

"Ladies in White" A Pioneering Group

CITRUS HEIGHTS, CA – (MPG) Blazing trails for today's female firefighters and paramedics, women from Citrus Heights historically demonstrated strength and tenacity in emergency situations, setting a higher bar for women and men alike.

In tribute to these groundbreaking women, Teena Stern and Alice Fellos produced a pictorial history book, "The Ladies Auxiliary and Ladies in White: Pioneering Female Firefighters in Citrus Heights," published by the City of Citrus Heights.

"The City is delighted to share the stories of this pioneering group of women," says Katherine Cooley, Development Specialist, II. "We hope their stories will serve as an inspiration to the girls and women of Citrus Heights to strive for excellence, strength and innovation in their own lives."

During WWII, women around

the country were asked to fill in for absent men who were serving overseas. Locally, the Citrus Heights Fire District created The Ladies Auxiliary, asking women to cover daytime emergencies. They fought grass fires, barn fires, and rescued animals. It was a challenge, as fire hydrants were scarce, and fire trucks only held 150-250 gallons of water.

In 1947, they assisted in fighting the devastating Cap Kohler fire, resulting in two of their own receiving severe injuries. That same year, the men returned and the organization was disbanded. However, some women continued to fight fires.

In 1951, the volunteer Ladies in White Rescue Squad was created to augment emergency response services. Many of the Ladies were married to firefighters and understood the rigorous challenges they faced every day.

Their services included emergency birthing deliveries. They wore a safety pin on their

uniform, pinned horizontally, from which hung additional pins – each reflecting a birth for which they assisted.

When their ambulance "Rescue One" – the only ambulance in the northeast portion of Sacramento County – wasn't available, they drove their own cars, and had to purchase their own radios.

A crowning glory of the Ladies is that they, not the men, developed one of the nation's first, and most effective, first aid programs. It was so innovative, the program was written up in Europe and Japan.

The organization ended in 1986 with the introduction of advanced trained paramedics, and the growing number of rescue calls.

On May 8, 2013, the Sacramento Metropolitan Fire District's Station 23 hosted a book signing event, at which attending Ladies received appreciative applause from a grateful

public. Uniforms from both Ladies organizations were on display, along with photographs and other memorabilia.

Ladies present were Jay Darnell, Sandra Thayne, Janie McBride, Claire Koll (Kropp), Shirley Verhines, Linda Pittman, Winnie Veasman, Doreen Sharlach, and Marleen Covington.

"It's an honor to be here today with the Ladies in White who set the stage earlier than what my mom did," says Fire Chief Kurt P. Henke. His mother was a volunteer firefighter in rural Napa County in the 1970s. "She was in a group of 13 women. In a rural area, you couldn't depend on anybody else. She was a very classy person, but very rugged, with a can-do attitude. They all were. CalPERS Board President Rob Feckner's mother was one of them."

Coming Soon...CHERP of Citrus Heights

CITRUS HEIGHTS, CA – (MPG) Due to the recent loss of state redevelopment funds local governments have been scrambling to find "alternative" approaches for redevelopment. One such alternative may come from a program called CHERP initiated 2 years ago in Claremont, a small town of approximately 35,000 people in Southern California.

CHERP is an acronym for "Claremont Home Energy Retrofit Program". Over a two-year period 163 Claremont homeowners have voluntarily participated in a "deep energy retrofit" resulting in significant reductions on their home utility bills. Claremont homeowners have also received over \$600,000 in combined utility rebates to help offset the cost of their energy-efficient improvements.

The City of Claremont benefited from over \$2.6 million in economic development and significant job growth. The city's budget has also benefited from increased property and sale tax revenues, and the city discovered a "new source" of consumer discretionary spending generated from the monthly savings

from lower utility bills. CHERP was made possible through a \$36,000 City grant that so far in only 2 years has returned a 100 to 1 dividend to the city and has reduce Claremont's greenhouse gas emissions by over 227 metric tons of CO2 annually.

Devon Hartman, founder of CHERP, has appointed a local Citrus Heights energy consultant, Jack Frost, to become the Sacramento Regional CHERP Director, with the goal of expanding CHERP to all 22 cities and 6 counties representing the Greater Sacramento Region. CHERP has recently applied for a \$25K grant from the Citrus Heights Economic Development Support Fund where a little over half the funding (\$14,000) is earmarked for financial incentives to Citrus Heights homeowners who voluntarily participate in CHERP, and the balance of the funds (\$11,000) will be used for expenses related to public awareness and consumer education.

CHERP is a volunteer organization made up from a broad range of business professionals, community organizations, utility companies, and interested Citrus Heights citizens and

homeowners. These groups form a CHERP "core-group" with a focus on providing public awareness and consumer education to allow participants to maximize energy-efficiency and minimize the overall cost of improvements. Consumer education is focused on helping consumers learn how to identify and access the most viable financing programs allowing them to participate, even if

their home values are "underwater" or their credit is less than "perfect" and to learn how to maximize utility rebates to help offset the cost of energy-efficient home improvements.

Citrus Height is poised to surpass the results achieved in Claremont where homeowners are "limited" to a maximum of \$4,500 in utility rebates. Homeowners in Citrus Heights

are currently eligible for rebates as high as \$4,500 from PG&E plus \$5,000 from SMUD. These rebates are welcome news at a time when local utility companies are proposing rate hikes and leading economists are predicting that utility rates could rise significantly over the next decade.

Citrus Heights will also have a head start on its' program as CHERP Director, Jack Frost, recently completed a "deep energy retrofit" on his mother-in-law's home at 7640 Taurus Ct. in Citrus Heights. The 2,200 square foot home of Gloria McCormack was built in 1958. The average monthly PG&E bill over the past year averaged \$300 and the SMUD bill averaged \$75. The first PG&E bill "post" retrofit was only \$28.92 and the first SMUD bill was \$13.64. This represents nearly 90% in combined monthly savings allowing an extra \$330 per month to be "re-directed" to the local Citrus Heights economy.

The McCormack home will be featured in "free" CHERP public workshops as a "Case Study" to teach Citrus Heights homeowners about the wide range of energy-efficient measures

available to reduce energy and to lower their utility bills.

CHERP Founder Devon Hartman recently observed that it must have been divine intervention that Citrus Heights would be the first city in the Sacramento Region to launch CHERP, as here the original acronym for CHERP will denote "Citrus Heights Energy Retrofit Program".

The CHERP grant has received a broad range of support from local Citrus Heights business owners who will benefit from additional jobs and the opportunity to provide products and services required to complete residential retrofits. Lowe's Home Improvement Center and PG&E are among the many supporters of the CHERP Grant.

A broad base of support has also been provided by 80% of the Citrus Heights Neighborhood Associations reflecting support from the community at large.

The Citrus Heights City Council is scheduled to vote on the CHERP grant the evening of May 23rd. If you have questions about the CHERP program you can reach Jack Frost at 916-616-7962.



Memorial Day Service at Sylvan Cemetery

All Gave Some; Some Gave All

CITRUS HEIGHTS, CA—(MPG) Memorial Day is a day of remembering the men and women who died while serving in the United States Armed Forces. This day is often confused with Veterans Day which is observed on November 11 and celebrates the service of all U. S. military veterans.

Every year, Sylvan Cemetery in Citrus Heights honors those who gave their lives in the defense of their country. This year the Memorial Day service will be held on Monday, May 27, 2013, at Sylvan Cemetery, 7401 Auburn Blvd., Citrus Heights.

American Legion Post 637 sponsors the ceremony. All members of the community are invited to attend this important event.

The morning begins at 10:30 a.m. with a walk through the historical section of Sylvan Cemetery, which takes about 30 minutes. Walkers stop briefly at each flag station to read a prayer and salute the flag.

The men marching include the American Legion, Veterans of Foreign Wars, Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War, Sons of the American Revolution, Boys Scout Troop 228, and police officers of the Citrus Heights Police Department. This year the American Legion

Auxiliary, female relatives of qualified living and deceased servicemembers, will be joining in the march. All others who wish to walk are welcome.

The procession will conclude at the gazebo where there will be a one hour ceremony. Many participants marching will be in uniform – past and present – from the American Revolution to modern day.

As part of the ceremony this year, we invite all who would like to, to take part by standing and saying the name aloud of loved ones, friends and family members – all who lost their lives in war. We would like you to say the name, branch of service and the war they did not return from. In this way it is hoped that this Memorial Day will truly be memorable.

Although Memorial Day was to be celebrated on May 30, the official holiday occurs every year on the final Monday of May.

Memorial Day, formerly known as Decoration Day, originated after the American Civil War in 1868 to commemorate the Union and Confederate soldiers who died in the Civil War. The end of May seemed to be appropriate since many spring flowers are available. By the 20th century Memorial Day had been extended to honor all Americans who have died in all wars in the past 236 years.

SMUD Asks Customers to Take Safety Precautions Before Digging

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA – (MPG) Whether planting a tree, building a deck, putting in a pool or putting up a new fence, be sure to include an important safety step prior to starting the job. Call Underground Service Alert (USA) a minimum of two business days before beginning to dig to find out if there are any dangerous underground utilities

such as power lines in the area. Whether you are doing the job yourself or hiring a professional, smart digging means calling 811 or going online to call811.com before each job. The Sacramento Municipal Utility District and other area utilities such as gas and cable television will be contacted to determine whether they have underground

facilities at the excavation site. Underground utility lines are not always located in the street; some utilities may be located in backyard easements. Digging into an underground electrical line can cause power outages and personal injury or death. Source: SMUD Newsroom

Bittersweet 'Homecoming' for Mother of Liver Transplant Donor

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA – (MPG) In January 2010, 22-year-old George Becker died suddenly of a rare bacterial brain infection in Carmichael. At the same time, 15-year-old Alfonso Garcia was fighting for his life in San Francisco, with a rare genetic disorder. When Becker died the family chose to donate his liver to Garcia.

The floral image of liver donor Becker, created entirely of materials from nature, was chosen by the CA Transplant Donor Network (CTDN) as one of 32 floral images of organ and tissue transplant donors to be featured on their Journeys of the Heart float in the 2013 Tournament of Roses Parade. Recipient Garcia, now 18, and a student at UC San Francisco, rode next to Becker's floral picture.

Four months later her son, George has in a sense, come home. As family, friends and

media looked on, the recipient of her son's liver, Alfonso Garcia, presented Connie Mays with the floral portrait of her son. It was hung in a prominent place in May's hair salon in Sacramento.

Garcia, his parents and Connie Mays have become ambassadors for the transplant program, working to encourage others to

SMUD Invites Public Input

SACRAMENTO, CA – (MPG) The Sacramento Municipal Utility District (SMUD) Board of Directors is holding two public workshops and a public hearing to discuss proposed rate changes to begin in January 2014.

In the General Manager's Report & Recommendation (Report), released by SMUD General Manager & CEO John Di Stasio, staff outlines a proposed two-step rate increase of 2.5 percent in both 2014 and 2015 for all customers to meet projected shortfalls resulting from the higher costs of renewable power required by the state, the increase in the number of participants in the low-income energy assistance program, and debt service obligations. SMUD's rates remain lower than most other utilities in California. Of the 19 largest electric utilities in the state, SMUD has the third lowest average cost per kWh. The Report also recommends a restructuring of the residential rates that will be phased in gradually over four years to

better align rates with SMUD's cost to serve customers. This restructure will help residential customers make better informed choices about their energy consumption and utilizes new smart technology. SMUD seeks to transition to flat rate pricing with the goal of recommending time-based pricing by 2018.

The Report also addresses the following items:

- A new approach to the Energy Assistance Program Rate (EAPR) for low-income customers to help neutralize bill impacts by increasing the discount but adding a cap to the total discount.
- Modifications to street lighting rates making efficient LED lighting more cost beneficial.
- New Combined Heat and Power (CHP) rate for non-renewable generators.
- Revised late fees for public entity commercial customers.
- Reduce bill impacts to small commercial customers by combining demand and energy criteria

for the small commercial rate.

- Revisions and modifications to the Rates, Rules and Regulations to enhance clarity and consistency.

All three meetings will be held at the SMUD Headquarters building, 6201 S Street, Sacramento, 95817.

Auburn Rd. and Sunrise Blvd. update

CITRUS HEIGHTS, CA – (MPG)

AUBURN BLVD

Segment II (under grounding of utilities from Rusch Park to Sylvan Corners and street improvements from Rusch Park to Sycamore Drive): SMUD installed the last of three new 69 KVA poles on Auburn Boulevard between Watson Way and Antelope Road on Thursday, May 2nd. Sidewalks, driveways and curb and gutter are almost complete on the east side of Auburn from Antelope to Cripple Creek. Demolition has also started on the west side of Auburn Boulevard with sidewalks scheduled to be constructed starting the week of May 13th.

Utility companies have also started to arrive on-site. SMUD and Surewest are both actively working and Comcast and Sprint

are expected to start in June if not earlier. Properties are also being converted to the underground utilities, one by one. Poles are expected to start coming down in early July.

DRIVE THE SPEED LIMIT, 25 MPH. CHPD is enforcing.

Segment III (Street improvements from Sycamore Drive to Sylvan Corners):

Staff and the consultant team performed a project site walk to coordinate changes to the Segment II utilities and field review 100% plans. Final plans, specifications and estimates are expected in early June.

SUNRISE BLVD

The Sunrise Boulevard Complete Streets Project Phase I (Vista Ridge to Antelope Road): Project is substantially complete. The contractor, Teichert Construction, is currently working on punch-list items such as completion of landscaping and

items to be corrected before the project can be field accepted. Drivers can now enjoy a smooth road to travel on, coupled with advanced traffic signal operations to help traffic flowing.

Drivers will also notice an additional left turn lane has been added on Old Auburn to northbound Sunrise. Pedestrians can also enjoy wider, ADA compliant sidewalks, enhanced crosswalks, and audible countdown devices at the three main intersections.

This project also incorporated "green" amenities, such as new LED streets, and enhanced landscaping along the new crosswalks, which were designed to help filter storm water before entering our storm drain system.

While the project is wrapping up, it is still a construction zone, so be sure to DRIVE THE POSTED SPEED LIMIT – 25 MPH.

SMUD INVITES PUBLIC INPUT ON PROPOSED RATE ACTIONS

The Sacramento Municipal Utility District (SMUD) is holding two public workshops and a public hearing to discuss proposed rate changes to begin in January 2014.

The General Manager's Report and Recommendations (Report) includes a proposed two-step rate increase of 2.5 percent in both 2014 and 2015 to meet projected shortfalls resulting from higher costs of renewable power required by the state, the increase in the number of participants in the low-income energy assistance program, and debt service obligations. Even with the proposed rate increase, SMUD rates remain among the lowest in California and would be approximately 24 percent below PG&E.

The Report also recommends a restructuring of the residential rates that will be phased in gradually over four years to better align rates with SMUD's cost to serve customers. This restructure will help residential customers make better informed choices about their energy consumption and utilizes new smart technology. SMUD's goal is to transition from tiered pricing to time-based pricing by 2018.

During the residential rate transition, SMUD proposes a new approach to the Energy Assistance Program Rate (EAPR) for low-income customers to help neutralize bill impacts.

The Report also addresses the following items:

- Modifications to street lighting rates making efficient LED lighting more cost beneficial.
- New Combined Heat and Power (CHP) rate for non-renewable generators.
- Revised late fees for public entity commercial customers.
- Reduce bill impacts to small commercial customers by combining demand and energy criteria for the small commercial rate.
- Revisions and modifications to the Rates, Rules and Regulations to enhance clarity and consistency.





Dear Kayla,
 I understand the feelings involved, especially if you've spent all of your time home with your child. But don't make the mistake of blaming the debt if you simply want to go back to work. You're not a bad person if you have kids and you work outside the home.

I have several ladies on my team who have young children, and they work 40 hours a week. Guess what? They're excellent mothers! Anyone who says a woman can't be a great mom because she works outside the home is full of crap. On the other hand, if anyone says you're not fulfilling yourself as a person or you're stunting your intellectual development because you're a stay-at-home mom, they're full of it too!

I'd advise you and your husband to sit down, talk about this a lot, and pray about the situation.

Don't worry about what anyone else thinks, because it's none of their business. You guys are in charge of your lives and your family. That makes it your job to decide what's best.

If you want to stay at home, and you guys can make it happen financially, that's a great thing. If you can't right now, or you simply want to go back into the workforce, that's fine too. It'll help solve your debt problem. Then after you've got your money under control, you might find you want to come home again. The option will be there.

 We live in New Jersey, and my wife and I can afford the \$10,000 to send our son to a state college. However, we have a younger child who is heading to college in a couple of years, and I'm having a hard time justifying room and board when he can commute. My wife doesn't have a problem paying for it, even though it would mean taking out a loan. What do you think?

Dear Andy,
 I'm with you on this one. If you had an extra \$40,000 lying around, this wouldn't be an issue. But if you're talking about borrowing money just for him to live in a dorm, my answer is a resounding no!

If your son, or your wife, wants the "college experience" to be part of the equation, then Junior can get a job to pay for the added expense. Besides, most college dorm rooms look a lot like prison cells; they're tiny, with concrete block walls and maybe a window, if you're lucky. Does this really sound like an "experience" worth going into debt for? I don't think so!

end of the scale, the countries of Haiti, Afghanistan, the Congo, and the Central African Republic have more than a stench to deal with. These countries are consistently at the bottom of the happiness list, reflecting terrible misery for their populations.

If you are curious, the United States is currently ranked 12th on the Prosperity Index. Not too bad, but we were much happier in the near past. We have been sliding downward for some time now. Our society as a whole is not as happy as it once was, and honestly I don't think that comes as much of a surprise.

While this survey says a lot about societal happiness, it says hardly anything at all about personal happiness. You can be a healthy, wealthy, free and secure Norwegian and be absolutely miserable. You can be a Haitian child living half-starved on the streets of Port au Prince and be filled with wondrous joy.

You can be a comfortable, successful, suburban, mortgage-paying, SUV-driving husband of one and father of two and be wretchedly unhappy. You can be a poor immigrant, a single mother with four children living in squalor, scraping for every meal, and be as happy as a singing bird in a tree.

Happiness is affected by our environment. That much is true. Happiness is a product of our genetics (scientists say that an elongated 5HTT gene will make you happier on average than most). But ultimately, barring emotional or mental dysfunction, happiness is a choice we make. No, we don't live in Scandinavia. We have no control over our chromosomal makeup.

We can't do anything about our age and very little to change our personal economics. There are simply some things we cannot change.

But, there are other things we can do something about. We can opt to live near our friends. We can decide to practice gratitude. We can do work we find fulfilling. We can opt out of the blame game, and quit holding God, life, circumstances, past lovers, ex-wives, former business partners, parents, and reality responsible for doing us in.

We can make choices that will lead us toward becoming happy, joyful people or we can make choices that will result in us becoming chronically unhappy people. Regardless, that choice belongs to each and every one of us.

It was Viktor Frankl, famed Jewish Holocaust survivor and brilliant Austrian psychiatrist, who best articulated the power of choice in personal happiness. Reflecting upon his time in the concentration camps he wrote, "Everything can be taken from a man but one thing: the last of human freedoms – to choose one's attitude in any given set of circumstances."

If you want to be happy you don't have to move to Northern Europe or wait for science to alter your genetics. But you do have to choose to be happy, and no one else can make that choice for you.

In celebrating Mother's Day, I cannot help but think of the many wonderful memories each mother cherishes. Their children will always be children. No matter how old their children get, they will always be their little babies.

Memory is a delightful thing and sometimes can be very selective. I am sure, when a mother engages in the fine art of memory, they are all good memories.

Solomon was probably thinking about his mother when he wrote, "Her children arise up, and call her blessed; her husband also, and he praiseth her. Many daughters have done virtuously, but thou excellest them all" (Proverbs 31:28-29 KJV).

You cannot put a price on a good memory.



Ask "What?"**

"What, Lord?" What, Lord, do you want to teach me? What, Lord, do you want to produce in me through this difficult time?"

"Everything that happens fits into a pattern for good. For God chose us to bear the family likeness of His Son" God uses every problem to produce in you the character of His Son. If God is going to make you like Jesus, then He's going to allow you to go through some things that Jesus went through.

There were times when Jesus was betrayed. There were times when Jesus suffered. There were times when Jesus was lonely. There were times when Jesus was angry, upset with people, discouraged and confused. God allowed Jesus to go through all these things. Do you think God is going to spare you from these things? What makes any of us think we'll be exempted from suffering, loneliness, betrayal, discouragement or confusion?

God's going to allow you to go through similar circumstances that Jesus went through - count on it, because He wants to perfect you. Hebrews 5:8 says, "Jesus learned obedience through suffering." If Jesus learned obedience through suffering, how do you think you're going to learn it? Hebrews 2:10 says, "Jesus was made perfect through suffering." How

do you think you're going to be made perfect? God perfects you, first through His word, 2 Timothy 3:16-17, then the Holy Spirit, Romans 8:11, 1 Corinthians 3:18, and then if those two don't work, He uses circumstances. Even if you read the Bible 5 hours a day or follow the Spirit's leading most of the day, how many hours a day do you have circumstances? 24 hours. So God depends on circumstances the most to perfect you.

You cannot choose what is going to happen to you next week, next month or next year. You don't have that choice. But you can choose how you're going to respond, how you're going to react - whether it's going to make you or break you, whether it's going to be a stepping stone to maturity or a stumbling block to failure. What really matters in life the most, is not what happens to you. What happens to you is not the most important thing in your life. What happens *in you* is what matters most. And that's your choice.


Cops Reading to Kids

at once. Start by making smaller decisions that are less frightening. Be consistent. That's the only way real change will take place. Over time you gain confidence you need to make the big decision that probably seemed impossible.

2) ARROGANCE: Cultivate humility - arrogant leaders tend to think of humility as weak. That's a false perception. Humility means being realistic about yourself, your abilities, your ideas. It means being honest enough to accept your limitations and admit that you are not perfect. You acknowledge that you can, and do make mistakes. Humility is about truth, and if you want to move forward, you need to be firmly rooted in the truth.

3) INSECURITY: Truly embrace compliments and Value your Worth - instead of leaping to devalue yourself. Grab the opportunity to pat yourself on the back after any success. It may be as simple as allowing yourself to accept a compliment without diminishing the praise. Then fan the spark of positive feedback into a small fire that you learn how to feed. If you can't do it for yourself, find a career coach or counselor who can help you.

4) CONTROL: Look at yourself - and ask yourself if you truly need to be involved. Does this really require your attention? Before you dive into a new timeline consuming initiative, see if you can delegate instead. And if you are sincere about wanting to change, ask yourself the hardest question..."am I getting in the way?"

5) ANGER: Breathe—when you start to feel yourself boil over, stop, breath, and think before you do or say anything you might regret. Are you so enraged

that it might be a good idea to leave the room? Fine! Get up and take yourself out of harm's way. Better than saying or doing something that leaves an indelible. You can always address the issue later, calmer and having thought it through.

6) GUILT: Move on quickly - lingering guilt is the mind's way of trying to rewrite history and change the outcome which, of course, is impossible. What is done is done. No matter how many times you think about it, or try to resolve it differently, nothing will change. Instead, drop the baggage, hit the pedal, and move forward.

7) PARANOIA: Write it out before you blurt it out - before you explode over a perceived slight to your status. Go back to yourself and ask, "why am I feeling this way?" It is remarkable how sitting quietly with your thoughts and a blank piece of paper or computer screen helps you sort out your emotions. Away from the event, you may find that you are misreading the situation through your own interpretations of fear and doubt.

There you have it. Several of these recommendations seem like common sense, but we do let our emotions run away with that common sense. 
