City Council Approves Sale of Sylvan Property to Woodside Homes



The Citrus Heights City Council approved the sale of the Sylvan property to Woodside Homes, which plans to develop 93 new homes on the 11.34-acre site. Woodside hopes to preserve many of the mature trees on the site while creating much needed housing opportunities in the city.

CITRUS HEIGHTS, CA (MPG) - The City purchased the 11.34-acre New Sylvan property – located just south of Sylvan Cemetery on Auburn Blvd. – from the San Juan School District in September 2019. “This was a strategic acquisition to be able to direct the use and steward the land development,” said Meghan Huber, economic development and communications manager.

The City declared the property as surplus in December 2019, and set concept, design, land use, and financial goals for the site in April 2020. The City put the property on the market in July 2020 with the Offering Memorandum, which closed in October 2020 with one response

– from Woodside Homes. The draft Purchase and Sale Agreement was completed in December 2020 and presented to Council during the January 14 meeting (conducted via teleconference). Huber said, “Because the project, and this site, is so highly visible and important to our community, we wanted to ensure maximum public engagement.” Ahead of the meeting, letters were delivered to adjacent residents and property owners notifying them of the upcoming public hearing, and notifications were sent via news releases and social media.

The purchaser, Woodside Homes, is one of the largest homebuilders in the western United States, with many active developments in the Sacramento Region. The proposed project would develop approximately 93 single-family for-sale units on the

site – a combination of 69 Bungalow lots measuring 40’ x 75’ and 24 Cottage lots measuring 35’ x 75’. The actual design of the project will still need to go through the standard development review process.

Part of that process involves meeting the requirements of the Surplus Land Act, which is initiated when a surplus property is sold for residential use. The Act requires 15% of the residential units be designated as affordable housing, which is defined as affordable to persons earning 80% of the median income in the city. To meet this requirement, 14 of the Cottage lot deeds will be bound by a regulatory agreement that potential buyers must meet income requirements to qualify for those homes.

The purchase price agreement

Seniors 65+ Now Eligible to Receive COVID Vaccine

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - In order to increase the pace of COVID-19 vaccine distribution to those at greatest risk, the state is prioritizing individuals 65 and older to receive the vaccine as demand subsides among health care workers.

“There is no higher priority than efficiently and equitably distributing these vaccines as quickly as possible to those who face the gravest consequences,” said Governor Gavin Newsom. “Individuals 65 and older are now the next group eligible to start receiving vaccines. To those not yet eligible for vaccines, your turn is coming. We are doing everything we can to bring more vaccine into the state.”

Those in Phase 1A – health care workers and long-term care residents – remain the highest priority to receive vaccines. Demand for the vaccines continues to far exceed supply.

“With our hospitals crowded and ICUs full, we need to focus on vaccinating Californians who are at highest risk of becoming hospitalized to alleviate stress on our health care facilities,” said Dr. Tomás Aragón, Director of the California Department of Public Health and State Public Health Officer. “Prioritizing individuals age 65 and older will reduce hospitalizations and save lives.”

Following a bipartisan letter from nine governors including Governor Newsom on January 8, the CDC announced changes yesterday to its vaccine plan including making more of the coronavirus vaccine supply available to all states. Along with the increase in vaccine supply, the federal government encouraged states to expand the pool of those eligible to receive the vaccine to individuals 65 and older.

The Governor also announced a new system to let people know if they are eligible to receive a vaccine, and if not yet eligible, to register for a notification via email or text when they are eligible. That system is expected to launch next week. A second phase of that system will help counties, cities and others run mass vaccination events. This will include a way for eligible members of the public to schedule their vaccination appointments at those events.

School Reopening Plan

The record \$89.5 billion education budget Gov. Gavin Newsom unveiled Friday includes \$2 billion in grants aimed at nudging schools to reopen classrooms for its youngest students by mid-February and \$4.6 billion for summer school to address students’ learning.

The governor’s push to reopen schools, though, comes as many of the state’s large, urban districts have delayed or scaled back plans for in-person learning amid the state’s worst surge in coronavirus cases since the pandemic initially closed schools almost a year ago.

School districts will also be under tight deadlines if they wish to receive the full \$450 to \$750 per student in grant funding. In order to get the full amounts, districts will have to submit to the state by Feb. 1 plans outlining the safety and testing measures for in-person learning with approval by their local employee unions, according to trailer bill language describing the program.

Schools then must offer in-person instruction to students in transitional kindergarten through second, as well as students most at risk of disengaging from school, by Feb. 16, followed by third- through sixth-graders by March 15.

Schools – and the governor – are under intense pressure from parents and communities to reopen campuses as they near the anniversary of their initial March 13 closures. In California, reopening schools has been left to local superintendents, schools boards and employee unions, resulting in a patchwork of school reopenings that’s created a divide between private and public schools.

Newsom also is putting the Legislature under a time crunch by asking lawmakers to push through his proposed school-reopening grants in the next two weeks and the \$4.6 billion learning loss plan by end of March, ahead of the traditional summer deadlines.

Aided by better-than-projected state revenues, Newsom’s budget plan pays down two-thirds of the schools’ \$11 billion in deferrals. It also marks the most significant involvement by the governor in the state’s charged school reopening debate since he introduced reopening guidelines in July that effectively kept most schools closed to start the year.

During his budget presentation Friday, Newsom affirmed his position that schools should be open for in-person instruction if

done safely and spoke of his youngest children’s struggle learning remotely.

“Those kids are falling through the cracks, and we have all the support in the world,” Newsom said. “I can’t imagine what’s happening for millions of other children. This is why this is so important.”

But the governor’s reopening plan has come under criticism both from local school leaders who say it would do little to help districts most impacted by the virus, as well as teachers unions pushing against reopening schools as cases climb.

Los Angeles Unified superintendent Austin Beutner said Monday that the governor’s plan “falls well short of what’s needed to help our schools” because it neither sets across-the-board safety standards nor sets a requirement for when schools should reopen. “It leaves the definition of a safe school environment and the standard for reopening classrooms up to the individual discretion of 1,037 school districts across the state, creating a patchwork of safety standards in the face of a statewide health crisis,” Beutner said. “And it reverses a statewide commitment to equity-based funding of schools.”

Beutner, leader of the state’s largest school district, and six other superintendents from large, urban districts raised concerns about Newsom’s reopening plan ahead of its release. The superintendents pushed back against the proposed \$2 billion coming out of the state fund earmarked for

K-12 schools and community colleges. In a Jan. 6 letter, they said the proposal shuts many of their schools and students out of grant funding because they reside in communities with some of the state’s highest case rates.

The nonpartisan Legislative Analyst’s Office also raised concerns about the reopening plan, writing that the “proposal sets unfeasible time lines” in an analysis of the governor’s budget.

Suzanne Kitchens, president of the California School Boards Association, praised Newsom’s budget plan for easing the financial strain on schools by paying down most of the deferrals, as well proposing a 3.84% cost-of-living adjustment for schools, but added that “we have work to do on both the school reopening and summer school plans.”

“While some schools will undoubtedly take advantage of the incentives to reopen schools this spring, others are not in a position to do so given community health concerns, local standards, funding, resource staffing, and capacity limitations,” Kitchens said.

Newsom’s budget does not propose extending the school funding protections that held attendance-based funding flat this school year. The proposal assumes in-person learning as the “default mode of instruction” during the 2021-22 school year for funding purposes.

As California schools begin the new

semester, most will remain learning remotely, many indefinitely. Some of the state’s districts, such as San Francisco, have yet to come to agreement with their local teachers union on how to reopen schools. Others, such as Oakland, have said they planned to reopen campuses once their counties reach the orange tier at the request of their unions – a requirement more stringent than what state public health officials allow for in-person learning.

A key distinction between Newsom’s reopening plan and legislation Democratic lawmakers introduced last month is that the governor’s effort does not establish a requirement for when schools have to reopen.

Assembly Bill 10, which legislators plan to advance this month, would require that schools offer in-person instruction starting in March once their county moves out of the state’s purple tier. The bill is in response to the fact that many school districts, primarily those in Bay Area counties, stayed closed after they had clearance from public-health authorities to reopen.

Teachers unions have pushed back against Newsom’s plan and AB 10, saying schools should not reopen without extensive health and safety measures and until after the state’s current surge.

“We are in the middle of a devastating COVID-19 surge, and any discussion of returning to in-person instruction is premature,” Jeff Freitas, president of the California Federation of Teachers, said Friday.

Other highlights from Newsom’s education budget include: \$315 million to support teacher professional development, such as social-emotional learning and implicit bias training; \$300 million in special education funding, with an emphasis on services for infants, toddlers and preschoolers, adding to the \$100 million for special-needs students passed last year; \$400 million in one-time funds toward preventative and early intervention behavioral health services for students; \$15 million to continue developing the state’s cradle-to-career longitudinal data system, an effort Newsom championed since his first year in office; A requirement that high school seniors complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid, known as FAFSA.

between the City and Woodside Homes is based on the lot count – \$50,000 per Bungalow lot and \$30,000 per Cottage lot. The approximated total purchase price for the property is \$4.17 million. The City’s total investment into the property (including \$3.4 million for the site, plus additional costs to prepare the property for sale, plus interest on the financing) totals \$3.8 million. After the sale, the City’s estimated profit would be \$297,915.

Huber explained that the project will have long-term economic benefits for Citrus Heights: “By building on a long-dormant corner of the city, we are activating the land to begin generating property tax dollars,” which the City is scheduled to begin receiving in fiscal year 2022-2023 after the Revenue Neutrality agreement with the county expires. Huber estimates that the City will receive almost \$30,000 annually from these new units.

Welcoming 93 new families will increase the population along that corridor, which Huber said will help support existing businesses and improve the City’s statistics in order to attract new businesses. Those new residents will also spend money on taxable items, potentially generating new sales tax revenue for the City.

Jim Bayless, land acquisition manager for Woodside Homes, said they are “excited about the opportunity to build on all the improvements that Citrus Heights has invested in the Auburn Blvd. corridor.” Bayless explained that they initially considered a higher number of units, but they want to ensure quality housing with good circulation on the site – while preserving as many of the beautiful, mature oak trees as possible.

Four public comments were submitted for this item. One resident wrote in to oppose any development of the land, while two pushed for retail and restaurants on the site, or even a mixed use of both retail and housing. Another resident opposed any new housing, asking instead for some kind of attraction or a sports complex for traveling sports teams.

Councilmember Tim Schaefer also asked about the possibility of a park or sports complex. He said he didn’t think building homes on the property complemented the cultural significance of the site. He asked whether any analysis was done regarding subdividing the property, because he noted there is limited market interest in such a large property.

Community development director Colleen McDuffee explained that the City was open to offers on smaller portions of the property, and the Offering Memorandum didn’t specify that the purchase had to include the entire site. The City also discussed possible sales to Sylvan Cemetery or to Sunrise Recreation and Park District, but both declined.

Councilmember Jeannie Bruins said there are already a lot of commercial vacancies in Citrus Heights, “many of them at Sylvan Corners.” Building new retail “only adds to that problem.” Bruins said that developing good, quality affordable housing will “encourage further development of our business community, knowing that we have built-in consumers to participate.” Bruins also cited the excellent reputation of Woodside Homes, stating, “I am pleased to support this project.”

Councilmember Bret Daniels said, “I appreciate staffs’ efforts to put as much lipstick on this as possible,” but he expressed disappointment in the project. He had “visions of stores and homes together with this energy and this destination.” But he acknowledged that with the current economic climate, new commercial spaces were likely to wind up vacant. While he said, “I greatly appreciate that a developer with the status and reputation of Woodside is coming forward,” he still described it as “unfortunate,” “very sad,” and “a big thud.”

Mayor Steve Miller said that the goal of purchasing the property was to ensure the site didn’t end up filled with gas stations, drive-thrus, or “another strip mall that we don’t need.” He explained that the proposed project meets one of the major goals of the City’s General Plan, which is to increase home ownership. As part of the economic recovery after the pandemic, “this is going to help the surrounding small businesses, and I think encourage redevelopment,” said Miller. He pointed out the many commercial vacancies nearby and said what the city needs right now is not new retail, but new customers.

“I don’t see this as a thud. I see this as closing one chapter and moving on to the next,” said Mayor Miller. The motion passed 4-1, with Councilmember Schaefer dissenting. ★

Social Security Matters

Do COVID-19 Bonuses Count
Toward the Earnings Limit?

Dear Rusty: I'm 63 and still working, and I receive Social Security benefits. Because of COVID-19 my employer has been giving us a \$300 bonus, every 3 months. This will be \$1,200 for the year and it will put me over the \$18,240 earnings limit for this year. My question is, since these bonuses are COVID-19 related are they still considered earned income? My second question is, if I go over the limit does Social Security stop my check, even if it might be a portion of the check?
Signed: Working During COVID-19

Dear Working: Whether your 2020 earnings (and those bonuses) put you over the annual earnings limit will depend upon how the bonuses are reported on your Federal income tax return (or your W-2 if you aren't required to file). Your employer will send your W-2 earnings to the IRS which will, in turn, inform Social Security of your earnings. Social Security compares your 2020 W-2 earnings to the earnings limit to see if you exceeded the allowable limit. In other



words, how your employer defines those COVID-19 bonuses and reports it to the IRS determines whether SS will count them toward the earnings limit. You should check with your employer's Human Resources department to see if your COVID-19 bonuses will be considered as taxable earnings reportable on your W-2.

If you exceed the limit, and you don't inform Social Security in advance that you did, they won't know about it until they receive your W-2 information from the IRS (sometime next year, after you file your income taxes). They will then send you a notification that you exceeded the limit and tell you how much you owe them, and they will want to recover \$1 for every \$2 you are over the limit (half of what you exceed the limit by). They'll give you the option to repay what they consider to be an overpayment in one lump sum, request a repayment plan or to have your SS benefits withheld for as many months as it takes for them to recover what you owe. Note they only withhold full months of benefits, not partial, so you could go several months without collecting any SS benefits until they

recover what is owed.

The money they withhold because you exceeded the limit is not lost forever, because when you reach your full retirement age (66 ½ if you turned 63 in 2020) they will give you time credit for any months they withheld benefits. That means they will move your effective claim date forward by the number of months benefits were withheld, which will result in a small increase in your benefit amount. But you'll get that higher benefit for the rest of your life, enabling you to eventually recover the money they withheld because you exceeded the limit. And for information, during the year you reach your full retirement age (FRA) the limit goes up and the penalty is less, and once you reach your FRA there is no longer a limit to how much you can earn while collecting benefits.

California's Technology Woes Deepen

While doing his stretch in solitary confinement as lieutenant governor of California, Gavin Newsom wrote a book entitled "Citizenville: How to Take the Town Square Digital and Reinvent Government."

In the book, published in 2013, Newsom sang the praises of digital technology and its potential for making government and its services more transparent, more efficient and more responsive.

A half-decade later, Newsom succeeded Jerry Brown in the governorship and thus management of a state government that had been struggling, with little success, to implement the technological nirvana he envisioned.

Since then, it's become even more evident that despite being the cradle of the digital revolution that has utterly transformed how humankind lives and works, California's government just can't make technology work well. In fact, its tech failures have gone the other way, making services even less reliable.

We've seen two spectacular examples in the first two years of Newsom's governorship, melt-downs at the Department of Motor Vehicles and the Employment Development Department. The DMV

fiasco was annoying, but the one at EDD has serious human consequences, delaying or denying cash benefits to those suddenly thrown out of work by COVID-19 shutdowns while allowing billions of dollars to be squandered on fraudulent claims.

Just this month, there was another. Software meant to hasten the distribution and application of vaccinations against COVID-19 stumbled, contributing to California's subpar rollout of lifesaving inoculations against the dread disease and thus possibly adding to the pandemic's already horrendous death toll.

Asked about the vaccination tech failures as he rolled out his new state budget last week, Newsom responded, rather lamely, "We have a lot of work to do in bringing California into the digital age."

No kidding.

A day before Newsom's budget announcement, the state auditor's office gave California's sorry efforts to implement technology another black mark on its most ambitious project, Financial Information System for California (FISCal), meant to become a centralized repository of financial data.

The FISCal project began 15 years ago and Auditor Elaine Howle has been a frequent critic of its years of delay in implementation, ever-increasing costs and ever-changing parameters.

In her latest report, Howle says those issues are still not resolved and not having a workable financial reporting system in place threatens some adverse consequences.

"State agencies using

FISCal still struggle to complete required financial reports on time," she told Newsom and legislative leaders. "Consequently, the state released its annual audited financial statements months late for the second year in a row. A late release of critical financial information increases the risk to the state of a lower credit rating, which could result in increased costs to taxpayers."

Howle is especially critical of what she describes as deceptive information on what adopting FISCal will actually cost in relationship to what it will presumably accomplish when it is completed. As costs climb — the most recent estimate is \$1 billion — the tasks to be performed have shrunk in apparent hopes that a half-baked system can be declared finished.

Faced with a sorry record on tech implementation, Newsom created an Office of Digital Innovation and charged it with making his lofty visions of "digital transformation and results-oriented government" a reality.

Newsom's new budget refers obliquely to the DMV and EDD disasters by saying, "The events of 2020 highlighted the urgent need to modernize government services in an online environment." He proposes to spend even more money on technology in the hope that it will ultimately pay off in better services at less cost.

At the moment, however, he's trying to make water run uphill.

Reference Pricing Kills Cures

The pharmaceutical industry is on a bit of a hot streak. Just last month, both Pfizer and Moderna received FDA approval for their COVID-19 vaccines. Millions of Americans have already received them.

And yet, Republicans and Democrats alike are sitting on proposals that would make breakthroughs like these much rarer.

Specifically, they're moving to peg domestic drug prices to the lower prices in other developed nations, a tactic known as "reference pricing." Doing so, they claim, would save patients and taxpayers billions of dollars.

But reference pricing is a terrible idea. It would stifle the creation of lifesaving drugs in the future and limit Americans' ability to access medicines already in development.

In 2019, House Democrats passed H.R. 3, which would index reimbursements for prescription drugs — for both government and commercial insurance plans — to those drugs' average prices in advanced economies.

Not content to let the Democrats have a

monopoly on bad ideas, President Trump issued an executive order in September that, if implemented, would prohibit Medicare Parts B and D from paying more for drugs than any comparable country in the Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development, a group of 37 developed nations.

Proponents of reference pricing complain that Americans pay more for drugs than citizens of other developed nations — that they're just trying to give Americans a fairer deal.

But drug prices are lower abroad because foreign governments forcibly cap them, which has all sorts of negative consequences for patients in those countries.

Consider Germany's Federal Joint Committee, better known by its German abbreviation, G-BA. The G-BA allows pharmaceutical companies to charge market rates for one year, during which the board determines a drug's clinical effectiveness. If the board decides the medicine is no more effective than existing treatments, it sets the price equal to reimbursements for those drugs already on the market.

The G-BA has a problematic track record when it comes to judging drugs' clinical effectiveness. German officials deem about 60 percent of medicines no more effective than existing ones. Yet between 2013 and 2017, half the drugs dismissed by G-BA as "no more effective" were considered breakthroughs by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration.

For German patients, that means going without lifesaving drugs. Between 2011 and 2019, Americans had access to 87 percent of the 356 new medicines launched worldwide. Germans had access to fewer than two-thirds of those drugs.

Reference pricing would yield similar results here. Drug developers would delay launching their products in the United States, if the potential returns shrank drastically.

Americans would lose out on not just existing medicines but future drugs, too. Developing a new medicine costs \$2.6 billion and takes ten years, on average. Only 12 percent of drugs that enter clinical trials actually make it to market. Companies will drastically scale back R&D efforts if government price-setting renders the likelihood of securing a return on their investment slim.

Americans pay more for pharmaceuticals than the denizens of other rich countries. But the solution is to make Germany, Canada, and others pay market prices for drugs — not for the United States to adopt reference pricing that hurts present and future patients.

Sund, who announced his Saturday resignation last week under pressure from House Speaker Nancy Pelosi, said he had asked House and Senate security officials for D.C. National Guard assistance ahead of the rally, where President Trump urged his supporters to march to the U.S. Capitol building, in anticipation of the large crowd. The first request was rejected, and in the midst of escalating violence on Capitol grounds, Sund said he asked for assistance five additional times. “If we would have had the National Guard, we could have held them at bay longer, until more officers from our partner agencies could arrive,” Sund told the Washington Post.

I was hospitalized in March 2020 due to low sugar when I passed out at home. I had no idea that I was a severely insulin dependent diabetic. The diabetes has caused me to need dialysis when my kidneys stopped working.

With Plan K, I must pay 50% of the Medicare Part A hospital deductible and the Medicare Part B costs is astronomical. I now pay the Part B deductible plus 50% copay for all Part B services. I had to pay over \$5,000 in 2020. I made an awfully bad decision to change!

I tried to apply for a Medicare Supplement during Medicare Annual Enrollment last fall, but the agent said I cannot because I am having dialysis.

I thought with Medicare that pre-existing conditions did not count. Can you help me to understand this? ~ Thanks, Terry

Wow, Terry...What a great question: Americans that do not have health problems need to realize that a healthcare crisis can happen at a second’s notice. Everyone wants to save a few dollars and do not realize what having to be medically underwritten means with any type of insurance plan, especially a Medicare Supplement.

Terry, you went from a Medicare supplement plan “F”, where you would have zero out of pocket and all Medicare expenses would be covered 100% to “Plan K” which does pick up Medicare expenses, but has a tremendous out of pocket as you are experiencing. Because you now have End Stage Renal disease which requires kidney dialysis; you cannot qualify for a Medicare Supplement.

Good News because beginning 2021 certain Medicare Advantage plans are now

accepting those with ESRD (end stage renal disease).

There are 2 chapters in my book, Medicare Survival Guide® Advanced edition which explains the difference in Medicare supplements and Part C Medicare Advantage Plans. Chapter 3 of the Medicare Survival Guide discusses Medicare Supplements, also known as Medigap policies. In chapter 4, I explain what Part C or Medicare Advantage plans are and the different type of plans...HMO, PPO, PFFS (Private Fee for Service), SNP (Special Needs Plans).

With a Medicare Supplement, the most comprehensive plans that cover more of your Medicare expenses are “Plan F and G”. Now remember that Medicare Supplement Plan “F” are not available for those who turned 65 beginning January 1, 2020 but is still available to those who’s Medicare Part A began prior to January 1, 2020. To make a change to their Medicare supplement they may have to answer underwriting questions.

Medicare Supplement plan “F” picks up most of your Medicare approved amounts with zero out of your pocket. Plan “G” is similar to Plan “F” except it does not include the Part B deductible that is \$203 once a year for 2021.

America should be made aware of telemarketers that call to try and change one’s Medicare plan options. Please be careful when answering phone calls and giving out personal information. Medicare telemarketers are lurking around waiting for the right person to attack and have them make an important decision when they only need proper Medicare information to make the right Medicare decision.

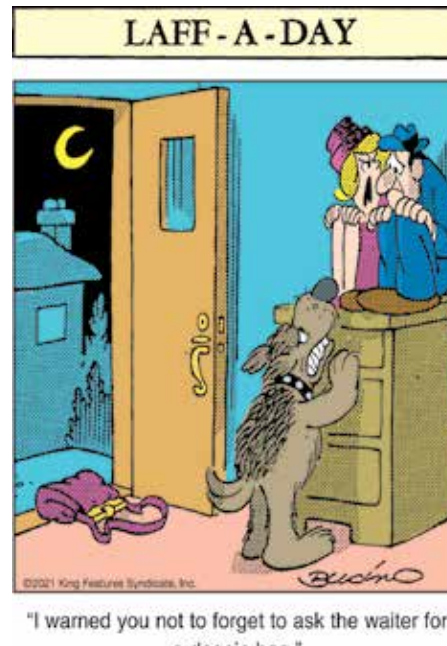
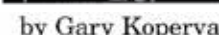

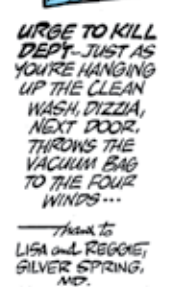

- In response to the COVID-19 pandemic, the City of Citrus Heights has tailored its customer service model to continue to support residents and businesses remotely. For example, the Building & Safety Division adapted to support an increased demand for online permit applications and processing, resulting in a record-breaking number of 2,616 permits issued online for 2020. Doug found information about City permits online, but called the Building Division and spoke with Susan McLendon, Development Services Technician II, for assistance with creating an account to use the Citizen Access Portal for the first time. “The online portal was very intuitive but I wanted to make sure I didn’t mess anything up my first time using the online service. I appreciate that Susan is so knowledgeable and enthusiastic about her job – it is very refreshing.”

Through the City’s Citizen Access Portal, residents and businesses may apply for several types of building permits online, ranging from tenant improvements, to HVAC upgrades, to remodeling. The portal allows users to submit a permit application with PDF attachments, pay the required fees, request inspections, and research your permit history.

Seniors 65+ Now Eligible to Receive Vaccine

Community vaccination events are only one way for eligible Californians to receive their vaccines. When available, the public can also go to their doctor or pharmacy to receive the vaccine.

Governor Newsom has aggressively led the state to increase the pace of vaccine administration. He laid out the goal of 1 million additional vaccines administered by the end of this week. At the direction of the Governor, the state has tackled the problem with a multi-pronged approach, including: Increasing the number of people who can provide vaccinations by more than 100,000 health care professionals. Last Monday, added 36,000 dentists to the pool of health care providers who can administer the COVID-19 vaccines. The state has

already received anecdotal reports of dentists actively administering vaccines after completing the required COVID-19 training. This expansion comes on the heels a similar waiver in late December allowing pharmacy technicians overseen by licensed pharmacists to administer COVID-19 vaccines. There are 69,000 pharmacy technicians in California. Directing Resources, Driving Commitment. The Governor’s office has convened meetings with leaders across the public and private health care system and received commitments to cooperatively accelerate the pace of vaccine administration.
