Citrus Heights Citizen's Police Academy Shares Wealth of Information

CITRUS HEIGHTS, CA (MPG)-If you cringe every time you pass one of the eight red light cameras in Citrus Heights, have ever called 911 from your home or car, seen a K-9 demonstration, noticed increased graffiti in your neighborhood, or just wondered how safe you really are living or working in Citrus Heights, the Citrus Heights Police Department (CHPD) has a program for you! It's the Citrus Heights Citizen's Police Academy (CPA), and it just graduated its ninth class of 21 students on August 7 at the Community Center.

Citrus Heights is a city of 90 thousand residents living and best candidates, with extensive training and experience spanning every phase of police work the force. Ongoing training for officer at all levels is mandatory.

For nine weeks, three hours a week, students learned about 'everything police,' the lighter side of the work along with the dark side, from the perspective of the officers, the residents, and even the crooks! It is hoped that armed with new knowledge of the workings of their police force, graduates will pass along what they have learned to friends, coworkers and fellow residents.

Along with the traditional lecture and Power Point, students met and watched their K-9 protectors in action, sat on a motorcycle, aimed the 'aging' radar and new Doppler laser guns at speeding cars, and learned how to dust for and lift their own fingerprints from a Coke can.

One Hundred Years of History: The Roots of San Juan Unified School District and Creation of San Juan High School —Part 1

CITRUS HEIGHTS, CA (MPG) - This is the first in a series of articles exploring the past, present, and future of San Juan High School in Citrus

The area encompassing what is now known as the San Juan Unified School District was a far different place in 1913 than it is today. The major livelihood for families was agriculture - most farms were family-owned and family-operated. The family's members, including school-age children, made up the major labor contribution to the success of the farm. Yet in another way, the area had a trait that continues today – a commitment to quality education for the area's children.

The Sylvan Elementary School District had been formed in 1863, only 14 years after the gold rush, replacing informally run schools that had been set up earlier. The (note the spelling used then) Roberts, Fairoaks, Orange Vale, and San Juan (later named Carmichael) Elementary School Districts were formed a few years later. But a dilemma faced the area's elders.

What about high school for their children? If the patriarch of a family was 60 years old in 1913, he had seen in his lifetime the coming of the railroad, telegraph, telephone, automobile, and airplane. It would have been readily apparent that the family's children in this new technological 20th century would need more education than the elementary level. But Sacramento High School was a 2-1/2 hour buggy ride each way - too far for daily commute. If a family wanted high school for its children, it faced the dilemma of boarding them in Sacramento with other

families, losing their children's valuable work on the farm before and after school.

The need for a local high school was compelling. So, on February 28, 1913 the Folsom Telegraph newspaper reported, "Petitions are being circulated in Fairoaks, Orange Vale, and Sylvan Districts asking the supervisors to call an election for voting on the proposition of a union high school...." The petition drive was successful, and an election was scheduled for June 28, 1913.

On July 11, 1913, the Telegraph reported, "At the election recently held in the Fairoaks, Orange Vale, Roberts, Sylvan, and San Juan School Districts on the matter of forming a union high school district, the vote was unanimous in favor of the proposition, not a negative vote being cast." With this 165 to 0 vote, the area and education offering of elementary and high school education that became the San Juan Unified School District became official

On July 28, 1913, the County Superintendent of Schools called for a board member from each of the five elementary districts to a meeting. They were F.H. Sargent, Fairoaks; J.L. Patterson, Orange Vale; G.E Fetters, San Juan; J.F. Close, Roberts; and Adolph Van Maren, Sylvan. The five elected J.L. Patterson as president.

The Telegraph later reported, "Routine business was transacted and adjournment was taken to August 2nd at Fairoaks when applications for principal were considered and a selection was made. Thirty applications for that place, which pays \$1,500 a year, were received, and E.C. Overholzer was chosen for the coming year."

The October 3, 1913, Folsom Telegraph reported "The new

San Juan Union High School opened at Fairoaks, Monday September 22nd, with most encouraging prospects." The Fairoaks Elementary School had offered the second floor of its school for the first high school classes.

Think of that: From June 28th to September 22nd, a school district was formed, a staff was hired, a temporary location was located, and classes began. Could we do that today? What a fine legacy our founders gave us with their commitment to quality education and a drive to work together to provide it.

In June of 1914, the first San Juan diploma was awarded to Gertrude Jeraud of Fairoaks (who later became Mrs. A.G. Broadley).

Governor Brown Signs Assemblyman Cooley's Business Fee Transparency Bill New law ensures access to fee requirements

and schedules for businesses

CA (MPG) - On Monday, August 19th, Governor Jerry Brown signed into law Assembly Bill 393 (Cooley) requiring the Governor's Office of Business and Economic Development (GO-Biz) to provide small businesses with an online location where they can find information on mandatory fee requirements and schedules so that start-ups and established small businesses can budget accordingly throughout the year.

"One priority for a healthy business is the ability to plan," said Assemblyman Ken Cooley. "Licensure costs and other fees are usually manageable, if the owners can anticipate them and plan for their eventual payment. Protecting the health of our business community sustains jobs in our community."

Authored by Assemblyman Cooley, AB 393 requires the State's GO-Biz website, starting on January 1st, 2014, to provide businesses with electronic, downloadable copies of all state licensing, permitting, and registration applications and fees they are required to complete and pay.

"Business licensing and monitoring is necessary in keeping our State's workforce and consumers safe, but because of a lack of transparency doing business in our state has become burdensome and costly for many," said Cooley. "This bill's passage will make doing business in California easier and less time consuming, giving business owners/operators

SACRAMENTO REGION, more time to focus on developing their staff and selling their products and services."

AB 393 was a bipartisan piece of legislation sponsored by the California Small Business Association and supported



A Case in Point

Wronged at Work!

CANTHEY FIRE ME BECAUSE I'M PREGNANT?

Cynthia got pregnant. Then, she got fired. Next, she got a lawyer.

Cynthia was marketing director for Gosharooney.com, an Internet retailer that sold children's clothing. (The names of both Cynthia and Gosharoony are fictional.) Cynthia was admired by her co-workers for her dedication and leadership skills.

When Cynthia learned she was pregnant in October 2012, she immediately provided Gosharooney with notice of her anticipated leave. She continued to work long hours and set a demanding pace for herself and her marketing group.

Gosharooney expanded too quickly and ran into hard times. During January 2013, its stock price declined by 80%. The CEO was terminated, and the Board of Directors hired a new chief executive who was known as a turnaround expert. This incoming CEO brought along an aggressive marketing consultant; the two men had worked together at a previous company. The consultant clashed constantly with Cynthia on budgets and personnel decisions. Cynthia suspected that the consultant was angling to force her out of the company and take her job.

The new CEO began expressing doubts about Cynthia's performance, attitude, and attendance. He put three of Cynthia's reports on the spot by asking them whether she was a "team player." On several occasions, he commented to Gosharooney's management group that her attendance record was "spotty" and that she seemed to be "checked out."

In March 2013, the company announced a 20% reduction-inforce (RIF). About 30 people

were fired, including Cynthia.

Cynthia hired a lawyer who specialized in employees' legal rights and sued the company for pregnancy discrimination. Gosharooney's lawyer argued that Cynthia's termination was a consequence of the RIF and was unrelated to pregnancy. The company's attorney filed a motion for summary judgment (i.e., the attorney asked the judge to dismiss Cynthia's case and throw it out of court before a trial even started).

What's the likely outcome of this hypothetical case?

The names of Cynthia and Gosharooney.com are fictitious, but otherwise I've based this situation on an actual case, Kelly v. Stamps.com (2006). In this decision, a California appellate court ruled in favor of Megan Kelly, a marketing executive who was seven months pregnant when she was fired. The court permitted her lawsuit for pregnancy discrimination to proceed against her former employer, an Internet company that sold postage online.

The court ruled that the CEO's comments about Kelly being "checked out" could refer to some combination of Kelly's commitment to take the maternity leave, and a temporary diversion of her attention due to her pregnancy.

Furthermore, the court rejected the company's argument about a reduction in force. An employer's freedom to consolidate or reduce its work force, said the court, doesn't allow it to use the RIF as "a convenient opportunity" to get rid of protected workers.

California statutes and their federal counterparts are designed to protect employees and job applicants who are pregnant. California laws are found within the Fair Employment and Housing Act. Federal law is part of Title VII of the Equal Rights Act and is known as the Pregnancy Discrimination Act (PDA).

These laws say that it is unlawful to harass or discriminate against a woman because of pregnancy, childbirth, or a medical condition related to pregnancy or childbirth. Since only females become pregnant, a claim for pregnancy discrimination is also a claim for gender discrimination, and the same legal analysis is applied to both claims.

One aspect of California's law is vital to women who work for a small employer (i.e., fewer than five employees). Typically, companies with fewer than five employees are exempt from FEHA regulations. However, a California court ruled that pregnancy discrimination is also prohibited by Article I, Section 8 of the California Constitution. This Constitutional provision enables a victim of pregnancy discrimination to sue her employer, even if the company would be too small for enforcement under FEHA.

Fair Effective Tax Rates Could Re-ignite Small-Business Job Creation



Not Enough Down Payment?

Dear Dave,

When is it okay to purchase a house without making a 20 percent down payment? - Hannah

Dear Hannah,

(PMI).

When you're willing to pay private mortgage insurance

And

something you want to do. PMI costs about \$75 a month per \$100,000 borrowed. So, if you borrow \$200,000 on a home, and you don't put down at least 20 percent on the transaction, you'll have to pay out an extra \$150 a month as

part of your mortgage payment.

Private mortgage insurance does nothing for you except pay your mortgage company in the event they have to foreclose on you and they lose money. PMI is foreclosure insurance that protects the lender, and you get to pay for it if you don't make a 20 percent down payment. In the scenario I mentioned before, that would be an additional \$1,800 a year on a \$200,000 loan. In a sense, that's an extra 0.9 percent on your interest rate. That's what it feels like.

So you can see that PMI is not a positive thing. Often, a firsttime homebuyer will purchase a house with 10 percent down, then pay the other 10 percent as quickly as possible in order to get rid of the PMI. Stay away from it, Hannah. It's nasty stuff!

Loving Your Friend Enough for the Truth

Dear Dave,

I have a close friend whose 17-year-old daughter is going to college to become a high-school band director. Her daughter wants to take out student loans to attend an expensive private school, and tuition alone over four years will cost \$100,000. I feel this is a really bad idea, but I don't know how to talk to her about this. - Natalie

Dear Natalie,

I'm sure your friend and her family are nice people. But what we've got here is a little teenage girl who has her heart set on something, and no one has told her no in awhile. You're getting ready to help introduce a new word into her vocabulary, because what you've described to me is stupid.

Listen, I love high school band directors. It just doesn't make sense to spend over \$100,000 on a degree to become one. Most of them make about \$30,000 a year, so the return on investment for this kind of thing is terrible. It doesn't matter if you're a band director, English teacher, or a doughnut shop owner; you need to figure out what you're going to make versus what you spend to get there.


Make sure you talk to your friend directly, not her daughter. If you do that, you'll end up branded as mom's mean friend. Use your relationship and history together to help her see this is a train wreck waiting to happen.

My suggestion would be for her daughter to live at home, work, and attend a community college for a couple of years. Then, when she transfers to a four-year school, make sure it's a state institution and she keeps working.








There's a book called, Games Christians Play. It's an interesting book that deals with games Christians play in the name of the Lord. I want us to look at the deadliest game the game of playing God. We play this game when we judge other people. "Do not criticize one another, my friends... God is the only lawgiver and judge. He alone can save and destroy. Who do you think you are, to judge someone else?" James 4:11-12 (TEV) Scripture does say in some places that we are to judge certain things, but there are many places where it says it is wrong to judge; where God says, "Don't do this."

"You judge those who do wrong, but you do wrong yourselves. Do you think you will be able to escape the judgment of God?" Romans 2:3 (NCV) People have a tendency to judge others yet excuse their own imperfection. How do we do that? We do that by re-labeling our sins. "I'm not a gossip, I'm just sharing a concern." "I'm not negative, I'm just realistic." "I'm

not critical, I'm discerning." Different terminology, but it all means the same thing – you're playing God.

"The words of a talebearer are as wounds, and they go down into the innermost parts of the belly." Proverbs 26:22 (KJV) That's what gossip does, it wounds and separates the closest of friends. There is a natural innate ability of gossip or slander to capture curiosity. Yet this is the sin, the sin of judging other people, having a self-righteous attitude, being critical, being judgmental, Jesus condemned more than almost any other sin.

"Therefore judge nothing before the appointed time. Wait until the Lord comes. He will bring to light what is hidden in darkness and will expose the motives of men's hearts." I Corinthians 4:5. What they're doing may seem wrong to you, but you may not have all the facts. Your understanding is limited. You can guess but you don't know. Even if you are right, you're still wrong, because you judged with limited understanding. You wait for the appointed time and leave the judging up to God.

How do you break the habit of judging, critical analysis, gossip or slander? "If you love someone you will always believe in him, and always expect the best of him." I Corinthians 13:7 (LB) Love thinks no evil, but believes the best in every person. You remember there's a higher law that YOU are breaking when you judge another person, the law of love. "Above all, love each other deeply... love covers over a multitude of sins." 1 Peter 4:8

Sure people sin. And you may think-"That person shouldn't get away with that!" Your judgment may be justified. But let me tell you something greater, there's a principle greater than judgment: the principle of Mercy. "Mercy triumphs over judgment" James 2:13. They may deserve judgment, but would you like God to give you what you deserve? Aren't we all in the same boat? If Mercy has triumphed over judgment in your life, then you ought to be merciful to others. If you want God's mercy, you must be merciful. It's not in your job description to judge people. God has not commissioned you to talk to everybody about everybody else. For your own sake quit playing God.







KICK-ASS 2 (Rated R)

Just in case it wasn't obvious in the original, the R rating achieved by the comical superhero franchise "Kick-Ass" has been attached for a purpose. Notwithstanding the lead characters being teens, this is not a family film.

Arguably, the thrust of "Kick-Ass 2" appears even more intense and over-the-top than the first, though there was something completely shocking about a foul-mouthed pre-teen vigilante superhero in Hit Girl the first time around.

Chloe Grace Moretz's Hit Girl is now in high school, watched over by her guardian, a police officer (Morris Chestnut), who insists that she hang up her uniform to be a normal teenager, known only by her given name of Mindy Macready. Of course, that's not part of her plan.

Meanwhile, Hit Girl's partner in crime-fighting, Kick- Ass (Aaron Taylor-Johnson), now a high school senior, has also put away his green and yellow spandex uniform. But Kick-Ass inspired a motley crew of masked vigilantes to continue the efforts to battle the bad guys.

Mindy tries to fit in with the school's clique of popular girls, even trying out for the cheerleader squad. Her acrobatic moves, inspired by Hit Girl's martial arts skills, make the other contestants look inferior.

Of course, the cool kids are, in fact, the mean girls, and they are just like the obnoxious students in Lindsay Lohan's "Mean Girls," and to a lesser extent, "Clueless."

At school, Kick-Ass is Dave Lizewski, a rather nerdy fellow who's bored by his mundane life, so he starts patrolling the streets with Justice Forever, a fearless group of urban watchdogs fronted by Colonel Stars and Stripes (Jim Carrey).

Members of the colonel's squad of masked crime-fighters include Dr. Gravity (Donald

SUPERHERO "KICK-ASS 2" STORY GETS COMIC, BRUTAL AND NASTY

Faison) and Night Bitch (Lindy Booth), an ordinary girl by day and a Catwoman-like sexy figure

For a movie that contains some very graphic violence and brutality, the comic element springs, in part, from the transition of Christopher Mintz-Plasse's Red Mist character of the first film into a full-blown super villain who goes by a moniker not printable in a family newspaper.

For the sake of clean language, we'll go with Red Mist's given name of Chris D'Amico, who still nurses a desire for revenge for the death of his father at the hands of Kick-Ass. After the accidental death of his mother, Chris inherits a fortune.

With seemingly limitless funds, Chris acts like a spoiled rich kid as he hatches an evil scheme to recruit the scum of the earth into a super villain's army. His best conscript is Mother Russia (Olga Kurkulina), a truly frightening psychopath.

As to be expected, there is climactic showdown between the Justice Forever good guys and the villains. The best thing about "Kick-Ass 2" remains the sweet yet tough appeal of Hit Girl.

TV UPDATE - STARZ **ORIGINAL PROGRAMS GROW AS LOSSES MOUNT**

During the recent national TV press tour, Chris Albrecht, CEO of the Starz cable channel, announced a goal for 2014 to air more than 50 hours of original programs.

Starz has had critical, if not financial, success with several original series, including "Boss," starring Kelsey Grammar as a ruthless Chicago mayor, and "Magic City," starring Jeffrey Dean Morgan as the owner of a ritzy Miami Beach hotel during the early 1960's.

At a press conference on July 26th, Albrecht answered a question about a possible third season for "Magic City" only by saying that there many "surprises left in the last three episodes" and that Starz is "evaluating all

the options" with "Magic City." Little more than a week later,

Starz announced that they would not order a third season of "Magic City." Listening to TV executives is a lot like trying to figure out what politicians are really saying.

Albrecht dropped another clue on the TV critics when he said in his answer about the fate of "Magic City" that they had a couple of surprises in store "so I can't reveal too much other than you'll have the answer to your question soon."

Okay, he was at least right about the last part, knowing sense of pride, and control of his soon, that is. So while we may never be able to check into the Miramar Playa again, there will be other new programs.

Interestingly, Albrecht also revealed a second season pick up for "Black Sails," based in part on fan reaction at Comic-Con to a viewing of the first episode. And in 2014 there will be a second season of "Da Vinci's Demons."

Palace intrigue is always good for TV programs. Just ask Showtime about "The Tudors." Launched this month, "The White Queen" is a limited tenhour series based on Philippa Gregory's best-selling novel "The Cousins' War."

"The White Queen" is set against the backdrop of England's War of the Roses, but it is told through the eyes of three main female characters as they manipulate behind the scenes for the throne of England.

The year is 1464, before the Tudor dynasty, and war has been ravaging throughout England over who is the rightful King. It is a bitter dispute between two sides of the same family, the House of York and the House of Lancaster.

There may not be a sequel to "The White Queen," but Philippa Gregory continues to be a prolific writer about medieval British royal history, so the source material will be available for several new series.

I know little about the finances of cable networks, but it is obvious that programs like "Magic City" and "The White Queen" have tremendous production costs, which must be recouped.

If the audience for a Starz original series does not grow over time, the financial losses continue to mount, which has factored into whether series stay or go. Starz is committed to keep searching for the right balance.



STRESS PANDEMIC

Are you going crazy over problems at your job? How about that relationship that seems to be going into the dumpster? And what about that driver who cuts you off, and you blow your stack?

That's called stress. I can name many more things that can really get to you on any given day. So would you be surprised if I told you there's a stress pandemic? More importantly, what if I told you that stress can cause major diseases, ranging from heart conditions to cancer, as well as sadness and anger? As a result, we often become depleted and unproductive.

Got your attention yet? Well, it should. Why? Because it can become life-threatening!

So I was happy to have Paul Huliich on the PopOff Show. who explained his 9-step lifestyle plan for preventing and controlling stress in his book Stress Pandemic. I really wanted to take notes on this one because I've had top does from around the world, from traditional to alternative, and they all agree that stress is a major problem!

Paul, now a blogger for Psychology Today.com, offers a prescription for reducing stress in your life and for living a balanced life that gives you more energy, happiness, and fulfillment.

In the book, he shares his story of how he crashed and burned at age 45. Worth \$100 million as a pioneer of the world's organic food movement, and having a beautiful wife and three young boys, didn't protect him from

He had a mental breakdown and lost most of the life he had worked relentlessly to build. Gone was his wealth. Gone was his wife. Gone was the respect of his children, friends, and colleagues. Gone was his dignity,

life. But he never lost the will to fight back, and he eventually found a way to handle what was happening to him.

Now, 14 years later, he is back and wants to help others. He spends most of his time in New York, but still visits his native New Zealand, and is the founder of a U.S. non-profit organization dedicated to helping others stay mentally healthy. His story is incredible, but I wanted to share an abbreviated version of his 9-step plan with you.

Paul emphasizes that change will not happen overnight, but once you make the commitment to change, you'll begin to see results in 30 days. So here are the

1) TAKE CHARGE – Accept the need for change and recognize the "old you" causes stress. Know that you deserve well-being and balance. Take responsibility for making changes by making time to put those changes in practice. Renew your commitment every time you slip and fall.

KICK YOUR BAD HABITS – Acknowledge which habits are unhealthy, addictive, and harmful. Gradually decrease your dependence on these habits and resolve to overcome with coping mechanisms, beginning with one habit at a time.

3) LEARN TO SAY NO -Learn to say "no" to demands and requests that are not in line with your true desires. Don't commit to obligations that you don't have the necessary time and energy for.

4) AFFIRMATION – Spend time daily to focus on your affirmations (positive statements about who you are), saying them to yourself and feeling them working in your mind and on your body.

5) EXERCISE - Exercise regularly – ideally with a 60- to 80-minute walk outdoors each morning, free of all distractions, allowing yourself time and space to reflect. Where possible, spend 15 minutes a day "earthing," that is connecting to the earth's natural surface with your skin (by standing or walking barefoot).

6) NUTRITION – Change your eating habits by eliminating toxins from your diet, including foods containing refined sugar, artificial colors or flavors, junk

food, caffeine, and alcohol. Avoid processed foods, and minimize dairy intake and red meat or pork products. Avoid seafood that contains high levels of mercury. Choose organic foods wherever possible, and drink plenty of purified room-temperature water. Start your day with exercise and a vegetable juice cocktail.

7) SLEEP - You need to follow certain healthy patterns with regard to sleep, including getting seven-and-a-half to nine hours of sleep each night. This ensures maximum recuperation and healing of the body and mind. Avoid sleeping pills.

THE POWER OF AWARENESS - Be mindful of your thoughts and desires, and their likely consequences. Become more aware of what you're holding on to, and see if you can begin to forgive yourself and love yourself. Allow yourself to embrace the present moment, enjoying fully what life has to offer here and now.

9) DON'T GIVE UP - You have the power to move forward in your life. Allow yourself time to break bad habits and form new ones that are positive. Nurture your flame of hope, and maintain your commitment, regardless of the challenges you encounter.

Well, there you have the short version. Some of these may seem like common sense, and others, perhaps a stretch. But why not give them a try?

According to Huljich, "The nine steps are your armor and tools for dealing with the stress pandemic," and "Each one of us is a powerful warrior in the coliseum of life. These steps equip us well for our challenges."

Stress Pandemic is based on his real-life experiences, exhaustive research, and consultation with medical professionals. Stress can manifest in many ways and can have serious physical and psychological consequences. Although stress is a natural part of life, Paul says the number of people experiencing increased levels of it is alarming, approaching a pandemic.

If you apply this to the nation, regardless of economic theories and social dogmas, one must in earnest think that we are acting as though we were richer than our reality. So perhaps if we spend so much on social programs maybe we need to say we cannot afford it. This should be after all citizens pay an honest and honorable share to help others.

What is the honorable share is possibly the crux of the debate. The Islamic empire in its heyday relied for its expansion on two and a half per cent tax rate or what they call they Zakat. So why do we need forty per cent and we still face economic problems of distribution and allocation? There is an identity problem. We must look in the mirror and see what we are doing. If it is a case of irrational and reckless endeavors and expenses we say that needs to stop. And I do believe it is a case of reckless behavior and my evidence is the high tax rate that does not quench the appetite of those who

do not see the big picture. And what is the big picture? The big picture is that we are all citizens governed by a machine called the

government. We must restrain this machine from intruding on our liberty. Including in the definition of liberty is aborting the ability of an authority that to levy coercive fines (taxes) because of the transgression of power. Now they are tinkering with reducing corporate taxes on big companies and increasing the tax rate on people with lesser income.

You are talking about a warped logic and intellectual bankruptcy. If your loyalty diverts form the truth, to that extent you draw a picture of buffoonery and disbelief. Those who have no goals can as they say be taken anywhere. Now again back to the belief, the good one, if we don't think of the honest role of government in our life we will be dominated by the large government apparatuses such as the IRS, the immigration and homeland security to name a few.

Maybe we are not calling for anarchy because in the end it is impractical, but we call for a government role that does not diminish the liberty of citizens and does not sacrifice the needy in the process. Liberty and justice are our guidance to a balanced society and governed government.

Women's Empowerment receives \$110,000 For Health Programs

CA (MPG) - The California Wellness Foundation recently granted \$100,000 to Women's Empowerment to be given over two years to fund its health programs for women who are homeless and their children. Women's Empowerment also received a \$10,000 grant from Kaiser Permanente for its Wellness and Recovery substance abuse education and support groups.

Women and children who are homeless have numerous health needs, from basic women's health exams to dental care and wellness and recovery support groups," said Lisa Culp, executive director, Women's Empowerment. "We are grateful to The California Wellness Foundation and Kaiser for recognizing these important needs that are often barriers to women finding jobs so they can support their families."

Women's Empowerment's health programs address women's and children's myriad health needs, connecting them to dental care, physicals, well woman exams, HIV and glasses, smoking cessation, substance abuse treatment and groups, health care enrollment, health education and more. The nonprofit weaves fitness components into its job training programs, including trips to the gym and walking groups, as well as yoga for its Wellness and Recovery groups for women with a history of substance abuse.

Kaiser's grant to Women's Empowerment helps fund the nonprofit's two Wellness and Recovery groups - one for current students and one for graduates of the program. In the groups, women are educated about the effects of substance abuse and the roles of family members and others in drug dependency. They learn to take action and create a self-care plan to avoid relapse.

"Many government agencies and nonprofits have lost funding for substance abuse education and prevention programs, so we stepped in,' Culp said. "Substance abuse is a root cause of homelessness and must be addressed

SACRAMENTO REGION, testing and care, eye exams in order for women to break the cycle of homelessness for themselves and their children. We are grateful that Kaiser chose to fund this important

program." Women's Empowerment offers the only comprehensive job-readiness program in the Sacramento area designed specifically for women who are homeless and their children. The 2009 Nonprofit of the Year has graduated 1,064 homeless women and their 2,092 children. Last year, 89 percent of graduates found homes and 78 percent found jobs or enrolled in school or training. The program combines self-esteem courses, job training, health classes and support services to help homeless women across diverse ages, races and cultures.
