



**MARYSVILLE, CA (MPG)** - In their 20th season, the Yuba-Sutter Gold Sox are once again set to take the field this summer to bring the Yuba-Sutter community collegiate summer wood bat baseball.

Family entertainment at its best will return to the region on Opening Night, Thursday, June 2 when the Gold Sox take on the Lincoln Pottery at 7 P.M.

It has been 20 years since the Gold Sox first stepped foot on Bryant Field and although much has changed, there is much that remains the same. For the first time since 2019, the

ballpark will be open to full capacity. The Gold Sox look forward to the return of a packed stadium and exciting summer nights.

In addition, this year the Gold Sox will feature five fireworks shows throughout the season along with many of the fan favorite promotional nights you've come to love over the years. Fans this year will notice some renovations to the ballpark thanks to the City of Marysville. **County/City Issue Statement Regarding Homeless at Kmart Lot**

**City of Yuba City News Release**

**YUBA CITY, CA (MPG)** - Homelessness is an issue that affects us all as a community. For more than a decade this issue has continued to grow larger nationwide while counties and cities have attempted to resolve it. The City Council and County Board of Supervisors jointly strive to protect and improve the quality of life for our residents in a safe and prosperous manner.

Both the city and county, as well as our residents and businesses, have seen an increase in homeless living in cars and recreational vehicles parked on our streets, in parking lots, and on public park land. We continue to work together to tackle this very controversial issue, but enforcement to move these vehicles is difficult because we're legally required to have a place for people to go.

We recognize that there is too much confusion about this project being circulated in the community to move forward with the proposed solution. The sign of real leadership is the ability to adjust, listen, and work collaboratively with stakeholders, and we acknowledge the need to adjust, listen, and collaborate. While doing nothing is not an option, together we will be pausing the current plan at the county owned former Kmart parking lot.

In the days ahead, the county and the city will be coming together to develop a complete plan to address and answer the questions many have. We will not do this alone though. We will reach out to engage members of our community to meet, discuss, and design the next steps as we move forward in addressing homelessness issues affecting us all. Community members will be jointly selected to work with the city and county to give different perspectives and to join together to find real solutions to homeless issues. If we are truly going to make the quality of life better for everyone in our community, we must

The museum will be open between the hours of 9 A.M. and 2 P.M. 250 United States and military branch flags will circle the property and Taps will be played at 10 A.M. This will most likely attract visitors who are attending multiple other memorial events in the area.

Memorial Day and Veterans Day are the two most important days of the year for the non-profit that is dedicated to the memory of all who have served. Other than these dates, the museum is open every Saturday and by appointment. The tanks,

# Broken Compass Bluegrass Concert at the Sutter Theater

MARYSVILLE, CA (MPG) - What do you think of when you think about bluegrass music?

If you are of a certain age, you might remember the tune "Foggy Mountain Breakdown" played by Flatt & Scruggs in the iconic film Bonnie and Clyde. Or how about "Dueling Banjos" from Deliverance? Maybe you know some of the current young practitioners of the genre like Molly Tuttle and Billy Strings. If you are ready to have your knowledge and enjoyment of the genre greatly expanded or if you just want to put your toe in the water of this uniquely American musical form, plan to attend the upcoming concert by Broken Compass at the beautiful Sutter Theater Center for the Arts on June 4 at 7pm. Tickets are \$20 at yubasutterarts.org. Doors open at 6pm.

This dynamic young bluegrass quartet was formed during COVID. What inspires a group of young musicians in northern California to form a bluegrass band? Band member Kyle Ledson says it is in his DNA having grown up in a musical family that loved bluegrass. The group also includes Django Ruckrich, Mei Lin Heirendt and, most recently, Sam Jacobs. Classically trained musicians, these young people are comfortable performing a wide range of musical styles. Their concerts include a mix of jamgrass, bluegrass,

country, and Grateful Dead material along with numerous original compositions. They are all multi-instrumentalists playing guitar, mandolin, slide guitar, fiddle and bass and they all join in on vocals.

Bluegrass music is a genre of American roots music that developed in the 1930s and 1940s in the United States Appalachian region. The genre derives its name from the band Bill Monroe and the Blue Grass Boys formed in the late 1930s. Unlike mainstream country music, bluegrass is traditionally played on acoustic stringed instruments. Bluegrass has roots in traditional English, Scottish,

and Irish ballads and dance tunes and in traditional African American blues and jazz. Current practitioners of "new" bluegrass include Bela Fleck, Sam Bush and Alison Krauss who had a big hit with her duet album with Robert Plant of Led Zeppelin fame. Talk about a cross over album!

The band members have each recorded solo albums and have played all over northern California. Broken Compass will be heading to Ashland, Oregon later this summer. Come hear them live right here in Yuba City so someday you can say "I heard them play way back when!" ★

amazing to see what the Gold Sox organization has done for this community, and what this community has done for the Gold Sox. We have put our heart and souls into this every year to bring affordable family entertainment to the Yuba-Sutter community, as well as providing collegiate athletes from around the country an opportunity to showcase their skills," said Gold Sox General Manager Tommy Lininger. "Not to mention providing jobs to dozens of residents every year.

"In return, the community has supported us and given back to us more than we could ever repay. If you've ever been to a packed house on fireworks night, you know what I mean. Yuba-Sutter is a family, and I am honored to be a part."

When the Yuba-Sutter Gold Sox open their season on June 2, fans will see a new manager, seven returning players and 19 players pulling up their gold sox for the first time.

The Gold Sox announced on Monday, May 23, that former Oregon State outfielder and current assistant coach at Feather River College, Ryan Dettman, has been hired as the club's manager for the 2022 season.

Dettman, a Sacramento area native,

played for the Beavers in 2012 and 2013. He just finished his sixth year as assistant coach at Feather River College, where this season he helped guide the Eagles to the Northern California finals.

Players with prior experience with the club on this year's roster are: Will Bermudez (Mt. San Antonio College), Jonah Hendrickson (UC Davis), Joe Polizzotti (William Jessup), Trevor Armston (Antelope Valley College), Brad Madison (University of Colorado, Colorado Springs), Corey McIntyre (Feather River) and Nate Vargas (University of Nevada-Reno).

As is often the case, the roster is a mix of local talent and players from all over the country. This year's roster has players representing 18 different colleges in eight separate states. 





### ARE MOSQUITOES BREEDING IN YOUR POOL?

#### Green Swimming Pools

One, unmaintained, green pool can produce 100,000 mosquitoes over a summer. This is a significant concern as West Nile Virus is regularly detected in our area annually. So green pools that we learn about have become a priority. To discover unmaintained pools, the District hires an aerial photography contractor each year to fly the urban areas within the District at the end of May. The contractor provides a photo of each suspect pool and it's address. Our staff makes a visit to each home where a pool may be producing mosquitoes. When an inspection shows that mosquitoes are breeding in a pool, treatment is simple, quick and free. Application of a thin film of a coconut based oil quickly kills the immature mosquitoes living in the water. For a long term solution, mosquitofish are introduced. No unrelated data is collected or shared regarding any property. There is no charge, penalty or fee for an inspection or treatment to a pool. You can still get your pool ready for swimming later.



#### Mosquitofish

*Gambusia affinis*, also known as "mosquitofish", are used in many parts of the world to control mosquito larvae. Most of our mosquitofish are used in agricultural sources. However, these fish work great in neglected swimming pools, giving season long control of mosquitoes. District residents are welcome to pick up mosquitofish, free of charge, for stocking their own backyard sources. The fish can be picked up Monday - Friday at 701 Bogue Road, Yuba City between the hours of 7:00 - 3:30 PM.

## Market Carnage

The S&P reached official bear market territory last week, albeit closing just above the down 20% benchmark of a bear on Friday. Records are being set in many securities as the ongoing market carnage continues. The Dow is on track to have its longer losing streak in over a century.

The major stock indexes continue to erode, the key word here being "erode" in lieu of an all-out fast crash.

Erode means a continuing disintegration over time. As painful as that is for investors, the next event could be even more so.

As mentioned before in Money Matters, historically, when markets experience a continuing erosion over a prolonged period of time, a capitulation event may need to occur before the fall in stocks comes to an end.

Capitulation is a throw-your-hands-up, toss-out-the-baby kind of sell-off which signals investors as a whole have reached a breaking point where they just sell, regardless of any rhyme or reason.

In light of the brutal daily declines we have seen in the Dow in the last few months which have included more than a 1,000 point drop on May 5th, a capitulation event could be in the order of a several thousand point drop in the Dow if and when it occurs.

Keep in mind no one can forecast market direction at any time and markets may not necessarily repeat past movements. It is concerning however that an event such as a sell-off of that magnitude is possible.

Prudent money managers and option traders utilize stop loss strategies to limit losses and it is in my opinion that retail mom and pop investors should emulate such methodologies. This is done by lightening up on holdings along the path of a sell off event. In speaking with many investors of late however, many are just painfully sitting on holdings and hoping things get better.

It is true over time, the market

has recovered from every set back, although some setbacks hurt balances so bad, it took a long time to recover losses.

No doubt, selling some stocks on the way down raises cash so when the bottom does materialize, there is dry powder to buy stocks at much lower levels. The more severe the crash, the better the prices on stocks will be at the bottom and the higher the yields on dividend paying stocks will go.

Selling also gives the investor at least some peace of mind that something proactive is taking place. Buying stocks at lower prices with raised cash from previous sales also helps recover losses quicker than just riding out the crash fully invested.

Those with cash from selling during the plunge might look back years later and think "thank heaven I had some cash and picked up some great buys in the midst of the carnage".

Having a plan goes a long way in helping calm nerves during time of market duress. It also can be prudent money management and installs some loss-control machinery and provides a blueprint for how to maneuver during crashes before the event occurs.

Concluding, the time to have a plan is before the markets correct. Calmer heads will then prevail during times of market upset knowing a plan is in place. Like a fire evacuation plan, the time to formulate such plans are not in the midst of crisis.



## Memorial Day

On May 5, 1868, United States Military General John A. Logan, leader of an organization for Northern Civil War veterans, called for a nationwide day of remembrance later that month.

“The 30th of May 1868 is designated for the purpose of strewing with flowers, or otherwise decorating the graves of comrades who died in defense of their country during the late rebellion, and whose bodies now lie in almost every city, village and hamlet churchyard in the land,” he proclaimed.

The date of Decoration Day, as he called it, was chosen because it wasn't the anniversary of any particular battle.

Memorial Day, as Decoration Day gradually came to be known, originally honored only the lives lost while fighting in the Civil War. But during World War I, the United States found itself embroiled in another major conflict, and the holiday evolved to commemorate American military personnel who died in all wars.

For decades, Memorial Day has continued to be observed on May 30, the date Logan had selected for the first Decoration Day. But in 1968, congress passed the Uniform Monday Holiday Act, which established Memorial Day as the last Monday in May in order to create a three-day weekend for federal employees; the change went into effect in 1971. The same law also declared Memorial Day a federal holiday.

Memorial Day is an American holiday, observed on the last Monday of May, honoring the men and women who died while serving in the United States Military. Originally known as Decoration Day, it originated in the years following the Civil War and became an official federal holiday in 1971.

Many Americans observe Memorial Day by visiting cemeteries or memorials, holding family gatherings and participating in parades. Unofficially, it marks the beginning of the summer season. Cities and towns across the United States host Memorial Day parades each year, often incorporating military personnel and members of veterans' organizations. Americans also observe Memorial Day by visiting cemeteries and memorials. On a less somber note, many people take weekend trips or throw parties and barbecues on the holiday, perhaps because it unofficially marks the beginning of summer.

Thank you to all who have died for our country. As stated by a man I met a few years ago, Maj. Gen. Cecil Richardson: “Our liberty today is because of somebody else's courage.” Memorial Day reminds us of that.

### Will Water District Allow Water?

As a way to provide water to irrigation customers in Oregon House and Dobbins, South Feather Water & Power Agency offered to sell water to the Foothill Water Coalition for \$39 per acre-foot. All that would be needed is for the North Yuba Water District directors to allow this water to flow through the Forbestown Ditch, Costa Creek, the Dry Creek Diversion Dam, and the Oregon House Dobbins canal to reach the irrigation customers. With the Yuba Water Agency oversight, it would cost the District little more than a resolution and a vote. As of May 20, the District has not responded to this inquiry other than a request by the District's legal counsel to see proof of this offer.

# Newsom's Rosy Budget Ignores Troubling Trends

The truly astonishing tax revenue numbers cited by Gov. Gavin Newsom last week as he unveiled a revised state budget bring to mind an old adage: “The bigger they are, the harder they fall.”

So much money is pouring into state coffers from personal and corporate income taxes and sales taxes that Newsom said the state will have nearly \$100 billion more than it needs to finance ongoing spending, twice as much as his original budget, proposed in January, estimated.

“You've never seen a number like this,” Newsom told reporters.

True enough, and it poses a potential problem that could be just as monumental. Big budget surpluses generate big demands for new spending from the advocates of educational, social welfare and medical services. But if spent on new entitlements, they become liabilities when, inevitably, the economy cools and revenues decline.

Boom and bust budgets plagued the state for decades as personal income taxes became the largest revenue source with much of them coming from a relative few high-income taxpayers. Their incomes, largely from capital gains

on investments, were and are more volatile than those of ordinary people and when they declined, it had a disproportionately heavy impact on the state's finances.

The revised California budget projects \$214.2 billion in direct general fund taxes, with personal income taxes supplying 64% of that. Roughly half of those income taxes come from the top 1% of taxpayers, fewer than 200,000 people in a state of nearly 40 million residents.

In introducing the revised budget, Newsom said he is “very mindful” of potential volatility and is responding by putting more money into reserves and making very few new permanent and long-term spending commitments.

About half of the projected surplus must, by law, go to public education and expanding the “rainy day fund” and other reserves to nearly \$40 billion. That leaves an estimated \$49 billion of so-called “discretionary income” that could be spent on anything he and legislators want.

Newsom says his budget would devote 94% of that pot of money to one-time allocations or paying down debt to avoid long-term commitments that could backfire should the economy cool and revenues decline. “This is important,” he said of that strategy.

Yes it is, because the advocates of expanded entitlements and their legislative allies contend that the surplus is a golden opportunity to fill gaps. Within minutes of Newsom's budget press conference (which was 132 minutes long,

incidentally) advocacy groups were expressing disappointment.

The question posed by the astonishingly high revenue numbers is whether the good times — at least the good times for high-income taxpayers — will continue.

As the budget revision was being finalized, the world, the nation and California were experiencing some troubling trends that Newsom acknowledged.

“This May revision reflects a significantly upgraded revenue forecast due to recent cash trends and improvement in key economic indicators,” Newsom told the Legislature. “However, the forecast has become more uncertain given Russia's war on Ukraine, high rates of inflation, and anticipated actions by the Federal Reserve to raise interest rates. In addition, capital gains as a percent of the state's personal income are at levels last seen in 1999 — just before the dot-com bust. Furthermore, the May revision forecast was finalized before the recent declines in the stock market.”

California is not an economic island and those potentially negative factors are beyond the state's control. However, the budget's very rosy revenue projections ignore them and assume that the golden geese, California's high-income taxpayers, will continue to prosper and continue laying golden eggs.

#### More Water Curtailments Looming for Farmers Across California

State officials are warning water-rights holders that they should expect more curtailments during the peak irrigation season in June and July. The recent word from the state Division of Water Rights was the latest bad news for farmers and ranchers facing a third straight year of drought. California Farm Bureau environmental policy analyst Justin Fredrickson said, "We are seeing unprecedented levels of water cutbacks and water-rights curtailments throughout the system."

#### Russian River Farmers Seek Solutions to Across-The-Board Water Cuts

Farmers with water rights along the Russian River in Mendocino and Sonoma counties are proposing solutions to avoid across-the-board reductions in water supplies this year. About 2,000 water-rights holders in the region are expected to receive curtailment orders. But the Mendocino County Farm Bureau and local farmers are working with state officials in hopes of achieving a voluntary system to allocate limited water resources and sustain local agriculture.

#### Water Woes Preventing California Growers from Cashing in on Cotton Prices

The price of pima cotton has reached record levels at about \$3.40 a pound compared to \$1.20 to \$1.50 over the past two years. But California farmers have increased plantings by just 10% to meet demand. They say they would love to plant more but simply don't have the needed water. Otherwise, Roger Isom of the California Cotton Ginners and Growers Association said, "We should see wall-to-wall cotton out there."

#### National Garlic Festival Raises Fresno County's Garlic Crown

Now that the famed Gilroy Garlic Festival has closed its doors, Fresno County is reminding people where America's true garlic capital resides. Fresno just played host to the May 13-15 National Garlic Festival, which hopes to be the featured garlic event going forward. Fresno has always grown substantially more of the stinky vegetable than Gilroy. The county produces 77% of all the garlic grown in the U.S.




