BBB's Top Ten Scams Of 2012



Better Business Bureau serving California gathered information from consumers, federal agencies and internally to cultivate a list of the top scams of 2012.

SACRAMENTO REGION, Top Emergency Scam: CA – (MPG) Better Business Bureau serving northeast California gathered information from consumers, federal agencies and internally to cultivate a

list of the top scams of 2012.

While some scams are fairly new as scammers learn to take advantage of the Internet, others have been around for years continually victimizing consumers.

"Our list highlights the scams that are the newest or most outrageous," said Gary Almond, president of BBB serving northeast California. "While consumers seem to be getting savvier, these scams only become more prevalent with the advent of new technologies."

BBB's top ten scams of 2012: Top Overpayment/Fake Check Scam: Car Ads

A prominent company is offering \$400+ per week to consumers willing to drive around with logos plastered to their cars. They send a check to the consumer and ask the consumer to wire a portion of that "check" to a graphic designer to customize the car. One week later, the check bounces, the graphic designer is nowhere to be found, and the money wired is gone.

Grandparents Scam

The "Grandparents Scam" has been around a while, but deserves mentioning again: grandchild/niece /friend is traveling abroad and calls/texts/ emails to say he or she has been mugged/arrested/hurt and needs money right away. Before wiring money in an emergency, check with the supposed victim or family members to make sure the relative is really traveling.

Top Employment Scam: Mystery

Shopping Working as a secret shopper may sound like an ideal way to supplement income, but scammers have figured that out, too. Many job offers are nothing more than a variation on the Overpayment/Fake Check Scam (above). Sometimes they claim that evaluating the wire service company is part of the job, which is why the consumer needs to send back part of the money. The Mystery Shopping Providers Association says it is not the practice of their members to pre-pay shoppers. Those looking for legitimate opportunities can find a gig through www. mysteryshop.org.

Top Advance Fee/Prepayment "collect" the prize, consumers never

Scam: Nonexistent Loans Loan scams continued to fester in 2012. Most of the scams advertise online and promise things like no credit check or easy repayment terms. The hook: you have to make the first payment upfront, you have to buy an "insurance policy," or there is some other kind of fee that you have to pay first to "secure" the loan. In the end, the consumer ends up with nothing but an empty wallet.

Top Phishing Scam: Obama

Will Pay Your Utility Bills At the peak of summer with utility costs soaring, consumers received emails, letters and even door-to-door solicitations about a "new government program" to pay utility bills. Victims "registered" with a website and provided everything scammers needed for ID theft, including bank account information.

Top Sweepstakes/Lottery Scam: Jamaican Phone Lottery

The calls come from area code 876 but the person claims to represent BBB, FBI, or other trusted group. Great news: you won a terrific prize, but must pay a fee to collect the winnings. After wiring money to

hear from the scammers again.

Top Identity Theft Scam: Fake **Facebook Tweets**

"ROFL they was taping you" or "What RU doing in this FB vid?" are typical tweets. In a panic, you click on the link and get an error message that says you need to update your video player. It's a virus or malware that can steal confidential information from your computer or smart phone. Twitter recommends reporting spam, resetting your password and revoking connections to third-party applications.

Top Home Improvement Scam: Sandy "Storm Chasers"

BBB spends a lot of time investigating and reporting on home improvement scams, but this year we saw an unusual amount of "storm chaser" activity following Super Storm Sandy. It's tempting to skip reference checking in an emergency, but that's never a good idea. Always check a company's licensing before hiring and search for them at necal.bbb.org.

Scammers Harassing SMUD Customers

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA – (MPG) The Sacramento Municipal Utility District (SMUD) continues to urge customers to be aware of a scam actively being conducted in the area as more SMUD business customers report being contacted. The scam is carried out by someone contacting SMUD customers by phone and pretending to represent SMUD Disconnection Services.

Two techniques are being

used. The first one has a scammer threatening to shut off the electric power unless the customer pays a past-due bill immediately at a payment facility. The second has the scammer telling the customer that their utility payment has been returned for overpayment and another payment must be made immediately at a payment facility. In these cases, the scammer is very well-versed in past-due collection techniques and sounds very convincing. The

Sacramento Police Department is investigating.

SMUD customer service representatives will never call a customer and ask for financial information over the telephone, nor direct them to a payment facility. A list of authorized SMUD pay stations can be viewed here.

The following are NOT SMUD authorized pay stations: CVS, RiteAid, Walgreens and Walmart. Also, SMUD does not

accept payment via Green Dot or Money Pak.

If SMUD customers receive a suspicious call, SMUD urges customers to ask for a name then hang up and call SMUD at one of the following published numbers: Residential customers - 1-888-742-SMUD (7683) Business customers - 1-877-622-SMUD (7683)

Citrus Heights Pastors Travel to Sandy Hook to Promote Healing among Newtown Residents

CITRUS HEIGHTS, CA -(MPG) The pastors, staff, and congregation of Antelope Road Christian Fellowship (ARCF) in Citrus Heights, CA are accustomed to stepping out in faith in service to their community, the nation and world.

Yet on Friday, December 14, 2012 a new kind of mission was put on the heart of Senior Pastor Rhodes Pringle, which by Monday found him walking and praying amongst the grieving townspeople of Newtown, CT in the wake of the shooting which took the lives of 20 children and 6 school staff at Sandy Hook Elementary School. Accompanied by Worship Pastor Warren Starkss, the two embarked on a true walk of faith, which had in fact begun days earlier.

Pringle was not aware of it at the time, but the journey had begun taking shape in his mind as he sat glued to his television watching the images of the tragedy unfold before his eyes. He had told his wife, Jolene, several times during the day, "I just feel like I need to go there."

His calling was confirmed on Sunday as the congregation was gathered for worship. Pringle was praying for the grieving families when he again shared, "the Lord wants me to go, I need to be there." He didn't know what God had planned for him once he arrived, only that he needed to go.

A man rose and said, "You need to go," and made the first donation towards his travel expenses. In five minutes over \$2,000 had been raised. The next day Pringle and Starkss were on a plane to Newtown, CT.

Within moments of arrival at Newtown, a town of 25,000, it

became obvious what they were meant to do. The atmosphere of grief was overwhelming as the pair walked among the people and immense memorials created from stuffed animals, candles, angels and cards, scattered throughout the town.

Pringle and Starks became 'spiritual first responders' as they began a prayer walk. They now knew their assignment was to "pray for the city, the families and for the process the city would go through." For a week they anonymously walked through the neighborhoods, praying around the homes and for the people as they passed by. Pringle left 'hope' cards written by church members at the memorials. Starks said they fit in so well, "residents we talked with thought we were local."

When they returned at the end of the week, Pringle and Starks knew this experience would "change the way we are doing church", and lead them to reevaluate their role in the community. This is already happening.

Realizing Newtown, CT could in actuality be 'Anytown', USA, they know they need to have programs in place in the community that speak specifically to the kinds of issues the shooter and his mother had: parenting, relationships, loneliness. They want to open their doors and be more involved with families in the community: to be a place for teens and other youth to feel like they have a home and friends away from home, and to be a support to parents, whatever their needs may be. One of their members in local law enforcement foresees a relationship with schools, police and other city and community entities to be part of averting this kind of tragedy in our community.

ARCF has been a sponsor of the Citrus Heights Little League

but since their visit to Sandy Hook, this model is becoming a reality with more involvement and interaction between the church and players and their families being planned.

Another proposal is to develop a 'spiritual first responder team' to be trained and available in the event of a disaster of any kind in Citrus Heights. They noted that the Billy Graham organization had such responders at Sandy Hook, there to pray with and be available to the community in any way needed.

One concrete outcome of their experience is the song, "Out of the Darkness" written by Starks on the first night of his trip. Inspired to capture the emotion and God's healing throughout the tragedy, he said the words and music just came to him. Starks returned to Citrus Heights and used his Face Book page to call for singers to record the song. In three days they had 80 singers from eight local churches that had never seen the song show up at the church. In three hours the song was learned, rehearsed and recorded. A video was made and then viewed by the congregation on February 7. It eventually found its way to the victims of Sandy Hook. Members of the choir shared that this was a way for them to also help those recovering from the heartbreak of the

As Pringle related, it is too soon to know how this experience has affected them. "It will take time to move out of the emotion of the event to the logical response", which is what they are being led to do now.





Increase In Flu Activity Is Reported

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA - (MPG) Dr. Ron Chapman, director of the California Department of Public Health (CDPH) and state health officer, says while we are seeing an increase in flu activity in California it is not an unexpected increase, nor is it too late to get vaccinated against the flu.

"California is seeing an accelerated increase in flu activity over the past few weeks," said Dr. Chapman. "You can help prevent further spread of the flu by getting a flu shot."

While influenza activity varies from year to year and is unpredictable, California generally sees an increase in cases in late December or early January and it often peaks in February or March. According to CDPH

surveillance indicators, influenza activity in California is beginning to show a steady increase. "The best defense against the flu is getting vaccinated. This year's vaccine is an excellent match against this year's influenza strains," Dr. Chapman says. "There is no shortage of vaccine in California and it is not too late to get vaccinated. Our flu season may not peak for several more weeks, so I encourage everyone to get vaccinated to protect not only themselves, but those with whom they come into contact."

Dr. Chapman also notes that in addition to getting vaccinated, it's important to practice good hand washing and other good health habits. People who are ill should take actions to stop the spread of germs such

While sick, limit contact with others; cover your nose and mouth when coughing or sneezing; wash hands thoroughly with soap and water or use an alcoholbased rub; avoid touching your eyes, nose and mouth.

Those at highest risk - the elderly, pregnant women, infants, or those with other health conditions - who show flu symptoms should contact their physician immediately in order to get the most effective treatment. Symptoms include fever, cough, sore throat, runny or stuffy nose, muscle or body aches, headaches and fatigue.

Top Sales Scam: Fake Goods

From the Super Bowl to the World Series, counterfeiters managed to have their hands in consumers' pockets all year long. Some scammers sold cheap knock-offs in front of stadiums. Others set up websites that never had any goods for sale to begin with. Counterfeit goods are not only a rip-off for fans, but also rip-off the teams, athletes, designers and artists who create, license


and sell the real merchandise. Buy directly from teams or from legitimate retailers. If a deal sounds too good to be true, it probably is.

Scam of the Year: Newtown **Charity Scams**

Within hours of the horrific shooting at Sandy Hook Elementary School in Newtown, Connecticut, social media pages dedicated to the child victims began cropping up. Some of them were scams asking for money. The FBI has already arrested one woman for posing as the aunt of one of the children killed, and state and federal agencies are investigating other possible fraudulent and misleading solicitations. Although the number of people defrauded and the total dollars stolen is most likely low, the cynicism and sheer audacity of these scams merits our selecting it as the "Top Scam of 2012."

CASE: Nathaniel Carter (01/04/13)

PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Charles Gonzalez

District Attorney Jan Scully announced that Nathaniel Carter was convicted by jury of first degree murder and attempted robbery in the October 29, 2010 murder of Steven Carmassi. The jury also found true the special circumstance that the murder was committed in the course of an attempted robbery and that Carter personally discharged a firearm causing Carmassi's death.

Carter, along with co-defendants Latice Collins and DeJohng Taylor, attempted to rob Mr. Carmassi at gunpoint as he sat in his truck in the parking lot of a supermarket on Garfield Avenue. When Mr. Carmassi tried to drive away to escape the attempted robbery, Carter shot him in the left side of his chest through the open driver's side window.

Prior to jury selection, co-defendant Latice Collins pled guilty to first degree murder and attempted robbery. Collins will receive a sentence of 26 years to life in prison. Co-defendant DeJohng Taylor pled guilty to voluntary manslaughter and will receive a sentence of a maximum of 12 years in prison.

Carter faces a potential sentence of life in prison without the possibility of parole. Sentencing is scheduled for February 8, 2010 in Department 10 before the Honorable Greta Fall.

In these days when it seems everything has become angry polarization, it's not uncommon to hear someone in the heat of an argument invoke the familiar words of Jesus: "Judge not, so that you are not judged." These words are probably misapplied as much as anything Jesus ever said.

Jesus' prohibition against judging has less to do with our academic arguments than it does with how we treat people. The better translation of his words is, "Do not condemn others." This changes the whole equation, as Jesus doesn't ban "judgment" in the sense of discernment, making honorable choices, or being an informed person. Rather, Jesus is precluding the use of condemnation against others.

Yet, if you turn to the media, read much of what is printed by Christian publishers, listen to what is repeated in church pulpits, or spend time perusing the Christian blogosphere, it seems the only voice we Christians have is that of a crotchety old man, angry that the neighborhood kids won't stay off our lawn.

Yes, some of what we say is healthy, principled dissent; but too much of it is an exhaustive collection of condemnation and angry finger-pointing, incensed as we are, at what everyone else is doing wrong. But by Jesus' own word, the

church is not permitted to become this type of condemnation-meting society. We are not called to operate a business of inflicting punishment on others. In fact, we aren't called to mind others' business at all.

In my vocation I often come across those who are hostile toward the Christian faith. I try to engage such individuals and learn something from them. What I have learned from people such as these, more often than not, is their exasperation over how we Christians frequently come across as a kind of moral SWAT team.

We intrude into the lives of others filling the air with the ammunition of "ought, should, and must" when we would be better served by turning our energies and attention to our own hearts and examine our own lives, not the lives of others. Dietrich Bonehoeffer said it like this, "Jesus is the only standard by which disciples should live, but he is not a standard we can apply to others. He is a standard we can only apply to ourselves.

So, when we as Christians get blisteringly angry with those who sin differently than we do, we should remember to mind our business. That business is to love, not to condemn. That business is to begin with the self, for beginning there will keep us busy for a lifetime.

To that end, there is a wonderful story from famed Rabbi Mendel Futerfas, who survived years in the Soviet Gulags of Siberia. In the Gulag, one of the many activities that was prohibited and dealt with harshly was playing cards. Still, some of the inmates managed to

smuggle in a deck of cards, and they would play for hours without the guards knowing.

Finally, however, an informant sold the card-playing prisoners out. The guards would storm in with surprise inspections looking for the cards, but could never find them. They checked every inch of the barracks including strip searches of the inmates, but the result was always the same: Nothing. Yet, as soon as the guards left, the cards would reappear and the games continued.

Rabbi Mendel couldn't understand how this happened, but eventually the card players let him in on their secret. "You see," they said, "we are professional pickpockets. As soon as the guards enter the barracks, we slip the cards into their pockets. Right before they leave, we slip them back out again. It never occurs to the guards to check their own pockets.'

"Judging" does not prevent us from having and sharing opinions. It doesn't mean we can't give a verbal witness to our faith. But it does mean we refuse – absolutely refuse – to condemn others. We leave "room in our hearts for God's grace," and that room is made possible by looking in and emptying our own pockets





There's a story about an American Indian brave that found an eagle's egg and put it into the nest a prairie chicken. The egg hatched with the rest of the chicks and began to grow up with them. All his life the eagle, thinking he was a prairie chicken, did what prairie chickens did. He scratched in the dirt for insects and seeds, he clucked and cackled. He flew in brief thrashings of wings just a few feet off the ground. After all, that's the way prairie chickens were supposed to fly. Years past and the eagle grew very old. One day, he saw a magnificent bird far above him in the sky. Gliding gracefully on the powerful wind currents, it soared effortlessly with hardly a beat of its strong golden wings. "What a beautiful bird!" said the eagle to his neighbor. "What is it?" "That's an eagle." Clucked the neighbor, "But don't give it a second thought - you could never be like him – you're just a prairie chicken!" And the eagle never did. He died thinking he was a prairie chicken. What a tragedy! Created to soar into the heavens, he was conditioned to stay earthbound. He lived beneath

eagle. You know you are created for more than you've experienced to date. You have the ability to move well beyond your self-imposed limitations or the limitations that others have placed on you. You feel like an eight cylinder automobile straining on four. The Bible teaches that every person is designed for excellence. Nobody wants to be mediocre; to live beneath their potential. God never meant for you to live that way. He wants you to live above your limitations and realize His powerful ability

that's available for your life. The Bible tells a story about a man named Jabez, who learned to live beyond his limitations. The Bible says that Jabez prayed a short and simple prayer, asking God to bless his life. God answered his prayer and Jabez he began to live above his own limitations and those that others labeled him with. One of the most interesting things about Jabez is his name. The name Jabez in Hebrew literally means, "Painful". Apparently he caused his mother so much pain at childbirth that she named him, "Painful". How would you like to have that name? To go all through life, "What's your name, son?" -- "Painful". What a big handicap! To be called "a pain" all your life. He was labeled, "That kid's a pain!" Everyone in the world would know it, he was rejected, labeled. His name was a constant reminder that even his mother regretted his birth.

Yet Jabez would rise above his

handicap. He wouldn't let his conditioning or the label of others interfere with God's plan for

Let me ask you a question -Who has labeled you? Who has conditioned you? Who has said to you -- "You'll never change!" "You could never be like that!" "You'll never amount to anything!" "You'll always be ... this way", "You're this...you're that..." The problem is you believed it and it's held you back from becoming all that God created you for. God doesn't want you to live beneath your potential. He wants to set you free in 2013. Free from self-imposed limitations. Free from the limitations others have placed on you. But like Jabez, it starts with turning to God. It starts with prayer. It starts with getting God's view of you, rather than the view of others or even yourself. You don't have to stay the same. You don't have to live beneath your potential. God wants to do great things in your life. How do I know? Because He's a great God! Local Girls Gear Up for the 2013 Girl Scout Cookie Program


A "Learning by Earning" Opportunity





So what upsets Kreskin? Lobbyists for one...some 35,000 in the belt way. He used the words infection and influence in the same sentence with Lobbyists. He wondered where the statesmen are like Benjamin Franklin, a printer and George Washington, a farmer? Today they are just politicians, and he did not say that in a positive reflection. He laughingly said he listened to the debates last fall to read their thoughts and he got a blank. I think we did too. 
And so this is the Kreskin I got to know, and I look forward to our next time together with this man who has achieved so much, and yet cares more about sharing his talent to better us all. I am honored!





Recently, my husband had to quit his job due to an old back injury. We have \$25,000 in debt, but I'll be receiving a \$38,000 inheritance in a couple of weeks. Should we use the money to pay off our debt, or hold on to it in case he needs surgery?

Dear Kristen,

Now is the time to keep the cash piled high. You're in the middle of an emergency, and that means you push the pause button on your Total Money Makeover and stop paying extra on debt. Surgery is a possibility at this point, plus you may need

some of that money to live on until his job situation improves.

Then, the moment he returns to work and things are stabilized, you jump back into getting control of your finances. Use whatever is left of the \$38,000 to pay off debt that very day. But right now you don't need to worry about becoming debtfree, only to turn around and be in a mess in the event he has trouble finding another job.

Let me give you a warning too. Thirty-eight thousand dollars is a great gift. If someone handed me a check for that amount, I'd cash it in a heartbeat. But it's not \$380,000 or \$3.8 million. It's easy to develop a false sense of security if you've never received a check of that size. This kind of money is enough to keep the wolf away from the door for a while, but it's nothing to retire

This little nest egg is a real blessing, Kristen. Just make sure you handle it wisely, and take into account all of the possibilities over the next couple of months. In a bestcase scenario your husband won't need surgery, he'll find a job pretty soon, and you guys won't have to dig in to the inheritance money. Hang on to as much as possible, though. This sounds like a time of personal and professional transition for you both, and having that kind of extra cash around could be a lifesaver!

Should We Ever Buy A House?

Dear Dave,

My husband and I are on Baby Step 2 of your plan. We move every two or three years due to our jobs, so would it ever make sense in our situation to buy a house?

Dear Janelle,

In most cases like this it doesn't make sense to buy a house, especially if the real estate market in your area is lethargic. Some markets have bounced back and are doing very well, while some are worse than slow. It all depends on where you're moving.

Here's the big question: Can you get the place sold quickly the next time you have to move? Another thing to consider is whether or not you can sell it for more than it cost when the time comes. If not, you'll be writing a check for home ownership, and that's not a good plan.

As a general rule, a two- to threeyear window is not enough time to own a home. There are rare exceptions to this rule, places where you have a hot, escalating price market. But if you're not careful you'll end up leaving behind a rental property and playing landlord, whether you want to or not!


