## **Appreciation Picnic Honors Wounded Warriors**

CITRUS HEIGHTS, CA (MPG) -"Every Day is Veterans Day"

and "Freedom is Not Free" were both running themes throughout the day at the sixth annual Citrus Heights Veterans Appreciation and Resource Picnic on August 22nd. The event was co-hosted by the American Legion Post 637 and the GFWC Citrus Heights Women's Club.

This year, the 10 a.m. hour was set aside for the special Purple Heart Memorial Service and Celebration. Master of Ceremonies for the day was CBS 13's Dave Bender, who said he was honored to be asked to serve as Master of Ceremonies.

Chris Lambert Jr., Military Order of the Purple Heart chaplain, and his wife, Susie, were guest speakers. Lambert is a U.S. Marine Corps veteran. He was awarded three Purple Hearts while assigned to Alpha 1/5 rifle platoon in Vietnam. This was a unique presentation as they addressed the stress issues experienced by families from every war that are "overlooked and minimized by American politicians and the

Susie Lambert delivered a poignant, self-revealing essay entitled, "Who Am I" that delved into their past. Upon her husband's return from Tet Offensive in Hue City, Vietnam, their life was never normal. The family experienced anger, 42 jobs, self-medication, overwork, and no family relationships. Yet, it took 42 years—until 2010—for changes to be made. Lambert was only then

VA and other resources. Susie shared that things are better now; they talk more and laugh more and she listens. Her hope on this day is to reach out to the young veterans who are suffering from their own demons and the mental and physical scars that run deep. There is help for them.



## Citrus Heights Fifth Annual Mutt Strut Volunteers Needed for United

Mutt Strut to Raise Funds for Visually Impaired

#### CITRUS HEIGHTS, CA (MPG) - Calling all dogs, runners, walk-

ers, and their humans! The fifth annual Mutt Strut, a 2K/5K timed run or walk for dogs and their human companions, will be held at Rusch Park in Citrus Heights on Saturday, September 19th from 9 a.m. to noon.

In 2014, over \$10,000 was raised for the needs of those dealing with vision loss. Over 275 people participated in the event, including 106 race contenders, over 100 volunteers, and a dozen vendors.

Thirteen teams competed for "top dog" fundraising honors. Team Tahoe, consisting of Elena Thomason and her golden retriever guide dog named Tahoe, brought home that honor for the fourth year after raising \$1,700. Thomason, along with other teams and their donors, raised a total of over \$5,000. They hope to exceed this amount in 2015.

New this year, the Mutt Strut will be a fundraiser for the California Council of the Blind and City of Hope. For over 80 years, the California Council of the Blind has been the largest organization of people who are blind and visually impaired in California.

"The Mutt Strut is vitally important in supporting the work of the California Council of the Blind," said Jeff Thom, California Council of the Blind statewide president. Thom added that they offer college scholarships, low-interest loans for businesses, technology support, advocacy, crisis intervention, peer support, and information and referral services to Californians who are blind or visually impaired.

The City of Hope Comprehensive Cancer Center is a treatment, biomedical research, and education center that focuses on eliminating lifethreatening diseases. It aims to transform scientific discoveries into improved prevention strategies and treatments for cancer and other diseases.

Registration is \$30 for adults, with reduced rates for students and children. Registration includes a pancake breakfast provided by Embarcadero Lions Club, a Mutt Strut t-shirt, and a "Wag Bag" with goodies donated by local businesses. The run portion of the event is again being organized and officially timed by a professional timing company. Individuals, couples, and families are invited to walk or run with or without a dog. Organizers are hoping to attract more families and their pets to this year's event.

Check in begins at 8 a.m., and the Mutt Strut at 9 a.m. Vendors, activities, and entertainment are from 9:30 a.m. to noon. For more information, call Jeff Thom at (916) 995-3967 or email jeff. thom@ccbnet.org.

## **Jury Duty Scam Nearly Costs Senior \$500**

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - Better Business Bureau is warning area residents about a jury duty scam that nearly cost one senior Sacramento resident \$500.

The victim received a phone call informing him that he missed a jury duty summons. He informed the caller of his permanent waiver due to health reasons and that he is not required to perform jury duty. Undeterred, the scam artist pressed on.

"To fix this problem right away without further action against him, he would be required to pay \$500 right now. If he refused, the authorities would be by his home the following morning to take him into custody," his caretaker recounted to BBB.

The resident became suspicious of the call when he was pressed to make payment immediately, and hung up the phone. Following a web search, the would-be victim found a report by Better Business Bureau warning consumers about jury duty scams. The Sacramento Superior Court also warns residents of scams like these, and on their website advises that if you receive a telephone call from someone identifying himself or herself as a court employee or an employee of the Sacramento County Sheriff's Department regarding a failure to appear for jury service, this is a scam. Do not provide any personal information or pay them any money.

Avoid being the victim of a jury duty scam and remember:

- ·Watch out for the red flags. Courts almost exclusively contact consumers about jury duty by postal mail, not by phone or email. If you receive a phone call in the evening or late at night, it is also likely that it is a scam. Court-related calls should come during normal business hours.
- •You cannot always rely on caller ID. Scam artists often spoof phone numbers of legitimate organizations to gain the victim's trust. If you think you

are being contacted by a scam artist, ask what their name is and where they are calling from. Hang up, and do a general web search or contact your local BBB to find the phone number yourself to verify.

- Never send money to someone you do not know. Court officials or police departments will never shake you down for payment or personal information over the phone. Requests for payment via wire transfer or prepaid debit card may also be signs of a scam.
- Think you may have missed a jury duty summons? Contact your local courts directly to find out if you missed a jury duty summons.
- Contact your local BBB. If you think you have been contacted by a scam artist, or are unsure how to contact your local court, contact your local Better Business Bureau at bbb.org.



## **Caltrans Behaving Badly**

- California's highways are crumbling. It's a simple fact that we need to send more funding toward fixing our transportation infrastructure.

Sacramento Democrats believe that funding must come from increased taxes on fuel and fees on drivers. But the kneejerk reaction to go back to the public tax trough is unconscionable when multiple reports continue to show high levels of government waste. Consider the following facts:

•A recent report by the California State Auditor Report found that Caltrans approved the timesheets of an engineer who played golf for 55 workdays from August 2012 to March 2014.

•The Los Angeles Times recently reported that the government email addresses of dozens of California state workers were included in the hacked list of users of Ashley Madison, the online dating site for married people, including employees from Caltrans.

• A report by the nonpartisan and independent Legislative Analyst's Office recommends eliminating 3,500 redundant positions at Caltrans. The report found that this would generate \$500 million annually for road repair, without impacting current construction projects.

If we can afford to pay 3,500 redundant employees to do things such as play golf and seek illicit affairs, we can afford to

pay to fix some potholes!

The majority party put crumbling roads in the back seat while they pushed forward with fast-lane new spending programs during this year's budget planning. Assembly Republicans have offered a nine-point plan to provide \$6.6 billion to fix our roads without raising taxes, but Democrat leadership has stalled on the plan. It's long past time for the majority party to come to the table to discuss... or maybe they're just stuck in traffic.

## **Important Key** Consumer **Advice**



Memorial Parks Mortuaries & Crematory

Have you ever heard one of those horror stories about a funeral home that has abused the public trust? The reason some of those stories stick with us is because they are so rare.

The funeral, cremation and cemetery industry is highly regulated – especially here in California. The Department of Consumer Affairs is diligent about inspecting funeral homes, crematories and cemeteries on a regular basis. I commend them for their diligence.

There is no more sacred duty than to take someone's loved one into our care and trust that they will be treated with the utmost dignity. We consider it an honor and a privilege to do so.

When you are researching mortuaries and/or cemeteries, you are encouraged to check with the California Department of Consumer Affairs (DCA) to see if that firm has had any recent inspection violations or consumer complaints.

Did you know that in California embalming is not required by law? A funeral home typically cannot force you to embalm your loved one, however, under certain circumstances it may be necessary and required. For example, if your family member will be shipped to

another state or country on a common carrier (train, airplane, etc.) they must be embalmed or shipped with dry ice.


Many funeral homes have company policies regarding embalming. This means that they may not be obligated to offer a public viewing of your family member without embalming because it can be considered a public health concern to do so. Always ask what their embalming policies are.

Additional key consumer advice for everyone is that you know that all funeral homes and mortuaries are required by law to make their General Price List (GPL) available to you. Not just for you to look at – but for you to have a copy to take with you. This protects consumers so they are treated fairly in all monetary interactions with each funeral home. It also helps you make a better informed decision because not all funeral service packages are equal. They include and exclude different services so compare them carefully.

## They're Back!

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (STATEPOINT) - Back-to-school prep means more than a trip to the office supply store. Help kids stay strong, healthy, and safe this school year by putting wellness front and center.

"Thinking about back-to-school now can help parents keep kids on track for a healthy summer and start to school," says Dr. Sandra Hassink, MD, FAAP, President of the American Academy of Pediatrics.

With that in mind, Hassink recommends taking the following

#### **Ease into the School Schedule**

Ease the back-to-school transition by keeping bedtime and meals scheduled during the summer and adjusting timing as school approaches. If your child has been going to bed later than usual, begin adjusting his or her bedtime earlier toward the end of summer. Depending on age, children and teens need between 8.5 to 9.5 hours of sleep nightly.

For young children, arranging to see their new classroom and meet their new teacher before school starts can calm first-day jitters. Go over the school schedule with your child, including how she will get to school and what the plans are for after school time.

#### Schedule a Pediatric Visit

The back-to-school season is a good time for scheduling a pediatric exam. Create a list of items you want to discuss with your child's pediatrician. This list should include ensuring your child is upto-date on vaccinations, a crucial part of preventive care.

It's a good idea to build a medical home with a pediatrician by sticking with one doctor or medical practice throughout childhood and adolescence. The doctor will be better informed of your child's medical history and aware of any emerging problems.

Beyond medical testing, pediatricians are well equipped to counsel patients and parents on emotional and social issues, as well as issues that often crop up during adolescence, such as smoking, drugs, drinking, sexual activity, and depression.

"Parents can ask a pediatrician about anything related to the care of their child or teen, medical or not," says Dr. Hassink. "The visit can be a good way to bring up these issues."

#### Consider Sports

Sports can foster confidence,

cooperation, and healthy habits, and the start of the school year brings many opportunities to join various programs.

Hydration, nutrition, and proper conditioning are important for any sport, especially those with intense training in warm weather. Schedule a sports physical with your pediatrician to discuss your child's overall health and how to prevent injuries.

#### **Talk Safety**

If your child will be walking to school, travel the route with him to assess its safety. Find out about traffic patterns and crossing guards. Teach your child safety rules like looking both ways. If possible, have your child commute with an older sibling or neighbor. If your child will be riding a bike or skateboard, be sure he wears a helmet. Review basic rules for safer riding. Bus riders should also be mindful of safety rules, like remaining in one's seat and listening to the driver.


