One such officer, Sgt. Dave accident in a dark wooded area Gutierrez from the Citrus on Hwy 89 in Siskiyou County. much of the national media (CHPD), recently received a situation, he stabilized and life-saving ribbon at the department's annual Awards and Promotion Ceremony. He was awarded the ribbon for saving a life while off-duty in November of 2014. Gutierrez has agreed to come forward to share the details of this incident and two other incidents he was involved in since 2009. On November 26th, 2014 at 7 p.m., Gutierrez, a nine-year veteran of the CHPD, placed his own life in peril when he came upon a serious traffic

pulled a seriously injured woman through the window of her smoldering SUV seconds before it exploded into flames. There is no doubt that if Gutierrez and his wife had not been at that exact location on Hwy 89 at that time, Chris Henline from Northern California would have died in the accident. This scenario, which played out like a well-rehearsed television cop show or Hollywood movie, was in fact very real.

Yet Gutierrez is the first to disagree with those who call him a hero. He says that his life-saving actions – while an amazing

Officer-Involved Shooting on **Greenback Lane**

CITRUS HEIGHTS. CA (MPG) - The Citrus Heights Police Department is currently investigating an officerinvolved shooting that took place at an apartment complex at the 7500 block of Greenback Lane on June 22nd. Officers initially responded to the apartment complex for a report of a domestic violence incident between a husband and wife. Initial reports to police dispatch indicated that the suspect had physically attacked the female victim, causing injury, and was armed with a handgun.

As Citrus Heights police officers arrived on scene, the 35-year-old male suspect began shooting at the officers. A total of four officers engaged the suspect and returned gunfire, fatally striking the suspect. Officers immediately attempted life-saving measures. Fire personnel also responded and pronounced the suspect deceased at the scene. No police officers were injured.


The female victim was safely removed from the apartment and transported to a local hospital for treatment. She appeared to have a significant head wound caused from being struck ("pistolwhipped") with the handgun.

According to Citrus Heights Police Lieutenant Ryan Kinnan, "The armed suspect placed the victim, the children, and all the residents within the apartment complex in danger. The responding officers' heroic actions, training, and experience saved numerous lives during this incident. We are extremely proud of the actions taken by our officers during this incident." The original domestic violence call was received by police dispatch at approximately 7:20 p.m. The officers involved with the shooting will be placed on paid administrative leave, which is standard policy during these incidents. There are no outstanding suspects or threats to the public resulting from this incident. Source: Citrus Heights Police Department

Local Filmmakers Premiere Crime Thriller

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - On June 21st, the locally based crime thriller pilot of *RELLIK* premiered at both Wizard World Sacramento Comic Con and the Tower Theatre in Roseville. The Roseville premiere featured most of the cast and crew, and the excitement was palpable as everyone saw the results of their work on the big screen.

RELLIK was directed by Tim Russ, known primarily for his role as Tuvok on Star Trek Voyager. Originally contacted to act in the series, Russ was intrigued by the script and ended up directing instead. The cast and crew hope that the web series will be picked up by a streaming service for wider distribution.

Messenger Publishing Group was able to speak with Craig DeLuz - who plays the character of Dante Valentino and is one of the writers and producers of RELLIK – about how he got involved in the project and what he wants the public to know about the series.

MPG: How did you get involved in this project?

DeLuz: A little over a year ago, a casting call went out to film what was going to be the pilot of a web series, which was actually a small segment of what you saw in the theater. I came to find out that I actually knew the head writer – the only writer at the time - Brian Jagger, and I let him know that I was really excited about it and I had written for stage, but I would be interested in doing some writing for RELLIK if they were interested.

MPG: Where is the series going to go?

DeLuz: What I can tell you is this: that the pilot really comes across as a police show, but it's a crime thriller. And it's as much about the killer as it is about the detectives hunting down the killer. *Continued on page 2*

City Gives Smart & Final Leeway to Pursue Liquor License

CITRUS HEIGHTS, CA (MPG) - A Smart & Final grocery store set to open at the corner of Madison Avenue and Sunrise Boulevard has passed the multiple stages for securing its alcohol sales license.

In addition to the sales of everyday grocery items and household goods, the 2,800 square foot store at 7945 Madison Avenue will be able to sell beer, wine, and spirits since its general alcohol sales license was approved with a 5-0 vote at May 14th City Council meeting. The company's applicant, Art Rodriguez and Associates, did not receive opposition from the Citrus Heights Police Department or any neighborhood associations.

"[We] responded to the Citrus Heights Planning Department on this subject," said Neighborhood Area 11 President James Reiman in an e-mail. "We saw no reason that Smart & Final should not be licensed to sell alcohol in their new location."

The Citrus Heights Police Department noted that Smart & Final's other store in town on Auburn Boulevard has not had any significant problems related to selling alcohol. However, they recommended several changes regarding the layout of their alcohol display areas in a memorandum to the City Council, including moving them to the back of the store to discourage thieves from grabbing alcohol by the front door and running out.

Peter Impala, with Art Rodriguez and Associates' sales and consulting department, said in an interview with the Citrus Heights Messenger that having the

alcohol at the front of the building is an intentional layout with security in mind. Alcohol theft at its other stores has actually been lessened because that is where the manager's office and the cash registers are located. Usually there are two to three workers up front keeping an eye on the alcohol while running the registers, according to Impala. "There's something to be said about monitoring the alcohol," Impala said.

In addition to regular monitoring, the alcohol will be behind locked cabinets and all cash registers will use technology to confirm that the buyer is 21 years of age or older.

Smart & Final representatives said that the original opening date for the Madison Avenue location has been pushed back from August until early 2016.

There's going to be lots of twists and lots of turns, but I think that when people get the chance to see the pilot on the screen, I think people are really going to be excited about the direction, the twist that it has.

MPG: Is there anything you'd like the public to know about RELLIK?

DeLuz: As far as I know, there hasn't been a product or show with the level of potential that *RELLIK* has to be something in the Sacramento region, to employ the number of actors and number of people in front of the screen and behind the scenes. It's really important that if we want to bring more [projects like this] that the Sacramento community get behind...efforts like these. We have to work with the elected officials to make this

happen. Because I'll tell you, the City of Roseville, Placer County, and businesses over in Sacramento County—they really went out of their way to make it happen. I haven't seen a single community come together the way they have to support this project. It's been humbling and for those of us – the four of us – who just started out; I can tell you that we fully recognize that

Temporary Relocation of City Hall

CITRUS HEIGHTS, CA (MPG) -Effective July 13th, Citrus Heights City Hall will relocate to 7927 Auburn Boulevard in the Grand Oaks Shopping Center during construction of a new facility.

In March 2015, the City Council approved construction of a new City Hall as part of the Medical Office Building and City Hall Project. The unique proposal to construct a Medical Office Building on the existing City Hall site and relocate City Hall to 6360 Fountain Square Drive is anticipated to result in a direct investment of \$53.2 million into the City's economy. Furthermore, the Medical Office Building will diversify the local economy, generate job opportunities, increase the City's Sales and User Utility Tax Revenues, and stimulate approximately \$1.6 million in economic output.

Development of the Medical Office Building and new City Hall is slated to begin summer 2015.

The Medical Office Building construction is estimated to last 18 months. Construction of the new City Hall facility is expected to be complete in late summer 2016.

made, you have to resort back to your training."

Gutierrez's proud wife J.J. agrees with his view that many of his brothers and sisters in the force would do exactly the same thing if necessary. All three incidents occurred on the way to family outings with their children in tow. The 2009 and 2011 incidents were also potentially fatal accidents, both involving women, one with two children. As a result of his training, Gutierrez quickly triaged the situations and assessed who to help first, extricating four victims and administering first aid. The 2011 accident involved an overturned truck that was sparking a fire. A woman was strapped in her seat, hanging upside down and bleeding from the head. Gutierrez again acted quickly to save lives as a result of his training and own expertise.

Gutierrez and J.J. cannot explain the reason for all these events taking place right in front of them. They chalk it up to divine providence that they were the ones put in those places at those times so that no lives were lost.

For his actions during these incidents, Gutierrez was honored by the Sacramento County District Attorney's Office, Citrus Heights City Council, and the Sacramento Rotary. On June 2nd, he received the 2015 "Service Above Self" Award from the Sacramento Rotary.

While he appreciates how this recognition brings the positive aspect of police work to the forefront, Gutierrez's most meaningful reward was meeting Chris Henline, the woman he rescued from her exploding SUV on November 26th. Of her ordeal, Henline said, "There are no words to adequately express my full appreciation. He was a calm and reassuring angel sent from above; my whole world was wrapped up in his eyes. I will never forget him." To keep Henline from going into shock, Gutierrez

insisted that she focus on his eyes throughout the entire ordeal.

Gutierrez credits his actions to his six month basic police training at the Sacramento County Sheriff's training academy, followed by more training at the CHPD and ongoing training to review and learn new tactics and skills. Like their military counterparts, police are trained to have a survival mentality. They leap into action, automatically coming to the aid of those who cannot help themselves.

In a phone interview, J.J. Gutierrez said that in light of all the negative publicity being given to the law enforcement in the last few years, she felt compelled to come forward with her husband's story. It burdens her heart that although most of his peers are like him, the national media spotlight falls mainly on stories involving the small percentage of officers with a bad attitude.

J.J. Gutierrez said it was scary to be so close to dangerous accident situations, but she is confident her husband knows what he is doing and would always help someone in need. She said that following the second rescue, "it

was surreal, a weird reality to later be sitting in the audience at 'Disney on Ice' discussing with family how 30 minutes ago, my husband had just saved a life."

Gutierrez also noted that the police rely on their relationship with the community as an important way to make Citrus Heights a safe place to live and work. Residents of all ages can be involved with their officers in activities, including being members of their Neighborhood Associations, attending the Citizens' Police Academy, volunteering at the Sayonara Youth Center, working with their Police-Oriented Problem officers, and events such as the Holiday Gift Program. Officers are also highly visible as they are involved in high school sports, the Police Activities League, raising awareness of children with cancer, the Explorer mentoring program, Shop with a Cop, introducing their K9 officers to the public, and the annual National Night Out.





Sharing faith, in Christian terms, is known as "evangelism." This is the English rendering of a Greek word meaning "to proclaim the good news." That's a problem, because the news isn't always good.

There was a subtext to the evangelization method I was taught that went something like this: "God is really ticked off with you. He's mad as hell - literally. And if you don't pray this prayer, believe the way I believe, and don't hurry to the baptismal waters as quickly as possible, then he will likely strike you dead before I'm finished talking to you." I would then scurry away before God's vengeance fell like fire on the sinner and I was caught in the collateral damage.

Again, there wasn't much good news in such confrontations, because there was no sharing of God's love. Love? Forget it. God didn't love, God hated. God didn't invite, God demanded. God didn't plead, God prosecuted. God wasn't pursuing wayward children as a heartbroken parent; God was dogging hardened criminals like a trigger-happy bounty hunter, a ready execution order in his hip pocket.

I no longer share with others my faith in an angry, perpetually irritated God who only wishes to stamp out humanity because I no longer believe in such a Deity. In light of Jesus, and the love



of God he came to reveal to the world, evangelism can radically change. We are now "compelled by love," to employ a phrase from Paul.

We share our faith not to coerce, force, intimidate, or to instill terror. We share our faith because of and for love's sake – the only worthy compulsion. We have learned that God loves us, remarkably so, and loves our neighbors with equal measure. This love changes us; cures our dysfunction; and gives us new life. It really is "good news."

This reminds me of an ancient story about a man named Demosthenes, a skilled orator from Greece. But he was not always a skilled wordsmith. As a young man he had a terrible speech impediment. This became painfully evident when his inheritance was stolen and he had to argue his case in open court.

His speech was so bad, they gave him an ambiguous nickname in the Greek, meaning either "stutterer" or "sphincter" (While neither is flattering, I prefer the former over the latter). He was laughed out of the courtroom. But Demosthenes was determined. He secluded himself in a cave and began studying the methods of the great orators of the past.

He stuffed rocks in his jowls, a crude form of speech therapy, forcing himself to slow down when he talked. Then he shaved off one side of his facial hair so that he would be

too embarrassed to go into public. That way, he had to remain in isolation practicing until his hair grew back, and would face no one until he was properly prepared for the task. This would be a good practice for most of us.


Before we breathe a word about the gospel or "good news," we should be properly prepared.

What is the proper preparation? Well, it's not about having all the theological answers or a collection of "gotcha" responses to objections. It's about having God's love consume our hearts.

When we can share the love of God by speaking of the ever-loving Christ, while loving those to whom we speak, only then are we ready to open our mouths, and not a minute sooner.

If we must, we will shave our heads and hide our faces. Let us go live in a secluded cave, if need be. Maybe we should stuff our mouths full of stones (or at least cover them with duct tape). It would simply be a good idea not to speak a word about religion, church, God, or the gospel until love is the means, message, and motivation for everything we say. If we can shut our mouths for just a little while, it just might open our hearts – to the love of God – which really is "good news" for all.

Traps to avoid after graduation

Dear Dave,

I'm currently a senior in college. I'm completely debt-free right now, and I am wondering what I should do to stay this way after graduation.? - Cary

Dear Cary,

You're already primed for a great start. Doesn't it feel great to know you won't have a bunch of payments hanging over your head when you walk out into the world? I'm really proud of you!

There are three major traps I tell all new graduates to avoid. One, don't buy or lease a new car. Save up and pay cash for your cars for the rest of your life. If you saved the amount of an average car payment — about \$485 a month — and put it into a good mutual fund from age 25 to 65, you could easily retire a millionaire. Now that's something to look forward to!

The second trap to avoid is

first few years after college will be some of the most volatile in your life in terms of career and relationships. Save up a big pile of cash and be patient. Too many young people today go crazy and buy houses they can't afford just because their friends bought one, or everyone is telling them it's what they should do.





1) EATING REAL FOOD. E.g.

whole grain food, meat, eggs, vegetables and fruits that promote gut workout, spend about 35% more calories digesting and absorbing the food, and also increase the satiety and cut cravings for sweet sugary drinks. Choose the diet that POPPOFF!

allows you to eat real foods rather than protein shakes and powders.

2) EATING A BALANCED DIET RATHER THAN A LOW CARB, LOW FAT **DIET.** Different body organs need different nutrients, for example, sugar (carb) is essential for blood cells and brain cells. Without the sugar, the brain will be chasing cabs and sweets. That's how cravings begin and the discipline of dieting gets ruined. That is the reason if you want to lose fat, you need to shoot for a balanced diet for long-term results. Losing weight from body water and lean body are short term. Quick fix diets will get you weight loss for a short time and then pounds come back with a vengeance.

3) EATING FOUR OR FIVE

TIMES A DAY. Our metabolism goes down 40% if we do not eat for more than four to six hours. It shuts down the less essential departments of the body. If your body senses that you are a regular breakfast skipper or small lunch eater, or just one meal a day eater, it will be cutting the calories by 40% without realizing it. That's why some obese people gain more weight without eating much. So let's fast-pace our metabolism by eating at least four to five times a day in correct portions. Let the gut work hard by

4) FOODS THAT BURN FAT. Whole grain breads and pasta, brown rice, legumes, lentils... good stable foods. A variety of colorful vegetables will give your gut a good workout and burn more calories. High-fiber diets promote fat-me-not bacteria in the gut and promote weight loss. Lean meat, fish, and seafood are great fat burners. For example, compare a protein shake vs a piece of lean meat with the same calories... eating meat will burn up to 40% more calories than the readymade protein shakes and the lean meat will enhance the gut workout by chewing, digesting, absorbing, and transforming the nutrients. As we all know, our state is facing serious challenges due to the current drought.

Recently Governor Brown initiated a directive for the reduction of residential and commercial usage and conservation of water. Here at East Lawn, we are in full compliance with the Governor's mandate. As a matter of fact, East Lawn voluntarily began making significant water reductions back in 2013. We have been, and continue to be, a responsible participant in any and all appropriate community efforts and standards to conserve water resources.

All three East Lawn cemeteries are independently provided with water through our own well and pump systems.

We do not receive water through the municipalities. Our wells and pump systems are professionally inspected and serviced regularly for maximum efficiency as are our sprinkler systems. Self-supplied well water entities, such as East Lawn, are required by the Governor's Executive Order B-29-15, to reduce potable water usage by 25%; however, our goal is to continuously try to find the most efficient means possible to reduce water usage and we have exceeded the mandate by conserving over 50% and significantly minimized run-off.

We have elected to temporarily stop the flow of water in our fountains. Unfortunately, due to these water cutbacks a few brown spots have appeared in some areas of our parks. We are cognizant of the responsibility we have to properly maintain the beauty of the cemeteries as Endowment Care facilities. We ask for your patience and understanding as we negotiate this drought; however, should you notice a problem that needs to be addressed, please do not hesitate to contact us.



LETTER TO THE EDITOR Red Light Cam Tickets Up 1/3 in Citrus Heights

The latest 2015 red light camera ticket counts are in and in March-May ticketing in Citrus Heights ran at a rate 1/3 higher than in 2014. An extra 238 tickets each month. No new cameras have been added; the existing cameras may have been adjusted to be more sensitive.

The majority of the City's red light cameras tickets – about 2/3- are for right turns. There is a growing cloud over such heavy right turn enforcement. Consider this statement found in a Dec. 26, 2014 Wall Street Journal interview of the president of the company supplying the City's cameras:

"Mr. [James] Saunders [president of Redflex] suggests jurisdictions refrain from issuin the crosswalk." The headline was, "Can the Red-Light Camera Be Saved? - Moneyhungry politicians discredit a hopeful safety innovation." (A Jan. 22, 2015 column in the Dallas Morning News confirmed the statement The Journal had attributed to Saunders: "When I asked Redflex spokeswoman Jody Ryan about her boss' comments urging cities to lighten up on rolling reds, she answered, "It only makes sense that Jim is going to say, 'Look, we need people to be thoughtful about how they are implementing these programs and how they are issuing citations.' It wasn't that shocking.")

S'mores Crispy Cereal Treats

- 1 1/2 cups granulated sugar 1 egg

Note: Make and decorate cookies 1 day in advance to allow for drying time. Heat oven to 350°F.

In large bowl, beat butter and sugar with electric mixer until light and fluffy. Beat in egg and flavors. Mix flour, baking powder and salt; add to butter mixture 1 cup at a time, mixing after each addition. Do not chill dough. Divide dough into 2 balls.

On floured surface with rolling pin, roll each ball into a circle approximately 12 inches in diameter by 1/8 inch thick. Cut cookies with star nesting metal cookie cutter. Dip cutter in flour before each use.

Bake cookies on ungreased cookie sheet 8–11 minutes or until cookies are lightly browned.

Prepare Color Flow icing. Tint icing following color formulas above. Use tip 3, a parchment bag and full-strength icing to outline cookies: 32 in red, 21 in white and 16 in blue. Let cookies dry 1–2 hours.

Thin 1 cup red, 1/4 cup blue and 1 cup white icing. Use thinned icing and disposable decorating bag to fill in cookies. Fill in 8 of blue outlined cookies with white icing and remaining cookies with matching outline color. Let dry 8–12 hours.

To serve, arrange cookies on tray in stars and stripes design.
