April.

Despite the challenges, Ebbitt-Riehle said the Chamber met almost all their objectives. During the pandemic, the Chamber welcomed 31 new members and the Board of Directors increased from 9 to 13 members. The Chamber improved communication with members by launching a weekly COVID update and a weekly Chamber newsletter, in addition to virtual events and luncheons that kept Chamber members involved and engaged.

Ebbitt-Riehle also listed a variety of Chamber events and fundraisers planned for 2021. Upcoming events include the Best of Citrus Heights and a drive-in concert at

Sunrise Mall. Voting for the Best of Citrus Heights will run from April 1 through May 31, with winners announced June 8. The drive-in concert, featuring Journey Revisited, is scheduled for May 22, pending County approval. All money raised from the concert will be used to fund a grant program to help local businesses affected by the pandemic.

Mayor Steve Miller said, "The fact that you've been advocating and fighting for our small businesses explains why, during COVID, you've had an increase in membership and interest." He urged residents looking for services to check the Chamber's website for listings: "Let's take care of our businesses and help them get back on their feet."

parrots that are seeking new homes. Many of these birds come to the Dewees because their owners can no longer care for their feathered friend, or they outlived their owners.

The owners try to match their “second-chance” birds to a new owner based on the positive aspects of their past environment.

This process consists of whether the bird has a gender preference, has been raised with children or pets, or has been an “only bird.” Finding the right second home might depend if the bird has always had someone home all day, had behavior issues, or was kept in a bird room or outside aviary.

“We want to help new parrot owners with the commitment they are about to make,” she said. “It’s not just the honeymoon phase where they’ll walk in and fall in love with one, and then want to take it home. It takes multiple visits to allow both bird and human to fully bond.”

Parrotopia provides one-on-one educational information on interpreting parrot behavior and body language, valuable tips to choose the right parrot species for the family, and practical advice on day-to-day exotic diet and nutrition. Both online ordering and curbside pickup are available.

Parrots and exotic birds tend to thrive in an enriching, stimulating environment, Dewees explained.

“We also have one of Northern

California's largest selection of toys and other bird-related products, most which are custom made by local artisans,” she said. “We also have a large selection of cages, locally made custom play stands, carriers, and nesting boxes.”

Parrotopia also offers its customers both “fresh chop,” a finely-chopped mix of cooked and uncooked food such as vegetables, grains and seeds and their very own signature feed blends, which are available either pre-packaged or in bulk.

While Parrotopia does not groom or work on beaks, it does offer a “birdie spa” to its feathery customers. A wing refresh is \$10 for any size bird. The price for a nail trim is \$7 for small birds including parakeets, cockatiels and lovebirds; \$10 for medium birds including African Greys, Amazons and small Macaws. Pricing for larger birds including Macaws, large Cockatoos, larger Amazons and Hyacinth macaws range between \$15 to \$20.

Parrotopia offers bird owners boarding services which provide a safe, stimulating and secure environment while their owners are away.

# Council Approves \$10,000 for Chamber of Commerce Sponsorship

Councilmember Jeannie Bruins applauded the Chamber for the improved level of communication and diligent promotion of members. “The Chamber is looking better than it has in a long time,” she said.

Citrus Heights resident David Warren submitted a public comment on this item, writing, “In light of the City Manager’s recent doomsday forecast of the City’s budget due to the failure to increase municipal sales tax rates, it is hypocritical that any payment, no matter how purportedly meritorious, of municipal funds would be made to the Chamber of Commerce.”

Warren said that the \$150,000 Economic Development Support Fund could pay the salary of a staff member at City Hall or the Police Department, or it could be used to fund needed road repairs. He stated that with the City’s current budget issues, the City should “begin immediately to direct all discretionary revenue to maintain municipal activities and cease funding ancillary activities.”

He also pointed out that the California Chamber of Commerce does not receive funds from the State of California, asking, “Why should the Citrus Heights Chamber ask for a government subsidy? As advocates of private enterprise, the Chamber members should follow their own philosophy and be self-supporting.”

Warren objected to the idea of leaving staff positions vacant while providing funding to other organizations: “If the City has to tighten its belt, it should not be on the backs of our employees.”

Councilmember Jeannie Bruins responded to the public comment: “I don’t think that Mr. Warren recognizes the positive impact. ... It’s not a subsidy, it’s a sponsorship. We get benefits in return for the economic investment we make in the business community through the Chamber of Commerce.”

Councilmember Bret Daniels said the public comment was well taken: “At a time when we’re not filling vacancies, we have budget issues ... we

should really be looking to cut as much as we can.” But he said that with the recent passage of the federal COVID relief bill, the City can expect to receive millions of dollars. “I want people to understand that even though we’ve done some things to kind of prop up our budget recently, it looks like we have relief coming for that.”

Councilmember Daniels agreed “it would not be prudent” to spend that money with the City’s current budget issues, and he wouldn’t support it without the additional funding coming in from the federal government. “The Chamber is extremely important to the City, and so it’s a good partnership. It’s a good use of the funds. But I just want to make sure people understand that money is coming to us, and this is not going to create an additional burden on us.”

Mayor Miller said the City will see “a lot of return on investment” with these funds. The Council voted unanimously to approve the sponsorship. ★

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# Social Security Matters

## Does Paying FICA Tax Now Increase My Benefit?

**Dear Rusty:** If a person retires at age sixty-six and continues to work full time, Social Security taxes are still taken out of his weekly paycheck. Will this taxation for Social Security contribute more to the person’s Social Security benefit, even if already retired?

**Signed: Curious Retiree**

**Dear Curious Retiree:** Since its inception in 1935, Social Security has been a “pay as you go” program where contributions from those who are working are used to pay benefits to those who are collecting Social Security benefits. That remains true even if, after you start collecting Social Security, you work and pay payroll taxes into the system.

Those Social Security (SS) payroll taxes you are contributing now aren’t deposited into a personal account for you, they’re used to help pay benefits to all recipients. So, paying SS FICA payroll taxes after you start collecting benefits doesn’t affect your benefit

payment. However, what might affect your benefit amount is if your current earnings from working are more than any of those in the 35 years used to originally compute your Social Security benefit when you filed.

When you apply for SS benefits, Social Security adjusts every year in your lifetime earnings record for inflation to bring those earlier earnings up to today’s dollar values. They then select the 35 highest-earning years over your entire lifetime, and from those 35 highest-earning years they develop your “Average Indexed Monthly Earnings” (AIME). Your AIME, in turn, is used to compute your Social Security benefit at your full retirement age (FRA).

Social Security examines your earnings every year after your earnings for the previous year are reported to Social Security by the IRS. After your benefits have started, and if your current earnings are higher, Social Security will replace an earlier year’s earnings with your more recent earnings and recompute your benefit, resulting

in a small benefit increase (“small” because it would represent only 1/35th of the average lifetime earnings used to compute your benefit).

A key thing to remember is that each of your past year’s earnings (up until you are 60) are adjusted for inflation before computing your benefit amount. So, for example, \$25,000 earned in 1990 is worth more than \$60,000 in today’s dollars, and it is the inflation-adjusted amount that your current earnings would need to exceed increase in your benefit. 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# Sacramento County DA Reports



**Child Sex Offender with Criminal History Spanning Decades Sentenced to Life**

**PROSECUTOR:** Principal Criminal Attorney Nancy Cochrane, Special Assault & Child Abuse Unit

On February 26, 2021, the Honorable Ernest Sawtelle sentenced Tajmal Sharrieff to 595 years to life in prison. On December 7, 2020, a jury convicted Sharrieff of seven counts of committing a lewd act on a child. It was also found true that Sharrieff has three prior strike convictions.

Sharrieff was found guilty of rape by means of force and assault with intent to commit a felony in Sonoma County and was sentenced to prison in 1982. In those two separate sexual attacks, Sharrieff victimized strangers. In one case, he approached a 13-year-old victim while he was wearing a mask. He threatened to kill her, dragged her down a driveway and raped her. Sharrieff threatened to rape her anally if she did not orally copulate him, so the victim complied. In the other case, Sharrieff wore a mask when he approached a 19-year-old victim and told her not to make a sound or he would kill her. He ordered her to orally copulate him. When the victim refused, Sharrieff began choking her and she started to lose consciousness.

In 1986 in Sacramento County, Sharrieff removed a screen from an apartment window and climbed into a woman’s bedroom while she slept. When she awoke, Sharrieff covered her mouth and told her to be quiet. When the victim managed to scream, Sharrieff fled.

In 2016, the Sacramento County Sheriff’s Office investigated a report that a 15-year-old male had been sexually abused by his mother’s acquaintance, Sharrieff, approximately seven years prior. The victim gave a statement to law enforcement and testified at trial regarding the numerous sexual acts he was made to endure by Sharrieff.

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**Defendant Convicted of Murdering Woman Near American River Bike Trail**

**CASE:** Steven Wilson (Case #20FE001859)  
**PROSECUTOR:** Deputy District Attorney Bret Wasley, Homicide Unit

Steven Wilson was convicted by a jury of the first-degree murder of Lora Hoagland. The jury also found true that Wilson personally used a knife in the commission of the murder.

On January 26, 2020, Ms. Hoagland was on the American River bicycle trail when she encountered Wilson and his ex-girlfriend. Ms. Hoagland appeared to be in distress, so Wilson wrapped his jacket around her, carried her off the bike trail and set her down under the railroad overpass. Without warning, he then pulled out a knife and stabbed Ms. Hoagland in the chest and neck. Ms. Hoagland bled to death at the scene of the crime.

Wilson’s ex-girlfriend reported the crime to the police. The Sacramento Police Department recovered the knife, which had Wilson’s and the victim’s DNA on it. When Wilson was arrested, he had the jacket that he wrapped around the victim with the victim’s blood on it.

Allegations that Wilson has two prior strike convictions for robbery will be determined at sentencing.

Wilson faces a maximum sentence of 61 years to life in prison. Sentencing is set for April 9, 2021, at 9:00 a.m. in Department 10 by the Honorable

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**Defendant Convicted of Pimping, Pandering Charges**

**DATE: February 24, 2021**  
**CASE:** Bruce Anderson (Case #20FE011579)  
**PROSECUTOR:** Deputy District Attorney Bret Wasley, Homicide Unit  
Deputy District Attorney Courtney Martin, Human Trafficking Unit

Bruce Anderson was convicted by a jury of one count of pimping and four counts of pandering charges. An allegation that Anderson suffered a prior strike conviction for first-degree residential burglary was also found true.

In the spring of 2020, Rancho Cordova police officers received a tip that Anderson was engaging in the commercial sexual exploitation of one of the victims. Officers contacted the victim and received information from her that substantiated this tip. Officers also obtained evidence from Anderson’s social media page, which showed him regularly inducing women to engage in prostitution with him serving as their pimp. Anderson has a previous conviction in Washington state for a felony charge of promoting prostitution.

Anderson faces a maximum sentence of 20 years in prison. Sentencing is set for April 30, 2021, at 1:30 p.m. in Department 14 before the Honorable Tami Bogert.

Once when I wore a younger man's suit I would take anything free. I assumed it was my right to get something free. Then I had a conversation with my grandfather. If anybody knew how to squeeze a buffalo out of a nickel, it was my grandfather. But you couldn't trick him by offering him something free. He said to me, "Son, if it's free, it ain't for me." At the time, I just chuckled and fluffed off this advice. After all, if I'm offered something free I'm going to jump and even dance to get it. I would see a free offer in the newspaper and immediately cut it out and send it in and wait for that free offer to come. But then came the Internet, and everything has changed. When I first started seeing these "free" offers, I jumped at the opportunity. After all, it was the Internet, and you didn't have to spend any money on postage. After all, you can trust the Internet. Pretty soon, those sunny days were overcome by a dark cloud of rain and thunderstorms. In checking my bank account, I noticed some suspicious withdrawals on my account. I thought maybe I

# No Borders, No Country

Before the lockdown left took a wrecking ball to our economy last year, we were enjoying one of the greatest expansions of economic opportunity in our lifetimes. Unemployment was at its lowest rate in 50 years, the poverty rate was at its lowest in 60 years. Wage growth was the strongest in 40 years. The wage gap was narrowing for the first time in many years, as blue-collar wages increased dramatically. The unemployment rate for women was the lowest in 70 years. For African Americans, Hispanic Americans and Asian Americans, veterans and disabled Americans, and those without a high school diploma, unemployment was the lowest ever recorded.

The tax and regulatory relief Republicans won in 2017 and 2018 explain much of this success, but something else was going on that caused the extraordinary improvement of wages for unskilled and low-skilled workers. The Trump Administration restored control of our borders and stemmed the flood of low-wage labor that had been suppressing American workers' wages for decades.

Big business and big agriculture hated Trump's immigration policy because it forced them to pay their workers higher wages. But in the growing economy it produced, working Americans who had been left behind for decades finally began to prosper.

Did we learn anything from this unprecedented blue-collar boom? Apparently not, judging from the Democrats' zeal to open our borders to new waves of illegal immigration.

The President's executive orders have already produced

a new migrant crisis on the southern border.

One abandoned the border wall in mid-construction. Another undermines the long-standing requirement that immigrants support themselves and not burden American taxpayers. Another ends the remain-in-Mexico policy for those making asylum claims, most of which are false. Yet another effectively releases illegal immigrants accompanied by youths under age 18 directly into the United States. Another grants what amounts to sanctuary status for a wide variety of criminal offenses including drunk driving and sex offenses. Another restores unrestricted travel from hot beds of international terrorism. The worst orders ICE not to deport illegal immigrants for 100 days. That order, now enjoined by a federal judge, begs the question, "What is the difference between abolishing ICE and forbidding it to do its job?"

Customs and Border Protection agents report that in the last month the daily incursion on the southern border has nearly doubled from 2,000 a day to 3,500 a day. The number of illegal immigrants encountered on the southern border during the first four months of the last fiscal year was nearly 165,000. That number has nearly doubled this year to more than 295,000.

Every American needs to clearly understand what this means to their lives, their families, their communities and their future.

How are American workers helped by flooding the labor market with another wave of illegal immigration?

How are our children – who have been robbed of an entire year of their educations – helped by filling their classrooms with non-English

speaking classmates?

How are our streets made safer by allowing aliens who drive drunk to remain on our roads rather than to be arrested and placed in removal proceedings?

How is our nation made safer by reopening virtually unrestricted travel with nations that foster terrorism?

How are our communities made safer by making it harder to deport criminal illegal aliens and gang members?

How are our hospitals made more accessible by overwhelming emergency rooms with illegal immigrants demanding care?

Why would our own government pursue policies that strike most acutely and painfully at American's working families – especially now, when those families are reeling from the effects of a year of oppressive lockdowns? Those blue-collar workers who made the greatest gains during the Trump economic expansion are the most harmed by reversing the immigration enforcement that produced it.

And let us not forget the millions of legal immigrants who obeyed our laws, respected our nation's sovereignty, waited patiently, and did everything our country asked of them – they too are made victims of the Democrats' pursuit of open borders.

Without enforcement of our immigration laws, our borders become meaningless. And if our borders are meaningless, then America ceases to be a nation and instead becomes a vast international territory between Canada and Mexico. It is becoming increasingly clear that this is the ultimate objective of the left, and the only force that can stop them now is the American people at the ballot box. ★



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Sacramento County Main Jail Expansion Plan Cancelled

Cutting in Line Sets Back COVID-19 Vaccinations

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Wednesday March 10th, in a 4-1 vote the Board of Supervisors denied the county staff's recommendation to approve a \$10 million Kitchell Construction contract, which would have continued the process of building a \$200+ Million jail annex. The motion was brought by Supervisor Serna, seconded by Supervisor Nottoli, and Supervisors Kennedy and Desmond supported; Supervisor Frost was the sole objector.

Instead, the Board will "recalibrate" their approach to meeting the consent decree requirements, starting with an in-depth examination of how to change the culture and behaviors that resulted in the consent decree mandates. The County's Public Information Officer Kim Nava told Fox40 that the general plan will be "reducing the jail population," which is what the

Mays v. Sacramento consent decree recommends as the more cost effective way to meet its terms.

More than two dozen live public commenters, over 100 email comments, and nearly 700 petition signatures all opposed the new jail building that advocates argued would have ensured the continued incarceration of people living with mental illness and disabilities, devastating the county's General Fund for decades to come.

Tifanei Ressler-Moyer, a founding member of Decarcerate Sacramento and a former staff attorney with Disability Rights California, along with Dr. Christina Bourne, a physician who has worked inside Sacramento's Main Jail, presented evidence that expansion of current infrastructure only makes more space for bad behavior, no matter how state-of-the-art. They say only a comprehensive systems approach will transform medical and mental healthcare policies inside the jail, and promote accountability for

all.

"We are committed to improving jail conditions and doing so as quickly as possible," said Supervisor Nottoli Wednesday, marking a commitment to meeting the Mays consent decree and a realization that a new building would not improve the way people are treated in the jails.

"This is a historic moment for our community and for our loved ones inside the county jails. It's promising to see the board commit to real accountability and change as we move towards building a more humane and equitable Sacramento" said Jael Barnes, an organizer with Decarcerate Sacramento.

"Weeks, months, and years of organizing went into this victory. In less than two years, we stopped two different jail expansion projects from moving forward in Sacramento County" said Liz Blum. "Our coalition continues to fight for the decrease of jail populations and the shift of county funding priorities towards vital community-based care." ★

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Just like you wear a mask to protect others from getting COVID-19, it is vitally important that we vaccinate those at highest risk for severe infection or to prevent outbreaks in vulnerable populations and disruptions to our essential services due to sickness and virus transmission.

The State worked with a group of public health experts to create a vaccination plan for California to prioritize groups to protect the healthcare system first, and then move to vaccinating those 65 years old and older who are the most vulnerable among us and experience severe complications, hospitalizations and death due to COVID-19. As of late February, among those ages 0-59, there are 76,700 cases and of those 178 deaths, compared to 16,300 cases for those ages 60-80+ years old, there are 1,285 deaths.

Data clearly show the death toll on our older adults: 0-59 years: 178 deaths from 76,700 total cases; 60-80+ years: 1,285 deaths from 16,300 total cases.

With the extremely limited vaccine supply, Sacramento County Public Health and healthcare partners are working to vaccinate those 65 years and older, and we are also vaccinating essential worker groups in Phase 1b, Tier 1, such as teachers and first responders. Only the groups who meet the criteria to be vaccinated should sign up for appointments. The next Sacramento County group in Phase 1b, Tier 1 vaccination group are workers in the food and agriculture industry – slated for mid-March.

Cutting in Line - We know many want the vaccine as soon as possible to get back to a

pre-COVID-19 lifestyle, but when someone books a vaccination appointment under false pretenses, that is one less appointment for someone who does qualify – setting the entire plan back.

Vaccination sites require a photo ID with address and date of birth to verify qualifying age and that you live in Sacramento County for the 65 years and over group. For those who work in Sacramento County, the vaccination sites require work identification to verify the essential worker group qualification in the current Sacramento County COVID-19 Vaccination Distribution Schedule.

Those who take an appointment and do not meet the criteria will have their appointment canceled or will be turned away on-site and will not be vaccinated. Taking vaccination appointment slots from others slows the vaccination process down for everyone in our community. If you don't qualify and someone offers you an appointment link or it's been shared on a social media network – don't do it – you will not be vaccinated – it wastes your time, staff time and everyone's in line, and, most importantly, you will have taken one of a precious few appointments from someone in our community who does meet criteria.

"Sacramento County is beginning to receive more allocations of COVID-19 vaccines from the State, which will allow us to vaccinate those in our community at highest risk and offer more vaccination appointments to those who meet criteria. In the near future, we will offer appointments to additional groups with the goal of keeping the community healthy and safely opening more business

sectors," said, Sacramento County Health Officer, Dr. Olivia Kasirye.

Please ensure that you meet the criteria before signing up for a COVID-19 vaccination appointment, by checking the Sacramento County COVID-19 Vaccination Distribution Schedule.

For those ages 65 and up who live in Sacramento County, learn about available vaccination appointments.

Qualified Vaccination Appointments - For those who meet the vaccination group criteria and have an appointment, please eat, hydrate and take regularly prescribed medication prior to arriving to receive your vaccination.

At your appointment, staff will verify that you live or work in a qualified worker group in Sacramento County, as well as your age for those 65 years and older, and you will be asked about allergies and some other questions. After the vaccination, you will be monitored for severe reactions by medical staff from 15-30 minutes per your applicable allergy history. Depending on the vaccination site, your second dose appointment will be scheduled at the time of your first, and some sites will notify you about a week before the second dose is due or provide you with contact information to make a second dose appointment.

The timing for second doses is three weeks after the first dose for Pfizer and four weeks for Moderna – however, for either vaccine, the CDC allows up to six weeks between the first and second dose, if a delay cannot be avoided.
