A Hidden Jewel in Citrus Heights

CITRUS HEIGHTS, CA (MPG) – There is a hidden jewel in the midst of Citrus Heights, sitting quietly on 41 acres of open meadow, rambling paths through groves of oak and redwood trees, contemplative areas, and a traditional meditative labyrinth, all waiting to assist visitors unwind and refocus amidst a hectic or uncertain life.

Known as "one of this area's best kept secrets", this hidden jewel of Citrus Heights is the Christ The King Passionist Retreat Center at 6520 Van Maren Lane, located between the Sylvan Library on Auburn Boulevard and Greenback Lane. It's one of those places you may have driven by hundreds of times and never knew was there.

Yet, over 7,000 visitors a year have found and enjoyed the center and its serene grounds: from individuals and couples on private retreat, to faith-based and community groups of 10-120 people enjoying modern meeting rooms, high-quality meals, and hotel-comparable lodging for overnight retreats. Numerous retreats and ongoing programs are available through the Center,

or groups can host their own event or retreat.

The Passionists are a global order of Roman Catholic priests, brothers, nuns, sisters and laity who proclaim God's love for the world revealed through the Passion of Jesus Christ. "Prayer elevated to a lifestyle" describes their philosophy on how life can be led more fully. The Order continues to carry their message of compassion and hope to 59 countries throughout the world.

Paul Francis Daneo, who became known as 'St. Paul of the Cross', founded the order in 1734. He was born in 1694 in Ovada, Italy. Those who would eventually follow him became known as Passionists because of their dedication to, and preaching of, the passion and death of Jesus Christ and what can be learned from this period of Jesus' life. The sick and the abandoned poor were special recipients of Paul's concern and love.

In 1945, Father Angelo Hamilton, reestablished a Passionists community in Sacramento, which had left the area years before. In 1946 following World War II, the Community, residing in a temporary residence at Immaculate

Sacramento, purchased 41 acres of land for \$27,500 from the Cross estate in Citrus Heights. By 1949 a small house was built and the Community moved in. The retreat center now occupies 26 acres of that land.

Following World War II, the Christ the King Center at Citrus Heights was built to serve a new generation of Catholics: fully American, upwardly mobile and educated. Through their retreat ministry, lay Catholics were trained to become the leadership corps in their parishes, school and fraternal organizations.

On May 7, 1950, the first retreat center building was completed, with accommodations for 30 retreatants, a chapel, dining room, library and offices. The initial retreat was held for the men of Holy Name Union and the construction workers on the weekend of May 19-21, 1950.

The retreat center facility was expanded in 1957 when military barracks from nearby Mather Air Base were moved onto the property. The buildings were pieced together to make 18 additional rooms for retreatants. These rooms are still in use today. By 1957 some of the first retreats

Conception Church in in the state for men and women in Alcoholics Anonymous were being conducted at Christ the King.

Finally, in 1987, further expansion saw the construction of the central Holy Cross Building with 40 additional guest rooms, three conference rooms and a beautiful large state-of-the-art assembly room. Each year, approximately 2000 men and women attend various retreat programs, and another 4,600 attend events hosted by outside groups.

The mandate of all Passionist centers has always been that they be retreat centers, beautiful yet convenient and must provide solitude to support prayer and contemplation. St. Paul of the Cross hoped to provide special facilities where Passionists could receive and guide clergy and laity in their religious journey. This mandate continues today, with opportunities for those in the local community and beyond to participate in and benefit from programs offered, while enjoying the beautiful grounds and facilities, including the occasional resident turkey or coyote wandering by.

Cooley's Bill to Save State's Mobile Field **Hospitals Advances**

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA - (MPG) Assemblyman Ken Cooley's effort to help strengthen California's preparedness for natural disasters and catastrophic events moved forward today with bipartisan approval of AB 355 by the Assembly's Governmental Organization Committee. AB 355 will restore funding to the 2013-14 budget year to continue to maintain three mobile field hospitals in California, strategically placed throughout the state for rapid deployment.

"Scientists forecast California will almost certainly experience a devastating earthquake over the next 30 years," said Assemblyman Cooley. "In a state of 37 million, the capacity these hospitals offer to establish 600 hospital beds in any area within 72 hours of a disaster occurring is a key part of preparedness. It is our responsibility to be ready for the inevitable."

California established its mobile field hospital program in 2006 by purchasing three, 200-bed mobile hospitals. The hospitals were fully maintained until the 2011-12 budget year, when budget constraints eliminated the program's funding. The program survived for the last two years via a short-term solution, which can no longer continue, and now risks permanent decommission.

"California will be hit by natural disaster in the future — that's a certainty - and the mobile field hospitals could be a critical asset to the State of California as an integral part of the response and rebuilding," said Chris Van Gorder, president and CEO of Scripps Health. Van Gorder is considered an expert in mobile field hospital operation,

Results of Texting and Cell Use Campaign Announced

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - Law enforcement in the Sacramento region recently concluded the second of three waves of their special high visibility driver hand-held cell phone and texting enforcement campaign, "Phone in One Hand. Ticket in the Other," and the results are in.

The California Office of Traffic Safety (OTS) announced that 4,750 drivers were cited for texting or talking with a hand-held cell phone between February 25 and March 10. This total compares to the first wave of the special enforcement efforts

last year, during which 3,008 were cited.

"With better weather and more enforcement days, we expected more citations compared to last December," said Christopher J. Murphy, Director of the California Office of Traffic Safety. "What we really hope to see is a drop in cell phone related crashes in the coming year, along with the suffering and tragedies that go with those crashes."

"Phone in One Hand. Ticket in the Other" is a year-long enforcement campaign to reduce distracted driving on roadways

November 29 to December 9 of in the Sacramento region. This was the second of three maximum enforcement periods in a pilot program using the region to test tactics that may be employed nationally in the future. OTS was awarded \$600,000 in federal funds for these special high visibility law enforcement operations. The last special enforcement wave will be conducted June 17-30, 2013.

The California Office of Traffic Safety, the California Highway Patrol, and the 37 local police departments from Modesto to Marysville, Vallejo to South Lake Tahoe that partnered in this latest effort are also joining with hundreds of law enforcement agencies across the state in April for National Distracted Driving Awareness Month.

"Between this special regional enforcement and April's statewide high visibility enforcement, Sacramento area drivers can't miss the "Phone in One Hand. Ticket in the Other" message," said Murphy.

Distracted drivers talking on a hand-held cell phone or texting receive a first-time ticket costing a minimum of \$159, with a second offense costing \$279. The goal of the special enforcement

operation is not to issue citations, but to raise awareness of the dangers of distracted driving and to keep drivers from being distracted by their phones in the first place.

Don't call or text anyone at a time when you think they may be driving





Women's Empowerment Graduates 26 Formerly Homeless Women from Job-Readiness Program First Class to Graduate from New Facility



Graduates of Women's Empowerment's Session 50 cheer and listen to a fellow graduate share her story last week. Women's Empowerment offers the only comprehensive job-readiness program in the area designed specifically for women who are homeless.

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA – (MPG) More than 200 community members witnessed 26 women who were homeless two months ago graduate from the Women's Empowerment jobreadiness program last week, most of them with homes and jobs. Session 50 was the first to complete classes at the nonprofit's new, expanded facility on North A Street.

"These women were in some of the darkest times of their lives when they walked through our doors," said Lisa Culp, executive director. "But they faced their fears and pain together, creating a support system that will not break. With that strength in place, they developed solid job skills and are either employed or well on their way to securing a job or enrolling in school."

The graduates' mentors and families attended the graduation where each graduate shared her story and future plans through poetry and speeches centered around the theme, "New and Different With Eyes Wide Open."

"When I came to this program, I needed just one person to believe in me," said Debbie


Tulysewski, graduate. "Now I know – that person is me."

Each woman received a new, donated handbag filled with a day planner and other items designed to help her succeed. The bags and reception were sponsored by Zonta Club of Greater Sacramento.

Women's Empowerment offers the only comprehensive job-readiness program in the Sacramento area designed specifically for women who are homeless and their children. The 2009 Nonprofit of the Year has graduated 1,036 homeless women and their more than 2,000 children. Last year, 89 percent of graduates found homes and 78 percent found jobs or enrolled in school or training. The program combines self-esteem courses, job training, health classes and support services to help homeless women across diverse ages, races and cultures. Women's Empowerment is funded solely through private donations from the community.

Spring is well under way, the weather is warming and the soil is starting to dry. That brings us to the topic that divides the green thumb from the brown thumb, watering.

In my gardening life we have moved from watering with hoses to in-ground manual irrigation to automatic sprinkler valves and finally we are just starting to see controllers that pay attention to the weather and soil moisture. Revolution after Revolution after Revolution.

Each Revolution has made it easier to water but unfortunately, it has moved us away from really SEEING what is going on in our gardens. Today, when Carole and I talk to our clients about watering it is often "every day for 5 minutes."

If you have been paying attention at all about water, you know most of us use too much. This has to stop; we have to be ready for drought. If not this year, soon. Don't waste water. It's too

But even outside of being a good citizen, paying attention to watering will make you a better gardener. Overwatering destroys roots which causes the leaves of the plant to wilt, yellow and eventually turn

brown and die. Many times gardeners look at those wilting leaves, assume things are dry and crank up the water! Its no surprise watering can seem frustrating.

Except for a few container plants that I will talk about in another article, your garden almost never needs daily watering. Most cities have ordinances that try to limit you to watering three times a week. Even that is usually too much. In the Sacramento region shrubs and trees can often be watered once a week to monthly. Lawns need water once to twice a week.

When I see water in the street or gutters I know there is a watering problem. I look for sprinklers miss aimed, misplaced or applying water too fast for the soil to accept. Miss aimed and misplaced sprinklers are easy to see and fix. Sprinklers that are watering too fast need some timer adjustments.

There are three parts to creating a water schedule.

1). Water slowly enough the water doesn't run off. Modern timers are set up to repeat irrigations up to 4 times each day. A solution to watering too fast uses this ability. You need to set up repeat waterings for a short amount of time about ½ to

1 hour apart. This allows the water to penetrate with out running off.

2). Water enough that the water gets to the entire root zone at each watering. Using multiple waterings at intervals allows you to apply enough water to get the entire root zone watered.

3). Space the waterings far enough apart so oxygen gets into the soil. This requires you to look around a bit. Perhaps digging a bit into the soil. You need to see how long it takes for your garden soil to dry down a inch or more into the soil. If your plants wilt so quickly that you cannot let the soil dry at all then you should look at mulches. They can help insulate the soil allowing the roots to move farther into the ground and making it more able to withstand dry periods between irrigations.

I will talk more about watering in my next article.

having been involved with Scripps in the response to both Hurricane Katrina and the Haiti earthquake. "The flexibility of the mobile field hospital is not well understood. It can be deployed in a variety of ways, depending on situation and need. Just like we have military, law enforcement and fire resources held in reserve, we should do the same with medical resources and mobile field hospitals."

Based on the Uniform California Earthquake Rupture Forecast (UCERF) model, California has over a 99% chance of experiencing a magnitude 6.7 or larger earthquake during the next 30 years. During the same time period, the probability of having a magnitude 7.5 or higher earthquake is 46%.

"It is not a question of 'if' California will face a catastrophic natural disaster, but when," continued Cooley. "Mobile field hospitals are an

"MAD MEN"

The AMC cable network has garnered a ton of awards and plenty of critical acclaim for the groundbreaking drama series "Mad Men," now entering its sixth season.

It's not the type of show you can starting watching at any given point unless you have been a committed viewer from the beginning.

Series creator Matthew Weiner sent a cautionary note along with the screener for the two-hour premiere of the new season entitled "The Doorway."

He asked that critics refrain from revealing certain things, including the year the season begins

and whether the ad agency has expanded to an additional floor.

As anyone following the show can gather, the series is no longer rooted in the early, optimistic days of President Kennedy's tenure in

By now, the days of Camelot are long gone and the war in Vietnam has become a strain, turning the Sixties into turbulent and unsettling times. Lyndon Johnson is simply not an appealing figure for the era.

There was no way around the fact that advertising executives like Don Draper (Jon Hamm) and Roger Sterling (John Slattery) are creatures of the early Sixties, when excessive drinking, smoking and general carousing were tolerated in

the workplace.

As time marches on, the challenge for "Mad Men" is to keep its relevance with a changing world. Don Draper's philandering ways are so habitual that we can hardly expect him to change even though he remarried.

Of course, "Mad Men" has always been preoccupied with the existential crisis faced almost daily by Don Draper, a man of assumed identity who has no real sense of who he is.

A telling scene is when Don returns from a Hawaiian vacation with his younger, attractive wife Megan (Jessica Pare) back to the grind at the firm of Sterling Cooper Draper Pryce.

Asked to pose for an office photo, Don asks what he should do, and the photographer replies: "I want you to be yourself." Don says nothing but the look on his face says everything.

Earlier, during the Hawaiian vacation, the restless Don is alone one night at the hotel bar and in a conversation with a soldier shipping out to Vietnam, they accidentally swap Zippo lighters.

Later on, Don tries to throw away the other soldier's lighter only to have the maid return it to his nightstand, reminding him that his own Zippo was never really his to begin with.

Death creeps into the storyline in several ways. Returning drunk one night from a funeral, Don insists that his doorman tell him what it was like to have a near-death experience and what did he see on the other side.

Roger also has issues with death. oddly showing little emotion at the death of his beloved mother, but breaking down in tears over the passing of a minor, unseen character.

Weiner also asked that critics not reveal the status of Don and Megan's relationship. There's plenty of complexity to address about their marriage, but just keep in mind the dubious nature of Don's moral character. I think "Mad Men" was always

at its best when it focused on the interactions of the creative people working at the Madison Avenue ad agency.

(Vincent Kartheiser), the overtly ambitious advertising executive jockeying for higher position at the firm, is not a likeable character, but he gets the job done better than his superiors.

Peggy Olson (Elisabeth Moss) was a creative talent at the firm who became frustrated with Don's erratic behavior and decided to move on to another agency. Her absence from the firm, though not from the series, is a real loss.

The sexpot Joan Harris (Christina Hendricks) became a partner last year when she accepted a sleazy proposition from the odious Pete Campbell to sleep with a client in order to land the Jaguar account. It will be interesting to see where she goes this season.

One thing frustrating about "Mad Men" is the often randomness of events that require you to pay attention. For instance, the significance of Don reading a passage from Dante's "Inferno" on the Waikiki beach won't be known until the very end of the episode.


Other happenings are so strange as to be unsettling. Don's ex-wife Let's face it, Pete Campbell Betty (January Jones), long since remarried, has an awkward bedtime scene with current husband Henry (Christopher Stanley) when she suggests an act of felonious sexual conduct.

Betty also does other weird things, such as visiting a dangerous tenement in the East Village in a vain search for a violinist prodigy who fled the comfort of the

suburbs. Having entered "The Doorway," I am not entirely convinced that I want to continue the journey. And yet I remain tantalized enough that I will probably have to watch more episodes. The show has an almost hypnotic appeal.

A book published a year ago, entitled "Mad Men on the Couch" and written by Dr. Stephanie Newman, analyzes the show's primary characters through the lens of modern psychology, asking questions like "Why does Don constantly sabotage himself?" and "Why is Betty such a cold mother and desperately unhappy housewife?"

I guess one good reason to keep watching "Mad Men" is that the psychological analysis of the characters will be constantly evolving.









Recent cases of interest

CASE: Rosemary Eusted (04/12/13)

PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Quirina Orozco, Special Assault & Child Abuse Unit

District Attorney Jan Scully announced today that Rosemary Eusted was convicted by jury of 17 counts of lewd and lascivious acts with force against a child under the age of 14.

Eusted began continuously molesting two female family members in November of 1997 at her Rio Linda home. The victims were 6 and 7 years old at the time. They did not report the sexual abuse for several years out of fear of retaliation and further physical abuse.

In May of 2005, Eusted was convicted of two counts of child molest in Placer County. In that case, her victims included her ex-boyfriend's three daughters whose ages ranged from 5 to 10 years old. These victims traveled from Twin Falls, Idaho, Red Bluff and Marysville to testify in the Sacramento County case.

Deputy District Attorney Quirina Orozco states "This trial brought together a tragic sisterhood of young girls who banded together to stand empowered in the face of their abuser. The defendant robbed them of their innocence, dignity, and the sanctity of their childhood. For the first time, each victim finally had the opportunity to look her in the eyes and say 'You cannot hurt me anymore." Eusted faces a possible maximum sentence of 425 years to life in prison. Sentencing is set for May 10, 2013 at 9:00 a.m. in Department 31 before the Honorable Michael Kenny.

CASE: Ramces Orellana (04/10/13)

PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Timothy Carr, Special Assault & Child Abuse Unit

District Attorney Jan Scully announced today that 40-year-old Ramces Orellana was convicted by jury of 13 counts of committing lewd and lascivious acts on a child under 14. Orellana was the live-in boyfriend of the victim's mother. He molested the young girl when she

was between the ages of 11 and 12. Orellana will be sentenced on May 17, 2013 at 10:00 a.m. in Department 11 by the Honorable Trena Burger-Plavan.

CASE: Jermaine Campbell (04/03/13)

PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Kevin Greene

District Attorney Jan Scully announced that the Honorable Cheryl Chun Meegan sentenced Jermaine Campbell to life in prison without the possibility of parole, plus 25 years to life. Last month, Campbell was convicted by jury of first degree murder, first degree robbery, the personal use of a firearm and the special circumstance of committing a murder during the commission of robbery.

In October 2010, Jermaine Campbell and Jonathan Hudson shot and killed 54-year-old James Walker while robbing him. Sheriff's deputies found Mr. Walker sitting in the driver's seat of his taxi cab and he was pronounced dead at the scene.

Jonathan Hudson was convicted by a separate jury of first degree murder, first degree robbery and was found to have been armed with a gun. Hudson's sentencing is set for April 26, 2013 in Department 18 of the Sacramento Superior Court.





Dear Dave,

Is there ever a time you should dip into emergency fund savings in order to pay off your home early?

Dear Eric.

The only time I would advise this is when your emergency fund is too big, and you have a very small amount left to pay on the house. Keep in mind that your emergency fund should be three to six months of expenses, not three to six months of income. Besides, paying off the house doesn't fall into the category of an emergency. The fact that you have to pay for your house doesn't catch anyone by surprise.

I understand it can be very tempting to throw a bunch of money at your house, get rid of the mortgage payments, and own it outright. But I wouldn't drain my emergency fund to make it happen—even if it meant being completely debtfree sooner. Life happens, and the moment you write that big check and weaken your emergency fund, the central unit will

go out, the roof will spring a leak, or you'll have major repair issues with a vehicle.

When you do things like that, you're just begging for Murphy to come visit. And that's not my definition of financial peace! - Dave

Too Much for Date Night

My husband and I have a baby and are trying to live on a budget and pay off about \$14,000 in debt. He wants to spend \$100 a month for a date night, but I think this is too much under the circumstances. I'm a stay-athome mom right now, and after taxes he makes about \$3,200 a month. What do you think?

- Ashley Dear Ashley,

You win on this one. If you'd told me you guys make \$150,000 a year, then I'd say he was being completely reasonable. But with your income and a lot of debt to boot, it sounds like he's just looking for an outlet to spend some money. The good thing is you're working together and beginning to take

this personal finance thing seriously. You're just a little bit apart on the particulars in this

I think you back this amount down to \$40 or \$50 for now. That's plenty for a reasonable dinner and perhaps a baby sitter for a couple of hours. If you have family or friends nearby, you might not have to figure baby-sitting expenses into the equation at all. Keep in mind, too, that going out on a date doesn't have to mean spending money. Years ago, when my wife and I were broke, we did tons of stuff that didn't cost a dime. Picnics in the park or a pretty hike through the woods are great ways to spend time together while keeping the pocketbook in your pocket.

Be creative and make sure you find ways to have "us" time on a regular basis. But you're right on this one, Ashley. You can go out and have plenty of fun together without spending a lot of money!



There is a Zen parable about a man who surprised a sleeping tiger while walking through the jungle. The ferocious animal pursued the man, causing him to throw down his bag and walking stick, as he ran for his life.

With the tiger tightly on his heels, the man came to a steep cliff. He saw a vine dangling over the edge, quickly grabbed it, and began shimmying down the vine just narrowly escaping the teeth of the tiger who now leered hungrily at him from the

This put the traveler in a real predicament. He was high in the air with no place to go. The vicious tiger was overhead; jagged rocks were below; and he was clinging to a vine that was not nearly long enough to lower him to the ground. Then, as if things could not be direr, a mouse emerged from its den and began to nibble at the vine.

At this precise moment the traveler saw a perfect, plump strawberry right there within arm's reach, growing out of the face of the cliff. He picked it, ate it, and exclaimed, "Wow!!! That is the best strawberry I've ever tasted in my entire life!"

The story ends there (leaving the man hanging in a lurch),

but the lesson keeps going: If the man had been preoccupied with the rocks below (his possible future), or the tiger above (his past troubles), or the mouse chewing away at the vine (his vanishing present), he would have missed the strawberry within the present moment. He would have missed the joy of now.

Now: There are few words with more potency but hardly a word more fallow or underutilized, because most of us do not live "in the now." We don't even aspire to live in the broader category of "today," having trading the present for a regretful past or a fearful future, a trade that leaves no life left to live

Those of us who have fixed our eyes on the rearview mirror feel the days gone by slashing angrily at our heels with the unanswerable questions of regret. Where did my life go off the rails? How could I have made such terrible mistakes? What could I have done differently? Why hasn't God (or my parents or my spouse or my employer) treated me fairly or at least as well as others?

Such questions only end with inadequate replies, proving the axiom true: "There is no future in the past." But there is no future in the future either; not a view of the future that is tainted with fear! Yet, countless people live their lives in a hypothetical time machine, always worrying and fretting over a distant yet to come that might never materialize.

These future-fearing people fill

the air with their own questions, questions that usually begins with the words, "What if?" What if I lose my job? What if I am diagnosed with cancer? What if I run out of money? What if the economy collapses? Again, such questions can't be answered. They can only rob the worriers of the time they have today.

And of course there are those who are preoccupied with the future differently. They aren't worried. They are enthused. They have schemes and plans for tomorrow, but tomorrow never comes. They say things like: "I'll do it one day (whatever 'it' is). Life will be better next week...next month...next year...next decade. Eventually I'll get around to it. In the end I will achieve my goals." But in the end, the end comes far too soon, and all the best-laid plans never materialize.

If we are engrossed with the snarling monsters of our past, obsessed with the fearful uncertainties of tomorrow, or spend our precious few days prepping for an ethereal future, this much is certain: We give away today; we miss the now.

Right now might not be your greatest moment, but now is all you have. Give now all you have, and you might be surprised at the joy you will discover.



You may not know how to answer that question if you don't understand grace. Grace is God giving to you what you don't deserve: His love, His forgiveness, His acceptance. Grace is the central theme of the New Testament. If you don't get anything else get this, God loves you unconditionally. That's called grace.

Legalism and perfectionism are based on the fear of God rather than the love of God. You may think, "But doesn't the Bible say the fear of God is the beginning of wisdom"? Yes but you must understand what that word "fear" means. Proverbs 9:10, "The **fear** of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom...." The word for "fear" means "reverence" or "to be in awe of". God doesn't want you to be afraid of Him; He wants you to love Him. Jesus didn't say if you're afraid of me you will keep my commandments (John 14:15)

One of the greatest emotional

hang-ups that people have today that causes more misery, more fear, more heartache and more depression than anything else, one that you might be dealing with today, is perfectionism. What is perfectionism? It's trying to gain and maintain the approval of God, the approval of others and maybe even the approval of you, by trying to be perfect. You have this constant feeling that you don't measure up. You go through life giving it your best shot and always feeling that you come up short. Like you're not good enough and you feel like a failure. Then you start thinking, "What's the use...If God demands perfection why even try?" The Christian life becomes a frustrating rather than fulfilling; it becomes a burden rather than a blessing. It's no wonder some people avoid God; they have a misconception of Him.

Every basic problem of man comes down to a misunderstanding of who God is, what God is like and what God has promised to do in your life. Some people see God as a cruel and unreasonable judge. We've been conditioned by a performance-oriented culture and we've transferred that over to God. We invent an un-pleasable

He said if you love me you God that cannot be satisfied no matter what we do, because you don't understand grace yet.

Life's greatest burden is trying to measure up to a standard that God has already said no man can measure up to. Trying to get what God says you already have in Christ. Trying to become what God says you already are: loved, accepted, and forgiven when you open up your life to Jesus Christ and make Him your Savior and the manager of your life.

If you've never opened your life to Jesus Christ, do it right now. Say, "Jesus I realize that I can't live a perfect life and that's why I need you in my life; that's why I need your grace. I don't understand it all but I believe you love me and I want a relationship with me. I want to love you back and I want to have a relationship with you. I confess that I'm not perfect and ask for your forgiveness and grace in my life. Help me to understand your grace and love better, in Jesus name, amen."

INFLAMMATION INQUIRY

Here's a 'did you know' fact that floored me. Did you know that medical researchers have found that heart disease, diabetes, cancer, obesity, arthritis, depression, asthma, and even allergies have all been linked to elevated levels of inflammatory markers in the body? That's the bad news I got from Dr. Aimee Shunney, Naturopathic Physician and health educator on my POPPOFF radio Show recently. But here's the good news. Dr. Shunney says, "Chronic inflammation perpetuated by poor diet, sedentary lifestyle, and unrelenting stress, may be the single greatest threat to patient health."

But never fear, the good Doc says these issues can actually be fixed. Dr. Shunney revealed her five most effective recommendations for decreasing inflammation and moving towards optimal health:

1) Eat a whole foods antiinflammatory diet: What we put in our mouths is the foundation of our health. When it comes to inflammation, an anti-

inflammatory diet is essential. This includes removing foods like refined grains and sugar, and including foods like vegetables, legumes, and fish, and anti-inflammatory spices like garlic and ginger. It also includes identifying and eliminating food allergies and food sensitivities, best done with an elimination and challenge diet.

2) Increase your activity level: Having extra weight on us increases inflammatory markers in the body AND exercise releases anti-inflammatory chemicals in the body, making regular activity a win-win in the inflammation game.

3) Get adequate sleep: Sleep is the time when the body recovers from the day's stressors. Those who report more sleep have better health overall. Some of our best sleep happens before midnight, so getting to be by ten or eleven pm is a great step towards optimal health. Adequate sleep also allows the body to handle stress better, which decreases inflammatory markers in the body.

down your stress response. We do so much in our daily lives that keeps us in constant motion. Taking the time to slow down helps calm and balance our nervous system, thereby decreasing inflammation. These activities include yoga, tai chi, qi gong, meditation, prayer—ultimately, anything that gets you to a quieter place. Joy, gratitude, and

optimism have also been shown to benefit our health!

5) Use anti-inflammatory supplements: Scientific research has shown that the omega 3 fats from fish oil are highly anti-inflammatory due in part to their ability to slow down the body's production of chemicals called prostanoids, which when produced in excess increase inflammation in various tissues and organs. Tumeric, ginger, garlic, rosemary, glucosamine, and quercetin are also known for their anti-inflammatory properties and can be taken in supplement form.

Are these all the answers? Probably not, but it's a start with tools we have control over for the most part. There is, of course genetics and a myriad of other conditions, but if we can get a handle on some of the issues, it's a good start. I know it's so easy to throw out the big BUT, like, 'but I have work to do' 'but I have a family to care for,' but it's so complicated.' BUT, if you don't start somewhere, you'll get nowhere BUT sick! It's one step at a time to good health! Lewis admitted as much when he wrote "Though I had never written anything more easily, I never wrote with less enjoyment . . . though it was easy to twist one's mind into the diabolical attitude, it was not fun, or not for long. The work into which I had to project myself while I spoke through Screwtape was all dust, grit, thirst, and itch. Every trace of beauty, freshness, and genial-
