Kiley Responds to Newsom Extending School Mask Mandate

**SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG)** - Assemblyman Kevin Kiley (R-Rocklin) released the following statement in response to Governor Newsom's announcement that the statewide school mask mandate will continue until March 12, 2022:

"There is absolutely no basis for continuing the statewide school mask mandate another day. That's why almost every other state has moved on. Rather than finally acknowledge evidence and common sense, the Governor has chosen to give California kids another two weeks of pointless misery." "This is the same Governor who kept schools closed longer than any state in the country. It's the same Governor who tried to stop students from enrolling in high-performing charter schools soon after COVID began. Young people in California will pay a lasting price for Gavin Newsom's indecent school policies." "It's no wonder that dozens of school districts across the state have completely tuned the Governor out. They are doing what is right for their kids. "The Governor is also refusing to give up his emergency powers and continuing the State of Emergency in violation of the plain text of the Emergency Services Act. The Legislature must act to stop this lawlessness, end the emergency, and let the people of California move on with their lives." While California students wait until March 12, one day ago Gov. Kathy Hochel of New York announced that students would no longer need to mask starting Wednesday, March 2.

### MISTREATED ITS WORKING FAMILIES



California state health officials issued the order on Monday, nearly a month after they lifted the mandate for vaccinated people gathering in restaurants and other indoor spaces.

"This feels like the right time," said Dr. Mark Ghaly, California secretary of Health and Human Services. "I've been pleased with how the data has come down, and it is the right time to transition from the requirement to a strong recommendation."

Ghaly said on Feb. 14 that he would provide updated guidance for schools as early as Monday,


## **Time to Tickle Your Funny Bone**

## **Prophecy Fulfilled** Tickle Your Funny Bone

About seventy five years ago...somewhere on the back streets of Honolulu...I was having my "Fortune Told"...no kiddin! By a real honest to gosh gypsy woman!

She had motioned my buddy's and me to a dimly lit stairway squeezed tightly between a large pool hall and bar. We wanted to do the whole town...everything.

Although a bit apprehensive about "Stairway Prophecies", I was intrigued by the green and red gaily dressed woman with her rings of silver, painted face and the ever present "Tarot Deck" she fingered with expertise. The scene took me back a few years.

As a child in the 30's I had witnessed the bands of gypsies that came through town in wagons and later cars. They used "tarot cards" which there is no origin that can be established beyond a doubt. I knew there were 78 cards in a tarot deck. My mother had a deck and could tell fortunes by them...but that too was long ago.

At any rate I was given "my fortune" for two dollars which I figured could go towards a down payment on a crystal ball, which any self-respecting gypsy should have. I was told that "this night will be remembered for the rest of your life and you will soon receive bad news!" I shucked it all off as fun and entertainment with a cold deck (stacked). As the evening wore on we met a navy nurse and a wave out to one of the finer restaurants and then night clubbing. Later we became sorta disoriented down town and one of the

girls started climbing one of the street lights to see where we were. She said it was like climbing a mast aboard ship to look for land! That was when all the women wore dresses too! Somehow we got back to our ships and it was a night I would never forget.

What happened the next day was even more surprising? I received a telegram from the States saying there was a death in the family ... a strange prophecy!

But, one of the oldest prophecies in our nation came about as a result of the Battle of Tippecanoe, which was fought on November 7, 1811 just outside of the city of Lafayette, Indiana. The Chief of the Shawnee Nation was then Chief When Tecumseh. Tecumseh was away to Canada, William Henry Harrison led his troops into the Indian Territory resulting in the bloody, but almost meaningless battles of Tippecanoe. It was in the year 1813 that newly appointed supreme commander of the Army of the Northwest. Harrison sought out and killed Tecumseh at the Canadian Battle of the Thames. His reputation as an Indian fighter and hero was solidified.

Chief Tecumseh's own brother was the medicine man and religious rites person and was known as the "prophet" of the people. He was a one eyed brilliant Indian who was a self taught astrologer with accurate predictions that was a source of advice to the entire Shawnee Nation. It was the prophet's cave (still in existence today) that is a result of the Battle of Tippecanoe. An incredible curse was put on the white man. The prophet's curse was directed at U.S. leaders. In 1820 the prophecy found his promise in the stars, Jupiter and Saturn, as they are now known, in conjunction. - In 1940 Franklin D Roosevelt was elected and died in office in 1945.
- In 1960 John F. Kennedy was elected and was assassinated. John F Kennedy has written a letter regarding the curse. Which was donated to the Library of Presidential Papers.

SAN BERNARDINO-RIVERSIDE COUNTIES, CA (MPG) - Governor Gavin Newsom's Clean California initiative is a sweeping \$1.1 billion, multiyear clean-up effort to remove trash, create thousands of jobs, and engage communities to transform public spaces.

In this News Flash, Caltrans shares with kids in the Inland Empire the importance of picking up litter in our neighborhoods.

Over three years, Clean California will remove an additional 1.2 million cubic yards, or 21,000 tons, of trash from the state system alone – enough to fill the Rose Bowl three times over. The initiative has already resulted in 7,300 tons of litter removed from the state highway

system and, to date, Caltrans has hired 615 new team members, including 489 maintenance workers who collect litter and perform maintenance duties like graffiti removal. Additionally, the Governor's California Blueprint proposes an additional \$100 million to fund another round of local Clean California grants.



denied the accusation from some parents that teachers unions delayed the lifting of the mask mandate.

"The Governor's office engaged all school stakeholders in the conversation around a safe transition for schools-management and labor," Gardiner wrote in a text message on Monday. "Our approach has always been grounded in science. Those who are trying to vilify educators right now want this to be about politics rather than safety and science."

CTA president E. Toby Boyd said he supports the "optimism of Gov. Gavin Newsom and CDPH officials that declining COVID-19 cases hospitalizations allow us to see light at the end of the pandemic tunnel." But Boyd also acknowledged that many students might not feel ready to unmask at school.

Andrew Noymer, a public health professor at the University of California, Irvine, says it's too early to lift the mask mandate, especially because it remains unclear what thresholds the state hopes to reach by March 12.

"I can only say that the COVID rates are too high now," he said. "But I'm not in favor of a future in which kids always go to school with masks."

The state's decision and timeline for making masks optional in schools arrives just days after the federal Centers for Disease Control and Prevention revised federal guidance on masking in schools. CDC experts said counties showing positive trends in COVID-19 cases and hospitalization rates do not need to require masking in most indoor spaces, including schools.

"I think California's approach is smarter to treat schools differently because students for the time being have much lower vaccination rates than other demographics," Noymer said.

In Monday's announcement, state officials said local school districts will be able to have stricter masking rules than the state order.

San Diego Unified, the second largest district in the state, will continue enforcing its indoor mask mandate, according to school board president Richard Barrera.

"San Diego County is still in the highrisk tier, even under the CDC's new system," Barrera said. "When we move into the moderate-risk tier, then we'll reassess."

Districts like Oakland Unified and Los Angeles Unified required masking outdoors even after the state made the practice optional. Los Angeles got rid of its outdoor mask mandate last week. Officials from both districts have not yet responded to questions about how they will adjust their rules starting March 12.

State officials also said on Monday that the indoor mask mandate for unvaccinated adults will be lifted starting March 1. Masks will still be required in "high transmission settings" like public transit, emergency shelters, health care settings, correctional facilities, homeless shelters and longterm care facilities.

### Alleged Shooting of Juvenile by Brother Under Investigation



**OLIVEHURST, CA (MPG)** - Yuba County Detectives are investigating the shooting of a 14-year-old Olivehurst boy who suffered a life-threatening gunshot wound on Thursday, February 24, 2022 at approximately 4:20 p.m. alongside McGowan Parkway at Fleming Avenue in Olivehurst. The victim was transported by ambulance to a local hospital, and later flown to a Sacramento area hospital, where he remains in critical condition.

The victim's 15-year-old brother was taken into custody for the alleged shooting. Additional minors, whom investigators believe may have been the intended targets of the shooting, ran from the scene and were later contacted by detectives.

The circumstances surrounding the shooting, including whether or not the incident was gang related, remain under active investigation at this time.  $\star$ 







#### Despite High Commodity Prices, Farmers Face Difficult Planting Decisions

With commodity prices higher across the board, the market may be telling farmers to plant - and plant some more. But, amid continuing drought, water concerns may be overriding market demand as California farmers decide which crops to plant and how much they can afford to plant. Many farmers say they don't expect to receive any surface water deliveries this year, and rising chemical and fertilizer prices will also affect planting decisions for the 2022 growing season.

### State Grape Growers Reaping Higher Prices From 2021 Harvest

California's 2021 grape crush produced a yield of 3.86 million tons, according to a preliminary report from the California Department of Food and Agriculture. Winegrapes accounted for 3.6 million tons, with table and raisin grapes making up the remainder. California produced more than 4 million tons of grapes annually between 2016 and 2019. But those years created an oversupply of bulk wine, negatively impacting prices. In 2021, grape prices went up by more than 20%.

#### 2022 Avocado Harvest Expected to Top 300 Million Pounds

California avocado growers are expected to harvest more than 300 million pounds this season. That supply is augmented during the year by imported avocados from Mexico. Last week, those imports were briefly suspended after threats in that country against a U.S. agricultural official. The California Avocado Commission urged Agriculture Secretary Tom Vilsack to maintain strict import standards but said state growers "have no interest in disrupting the supply of avocados from Mexico."

### Rate of Land Subsidence from Groundwater Pumping Decreases

New satellite data shows that land surface sinking continued during California's 2021 water year due to high levels of groundwater pumping. However, the California Department of Water Resources reports that the ground subsidence pace was slower than during past drought years. Water Resources Director Karla Nemeth said, "It is good news that, compared to previous droughts, subsidence is slowing." She said it is important to recharge aquifers in wet months.

March is usually a favorite month for gardeners - the really cold weather is usually done and it will not get hot for a couple of more months. The first day of spring officially happens on March 20th. Spring is a beautiful time of the year with beautiful weather for all kinds of pleasant activities, gardening being a favorite for many. Other noteworthy days in March are on March 13th, we start Daylight Saving Time, and on the 17th, is St. Patrick's Day. Nice time of the year to be in the garden.

Vegetable gardens and flower gardens are high on the list of things to do for many. Select a spot with lots of sunlight for your vegetable garden, and some intermittent shade as the sun moves across the area is alright. The soil will probably need to be spaded or roto-tilled to loosen it. If you have heavy clay soil, it will likely take several rounds of turning the soil and adding compost to lighten it and make it more porous. Try to use organic soil additives that will build your soil rather than chemical products that tend to deplete the soil of needed nutrients. The decomposition of organic matter such as crushed leaves and grass clippings can be interspersed into heavy clay soil to help lighten it as well as create spaces to help with drainage which is a problem with very dense clay. Many of our customers in the foothills are very familiar with the clay soil, and maintain a compost pile - an effective way to always have soil additive ready when you need it. A compost pile is not especially attractive and might be offensive to some neighbors in town, but there are containers available that work well and will breakdown trimmings into compost. It is not a fast process, but it is still a good way to dispose of trimmings and weeds, and make good use of them. It is important to keep weeds and brush under control - they both grow rapidly and can be an invasive problem. Control can be accomplished in several different ways, some of them can be quite labor intensive – such as pulling them by hand. They can be controlled mechanically and they can be sprayed with an herbicide. Because we had so much warm weather in February, I doubt that pre-emergent can be used effectively now to deter the weeds – most of them have likely sprouted already. With pre-emergent, one must be careful not to apply it where you planted flower seeds for spring color it is not fussy about what it works its magic on! Congratulations to anyone who had the

foresight to use it early enough to be effective. A combination of all those things seem to work for most people, depending on the areas to be done, the kind of weeds, etc. All methods require that some caution be used in order not to harm something else in the process.

With the weather warming and plants eager to grow, it is also time to fertilize just about everything to give them all a good start. An all purpose fertilizer is fine for most plants, but try to use the proper fertilizer on those things that need it, such as citrus food and acid based fertilizer. I have a few words of caution, though. should you have any plant that has buds that should open several weeks later than your date of fertilizing, skip those plants until they have finished blooming. Fertilizing while the buds are not mature might cause the plant to start putting on vigorous new growth that could push the unopened buds off. Just wait until it has finished blooming, and fertilize it then. It is natural for spring blooming plants to put out new growth following their bloom period. This caution refers to those plants that bloom only once a year in the spring. Sometimes, for instance, some rhododendrons are later blooming. Enjoy all of their beautiful blooms, and fertilize them after they have finished. Another cautionary statement on rhodies - be sure to break off the flower trusses left following the petals falling, to reduce seed formation which will reduce next year's bloom. We are not the only ones happy to see spring, slugs, snails, earwigs, aphids all welcome the warmer weather. Aphids multiply exponentially and ants farm them by moving them from one place to another because they like the sticky honeydew that they leave behind. Aphids can be controlled by hosing the off frequently, and there are insecticides that will control them for longer time. Controlling the ants helps to control the aphids. This an excellent time to plant most anything - ground covers, lawns, annuals, etc. Perennials can also be dug and divided and possibly shared with other gardener friends. They can become well established more easily in the cooler spring temperatures and thus, withstand the heat of the summer. Enjoy the beauty of the spring season.

YUBA CITY, CA (MPG) - The Affordable Housing and Sustainable Communities, or AHSC, grants were awarded to projects in Sacramento, Yuba City, and South Lake Tahoe. The awards make the first time a project in the Sacramento region has been successful in the transit-oriented development category. Funding programs like the AHSC grant give developers and jurisdictions financial support as they work to meet demands and address state emissions reduction targets.

Yuba City's project, Richland Village,

received the second-highest score across the state out of 37 awarded projects, and a total of \$30 million for the 4.7-acre site that sits near the confluence of the Feather and Yuba rivers.

Richland Village will include 176 units with one-, two-, and three-bedroom apartments, park space, trails, and transit connections. As part of the project, Yuba-Sutter Transit will receive \$8.5 million to help finance the development of their new facility. Financial commitments from the City of Yuba City, Sutter County, and even the Yuba City Unified School District helped to propel the project's success.  $\star$

### **How California Mistreated** its Working Families

Democratic politicians frequently and vehemently express their admiration for and support of what they call "working families," while contending that rival Republicans lack such empathy.

Despite that political posture, the Democratic governor of California, with the implicit support of a Democratdominated Legislature, has imposed unnecessary misery on those they purport to value, as a new report from the Legislature's budget analyst confirms.

When COVID-19 struck California two years ago, Gov. Gavin Newsom declared a state of emergency and ordered closure of large segments of the state's economy to battle its spread. Almost immediately, more than two million workers were laid off as their employers complied with the orders and most applied for unemployment insurance benefits to keep themselves and their families housed and fed.

Whether the closures and resulting layoffs were justified, in terms of their pandemic-fighting effects, will be endlessly debated. Regardless, they happened and having lost their jobs by executive decree, the suddenly idled workers' claims for benefits deserved rapid and accurate processing by

Newsom's Employment and triply mistreated. Development Department.

Instead, EDD's pandemic operations rapidly devolved into a bureaucratic Chernobyl with immense and prolonged backlogs of claims, unresponsive handling of claimants' inquiries, rampant fraud and, as the new report details, botched anti-fraud practices that blocked payments to those with legitimate claims.

The state's oversight agencies, particularly the state auditor's office, have steadfastly catalogued EDD's shortcomings and the latest report, focusing on about \$20 billion in fraudulent payments and EDD's measures to battle it, comes from the Legislative Analyst's Office.

What emerges is a tale of an agency repeatedly failing to act when necessary and then overreacting as it tries to correct its previous errors.

Embarrassed by the revelations of fraud, mostly involving special federal jobless benefits, EDD's managers went overboard in adopting anti-fraud policies, thus denying benefits to many legitimate and qualified claimants, the LAO report declares.

At one point, it says, "EDD and (and an outside contractor) identified 1.1 million claims as potentially fraudulent. EDD stopped payments for these claims. Workers were not notified ahead of time. To reopen their accounts, workers had to verify their identity using ID.me or their accounts would be closed permanently. Ultimately, more than half of the claims (600,000) flagged as fraudulent were confirmed as legitimate."

Thus, the "working families" that Democrats profess to treasure have been doubly

Newsom's proposed 2022-23 budget contains funds for six contracts by outside vendors to prevent future fraud, in addition to 13 other fraud-related contracts and the LAO report questions whether additional antifraud efforts are warranted at this time."

"Moving forward at this time with new, additional layers of fraud protection also would move the department further out of balance by again prioritizing fraud elimination at the expense of prompt and straightforward payments," the report states.

One of the most irritating things about the EDD's incredibly bad performance over the last two years is that its political overseers had plenty of warning. During the previous recession that began in 2007, the department experienced great difficulty in handling a surge of unemployment insurance claims because of antiquated tools and procedures.

However, once that recession ended, the agency reverted to its customary ministerial role and no one — in particular Newsom's predecessor, Jerry Brown - took the proactive step of improving EDD's capabilities before the next recession hit.

Thus, when it did hit in 2020 by Newsom's decree, the department was overwhelmed and the shortcomings revealed in the previous recession were magnified. It's another reminder of government's endemic inability to look ahead and plan ahead.

with a current downward bias being prominent since the start of the year.

Investors are likely experiencing the rare but excruciating pain of seeing balances continuing to erode, seemingly in an endless daily parade of red numbers and dropping balances appearing on their investment screens.

Much of this many say is the fault of policy makers, both in addressing the CoVid crisis and the massive amount of money creation given out to consumers and businesses alike to address it.

I would say much of what we are seeing now in the markets is not the fault of any one person but the fault of many.

This analyst has always maintained the position that the CoVid virus could not be stopped, that shutdowns did nothing but destroy many businesses and livelihoods, and that shutdowns actually prolonged the crisis by allowing a longer virus survival time which in the end caused more mutations. So far, at least on the surface, that statement seems correct.

That said, others claim shutdowns helped limit the damage that would have been much worse had we not had them. They use science as their argument. Detractors claim the scientists have been wrong so many times during the crisis that they are not to be believed.

It's impossible to go back in time and take the opposite route we took, and then compare the results side by side. What we can discern is that the current events certainly don't confirm the decisions world governments made were the correct ones.

Fast forward to our markets, and the issues believed to be responsible for the markets current ills are Russian aggression on the Ukraine border and the worst inflation in decades.

Although the U.S. holds no blame for what Russia is doing, the inflation part is argued to be the result of the overly generous unemployment, bailout and stimulus programs instigated to address the CoVid slowdowns and shutdowns.

Whereas the Russia crisis is serious, and has taken the spotlight off of inflation and the Federal Reserves predicted actions to address it, in my opinion, inflation is the real threat. The Russian crisis may pass without culminating in a major event.

In my opinion, what the Fed does to address inflation is the real threat to market upward momentum. To address inflation, is (530)559-1214.

The markets continue to remain volatile, the Feds will raise interest rates. The Feds have indicated that they are very concerned about the rate of inflation and will start to raise interest rates as soon as this March. Uncharacteristically, they have indicated that at least a one percent increase will be accomplished by a quick succession of smaller increases. Following the markets for as long as I have, the fact that they have mentioned one percent as a minimum should be taken seriously.

> Should investors be worried? Obviously the continued erosion since the start of the year has taken a big bite out of the markets.

> The markets however, historically, can on occasion, act positively to a rate increase period, once the increases are underway.

> From KENSHO STATS, and as mentioned on CNBC, looking at six periods of rate increases since 1988, the results from the start of the interest rate increases event until the increases stopped, information technology stocks gained 47%, consumer discretionary (luxury nonessential items) were up 31%, financials were up 30%, industrials were up 29% and materials went up 27%.

> What this indicates is that although rate increases by the Fed are initially taken very seriously by investors (there have been many instances where rate increases have initially hammered stocks) there is some historical precedent that may give some hope to investors that are now running scared.

> Rate increases can lead to a rising stock market once the stigma of a rate increase has passed.

As for the Russian crisis?

In my opinion, it's likely a nonevent, although it is moving the markets at this time.

Investors should focus more on the interest rate event, which may eventually have a positive effect on the economy and therefore the markets.



# on Russia's Invasion of Ukraine

With our technological aid they can make this invasion extremely painful for Russia and hopefully prevail."

"Further, immediate and crippling sanctions must be placed on all Russian industry, military leaders, and oligarchs. We should use our economic might to freeze their accounts and make Russian leadership feel true economic pain. A major shift in domestic policy has to accompany this foreign policy action. Biden's appeasement of Russia on the Nord Stream 2 pipeline has given Russia power over our allies in Western Europe. We must pursue a full domestic oil production policy including new pipelines. America has the largest untapped oil supplies in the world and now is the time to use them to avert escalating international danger. We must have the capacity to export LNG (liquified natural gas) to our European allies to remove Russian threats to cut off their energy sources. We need to produce oil in such vast quantities that prices drop, robbing Russia of their primary economic driver. High oil prices hurt American consumers but also directly finance both Russian and Iranian aggression. This must be accompanied by returning to Trump era regulations that produce vibrant and strong economic activity. An economically powerful America has more diplomatic tools to stop both Russian and Chinese aggression."

### **California's Constitutional Right to Fish** by Francis Coats and Karrigan Bork

The Lewis and Clark Law School Environmental Law journal has published an article by local retired attorney Francis Coats and University of California, Davis Law School professor Karrigan Bork on California's Constitutional Right to Fish, section 25 article I of the California Constitution, which provides for a constitutional right to fish on state-owned land and on land formerly state-owned and sold or transferred after November 8, 1910. The article sees the "right to fish" provided as the right to enter upon and use land, not a prohibition on state regulation of time of day, tackle, bag limits and license requirements.

The section was adopted by popular vote in 1910, and since that time practically all state school and indemnity lands (lands given the state by the federal government to subsidize education) sold by the state has had an express reservation of the absolute right to fish in the people on the land being transferred printed in the grant. Today, the state claims to be unable to identify the lands subject to this burden. However, from 1915 until at least the early 1930's the state published lists of state school and indemnity lands subject to sale or lease; and, today these lands are either still owned by the state or subject to the express reservation of fishing rights. These lists are available from the California State Library. In addition, since 1921, school and indemnity lands sold have been subject to a reservation of mineral interests in the state. The state seems to keep good track of these interests as they present income or potential income. Any list of state mineral interests is effectively a list of state lands or former state lands subject to fishing rights, from 1921 forward.

The lands subject to the obligation to reserve fishing rights applies to all state-owned lands, not merely those on navigable water or even only those with fishable water.

As for lands not expressly subject to fishing rights because the state and its grantees did not provide for them expressly, it is likely that the transfers are void, with the land still belonging to the state; or, that the reservation is effective by operation of law even though it does not appear in the granting document.

In addition, in California local agencies are considered mere extensions of the state and land held by a local agency is state-owned.
