CITRUS HEIGHTS, CA (MPG) - Look for a 'new' bell to soon add to the historic appearance of the Citrus Heights Veteran's Community Center.

On January 17, 2014 the regular Friday morning meeting of the Citrus Heights "Skillbuilders" Toastmasters Club (which meets at the Sylvan Community Center located directly across from the Citrus Heights Veteran's Community Center), was beginning a celebration 25 years in the making. This meeting had a dual purpose. Dignitaries from

the community and veterans were present to congratulate the club on their anniversary and to make a special presentation that would benefit the veteran community and carry on the history of the old Sylvan School House, presently in the process of renovation.

Mary Holly, a retired Army warrant officer, and her husband Joe, also a veteran are both members of Skillbuilders. Active in the greater veteran community, they have long been involved with the work of Pathways for Veterans. Now a national organization, which originated in the Sacramento area, they "work

with returning veterans in an effort to overcome the individual tragedies of war, put loss and victim hood aside and move on with their lives, ultimately becoming fully self-expressed citizens."

The founder of Pathways, Gary Ferguson happened to be on hand earlier to receive an authentic vintage school bell from Mary, which she had rescued several years ago from a scrap heap on the California coast. The bell was to be donated to the Pathways Well Being Center. Here is where the story takes an interesting turn.

Pathways growth nationally

has caused them to move their center to a new larger location in Orangevale, CA, which has no place for the newly restored school bell. Now enters the Citrus Heights Veterans Community Center and its founder Jim Rounsavell. Rounsavell's own nonprofit, Veterans Golf Park for Disabled Vets, is headquartered in the old Sylvan School house. It has a bell tower with no bell. At this point the meeting became about veterans helping veterans.

In a ceremony prior to the

Legal Drama Sparks Arena Debates
McGinness to Moderate Third Debate As Arena Issue Intensifies

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - The consequences of a June vote on Sacramento's arena funding will be the topic for Arena Debate 3, the third town hall discussion between John Hyde and R.E. Graswich. The debate takes place on Tuesday, February 11, at Belle Cooledge Library, 5600 South Land Park Boulevard, 7 - 8 p.m. Doors open at 6:30 p.m.

"The events unfolding around the arena petition are unprecedented," said Hyde, "and despite media attention, there's still a lot of misinformation circulating. It's critical that the community understands what's really at stake in this election."

Hyde is a former spokesperson for STOP (Sacramento Taxpayers Opposed to Pork), the group seeking to place the sports subsidy question before voters.

Graswich, former Special Assistant to Mayor Kevin Johnson and author of the new book on the Sacramento Kings, "Vagrant Kings," takes the opposite side, arguing against a public vote and citing the City Clerk's rejection of STOP's petition due to "major" legal flaws.

"The vote is a sham designed to kill the arena and run the Kings out of town," Graswich said. "Even if you don't like the Kings, you'd better know the consequences of sending the team and their \$1 billion investment down the river to San Jose or a more welcoming city."

Former Sacramento County Sheriff John McGinness will moderate Arena Debate 3, which is sponsored by Inside Publications. Former City Council members Lauren Hammond and Rob Fong moderated the first two debates.

Final State Water Action Plan Released: Outlines California's Near- and Long-Term Water Priorities

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - As California experiences one of the driest winters on record, the California Natural Resources Agency, the California Environmental Protection Agency, and the California Department of Food and Agriculture released the final California Water Action Plan, laying out goals and vision for the next five years. The plan will guide state efforts to enhance water supply reliability, restore damaged and destroyed ecosystems, and improve the resilience of our infrastructure.

At the direction of Gov.

Edmund G. Brown Jr., a collaborative effort of state agencies, and nearly 100 substantive public and stakeholder comments formed a plan to set direction for a host of near- and long-term actions on water issues for the state.

"It is a tall order. But it is what we must do to get through this drought and prepare for the next," said Gov. Brown in his 2014 State of the State address.

The Governor's proposed 2014-15 budget lays a solid fiscal foundation for implementing near-term actions for the plan, recommending \$618.7 million

in funding for water efficiency projects, wetland and watershed restoration, groundwater programs, conservation, flood control, and integrated water management.

"As we work on emergency actions to manage through one of the driest winters on record, we are also taking proactive, long-term steps to prepare California for future droughts and flood," said Secretary for Natural Resources John Laird. "Each decade brings improvements, but also significantly highlights what we can do better. The California

CITRUS HEIGHTS, CA (MPG) - “Navigating Change” was chosen as the theme for the 56th Annual Citrus Heights Chamber of Commerce Installation Dinner held on January 24, at the Citrus Heights Community Center.

The evening was a time for attendees to gather and get an overview of what Chamber and other community members have worked for and accomplished in 2013. Special recognition was given to those who have performed their duties with enthusiasm and an exceptional understanding of the community they serve.

Outgoing Chamber Board of Directors Chair, Christie Woodards, welcomed guests. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited, and the Citrus Heights Police Department did the Posting of Colors.

John McGinnis, former Sacramento Sheriff and now talk radio host for KFBK News Radio, emceed the evening.

Mayor Mel Turner installed the new 2014 Board of Directors and led them in their oath of office.

The “Best of Citrus Heights” awards to businesses were handed out. Voting by the community began online in October in 26 categories of retail, wholesale, services businesses and community non-profits. Among the winners were Dutch Brothers Coffee, Kniesel’s Auto Service Center, Discovery Tree Schools and Costco Wholesale. Chief Christopher Boyd of the Citrus Heights Police Department presented Officer

Chris Garbarini with the 2013 Police Officer Excellence Award. With almost eleven years of law enforcement experience, Boyd emphasized Garbarini’s ‘preemptive approach to law enforcement’, stating that, “in 2013 alone, he responded to more than 2,100 incidents, was involved in more self-initiation events than any other department member, and led the agency in arrests with a total number of 114.” His efforts are credited for “measurably reducing crime in Citrus Heights.”

Sacramento Metro Fire Chief Patrick Ellis awarded the Firefighter Excellence Award to Captain Kevin Wegener. Wegener was acknowledged for his active work with small businesses in the community, his 20 years of volunteering for many special duties, and initiating regular meetings and trainings that have greatly improved the performance of Station 23, where he is now assigned. ‘Wegener is not afraid to hold himself and others accountable...with an old school work ethic.’ As a testimony to his ability to earn and keep the trust of those he works with, when Wegener transferred, “his whole crew followed him to a new battalion.” “That is a giant compliment and testament to his trustworthiness.”

The Chairman’s Award, a special award presented to a member by the outgoing Chair, went to Jeannie Bruins, Interim Chamber President/CEO. A member of city council, Bruins agreed to return to her former position of President/CEO in 2013. Woodards said, “Thanks to her diligence the Chamber has a renewed discipline and is in a great position to continue to provide excellent service to our members and the community as a whole.”

The Ambassador of the Year is an award that is presented to the ambassador who achieves a consistently high level of service to the Chamber and its members. Presented by Woodards to ilene Martzen, an ambassador since 2011, Woodards commented on how Martzen works tirelessly not only interacting closely with prospective and new members, but continuing to help maintain members interest in the Chamber.

Bruins then presented Christi Woodards, Sunrise Mall General Manager, with the Business Person of the Year award. Following the passing of the gavel from Woodards to Evan Jacobs, of California American Water, Jacobs recognized Woodard’s hard work and dedication in 2013 stating, “The Citrus Heights Chamber of Commerce has emerged from 2013 with renewed discipline and clear goals to improve the economic prosperity of our businesses, support the education of our kids and create connections that strengthen the community as a whole”.

Newly installed board chair Jacobs then awarded the “Best of the Best’ business in Citrus Heights” to Sylvan Corners Pet Hospital, which received the most votes overall in the Best of Citrus Heights polling.

It was an evening of community awards, good food, music and a silent auction. Prizes included Sacramento Capitols tennis tickets, a personal tour of the State Capitol and lunch with Assemblyman Ken Cooley, lunch with Sacramento County Board of Supervisors Roberta MacGlashan, and the ultimate prize, “The Citrus Heights Police Experience.” ★

Interview with Shannon Dittemore

CITRUS HEIGHTS, CA (MPG) - Shannon Dittemore has lived in Citrus Heights for most of her life. I recently caught up with her after her book launch at Barnes and Noble. Dark Halo is the third book in the *Angel Eyes* trilogy.

Daly: Shannon, tell me the book summary of *Dark Halo*.

Dittemore: It's the story of a girl who's gifted with the

ability to see into the spirit world, to see beings invisible to normal humans. In this book, she needs to decide if she's going to fight for what she's lost in the first two books. She's given the choice to not see the invisible, but in giving up her sight, she won't be able to see all the beauty surrounding her.

Daly: I know you have a busy family, two young children and you volunteer a lot of your time. How long did

it take you to write the book, and when do you find time to write?

Dittemore: I call it 'stealing moments.' I have three hours after I drop off my daughter for kindergarten. I use that time to stay in the story, to go back and do edits on what I've written the day before. I do my 'chunk' writing on the weekends or when the kids are in bed. Then I'll have two to four hours of uninterrupted time. I usually write, then walk around my cul-de-sac, then write some more, then walk. My neighbors think I'm nuts, but that's okay.

Daly: The battle between good and evil is a timeless story. What makes yours different?

Dittemore: As you know, angels and demons are very big right now in speculative fiction, especially in the young adult market. My books focus on the invisible world. While the story has a romantic element, there are bigger things at stake.

Daly: Would you let your kids read *Dark Halo*?

Dittemore: (Laughs) Yes, but not yet. The ideal age is thirteen and up. I'd say that parents should read alongside if their child is younger than that. I do touch on the issue of human trafficking, so parents need to be aware of what they want their kids exposed to.

Daly: What's it like to have three books published at such a young age?

Dittemore: Writers are an insecure bunch. I worry that all my stories have been told. I know lots of writers would kill to be where I am, but I ask myself if I have any stories left that are personal to me. I love getting emails from teenagers who've read my books, and I want this to be a career.

Daly: With that in mind, what's next?

Dittemore: My work in progress is a young adult detective novel, set slightly in the future. There's a speculative twist to it. My thief is stealing hearts. (spoiler alert!).

Daly: What advice would you give to an aspiring author?

Dittemore: Enjoy the time you have to write your first book. After you get that contract, you'll spend a ton of time doing things that have nothing to do with writing. You'll be marketing, selling, posting on Facebook, doing blog tours, book signings, and doing Tweet Chats. And you'll be working on your second novel at the same time.

Daly: What do you do for fun?

Dittemore: (Laughs) Well, I write. Oh, I love live theater. As a child, I wanted to be an actor. I did a lot of community theater stuff. Then I got married and didn't want to give up my nights, but I missed acting and storytelling and that creative outlet. When my youngest

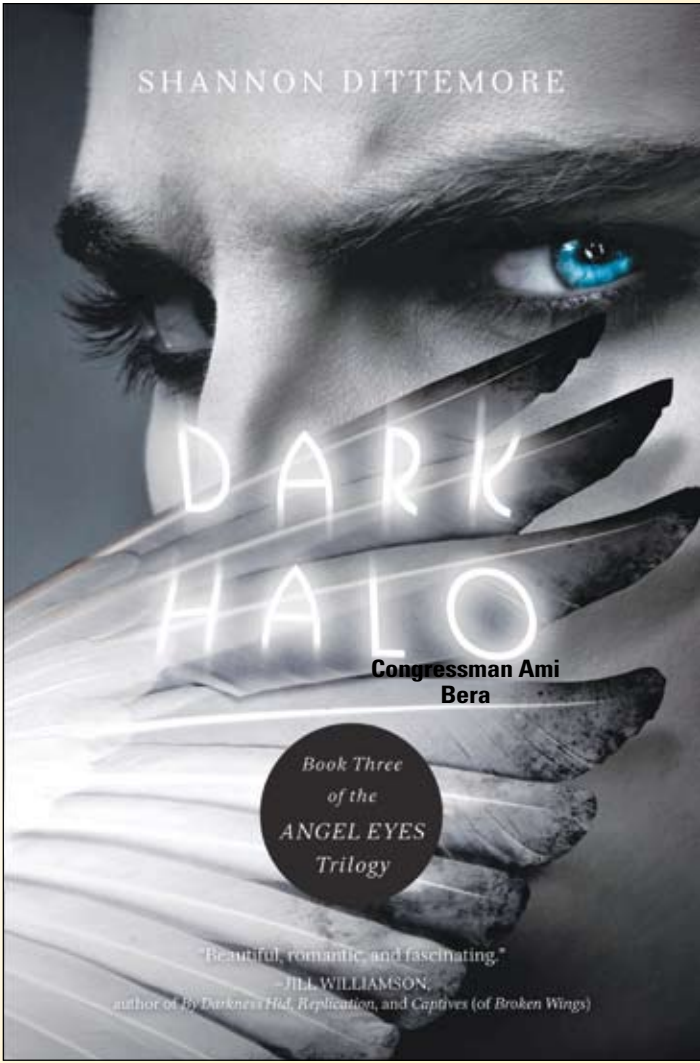
was two months old, I had 'a moment.' I was frustrated, and asked God, "How can I tell stories from home?" It was while walking my non-sleeping baby, I came up with the concept of a halo, which gave Brielle the eyes to see the hidden spiritual world.

I'm also excited to be helping with a mentoring program at my kids' school. I'll be working with sixth through twelfth graders by teaching them how to write

fiction, and introducing them to the publishing industry.

Daly: Thanks, Shannon, for taking the time to talk with me.

The airman completed an intensive, eight-week program that included training in military discipline and studies, Air Force core values, physical fitness, and basic warfare principles and skills.

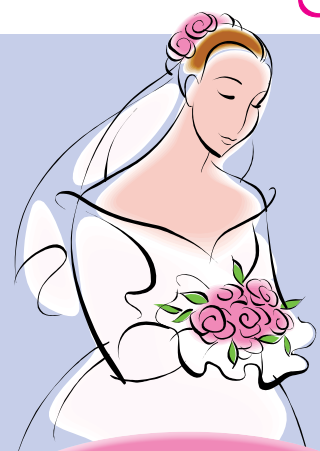

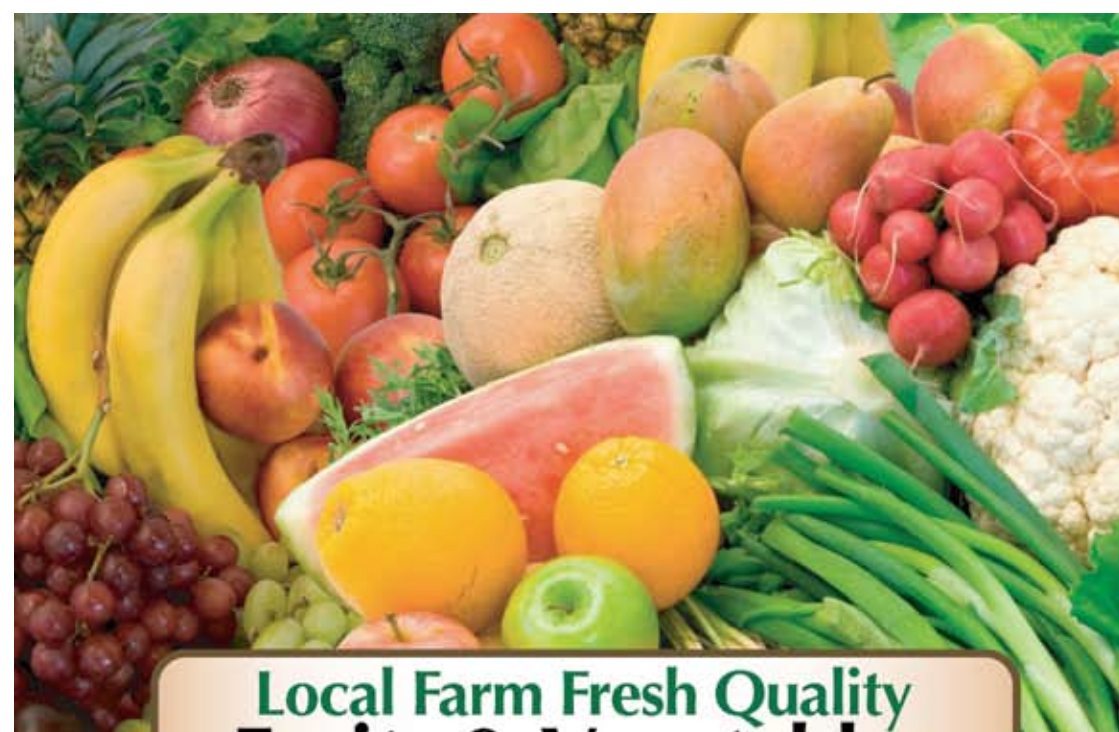

Recent cases of interest

CASE: Daniel Cory Clapp & Jolea Marie Clapp (01/31/14)
PROSECUTOR: Assistant Chief Deputy District Attorney Marv Stern, 916.874.6612

District Attorney Jan Scully announced today the arrest of 11-year veteran California Highway Patrol (CHP) Officer Daniel Cory Clapp, stationed in Lassen County, and his wife, CHP dispatcher Jolea Marie Clapp, on five felony counts of workers' compensation insurance fraud.

Daniel Clapp filed his workers' compensation claim based upon injuries he allegedly received during a scuffle while making an arrest on December 27, 2011. Daniel and Jolea Clapp stated to the workers' compensation doctor that Daniel was unable to drive, lift heavy items, and that pain prevented him from performing his duties as a CHP officer.

The CHP's Internal Affairs Section, Workers' Compensation Fraud Investigation Unit, conducted surveillance on numerous occasions and observed Daniel Clapp camp, boat, swim and dive. In addition, he was observed driving for long periods of time and cutting and carrying firewood rounds 18" thick and 24" in diameter. Jolea Clapp often accompanied Daniel Clapp on these pleasure outings and would drive for him while in the local CHP jurisdiction and then change driver positions outside of the jurisdiction.

During medical visits in which Daniel Clapp complained of pain, Jolea Clapp forcefully corroborated her husband's accounts of disabling pain and his inability to perform physical activities that she was observed seeing him perform.

Both defendants are accused of conspiracy to make false statements in support of a workers' compensation insurance claim and making false statements about the true extent of Daniel Clapp's physical activities and abilities in order to obtain benefits. Daniel Clapp is additionally accused of perjury for false statements in a deposition.

The amount of the fraud is in excess of \$50,000 and the charges carry a potential state prison sentence of up to 5 years and a \$150,000 fine upon conviction. The defendants will appear in Sacramento Superior Court in early February 2014.

This case is being prosecuted by the District Attorney's Insurance Fraud Unit.

CASE: Joseph Gannon (01/31/14)
PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Caryn Dubke, Elder Abuse Prosecution Unit

District Attorney Jan Scully announced today that the Honorable Delbert Oros sentenced 22-year-old Joseph Gannon to 15 years in state prison. On December 5, 2013, Gannon pled to multiple felony charges, including first-degree residential burglary, assault on an elder adult causing great bodily injury, second-degree burglary and two counts of identity theft. Gannon also admitted a prior first-degree residential burglary conviction from 2009, a strike under the Three Strikes Law.

The morning of April 7, 2013, Gannon entered the home of a 68-year-old woman he knew while she slept. During the burglary, the victim woke up, saw Gannon, and ultimately recognized him to be the son of her former friend. Gannon then beat her with his fists and her cane while she laid in bed, causing head trauma, multiple lacerations, and fractures to her cheekbone and jaw. The victim required jaw surgery and suffered other permanent injuries.

Gannon fled the victim's home with two rifles, her purse, cash, jewelry, and other items. A short time later, he was captured on surveillance video in two Placer County businesses using the victim's credit card to make purchases.

Deputy District Attorney Caryn Dubke stated, "The defendant targeted someone he knew and thought would sleep through the burglary. This senseless beating robbed the victim of her independence and left her depressed, disfigured, and terrified. Today's sentence is appropriate for this cowardly and despicable crime against an elderly member of our community."

CASE: Charanjit Sandhu (01/30/14)
PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Nancy Cochrane, Special Assault & Child Abuse Unit

District Attorney Jan Scully announced today that the Honorable Eugene Balonon sentenced Charanjit Sandhu to 83 years to life in prison. On December 18, 2013, a jury convicted Sandhu on multiple charges of committing lewd and lascivious acts against minor female children.

After years of abuse, the victims bravely stood up against Sandhu and testified at trial even though they were fearful of him.

Deputy District Attorney Nancy Cochrane states, "I commend Sacramento County Sheriff's Detective Tony Saika and District Attorney Victim Advocate Rafaela Perez for their hard work in this case."

This year Bob Seger will celebrate his tenth anniversary as an inductee into the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame. The honor is his because of his hardscrabble, up-by-the-bootstraps life story; the way he can forge lyrics that are a combination of personal autobiography and everyman’s experience; and of course, there is the legendary intensity with which he delivers his melodies.

Of equal legend are his songs: “Turn the Page,” “Night Moves,” “We’ve Got Tonight,” and “Still the Same” – tunes that launched Seger to worldwide fame, carried him to the top of the charts, and gave many of us a soundtrack for our coming of age years.

My personal Seger favorite is “Like a Rock.” Most people today associate this iconic song with Chevrolet pickup trucks. I associate the apropos lyrics with the evening of my high school graduation: “I stood there boldly, sweatin’ in the sun, felt like a million, felt like number one; the height of summer, I’d never felt that strong, like a rock.”

And then the refrain that Seger screams into the microphone, a refrain about himself as a younger man: “Like a rock, I was strong as I could be; like a

rock, nothin’ ever got to me; like a rock, I was something to see; like a rock.”

Seger captures the years of youth, perfectly. It is a time of unbridled optimism, strength, and arrogance. A young man or woman can do anything, be anything, try anything, and overcome anything. No challenge is too big, too tough, or too much – body and soul are as solid rock.

Honestly, a young person needs this kind of bravado. He or she needs a kind of audacious swagger when life is just getting started. But he or she will also learn – life teaches everyone this lesson – that the do-everything, dare-anybody, defy-anything ability of youth, doesn’t last.

We live a little while and experience a few disappointments. We bury loved ones, lose a job, a marriage, a house, a career, or a fortune. We are betrayed by a friend, a business partner, or a lover. We suffer, hurt, age, have our hearts broken, or muddle through a couple decades of muted frustration.

Then we learn, and this learning is as absolutely necessary as youthful strength, that we really aren’t “like a rock” at all – at least not anymore. The challenges of life are indeed too big, too tough, and too much. We learn that life, like erosion, has a way of reducing the hardest stone into sand.

Admittedly, this realization might cause you to hit the booze or pills and collapse into a hopeless stupor – many past the prime of youth do exactly that.

But the recognition of weakness and personal limitation – that we won’t always be “standin’ arrow straight, chargin’ from the gate, and carryin’ the weight” – is not cause for despair. It is liberation.

It is deliverance from the “try-harder-and-do-more” life. It is a release from the gladiator’s ethic of “I have to kill myself (or others) to overcome.” It is freedom from the totalitarianism of “If it’s going to be, it is up to me.” In short, it is surrender, and surrender is true faith and true life.

“If you try to hang on to your life,” Jesus said, “then you will lose it.” This “hanging on” includes personal arrogance, strength, ambitions, and our self-reliant approach to life. We learn to let these go, not because we have hopelessly given up, but because we have given over. We have exchanged our failing abilities and life for the power of God and his life.

In the end, we won’t always “stand boldly in the sun.” We retreat into the darkness. We aren’t always as “strong as we can be,” because we face things in life that are stronger than we are. Our steady hands will grow shaky and our clear, bright eyes will grow dim. But it’s all okay if we have learned to live differently, if we have learned to live a life entrusted to the Rock that is Christ. ★

At least a hundred years before health care reform became all the rage, religious reformer and medical pioneer Mary Baker Eddy spoke of a growing interest in “a higher mode of medicine.”

Little did she know it would take so long for many of the changes she envisioned to find the broad support and practical application we’re seeing today, particularly within the field of mind-body medicine.

Just one bit of evidence can be found in the publication earlier this month of “Spiritual Pregnancy,” a book that superimposes Joseph Campbell’s mythical “hero’s journey” over the three trimesters of pregnancy, drawing special attention to the spiritual awakening that takes place throughout this process. During an interview last year, Shawn Tassone, one of the book’s two authors, spoke about the unexpected and often dramatic nature of progress in all aspects of life, including medicine.

His inspiration came from an advanced math class he took where an exploration of S-curves taught him that the nearer ocean waves approach land, the closer they become, the larger they grow and the faster they move until, at last, they come crashing onto shore. Years later, he noticed these patterns appearing again, this time in his practice as an OB/GYN.

In 2002, Tassone and his wife began running a busy women’s health clinic in Arizona,

a veritable proving ground for the latest advances in medicine. But in 2009, it was the advances being made in a different although related arena that led him to enroll as a graduate student in the College of Mind-Body Medicine at San Francisco-based Saybrook University.

It was at Saybrook that Tassone began working on a “narrative biopic” about Dr. Larry Dossey, best-selling author of a number of books on health and healing and the man widely credited with infusing the term “nonlocal mind” into the modern-day vernacular. Broadly defined, “nonlocal mind” refers to the presumed source of a variety of interactions that are beyond the comprehension of the physical senses, including intuition, synchronicity (simultaneous occurrences) and spontaneous healing. According to Dossey, it’s this ability to affect physical cure for yourself and others by means of a singular nonlocal mind – or Mind for those who consider this a divine consciousness – that represents what he describes as the most advanced era of medicine.

“It makes sense to me that at some point that wave is going to break, or hit a break-point where nonlocal healing has to happen,” said Tassone, relating this concept to his earlier research. “I don’t think it’s something that you can avoid.”

“The question that I have is, has it been there the whole time and we just discovered it? Or is it something we invented? I would venture to say it’s probably been there the whole time. We just weren’t able to incorporate it.”

As surprising and as futile as it may seem to people like Tassone, there are still quite a number of people doing all they can to keep this wave from reaching shore.

Last year he wrote a column for Psychology Today detailing a case of his involving a woman suffering from severe pelvic pain. Long story short, rather than operating on her, which was Tassone’s first inclination, he chose an approach that dealt directly – and successfully – with the patient’s troubled thought.

“What I discovered that day was the mind holds so much power over pleasure and pain,” he wrote.

Unfortunately, the response he received from mostly women readers was so vitriolic, a number of comments had to be removed from the website.

“I got so distraught about all these threats because these women were saying to me, ‘You are so wrong for saying that pelvic pain is all in your head,’ said Tassone. “I wasn’t saying that at all. In a way, it was almost worse than [the] response I get from doctors when I tell them about mind-body medicine.”

“So, what I took away from that [experience] was that, even though there is definitely a physical and mental component to pain, we as a society are more geared to fix the physical and unconsciously ignore the mental, maybe because that’s easier to deal with.”

Despite this resistance, however, the wave that Mary Baker Eddy envisioned so many years ago keeps coming. Whether it’s being propelled by people like Shawn Tassone, or the thousands if not millions of others who for years have recognized this connection between our thoughts and our physical well-being, it appears to be getting closer, higher, faster.

“The Bible says, ‘Doctor heal thyself,’” said Tassone, “but I think that what it [should be] is, ‘Patient heal thyself.’

“If patients would make the transition themselves and push this issue, that’s when I think that wave is going to crash.”.H

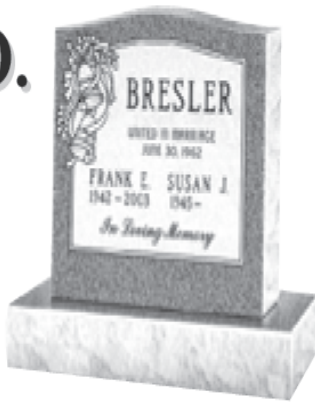

JACK RYAN: SHADOW RECRUIT (Rated PG-13)

A Film Review by Tim Riley

The brutal realities of war in the rugged terrain of Afghanistan, as told in "Lone Survivor," hits the audience right in the gut in this unvarnished tale of heroism and courage under the harsh light of Peter Berg's direction.

The director brilliantly captures the unforgiving essence of a Navy SEAL operation that went horribly wrong when a reconnaissance team of four brave soldiers became trapped under fire in the mountains of the remote Hindu Kush region of Kunar province.

Based upon the first-person account of Marcus Luttrell, "Lone Survivor," at least as a title, downgrades the element of suspense, but not enough that the ill-fated mission is relieved of all sense of shock and trepidation.

The opening scene is a fitting prologue that explores in excruciating detail the rigors of the intensely grueling training process, where only those with the greatest mental and physical toughness emerge as full-fledged SEALs.

The point of this exercise is to set the stage for what follows in 2005 when Marcus Luttrell (Mark Wahlberg) and three of his battle-ready fellow soldiers are dispatched on a mission to capture or kill a top Taliban leader responsible for slaying U.S Marines.

The other elite soldiers include

commanding officer Lt. Michael Murphy (Taylor Kitsch), gunner Danny Dietz (Emile Hirsch), and sonar technician Matthew "Axe" Axelson (Ben Foster), all of whom report to Lt. Commander Erik Kristensen (Eric Bana).

Character development is somewhat limited by the circumstances of the wartime setting. We get a glimpse of the camaraderie between the men at the base camp, mostly the usual male bonding and joking around, but not a lot of perceptive insight.

On June 28, 2005, the four-man surveillance team of Operation Red Wings boarded a helicopter so that they could be dropped into a remote mountainous area with the mission to identify Ahmad Shah, a high-level Taliban operative that the American military was most anxious to neutralize.

The four SEALs arrive safely on the ground, but soon discover that their radio equipment and satellite phone are not functioning regularly, leaving them isolated when having to make key decisions or relay vital information back to headquarters.

Another immediate problem is that three goat herders grazing their flock stumble upon the men's hiding place, plunging the mission into immediate jeopardy. The SEALs are forced to make an urgent life-and-death decision – how to treat the intruders under the rules of engagement.

In one of the film's most compelling scenes, the soldiers debate the choices facing them. Instantly, they know that protocol dictates they must release civilian noncombatants, but these

guys look more sinister and suspicious than simple farmers.

Still, killing the unarmed prisoners so that they could not alert the Taliban was morally objectionable, to say nothing of how the soldiers could be crucified by public opinion and the official rules if they killed innocent civilians.

Ultimately, the goat herders are cut loose, and the SEALs began an arduous climb to what they hoped would be safety. Soon, hellfire rained down on them.

The Taliban, bolstered by more than a hundred fighters, launch an assault that results in an intense firefight from machine guns, mortars and rocket-propelled grenades. The Americans are seriously outnumbered and outmatched in firepower.

But the hardy band of Navy SEALs hold off the enemy hordes for quite some time, a blood-splattered affair that puts the Americans in a courageous last stand that offers no way out since help is not imminently on the horizon.

Even when the cavalry arrives, in the form of an assault helicopter, the Taliban have already gained the upper hand and blast the rescue team out of the sky, killing another 16 Marines.

Even after falling down mountainous hillsides, pummeled by rocks and falling debris, Luttrell, badly wounded, miraculously escapes to small village where he's hidden by a tribe willing to stand up to the Taliban thugs.

For a war movie that seeks to put the audience in the thick of the action, "Lone Survivor" has adroitly accomplished the mission. Director Berg delivers an unflinching look at the brutality of warfare.

"Lone Survivor" is a significant war movie, and much like "Saving Private Ryan," it highlights the heroism of our soldiers. But it is also much like "Black Hawk Down" insofar as recalling very tragic circumstances of grueling combat.

CHOPPY WATER

Did you ever wonder why choppy water usually makes walleye fishing better—especially during bright, sunny days?

Much has been written about how walleyes react to light. In general, they are more active during periods of low light. Also a surface chop diffuses light.

On the sunniest of days, a slight chop will decrease underwater light intensity at least a little bit, and that is going to make walleyes more active. It might even cause them to use shallower water longer, and that will increase your fishing options.

So when you're planning your next walleye trip, check the weather forecast. If it's going to be sunny and breezy, your chances of catching fish are going to go up.

Final State Water Action Plan Released: Outlines California's Near- and Long-Term Water Priorities

Water Action Plan gives us clear focus and vision for the next five years."

Final revisions to the draft plan, released in October, include an expanded section on drought response and a new effort focused on better management of Sierra Nevada headwaters that helps water storage and quality, and ecosystems. Public comment on the draft plan made it clear that California must better understand the economic and ecological harm of sustained dry weather. The Governor's proposed budget would provide \$472.5 million in Proposition 84 funds to the Department of Water Resources (DWR) for integrated regional water management. The bond funds would leverage local and federal investment in projects that reduce demand, build supply, and offer additional benefits such as wildlife habitat and flood management. The budget also placed immediate emphasis on water and energy use efficiency and wetlands and coastal watershed restoration to further support the resiliency of water supply and ecosystems during this dry weather period.

The governor's budget also would allow DWR to better monitor the groundwater

resources that provide more than one-third of California's supplies in dry years, and supports the development of a state backstop for sustainable groundwater management practices by the State Water Resources Control Board, should local efforts to do so not materialize.

"Together, the Governor's proposed budget and this finalized plan provide the State with practical solutions to the state's most critical problems; the proposals on groundwater are a good example," said Cal/EPA Secretary Matt Rodriguez. "Data collection and monitoring are crucial to sustainable management of our unseen but incredibly important aquifers."

All of the near-and long-term actions in the plan center on sustaining supplies of water for people, the environment, industry and agriculture. This year's severe dry conditions highlight the stakes. Drought threatens to force the fallowing of hundreds of thousands of acres of farmland, throw thousands of people out of work, and potentially raise supermarket food prices.

"Our severe dry conditions are alarming for California's agricultural industry," said California Department of Food and Agriculture Secretary

Karen Ross. "In the near term, we must do all we can to keep our fields productive. In the long term, we have a once-in-a-generation opportunity to make the investments that will allow us to stay productive in the face of a changing climate."

Key actions identified in the Plan include:

- Make conservation a California way of life.
- Increase regional self-reliance and integrated water management across all levels of government.
- Achieve the co-equal goals for the Delta.
- Protect and restore important ecosystems.
- Manage and prepare for dry periods.
- Expand water storage capacity and improve groundwater management.
- Provide safe water for all communities.
- Increase flood protection.
- Increase operational and regulatory efficiency.
- Identify sustainable and integrated financing opportunities. ★
