Crisis Support for Foster Youth and Families

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - "The Source," is a new, free, 24/7 support service for foster youth and resource families living in Sacramento County. The service, implemented by Department of Health Services and the Sacramento Children's Home, connects foster youth, and former foster youth, up to age 21 and resource families to licensed professionals who immediately provide guidance, support, and connection to critical resources.

The 24/7 hotline is staffed with operators trained to deescalate situations and help callers work through conflicts and tension to support foster placements. The hotline will prioritize crises and when needed dispatch mobile response teams to provide additional support. The mobile response teams are made up of social workers, behavioral health specialists, as well as peer partners, which could be former foster youth or caregivers to provide assistance in supporting placement stability.

"The Source is designed to provide foster youth and foster families with high levels of support and stability when challenging situations arise," said Michelle Callejas, Director of Sacramento County Department of Child, Family and Adult Services. "This is the only foster youth/ family support line of its kind in Sacramento and we are grateful to the Sacramento Children's Home for their service and partnership."

Foster youth and their resource families can access The Source's crisis hotline by calling or texting 916-SUPPORT or by using the online chat option on their website. The Source team can also provide in-person support at homes, schools, and community locations.

Available Services:

Support for Youth -Support when youth need help handling life's changes. Help to solve problems and create a plan for the future; Support for Caregivers -Assistance to aid overcoming conflicts and challenging situations in the family. Intense, short-term support is available, as well as resources to create a plan for the future; Referrals - Get connected to other supports and programs in the community; Activities -Have fun attending activities with other youth in the community; Advocacy - Support from staff who have similar experiences to youth and caregivers.

California State Fair **Sees Boost in Sales**

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - The California State Fair ended its 2019 season with strong food, beverage and, amusement ride sales which is thanks in-part to an all-new food Festival Pass. The pass allowed Fair attendees to pick four items from over 30 different offerings ranging from mouth-watering appetizers, one-of-a-kind entrees, and to-die-for desserts from 30 food vendors at a low price of \$28. Food sales from the Food Festival Pass generated roughly \$380,000 in revenue alone.

"The Food Festival pass was popular every single day of the Fair," says Wille Madaus, owner of Country Fair Cinnamon Rolls, whose Bacon & Pecan Cinnamon Roll won Best of Show in the Food Festival Competition. "We had our highest grossing Saturday ever and are up more than 20% this year."

Barbecue sales, always a Fairgoer favorite, hit an all-time high with \$1.3 million in gross sales while new, fresh food options such as the Fair's first vegan stand, Frik'n Vegan, had a very successful debut. The food vendor has already confirmed plans to return to the fairgrounds next year. Non-profit organization Friends of the California State Fair program sold over 7,585 pounds of fruit during the California State Fair Farm.

"Food has a powerful way of bringing people together" said General Manager and CEO of Cal Expo & State Fair Rick Pickering. "We are grateful for the opportunity to provide a common place for Fairgoers of all backgrounds to come together and celebrate our state's rich history, diverse cultures and some long-standing and new traditions that make California great."

Overall, the total for food and beverage sales was \$8.5 million this year, bringing local sales tax revenue to the city, county, and state over just 17 days of the Fair.

Butler Amusements, the CA State Fair vendor responsible for the amusement rides, also reported its highest weekend in history with sales of over \$500,000 on Saturday, July 20 and more than \$400,000 in sales for rides on Sunday, July 21, making it a \$1,000,000 ride weekend. More than 100,000 people rode the monorail and Skyride, taking in views of the entire fairgrounds and the surrounding areas from high above.

The California State Fair closed out its 2019 season — where innovation was a major theme — with an exciting Drone Light Show presented by DISH. Other novel ideas were created at the Fairgrounds, including Esports gaming tournaments every day of the Fair, the unique Bank of America sponsored Selfie Experience, and other new and exciting exhibits.

"This year's fair brought together the beauty and innovation that demonstrates the very best of California," said Pickering.

The state-wide Youth Mariachi Competition returned for a second year as part of a celebration of Mexican culture's influence of the Golden State. The competition, held at the illustrious Golden 1 Stage, showcased talented youth mariachi ensembles from throughout the state. The competition gave participants an opportunity to win up to \$5,000 in grants for their respective academy or school mariachi program.

The new Esports Gaming tournament sold out all of its tournament slots and first-ever California State Fair Bear Cup champions were crowned. The Esports Gaming tournament garnered more than 700,000 viewers around the country on the California State Fair's very own Twitch channel; hosted on Twitch's front page. Esports is a new and booming video game competition and having this event showcases California's robust tech industry.

An innovative Drone Light Show produced by The Great Lakes Drone Company, was followed by a traditional fireworks show that wrapped up the CA State Fair's events. The combination of the old, beloved fireworks and the new drone light show symbolizes the innovation and nostalgic activities the Fair

The CA State Fair provided opportunities for community engagement by providing free entrance to 10,000 military, veterans and first responders. Attendees on Mondays who provided three non-perishable food items received free admission during SMUD Giving Monday. Attendees donated a total of 31,000 pounds of food; all of which went to the Elk Grove Food Bank. Fair guests also had multiple opportunities to adopt an animal from Front Street and SPCA animal shelters.

Despite an extremely hot final weekend, Californians from all regions of the state were welcomed and enjoyed the Fair, and all its activities, for 17 days! Total attendance at the California State Fair increased from the prior year, up more than 5%, for a total of 601,761 happy Fairgoers.

Railroad Museum Celebrates Toy Train Month **Showcasing Prized Lionel Observation Car**

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - California State Parks and the California State Railroad Museum & Foundation are proud to recognize August 2019 as Toy Train Month, an annual celebration that spotlights the ever-popular Thomas W. Sefton Gallery and "Small Wonders: The Magic of Toy Trains" exhibit.

The Railroad Museum will debut a very special Lionel Observation Car (No. 416) from 1929. On public display for the first time, the prized artifact on the Museum's third is part of the Museum's extensive and internationally recognized toy train collection donated to the Museum by the Sefton family in 2002. The vintage toy train is especially unique due to its personal connection to Thomas W. Sefton. In fact, it was once on display in a glass showcase in Sefton's office at San Diego Trust & Savings Bank and was used as a conversation starter for those who visited his office. The pre-war green State observation car (Type 1, standard gauge which is part of a State Set) will be on display for the month of August 2019 in a special case at the entrance to the Thomas W. Sefton Gallery floor. Accumulated over four decades by the late Mr. Thomas W. Sefton, the crowd-favorite collection includes 20th century toy trains, Buddy "L" riding toys, and railroad-related artifacts, featuring approximately 7,000 toy trains and a variety of accessories, such as locomotives and railroad cars from companies including Buddy "L," Ives, American Flyer, Marklin, Marx, and Lionel.

Library Gets a New Look City Accepts Portion of Charolais **Way Properties for Public Use**

CITRUS HEIGHTS, CA (MPG) - At the July 25 meeting of the Citrus Heights City Council, staff recommended the Council accept a portion of an Irrevocable Offer of Dedication (IOD) along the east side of Charolais Way (southeast of the Old Auburn Rd. and Auburn Blvd. intersection) for right-of-way public street use.

The IOD was originally offered to Sacramento County in 1972 when the owner wanted to split the property into two separate parcels: 7002 and 7030 Charolais Way. The purpose of the IOD was to provide public use right-of-way for any future extension of Charolais Way in case eventual development ever required access to the currently underdeveloped parcels to the east, toward

In 1988, the New Auburn Estates subdivision was constructed along the west side of Charolais Way. Along with street improvements, the developer installed a hammerhead turnaround area on the east side of Charolais Way, within the IOD property — even though Sacramento County never officially accepted the IOD.

Staff explained that Charolais Way is a narrow street with limited parking, which has caused numerous neighborhood disputes over the last 30 years. Recently, in an effort to block off their private property within the IOD, Susan Bayless (7002 Charolais Way) and Darice Trafton (7030 Charolais Way) installed a wood fence in part of the hammerhead and removed the pavement behind the fence. Other residents have been complaining that the newly shortened hammerhead area makes turning around at the end of the street more difficult, stating that some larger vehicles now use their driveways to turn around.

Staff recommended that the City now accept a portion of the IOD in order to take over responsibility for traffic enforcement and street maintenance — and potentially to reduce the neighborhood disputes by creating clear boundaries of ownership. After accepting the IOD, the City would relocate the wood fence to the new right-of-way line and repave the hammerhead turnaround. The proposal also included parking restrictions in front of Bayless and Trafton's properties.

Bayless spoke at the meeting and stated that her driveway has been repeatedly blocked by overflow parking from her neighbors. She said she contacted the City to address the issue many times since she took ownership of the property in 2001, but she didn't receive any response until 2013. At that time, Bayless says

City representatives stated that since the County never accepted the IOD, that portion of the roadway was her private property so the City had no legal authority to restrict parking or provide enforcement.

Bayless has repeatedly asked the City to abandon its rights to the IOD. In response, the City sent a letter stating that while Citrus Heights did not plan to accept any portion of the IOD at that time [2013], they were also unwilling to abandon the IOD. The letter clarified that the portion of Bayless's property within the IOD was still her private property "to do with as you please." The letter further noted that any improvements made to her private property within the IOD boundary would be subject to removal at her expense if the City did eventually choose to accept the IOD.

Bayless said, "Ten days after we put the fence up we receive a letter from the City of Citrus Heights saying, 'We're tearing down your fence, and we're accepting the property.' ... I'm here to ask you ... to let us have our property back to do with what we wish."

Trafton also spoke at the meeting, asking that the Council abandon the remaining portion of the IOD since the City doesn't have any use planned for the area. She cited California Code of Civil Procedure 771.010 (Land Dedicated for Public Improvement), which states that a proposal to dedicate property will be presumed unaccepted if formal acceptance is not recorded within 25 years. "It is now 47 years this month," said Trafton.

Vice Mayor Jeff Slowey said, "I will support the staff recommendation with the understanding that it's an unfortunate situation and I'm sorry we're here."

Mayor Jeannie Bruins stated that abandoning the remaining portion of the IOD could limit the development of the other parcels to the east. She asked that residents on the west side of Charolais Way have consideration for their neighbors and respect the parking restrictions that will be implemented on the east side.

Before the vote, Councilmember Bret Daniels requested an amendment, asking that the resolution include a time limit for abandoning the remaining portion of the IOD if the parcels to the east are not developed during that time. He said, "These people have had this hanging over their heads for decades."

The other members of the Council did not support the amendment. Councilmember Daniels voted against the resolution, but it passed with support from Mayor Bruins, Vice Mayor Slowey, and Councilmember Porsche Middleton.



Workshop for Businesses Required to Subscribe to Services

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - The Regional Solid Waste Authority (SWA) will be holding a workshop on Tuesday, August 13, to seek input on code changes intended to increase generator waste compliance levels in accordance with mandates required by the State of California. These mandates will affect all businesses that generate four or more cubic yards per week of all solid waste (including trash, recycling and organics).

The SWA needs business engagement and consensus on developing workable solutions to be successful in meeting these state mandates. Both Sacramento County and the City of Sacramento are under intense compliance pressure from the California Department of Resources, Recycling, and Recovery (CalRecycle) to achieve greater compliance with existing commercial sector recycling regulations


as a result of the Mandatory Commercial Recycling Act (AB 341) adopted by the California Legislature and implemented by CalRecycle. It requires recycling by all businesses that generate four or more cubic yards of solid waste per week. In addition, AB 1826 requires businesses generating 4 or more cubic yards of trash and recycling to recycle their organic waste.

Currently, SWA code allows businesses to decline recycling services from their trash service provider and seek those services elsewhere. The proposed plan would require SWA franchisees to provide recycling and organics services to a business unless that business provides documentation their recycling services are provided by another recycler or by self-hauling.

The workshop on requiring businesses to subscribe to services for trash, recycling and organics will held at 1 pm in the County Board Chambers, 700 I Street, in downtown Sacramento. If you have questions, please email SWAInfo@saccounty.net.









SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - Annual bills for Sacramento County unsecured personal property taxes for fiscal year 2019-2020 were mailed on July 12, 2019, and are payable without delinquent penalties through Aug. 31, 2019.

Unsecured property tax bills are mailed to all owners of unsecured property in July of each year. If you owned unsecured property in Sacramento County, such as a boat or aircraft, or if you leased or owned fixtures and equipment related to a business on Jan. 1, 2019, and do not receive a tax bill by Aug. 7, 2019, please contact the Sacramento County Tax Collector's Unsecured Property Tax Unit at (916) 874-7833, between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m., Monday through Friday excluding holidays.

Nonreceipt of a tax bill does not excuse delinquency or allow the tax Bill Information System website.

collector to cancel penalties or collection costs.

Tax bills become delinquent if not paid in the Tax Collector's Office by 5:00 p.m. on Aug. 31, 2019, or received by mail bearing a postmark of Aug. 31, 2019.

If the tax bill is not paid by the delinquency date, a 10% penalty and collection cost will be added. DMV registration may be withheld on boats if unsecured property taxes are reported delinquent. If a tax bill remains unpaid after Oct. 31, 2019, additional collection costs and monthly penalties at the rate of 1.5% will be added to the base tax.

Payments may be made by mail or in person at the County Tax Collector's Office located at 700 "H" Street, Room 1710, Sacramento, CA 95814, between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m., Monday through Friday, holidays excluded. 

A Most Versatile Combat Warship

CITRUS HEIGHTS, CA (MPG) - A 2010 Mesa Verde High School graduate and Citrus Heights, native provides key support as part of combat operations aboard future USS Billings, stationed at Naval Station Mayport, Florida.

Petty Officer 2nd Class Anthony Galvan serves as a mineman responsible for daily scheduling of operations.

Galvan credits success in the Navy to many of the lessons learned in Citrus Heights.

"Growing up in my hometown, my parents taught me the value of respect," said Galvan. "Everything in the Navy is about respect."

This intense and realistic training pipeline allows sailors to execute their roles and responsibilities immediately upon stepping onboard.

Galvan is now a part of a long-standing tradition of serving in the Navy our nation needs.

"Joining the Navy gave me the opportunity to make something of myself," said Galvan.

Galvan is part of a warfighting team that readily defends America at all times.

"Serving in the Navy has allowed me to travel and see the world," said Galvan.

Galvan is playing an important part in America's focus on rebuildaccount the unique design ing military readiness,

strengthening alliances and reforming business practices in support of the National Defense Strategy.





A Personal Blast Off!

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - It all started in northern New Jersey at Kittle Field, a part of the Stokes State Forest Service. I was 10 years old and my Dad and I were about to blast off my first Estes model rocket. I was hooked after that experience. Fast forward to July 16, 2019, and I was at the U.S. Space Center in Huntsville, Alabama, ready to witness the world record attempt of the launching of 5,000 model rockets simultaneously in honor of the 50th anniversary of the moon landing and the Apollo 11 astronauts.

To achieve the record, the Rocket Center said the launch must meet the following criteria: Use commercially available rockets and build them following basic manufacturer guidelines; Pass 30 meters (or about 100 feet) in altitude; Have an independent specialist verify the counting method. An independent specialist is anyone who can claim a general level of experience or knowledge in the specific field of our record attempt (someone who has experience with model rocketry or aerospace engineering.)

Part of the verification process is determining that a record number of rockets exceeded the 100-feet threshold. The launch at the US Space Center successfully launched 4,923 model rockets. Although confident that the 100-foot mark was achieved, (the previous world record was 4,231 model rockets successfully launched), the Space Center said it may take up to 16 weeks to receive confirmation from the Guinness World Records officials.

What fascinates us with the moon and the stars and the planets? The Apollo 11 astronauts represented all those people like us who thirst for adventure, and we are fascinated when someone actually lives our dream for us. I met a volunteer named Eli, who works as a Planetarium Specialist at the US Space Center. He told me he has a love of rockets and enjoys "educating people about his work." We discussed how many people, approximately 3,000, came to witness the model rocket launch.

One aspect of the launch was the number of children who witnessed the event, and it makes sense since children from all over can enjoy Space Camp at the US Space Center. It is one of the most popular programs, and according to the US Space

Center it is "designed to inspire and motivate youth to push the boundaries of human exploration just as generations before them did. Space Camp is internationally popular, with visitors from all 50 states and more than 60 foreign countries."

surrounds you at the US Space Center, one does not need to go any farther than to stand face to face with two of the most iconic symbols that represent our space program – the Saturn V rocket and the Space Shuttle. I have to admit I am still in awe of As you start to grasp the history that seeing these two monuments, and part of


the generation that welcomed them to our side. What was it like to be in these vehicles for our space explorers? Fortunately, we had a president that also wanted to know the answer.

In September 1962, President John F. Kennedy gave a speech that focused the United States on landing men on the moon. The President said, "... the vows of this Nation can only be fulfilled if we in this Nation are first, and, therefore, we intend to be first. In short, our leadership in science and in industry, our hopes for peace and security, our obligations to ourselves as well as others, all require us to make this effort, to solve these mysteries, to solve them for the good of all men, and to become the world's leading spacefaring nation."

It wasn't long after that we became "trekkies" and became obsessed with the science fiction television show called "Star Trek" that debuted in 1966 and ended in 1969, just one month before we landed men on the moon. Whether a television show or a real life space drama, we were imagining being on the moon, or being one of the characters on "Star Trek." I take note when we can see an eclipse, or to see the planets align, or witness shooting stars. What exactly is out there in space?

Now nearly fifty-seven years since President's Kennedy speech, the National Aeronautics and Space Administration (NASA) has announced the creation of the Artemis program. Artemis was the twin sister of Apollo and goddess of the Moon in Greek mythology. The goal of the program is to return astronauts, including the first woman and the next man, to the lunar surface by 2024. American astronauts will also step foot where no human has ever been before - the Moon's South Pole. When Neil Armstrong walked on the moon, it is estimated that 600 million people watched, and I ask you, will you and your family be watching in 2024?

More Than 16,000 Diapers Donated To Sacramento Life Center Through Leatherby's

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Local residents who brought an unopened pack of diapers to any Leatherby's Family Creamery location on July 20 received a \$5 gift card to Leatherby's, resulting in donations of more than 16,000 diapers for the Sacramento Life Center. Daddy Dave's Diaper Drive, which took place during National Ice Cream Month, provided diapers for low-income moms in the Sacramento area and honored the life of the ice cream shop's founder Dave Leatherby Sr. who passed away earlier this year and supported the Sacramento Life Center for decades.

"It was heartwarming to see the Sacramento community come together to support local moms and babies in need, as well as to honor my dad who believed so much in this cause," said Marie Leatherby, executive director, Sacramento Life Center. "Thank to you everyone who brought diapers or donated online – these diapers mean the world to families in our community."

The Sacramento Life Center accepts diaper donations all year at its primary clinic at 2316 Bell Executive Lane in Sacramento. Families in need of diapers can call the clinic at (916) 451-4357 to learn if they qualify to receive free diapers.

The Sacramento Life Center's mission is to offer compassion, support, resources and free medical care to women and couples facing an unplanned or unsupported pregnancy. The Sacramento Life Center's licensed Sac Valley Pregnancy Clinic includes a primary clinic and mobile clinic that provide all services for free, including pregnancy tests, STD tests, ultrasounds, peer counseling for men and women, education and resource referrals. In 2018, the Sacramento Life Center achieved accreditation by the Accreditation Association for Ambulatory Health Care, which ensures the group has met nationally recognized standards for the provision of high-quality health care. The nonprofit also offers a school-based teen education program, 24-hour hotline and program for women who have experienced reproductive grief.
