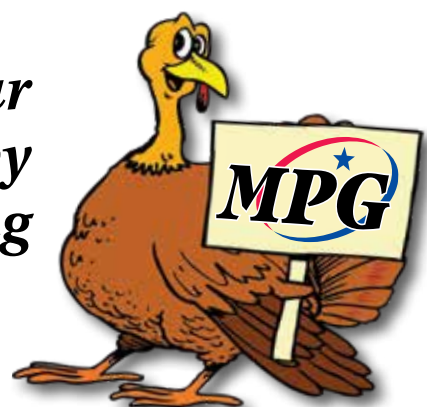

California's Messier, but Fairer, Redistricting Process

For many decades, the decennial chore of redrawing California's congressional and legislative districts was relatively simple.

Every 10 years, following the census, legislative and congressional leaders would hire some knowledgeable number-crunchers and privately divvy up the districts for purely political purposes.

If one party controlled both the Legislature and the governorship, it would maximize its ability to remain in power. The maps that the dominant Democrats drew up after the 1980 census was the last time California saw a blatantly partisan gerrymander.

Republicans howled and persuaded voters to overturn the plan via a referendum, but the state Supreme Court ordered that the rejected maps be used anyway for the 1982 elections, in which Democrats retained their control of the Legislature and the congressional delegation.

Assembly Speaker Willie Brown publicly thanked "Sister Rose and the Supremes" for helping his party overcome the referendum, referring to Chief Justice Rose Bird. It fueled a successful drive to oust Bird and two other justices when they stood for re-election four years later.

After the 1982 election, Democrats enacted a slightly altered version of the gerrymander and then-Gov. Jerry Brown signed it just before leaving office. The congressional map was particularly slanted toward Democrats and its primary creator, San Francisco Congressman Phil Burton, laconically called it "my contribution to modern art."

Control of redistricting was the primary, if unspoken, issue of the 1990 campaign for governor and after Republican Pete Wilson won he vetoed a new set of maps drawn by Democrats, throwing the issue into the state Supreme Court. The court generated maps of its own that allowed the Republicans to make some gains in the 1992 and 1994 elections.

Democrats once again controlled the Legislature and the governorship after the 2000 census, but a partisan gerrymander was blunted by other factors, including an implicit threat of intervention by the U.S. Department of Justice under President George W. Bush.

The upshot was a bipartisan gerrymander aimed at protecting all incumbents and preserving the partisan status quo in both the Legislature and Congress, while ignoring dramatic demographic shifts, including a big surge in Latino population.

Overt gerrymandering ended a decade later, after voters approved two initiatives – hated by leaders of both parties – to shift the decennial mapmaking to an independent commission

that would ignore partisan considerations, draw districts to follow, where possible, city and county boundaries and preserve "communities of interest."

On the whole, the commission was faithful to its mission, but nevertheless, Democrats made big gains in congressional and legislative seats – eventually winning three-fourths of both as GOP voter strength plummeted.

With data from a new census – much delayed due to the COVID-19 pandemic – a new commission is working on new maps under a very tight deadline and it's been a rather messy process – a "hot mess" in the recent words of one commission member. Drafts of the new maps were released last week and it's apparent that they are likely to change quite a bit before the Dec. 27 deadline.

That said, it's obvious that Democrats will retain their overwhelming legislative and congressional supermajorities and could gain a few more seats simply because demographic trends continue to run their way.

Most of the uncertainty is in the 52 congressional districts – one fewer than before due to California's slow population growth. Democrats are struggling to retain their paper-thin control of Congress and a handful of toss-up seats in California could be the difference.

However, until the final maps are filed, no one can truly predict who will survive and whose careers will end. The process is messier than before, but also fairer.

YUBA COUNTY, CA (MPG) - On 11/5/2021 at approximately 3:30 p.m., Yuba County

Sheriff Patrol Deputies and Detectives served a search warrant at a property in the 7600 block of Silva Path in Rackerby and arrested 53-year-old Hubert Townshend for possession of stolen property and auto theft. During the course of an investigation into a burglary of the Browns Valley Irrigation District Office reported on 10/29/21, deputies obtained information that a dump truck taken from the company was parked on the property on Silva Path.

During the search of the property, patrol and detectives recovered the stolen dump truck and additional

property from the Irrigation District burglary. Additional stolen vehicles were located including a pontoon boat from Butte County, a water truck from San Jose, and a camp trailer from Redding in which Townshend appeared to be residing in on the property. Approximately \$40,000 worth of stolen property was recovered; however, additional stolen property remains outstanding. The investigation remains active and ongoing.

Townshend was booked into the Yuba County Jail for Possession of Stolen Property and Auto Theft. His bail is set at \$25,000. ★

Problems have Solutions, Whereas Predicaments only have Outcomes

It is said that problems have solutions, whereas predicaments only have outcomes. If that is true, the U.S. economy's future and indeed our immediate way of life, awaits an outcome that the Feds can do nothing about. Ex-Federal Reserve Chief Alan Greenspan used the word conundrum on occasion, yet conundrums do have outcomes, they are just difficult ones.

The predicament we now find ourselves revolves around the subject of last week's column about inflation, the latest one trillion dollar spending bill passed this weekend, and the six trillion or so spent during 20/21 for CoVid relief.

Deficit spending and inflation go hand in hand. There is no argument on that economic reality. The debate is not whether inflation follows massive deficit spending. It does, it is now, and everyone knows it. The question is can the Feds stop inflation if it gets out of hand. The answer is yes, they can, but that is not the predicament.

The question becomes what is the effect on the economy from using the known tools to stop inflation.

Therein lies the predicament. If inflation begins to accelerate to unacceptable levels, and it going pretty fast now, real damage to the economy and its inhabitants will occur. The most obvious problem is people won't be able to afford to buy the things they need. But as horrible as that is, that will be the least of our problems.

Really bad inflation, known as hyperinflation, or even approaching hyperinflation, can cause breakages in the economic system, many of which can actually stop it from predictably functioning.

The result of that is the normal economic signals that transmit what it happening in the marketplace, to those participating in it (which is anyone who has to procure anything), begin to fail, sending false or even misleading signals to all concerned, which again, is all of us.

Since markets (not just stock markets but all markets where things are sold) depend on accurate economic signals to regulate the flow of goods and services from suppliers to end users, when these signals fail, the normal flow of everything is interrupted or may even fail altogether. This can translate into empty store shelves at best, and chaos on many levels at worst.

For a recent but relatively inconvenient example of a market failure, just

look at the job market, where unemployment levels are relatively high, in the midst of millions of unfilled jobs. In spite of rising prices, slowing unemployment checks and stimulus programs ending, employers still cannot find enough worker to fill staffing positions. Although a serious problem, it will pale in comparison of what will happen should we even get close to a hyperinflationary environment.

The tools to stop inflation are the same used for normal inflation, except on a much more drastic scale. The Fed would increase interest rates and likely not the quarter point increases we have seen in the past. Interest rates were increased 3% in one day in the 80's. Experts agree an increase of this proportion would crash the economy in today's environment. Social programs would have to be eliminated or drastically cut. Government spending would have to be significantly cut. The Fed would have its hands tied to initiate more stimulus and bailouts as this is what caused the problem so those suffering would get little help from the government. Credit and loans would likely have to be recalled in an attempt to remove cash from the system. The credit markets would likely freeze up due to the unpredictable yields of fast moving interest rates. Both government, business and individual balance sheets would explode due to rising interest rate costs to service existing debt. In essence, all hell would break loose, and the Feds, having only one tool in the proverbial toolbox (printing money) would be powerless to use it as that is what caused the problem in the first place.

Simply put, the predicament is that the very thing they would use to address the economic malady, caused the malady.

With no solution, the Feds have essentially painted themselves into a corner. Hence the statement, "print or die", which always eventually morphs into "print and die".

Attempted Murder By Shovel

YUBA CITY, CA (MPG) - On November 10, 2021, at approximately 9 a.m. Yuba City Police officers responded to Kingwood Park on Gray Avenue reference a male subject holding a shovel handle and threatening to kill a female. When the officers arrived in the area, they located the male hiding in bushes near the Yuba City Senior Center in the 700 block of Ainsley Avenue. The male immediately began yelling at the officers and refused to listen to officer's requests. The male ran from the officers and as they were chasing him, he fled into

the senior center where a ceramics class was being held. The officers became concerned for the safety of the members in the class and they were able to corner him in the room and, after a brief physical struggle with officers, he was taken into custody. There were no reported injuries from the original victim or the witnesses in the senior center. The male was then identified as 50-year-old Christopher Borden from Yuba City. He was booked into the Sutter County Jail for criminal threats, physically resisting an officer, and possession of drug paraphernalia. The case will now be turned over to the Sutter County District Attorney for prosecution. ★

Three Vehicle Accident Results in One Fatality

California Highway Patrol Press Release

YUBA SUTTER, CA (MPG) - On November 10, 2021, at 9:28AM a three vehicle accident resulted in one fatality on Hwy 99. The driver of the Toyota was traveling southbound on SR-99 and had entered the left turn as it approached Stewart Rd. Whitmore (Mazda) was traveling northbound SR-99 within the #2 lane, south of the Stewart Rd. intersection. Fletcher (Lexus) was traveling northbound SR-99 within the #1 lane, south of the Stewart Rd. intersection, slightly behind Whitmore's vehicle (and to the left). The driver of the Toyota failed

to yield to oncoming traffic and initiated a left turn directly into the path of the northbound vehicles. Whitmore's vehicle collided nearly head on with the Toyota. The impact sent the Toyota into a counter-clockwise spin and it struck the right rear corner of Fletcher's vehicle, as he took evasive action to the left. The driver of the Toyota and Whitmore were transported to Rideout Hospital via ground ambulance. The driver of the Toyota succumbed to her injuries later that evening, while at the hospital. Drugs nor alcohol were suspected to be a factor in this collision. At the time of this release the investigation is ongoing. ★

Turkey Farmers Ready for Thanksgiving, Despite Market Uncertainty

California's turkey farmers are promising an ample amount of different sized turkeys for this year's Thanksgiving, even if overall demand is hard to anticipate. Only a year ago, the COVID-19 pandemic resulted in scaled-back holiday gatherings and smaller feasts. Even before the pandemic, the size of birds on Thanksgiving tables was trending downward. The average holiday turkey weighs 14 to 18 pounds.

Thieves Target Farm Vehicles for Catalytic Converters

Catalytic converter thefts are surging in California farm country. In rural Merced County, authorities reported at least 176 converter thefts in October alone as thieves look to sell platinum and other metals from the auto parts. The thefts are disruptive to farmers, particularly when thieves target pickup trucks and other vehicles used in agricultural work. The Merced County sheriff is calling for more aggressive prosecutions.

Proposed Initiative Would Mandate State Water Investments

A proposed California water initiative is being circulated for signatures in hopes of qualifying for the November 2022 ballot. The Water Infrastructure Funding Act of 2022 would allocate 2% of California general fund spending for reservoirs and other projects to boost water availability. California still hasn't built projects approved in the last water bond. Proposition 1, approved in 2014, was supposed to fund major upgrades in water storage.

California Citrus Yield Drops; Fruit is Smaller

A hot, dry year has impacted California's citrus production. Growers say early navel varieties generally are running smaller this year, putting a premium on larger offerings. Meanwhile, a survey of state citrus growers says the costs of bringing citrus to market has jumped 19% since early 2020. Factors include ballooning costs of surface water and increased expenses for fuel and fertilizer. ★

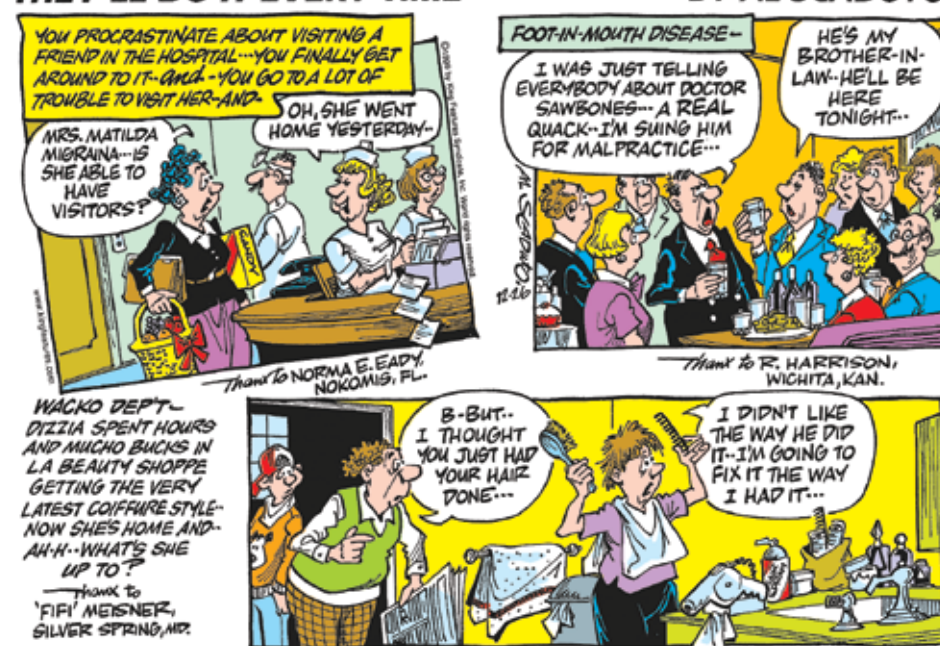

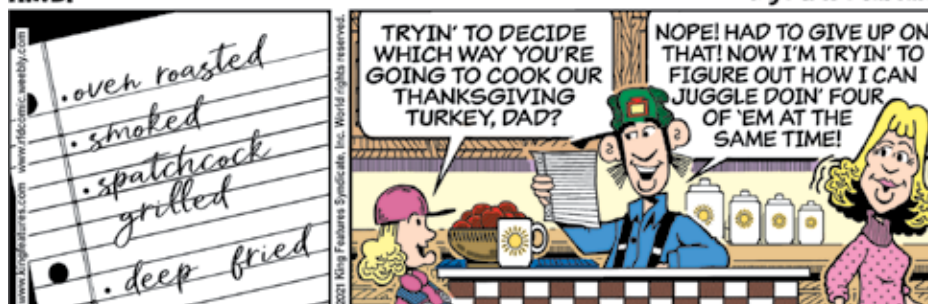

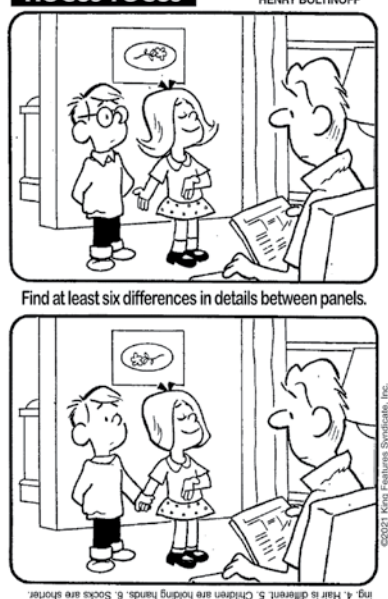
