CITRUS HEIGHTS (MPG) - Citrus Heights American Legion Post 637 and the General Federation of Women's Clubs (GFWC) Citrus Heights Women's Club are hosting the sixth annual Veterans Appreciation and Resource Picnic to honor the area's active duty servicemen and servicewomen, our retired veterans of past wars and conflicts, and their families.

This free event will be held Saturday, August 22nd at Rusch Park, located on 7801 Auburn Blvd at the Gazebo/Pavilion from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. All veterans and their families and friends are welcome.

New this year, Master of Ceremonies Dave Bender—a familiar face on Channel 13 (KOVR)—will keep the program rolling and will share his appreciation for our U.S.

The day will begin with the Citrus Heights Community Marching Band, the Folsom Marine Corps Honor Guard, and recognition of our veterans from members of City Council and local veterans groups. The Military Order of the Purple Heart is sponsoring several activities this year, including

the reading of the governor's annual Purple Heart Day Proclamation.

During the 10 a.m. hour, the public is invited to wit-

ness a special ceremony and wreath-laying honoring all California combat-wounded veterans—in particular those killed in action, the disabled, and who have died of their wounds.

Keynote speaker is Chris Lambert, a U.S. Marine Corps veteran awarded three Purple Hearts for combat action in Vietnam in 1968. He is a member of Military Order of the Purple Heart Chapter 385. Lambert's wife Susie will share her experiences as the spouse of a deployed warrior.

Lunch will be the traditional hot dog and hamburger barbeque with all the fixings and dessert. Buffalo Wild Wings of Citrus Heights will provide their famous wings for your enjoyment. Dozens of veterans' resources will be available for attendees. The special guest of honor this year is Sgt./Major Charles Linden, U.S. Army Retired, also a Purple Heart recipient during the Korean War.

Scheduled children's activities include a bounce house, balloon lady, and face painting and crafts. Be sure to look for the equines

and canines (dogs). Horses Healing Heroes along with Canine Companions for Independence, 4 Paws 2 Freedom, and the California Council for the Blind are scheduled to be present, sharing how their programs help our veterans.

Scheduled information and resource booths include Gold Star Wives and Blue Star Moms, Veterans of Foreign Wars (VFW), Citrus Heights Community Veterans Center (Veterans Golf Park for Disabled Vets). Water Merger Proposal Circles Down Drain Amidst Controversy

CITRUS HEIGHTS, CA (MPG) - Recent plans for a merger between the San Juan Water District (SJWD) and Sacramento Suburban Water District (SSWD) fell through at a June 25th meeting. Proponents said that the merger would have provided customers with more effective water management and perfected beneficial use, in addition to more groundwater for current SJWD customers. SSWD voted down the merger in a 4-1 vote, while SJWD did not take a vote.

Opponents called the merger a money grab and accused several SJWD board members of strongarm tactics to push the merger through, including threatening to run new candidates in future elections against board members of other water districts who questioned the deal.

"If [the merger] had taken place, it would have had a profound effect on about 400,000 people," said Bill Eubanks, a SSWD customer. "The attitude of the San Juan board was, 'We don't need any data, all we need is a vote.'

Emotions ran even higher when an announcement was made during the meeting that Citrus Heights city manager Henry Tingle received an email with attached screenshots of a Facebook post offering payment of \$40 to anyone who agreed to publicly testify support for the merger. SJWD board president Ted Costa demanded an apology for the audience from Citrus Heights Water District board director Ray Riehle, who forwarded the information from Tingle.

The Citrus Heights Messenger received copies of the screenshots from Tingle and reached out to the informant, Andrew Slater. While Slater, a Bay Area resident, was mistaken about Citrus Heights' jurisdiction over SJWD, he felt compelled to alert the public about the Facebook post.

"I assumed it was shady," Slater said. He said that he asked the poster—Ricky Borba, an actor from Roseville whom Slater knew from high school for more details about the offered payments to people.

"He said, 'You are mistaken,' and I asked for clarification and never got it," Slater said.

Borba told people in the post to meet with a man named Joshua Wood at the meeting for payment. The Messenger was unable to confirm the identity of Joshua Wood or his connection to the board meeting. When contacted for an interview with the Messenger, Borba declined to comment.

Construction Begins on New Citrus Heights City Hall

CITRUS HEIGHTS, CA (MPG) - The cheerful fountain and informative digital sign that has welcomed drivers to the Citrus Heights Civic Center for the last 19 years has gone dark. But while this chapter in the history

of Citrus Heights has closed, a new one is rapidly being constructed to improve the lives of those who live, work, shop, and visit this evolving city.

On March 26th, 2015, the Citrus Heights City Council approved a proposal to demolish the aging city hall on Greenback Lane and relocate city staff to

a temporary location. Dignity Health will then construct a new three-story medical office building on the site at the corner of Greenback Lane and Fountain Square Drive.

A groundbreaking ceremony for the new Citrus Heights City Hall Complex took place on July 15th at the 10.92 acre site next to the Citrus Heights Post Office. The new one-story 35,000 square foot city hall and 4,000 square foot utility yard is scheduled to be completed in late summer of 2016.

The new city office structure, to be built on about half of the available acreage, will consolidate the 65 city employees previously located in four separate buildings that made up the 5,000 square foot Fountain Square Nursery Complex. The original nursery was built in 1977 by Henry Kroeger and Kathryn Mae Van Maren Kroeger.

The 45 minute groundbreaking ceremony-attended by approximately 150 people—featured greetings from a representative Continued on page 3

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (STATEPOINT) - Being a good neighbor means more than being friendly to the humans across the street; it also means being friendly to the animals in your yard. Making your yard a safe place for local wildlife should be a top lawn care priority.

With that in mind, here are some tips for creating a healthy habitat for local critters:

Be a Valuable Rest Stop

Stock your garden with small native species of trees, shrubs, and flowers to give wildlife needed nourishment, as well as cover from predators.

A source of water can also be a great resource for visiting fauna. Whether it's a pond or a bird bath, be sure this zone is well maintained so you don't inadvertently create a haven for unwanted species. In the warmer months when mosquitoes are most active, you should change the bird bath water even more often.

Promote Safety

A bird feeder in your backyard, full of water and seeds, will be the perfect invitation for beautiful

migrating and local birds to stop by.

Just be sure your property is safe for birds. Unfortunately, birds don't see clear glass. As a result, millions of birds die every year by striking glass. Don't let your sliding glass doors or other windows become a death trap for birds.

To protect birds, apply special decals that reflect ultraviolet sunlight. For example, those from WindowAlert have the appearance of frosted glass, but glow like a stoplight for birds, so you don't have to compromise your own view out your window. The brand also makes a high-tech liquid called WindowAlert UV Liquid, which should be applied between decals.

"Wildlife can beautify your garden and be a sign that your yard is healthy" says Spencer Schock, founder of WindowAlert. "But birds and other wildlife need food, shelter, and safety."

Derick joined the Sacramento Regional Conservation Corps in 2012 because it offered two things: help to earn his diploma, and a chance to gain valuable work training. It took him three years to earn his diploma, but with the help of staff, he is now a high school graduate. Although there were times he wanted to give up, he never did. He knew this was the only way to get where he wanted to go.

Derick also learned how to be a good worker. He learned to show up on time and work hard on the job. He worked in the creeks of Citrus Heights clearing debris. He cut trees and used wood choppers and weed whackers. His crew set up public events and performed minor road construction in the city. Derick learned to take pride in making Citrus Heights a better place to

live for himself, his family, and for the community as a whole.

Derick earned several certificates, including his First Aid/ CPR certificate. He earned an AmeriCorps Scholarship Award, which he plans to use on furthering his education. AmeriCorps helped him earn his Class C California's Driver's License, and Derick wants to get a Class A license to become a driver.

Derick has come a long way from the young man who just wanted to hang out and look for easy answers. He has learned that to succeed in life, you have to work hard, stay focused, and never quit.



of Congressman Ami Bera, California Senator Jim Nielsen, a representative of California Assemblyman Ken Cooley, and Citrus Heights Mayor Sue Frost.

Following the event, Frost said, "The Dignity Medical Office building will bring jobs and resources to our residents. The new city hall is a smart move. It is our opportunity to pay cash for a new city hall before construction costs go up. It's all about timing. Thank you to Mr. Henry Tingle who had the vision."

This was also a special day for Sacramento Board of Supervisors member Roberta MacGlashan. One of the of the city's first city council members

in 1997 and former mayor MacGlashan reminded the audience that the new City Hall will be completed just in time to celebrate the 20th anniversary of cityhood.

On July 18th, the City held a "Cash and Carry" day where hundreds of residents unearthed and took home hundreds of roses, potted plants, shrubs, and trees from what still remained of the original nursery. Fountains, statues, planters, and even benches found new homes to assure part of the legacy. Prices from \$5 to \$30 assured that many historical items found new homes.


As of now, Citrus Heights City Hall is temporarily located at 7927 Auburn Boulevard in the Grand Oaks Shopping Center for approximately 12-14 months. If you have questions about the Sylvan Road Improvements Project, contact the General Services Department at (916) 727-4770 or email generalservices@citrusheights.net. As a result of the two construction projects, traffic on Fountain Square Drive, Stock Ranch Road, and Sylvan Road will be impacted—sometimes heavily impacted—during the hours of 6 a.m. and 5 p.m. Monday through Friday.

"Control is an illusion, you infantile egomaniac." So said Nicole Kidman to Tom Cruise in the movie, "Days of Thunder." It was a fictional scene, of course, but I'm sure it's a mantra she repeated often over the course of their decade-long marriage.

That digression aside, the quote itself is absolutely the truth. Control - over others' behavior, personal circumstances, world events, the universe - is a fantasy. It was Dr. Ellen Langer who wrote the book on the subject. Her work is titled, "The Illusion of Control." She believes, and her research backs this up, that human beings have a delusional sense that they can influence the outcomes of certain events, even those events over which they have no

Summarizing one of her experiments, she gave a group of subjects lottery tickets with a chance to win big money. Some tickets were random "quickpicks" and some were numbers chosen by the participants. Once in hand, all participants were told that they could trade their tickets for other ones that had a higher chance of winning.

Those who had quick-picks traded almost immediately. Those who had chosen their own numbers, far and away, did not. They had more faith in the numbers they controlled, than in the tickets that actually improved their odds.

In another gambling example, Dr. Langer discovered that when a person rolling dice needed tional mindset at best, or

higher numbers, as in the game of craps, he or she would throw the dice with greater force, thinking, almost unconsciously, that the greater effort would produce higher numbers. Likewise, those rolling for lower numbers invariably threw the dice softly, as if that could change the outcome.

And finally, Langer's research reveals that drivers feel that they are much less likely to be in an accident when they are driving versus sitting in the passenger's seat. No surprise there, as we have all beat the floorboards out of the passenger side of the car when someone else is driving.

But here is where things get interesting: Move that front seat passenger to the back of the automobile, and that individual's feelings of anxiety completely skyrocket! In fact, the further removed from the driver's seat he or she was moved, the more the test subject felt an accident was inevitable. Why? He or she was not the one in control of the

This is one reason why I recoil from the banality of the bumper sticker, "God Is My Co-Pilot."

Oh, for heaven's sake. Can any phrase in the human lexicon be more descriptive of our neurotic need to be in control, and yet tip our hat to The Maker in case we get into a situation that is just a bit too much for us? Even then, we want to remain firmly ensconced in the driver's seat; we want to remain the gods of our own universe.

Critics of faith often argue that belief in God is an irra-

serious derangement at worst, as God's existence defies logic and evidence. God cannot be "proven," goes the reasoning, so ceding command of life to such a hypothetical being is simply

Philosophically, I understand and appreciate this argument. Yet, I counter that we all - atheists, theists, Christians, Jews, Muslims, agnostics - have confidence in something, in some foundational truth or principle that guides our lives. It's plainly impossible to be human and not to believe in something.

That much said, and without diving into some empirical argument, I discover that belief in God - a Higher Power as my friends in AA call it - is a far safer bet than trusting humanity. Not because I believe God will steer the cosmos in my direction, but because I have little confidence in our ability to control

No, you might not find faith in God to be easy, even logical. I respect that. But surrendering the management of the universe to someone else makes a lot of sense when there is so little we can personally control. After all, control is an illusion, and the evidence on that matter is irrefutable.

Why does God delay answers to our prayer? Usually it's because He needs to prepare us first. He needs to get us ready. He wants to bless us and in order to give that blessing to us, He has to prepare us for it. When my son was 13 years old, he would ask, "Dad can I drive the car?" I would reply, "Not at this time, but someday. When you grow up and you're mature and you've learned how to drive, then you'll get the request answered, but not yet, because you need to grow up." The fact of the matter is this: God is never late. His timing is perfect. We may think He's late but He's never late. God's delays are not God's denials. "Not yet" does not mean "No". What do you do when the answer is delayed? You keep on praying until you get the answer, you get assurance of the answer or until God reveals to you that it's not His will.

What you need to remember is God loves you more than you'll ever know and He knows what's best for you. He knows when you're ready for the answer. He knows when you can handle it. Trust in His timing and know that God's delays are not God's denials. God is working behind the scenes to bring things together and God is working in you.

Golf Tournament Changes the Lives of Special Needs Youth

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) -

"It's All About the Kids" is how all those involved in this year's annual Sacramento Rotary "Golf 4 Kids" fundraiser on August 10th. Funds raised from this one event have been changing the lives of 100 special needs students at Ralph Richardson Center in in the San Juan Unified School District (SJUSD) in Carmichael and three other schools in the Sacramento City Unified School District (SCUSD) for three decades.

The annual tournament held at the Northridge Country Club in Fair Oaks funds programs for the physically and health impaired at the Richardson Center, and at Luther Burbank High School, Fern Bacon Middle School, and Bowling Green Charter School in the SCUSD.

Parents of children with special needs living in these school districts are very fortunate. The Ralph Richardson Center is a unique and successful public school located within the SJUSD. They provide a wide variety of unique resources for 100 children and young adults with special needs ages 3 to 22.

Richardson Center Principal Beth Von Striver in a phone interview emphasized the importance of the event; "What

happens on this golf course on this one day makes or breaks what we do here." Eighty-five percent of funding for these schools comes from the proceeds of this one event

Von Striver added that the center would not have the quality of their aquatic program or maybe even its existence if not for the funds they receive from the Rotary. Funds are needed for equipment used in and out of pool and for its upkeep. Most of the therapy can only be done in the warm water pool, not on land.

According to Bob Miller, event chair, providing technology is of major importance to these students. Von Striver added, "The only way for most students to communicate and make their needs and wants known is from access to latest technology." A large cost has been the purchase of seven wall-sized Smart Boards and one Apple TV at a cost of \$5,000 each, including installation by the district.

Programs include physical and occupational therapy, adaptive PE classes, and music classes. It is common for students to produce their very first words and sounds during their music classes, which are also aided by technology.

A typical example of success is eight-year-old Ian Diedrich. At the Sacramento Rotary meeting on July 21st, Ian was able

to get up from his wheelchair with the help of braces on his legs and walk with his mother's help. His mother and father, Colleen and James, moved to Carmichael from Rancho Cordova in mid-2014. After just one year at Richardson, Ian, who upon arrival was confined to his wheelchair, was walking with help, his stamina had improved, and he was happy. Colleen said he would often cry when they began to pull away from the school at the end of the day.

Colleen Diedrich noted that, "A key to the success of their programs for these students is the many professional and collaborative skills all on one campus from staff who have dedicated their lives to helping and supporting their students." Many staff members have been at these schools for decades.

Andre Justice is another success story, recently graduating from Luther Burbank High School in Sacramento. Prior to his four years at Burbank, Andre attended Bowling Green Charter School for three years. His mother, Andrinus Pernell, says she no longer worries about her son, who is proud of his independence. Although confined to a wheelchair, he can take the bus on his own, budgets his money, and was elected prom king.

These schools change students' quality of life and greatly affect their transition into the real world. This assistance is especially helpful for older children and young adults transitioning into the workforce.

The "Golf 4 Kids" tournament is in its 93rd year, making it the oldest charitable event in the history of the Rotary. This Rotary event is the oldest charitable event in the history of Rotary International. In the mid-1980s, it shifted to a golf tournament.



Memorial Parks Mortuaries & Crematory

Have you ever heard one of those horror stories about a funeral home that has abused the public trust? The reason some of those stories stick with us is because they are so rare.

The funeral, cremation and cemetery industry is highly regulated – especially here in California. The Department of Consumer Affairs is diligent about inspecting funeral homes, crematories and cemeteries on a regular basis. I commend them for their diligence.

There is no more sacred duty than to take someone's loved one into our care and trust that they will be treated with the utmost dignity. We consider it an honor and a privilege to do so.

When you are researching mortuaries and/or cemeteries, you are encouraged to check with the California Department of Consumer Affairs (DCA) to see if that firm has had any recent inspection violations or consumer complaints.

Did you know that in California embalming is not required by law? A funeral home typically cannot force you to embalm your loved one, however, under certain circumstances it may be necessary and required. For example, if your family member will be shipped to

another state or country on a common carrier (train, airplane, etc.) they must be embalmed or shipped with dry ice.

Many funeral homes have company policies regarding embalming. This means that they may not be obligated to offer a public viewing of your family member without embalming because it can be considered a public health concern to do so. Always ask what their embalming policies are.

Additional key consumer advice for everyone is that you know that all funeral homes and mortuaries are required by law to make their General Price List (GPL) available to you. Not just for you to look at – but for you to have a copy to take with you. This protects consumers so they are treated fairly in all monetary interactions with each funeral home. It also helps you make a better informed decision because not all funeral service packages are equal. They include and exclude different services so compare them carefully.

Nintendo Shifts its Strategies

Nintendo has been a driving force in video games since the release of the Nintendo Entertainment System in 1983. For three decades, Nintendo has enchanted gamers with lighthearted, creative, genre-defining games that have earned millions of loyal fans. But right now, the multi-billion dollar corporation seems at a turning point, trying to figure out how to adapt to a quickly changing industry without losing its creative identity.

The problems started with the Wii U, a console released in 2012 that centered on the idea of a second screen as a controller. It seemed too gimmicky to hardcore gamers and too inaccessible for casual gamers. Though the concept of a two-screen experience has arguably lived up to Nintendo's promises, the idea wasn't nearly as revolutionary as was hoped. Wii U sales flopped and continue to flop as sparse store shelves sport the occasional excellent Nintendo-made exclusive interspersed by almost nothing in the realm of thirdparty support.

That's a shame, because Nintendo's first-party titles are some of the best to come out of this console generation. Though the volume of games on the Playstation 4 and Xbox One is higher (although still relatively low), few games released for those systems come close in quality to Wii U

titles like Bayonetta 2 or Super Smash Bros. Nintendo stuck close to its strategy: create fun, original games, and the sales will come. One problem: the sales didn't come.

Nintendo's recent announcement of a shift to mobile is an indication that it's reevaluating its strategy. The handheld Nintendo 3DS console is selling incredibly well in both systems and games, despite the fact that Wii U and 3DS games seem to be cut from the same fun-centric fabric. Nintendo knows that the games it makes do well on the go, so the decision to use Nintendo characters and intellectual properties in titles for phones and tablets seems like a natural evolution. Despite protests that this change could shift focus away from Nintendo's dedicated fans, this was an important business decision that President Satoru Iwata had to make.

Sadly, it would be one of the last big decisions ever to come from Mr. Iwata, who passed away on July 11th at the age of 55. Iwata was a beloved figure in gaming: charismatic, fun, quirky, dedicated, and constantly optimistic. The

experienced creative mind and long-time president led Nintendo through some of its darkest and brightest moments. Unfortunately, he left Nintendo at a crucial time with many unanswered questions, including who his successor will be.

One notable unanswered question concerns the NX, Nintendo's still-in-development console that's being kept a close secret. It has teased that it will be revolutionary, that it will change how we think of gaming hardware, but nothing more. The announcement that a new console is in the works seems to be a white flag for the Wii U, a failed console with enormous unspent potential that tapered off just a few years after release.

Nintendo seems insistent on supporting its motto of fun that it has sported since the eighties. But Nintendo has been slow to adapt to a changing market and now must face its failures, challenges, and tragedies head-on if it plans to increase its relevance in the gaming world.

How to Protect Your Eyes from Macular Degeneration

Dear Savvy Senior,

Is macular degeneration hereditary? My mother lost her vision from it before she died a few years ago, and now at age 65, I'm worried I may get it. What can you tell me?

Nearsighted Susan

Dear Susan,

Having a parent or sibling with macular degeneration does indeed increase your risk three to four times. But the good news is there are things you can do to protect your eyesight, and a number of treatments that are available if you do happen to get it. Here's what you should know.

What is AMD?

Macular degeneration, also known as age-related macular degeneration (or AMD) is the most common cause of vision loss in people over age 50, affecting about 10 million Americans.

AMD is a progressive eye disease that damages the macula, the part of the eye that allows us to see objects clearly, causing vision loss in the center of your vision. This affects the ability to read, drive, watch television and do routine daily tasks, but it does not cause total blindness.

There are two types of AMD - wet and dry. Dry AMD, which affects about 90 percent of all people that have it, progresses slowly and painlessly over a period of years. While wet AMD is much more aggressive and can cause severe vision loss in a matter of weeks or months.

Factors that can increase your risk of getting AMD include age (60 and older); smoking; excessive exposure to sunlight especially if you have light-colored eyes; certain genetic components; a family history of AMD; high blood pressure; obesity; and being Caucasian.

For anyone over the age of 60, it's a smart idea to get your eyes examined by an ophthalmologist every year. They can spot early signs of AMD before vision loss occurs. Early signs, however, may include shadowy areas in your central vision or unusually fuzzy or distorted vision. The Amsler grid at amslergrid.org, is a good tool to check your eyes for AMD.

Preventing AMD

While there's currently no cure for AMD there are some things you can do if you're high risk. One option is to talk to your doctor about taking a daily dose of antioxidant vitamins and minerals known as AREDS – vitamins C and E, plus copper, lutein, zeaxanthin, and zinc. Studies by the National Eye Institute have shown that AREDS can reduce the risk by about 25 percent that dry AMD will progress.

Most drug stores sell these eye supplements in tablet or soft gel form over-the-counter for around \$20 to \$30, but be aware that not all eye supplements contain the proper formulation.

Choose either the PreserVision Eve Vitamin AREDS Formula. PreserVision Eye Vitamin Lutein Formula, PreserVision AREDS2 Formula, or ICAPS AREDS. These four options contain the right formula mix.

Other lifestyle adjustments that may help prevent or delay AMD include eating antioxidant-rich foods such as dark green, leafy vegetables, and cold-water fish for their omega-3 fatty acids; protecting your eyes from the sun by wearing UV protective sunglasses; controlling high blood pressure; exercising regularly; and if you smoke, quit.

Wet AMD Treatments

For wet AMD, there are several effective medications (Lucentis, Avastin and Eylea) available that can stop vision loss and may even restore it. These medications are given by injection into the eye, and repeated every month or two, perhaps indefinitely.

Note that each of these three drugs works equally in treating wet AMD, but there's a big cost difference. Avastin costs just \$50 per month, compared with \$2,000 for the other two. So experts recommend Avastin as the first choice for most people with wet AMD, especially if you don't have supplemental Medicare coverage.


