

Mom Pays it Forward after Son's Transplant

CITRUS HEIGHTS, CA (MPG) - Riggs Grassinger of Citrus Heights was a happy and healthy infant and toddler. Then, at the age of 17 ½ months he went into acute liver failure without any discernible reason.

He was officially listed for a transplant on a Wednesday. "He was status 1A when he was listed," Riggs' mom Sarah Grassinger said, "which meant that his life expectancy at that point was measured in hours to days." A potential donor was located on Wednesday evening and the transplant took place on a Thursday morning in September 2012, at University of California, San Francisco Benioff Children's Hospital. The procedure was a success, and Riggs is now an active five-year-old.

Riggs's brother, 14-year-old Simon, said he was too young at the time to fully realize the significance of his little brother's illness. "But at the same time I was also terrified," Simon said.

The liver came from a teen girl who had died. Sarah said, "My heart just broke for some family out there that lost their child, yet

FBI Warns of Phone Scam Targeting Northern and Central **California Residents**

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) The Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) Sacramento field office has received numerous reports of individuals impersonating government agencies in an effort to scam the public. Currently, these unsolicited calls are placed by criminals who claim to be representatives of the FBI or other government agency and make demands for money. Several call recipients stated that Caller ID information falsely displayed the call as originating from an FBI office and the caller told the victim to check the internet to verify the number.

Federal agencies do not call or e-mail individuals to collect money. Government impersonation scams vary but most use intimidation tactics to coerce victims to hastily provide personal information or money. During calls, scammers often tell victims that charges have or will soon be filed against them and arrest or confiscation of property is imminent unless payment is made immediately by prepaid credit card or gift card. Often, if a call recipient questions the caller about the authenticity of the call, the caller becomes increasingly more aggressive. In some cases, Caller ID information was replicated to make calls appear to originate from a federal agency's legitimate phone number.

The FBI advises the public to always exercise caution when receiving unsolicited calls and never give personal information when such calls are received. Recipients of scam calls should hang up immediately and report the call. All types of telephone fraud schemes and scams can be reported to the FBI's Internet Crime Complaint Center (IC3) at https://www. ic3.gov/complaint/splash. aspx.

Bera Announces Nearly \$800k Grant for Runway Upgrades to Mather Airport

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) -Congressman Ami Bera (CA-7) announced last week a major grant from the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) for upgrades to Mather Airport's runways. The grant of \$788,500 will be used to rehabilitate and upgrade the taxiway to FAA standards and to install runway lights along the taxiway. Congressman Bera was joined by Airport Director John Wheat and Airport Chief Administrative Officer for Planning and Development TJ Chen, and will discussed other ongoing projects to improve the safety and efficiency of the airport.

Sacramento Mather Airport is great news for our community," said Congressman Bera. "Improving the conditions of the runway and safety with lights is critical to attracting, maintaining, and expanding private investment and economic development in the area. Making our airport more convenient and efficient to passengers and businesses has a positive impact on our community and our economy."

"Sacramento County is grateful of the efforts made by the Congressman to secure Federal funding from the FAA to

"This investment in improve the airfield at Mather Airport, which is a vital component of the aviation and cargo infrastructure for the Sacramento region," said Airport Director John Wheat.

This grant will fund the rehabilitation of approximately 670 feet of the existing connector Taxiway B-North that is needed to maintain structural integrity of the pavement. It will also fund the installation of a new Taxiway B-North edge lighting system to enhance safe airfield operations during low visibility conditions.

Unsecured Property Taxes Due

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Annual bills for Sacramento County unsecured property taxes for fiscal year 2016-2017 will be mailed on July 22, 2016 and are payable without delinquent penalties through August, 31, 2016.


Unsecured property tax bills are mailed to all owners of unsecured property in July of each year. If you owned unsecured property in Sacramento County, such as a boat or aircraft, or if you leased or owned fixtures and equipment related to a business on January 1, 2016, and do not receive a tax bill by August 15, 2016, please contact the Sacramento County Tax Collector's Unsecured Property Tax Unit at (916) 874-7833, between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m., Monday through Friday excluding holidays.

NONRECEIPT OF A TAX BILL DOES NOT EXCUSE DELINQUENCY OR ALLOW THE TAX COLLECTOR TO CANCEL PENALTIES OR COLLECTION COSTS.

Tax bills become delinquent if not paid in the Tax Collector's Office by 5:00 p.m. on August 31, 2016, or received by mail bearing a postmark of August 31, 2016.

If the tax bill is not paid by the delinquency date, a 10% penalty and collection cost will be added. DMV registration may be withheld on boats if unsecured property taxes are reported delinquent. If a tax bill remains unpaid after October 31, 2016, additional collection costs and monthly penalties at the rate of 1.5% will be added to the base tax.

Payments may be made by mail or in person at the County Tax Collector's Office located at 700

SB 1146 Turning Christian Colleges Upside Down

Democrats in control of the California Assembly Judiciary Committee have passed SB 1146 to redefine Christianity at Christianformat colleges by forcing support of the unnatural, unhealthy, unbiblical, and tyrannical homosexual-bisexual-transsexual agenda.

Thursday afternoon, SB 1146 was approved on a party-line vote, with Democrats in favor and Republicans opposed, with the exception of Republican Brian Maienschein of San Diego not voting.

"The First Amendment sets out religious and secular spheres, and we need to keep them separate," said committee member James Gallagher, a Yuba City Republican. "We don't want government involved in religion and we don't want religion controlling government, right? But with this bill, no matter what you do, you're going to infringe on a religious sphere and have the government deciding what is religious and what is not."

Another Republican committee member, Donald Wagner of Irvine, said SB 1146 "betrays a fundamental misunderstanding of what faith

is." Wagner said, "Faith is a way of life. Faith comes first," adding that SB 1146 "derives from a thoroughly flawed perspective" by prohibiting and punishing Christian colleges' religious principles and practices.

SB 1146 allows students to file lawsuits against their religious-based colleges, challenging the colleges' right to have Biblical standards on sexuality, gender, and marriage in admissions, housing, employment, student counseling, and outside groups allowed on campus.

For example, the bill forces Christian colleges to allow homosexual and transsexual activists on campus to challenge students' moral beliefs. SB 1146 would permit homosexual-couple housing and transsexual-policy restrooms on campus, and likely prohibit counseling a student to overcome homosexuality. And SB 1146 would prohibit Christian colleges from firing a professor who becomes a homosexual or transsexual activist, indoctrinating students to support sin.

"SB 1146 is passing because too many colleges and other wellmeaning opponents of the bill have made the mistake of lobbying the author, who's made his tyrannical bill a little less onerous with each amendment, enabling it to advance by sleight of hand," said Randy Thomasson, president of SaveCalifornia.com, a statewide pro-child, pro-family organization that promotes moral virtues for the common good. "If Christian colleges want SB 1146 defeated, they need to unapologetically mobilize every single supporter to call and demand SB 1146 be defeated. In this election season, they must launch bold religious-freedom campaigns with students in key Assembly districts this summer."

SB 1146 will next be heard in the Assembly Appropriations Committee in August when the Legislature returns from its monthlong recess.

Brown Signs Bill Providing Help for Those Claiming Refunds on Tax

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) -A bill sponsored by the Board of Equalization (BOE) to streamline and simplify refunds on tax liabilities is now signed by the governor and will become law January 1, 2017. AB 1856, authored by Assemblyman Matt Dababneh helps taxpayers making installment payments by only requiring they file one claim for refund, rather than one for each installment payment they have made on a single liability.

"Running a business is challenging enough without having to keep track of multiple layers of paperwork," said BOE and Legislative Committee Chairwoman Fiona Ma. "It is my goal and that of all our members to simplify and streamline our taxpayers' dealings with government agencies so they can spend more time on achieving success in their business ventures."

In several cases, BOE taxpayers have been barred by the statute of limitations from recovering all of the installment payments they made to the-BOE, even though their tax debt was cancelled or reduced to an amount less than the total payments received—because they made payments after the original claim had been filed, but did not file additional claims to cover the later payments. The new law will allow taxpayers making installment payments to file a single claim for refund before the entire liability is paid

New State-of-the-Art City Hall Building Opens for Business

CITRUS HEIGHTS (MPG) - It's business as usual once again at the new Citrus Heights City Hall located at 6360 Fountain Square Drive. On August 9, just 13 months following groundbreaking, 65 city staff moved from their temporary offices in the Grand Oaks Shopping Center on Auburn Blvd to their new state-of-the art, energy efficient facility.

At five weeks ahead of schedule for completion of staff offices, the builders wanted to give the city the option to use their new space early in exchange for working around jobs still being completed on the interior and exterior of the 35,000 square foot building.

Outside, crews were working feverishly to complete the front of the building including concrete and paving, painting, landscaping and artwork. A three tiered, 25 foot wide fountain will be the focal point of an attractive plaza area.

During a tour of the facility, Tyler Gahagan, project manager of

Ascent Builders, pointed out where the state-of-the-art acoustical wall panels and handsome wooden wall paneling in the new city council chambers will be. Many features in the new building grew out of input from the public during numerous community work sessions.

Artwork will be a focal point of the building from a large piece at the front entry way, to one at the heart of the main lobby, and many scattered throughout the facility, according to Gahagan.

Staff who were asked about their new surroundings all answered with variations of, "gorgeous", awesome", and spacious".

Customers were enjoying the short sign-in process and the comfortable chairs in the large waiting area. One customer, Larry Darling of Petkus Brothers, claimed the distinction of being the very first customer at the new city hall. He was visiting the Planning Department to obtain a building permit

By the end of the year there should be no question where any of the city of Citrus Heights services are. A 15' 10" feet tall by 12' 6" wide LED illuminated digital monument style sign is scheduled to be erected at the corner of Greenback and Fountain Square Drive, directing drivers and pedestrians to city hall, the police department, post office, and community center as well as the businesses in Regency

And yes, the city will be holding its traditional Christmas tree ceremony with a permanent tree placed in a specially designated area across from the fountain.

Citrus Heights City Council Appoints New City Manager

CITRUS HEIGHTS, CA (MPG) - The Citrus Heights City Council announced that Christopher W. Boyd has been appointed city manager effective October 1, 2016.

The announcement was made during the regular Citrus Heights City Council meeting on July 14, 2016. Boyd currently serves as chief of police for the Citrus Heights Police Department. Earlier this year Boyd was designated to act in the capacity of the City Manager during his absence.

The City of Citrus Heights incorporated in 1997 and current City Manager Henry Tingle was appointed in 1999. Best known for his strong fiscal responsibility, Tingle announced in January that he would be retiring effective September 30, 2016, after 18 years of service. In 2005, Tingle hired Boyd as the city's first chief of police, tasking him with creating a new police department. Boyd did so within ten months and under budget, replacing the sheriff's department, which had been the contract policing agency for the first nine years of cityhood. Since then, the Citrus Heights Police Department has become known for its creative approach to community policing, employee leadership development, focus on youth, and innovative programs that have consistently reduced crime every

Boyd has earned the respect and support of the citizens of Citrus Heights and his relationships within the community are strong, therefore transitioning to the role of city manager will be seamless. "It has been an honor to serve the City of Citrus Heights as chief of police. I have come to really know and love this community over these last ten years," he said. "I am equally honored and excited to now have the opportunity to serve as city manager." Citrus Heights Mayor Jeannie Bruins commented, "Chris is





Dear Dave,

My wife and I are on Baby Step 3 of your plan, and we're about halfway to building our fully funded emergency fund. We don't like our current home very much, and we'd like to sell and move as soon as possible. We have a little over \$30,000 equity in the place, so would selling the house be a viable option for funding Baby Step 3?

Dear Justin,

I wouldn't sell the house just to do Baby Step 3. That's usually a pretty easy Baby Step after you've gotten everything paid off except the house. As you know, a fully funded emergency fund means saving three to six months of expenses, so you shouldn't have to sell your home in order to accomplish

However, if you don't like the house anyway, and you're already planning on selling it, then yes, set some of the equity aside. I wouldn't put all of the equity into the next deal. I'd hold back my three to six months of expenses, so that when you move into another house you're debt-free with a

fully funded emergency fund sitting there.

It sounds like there's nothing to prevent you from selling it today, if you're sure that's what you both want to do. Just hold on to enough so that you still have an emergency fund in place, and use the remainder for your down payment. So if that equation works for you, sell the house. If not, you may need to completely save up your emergency fund before you sell in order to make it

Regardless, when you move I want you to have an emergency fund and be debt-free in addition to your down payment. That's what we're after!

Don't cut your safety net

Dear Dave,

I make \$25,000 a year, and I'm single. I expect my salary to increase to \$35,000 next year, so can I get by with a \$500 starter emergency fund instead of \$1,000? I have about \$38,000 in debt right now, including student loans, and I don't know how to keep up with bills and everything if I try saving a bigger emergency fund.

Dear Jane,

You really need a starter emergency fund of \$1,000 if you're at a point in life where student loans are in the picture. It might seem like an

impossible task right now, but that should be your first big goal. A written, monthly budget will go a long way toward helping you achieve that goal.

Making a budget for your money isn't rocket science. It's a simple, written planning process where you give a name and destination to every dollar you make before the month begins. Food, shelter, clothing, transportation and utilities are necessities, so they come first. After you've taken care of those, make sure you're current on your debts. Once all that is out of the way, put every spare dollar you can into your emergency fund.

If you do this with a sense of urgency, and limit spending to necessities, it won't take very long. You'll be surprised by how quickly it can happen, and you'll love the newfound sense of security you'll have in knowing \$1,000 is sitting there ready to cover life's little emergencies!

So, this is summer, but you did not hear it from me.



Celebrity Reflection Mirrors Excellence

Ground chuck makes for a delicious burger, but if you're the type of consumer who will spend a bit more for the quality of sirloin, let me introduce you to premium cruising. I'm assuming you've never had the pleasure as only 15 percent of American adults have ever cruised at all, let alone treat themselves to the "better" class of cruise lines in the good-better-best marketing model. After taking 19 voyages on "good" ships, I finally tasted the sweet life of "better" and it was delicious.

What a difference spending 25 percent more makes. That was the takeaway after this self-paying travel writer took a 10-day Italy & Greek Isles cruise aboard the Celebrity Reflection out of Rome. Don't get me wrong: Carnival, Royal Caribbean, Norwegian and other Big Shipcategory players generally offer a solid product at economical fares. In fact, the ship, crew and service were so good on the new Carnival Vista in May, at times it felt like premium-class cruising. But on the Celebrity Reflection, with few exceptions, there was zero interruption of excellence.

Celebrity is to Royal Caribbean what Lexus is to Toyota. Premium ships, marketed as a more personalized alternative for an upper-middleclass demographic, are typically smaller, and that holds true here; the 3,046-passenger Reflection is the newest and largest in Celebrity's fleet, yet dwarfed by every Royal Caribbean ship launched in the past decade. The next generation of Celebrity ships is scheduled to debut in 2018, and it has big hulls to fill thanks to the feature-rich Solstice class now gracing many of the Seven Seas. When Reflection debuted in 2012, it immediately set itself apart from its four older siblings with an
