





# **City Council Meeting Addresses Issues**

CITRUS HEIGHTS, CA (MPG) - Floor plans and interior decorations for the new city hall were on the minds of the Citrus Heights City Council, who met on Thursday, September 10th in a special session followed by the Council's regular meeting an hour later. A 35,000 square foot facility with a 4,000 square foot utility yard is intended to be ready for the city's administrative needs by the summer of 2016. The draft of the new floor plan, along with the decorative scheme and finishes, were approved by consensus.

Council Member Jeannie Bruins expressed a minor reservation she had about the need for a more lively color scheme in the new City Hall's furniture, fixtures, and equipment, which are currently proposed to come in subdued earth hues with names like "Earthly Pleasures," "Toffee Crunch," and "Gilded Pear."

At 7 p.m., Cub Scout Troop 537 opened the regular meeting with a presentation of the colors and a flag salute. During the public comments session, Citrus Heights resident Arthur Ketterling voiced a complaint that the audible crossing signals designed for the hard of hearing were too quiet on the major crosswalks of the city. The Council took Ketterling's complaint into consideration.

The Council addressed agenda items dealing with the approval and adoption of a recognized obligation payment schedule for the period of January 1st through June 30th, 2016, which was unanimously approved, as well as a recommendation of the resolution for the acceptance of the 2015 Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant funds in the amount of \$24,219, which was also approved. These funds are earmarked for the purchase of an alternative source of lighting for crime scene investigators in Citrus Heights.

The final motion of the evening, which the Council carried, was for a resolution authorizing the city manager to execute addendum #1 with the Anaheim-based AMPCO construction company in the amount of \$152,020 for demolition of the old City Hall. The addendum is proposed to prevent the adverse effect that these operations would have on local air quality.

Sadly, civility has become a counter-culture value in our society. I don't know if you've noticed how disrespectful and uncivil our culture has become. 

# **A Framework** for Patient Harm

A group of doctors has decided to rewrite the Hippocratic Oath.

The ancient pledge charges physicians with applying "all measures that are required" to help the sick. The American Society of Clinical Oncology (ASCO) wants to add a caveat: "unless those measures are too expensive. Then let the patient die."

The oncologists' group has developed a "conceptual framework" that relies on cost-benefit analysis to determine the most "valuable" treatments for different patients.

Sounds innocent enough. But healthcare outcomes cannot be reduced to cost-benefit calculations. By focusing on the cost of a treatment—rather than its potential benefit—the oncologists are allowing dollar signs to dictate whether a patient lives or

Under ASCO's framework, new treatments will be judged "based on clinical benefit, side effects and cost." Those are the exact same measures health insurers use in limiting patient access to treatments. Indeed, ASCO wants insurers to use its calculator to "evaluate the relative value of new treatments" as they develop benefit structures and adjust premiums.

Such "controls" could include shifting drugs to the highest cost-sharing tier of an insurance plan or requiring patients to try older, cheaper drugs before receiving the most cutting-edge therapies.

Never mind that the Obama Administration has warned "placing most or all drugs that treat a specific condition on the highest cost tiers discourages enrollment by individuals based on age or based on health conditions" is discriminatory.

The oncologists are effectively asking insurers to discriminate against cancer patients—in direct contradiction of the Affordable Care Act's intent.

Further, ASCO has concluded that a treatment that can keep patients alive for weeks or months has no value.

The framework assigns zero value to any treatment that doesn't increase survival by 20%. Right away, the formula would deem numerous modern treatments for cancer worthless.

That 20% figure is arbitrary. Take a lung cancer patient who is alive today because of the accumulation of treatments that never made that arbitrary threshold. Cardiologists hailed a just-approved drug that reduces the risk of death from heart failure by 20% as revolutionary.

Under ASCO's framework, sorry—not good enough.

Between 1987 and 2000, various AIDS therapies increased patient life expectancy by less than 20% a year. Had ASCO's framework been instituted then, thousands of AIDS patients who benefited from those treatments wouldn't be alive today.

ASCO defends its guidelines by claiming that expensive new treatments have sown "unrealistic patient and family expectations that lead clinicians to offer or recommend some of these services, despite the lack of supporting evidence of utility or benefit." America's healthcare system can't afford limitless spending on cancer treatments, the group says.

True, spending on cancer drugs has risen. In 2014, it topped \$100 billion. But that's just 1% of U.S. healthcare spending.

Moreover, these medicines are worth their price tags.

Successful drug therapies reduce overall costs by diminishing the need for future medical attention. According to a study from the Center for Value and Risk in Health, specialty drugs "tend to confer greater benefits and hence may still offer reasonable value for money."

Successful treatment also benefits the nation. Cancer survivors have contributed \$4.7 trillion to the economy since 1990, simply by living and working longer.

By valuing treatments based on costs rather than the benefit they provide to patients, the ASCO framework violates both the letter and spirit of the Hippocratic Oath. It should be scrapped before it puts patients in danger.



## **Governor Signs Legislation that Limits Access to Direct Democracy**

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - Governor Brown signed Assembly Bill 1100 (Low-

D) into law on September 1st. Effective January 1st, 2016, citizens who wish to submit a ballot initiative or referendum must pay \$2,000, instead of the current fee of \$200.

"Direct democracy is a citizen's right—a cornerstone of the checks and balances of democracy that have been protected passionately in California," said Senator Jim Nielsen (R-Gerber). "Raising the fee by 900% is cost prohibitive."

The ballot initiative process engages voters and increases

interest and participation in elections. The intent of this extraordinary fee increase was

to deter frivolous filings, but with this new \$2,000 charge, the freedom and balance of powers that California's early Reformers established are slowly being eroded away.

This exponential fee increase will rob ordinary Californians from getting their ideas on the ballot and reserve that privilege only to the state's elite political class.

"Elected officials should increase voter participation, not discourage it," Nielsen added.

## **State Officials Honor Latino American Veterans**

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG)

- State officials gathered on September 15th at El Soldado ("The Soldier") Memorial in the State Capitol Park to honor the sacrifices and contributions of Latino American Veterans.

"We are so grateful to the veterans who continue to serve," said Senator Jim Nielsen (R-Gerber), who leads the Senate Committee on Veterans Affairs. "In celebrating Hispanic Heritage Month, it is appropriate to thank and express our gratitude to generations of Latino men and women for their love of country and selfless service."

To kick off National Hispanic Heritage Month, CalVet held a ceremony to honor the 296,000 Latino American Veterans who honorably defended our country in war and those who serve during times of peace.

Latinos represent the highest number of Medal of Honor recipients per capita of any ethnic group. During World War II, about half a million Latinos served with distinction.

A symbol of the military contributions of Latinos from all branches of the military, El Soldado is the only such monument located on a state capitol grounds in the nation. The existing statue is the centerpiece of a planned expansion, which will recognize Latino military veterans from all wars, including Medal of Honor awardees. The expansion is funded by private donations.

The statue was commissioned in 1948 by the wives and mothers of Mexican-American veterans, and eventually donated to the State of California, with the expectation that it would

become an official and permanent state memorial. In 1975, El Soldado was moved to its present location across the street from the Main (West) entrance to the State Capitol.

"These heroes volunteer to risk their lives to protect ours; I cannot think of a higher calling than that. With gratitude in our hearts, we thank our veterans and their families for their service," Senator Nielsen added.

Property owners can access CSLB's Disaster Help Center at www.cslb.ca.gov or CheckTheLicenseFirst.com to tap into helpful publications that can be ordered or downloaded. These include "After a Disaster, Don't Get Scammed" and "What You Should Know Before Hiring a Contractor." CSLB's "Rebuilding After a Natural Disaster" video also is available on YouTube. In addition to the website, all information can be requested by calling CSLB's Disaster Hotline, (800) 962-1125, staffed Monday through Friday from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m., or its 24/7 automated information line, (800) 321-CSLB (2752).

CSLB is also warning wildfire victims to be wary of unscrupulous and unlicensed contractors who may solicit to rebuild their homes or businesses. Avoid rushing into any agreement or contract until you have verified with CSLB that the person is licensed for the type of work that is being offered. Remember: construction work that costs \$500 or more in combined labor and material costs must be

performed by a state-licensed

CSLB investigators are already in the fire-ravaged parts of Amador, Calaveras, and Lake Counties, educating fire victims and looking for any signs of unlicensed contracting. Warning signs also are being posted. Anyone found contracting without a license in an area for which a state or federal state of emergency has been declared can face felony charges. Those convicted of unlicensed contracting in a declared disaster zone are subject to a maximum of 16 months in state prison and a fine of up to \$10,000 (Business & Professions Code 7028.16).

CSLB will join multiple other state and local agencies at Local Assistance Centers that are expected to be opened within a few days in the affected communities.

"It is heartbreaking that residents have lost so much," said CSLB Registrar Cindi Christenson. "The fire victims need to be vigilant and protect themselves against predators who might try to take advantage of them at their weakest moments. We strongly encourage homeowners who are looking to rebuild to first check CSLB's website before deciding on a contractor.'

CSLB urges everyone to follow these guidelines before hiring a contractor:

Avoid hiring the first contractor

- Avoid rushing into repairs: get at least three bids for comparison and check references;
- Hire only licensed contractors and ask to see their license and a photo ID;
- Always check the license number on CSLB's website at www.cslb.ca.gov or CheckTheLicenseFirst.com, and contact the business directly if you have any questions;
- Down payments are limited to 10 percent of the contract price or \$1,000, whichever is less. (There is an exception for about two dozen licensees who carry special blanket performance and payment bonds. These exceptions are noted on CSLB's website);
- Don't pay in cash, and don't let payments get ahead of the work;
- Get a written contract, and don't sign until you completely understand the terms.

CSLB also reminds residents to make sure their contractor pulls necessary permits and receives required inspections from city or county building departments for any construction, reconstruction, or installation of air conditioners, heaters, or water heaters.

## **Andrew & Williamson Fresh Produce Recalls Cucumbers**

**SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) -**California Department of Public Health (CDPH) State Health Officer Dr. Karen Smith has warned people not to eat garden cucumbers imported from Mexico and distributed by Andrew & Williamson Fresh Produce because these cucumbers may be contaminated with Salmonella. CDPH is currently aware of 285 individuals in 27 states infected with Salmonella serotype Poona, with 51 of these case-patients being reported from 17 California counties, including one death. Illnesses continue to be reported.

CDPH has been working closely with the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and local health departments across the state to assess the scope of this outbreak and identify possible causes.

Andrew & Williamson Fresh impacted by this warning. Produce of San Diego, CA, initiated a voluntary recall of their garden cucumbers, after being informed of the epidemiologic association between these cucumbers and the Salmonella Poona outbreak. The recalled garden cucumbers can be identified in distribution channels as "Limited Edition" brand polegrown cucumbers. The labeling on these cases indicates the product was grown and packed by Rancho Don Juanito in Mexico. These cucumbers were distributed between August 1st and September 3rd, 2015.

It is unlikely that cucumbers in retail grocery stores will have any identifying brand information. CDPH recommends that consumers check with their grocer to determine if the cucumbers they purchased are

Domestically produced cucumbers are not believed to be involved in this outbreak.

Symptoms of Salmonella infection include fever, abdominal cramps, and diarrhea, which may be bloody. Most infected people recover within a week. Some may develop complications that require hospitalization. Infants, the elderly, and people with weakened immune systems are at highest risk for more severe illness.

CDPH recommends consumers experiencing any ill effects after consuming cucumbers should consult their health care provider.



SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) -

Spencer Stone, Anthony Sadler, and Alek Skarlatos began a European vacation as ordinary tourists. The chums returned home as international heroes.

Armed with quick wits and aided by luck the Christian trio regard as divine intervention, they prevented a massacre that might have turned a train ride from Amsterdam into murder on the European express. Disabling an armed-to-the-teeth terrorist is now their legend—and probably inspiration for future movies. Meantime, France's Legion of Honor award, TV appearances, and hero worship are their overwhelming lot.

But homecoming topped all previous thrills. "We've been all over the world these last couple of weeks," an emotional Anthony Sadler said at last week's Sacramento rally. "All the thanks we've received don't compare to being in front of our home crowd like this."

Carmichael-raised Spencer Stone was amazed by the adulation. "We all love you," he told a 10,000-strong crowd. In uniform, the Airman First Class lived up to the "Captain America" moniker from his training days. Sadler was sartorial in slacks, shirt, and tie; Skarlatos' polo shirt and jeans did

little to hide an athlete's physique. Indeed, the three amigos were hotter than tar seal on a 100-degree Capitol Mall day.

Heralded by marching bands, drums, hoof beats, and cheers, they took the earlier procession—from Crocker Park to the State Capitol in their formidable stride. At first indulging in selfies atop their gaudy float, they soon warmed to waving and hand-slapping duties. They stooped to shake hands with front row fans. They returned compliments from well-wishers. "Thank you, boys" was a phrase often yelled at the modest trio. At Fourth Street, the first confetti blizzard provoked onboard delight.

A jet fly-over and Mayor Kevin Johnson's keys to the city were icing on the Capitol cake. An hour of ovations later, our boys were ushered away. Tearful moms, proud dads, and awed young relatives awaited.

Accolades are far from over. Captain America Stone was moved to tears when a little girl asked if he were able to fly. Former Army National Guardsman Skarlatos once envisioned a police career. Now the Carmichael hunk is foxtrotting with the stars in Los Angeles. "At some point, our lives will probably return to their intended courses," he considers. "For now, we're just trying to figure out what we're doing next
