Newsom Is Out Of **Control**

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) -

Governor Gavin Newsom ordered small businesses across the state to close indoor operations including restaurants, wineries, movie theaters, family entertainment centers, zoos, museums, cardrooms and bars. The Governor also shutdown indoor operations in counties on "County Monitoring List for 3 Days" such as salons, barbershops, gyms/ fitness centers and malls. In their continuing effort to advocate for employers and workers, Northstate lawmakers Rep. Doug LaMalfa (R-Richvale), Senator Jim Nielsen (R-Tehama), Senator Brian Dahle (R-Bieber), Assemblyman James Gallagher (R-Yuba City) and Assemblywoman Megan Dahle (R-Bieber) issued the following statement:

"Let's be clear: It is imperative that we all do our part by practicing social distancing and acting responsibly in order to suppress this virus and protect our community.

"But these efforts are undermined when the Governor is single handedly and arbitrarily crushing people's livelihoods – their ability to put food on the table, to pay rent and to pay their bills.

"There is no justification for this approach. There is no evidence that any of these activities are causing an increase in Covid-19 cases.

"Restaurants and churches are not the source of our increase in cases. Small businesses are hanging by a thread and this action puts all the burden of this crisis back upon them. Main Street is struggling for its very life, while Lowe's and Home Depot are packed with people and having record years. No one can make any sense of these confusing orders.

"Businesses have NOT been the direct cause, they've done everything they've been asked to do successfully. These shutdown orders punish them, their customers and it completely misses the target, especially in our rural

City to Receive State Funding for Housing Needs

Mayor Jeff Slowey returned to City Council Chambers for the July 9 Citrus Heights City Council meeting, while the other members joined the meeting through online teleconference to meet social distancing requirements. (Councilmember Porsche Middleton was absent.) City Clerk Amy Van read the public comments, which were submitted online.

David Warren wrote in to express concern that being struck by a driver to cause illness or death as

the Citrus Heights Police Department (CHPD) is not enforcing the California mask mandate: "An asymptomatic Covid-19 infected individual who refuses to wear a mask is as dangerous as a person who carries a concealed weapon, the only difference is the difficulty of identifying the weapon, making the weapon more deadly. The statistical probably of [becoming] ill or dying of Covid-19 in Citrus Heights is dramatically higher than being killed or injured as the result of gunfire or

Warren cited Health & Safety Code 120290, the California statute that makes it a crime for a person to intentionally transmit an infectious disease: "Considering all of the publicity surrounding the use of face coverings and the peer reviewed science which demonstrates that public safety requires the use of face coverings in public, no person can assert lack of knowledge of the safety issue." Warren stated that individuals who refuse to wear masks are likely

Human Trafficking Victims Qualify for Income Loss

California Victim **Compensation Board** News Release

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG)

- Human trafficking victims in California can now qualify for up to \$20,000 in income loss paid through the California Victim Compensation Board.

Signed by Governor Gavin Newsom, Assembly Bill 629 (Smith and Gonzalez) went into effect on January 1, 2020, making human trafficking victims eligible for up to \$10,000 of income loss per year, for up to two years. The bill required the Board, on or before July 1, 2020, to adopt regulations that allow it to rely on evidence other than official employment documentation in considering and approving applications for compensation. The Board adopted the regulations in May. The Office of Administrative Law approved the final regulations. ahead of the July 1 deadline.

"It's clear the trauma of human trafficking extends far beyond the time having been trafficked survivors often have faced homelessness, addiction and mental health issues stemming from their exploitation," Assemblywoman Christy Smith said. "My bill with Assemblywoman Gonzalez removes a loophole in the victim compensation system that required survivors to obtain a note from their employer - often times this was their trafficker. The regulations adopted remove these barriers to justice and provide critical support for victims rebuilding their lives."

"Survivors of human trafficking face unimaginable obstacles when they work to put their lives back on track. They are typically on their own and have to figure out how they will pay for housing and food, apply

for work, and get treatment for medical and mental health," Assemblywoman Lorena Gonzalez said. "Most human trafficking survivors don't have the formal documentation CalVCB had previously required to collect lost income, such as a W-2 form. CalVCB's new rules, now in effect thanks to our legislation AB 629, are a just and fair way to help survivors get back on their feet and get the help they need.

"CalVCB recognizes the challenges human trafficking victims face as they work to rebuild their lives," said Executive Officer Lynda Gledhill. "By providing financial support, along with options for medical and mental health treatment and other compensation, CalVCB is able to play a small part in victims' recovery."

As with all claims, victims will need to provide CalVCB with evidence of a crime, including, but not limited to, a statement under penalty of perjury from the applicant, a caseworker, a licensed attorney or a witness, or a law enforcement report. Victims CalVCB at info@victims.

brought from other countries and trafficked in California may also qualify. Before AB 629 became law, victims could only prove income loss with formal employment documentation or voluntary cooperation from their traffickers, meaning most could not qualify.

AB 629 became law on January 1, 2020, allowing victims to submit income loss applications, even as CalVCB drafted the required regulations. In the months that followed, CalVCB has approved five income loss claims and compensated those survivors more than \$70,000.

Victims, advocates, representatives, and attorneys can apply for compensation in several ways:

Create an application using CalVCB Online – a secure and private portal that can be easily accessed from a smartphone, tablet or computer; Contact a local county Victim Witness Assistance Center; Call the CalVCB Help Line at (800) 777-9229; Download an application from CalVCB's How to Apply page; E-mail

ca.gov.

Victims must apply within seven years of the date of the crime. Minor victims must apply by their 28th birthday. CalVCB will release funds for minor victims after their 18th birthday.

If you are a victim of human trafficking, or you suspect someone you know is being trafficked, there are a number of local, national and international organizations that offer and provide help and services, including temporary shelter, legal assistance and medical and mental health treatment.

The California Victim Compensation Board (CalVCB) provides reimbursement for crime-related expenses to victims who suffer physical injury or the threat of physical injury as a result of violent crime. CalVCB helps crime victims and their families cover unforeseen expenses such as medical bills, mental health treatment, funeral and burial expenses, income loss and more. Scammers Exploit California's COVID-19 **Contact Tracing Program**

MATHER, CA (MPG) - During the COVID-19 pandemic fraudsters are using this opportunity to create fear amongst residents across California.

Many traditional financial crimes and schemes are now orchestrated through electronics. Now, more than ever people of all ages, including the elderly can be victimized by these criminals.

The newest plot line in these online crimes, include California contact tracers.

What Is A Contact Tracer?

To mitigate the spread of COVID-19, Governor Gavin Newsom launched "California Connected," the state's comprehensive contact tracing program and public awareness campaign. A contact tracer from the local health department might call if you've been exposed to COVID-19. Under this program, public health representatives will telephonically interact with those who have tested positive, alert anyone that may have been exposed, and keep personally identifiable information (PII) confidential.

How To Spot A Scammer?

Real contact tracers won't ask you for money - Only scammers insist on payment by gift card, money transfer, or cryptocurrency; Contact tracing doesn't require your bank account or credit card number - Never Share account information with anybody who contacts you asking for it- Legitimate contact tracers will never ask for your Social Security number. Never give any part of your Social Security number to anyone who contacts you; Your immigration status doesn't matter for contact tracing, so real tracers won't ask - If they do, you can bet it's a scam; Do not click on a link in a text or email - Doing so can download malware onto your

Be wary of suspicious emails, phone calls, and text messages. Contact your local health department to verify that the call or messages are valid, think before clicking on any links, and be aware of suspicious

City Releases Offering **Memorandum for Sylvan Property**

CITRUS HEIGHTS, CA (MPG) - The City of Citrus Heights has released its Offering Memorandum for the 11+ acre property in the geographical center of the City, at the intersection of Old Auburn Rd., Sylvan Rd., and Auburn Blvd. The project is called "New Sylvan," (formerly Sylvan 40) and as of this week, City staff are officially seeking multi-use developers who are a good fit for the property's vision.

The City purchased this property in 2019, to ensure the future of the site would reflect the needs of the community and coincide with the overall revitalization vision for the Auburn Blvd. corridor. Since purchasing the land, the City Council has adopted goals, which outline that future development of the site should...

(1) Support multiple uses compatible with surrounding land uses; (2) Enhance the area as the geographical center of the City and reestablish the area as a cultural and social hub; (3) Include enhanced pedestrian connections to connect the property to nearby businesses, Sylvan Plaza, and the adjoining school;

(4) Incorporate the existing Sylvan Plaza into the project design; And more

These goals and others have been packaged with the City's updated timeline for future developers and are available on the City's website at CitrusHeights.net/ NewSylvan.

"Not every City lays out planning, design, land use, and finance goals before seeking developers as we have done, but we consider this forethought a crucial part of our economic development strategy," said Economic Development and Communications Manager, Meghan Huber. "City staff want to do everything possible to be fiscally responsible and support successful development at the New Sylvan property."

The New Sylvan site is part of an exciting larger redevelopment trend happening along Auburn Blvd. On the other side of the corridor, adjacent to Highway 80, the old Kmart shopping center is under construction to include a new Studio Movie Grill and a now open Big Lots. There has also been significant public investment in infrastructure along the corridor, including widening sidewalks, undergrounding of utilities, and

this pandemic. It's even more painful being forced to sit on the sidelines as the California Legislature has handed over all authority to one man.

"Keep in mind that 7.5 million Californians are jobless. That EDD has not been able to handle the current unemployment claims. People who filed in March still have not received payments. How in

the world will EDD be able to handle the enormous uptake in cases based on today's one-size-fits-all decision?

"We have said it before: human lives are at stake. People are stressed and filled with anxiety about their livelihoods. The mental health and other side effects of today's decision will be felt for years into the future."

City to Receive State Funding

Continued from page 1 tax roll ensures the City will receive payment from residents who do not pay their bi-monthly bill.

As of June 23, 2020, there were a total of 922 delinquent accounts, with past due balances totaling \$384,191.65. Including additional late penalties of \$38,419.16, the total owed is \$422,610.81. The City set July 9 as the date for the public hearing and published a notice of the hearing in the Citrus Heights Messenger. Republic Services, the waste collection company that serves Citrus Heights, also mailed notices of the public hearing.

Residents still have an opportunity to pay their past-due charges by contacting Republic Services before the final reconciliation of the tax roll on August 2020. After recording the list from Citrus Heights, the County will collect the payments and forward them to the City in January and May 2021. The City will then forward payments due to

Republic Services.

There were no objections submitted during the public hearing, and the Council voted unanimously to record the delinquent charges on the County tax roll.

Affordable housing is a critical need in California and within Citrus Heights. Senate Bill 2 (2017) established the Building Homes and Jobs Trust (funded by a \$75 real estate transaction fee), which aims to provide local governments with a permanent, on-going source of funding for housing-related projects and programs that address housing needs. Citrus Heights is estimated to receive \$1,876,554 from the fund over the next five years. The annual Permanent Local Housing Allocation will fluctuate depending on actual revenue collected but will be approximately \$376,000 per year.

To receive funding, the City must authorize the application and submit it to the state by July

27, 2020. The application must include funding percentages for each eligible activity the City intends to fund with the money. Staff recommended that funds be used toward three broad categories of eligibility: development, rehabilitation, and preservation of affordable rental and ownership housing; assisting persons who are experiencing or at risk of homelessness; and homeownership opportunities, including down payment assistance.

The projects that would receive funds under these categories would be the Sayonara Drive Redevelopment project to replace some of the City's affordable housing; adding a second navigator to the CHPD Navigator Program, which offers assistance to people who are homeless in Citrus Heights; and the City's First-time Homebuyer Program.

The City Council voted unanimously to approve the funding plan and authorize the submission of the application.

Candidates must:

Be at lease eighteen years of age; Be a citizen of the United States and a resident of the State of California; Be a registered voter and a resident within the district the candidate seeks to represent. Voter registration will be verified before issuance of the official nomination petition.

The Nomination Period for District 1 and 3 will begin on Monday, July 13, 2020 and closes on August 7, 2020 at 5:00 p.m. The nomination period may be extended to August 12, 2020 if an incumbent does not file within the respective district.

Vacationers Arriving at Second Homes Need to Respond to the Census ... Again

WASHINGTON, DC (MPG) - Many families will head to their vacation homes and cabins this holiday weekend in the more rural counties in California. They are likely to find a 2020 Census questionnaire packet at their doors even if they already responded from their primary residences.

It's required that homeowners complete a separate census form for every house they own, including seasonal residences. If homeowners have been staying in their seasonal homes during the COVID crisis, they still need to complete a census form for their primary residence. People should count themselves at the residence where they live and sleep most of the time under normal conditions.

cabin, vacation rental property, or any other home where someone does not live and sleep most of the time:

Visit www.my2020census.gov; Enter the Census ID or address for this secondary property. Owners will find the ID number in the information packet that census takers left on the property or at a mailbox if the home has a regular mailing address; Enter "0" for the number of people living at this property; Hit Next... the survey will not advance, but it will show a second prompt. Hit Next again to advance; Select "No" when asked a confirmation question about how many people live there; Select primary reason – Seasonal (most likely); Complete!

Residents Need to Protect Themselves from Mosquitoes as They Head Outside

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - As the weather heats up and residents head outside, mosquito experts encourage community members to protect themselves from mosquitoes and the diseases they can spread when they bite. West Nile virus is the most prevalent mosquito-borne disease in the U.S. according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), California had the highest number of West Nile virus disease cases in the nation in 2019, with 225 cases reported. Comparatively, Texas had 32 cases and Florida had two cases in 2019. There is no human vaccine for West Nile virus, a disease that can cause debilitating cases of meningitis, encephalitis, and even death.

However, West Nile virus isn't the only mosquito-borne threat in California. Newly established invasive Aedes mosquitoes can transmit viruses such as chikungunya, dengue, and Zika, all of which are costly to treat and can have long-term health and financial consequences. These mosquitoes are established in many areas of California and are steadily expanding their range.

"While COVID-19 is not transmitted by mosquitoes, infected mosquitoes pose other public health threats," said Peter Bonkrude, president of the Mosquito and Vector Control Association of California (MVCAC). "The best way to protect yourself from West Nile virus and other mosquito-transmitted diseases is to prevent mosquito bites. Wearing insect repellent is important as is eliminating all standing water which can create mosquito breeding sources."

"While our attention has been laser focused on COVID-19 it's important to remember that there are other public health concerns such as West Nile virus," said Assemblymember Mike Gipson (D-64). "As chair of the Assembly Select Committee on Infectious Diseases, I'm familiar with the devastating toll that mosquito-transmitted diseases can have and encourage all California residents to take simple steps to protect themselves."

National Mosquito Control Awareness Week, June 21-27, 2020, is a reminder to residents about the easy actions they can take to prevent mosquito breeding and protect themselves from mosquito bites. Mosquito experts are working to ensure

there are adequate local, state, and federal resources to meet the increasing challenges of combating mosquito-borne diseases. Specifically, at the federal level, MVCAC has been advocating for funding for the Strengthening Mosquito Abatement Safety and Health Act (SMASH Act) which would authorize CDC resources to be used to protect public health by addressing emerging infectious mosquito-borne diseases and improving existing mosquito control programs.

To help prevent mosquito bites:

Apply insect repellent containing EPAregistered active ingredients, including DEET, picaridin, oil of lemon eucalyptus, or IR3535, according to label instructions. Repellents keep mosquitoes from biting. It is important to follow EPA and CDC guidelines for the safe use of repellents on children; Dress in long sleeves and pants, especially if outside at dawn and dusk when mosquitoes that can spread West Nile virus are most active; Install screens on windows and doors and keep them in good repair to keep mosquitoes out of your home; Eliminate all sources of standing water on your property, including in flowerpots, old tires, buckets, pet dishes, and trash cans because mosquitoes lay their eggs in very small amounts of standing water; Repair leaking faucets and broken sprinklers; Clean rain gutters clogged with leaves; Report neglected swimming pools and daybiting mosquitoes to your local mosquito and vector control agency.

American Innovation Helps Patients Beat Coronavirus

American scientists are working furiously to develop treatments for the novel coronavirus, COVID-19.

No group of patients needs a vaccine more than those with chronic conditions. Patients with just one chronic disease who contract COVID-19 are 80 percent more likely to experience a "poor outcome" -- like hospitalization or death -- than those without any chronic conditions, according to recent studies.

Fortunately for Americans living with chronic disease, the United States leads the world in medical innovation. As long as policymakers protect this innovation ecosystem, U.S. scientists will surely produce vaccines and treatments relatively quickly—and keep our nation healthy through this crisis and for years to come.

Americans are rightly worried about COVID-19. More than 100,000 Americans have died from COVID-19 and more than two million have tested positive for the disease.

Patients with chronic diseases are particularly vulnerable. Forty percent of hospitalized COVID-19 patients have some type of cardiovascular or cerebrovascular disease. Other chronic conditions -- like arthritis, diabetes, and cancer -- could make it harder for the body to fight the virus

But our scientists will rise to this challenge and invent new therapies, just as they have countless times in the past. Heart disease death rates have declined 36 percent since 2000, largely thanks to new and better medicines. Similarly, cancer death rates have declined 27 percent since the 1990s.

Health gains like this come at a hefty price. It takes up to 15 years and \$2.6 billion to develop just one new medicine. And only 12 percent of drugs that begin clinical trials ever make it to pharmacy shelves.

Drug companies and their investors will only roll the dice on novel research projects if they have a chance of recouping their development losses and earning a return.

Because the United States fairly values medicines, scientists have a strong incentive to launch research projects here. All told, American firms develop half of the world's new medicines.

Researchers tend to flee countries whose governments arbitrarily cap prices of new medicines. Consider that in the 1970s, Europe produced more than half of the world's new medicines. But throughout the 1980s, many European countries imposed increasingly strict price controls on drugs. As a result, today Europe produces only 33 percent of all new drugs.

Unfortunately, some lawmakers want to implement similar price controls in the United States. A few members of Congress attempted to slip a price control into one of the first COVID-19 spending packages. The provision would have allowed the government to dictate the price of any COVID-19 vaccine that resulted from the emergency funding.

Congress wisely stripped out that provision, which would have discouraged investments into COVID-19 cures, vaccines, and therapies. Congress' decision is great news for every American hoping for a COVID-19 vaccine, especially those living with chronic disease.

COVID-19 poses an enormous threat to American society -- but our smartest scientists are already on the case. Let's hope our policymakers don't put any stumbling blocks along their path to a cure -- whether for coronavirus or any other dangerous disease.

My son is only two, and if something happened to me, he would go to his father. His dad is in good shape financially and responsible with money, so how much life insurance should I have?

Well, you probably don't need the full 10 to 12 times your income like I recommend for most people. The only dependent you have is also dependent upon his dad. And from what you said, his father seems perfectly able to take care of him.

I'd get a good term life policy equal to the amount that you'd like to supplement your son's care. The good news is you can get a couple hundred thousand in life insurance at your age for practically nothing.

If you get life insurance, make sure his dad-your ex—is not the beneficiary. The beneficiary should be a family trust, formed upon your death, and the money would go into that trust for the benefit of your child. You set the terms of the trust. It should not be controlled by your ex. In a divorce situation, I would never name someone I'm not willing to be married to the trustee of my money on behalf of my child.

I'm so glad you're thinking about these things, Christian. It shows you're an intentional lady, a fine mom, and a good planner. Those traits will serve you and your son well!

Are Utilities Included?!

Dear Dave,

I just received a formal job offer in law enforcement. I'm debt-free, single, and I'd like to move out of a roommate situation and into my own apartment. I'll be starting out at \$34,000 a year, then moving up to \$38,000 after my probationary period. You have a rule that says to make sure rent or house payments are 25% or less of your take home pay. If I can find a place where utilities are included, do they figure into that amount?

Dear Josh

It's really more of a guideline than a rule. The point of not letting your housing cost eat up more than 25% of your take home pay is to make sure you have money left over for other important things. It's hard to save and invest for the future when a huge chunk of your money is eaten up by rent or a mortgage payment each month. But no, utilities are not part of the one-fourth of your take home pay guideline.

At this point, it doesn't sound like you need anything fancy. Try to find a safe, quiet place to call home-somewhere you can relax and decompress when you're off duty. And thanks for entering law enforcement. A lot of folks are leaving your line of work, and we need good men and women in that profession right now.

you live for him and make the kingdom of God your primary concern." That's a promise that you can count on.



You Don't Need to Suffer **Emotionally**

occurs when you have unresolved issues persisting over an extended period of time. Suffering can be caused by guilt, shame, anxiety, worry, stress, or fear. Suffering which is not effectively dealt with runs the risk of becoming engrained ing is another emotional and normalized. If left unchecked, you become acclimated to suffering as a normal way of life.

However, you don't need to suffer when you are encountering an adverse situation. Regardless of what you may be experiencing, you can take steps participant in your life, not a docile observer. You don't have to passively wait for things to get better.

Don't resign yourself to accept suffering as inevitable, or normal. It's not something you have to get used to. Begin the recovery process by identifying the exact cause of what you are feeling.

Positive action is required to improve your circum- in order to extricate yourstances. You are an active self. Negative behavior worsens your situation. Formulate a step by step plan to move toward your objective. Each small step is preferable to doing nothing.

> Looking for the good in vour life alleviates suffering. It leads to a positive path forward. The good in your life provides a foundation upon which to construct your recovery. It affords a positive perspective to help you move forward.

Constantly tell yourself how you want to feel instead of thinking about how bad you feel. Doing so reprograms your mind away from suffering. Additionally, your brain works non-stop to bring whatever you say to

Helping others is another effective strategy which helps you feel better. While you are assisting someone else in solving their problems, not only are you doing something worthwhile, you are getting a needed respite from your suffering. The process of aiding another Inaction engrains your person stimulates your mind

to generate possible paths for you.

Changing gears by immersing yourself in an enjoyable activity or hobby gives you a mental break from suffering. Even during this break, your subconsciousness is working on finding appropriate solutions.

Smiling, especially when you don't feel like it, relieves suffering. Although it's not a complete solution to your situation, smiling provides an opportunity to feel better. Laughing is even more powerful than smiling. The endorphins produced by laughing have an amazing curative effect.

Exercise provides relief from suffering. Physical activity reduces stress while producing endorphins. Inactivity, on the other hand, worsens your suffering. The last thing you need is to sit and ruminate on your problems.

You are not alone. There are many others who have dealt with similar situations. Reach out to them for support and insight. Connecting with people who can relate to what you are going through is comforting. They prove that you can and will move forward from your suffering.


