Give Your Sprinklers a **Break this Fall**

Sacramento Suburban Water District Asks Customers to Voluntarily Limit Landscape Watering to One Day

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - Officials at the Sacramento Suburban Water District (District) are appealing to customers to voluntarily limit their landscape watering to one day a week this fall.

"Our customers did an outstanding job conserving water this summer, and reduced water use by nearly 36% June through August compared to 2013," said Greg Bundesen, SSWD's water conservation supervisor. "We need them to keep up the great savings this fall and winter to meet our overall target."

The request was issued as the District continues working to meet the mandatory water conservation target set by the State Water Resources Control Board. The District is required to reduce its overall water use by 32% from June 2015 through February 2016 compared to the same timeframe in 2013. The District has so far saved 2,076 million gallons of the 3,072 million gallons it must conserve, approximately 67% of the statemandated reduction.

"The biggest bang for our buck in water conservation comes from limiting landscape watering," Bundesen said. "As people stop watering their yards during the rainy winter season, we'll need to squeeze additional savings from indoor use, which is typically more challenging. That's why we're asking our customers to step up their efforts now, during the fall."

Lawns, trees, shrubs, and plants all need less water in the fall as the days become shorter and cooler, and with the

CITRUS HEIGHTS, CA (MPG) - Citrus Heights local Linda Champion has released a book called "Fairy Tales for Life: A Collection of Fourteen Original Short Stories." The book is a celebration of the fairy tale genre. Within it, a reader can find dragon slayers, talking animals, love, and betrayal.

It's easy to become lost in the worlds that the author creates. "My tales are not just for one age group," said Champion. "They are for readers both young and

old. The only requirement is that the reader be young at heart."

However, what you won't find in Champion's new book is a rehashing of old fairy tales these tales are completely original. "Yes, lovers of fairy tales will always love the old fairy tales written hundreds and sometimes thousands of years ago," said Champion. "... Peacekeepers and Peacemakers Honored at Citrus Heights City Council

CITRUS HEIGHTS, CA (MPG) - At a crowded session of the Citrus Heights City Council on October 8th, both peacekeepers and peacemakers were honored for their community strengthening efforts. After presenting awards to city police, as well as to a local activist for her work in spreading the awareness and prevention of domestic violence, the Council got down to the business of discussing agenda items during a long but productive municipal meeting.

Uniformed public servants of various kinds, including officers from the Citrus Heights Police Department and the California Highway Patrol, filled the conference room at the Citrus Heights Community Center, which currently doubles as temporary council chambers until the new City Hall is built. Chief Willie Godinez and Lieutenant Commander Brandon Straw of the CHP presented a first place award to Citrus Heights Police Department (CHPD) to honor their work in improving traffic conditions and reducing collisions. The CHPD earned this recognition by participating in the 2014 California Law Enforcement Challenge. Police Chief Chris Boyd was on hand to accept this prestigious award on behalf of his victorious law enforcement team

Chief Godinez said that the California Law Enforcement Challenge is "an annual friendly competition to identify the best in traffic safety programs, with emphasis on public education." It is patterned after the International Association of Chiefs of Police National

Law Enforcement Challenge. The Citrus Heights Police Department succeeded in taking the first place position among mid-sized municipal law enforcement agencies. Commander Straw added that, "I've had the privilege of knowing Chief Boyd a little over five years. When I grew up here, Citrus Heights was not the safest place. I know that because of Chris' leadership, integrity and professionalism—and just the job that all of you have done on City Council making—Citrus Heights is now a safe place; it's just tremendous."

After the peacekeepers received their award, a powerful peacemaker approached the podium to accept welldeserved recognition from the City. Elaine Whitefeather, the executive director of A Community for Peace, approached the Council with a basket of purple ribbons for people to take home as a reminder to stand against domestic violence. According to Whitefeather, A Community of Peace is "a safe and sacred space to connect to information, resources, education, support and understanding" that comes from those who have walked in the shoes who have suffered from violence at the hands of loved ones. "Domestic violence is a social illness that is experienced personally. Each of us can be both part of the problem and part of the solution," said Whitefeather.

While Whitefeather was passing out purple ribbons, Mayor Sue Frost said, "I just want to thank you for all the local resources that you provide Citrus Heights, for the partnership you have with the community, for the hope and happiness that you bring into peoples' lives, and for all that you're doing to make our community better." The Council then proclaimed the month of October 2015 Domestic Violence Awareness Month.

Citrus Heights Mayor Sue Frost to Run for County Supervisor

CITRUS HEIGHTS, CA (MPG) - Current Citrus Heights Mayor Sue Frost announced that she will run for County Supervisor in the 4th District, which is currently represented by Roberta MacGlashan, who is not running for re-election.

"Roberta has done a fantastic job as Supervisor, and I did not want to even consider running until she made a formal decision. After Roberta announced she would not run for re-election, I received an overwhelming response encouraging me to run for Supervisor," Frost said. "I am excited for the campaign and honored by those who have offered endorsements so quickly."

Frost announced that she has already been endorsed by Sacramento Association of Realtors, John Kabateck (former executive director of National Federation of Independent Businesses), Ken Payne (former President of Sacramento Taxpayers Association), and Carl Burton (president of Republicans of River City).

Frost is now putting her campaign team together. She announced hiring Tab Berg, who directed the campaigns of Roberta MacGlashan and Sheriff Scott Jones

"I want to continue to ensure the budget is balanced, that we prioritize public safety, and we work to encourage job growth in Sacramento

What is a Life Worth?

The question of "what is a life worth" has puzzled religious leaders and philosophers since the dawn of time. Unfortunately, the Citrus Heights City Council answered the question when presented with the issue of providing police officers body cameras, deciding that the life of a police officer is worth less than the cost of the purchase and maintenance of body cameras.

The mandatory use of body cameras raises substantial issues involving individual rights to privacy, who should or should not be allowed to view the recorded video, when or if the officer who recorded the incident should be allowed to write his/her report of an incident after viewing the recording, and where—if at all—should the video be viewed and by whom. Each of these items has a cost to the City. However, all of these issues are insignificant as compared to the worth of the life or injury of a single police officer.

Although there is nothing to assure that a mentally disturbed individual will not kill or injure a police officer, one sure way to reduce the possibility is to inform every person a police officer contacts that his/her action and words are being recorded. If the first words out of an officer's mouth are "This conversation is being video recorded," one of two things will occur:

- The most likely is that the individual speaking with the police officer will become more calm and moderate with the conversation because the recording is taking place, or
- The individual will not lower the tension of the contact, which will place the police officer on notice that assistance is needed. More

importantly, in the unlikely situation that the officer is attacked, the video will record the face of the assailant and guarantee the identification of the individual to assure a subsequent arrest and conviction.

Inexplicably, the number of attacks on police officers are increasing. Police officers need to know that as residents, we require the hiring of the best and the brightest candidates. If we as Citrus Heights residents wish to retain the best-qualified police officers, it is absolutely necessary that they receive the best equipment and training available, along with community support and reasonable wages. Body cameras represent but one more tool to protect police officers and demonstrate community support.

There is no doubt that body camera videos may be the subject of abuse, but that is true of all technology. There will be incidents that the individual officer, the police department, or the City of Citrus Heights would rather not be recorded. However, the recording of the assault upon or murder of a police officer will be the most invaluable tool available to bring the perpetrator to justice. Today, the death of Sacramento County Deputy Sheriff Jeff Mitchell, who was shot to death over five years ago while checking a suspicious vehicle on an isolated county road near Sloughhouse, remains unsolved. A video recording of the contact assuredly would have led to the arrest and conviction of the perpetrator. A similar tragic unresolved homicide should never be allowed to happen in Citrus Heights.

Implementing mandatory use of video cameras in Citrus Heights faces numerous obstacles, not the least of which are the Police Chief's and City



Council's resistance. However, the cost per resident per year to implement body cameras is less than \$3 per year. For me as a Citrus Heights resident, the knowledge that everything possible has been done to assure the personal safety of each officer on each watch by paying \$3 per year is more important than purchasing a cheeseburger and french fries for \$3 at a fast food restaurant, the very same cost per resident as a year of maintenance of body cameras for police

The Citrus Heights City Council has answered the age old question of "what is a life worth?" It is worth the same as the cost of a hamburger and fries. Unfortunately, our City Council members do not agree that cost of a single purchase of a burger and fries is better spent to protect those who serve and protect our community.

problem worse because you are reinforcing the problem and even making the problem bigger than it is by focusing on it. Resolve to speak positively.





You never know what might happen, and asking Him for help is never a bad idea. Who knows? He might even start dating some strong, mature young woman who'll jerk a knot in his tail and straighten him up!

Recent cases of interest

CASE: John Matta PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Sheri Greco, Homicide Unit

Fifty-four-year-old John Matta was convicted by jury of the first-degree murder of his mother.

On May 18, 2014, John Matta killed 75-year-old Janet Matta in their Antelope home. Matta beat and choked his mother to death. She died from blunt force trauma and asphyxiation. John Matta had a documented history of elder abuse against his mother.

Matta faces a sentence of 25 years to life in prison. Sentencing is set for November 17, 2015, at 3:00 p.m. in Department 39 before the Honorable David Abbott.

CASE: Jason Wymer

PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Quirina Orozco, Special Assault & Child Abuse Unit

Forty-four-year-old Jason Wymer was convicted by jury of multiple sexual assault and exploitation charges.

In January 2013, a citizen tried to text a photo of her 8-year-old daughter to a family member. The photo was instead received by Jason Wymer, who was unknown to the sender. Wymer began texting the sender requesting more photos and began communicating in a sexually explicit manner to who he thought was an 8 year old. The FBI began an investigation, which revealed thousands of images and videos of child pornography taken from 2010 to 2011 in Sacramento and San Joaquin counties. The images included children and toddlers engaged in sexual acts with adults. Several images showed a 3-year-old child being sexually abused by Wymer and co-defendant Stormy Mollissa Myers.

Wymer faces a maximum potential sentence in excess of 100 years to life in prison. Sentencing is set for November 20, 2015, at 11:00 a.m. in Department

38 before the Honorable Sharon Lueras. Thirty-five-year-old Stormy Mollissa Myers pled guilty to committing a sex

act with a child under 10 years old and committing lewd acts upon a child. Pursuant to the plea agreement, Myers will be sentenced to 15 years to life in prison. Sentencing is set for February 26, 2016, at 9:00 a.m. in Department 38 before the Honorable Sharon Lueras. Myers will also plead to federal charges of sexual exploitation of a minor.

CASE: Hector Caballero & Damian

PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Kari Reeve, Gangs & Hate Crimes Unit

Twenty-year-old Hector Caballero was convicted by jury of first-degree murder and conspiracy to commit a crime. Twenty-five-year-old Damian Flores was convicted of second-degree murder and conspiracy to commit a crime. The jury also found gun and gang allegations true for both defendants.

Caballero and Flores are Norteños gang members. On November 23, 2013, they walked the neighborhood of their rival Sureños gang confronting individuals they thought were members. They approached Ricardo Guerro and asked if he was a Sureño. Mr. Guerro said he was not a gang member, and he was not intimidated by them. Perceiving this response as disrespectful, Caballero shot him twice. The victim died almost instantly.


Once incarcerated, both defendants attempted to send notes to fellow gang members directing them to intimidate and threaten witnesses. The notes were eventually confiscated by law enforcement.

Caballero has two prior strike convictions, both gang related felony assaults. Flores has a prior strike conviction, a felony assault with a firearm.

Both defendants face a maximum potential sentence of life in prison without the possibility of parole. Sentencing is set for November 5, 2015 at 1:30 p.m. in Department 26 before the Honorable Curtis Fiorini.



Physicians Warn of Halloween Eye Risk

Over-the-Counter Contact Lenses Could Contain Dangerous Chemicals

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG)

- Every Halloween, costume contact lenses fly off the shelves as people look to accentuate their outfits with those appealing visual accessories. These non-prescription lenses, however, can cause potentially blinding infections.

To help prevent eye damage and vision loss, the California Academy of Eye Physicians and Surgeons (CAEPS) and the American Academy of Ophthalmology (AAO) are warning costume shoppers about over-the-counter decorative lenses after a recent study found that several varieties tested positive for chlorine and other harmful chemicals.

"While Halloween costumes complete with over-the-counter contact lenses can be fun, many people do not consider the possible damage these seemingly harmless accessories could be doing to their eyes," said Leah Levi, MD, CAEPS president. "We take Californians' vision very seriously, so we believe the safest way to avoid any potential loss of vision or eye damage is to avoid costume contacts altogether."

Research published in September found the potentially harmful substances in three types of cosmetic contact lenses produced in Ireland, Taiwan, and South Korea. Iron was found in four pairs of lenses. One pair seeped chlorine after a routine rinse, prompting concern from researchers about toxicity to the eye. The chemicals likely come from colorants used to

tint and create playful patterns on the lenses. The study also noted that colorants printed or pressed onto some decorative lenses create an uneven texture. Those rough surfaces could scratch the eyes, potentially allowing in bacteria that can cause infection and even blindness

Four of the five lenses in the study are not available legally in the United States because they are not approved by the US Food and Drug Administration. Despite that sales restriction, many decorative lenses of unknown origin can be bought online. Around Halloween, they often crop up for sale at beauty parlors, flea markets, or even gas stations. The problem is that contact lenses not approved by the FDA may be made with materials that can harm the eyes by causing corneal ulcers or other corneal irritations or infections (keratitis). These conditions can result in scarring that impairs vision or causes blindness. For this reason, both Academies advise against wearing decorative lenses without a prescription.

"You can't be sure what you're getting when you buy over-the-counter contact lenses, which can be very dangerous to your eyes," said ophthalmologist Thomas Steinemann, MD, spokesperson for the AAO. "If you want decorative contact lenses, get a prescription or steer clear of them. It's not worth the risk to your vision."

Costume Contact Lens Safety Guidelines

To safely wear decorative contact lenses this Halloween or any time of year, the California Academy of Eye Physicians and Surgeons and the American Academy of Ophthalmology recommend following these guidelines:

- Only buy decorative contact lenses from retailers who require a prescription and sell FDA-approved products.
- If you don't already have a contact lens prescription, obtain a valid prescription and eye exam from an ophthalmologist—a medical doctor who treats eye conditions and diseases—or an optometrist.
- Even those who don't require lenses to correct their vision need to get examined and fitted for the right size plano (zero power) cosmetic contacts by an eye health professional. Ill-fitting lenses can scratch the surface of the eye, creating an opening for infection.
- Redness, swelling, excessive discharge, pain, or discomfort can signal eye infection. If you have these symptoms, immediately see your prescriber. Eye infections can cause blindness if left untreated.



FBI Announces Results of Nationwide Human Trafficking Operation

Local Operations Aid in Recovery of Five Juveniles and Arrest of Seven Alleged Pimps

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - Officials from the FBI and its state and local partners (including the Citrus Heights, Rancho Cordova, Fresno, Fairfield, and Sacramento Police Departments as well as Sacramento County Probation Department) recently announced that 149 underage trafficking victims were recovered and 154 pimps were arrested in a nationwide human trafficking operation last week. The initiative, dubbed Operation Cross Country IX, is a national program spearheaded by the FBI and the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children, along with state and local law enforcement partners across the country. The initiative targets the criminal enterprises responsible for the commercial sex trafficking of children.

"Human trafficking is a monstrous and devastating crime that steals lives and degrades our nation," said Attorney General Loretta Lynch. "As a result of the FBI's outstanding coordination and exemplary efforts alongside state and local partners during Operation Cross Country, more children will sleep safely tonight, and more wrongdoers will face the judgment of our criminal justice system. The Department of Justice will continue to aggressively and persistently fight this heinous crime, and to hold its perpetrators

accountable to the fullest extent of the law."

In the area served by the FBI's Sacramento field office, FBI officials announced the recovery of five underage victims and the arrest of seven pimps as part of the takedown. The FBI Sacramento field office and its law enforcement partners conducted multi-day operations in the area served by the FBI Sacramento field office focused on the metropolitan areas of Fairfield, Fresno, and Sacramento. These operations also resulted in the arrest of 90 adults for various offenses including probation violations and prostitution-related charges.

In Sacramento, the FBI's Sacramento Child Exploitation Task Force—that includes officers from the Sacramento Police Department—recovered two minors and arrested three alleged pimps; the Sacramento County Sheriff's Department recovered one minor.

In Fairfield, the FBI, Fairfield Police Department, Solano County Sheriff's Office, and Vallejo Police Department recovered one child and arrested two alleged pimps.

Fresno operations conducted by the FBI's Child Exploitation Task Force—which includes officers from the Fresno Police Department—the Fresno Sheriff's Office, and Tulare Police Department resulted in the recovery of one minor and the arrest of

two alleged pimps.

"We sincerely thank our partners in Fairfield, Fresno, and Sacramento for their participation in Operation Cross Country IX and their continued, year-round commitment to the difficult task of identifying, locating, and recovering children who have been exploited and ensuring that their traffickers face justice," said Special Agent in Charge Monica M. Miller of the FBI Sacramento field office. "While the arrest of the offender has an immediate result, only recovering a child can offer him or her an opportunity to begin to accept services necessary to begin the healing process and restore a sense of normalcy."

In addition to Operation Cross Country IX, the FBI and Fairfield Fresno Police Department, Clovis Police Department, Merced Police Department, Tulare Police Department, and Visalia Police Department completed Operation Summer Tour in August. The five-week operation focused on commercial sexual exploitation of minors primarily in Clovis, Fresno, and Merced. The multi-week effort resulted in the recovery of 11 children as well as the arrest of six pimps. Additionally, 105 adults were arrested for a variety of other violations including probation violations and prostitution-related charges.

Operation Cross Country IX is the largest in the nine-year history of the initiative, with 53 FBI field offices and 73 Child Exploitation Task Forces taking part in the operation in 135 cities across America, including Citrus Heights, Rancho Cordova, Fairfield, Fresno, and Sacramento. Nationwide, more than 500 law enforcement officials conducted both "in-call" and "out-call" operations in hotels, casinos, truck stops and in other areas known as frequented by prostitutes, sex-traffickers, and their customers.

"We're proud to partner with the FBI and provide support to both law enforcement and victim specialists in the field as they work to locate and recover survivors of child sex trafficking," said Linda Krieg, acting chief executive officer of NCMEC. "The number of children recovered and pimps arrested in this year's operation highlights the importance of these efforts today and every day in protecting our children from exploitation."

Operation Cross Country is part of the FBI's Innocence Lost national initiative, which began in 2003. Since the program's inception, more than 4,800 children have been recovered from underage prostitution and prosecutors have obtained more than 2,000 convictions, including at least 15 that have resulted in life sentences. Is There a Link Between Diet and Your Mental Health?

From the American Counseling Association's "Counseling Corner"

Say the word "diet" and the usual reaction is that we're talking about losing weight. Today, let's talk about "diet" as simply our daily food choices, the ones we often make without giving them much thought.

While our food choices certainly affect our weight, they also play an important role in our emotional wellbeing and overall mental health. Numerous studies have found that the foods we consume play a large role in how we feel and act.

Most parents, for example, have seen how a sugar high affects their kids. Although numerous studies have failed to find a link between sugar and hyperactivity, just about any mom will tell you that her son or daughter seems more excited or active after eating a sugary snack.

The reason may not be so much a physiological link as a psychological one. Eating foods we like makes us feel better, and most of us are genetically programmed to like sweet-tasting things. Our love of sweet tastes comes from our ancient ancestors who learned that sweet fruits and veggies were ripe and ready to eat.

Recent studies have found even more direct links between our food choices and mental health. A 2014 study of over 3,500 people reported that long-term exposure to an unhealthy diet, one high in sugar and processed foods, appeared to increase the risk for depression.

Foods high in sugar and fat have also been cited as a risk factor leading to addictive eating. Sugar and fat trigger the same pleasure centers in the brain that addictive drugs do. The pleasurable feelings that come from eating such foods help relieve stress and cause people to overeat or even to binge eat.

Being more aware of your food choices and how they affect your moods and overall mental health can help lead to a healthier and happier you.

If you think your food choices are affecting your moods or wellbeing, try keeping a food diary for several days of what you eat and how you feel afterwards. You may find that you are turning to unhealthy choices and overeating simply to feel better.

That information can help lead you to making healthier choices. Or, if extra help is needed, talk to your family physician, a local nutritionist, or a professional counselor to help steer your diet back on track for better physical and mental health.



What **Veterans Need** to Know

Are you a veteran or do you know one? First, let me say, I love veterans. They are truly our heroes and deserve our respect and undying gratitude for their service.

Veterans are entitled to many benefits. I can't possibly list them all here, and I wouldn't want to try. But I do want to give you some basic information regarding burial that I hope you find beneficial.

There are some misconceptions about veterans getting a "free burial;" first, depending upon your service, veterans are entitled to be buried in a VA cemetery. The closest one to Sacramento is called Sacramento Valley National Cemetery, although it's not in Sacramento, it's in Dixon (in Solano County).

Please note that although you are entitled to be buried in the VA cemetery, you still must be prepared for burial and taken to the VA cemetery by a funeral home. This is where people sometimes get confused.

Simply put, your burial plot at the VA cemetery is free of fees and

yours to use if you qualify. To find out if you qualify, call a licensed funeral home and they can tell you. If you do qualify, you still need to make your final arrangements through a mortuary or funeral home. It is always a good choice to do this in advance.

This means you need to be brought into the care of the funeral home after you pass away. Your body must be prepared through either cremation or casketing, and these fees are not free or paid for by the VA.

Other important facts to know are that a licensed funeral director is required to make the arrangements with the VA cemetery at the time of need (it cannot be made in advance like other arrangements can), and that funeral home must transfer your casket or cremation urn to the VA cemetery for the interment.



THE WALK (Rated PG)

The Twin Towers of New York's World Trade Center come to life again in "The Walk," the story of a Frenchman's surreal participation in an illegal activity that didn't involve the worst strike on American soil since Pearl Harbor.

Apart from the horror of the 9/11 terror attack, let's also not forget that World Trade Center was the target of terror bombings back in

Fortunately, "The Walk" is set in 1974, allowing director Robert Zemeckis to pen a love letter to the iconic buildings that then loomed large over the New York skyline.

On August 7, 1974, the day before President Nixon resigned from office, Philippe Petit, a French aerialist, surprised unwary passersby with a high-wire walk between the towers of the almostcompleted and partially-occupied World Trade Center.

The story of daring wire walker Philippe Petit was documented in "Man on Wire," a film released in 2008 and subsequently awarded the Oscar for best documentary film.

Elsewhere, Petit's act has been described, perhaps fittingly, as the "artistic crime of the century."

An interesting take on why making a film about the seemingly impossible is director Zemeckis' observation that when you watch a wire walker, "you always have to watch by looking up at him."

"The Walk" affords viewers the point of view of Petit, wonderfully expressed here by Joseph Gordon-Levitt, a role that requires him to have a French accent that proves to be only minimally distracting.

GRIPPING HIGH WIRE ACT IN "THE WALK" PROVES STUNNING, TENSE

"The Walk" proves to be spectacular and emotional, Gordon-Levitt's Petit fulfills the director's primary objective of what it's like to be on the wire, and to be sure, the actual stunt is breathtaking.

But before the film gets to the scene of the "artistic crime," the story begins in Paris with Petit riding a unicycle and performing stunts in the public square acting the role of a struggling busker

Performing his circus act of juggling and walking on a rope strung between two trees, Petit was basically in the minor leagues until he met up with street singer Annie (Charlotte Le Bon), who became his girlfriend and partner in the eventual planning of the New York caper.

In many respects, "The Walk" is a caper film, with the heist target being the illicit act of making it up to the 110th floor of the Twin Towers with the necessary equipment and the heavy cable wires.

At first, it appears that Petit's ambition is beyond his talents. His attraction to the Twin Towers comes from a newspaper article about the architectural marvel of what would become at the time the world's tallest buildings.

Petit began doodling on the newspaper photo a line connecting the two towers, dreaming of a feat that would require him to seek out the help of Papa Rudy (Ben Kingsley), a circus performer with a lifetime of experience walking on the high wire.

After mentoring sessions with Papa Rudy, which include walking the wire under the circus tent without a safety harness and practicing in open fields, Petit assembles a team of cohorts to plan the New York adventure.

As time moves along, Petit becomes more immersed in American culture and the English Though the 3D presentation of language, even though his accent

remains unmistakably foreign. Serving as a framing device to

capture the Twin Towers in the background, Petit narrates his thought process on moving forward with an ambitious goal from a perch on the Statute of Liberty, a landmark which in itself is the welcoming point for entry into America.

Aside from Annie's dedication to his visionary yet dangerous aspiration, Petit finds a primary accomplice in his friend Jean-Louis (Clement Sibony), who has the responsibility in the pre-Internet age to document the event with still photography.

While picking up supplies at an electronics store in Manhattan, Petit and his team gain another accomplice in J.P. (James Badge Dale), who gets in on the action because, unbeknownst at first to the crew, he speaks French and understands their secret mission.

Once in New York, the story focuses on the planning stages of the caper, with Petit and his gang conducting undercover surveillance and scouting their options. Petit dons a number of disguises, from construction worker to an office drone complete with the appropriate business suit.

Interestingly, and completely riveting, is the notion that the preparation for the act itself is like a reverse heist film. The primary objective is not to steal anything, but to put the cables and equipment in a secure and hidden place.

In real life, Petit's high-wire walk, without a safety harness, took about 45 minutes. In "The Walk," the timeframe is more condensed, and yet it fully captures the extremely perilous nature of this performance.

Petit traverses the wire between the two buildings not just once but many times, pausing occasionally to kneel down and at one point to recline on the wire. If you don't feel the emotional punch of watching this hazardous stunt, check to see if you still have a pulse.

The high-wire walk creates gripping tension and suspense, and as such "The Walk" is a technical marvel that demands to be seen in 3D. You can't watch the climactic daredevil act without a feeling of shear dread or panic.

expected rains, yards will need little to no additional water. Customers willing to voluntarily limit their watering to one day per week are asked to choose one of their designated watering days (Tuesday or Saturday for odd addresses and Wednesday or Sunday for even addresses) and water only on that one day.

SSWD customers are encouraged to use the screwdriver test if they're not sure if their landscape needs water. The test can be done by taking an eight-inch screwdriver and pushing it into the ground. If the screwdriver goes in more than three inches below the surface, additional watering is not needed.



Medical Office Building and City Hall Project Moves Forward

spring, the City Council unanimously approved the Medical Office Building and City Hall Project, a unique public-privatepartnership resulting in a direct investment of \$53.2 million into the Citrus Heights economy and generating more than 170 jobs. The project consists of the development of a 68,727-squarefoot Medical Office Building and construction of a new 35.000-square-foot City Hall and adjacent 4,000-square-foot Utility Yard. The Medical Office Building will be constructed on the former City Hall site at the corner of Greenback Lane and Fountain Square Drive and City Hall will move to a new facility currently under construction at 6360 Fountain Square Drive, just north of the Post Office.

To prepare for the upcoming demolition of the former Fountain Square property, City Hall temporarily relocated to 7927 Auburn Boulevard in the Grand Oaks Shopping Center on July 13th. City Hall will operate out of the

CITRUS HEIGHTS, CA (MPG) - Last temporary location for 12 to 14 months during the construction of a new facility. The Police Department (6315 Fountain Square Drive) and Community Center (6300 Fountain Square Drive) will remain in their current locations

On August 31st, AMPCO Contracting began demolition of the former City Hall Complex, located at 7115 Greenback Lane. Following the demolition, Panattoni Development Company will construct a three-story, 68,727-square-foot medical office building on the site of the former City Hall Complex. The medical office building will be operated by Dignity Health and will provide primary and specialty care services. Demolition of the former City Hall Campus is expected to be completed fall 2015.

On July 20th, Capital Partners Development Company and Ascent Builders commenced construction of the new City Hall and adjacent Utility Building at 6360 Fountain Square Drive. On September 28th, crews poured the

foundation slab for the new building. Next, the contractors will finish installing site utilities, construct curbs and gutters, and form the concrete walls. The new City Hall facility is on-schedule for a late summer 2016 completion.

The new City Hall will consolidate 65 employees once housed in four separate buildings into a single one-story energy-efficient facility. The state-of-the-art facility will feature a "one-stop" public counter providing community members convenient access to City services. The new building will reduce maintenance and operation costs while enhancing the City's ability to continue providing high-quality and economical services to the Citrus Heights community for years to




