## **IRS Seeks Volunteers** for Taxpayer **Advocacy Panel**

WASHINGTON, DC, (MPG) - The Internal Revenue Service seeks civic-minded volunteers to serve on the Taxpayer Advocacy Panel (TAP), a federal advisory committee that listens to taxpayers, identifies major taxpayer concerns, and makes recommendations for improving IRS services.

The TAP provides a forum for taxpayers to raise concerns about IRS service and offer suggestions for improvement. The TAP reports annually to the Secretary of the Treasury, the IRS Commissioner and the National Taxpayer Advocate. The Office of the Taxpayer Advocate is an independent organization within the IRS and provides oversight of the TAP.

"In trying to comply with an increasingly complex tax system, taxpayers may find they need different services than the IRS is currently providing," said Nina E. Olson, National Taxpayer Advocate. "The TAP is vital because it provides the IRS with the taxpayers' perspective as well as recommendations for improvement. This helps the IRS deliver the best possible service to assist taxpayers in meeting their tax obligations.'

The TAP includes members from all 50 states, the District of Columbia and Puerto Rico. Each member is appointed to represent the interests of taxpayers in his or her geographic location.

The TAP is also seeking to include at least one additional member to represent international taxpayers. For these purposes, "international taxpayers" are broadly defined to include U.S. citizens working, living, or doing business abroad or in a U.S. territory. The new international member will not be required to attend any face-to-face meetings.

To be a member of the TAP you must be a U.S. citizen, be current with your federal tax obligations, be able to commit 200 to 300 hours during the year and pass an FBI criminal background check. New TAP members will serve a threeyear term starting in December 2014. Applicants chosen as alternate members will be considered to fill any vacancies that open in their areas during the next three years.

The TAP is now seeking members in California.

Candidates from underrepresented groups, including but not limited to U.S. taxpayers living abroad, Native Americans, and non-tax practitioners, are encouraged to apply.

Applications for the TAP will be accepted through April 11, 2014. Applications are available online at www.improveirs.org. 





## **Citrus Heights Police Chief Christopher W. Boyd Installed as President of CA Police Chiefs Association**

CITRUS HEIGHTS, CA (MPG) - Citrus Heights Police Chief Christopher W. Boyd was installed as president of the California Police Chiefs Association (CPCA) for a one-year term on February 26, 2014 at the organization's 37th Annual Training Symposium held at the Portola Plaza Hotel in Monterey, California.

Boyd became the California Police Chiefs Association's 49th president; it has been 39 years since a chief from the Greater Sacramento area has served as the association president. Chief Boyd will play a significant role in the legislative process through his partnerships with the Governor's office and the state legislature. The CPCA represents the state's municipal police chiefs whose agencies protect over 78 percent of the citizens of California.

Boyd brings a wealth of professional experience to the position of president of Cal Chiefs, having orchestrated the formation and implementation of the first ever City of Citrus Heights Police Department over seven years ago. Prior to his tenure as Chief of Police at the Citrus Heights Police Department, Boyd served the Menlo Park Police Department for over 15 years in a variety of capacities, including Chief of Police. He was appointed to the Cal Chiefs' Board of Directors in 2010 and was elected third vice president in 2012.

"I am honored to lead the California Police Chiefs Association this next year. We continue to face issues related to the implementation of Realignment and the importance of sufficient funding for local law enforcement to mitigate Realignment's impacts on our communities. The association is also launching proactive medical marijuana regulation legislation to further ensure the public's safety, and reduce the harm that is currently unfolding in our state due to lack of regulation. We intend to focus on the issues of human trafficking, mental health, and youth intervention through collaboration with our partners. I look forward to working with my colleagues on these and many other issues that impact the safety of the citizens of California," said Chief Boyd.

Boyd has always been committed to strong public safety through community policing. Under his leadership the Citrus Heights Police Department received the prestigious James Q. Wilson Award for Excellence in Community Policing two years in a row for their innovative community policing

Additionally, Boyd has held many leadership positions in the community as well as public safety organizations, including chair of the Sacramento County Chiefs Association and as president of the

Central Sierra Police Chiefs Association. Chief Boyd is a past board member for the Domestic Violence Intervention Center (DVIC) of Citrus Heights and proudly serves on the board for the Citrus Heights Police Activities League (CHPAL).

In Citrus Heights, Boyd and his team have developed and implemented a cutting edge statistical crime fighting analysis tool called CATCH (Crime and Traffic in Citrus Heights). The CATCH model was designed to use statistical data to determine the best utilization of the department's resources in regard to fighting crime. A 13 per cent decrease in the city's overall crime in 2013, the largest reduction in crime amongst cities in the Sacramento region, confirms the program's success.

Boyd holds a Bachelor of Science degree in Criminal Justice and Sociology from the University of Idaho, and a Master of Public Administration from the College of Notre Dame. Chief Boyd is a graduate of the FBI National Academy in Quantico, Virginia California Governor Jerry Brown, City of Citrus Heights Mayor Melvin Turner, elected members of the Citrus Heights City Council, Citrus Heights City Manager Henry Tingle, key Citrus Heights city and police staff, as well as police chiefs and executives from throughout the state attended this year's CPCA presidential installation event.Twitter: @citrusheightspd

## **DUI Checkpoint Nets 4 Arrests**

**CITRUS HEIGHTS CA (MPG)** - Citrus everyone to use sober designated Heights Police Department Traffic Unit conducted a DUI/ Driver's License checkpoint on 03/07/2014, at Antelope Road and Lauppe Lane between the hours of 7:00 p.m. and 3:00 a.m. Checkpoints are placed in locations that have the greatest opportunity for achieving drunk and drugged driving deterrence and provide the greatest safety for officers and the public.

DUI/Driver's License checkpoints have been shown to lower DUI deaths and injuries. A major component of these checkpoints are the deterrent effects it has on those who might drive drunk or drugged impaired, bringing about 2 DUI-Drug impaired suspects arrested more awareness and encouraging

drivers.

According to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA), checkpoints have provided the most effective documented results of any of the DUI enforcement strategies, while also yielding considerable cost savings of \$6 for every \$1 spent. Ninety Percent of California drivers approve of checkpoints.

906 Vehicles Screened

- 2 DUI-Alcohol suspects arrested

1 Suspect arrested for illegal drugs (possession/ transportation/sales)

13 Drivers cited/arrested for operating a vehicle unlicensed or while suspended/revoked

1 Arrested on other Criminal Charges

27 Citations issued







The year was 387. The place was Kilpatrick in ancient Scotland. Their names were Calpurnius and Conchessa, Roman citizens living at the edge of the Roman Empire. These young Britons were gifted with a new born son. They named him Maewyn.

Maewyn was a rambunctious, unruly boy who spurned his parents' instructions and their Christian faith. He romped the Scottish hills with other Brit, Scot, Pict, and Roman boys, and it was on one of these romps that young Maewyn ended up in the wrong place at the wrong time.

A roving band of Irish pirates was plundering the coast of Scotland, and in the process, captured

Maewyn and carried them back to Ireland. There Maewyn became a slave. And there, Maewyn's faith was reborn. He began to talk to God, and as the story goes, God began talking to

God instructed Maewyn to wander toward the coast. So he did, secretly, and found a boat bound for Scotland. He returned home and was reunited with his family after many years. Then God spoke again, coming to Maewyn in his dreams. God wanted him to return to Ireland.

Maewyn entered theological training, and at the conclusion of

his studies, was sent as the first

Christian missionary to Ireland. At his ordination he took the Latin name, Patricius; in Gaelic it was Padraig. In modern English we know him as Saint

With Nicholas and Valentine, St. Patrick rounds out the trio of best known Christian saints outside of the Apostles. They are celebrated and venerated by the world – but none more so than

St. Patrick. He has found his way into our hearts, and while drinking Guinness or Jameson is part of his appeal, that is hardly the beginning. Patrick, more than most, meets people where they are – and that is his lasting contribution.

When Patrick arrived in Ireland as a Christian missionary he had a decision to make about how to do his work. This was the early 400s. The Roman Emperor Constantine had "converted" to Christianity 100 years earlier, and the cross was now used, not as the suffering symbol of a

Galilean carpenter, but as a crusading tool of conquest.

It was the custom of Christian missionaries – then and for the next 1500 years – not to introduce others to Jesus, but to make them citizens of the Empire. A culture was "Christianized" not when it conformed to the words and ways of Jesus, but when it submitted to the rule of the

Roman Caesar or the conquering king. The local culture was eradicated, replaced by that of the conquerors, and Christianity was used as an instrument in that

But rather than imposing an imperial faith on the Irish people, Patrick met them where they

were and let faith erupt naturally. He did not overpower, he obliged. He did not impose, he

He did not attack, he adapted. He came in humility and simplicity, attempting to foster faith, not force it.

We still have much to learn from old Patrick, for his way of sharing faith could heal today's world. Vulnerability. Service. Humility. Meeting people where they are. Treating neighbors with dignity and respect. Honoring the lives and stories of those we encounter – plain civility – may be the only way to keep a society from devouring itself.

When we live with a no-compromise, never give-an-inch, militant attitude, and meet every person outside our circle with distrust, it creates a divisive, violent, negative, attack-based culture with an atmosphere of hateful rhetoric and suspicion. It destroys a community.

So we who are living today have a choice put before us: We will take the path of suspicion, violence, stubbornness, divisiveness, and imposition and we will witness the end of the world as we know it. Or we will we imitate Patrick by taking the way of peace, love for our neighbors, welcome and inclusion. Living this way will end of the world as we know it as well – but it might be the kind of end that gives rebirth to the world.

# Stanford's Fred Luskin Preaches **Health-Inducing Gospel Of Forgiveness**

Asked how he became the poster child for what he refers to as "forgiveness therapy," Forgive For Good author Dr. Fred Luskin says, it all goes back to his desire to have a better understanding of practical spirituality.

"I've had a longstanding interest in spiritual matters," said Luskin prior to teaching a class at Stanford Health Library in Palo Alto. "I've been reading spiritual books since high school, but

I've always wanted to know if this stuff is true. Is it teachable? Does increased spirituality lead you to be a better person? Does it improve your health?

"From my point of view, if something is true, it's true. It's not going to be true on a theoretical level and not be true on a physical level."

Some 20 years later, Luskin, a Stanford-trained psychologist who spent 10 years doing research on preventative cardiology, is convinced that increased spirituality, including the ability to forgive, does in fact make you a better person and improve your health.

"Forgiveness is one of those ways where we wipe clean a agement to practice forgiveness major threat to our well-being," or compassion," he said. "So he said. "That causes the body to we don't get to recognize what have more time to repair. Immune function goes up, blood pressure goes down."

Luskin backs up his claims with plenty of data. His "Forgiveness Projects" - an ongoing series of humanitarian workshops – have afforded him the opportunity to test his methods on a variety of populations exposed to extreme violence in places like Northern Ireland and Sierra Leone, as well as the attacks on the World Trade Center on 9/11. In March he is headed to Northern

Canada where he will provide forgiveness training for the native population in Inuvik.

During last month's class in Palo Alto – a course Luskin has been teaching under the auspices of Stanford Hospital since 1998 – the focus was less on health and more on our innate desire to "do a little peacekeeping in the world."

"There are billions of people telling themselves that somebody was a real [jerk] all day long," said Luskin. "That's really easy for humanbeings to do. That's swimming with the stream. To create peace, you need to swim against the stream sometimes, in fact, often.'

Of course, changing directions mid-steam is usually easier said than done.

"The idea of forgiveness still makes people edgy," he said. "They're afraid of giving up the resentment, like somehow they're not safe, if they can't resent and hate and dislike. They think that some of their weaponry or their protection is being removed."

Luskin also notes the need for good examples.

"There's very little encourthey're like in ourselves." Asked to offer up a positive role model or two, Luskin was quick to

respond: "Not to be ridiculous, but Jesus would be a hero of mine."

An obvious choice, perhaps, but one that is too often forgotten in a culture cluttered with what Luskin describes as "one dimensional action [figures] who shoot people." Recalling the

Amish group in Pennsylvania who, in 2006, responded to a violent attack on their one-room schoolhouse with an outpouring of forgiveness, he said, "They actually believe that it's their responsibility to practice what Jesus says."

The good news, according to Luskin, is that such a response – and the benefits that go along with it – is not reserved for the Amish but is accessible to all of us.

"I believe that whatever there is in us that is touched by the spirit, or Spirit, or God or whatever it is," he said, "that it is active, separate from what we call it. That's just what I believe."

protect local water for future generations of California's and build more water storage.







The event is open to the public and will include presentations from the County Board of Supervisors, Citrus Heights City Council, State Assembly Offices and local dignitaries as well as the official ground breaking ceremony.

Sunrise Recreation and Park District was awarded \$3,601,100 for implementation of the Arcade Creek Park Preserve Master Plan from the Statewide Park Development and Community revitalization Program (known as the Statewide Park Development Program).

The Arcade Creek Park Preserve was one of 64 recipients selected for funding from a pool of over 400 applications. In total, \$368 million was awarded for the creation of new parks and recreation facilities in critically underserved communities throughout California.

When the Park District acquired Arcade Creek property in 2004, the surrounding dmitchell@sunriseparks.com ★

neighborhood was considered an underserved area for neighborhood parks within the District. The ten-acre preserve includes the meandering Arcade Creek and natural woodland landscape. Arcade Creek Park Preserve's Master Plan was approved in 2008 and incorporates ideas from an intensive community outreach process. The Plan includes a nature trail system emphasizing the benefits of Arcade Creek, children's adventure play area, social fitness course, a shaded picnic area, pathway seating, the area's first public zip line and an interpretive walk.
