CHPD Planning for a Safe and Sane Holiday

CITRUS HEIGHTS, CA (MPG) - With the Fourth of July holiday approaching, CHPD Lieutenant Kris Frey updated so that teams can be prepared during the Council about the department's peak hours. There will also be a partic-2020 Fireworks Enforcement Plan. ular focus on locations that are typical "Understandably, our community is wanting to enjoy this holiday weekend after experiencing months of being sheltered in their homes due to COVID-19. The main focus of our plan this year is to make sure that the community, while they're out, is remaining safe. And we still want to make sure that they're taking the necessary precautions, to include safe distancing while they're experiencing their holiday events," said Lt. Frey. "Our mission this year with the enforcement plan is to provide additional resources in order to identify and deter the use of illegal fireworks."

Officers will undergo additional training to educate them about the laws regarding illegal fireworks. SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - This July, Agents of Discovery, an interactive, augmented reality game is coming to two Sacramento County Regional Parks, Gibson Ranch Regional Park and River Bend Park.

Sacramento County's Department of Regional Parks, in partnership with California Parks and Recreation Society and as part of the Parks Make Life Better campaign, is bringing this app to park visitors, free of charge, from July 1 31. While in participating parks, users will be encouraged to explore new areas to find "challenges" that will... well, challenge their knowledge of the parks!

"Our staff has been working hard to set up challenges to make this experience as fun and educational for visitors as possible," said Liz Bellas, Director of Regional Parks. "Agents of Discovery will help teach people of all ages about our local parks and open spaces while demonstrating the benefits of parks and recreation."

If you've ever played games like Pokémon GO or Harry Potter Wizards Unite, you're likely familiar with augmented reality. This technology combines visuals and audio from the game with the user's actual environment in real-time.

When users enter the active park area, they will begin receiving tips through the app that will help them find and complete the challenges.

Agents of Discovery Tips and Disclaimers:

While Agents of Discovery is best downloaded and played using WiFi, it is also accessible using cellular data; Under "Missions" search for the park you plan on visiting, either "River Bend Park" or "Gibson Ranch Regional Park" and download mission prior to visiting; Make sure GPS is enabled; Be aware and cautious of possible traffic, other people, and obstacles that may be in your way when playing Agents of Discovery.

Women's Empowerment **Receives \$10K from SMUD**

Protesters Topple Statues of St. Serra

NEW YORK, NY (MPG) - Catholic League president Bill Donohue comments on protesters who destroyed statues of Saint Junípero Serra:

Smashing statues of American icons is all the rage among urban barbarians. Ignorant of history, they are destroying statues of those who were among the most enlightened persons of their time. This includes Father Junípero Serra. The 18th century missionary fought hard for the rights of Indians, and was rightfully canonized by Pope Francis in 2015.

A statue of Saint Serra was toppled in San Francisco's Golden Gate Park on June 19, and the next day another statue of the legendary priest was torn down at Placita Olvera in Los Angeles. Archbishop José Gomez of Los Angeles, who is also president of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops, singled out Saint Serra for his compassion and his effort to establish rights for Indians and women.

a booklet, "The Noble Legacy of Father Serra," that detailed his many accomplishments. In light of the attacks on him, it is worth recalling some of his

Serra got along well with the Indians. His goal, and that of the Franciscan missionaries whom he led, was not to conquer the Indians – it was to make them good Christians. The mission-

rights and respected their human dignity, quite unlike the condition of black slaves. The Indians appreciated their efforts, drawing a distinction between the missionaries and the Spanish crown: the former treated the natives with justice; the latter did not. The civil authorities were the problem, not the priests.

Contrary to the conventional wisdom, the missionaries did not eradicate Indian culture. Indeed, they learned the native language of the Indians In 2015, I published and employed Indians as teachers. Some cultural modification was inevitable, given that the missionaries taught the Indians how to be masons, carpenters, blacksmiths, and painters. The Indians were also taught how to sell and buy animals, and were allowed to keep their bounty. Women were taught spinning, knitting, and sewing.

Archbishop Gomez is aries granted the Indians right to point out that Serra

fought for the rights of women, as well. It was the missionaries who sought to protect Indian women from the Spanish colonizers. The Friars segregated the population on the basis of sex and age, hoping to safeguard the young girls and women from being sexually exploited. When such offenses occurred, Serra and his fellow priests quickly condemned them.

A total of 21 missions were established by the Franciscans, nine of them under the tenure of Serra; he personally founded six missions. He baptized more than 6,000 Indians, and confirmed over 5,000; some 100,000 were baptized overall during the mission period.

If the truth were told about Saint Serra, he would be heralded as a friend of the Indians, not as their enemy. But truth matters little to those whose hearts are full of hatred and whose minds are closed to reality.

City Council Addresses Complaints, Discrimination

CITRUS HEIGHTS, CA (MPG)

- As the COVID-19 pandemic continues, the June 25 meeting of the Citrus Heights City Council was held again through teleconference to comply with social distancing recommendations.

COVID-19 has severely disrupted the local economy, so City staff recommended the approval of two COVID Relief Actions: an ordinance providing an automatic five-year extension to the entitlements of unexpired development projects within the city and a resolution encouraging the business use of outdoor space by temporarily relaxing City regulations regarding outdoor dining, signage, and parking. The Council unanimously approved both the Relief Actions.

Comment, Brendan Quinn stated that he recently emailed the Council asking what is being done "to combat systemic racism by reforming Citrus Heights PD policies." He said a response from Councilmember Bret Daniels stated that nothing is being done because there is no systemic racism in the Department (CHPD). Quinn's public comment disputed that claim, citing PoliceScorecard.org, which gave Citrus Heights an "F," based on statistics showing that Black people in Citrus Heights were 3.4 times more likely than whites to be targets of deadly force from 2016 -2018.

Quinn reaffirmed his stance that the CHPD does have a problem with systemic racism and asked,

Public again, what actions the Council is taking to reform police behavior in the city: "If I am to stay here, spend money here, and raise another generation here, I need assurance that this Council will take action. Police reform is sweeping the country and if we do not catch up, Citrus Heights will be on the wrong side of history."

In response, Mayor Jeff Citrus Heights Police Slowey said, "My only comment is, as we all know, numbers can tell many stories. Personally, I think it's disingenuous to take a specific timeframe and pull numbers. If you would really want to talk numbers, talk about the entire inception to now of the Police Department, and those are completely different numbers. So, I'm just going to leave it at that. I think we have a great Police Department."

The decision by prosecutors to accept DeAngelo's offer to plead guilty to the 26 charged crimes and admit the uncharged crimes was made in consultation with the victims and their family members. The totality of the circumstances. including the age of the victims, the age of witnesses and the death of other key witnesses, and the age of the defendant, were taken into consideration.

prosecution resulted in a guilty plea of:

13 counts of first-degree murder with special circumstances allegations of multiple murders and murder during the commission of rape, robbery, and burglary.

13 felony counts of kidnapping to commit robbery with sentencing enhancements for personal use of a firearm and personal use of a knife during the commission of the offenses.

DeAngelo also admitted to the uncharged crimes of: Attempted murder, kidnapping to commit robbery, rape, robbery, first-degree burglary, false imprisonment and criminal threats.

with the Exeter Police Department. The crimes, This six-county joint which continued long after he was fired from the Auburn Police Department in 1979, escalated from peeping through windows to stalking to rape and serial murder.

> The hearing was relocated to the Sacramento State Ballroom to accommodate the large number of victims and their family members in attendance and to ensure social distancing in light of the current COVID-19 pandemic.

"The investigation, identification and prosecution of the East Area Rapist/ Golden State Killer has been a long journey for justice - a journey marked by passion, persistence and sheer determination," said Sacramento County began in 1975 when he was District Attorney Anne working as a police officer Marie Schubert. "Through

the revolutionary tool of Investigative Genetic Genealogy, this serial rapist and murderer was not only identified and brought to justice but will spend the rest of his life in prison. It is my sincere hope that today brings healing to victims, their families and communities harmed by the atrocious crimes committed by Joseph DeAngelo."

Joseph DeAngelo will be sentenced to life in state prison without the possibility of parole. The sentence will run consecutive and concurrent to his sentence for the first-degree murders to which he has pled. His sentencing hearing will commence on August 17, 2020. Victims will be given the opportunity to deliver victim impact statements prior to DeAngelo's sentencing on August 21, 2020. The sentencing hearing location will be announced at a later date.

His crimes earned him the nicknames of the Visalia Ransacker, the East Area Rapist, the Original Night Stalker, and the Golden State Killer. It was not until April 2018 that Sacramento authorities announced that Investigative Genetic Genealogy had identified DeAngelo as the person responsible.

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - The Legislature sent the Governor a budget that increases billions of dollars in taxes, prevents funding for charter schools and jeopardizes public safety. This deal was cobbled together with little public input - an agreement that lacked transparency. Senator Jim Nielsen (R-Tehama), Vice Chair of the Senate Budget Committee, issued the following statement:

when the Continental Congress voted in favor of independence. It actually happened on July 2, 1776 when the Declaration of Independence was adopted. But what's a couple of days anyway. And it's been a federal holiday since 1941. So it is that the United States and Great Britain parted ways. Here are a few fun facts connected with that fateful day.

Only John Hancock signed the Declaration of Independence on July 4, 1776. All the others signed 13 colonies. The average age of the signers was 45 from the youngest Thomas Lynch from South Carolina at 27 to the oldest Benjamin Franklin from out of eight signers was

who later became President of the United States were John Adams and Thomas Jefferson. The stars on the original American flag were in a circle so all colonies would appear equal. (BANG President John Adams, James Monroe all died on the fourth.

Adams and Jefferson died on the same day within hours of each other in 1826. Benjamin Franklin proposed the turkey as the national bird, but was overruled by John Adams and Thomas Jefferson who recommended the Bald Eagle. In 1776, there were 2.5 million people living in the new nation. Today the population is near 330 million.

Fireworks are part of the tradition of celebrating this national holiday. And so is barbecue from hot dogs to chicken and ribs. Every 4 th of July the Liberty Bell in later. The Declaration was Philadelphia is tapped (not signed by 56 men from actually rung) thirteen times in honor of the original thirteen colonies. Tax Initiative for Certain Commercial and **Industrial Real Property is Withdrawn**

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Secretary of State Alex Padilla announced that an initiative eligible for the November 3, 2020 General Election ballot has been withdrawn by the proponents.

The Attorney General's official title and summary of the initiative is as

REQUIRES CERTAIN COMMERCIAL AND INDUSTRIAL REAL PROPERTY TO BE TAXED BASED ON FAIR-MARKET VALUE. DEDICATES PORTION OF ANY INCREASED REVENUE TO EDUCATION AND LOCAL SERVICES. INITIATIVE CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT. Taxes certain commercial and indus-

trial real property based on fair-market value—rather than, under current law, the purchase price with limited inflation. Exempts agricultural property and certain small businesses. Dedicates portion of any increased revenue to local services and to supplement, not replace, state's minimum-funding guarantee to schools. Provides tax exemption for \$500,000 worth of tangible personal property used for business and California, go to www.sos.ca.gov/

all personal property used for certain small businesses. Summary of estimate by Legislative Analyst and Director of Finance of fiscal impact on state and local government: Net increase in annual property tax revenues of \$6.5 billion to \$10.5 billion in most years, depending on the strength of real estate markets. After paying for county administrative costs and backfilling state income tax losses related to the measure, the remaining \$6 billion to \$10 billion would be allocated to schools (40 percent) and other local governments (60 percent). (17-0055.)

The measure previously became eligible for the ballot on October 16, 2018, through a random sample verification of signatures.

Pursuant to Elections Code 9604(b), proponents may withdraw an initiative any time before the Secretary of State certifies it as qualified. The 131-day qualification deadline for the November 3, 2020, General Election is June 25.

The proponents of this initiative, Anthony Thigpenn, Helen Hutchison, and Benjamin McBride did not provide any contact information.

Regional Campaign Urges Citrus Heights to Sort Smart and Recycle Right

City of Citrus Heights

CITRUS HEIGHTS, CA (MPG) -

With more people working from home and shopping online, curbside recycling carts have never been fuller. Citrus Heights has seen an uptick in the amount of curbside recyclables collected in April and May. But too often, what ends up in the recycling bin doesn't belong there.

To reduce cart contamination, Citrus Heights is partnering with the cities of Elk Grove, Rancho Cordova, Galt, Sacramento, and the County of Sacramento on an educational campaign to make sure curbside recyclables stay recyclable, and out of the landfill.

"Recycling is important for our environment, but it's only effective if we sort smart and recycle right," said Mary Poole, operations manager for the City of Citrus Heights. "The challenges faced across the region are very similar, so it makes sense for us to work with our neighboring cities on the Sort Smart campaign, to continue diverting materials from the landfill."

The website for the Sort Smart recycling campaign (www.SortSmart. org) connects residents with information specific to their own city guidelines, like those in Citrus Heights. The outreach efforts take aim at the most common recycling errors in all jurisdictions, including:

1. Empty and Dry. Prevent contamination from foodsoiled items by making sure that recyclables are empty and dry. Garbage and containers filled with


food make the cart unacceptable for recycling. A quick shake, a wipe with a spatula or towel will do the trick.

2. Sort Smart. While throwing items in the garbage should be a last resort, there are some items that are not accepted in the recycling cart. For example, cartons, shredded paper, and greasy pizza boxes cannot be processed by recycling facilities. Check the Sort Smart website to see what is acceptable in Citrus Heights.

3. Keep it Loose – No Bags. Once you've properly sorted out your recyclables, place them directly in the recycle bin. Please do not bag them. Bagged items are treated like garbage and end up in the landfill. Residents are encouraged to reuse plastic bags, bubble wrap, resealable plastic bags then put in the garbage cart when they are no longer useful.

"Planning for this campaign began in 2019, but the message resonates now even more with the increase in the residential waste stream," says Jerome Council, Integrated Waste General Manager for the City of Sacramento. "All the partners in this effort have the tools to help their residents find out what is recyclable and what can contaminate a cart. The web site will connect visitors to information quickly so they can make good choices on what to put in the garbage and what can be recycled."







COVID-19 Temporary Outdoor Dining Permit

Overview

Due to social distancing requirements of the Governor's executive order, the County understands that some restaurant establishments will seek alternatives to their existing indoor and outdoor configurations by extending operations to new outdoor areas including walkways, parking lots, landscaping or other required open space areas. On May 19, 2020, the Sacramento County Board of Supervisors Adopted a Resolution (Resolution No. 2020-0309) finding an Overriding Public Interest to allow the Planning Director to issue temporary permits to restaurants to allow for temporary outdoor dining areas.

Purpose of the Temporary Outdoor Dining Permit:

- Allow businesses and shopping centers to meet requirements for social distancing while facilitating restaurant establishments to resume operations.
- Prevent conflicts with other adjacent businesses or residential uses and ensure outdoor dining area will not significantly interfere with pedestrian or vehicular traffic or otherwise constitute a health and safety risk.
- Provide flexible outdoor operations allowances where they may not be otherwise permitted by County Code.

Expiration

Upon approval, the initial permit is good for a maximum of 90 days and so long as the emergency order is in effect. The permit may be extended upon request so long as the emergency order is still in effect and no complaints regarding violations of the permit conditions have been reported.

The application and permit is free of charge. County costs are being reimbursed through COVID-19 Recovery Funds.

Gov. Newsom Claims Right to Withhold Federal Grants to Fund California Deficits

New California State Press Release

YUBA CITY, CA (MPG) -California Gov. Gavin Newsom responded to a New California State press release regarding illegal borrowing of federal grant monies to fund budget deficits by claiming the right to seize federal grant funds from counties not requiring face masks.

New California State press release issued early on June 24, 2020 highlighted the State of California intending to fund its \$85 billion budget shortfall through June 30, 2021 by accessing "Borrowable Resources" of over \$59.6 billion, including the over \$27 billion in federal health and financial stimulus dollars to address the COVID-19 pandemic.

Later the same day, Gov. Newsom told reporters, the State of California has the sovereign right to indefinitely hold billions of targeted federal grant monies from counties that are not in full compliance with the "new rules and regulations" in his recent COVID-19 Executive

Newsom stated that after doing what he referred to as a "budget deal" with the California Legislature, "We're going to attach some considerations and consequences" for withholding federal funds from non-compliant counties.

New California believes that such action is a violation of law, and if implemented would set a dangerous U.S. Constitutional precedent that a state governor and

legislature can withhold spending federal funds during a crisis to fund its own budget deficit needs.

New California State calls on the United States government to immediately take actions to prevent and protect the public safety by assuring that the State of California is not improperly or illegally using federal funds designated for health and financial stimulus as a source of "Borrowing Resources" to fund California's \$85 billion budget deficits.

New California is a new state in development exercising its Constitutional Right to form from the State of California. The process to form New California is authorized and codified in Article IV Sections 3 & 4 of the United States Constitution.

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - The year 2020 is the 11th year the Harmer family has created a float for the Rancho Cordova 4th of July parade. Rules for floats require one patriotic feature which will be Harmer's granddaughter, Destiny, as the Statue of Liberty standing 10 feet into the air.

This year's float is based on the 1971 version of 'Willy Wonka and the Chocolate Factory' a movie which depicts the adventures of five lucky children from around the world who find five golden tickets hidden in chocolate bar wrappers and win a trip to Willy Wonka's secret chocolate factory.

Other Harmer floats include The Wizard of Oz, Flintstones, Flower Power and Eagle Mountain. Harmer's floats are the only nonprofessional, self-propelled parade floats in the region.

California Unemployment Insurance Claims Increase by 20 percent

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) -After a relatively stable level in the prior 4 weeks, total California initial claims (regular UI plus PUA claims by the selfemployed) jumped 20% for the week of June 20. As suggested in the separate WARN Act analyses, most layoffs continue to be temporary but an increasing percentage is now shifting to permanent, an indication that the recovery period will face additional difficulties in returning to previous job and employment levels.

To newly unemployed peradjusted (NSA)) for regular UI were essentially level at 1,457,373, while the seasonally adjusted (SA) level used for trend analysis is being reported as a decrease at 1,480,000. Combined with PUA claims, the national NSA numbers eased

287,354 initial UI claims employment after sub-(NSA) along with 86,130 initial PUA claims (NSA). As with last week's employment and job numbers, the initial claims data is another indication in the table above, that the economic downturn has been more severe in California and continues in many sectors, while the US on average appears to be in the initial stages of a recovery.

Combining both the regular UI and PUA initial claims, California had the highest number of initial claims among the states.
