Art Ambassador Shimo Brings Decades of East Meets West Art to Region

SACRAMENTO REGION (MPG) - Being a successful “Art Ambassador” between two very different continents and cultures is no easy task. Especially when that success was cultivated and slowly emerged from the mind and soul of a young boy during one of the darkest periods in Chinese history.

That young man was Shimo, today one of the foremost recognized and respected masters of Neo-Expressionism art in the world. Today Shimo resides in Sacramento, returning to China regularly where he is Dean of the Dept of Fine Arts at Shanghai Institute of Visual

Arts and where he holds weekly art classes with his students online.

Shimo has been active in the Sacramento region and beyond since 2003 when he came here with his wife, Winly and son, Michael.

He has a quiet, unassuming manner but not with a paint brush or his message. For almost 18 years Shimo has been actively sharing his expertise and love for the arts at venues from Los Angeles to San Francisco. His artwork hangs in the library at Hastings Law School in San Francisco, the Crocker Museum and Sacramento Convention Center (upon completion of its renovation). He has done demonstrations

and lectures at UC Davis and Merryhill School in Sacramento, and has made numerous visits to California State University, Sacramento to share his art with the students.

Shimo has shown his work at Blue Line Art Gallery in Roseville. In 2012 and 2014 he put together joint exhibits at Blue Line with prominent California landscape artist Gregory Kondo, one of them titled “East Meets West”. One of Shimo’s reasons for coming to the United States has been to help bring the two art worlds together for all to see.

To this end Shimo and his wife ran the Shimo Center for the Arts in

DMV Offices to Continue Serving the Public during COVID Outbreak

**Department of Motor
Vehicles**

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - The California Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) is moving to offer Californians essential services online starting next week to continue processing critical transactions during the COVID-19 pandemic. Field offices will be temporarily closed to the public statewide beginning March 27 and reopen, virtually, on April 2. All in-office appointments at this time will be canceled. Customers are encouraged to check the [dmv.ca.gov](https://www.dmv.ca.gov) website for future appointment availability.

DMV online services will continue to be available at [dmv.ca.gov](https://www.dmv.ca.gov). Customers can also take care of many tasks at the hundreds of kiosks throughout the state or through available local business partners. DMV’s customer service centers will continue to operate during normal business hours at 1-800-777-0133 or connecting via the live chat feature on the DMV website.

DMV field office employees will return on Wednesday, April 1 to process transactions and begin training on the DMV Virtual Field Office, which began in a limited pilot March 23. The Virtual Field Office gives customers the capability to take care of transactions that previously required an in-person office visit by virtually interacting with DMV staff. Beginning April 2, customers initially can complete vehicle title transfers and complex vehicle registration renewals by visiting [virtual.dmv.ca.gov](https://www.dmv.ca.gov). The DMV will gradually add more transactions to continue to provide alternatives to an in-person office visit.

The DMV is concerned about the health and safety of its customers, including seniors and those at risk for COVID-19. Following deep cleaning of the offices, expansion of virtual services and development of new protocols, DMV will offer in-person services in each region. More updates on how DMV is addressing the needs of its customers will be announced soon on its website.

Californians who do not have an urgent need to go to a DMV field office should delay their visit, including those interested in applying for a REAL ID. The U.S. Department of Homeland Security has announced that the REAL ID enforcement date is October 1, 2021, and customers who want a REAL ID will have an opportunity to apply at a later date. ★

Sacramento from 2012 to 2019, showcasing dozens of local artists. The gallery closed last year to give Shimo more time for his job as dean at Shanghai Institute of Visual Arts.

Kondo is one of the reasons Shimo settled in Sacramento in 2003. When he realized Kondo and Wayne Thiebaud, renowned popular culture artists both reside in Sacramento, he knew that is where he had to be. He also loves the slower pace of life in Sacramento compared to his second home in Shanghai, China.

The Kondos Gallery is in Sacramento. Kondo just celebrated his 97th birthday at the John Natsoulas Gallery in Davis and Theibaud reaches his 100th year in November. Wingly, Shimo's wife, shared with this reporter that he still plays tennis.

In 2007 his painting, *Before the Storm* was donated to the Sacramento Convention Center and will be had again at its entrance when the renovations to the center are completed later this year.

In 2015 Shimo held a solo exhibition at the Crocker Museum in Sacramento entitled "Flowers of Fire and Earth" which highlighted one of his passions, his blue and white porcelain vases featuring the iconic lotus flower. Today his "Onion-shaped Lotus Vase" and a painting, *Force Meeting*, are part of Crocker's permanent collection.

Most recently locally, Shimo recently was invited to donate a piece of his art, *Mid-day Glow*, to the Asian Community Center's newest Senior Living Community, Maple Tree Village in Sacramento. His work hangs predominately in the Welcome Center. Gregory Kondo's family donated a large collection of pieces depicting the Sacramento River Delta, making Maple Tree a virtual art museum within their home.

Shimo was born in 1962 in Shanghai, China. In 1966, when he was four, the 10-year Cultural Revolution began. It was led by China's Communist leader, Mao Zedong, in an attempt to reassert his authority over the government and rid China of the influence of capitalism including old culture, old customs, old habits and old beliefs. Schools were closed. Members of China's elderly and intellectual population were attacked and harassed. Traditional arts, music, art, literature, film and theater were banned. Artists could no longer pursue their craft; they were disgraced and reduced to doing menial tasks to survive. The government controlled

everything.

Both of Shimo's parents died as a result of the Cultural Revolution. His father died from high blood pressure when Shimo was only two months old. He and his family of eight older siblings and his mother lost their large two-story home and were forced to move into a small 100 square foot room.

However, if it weren't for these terrible events, he would not be the famous artist he is today. Shimo says he knows he was lucky to be born when he was and to have lived in the French neighborhood in Shanghai where the best artists resided. Because of his young age, Shimo was not considered to be a threat by the new government. Once the well-known but disgraced artists heard about this young child with a strong desire to learn about (and hopefully draw and paint) the things around him, Shimo's foundation for prominence in his chosen path was being laid.

No prodding was necessary. Learning to draw from the age of five, and later to paint under the tutelage of three great artists was easy. His mentors were just there to guide and help him perfect his craft.

In an interview using his cell phone voice translator Shimo said, "The key is that they (the government) see that I am very young so they are not afraid I will expose them (the artists). They said a lot of things from the bottom of their hearts to me, but in fact they thought I couldn't understand it so would not report them to the government." They knew they were safe as "they did not pay attention to the small children."

Shimo continues to promote the culture and arts between the United States. ★

Council Approves Concept for Old Auburn Complete Streets Plan

- As part of California's shelter-in-place order to slow the spread of the new coronavirus, COVID-19, the Citrus Heights City Council chamber was almost empty on March 26. Only City Clerk Amy Van (accompanied by a CHPD officer) was present to facilitate the teleconferenced City Council meeting. City Manager Chris Boyd said, "We're in unprecedented times. I want to start... by just letting you know how proud I am of our community and all of our City staff for rising to the occasion... an occasion none of us have ever seen in our lifetime, but we're prepared."

Boyd reported to the Council about steps taken during this crisis. He said, "Our front counters, our receptions, and lobby are closed, but our government and our city is very much open and conducting business in all service areas like we always have. We're just doing it differently without human contact. We were well prepared to make this transition very quickly." The business of governing the city continues through phone, email, and essential appointments. Building permits and inspections are reduced but still moving forward. The Planning Division is working remotely, and Public Works continues to provide essential services.

CHPD Chief Ron Lawrence said the police department is continuing to enforce traffic laws, respond to calls for service, and maintain crime prevention efforts. The department is increasing their presence in the business district and at local grocery stores. Chief Lawrence explained that departments throughout the state are united in their stance toward enforcement of the public

health order to shelter in place: "Our current status is we're educating our public; we're asking for voluntary compliance and cooperation. ... We do have prepared contingency plans for enforcement and mutual aid if necessary, but we really believe that our public is going to step up and do the right thing by adhering to the public health order."

Mayor Jeff Slowey recently declared a state of emergency in response to the COVID-19 pandemic, and the Council voted unanimously to ratify that declaration at the March 26 meeting. Proclaiming a state of emergency doesn't represent an increased risk to the Citrus Heights community, but it allows the City to access funds, resources, and potential aid if needed.

The Council also considered the Old Auburn Road Complete Streets Plan. In 2017, Citrus Heights received a Caltrans grant funding the development of a Complete Streets Plan for the two-mile section of Old Auburn Rd. between Sylvan Rd./Auburn Blvd. and Garry Oak Drive (just east of Fair Oaks Blvd.). Leslie Blomquist, the City's principal civil engineer, presented the Council with the preferred design concept to address safety issues such as excessive vehicle speeds, skewed intersections, numerous collisions, and inadequate bicycle and pedestrian lanes.

Blomquist said the data-driven plan was developed after robust public engagement, including seven public outreach events and a demonstration project to test portions of the plan in real time. The plan would reduce the number of vehicle travel lanes to just one in each direction with a center two-way turn lane. The plan also includes separated bike lanes, wide sidewalks

separated by a landscaped buffer, and enhanced pedestrian crossings with raised medians.


If adopted, the Old Auburn Road Complete Streets Plan will be used to seek grant funding to continue the design work, to perform environmental reviews, and for the actual construction costs. The plan will be phased and implemented based on available grants.

Three public comments were submitted regarding the plan. Anthony Silveria said, "I have a hard enough time trying to pull out of my driveway (Chipmunk Way), without the trees you are going to put in, or the cross walk for the church, or the median you want to create to take up more room. The two lanes are there for a reason, one to go to Antelope, and the other to continue on Auburn. The test you did stopped the road completely."

Kathy Morris said she has participated in many of the public engagement meetings and appreciates the hard work and professionalism in the development of the plan. Although Morris understands the concerns and the desire for pedestrian and bike lanes, "I believe the proposed changes will again make it difficult for me and my immediate neighborhood," she said.


Bill Shirley said that he and his neighbors are all "pleased with the current lane configuration. Not one person was in favor of the proposal you are being presented with tonight." He asked that this issue be tabled until a regular City Council can be held where residents in the area can attend and voice their concerns.


Vice Mayor Steve Miller said he felt comfortable approving the item because it is currently just a concept plan, so there is still plenty of time to refine the project. The plan was passed unanimously by the Council. ★

Coping with Change in a Crisis

We're in the middle of this virus crisis, a statewide shelter in place and it appears the crisis is going to last a few more weeks. I care about what you're going through. You may be struggling with the changes the crisis has brought. About the only thing you can predict accurately about the future is, it's going to change. We don't know what it's going to be, but we do know that change is an inevitable. So how do we cope with all the changes? Especially the ones we cannot control.

Look for God in the change. Mother Teresa, was once asked, why she helped the poorest of the poor? She said, "Because I see the face of Jesus in the poor and I want to help him."

She was right, but I've discovered you can find the face of Jesus anywhere if you look close enough. Even in the worst situations. God says in Jeremiah 29:13,

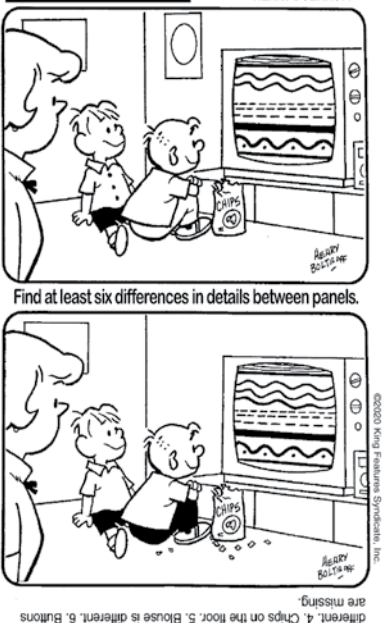
Just Like Cats & Dogs

Rebuild CA Foundation Calls for Full Transparency and Accountability in Dealing with the Coronavirus Crisis

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Doug Ose, Chairman of the Rebuild California Foundation (rebuild-ca.org), issued the following statement:

“All levels of government work best with full transparency and accountability. Transparency and accountability allow the voter to make informed decisions. Rebuild California Foundation strives to do the research and education necessary for an informed electorate.

As reported by the LA Times on Friday, California was prepared in 2010 for a pandemic: millions of masks, gloves and garbs for medical personnel; up to 21,000 beds of standby capacity; mobile capability to go where needed. Unfortunately, beginning in 2011, the Governor and the Legislature systematically dismantled the Health Surge Capacity Initiative. Consecutive budget year decisions by the Governor and the Legislature meant that the relatively small amount of funding necessary to preserve California's ability to respond to a pandemic was re-programmed for other purposes.

In addition, policy judgments by the Governor and the Legislature contributed to a reduction in the number of laboratories that can be utilized to combat medical emergencies. According to a report in the Sacramento Bee, the number

of laboratories that can do the testing needed has been reduced from 40 to only 29. In addition, funding for laboratory staffs has not changed since 2009; funding for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2020 for public health is the same as it was for fiscal year ending June 30, 2010.

Further, our research indicates that the Governor has access to significant sources of non-public information that can serve to give leaders an early heads up for a potential emergency. We have not been able to determine when Governor Newsom was first briefed about the threat posed by coronavirus.

Finally, we are not privy to any discussions Governor Newsom may have had with Legislative leaders about the coronavirus crisis.

Rebuild California Foundation will continue to examine issues affecting California and to educate the voters that live here.” ★

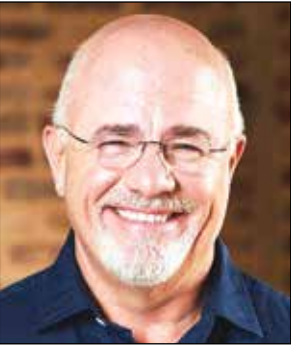

Start living on a budget, if you aren't doing so already. Making a monthly budget will show you exactly where your money is going. Plus, your budget will show places where you can cut back and save money.

If you don't have any income right now, make a

If you still have cash coming in from a spouse's job or some other source, then adjust your budget to reflect that. Maybe the two of you usually bring in a combined \$5,000 a month. Adjust your budget to live off that one income for the time being.

When the going gets tough, you need to focus on the things you really need to survive—food, utilities, shelter, and transportation. I call these the Four Walls. If there's any money left over after you take care of the Four Walls, make a list of what else you need to pay, and tackle those in order of importance. Reach out to anyone you can't pay, and explain the situation. They might be able to work something out, but they can't help if they don't know. Be up front with them, and pray for the best.

When you're just trying to make it to another day, you don't need to pay extra on debt. Instead, focus on piling up cash. Once life gets back to normal and everything is okay, you can pick up where you left off with your debt snowball. If it's within your budget to keep making minimum payments on your debt, go for

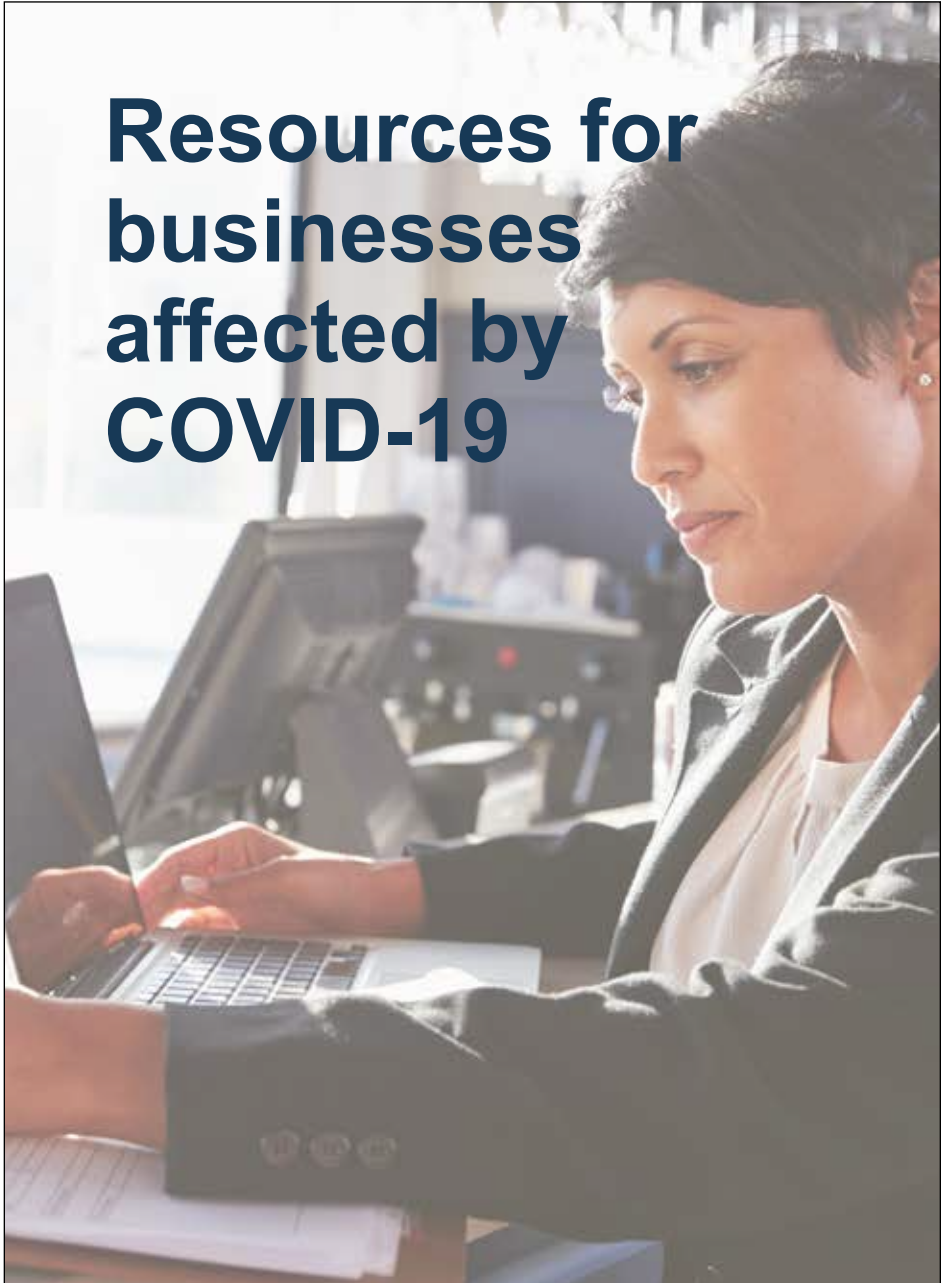
it. But the Four Walls come first. This is also the time to sell anything and everything you don't need to make some extra cash. With so much being shut down right now, there might not be as many traditional ways to make extra money. So, look into driving for Amazon, delivering takeout food, or dropping off grocery orders. Even if one of those doesn't work out, you can still take up odd jobs around your neighborhood. Be on the lookout for opportunities that will add a few extra bucks to your pocket. Don't forget to cut back on unnecessary expenses, either. Stop or pause your subscriptions. Call your cable, internet, and cellular providers to see if there's anything they'll do to work with you.

Finally, in times of real need, don't be too proud to ask for a helping hand. Many churches and community groups in your area exist for situations just like this.
