Blue Star Moms Host Drive-thru Fundraiser

CITRUS HEIGHTS, CA (MPG) - Members of the Sacramento Blue Star Moms are teaming up with the Texas Roadhouse restaurant at 6309 Sunrise Boulevard in Citrus Heights to host a "drive-thru" dinner fundraiser on Tuesday, March 16 from 5 to 7 p.m. with half of the money raised to help provide care packages to service members deployed worldwide.

Dinner includes BBQ ribs and BBQ chicken, coleslaw, corn, fresh baked bread, bottled water and a cookie for \$20. Reservations are required and pre-payment through the Sacramento Blue Star Moms website at www.sacramentobluestarmoms.org/ with Venmo or Paypal is recommended, said the group's fundraising chair Dana Caldwell.

"The public may also pick up their meals on the day of the event with cash, check or Venmo," she said. Caldwell said when she was interviewed some 60 people had already reserved a meal for pickup. A flyer promoting the event was distributed to the Citrus Heights American Legion post and other civic groups in the city, she said.

Debbie Konvalin, president of the Sacramento Blue Star Moms, said, proceeds from the fundraiser will help to offset the cost of postage need to send support packages to deployed military personnel.

"We'll ship medium-sized boxes in April. Our total postage for sending 200 packages is close to \$3,000. We budget over \$20,000 for shipping CARE packages per year," she said.

In addition to monetary donations,

Konvalin said donations of individual personal-sized items are still being accepted. "We are accepting items such as socks, puzzle books and small games, magazines, batteries and other non-perishable items," she said. Contact support@sacramentobluestarmoms.org for more specific information on what items are needed and where to drop them off.

The Sacramento Blue Star Moms mail CARE Packages to deployed US Service Members approximately three times a year. CARE packages are filled with individual-sized items typically carried in a service member's backpack.

"In April, we hope to send 200 CARE packages," Konvalin said. "Our annual goal has been to send between 1,200 to 1,500 boxes per year. Since

San Juan Unified Issues Reduced Delay for COVID-19

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - More progress in Sacramento County's steady march to the red tier of the state's COVID-19 risk assessment with the adjusted case rate falling to 12 per 100,000 residents and the testing positivity rate, adjusted for equity, at 6.6 percent. This puts the testing positivity marker in the range needed for the County to advance to the red tier once case rates fall further.

San Juan Unified announces reduced delay once red tier reached and sets April 5 as latest date to return grades TK-6 to in-person learning

This week, district officials announced that a new agreement had been reached with the San Juan Teachers Association providing for the option to return to in-person learning in a hybrid format for all grade levels once Sacramento County has been in the red tier for five days. A previous agreement had provided for a 14-day waiting period in the red tier in alignment with health guidance in effect when the prior agreement was made. The new agreement also sets April 5 as the date for grades TK through 5 and self-contained 6th grade classrooms to offer the option to return to in-person learning. Early childhood education programs will offer a return to in-person learning no later than April 12.

Students in 6th grade classrooms at K-8 schools and middle schools that switch classes throughout the day cannot be offered the option to return to in-person learning until Sacramento County is in the red tier.

According to the new update:

If Sacramento County enters the Red Tier on March 23, then Early Childhood Education (infant/toddler and pre-school) return to in person on... **April 12**; K-5 and Self-Contained 6th grade return to in-person on... **April 5**; and

DA: Let's All Remember the Victims of Crime

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - Sacramento County District Attorney Anne Marie Schubert announces the "2021: Year for Victims" campaign to recognize victims of crime and ensure that they are not forgotten by the criminal justice system, legislators, public officials, the media or the community.

The campaign will be rolled-out on a local, state and national level and led, in part, by a coalition representing the voices of

victims and survivors.

Called "Voices for Victims," the coalition consists of members who have their own personal experience with the criminal justice system and have demonstrated a steadfast commitment to achieving justice for themselves or a loved one. It also includes community leaders who advocate for victims of violent crime. Coalition members are: Dr. Nicole Clavo - People v. Lindsey; Karen Johnson - People v. Winnett; Rachelle Dittmore - Co-Founder, City of Refuge; Joyce Bilyeu - Director of Client Services, Family Justice Center; Misty Foster - Chapter Leader, Sacramento Chapter of Parents of Murdered Children (POMC); Mervin Brookins - Co-Founder & CEO, Brother to Brother; Nina Acosta - Program Manager, District Attorney Victim Witness Program.

The coalition's mission is to ensure that in the pursuit of criminal justice reform the survivors are not forgotten, and the voices of victims are heard. Members serve as liaisons and advocates for victims by sharing their personal stories and supporting legislation, enforcement, funding and resources that will help victims obtain justice.

The website www.VoicesforVictims.org was created to provide more

information about the coalition and its members as well as videos and resources.

Other components of the campaign will include a broad, coordinated social media campaign and an online book highlighting "Profiles in Courage." These profiles will shine a spotlight on the long journey victims, survivors and advocates must travel in obtaining justice.

DA Anne Marie Schubert states, "As District Attorney, I strongly support measured criminal justice reforms that reduce recidivism and enhance public safety. However, improvements to the system can be accomplished without wholesale abandonment of victims or their right to be heard. Through this coalition, we hope to ensure that when public safety policy decisions are being made, the voices of victims will neither be silenced nor ignored." ★

Gallagher Introduces Bill to Protect Free Speech on Social Media

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Assemblyman James Gallagher (R-Yuba City), along with coauthor Kevin Kiley (R-Rocklin), announced AB 1114, which would define social media platforms as “public forums”, essentially applying the First Amendment protections to social media platforms.
AB 1114 would prevent social media platforms such as Facebook, YouTube or Twitter from removing or manipulating any content unless it was unprotected

speech under the First Amendment. Platforms would still be able to remove content such as pornography, incitements to violence or obscenities.
Gallagher said, “Social Media platforms are today’s version of a public square. User’s speech on these platforms should be protected under the First Amendment just like it would if they were speaking in a public space. Canceling people and views, in addition to being Orwellian, is contributing to further polarization in our politics today.”

SMUD Extends Suspension of Power Shutoffs for Non-payment Through June 30, 2021

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - In response to the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic and growing economic challenges, SMUD announced it will extend the suspension of disconnecting power due to non-payment for residential and commercial customers through June 30, 2021, at the earliest.
“We stand by our community during these tough times,” said SMUD CEO and General Manager Paul Lau. “This prolonged pandemic has put a strain on our local economy and we’re committed to ensuring that ALL customers have safe and reliable power as we work through these unprecedented times.”
The suspension of power disconnection due to non-payment began March 13, 2020 and will last through June 30, 2021, at the earliest, as SMUD continues to monitor the evolving situation.
Customers who are behind on payment will still owe SMUD for service, they will just not lose power at this time. Customers are encouraged to contact SMUD to make payment arrangements or to enquire about energy assistance rates and other programs.
Since March, SMUD has suspended power shutoffs for non-payment and late fees, as well as adjusted its low-income rate so more people can qualify. SMUD is also offering flexible payment arrangement options.
In the midst of this COVID-19 pandemic, SMUD has taken a number of actions to keep its employees and the community safe. As an essential service provider, SMUD is proactively minimizing risk to employees to ensure reliable electric service and is asking the public to abide by the social distancing guidelines and not approach work crews. Learn to Pray and Heal, A Spiritual Adventure

After traveling the world for a year and hiking extensively in the Himalayas, he came to Boston in 2008 to work for his church, The First Church of Christ, Scientist. Since then, he has served in many capacities and is now serving as one of a number of authorized lecturers. He has shared the Good News at jails, rehab centers and interfaith-events. He's also been widely involved in composing, producing and performing Christian music. Experiencing firsthand the healing power of Love is Nate's favorite thing. It's what makes him tick. The healing work occurred in the jails, he shares, "... Like in the case of an inmate I worked with. As I shared the basics

of Christian Science with him he said it all sounded great but he was just a bad person. He seemed pretty convinced that healing wasn't for him. But as we talked about the fact that he wasn't defined by his past, but by God, his source, who is completely good, I could tell his thought about himself was changing. And then he wanted more. So he took a copy of the Bible and Mary Baker Eddy's book, Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures, back to his cell and started to dive into these books. Six or seven weeks later, I ran into him again and he told me that he'd been healed of a serious illness – just from studying the Bible and Science and Health. His study helped him grasp God and his life in a new way and his disease was cured." In my lecture, titled "Learn to Pray and Heal: A Spiritual Adventure", I'll share more about the fundamentals of effective prayer, as I've learned from studying Christian Science, as well as how healing is truly possible for everyone. State Announces Changes to when Counties can reach the Red Tier
The state's COVID-19 risk assessment system places each county on a colored tier based on their COVID-19 case rate per 100,000 residents and the testing positivity rate. To reach the red tier, counties currently must have fewer than 7 cases per 100,000 residents and a testing positivity rate less than 8.0 percent. On Wednesday, March 3, Governor Gavin Newsom announced plans to adjust the case rate requirements for the red tier once the state has been able to provide 2

million doses of COVID-19 vaccine to residents in the state's most disadvantaged zip codes. Once that marker has been reached, expected in the coming weeks, counties will only need to have a case rate of 10 per 100,000 or less to move to the red tier if they also meet the testing positivity requirement of 8 percent or less. This development could potentially speed up when Sacramento County reaches the red tier. District staff will continue to monitor developments.
Vaccinations Continue at Strong Pace
San Juan Unified hosted a second COVID-19 vaccination clinic in partnership with Dignity Health, UC Davis Health, and Sacramento County Public Health last weekend. Approximately 2,700 individuals were able to receive their first dose of the Pfizer vaccine at the event with the majority of those being educators. Unfortunately, vaccine supplies are not available to offer a third clinic this weekend. Additional events will be held as supplies allow.
Football, Water Polo, Baseball and more Set to Play
With the COVID-19 case rate falling below 14 per 100,000 residents in Sacramento County, additional sports are now authorized to not only engage in conditioning and practices but also competitions. Sports considered outdoor high contact sports (football and water polo) require weekly COVID-19 testing of all student athletes and coaches. The district will be providing this testing at no cost to help ensure the safety of our student athletes and coaches. Following state health directives to maintain physical distancing efforts, only a limited number of immediate family members will be allowed in attendance at athletic events. ★

Another Chance to Act on Housing

When he was running for governor three years ago, Gavin Newsom promised, rather absurdly, that he would spearhead a drive to build 3.5 million new housing units by 2025.

It was absurd because it would require California to escalate new construction from about 100,000 units a year to 500,000, which would be financially and physically impossible.

Once elected, Newsom backed away from that pledge, calling it “aspirational,” but he did attempt, a year ago, to once again focus attention on the state’s housing crisis by devoting nearly all of his State of the State address to it and the closely related homelessness issue.

Within weeks, however, his attention shifted to the COVID-19 pandemic and housing went on the Capitol’s back burner.

Meanwhile, California’s housing shortage has gotten significantly worse. This month, Newsom’s Department of Finance revealed that just 102,800 residential building permits were issued in 2020, down 8.8% from 2019’s total, which itself was a 3.8% drop from 2018.

Not only is overall construction headed the wrong

way, but all of last year’s decline was in apartments and other forms of multi-family housing where shortages are the worst. Moreover, when housing lost to fires, old age and other causes is included in the equation, the net gain last year was only about 75,000 units, under half of the state’s official yearly goal.

The cold fact that housing construction is headed the wrong way, and that housing shortages and high housing costs are feeding a high poverty rate and pushing employers and workers out of the state doesn’t seem to be having much effect on the Capitol.

Newsom and other politicians talk a good game, but don’t back up their words with action. What happened, or didn’t happen, to last year’s major housing bill is a telling example.

The measure, carried by Senate President Pro Tem Toni Atkins, was a modest stab at the housing issue’s biggest roadblock – the not-in-my-backyard attitudes in local communities. The bill would have made it easier to build duplexes and other low-impact multi-family projects on lots zoned for single-family homes.

Atkins’ measure cleared the Senate easily and had enough votes to pass the Assembly. However, due to conflict between Atkins and Assembly Speaker Anthony Rendon over legislative procedures, it was held in the Assembly on the last night of the session until just minutes before the midnight deadline, leaving too little time for a final Senate vote.

Newsom could have intervened in the petty squabble to get the bill to his desk, but didn’t, for reasons best known to himself.

The Legislature is back in session and its leaders and Newsom have another opportunity to match their words on the housing shortage with action – or not.

Atkins has introduced a new version of her failed bill, now known as Senate Bill 9, and others have proposed measures to speed up construction, most notably a four-bill package by Sen. Scott Wiener. The San Francisco Democrat has emerged as the Legislature’s leading housing advocate with a willingness to challenge the reluctance of many cities to build their fare share of low- and moderate-income housing.

The most important of the four is Senate Bill 478, which would neutralize local ordinances that effectively prevent construction of multi-family projects on land zoned for them by imposing unworkable land-to-building ratios.

The Atkins and Wiener bills challenge local governments’ much-cherished powers over land use, which is the most contentious but most important piece of the housing conundrum. They also will test the willingness of California’s political leadership to do something more than talk about the crisis.

New Lines to Draw at Clines Lines

CITRUS HEIGHTS, CA (MPG) - Clines Lines, a well-known pinstripping shop at 6001 Auburn Boulevard in Citrus Heights has experienced a “changing of the brush” as the talented brushes of long-time owner Mike Clines have been passed on to Dillon Proctor, 28, now in charge of day-to-day business operations.

Automotive, bike shops, and do-it-yourself car and motorcycle mechanics use paint pinstripping, a very thin decorative line of paint to create their own custom look on automotive bodies and parts.

“I couldn’t think of a more qualified and talented artist than Dillon to pass Clines Lines on to, as I’ve stepped back,” Clines said in a telephone interview.

“I told him about two years ago, the business is yours, and I’m going home,” Clines said. “I raised five children as a professional striper. I was reaching the end of my professional career, and just decided to slow down.”

Clines has a paint desk at the Citrus Heights shop when he chooses to stop by. He said he now enjoys being at home and caring for his wife Cindy.

“I recognized early on when Dillon came in with his parents at age 15 that he had an

incredible amount of talent and natural creativity,” Clines said.

The apprentice is now the master. What professional qualities define Proctor as a striper?

“Patience, practice, creativity and skill,” Proctor said. “Before I even pick up the brushes, I like to listen and work collaboratively with my customers on their ideas.”

Clines Lines is decidedly “old-school,” hand painting each line design on projects that range from commercial vehicles to hot rods, with care and plenty of time to paint each, and every design.

The shop has weathered the recent pandemic downturn, growing as it always has, Proctor said, through word of mouth, as customers discover just what Clines Lines can offer.

“We tend to see one to two cars a week and a lot of Harley-Davidson enthusiasts stopping by who wish to personalize their rides,” Proctor said.

The cost of an individual pinstripping project generally varies with the complexity of the project and the number of colors to be included in the eventual design.

“I’ll start with a general sketch first and then suggest specific colors to the customer. “We’ll build out our ideas from there into a final design for their approval,” Proctor said.

While skateboards and motorcycle fuel tanks are popular requests, others have wanted home appliances and ceiling fan blades customized with his striping expertise.

And the most unusual pinstripping request Proctor has received?

“We had a customer come in and ask to have his prosthetic leg pinstriped. It’s a one of a kind.”

Clines grew up in Long Beach. He first earned money as a striper in the mid-late 1950s and 1960s in his teens while watching and learning

from many of the early legends including Von Dutch – in what became known as the golden age of customizing cars.

He hung up his brushes in 1968 when he was drafted and called to duty in Vietnam. Upon his return to the states, and a welcome typical of the times, Clines decided to spend some time in Vancouver, Canada. He later settled in the Sacramento area in 1992 when he opened his Citrus Heights shop.

Clines was a frequent featured striper at the Sacramento Autorama, one of the most popular auto shows known on the West Coast. He and some of the best award-winning stripers in the country regularly applied their brushes to panels, cell phones, laptops and just anything enthusiasts might tend to bring them in return for a charitable donation.

Dillon has honored Clines with a tattoo caricature of him on his shoulder. “I’m touched and honored that he did that,” Clines said.

Rich Newey, owner of Route 40 Classics, a classic car restoration and repair shop, at 6008 Auburn Boulevard in the site of one of the city’s historic commercial landmarks: the former Angelo Orsi Olive Oil Company building is a frequent referral source and a past customer. When Newey’s shop opened, Proctor pinstriped his office ceiling fans.

“Clines Lines is especially creative, and they do fantastic work. I highly recommend them to all our customers,” Newey said.

“Both Mike and Dillon do an excellent job of interpreting what their clients are looking for. I wish Dillon much success as he carries the shop forward,” Newey said.

Q&A with City Engineer Leslie Blomquist on New City-Wide Trail

City of Citrus Heights

CITRUS HEIGHTS, CA (MPG) - What is the Arcade-Cripple Creek Trail Project?

The Arcade-Cripple Creek Trail Project is a 2.9-mile proposed multi-use trail that largely follows an existing Sacramento Municipal Utility District (SMUD) electric transmission corridor. The trail will span between the Arcade Creek Park Preserve to the west and Wachtel Way to the east, crossing over Arcade Creek and Cripple Creek.

This project will provide connections between eight community parks (including the new Mitchell Village Park), several schools, shopping centers, and neighborhoods along the corridor. This effort is part of the City's overall goal to increase walkability and safety, and provide improvements for pedestrians and bicyclists throughout a system of creekside trails, passive open space, and parks.

This project is a partnership between the City of Citrus Heights, Sunrise Recreation and Park District (SRPD), Orangevale Recreation and Park District (OVPD), San Juan Unified School District (SJUSD), Sacramento County, and SMUD.

What is the project timeline and next steps?

The project is currently in the final design and property owner coordination phase. The City has hired a consultant team, led by GHD, to assist in this phase of the project. Trail construction is anticipated in 2021/2022.

What percent of the overall funding for the project is

coming from the City's general fund?

None. The Arcade-Cripple Creek Trail project is primarily funded by grant funds, with an approximate 10-12% match coming from local transportation funds.

What are some of the safety elements of this project?

While in this final design phase, we are thinking through lighting, open sight distances, fencing, and landscaping options to provide safety along the trail, while balancing impacts on the community. We will be upgrading the bridge in the Sundance Natural Area over Arcade Creek, as it is outdated by both Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) standards and FEMA floodway design criteria. We are also installing a new bridge over Cripple Creek in the Woodside Open Space. Both bridges will provide accessibility, allow a clear passage for wildlife and debris in the creek, reduce flood risks, and more.

Are there concerns related to homeless camps along the trail?

Questions around homeless

camps and safety should be directed to the Citrus Heights Police Department. However, we know that in general the homeless population prefers to be in areas that are hidden from public view. Currently, portions of the Arcade-Cripple Creek Trail corridor are overgrown or otherwise not visible to the general public which can result in homeless camps or other related activities. The construction of the Arcade-Cripple Creek Trail will reduce overgrown vegetation and introduce legitimate trail users to the corridor which will discourage homeless activity. In addition, by improving the trail the Citrus Heights Police Department, Sacramento Sheriff's Department, and the Fulton-El Camino Recreation and Park District's Police Division will have improved access to the corridor allowing regular patrols and improved ability to respond.

In 2013, Sunrise Recreation and Park District constructed the Arcade Creek Park Preserve including a 1/3-mile multi-use trail. The park was constructed on land that was formerly overgrown and heavily used by

the homeless population. As part of the construction of the project, the overgrown areas were cleaned up and legitimate trail and park users introduced to the park. As a result, the homeless population moved away from the park and the park continues to be heavily used by families, trail users and children.

Will the new KB Homes development (Mitchell Village) be able to access this trail?

Yes, the Mitchell Village community will be able to connect to the Arcade-Cripple Creek Trail on the northwest corner of the development, travel along an easement through the SMUD substation property, and into the back side of Tempo Community Park.

What are the community impacts of the trail?

This trail project focuses on safety and connectivity while minimizing impacts on our community. We have paid special attention to the tree removal impacts of the project, as we know this is of specific concern to Citrus Heights and Orangevale residents. In fact, since our initial plan, the design team has already worked to reduce the amount of trees that will be impacted by 60% - and we are committed to reducing the number even further! The project will also replant trees along the trail corridor and in nearby parks. These replacement trees will be monitored by an arborist for three years following installation to ensure they are able to thrive. We take our "Tree City USA" designation seriously!

First 5 Sacramento Approves Funding

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - The First 5 Sacramento Commission unanimously approved more than \$40 million in funding for contracts that will begin July 2021. Funding over a three-year period is for critical prevention and early intervention programs that will serve young children and their families in Sacramento County. Funding was allocated specifically to: Prevent African American Child Deaths; Strengthen Families/Decrease Child Maltreatment and Trauma; Improve School Readiness; Build Quality Child Care Settings; Increase Breastfeeding.

A list of agencies approved for funding can be found on the First 5 Sacramento website.

As stewards of Proposition 10 tobacco tax public funds, First 5s across the state work toward three primary goals: 1) to ensure children receive the best start in life; 2) that parents and caregivers have the tools they need to help their children be successful, life-long learners; and 3) that systems serving children are streamlined and efficient.

"For more than 20 years, First 5 Sacramento has invested considerably in a variety of early intervention and preventive programs serving children and families," said First District Supervisor and Chair of the First 5 Sacramento Commission Phil Serna. "These programs provide parents and caregivers the necessary tools to ensure children achieve their greatest potential and succeed in life."

Research shows that 90% of a child's brain develops in the first five years and what parents and caregivers do during these years to support their child's growth will have a meaningful impact throughout life. Based on this research, California voters passed Proposition 10 in 1998, a tobacco tax, to support programs for expectant parents and children ages 0-5. In the last year, First 5 Sacramento distributed approximately \$11 million a year in Prop 10 revenues to programs and services that meet local needs in Sacramento County. All 58 counties have a First 5 Children and Families Commission providing unique local services for that county. More information available at www.first5sacramento.net. ★
