Californians Who Short Sell Won't Face State Tax Penalty

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) -

Board of Equalization Member George Runner announced that the Franchise Tax Board (FTB) will follow the lead of the Internal Revenue Service and not impose a tax penalty on Californians who have sold their home via a short sale.

In a written response sent to Runner today, FTB Chief Counsel Jozel Brunett states, "Since California conforms to the relevant portions of the federal tax law governing the forgiveness of nonrecourse and recourse indebtedness, California would follow the federal treatment for the CCP section 580e transactions."

"This is welcome news for Californians who have had to short sell their homes this year," said Runner. "We learned last month they wouldn't face a federal tax penalty. We now know they won't face a state tax hit either."

In a September letter to FTB's Chief Counsel, Runner requested a legal opinion as to the potential tax consequences for a California resident who completes a short sale under existing California law.

Initially, FTB staff indicated they would need guidance from the IRS before providing an answer. That guidance arrived last month in an IRS letter to Senator Barbara Boxer regarding the expiration of the Mortgage Forgiveness Debt Relief Act. The IRS opined that debt forgiveness involving non-recourse loans held by California homeowners will not be viewed as taxable income.

"We are pleased with the recent clarifications issued by the IRS and the California Franchise Tax Board, which protect distressed homeowners from debt relief income tax associated with a short sale in California," said California Association of Realtors President Kevin Brown. "Distressed California homeowners can now avoid foreclosure or bankruptcy and can opt for a short sale instead, without incurring federal and state tax liability, even after the Mortgage Forgiveness Debt Relief Act of 2007 expires at the end of this year."

A legislative effort to extend tax protection for California short sales derailed this year. However, the FTB's announcement that it will conform with the IRS ensures continued protection for taxpayers without the need for legislation.

Quick Action by Metro Fire Crews Stops Fire Spread



Sac Metro Fire Report

CITRUS HEIGHTS, CA (MPG) - Just after 7:00 p.m. this evening firefighters from Metro Fire were dispatched to a report of an apartment fire in a 4-plex at 5593 Keoncrest Circle in Citrus Heights.

First arriving Metro units are credited with initiating a stop on this fire by an aggressive interior

attack. On arrival it was reported that there may have been citizens entering the fire unit and firefighters conducted a search to assure everyone had exited. Exposure units were protected by additional arriving firefighters who made sure no citizens were in harms way.

30 firefighters worked to contain and overhaul this fire quickly without injury to personnel or

citizens saving over \$300,000 in property and contents.

At the time of this release, the Investigations Unit from Metro Fire was on scene looking into the possible cause of the fire. The Investigations Unit asks anyone with further information on this incident to contact the Arson Tip Line at (916) 859-3775.



City Council Selects New Mayor and Vice Mayor



The center wraps up the year with the 10th annual Toys for the Troops Kids, supplying toys







Music Partner's Academy Offers Music Instruction for the 21st Century Child

When the child presses "record," and at the end, it shows which notes were played correctly. The goal is to have all green notes. According to Anderson, this system works better than having parents continuously monitor their child. The "Smart Music" program has helped to keep students engaged because its challenges are like a video game. Along with fun, Music Partner's Academy emphasizes that learning to master a musical instrument takes discipline. The students achieve success through team work, a lesson they will

With the beginning of Music Partner's fall 2013 session, a new motivational program was introduced. It's called, "Level Up." The interaction is much like a video game in that students gain points through in-class assignments as well as out - of - class musical opportunities. An example would be to play a song for Grandma, visit a music store or attend a musical performance. In-class assignments include mastering of assigned songs and

take with them into adult life.

successfully completing theory and notation quizzes. As students accumulate points, they move to the next level.

Often a child wants to play a musical instrument but they and their parent don't know which one would best suit their interest and talent. Music Partners Academy offers a "Get Acquainted," session. It's comprised of eight lessons over four weeks; two piano, two guitar, two voice and two drums. The instruments for these lessons are provided, so parents don't make an investment in an instrument their child may not like after a few weeks.

Although, Duane Anderson is a teaching owner, he does have a staff of expert instructors available at Music Partner's Academy. He hires teachers who either have a California Teaching Credential or performance degree in music. Those who have equivalent performance experience are also considered. Vehicle Hits FedEx Truck and **Becomes Lodged Underneath**

On December 3, 2013 at approximately 1:05 p.m., a 23 year old from Citrus Heights was driving a 2008 International Fed Ex truck on southbound Watt Avenue approaching Chenu Avenue. The truck was in the right hand turn lane, turn signal activated, and slowing for a red light.

David Longenecker, a 25 year old from Sacramento was driving a 2011 Dodge Avenger on southbound Watt Avenue approaching Chenu Avenue. The Avenger was

traveling at a high rate of speed and straddling the #3 lane and

right hand turn lane. Longenecker failed to see the Fed Ex truck slowing and slammed into the rear of the truck.

The impact caused the Avenger to travel underneath the Fed Ex truck and become lodged.

The front passenger, Joshua Stephens, a 21 year old from Rancho Cordova, had to be extricated by Sacramento Metropolitan Fire Department personnel and was transported to Mercy San Juan Medical Hospital with major injuries.

CHPD Announces New Auto Theft Prevention Program

CITRUS HEIGHTS, CA (MPG) - The Citrus Heights Police Department is proud to announce a new Auto Theft Prevention program.

The program, known as B.A.T (Battle Auto Theft), will allow vehicle owners to register their vehicles in their vehicles with the Police Department. Participation in the program will include a decal that will be placed on the vehicle identifying it to Citrus Heights Police Officers. By enrolling in the program, vehicle owners give officers authority to conduct a traffic stop on their vehicle, without the need for probable cause, between the hours of 1:00 a.m. and 5:00 a.m. The hours were chosen based on crime trend data, which indicates the majority of auto thefts occur during the early morning hours.


Program enrollment requirements are easy. The registered owner of the vehicle will complete an enrollment form, supplying information on the vehicle and registered owner. A serialized decal will be issued to the vehicle. The completed enrollment form will serve as consent for Citrus Heights Police Officers to stop the vehicle during the specified

hours in an attempt to ensure the driver of the vehicle is authorized to drive it. If circumstances change, and the vehicle owner no longer wants to participate in the program, cancellation is just as easy as initial enrollment.



SMUD Approves 2014 Budget

The Sacramento Municipal Utility District (SMUD) Board of Directors has approved a \$1.4 billion budget. The 2014 budget provides funding for all programs, projects and initiatives needed to meet the strategic targets set by the Board of Directors. The budget reflects a balanced approach that will keep SMUD on track to meet its long-term goals, while keeping a close eye on spending and continuing to improve operating efficiencies that provide value for customers. As the region starts to come out of the prolonged slow-growth economy, SMUD starts 2014 with a strong cash balance. When combined with cash generated from operations, SMUD expects to be able to cover the budget expenditures, including capital projects, without issuing new debt.

The 2014 budget anticipates electricity sales of \$1.3 billion, or an increase of about 3 percent over 2013. While the customer base is growing, total kilowatthour usage is expected to remain flat as energy efficiency measures and new solar installations reduce average electricity consumption per customer.

The commodities portion of the budget—the cost of natural gas to fuel power plants, wholesale power purchases and transmission — is \$506.8 million for next year, about half of the total operations and maintenance budget and a slight decline from 2013.

The capital budget, which covers additions and improvements to buildings, property and equipment, is \$227.5 million, up from \$180 million in 2013. The portion of the 2014 budget

earmarked for the low-income Energy Assistance Program Rate is \$46.7 million, an increase of 4

percent over 2013. Major projects for 2014 will include preparations for renovating the SMUD headquarters building, geotechnical work to help evaluate a proposed 400megawatt (MW) addition to the SMUD hydroelectric system and planning for the relocation of two major substations. SMUD will be working with the city of Sacramento and the owners of the Sacramento Kings on development of the downtown entertainment and sports center, a modern NBA venue that would seat 17,000 and is expected to stimulate associated development. To address reliability the budget includes funds for:

- Enhancing SMUD's ongoing underground cable replacement
- Developing transmission interconnection alternatives to increase load-serving capability, access renewable energy, provide voltage support, and support long-term carbon emission reduction.
- Developing a new site for new flexible thermal generation and conducting feasibility studies for a compressed air energy storage project, both of which can help support more wind and solar generation.
- Starting environmental work for a Collinsville property wind farm development of approximately 50 MW.
- Transferring all remaining low-level nuclear waste from Rancho Seco to an approved site in Texas.

For customers, the budget

includes a new energy efficiency program for small and medium business customers; driving customer transformation to LED lighting; constructing SMUDowned fast-charging stations for electric vehicles; and presenting a more consistent online customer experience across all platforms and devices (e.g., smartphones and tablets).

Additionally, SMUD will implement the Customer Experience Excellence initiative, which will:

- Identify new business opportunities for SMUD's retail
- Proactively provide information customers want using the channels they prefer.

SMUD customers continue to pay significantly less for electricity than most Californians and as of January 2014, about 35 percent less than residential customers who are supplied by neighboring PG&E. San Juan Water District Wholesale **Responds to BDCP Release**

CITRUS HEIGHTS, CA (MPG) - San and provides us with assurances Juan Water District Wholesale is preparing to review and respond to the state's latest draft of the

Bay Delta Conservation Plan. "Reviewing the more than 34,000 page environmental document will take time, but important considering how large this project is," says Shauna Lorance, general manager of the San Juan Water District Wholesale.

The district is looking for the state to release an operational plan showing how they will operate the project's famous Twin Tunnels. They are concerned that without a plan on how the state's water systems will be operated, the operation of Folsom Reservoir could cause a significant impact to their customers' water supply reliability.

"It's like building a house without a blueprint," noted Lorance. "We need to see a plan that is good for the entire state

that our future water supplies won't be in ieopardy."

San Juan Water District Wholesale has been sharing their concerns over expected outcomes in the draft document, specifically impacts to Folsom Lake. The lake provides water to over half a million people in the greater Sacramento region, more than half of which are San Juan Water District Wholesale and retail customers.

"Customers in our retail areas like Granite Bay and portions of Folsom and Roseville rely entirely on water supplies from Folsom Lake," says Lorance. "What we've seen so far are projections that climate change will cause Folsom Lake will drop to such lows that we'll have serious difficulties providing water to our customers for months at a time every decade."

Over the next few months. the district is prepared to review the draft document and provide comments. Along with the City of Roseville and other regional water providers, San Juan Water District will be calling upon customers to react to the BDCP and share any concerns, comments and feedback during the public comment period.

San Juan Water District Wholesale is a community services district that provides drinking water to more than 265,000 people in portions of Sacramento and Placer Counties. In addition to serving retail customers in Granite Bay, east Roseville and the northeast portion of Sacramento County, San Juan Water District Wholesale provides water to Citrus Heights and Fair Oaks water districts, Orange Vale Water Company, the City of Folsom (north of the American River) and periodically to Sacramento Suburban

Public Safety Realignment Has Led to Increase in Crime

SACRAMENTO. CA (MPG) - State Senator Jim Nielsen (R-Gerber), former Chair of the California Board of Prison Terms, issued the following statement today regarding the Public Policy Institute of California's conclusion that crime has increased as a result of the Governor's public safety realignment program:

"The link between the increase in crime and the Governor's public safety realignment program is no surprise.

"This is consistent with the FBI's and the California Attorney General's yearly crime statistics when compared to last year's. The Governor and lawmakers can no longer deny the serious flaws in their prison reduction

"I have said it before and I will say it again, the Governor needs to call lawmakers to action by declaring a special session to deal with public safety, where we can focus exclusively on correcting the deficiencies of prison realignment (AB 109) to protect Californians.

"We have to fix realignment before more citizens are harmed?

Enacted into law in October of 2011, the Governor's prison realignment plan (AB 109) sends certain convicted felons to county jails instead of state prisons. Local jurisdictions are struggling to meet the increasing demands of housing convicted felons. Realignment requires counties to incarcerate or find alternative programs for tens of thousands of drug dealers, burglars and other habitual felons who previously would have been sentenced to state prison.





"We three kings of Orient are." So begins a favorite carol of the Advent season about the "Wise Men" who visit the newborn Jesus. And so begins a tale that takes inaccuracy and historical revisionism to a whole new level. Reverend John Henry Hopkins, Jr., who wrote the carol a century and a half ago, should have known better.

First, we don't know exactly how many kings there were. There could have been as few as two and up to almost any number. Tradition says that there were three (though some traditions mention twelve), and over time they were even given names: Caspar, Melchior, and Balthasar. But these are apocryphal stories.

Second, they were not "kings" from the Orient. They were Wise Men, or put more accurately, Magi. The Magi were astronomers – primitive by today's standards - who were on the cutting edge of scientific and philosophical knowledge in their day. So it may be best to view these Magi as the uncanny combination of scientists, philosophers, and theologians – but not kings. And such men called Persia home (modern day Iran), not the Far

Third, these men did not find the Christ child while "following yonder star." They saw the

All means All (Second Week of Advent)

star "in the East" or "at the rising of the sun," but then proceeded west to Palestine. The star did not reappear until they were already in Bethlehem.

And finally, the Magi, technically, do not belong in the Nativity scene at all. They were latecomers to the Christmas party, maybe as late as Jesus' second birthday. The quaking shepherds, singing angels, and lowing cattle had returned to life as normal long ago. On and on I could go ripping the veracity of this Christmas Carol apart, but that is not my intent.

'We Three Kings" remains one of my favorite Holiday hymns to bellow out this time of year. My critique of it is to simply point out that apart from the accumulations of questionable tradition, we know little about these mysterious men from the East. And these traditions prevent us from embracing what we can learn from them – for the journey of the Magi is a fascinating exercise in unexpected faith.

They came seeking the child who had been born king of the Jews, based almost entirely on the appearance of an enigmatic star. While history is rampant with explanations for this phenomena, one conclusion is certain: The Magi interpreted this unusual sign in the heavens as a clear communication that something extraordinary had taken place in the world. And even more extraordinary, these Persian sages applied their interpretation to the emergence of Jesus, the Jewish Messiah.

Why so astonishing? Not many people would launch out on a

dangerous journey through the Middle East based solely on a spiritual hunch. Not many people would put their life on hold to prove their mystical intuitions to be true. And the most shocking of all, not many Persians (today's Iranians) would worship at the feet (or manger) of a Jew. And not many Jews could abide by such a thing, either!

Yet, in God's way, these all belonged together. Divisions of race, religion, nationality or ethnicity did not factor into the equation. This is a foreshadowing of what the Apostle Paul would say later. "In Christ," he said, "there is no difference between Jew and Greek, slave and free person, male and female. You are all the same in Christ Jesus" (See Galatians 3). And "all" does mean "all." All are welcome into the presence of the One who will "reconcile everything – all things in heaven and on earth to himself'

So here is where the Magi teach us the wisest of their lessons: There are many barriers to overcome and great distances to cover in our journey of faith - "field and fountain, moor and mountain" to quote Reverend Hopkins - but when we get to where we are going, we will we welcomed in with open arms. There we will find the "King forever, ceasing never, over us all to reign." And "all" surely means "all.".





Two Ways to Get Your Medicare Benefits

Some people may not realize it, but there are actually two ways to get Medicare benefits.

The best-known way is Original Medicare. With Original Medicare, you can choose any doctor, hospital, or other healthcare provider you want, as long as they accept Medicare. When you receive medical services or goods, Medicare pays the provider directly.

The other way is Medicare Advantage, which is a form of managed care, like an HMO or PPO. Medicare Advantage is provided by private insurance companies approved by Medicare. If you're in Medicare Advantage, you generally must go to doctors and other providers in the company's network.

If you go outside the network, you may have to pay more.

On the other hand, Medicare Advantage companies may offer some coverage – such as dental, hearing, vision, and wellness programs - that Original Medicare

Most people with Original Medicare pay a monthly premium. If you're in Medicare Advantage, you sometimes pay Advantage plan.)

to the private insurance company that covers you.

With Original Medicare, you must pay deductibles, co-pays, and coinsurance.

To cover these "gaps" in Medicare, some people buy a type of supplemental insurance called Medigap. If you have a Medigap policy, Medicare pays its share of the covered costs, and then your Medigap policy pays its share.

Medigap policies also are sold through private companies. All plans offer the same basic benefits but some offer additional benefits. The costs vary between insurance companies - and often cost is the only difference between policies. Some Medigap policies also offer benefits that Original Medicare doesn't, such as medical care when you travel outside the United States.

Original Medicare generally doesn't cover prescription drugs. If you want drug coverage, you can get it through Medicare Part D. Part D policies are sold through private companies approved by Medicare. You have to pay an additional monthly premium for Part D.

About 75 percent of Medicare beneficiaries choose Original Medicare, with the rest getting coverage through Medicare Advantage.

Medicare Advantage companies must cover all of the services that Original Medicare covers, except hospice care and some care in qualifying clinical research studies. (Original Medicare covers hospice and qualifying clinical research care even if you're in a Medicare

Advantage plans, you're covered for emergency and urgent care. Most Medicare Advantage plans also include prescription drug coverage.

But the plans can charge different out-of-pocket amounts and they have different rules for how you get service.

For example, you may need a referral to see a specialist. And you may need to stay in their provider network, unless you're willing to pay more to go outside the network.

You should always check with the plan before you get a service to find out whether it's covered and what your costs may be. If the plan decides to stop participating in Medicare, you'll have to join another Medicare health plan or return to Original Medicare.

How can you decide whether Original Medicare or Medicare Advantage is better for you?

There's a more detailed explanation of the differences between Original Medicare and Medicare Advantage in the "Medicare & You" handbook. An updated version of "Medicare & You" is mailed to all Medicare beneficiaries every fall.

Many Sacramento residents find it tough to make ends meet and it can be especially challenging during the holiday season. Sacramento Municipal Utility District (SMUD) customers are here to help and continue to deliver for those who need it. Those in need can get assistance paying their electric bill thanks to the EnergyHELP program. EnergyHELP makes it very easy for those who wish to contribute funds to help strug-

gling customers. The program is now ten years running. In that time, SMUD customers have contributed more than \$3 million to EnergyHELP. More than 13,000 customers now voluntarily donate monthly to help struggling low-income SMUD

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - customers keep the lights on.

Here's how EnergyHELP works: Customers can contribute automatically in their monthly bill payment to any of four partner charity agencies. The donation is tax-deductible, and SMUD sends all of the proceeds directly to the charity. Those charities in turn provide as much as \$200 in one-time bill assistance to low-income customers whose electric power has been, or is about to be, disconnected for non-payment. Typical monthly donations are between \$1 and \$10 per month, but some customers contribute \$20 to \$100

Since the EnergyHELP program started in 2004, a total of \$3,441,848 in assistance has been distributed to more than

22,000 local households in crisis through all four EnergyHELP partner charity agencies: Sacramento Food Bank and Family Services, the Salvation Army, Travelers Aid Emergency Assistance Agency, and the Folsom Cordova Community Partnership.

Based on customers helping their neighbors, SMUD will surpass \$552,000 in annual pledged EnergyHELP contributions by this year's end.


