SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) -

The California Highway Patrol (CHP) Southern and Valley Divisions are working to reduce the number of victims killed and injured in traffic crashes as a result of illegal street racing and sideshows with the support of the Communities Against Racing and Sideshows (CARS) grant.

The CHP Valley Division continues to experience an increase in illegal street racing, sideshows, and drifting activities, often with fatal results. This continued dangerous behavior has proven the need for additional personnel and resources to properly address this illegal and highly dangerous activity.

With the CARS grant, CHP Valley Division officers will be able to focus enforcement on these unsafe driving behaviors and educating the public about the oftentimes deadly outcomes they bring.

"Ultimately we want to keep our roadways safe for everyone," said CHP Valley Division Chief Mike Dust. "Those who choose to engage in these irresponsible and selfish acts need to know they put everyone's life at risk, not just their own, and we cannot allow that."

Grant activities will include focused task force operations, undercover procedures, "in-view" proactive patrol operations, local high school presentations, and a public awareness campaign including community events and presentations.

Funding for this program was provided by a grant from the California Office of Traffic Safety, through the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration.



Letter to Governor Gavin Newsom from YCOE Superintendent

Dear Governor Newsom,

As County Superintendent of Schools and Superintendents of the 5 school districts in Yuba County, we have served our communities through each challenging stage of the COVID-19 pandemic. We have been relentless in our focus on the safety of students and staff and, during this time, we have observed overall minimal in-school transmission.

On October 1, 2021, your office issued a press release indicating that you are directing CDPH to require a COVID-19 vaccination for all K-12 students once the vaccine is fully approved by the Federal Food & Drug Administration (FDA). At this time, we are aware that this mandate may go into effect as early as July 2022. Currently, there are allowances for families to decline vaccination utilizing medical, religious, and personal exemptions.

It is important to understand the challenges these mandates are creating for our school community. As you are likely aware, many in our community have significant concerns regarding the continuance

of mask mandates. The introduction of the vaccination mandate has created additional concerns. In listening to our community, we anticipate the implementation of a vaccination mandate, without an exemption for personal beliefs, will deeply impact schools as families leave for independent study programs or other alternatives to classroom-based instruction.

From the very beginning of the response to this pandemic, State regulations have been mandated, placing much of the burden for communication, implementation, and enforcement entirely on principals, teachers, staff, administrators, and school boards. With the responsibility to implement these mandates, school boards and administrators are left to manage the real frustrations of large portions of our public, taking time and focus away from our critical mission of serving students and supporting teachers and staff. The resulting divisions within some communities are eroding the trust and partnerships that are essential in public schools.

We presume that it is the State's intention to create a supportive structure for public schools, thus we are requesting that more be done during this very difficult time to support our work educating children and youth with the following:

1. It is critical to engage the public in a transparent and coherent manner by clearly reinforcing Elementary School District ★

that the authority over these mandates lies with the State, and by clearly informing the public as to how they can engage with the correct decision-makers in these matters.

- 2. In addition, we request that the State identify what benchmarks must be met to end universal masking in classrooms.
- 3. Finally, it is vital that the State of California maintains the medical, religious, and personal exemptions with regard to the COVID-19 vaccination requirement. It is essential that we honor the voices of our parents.

In Yuba County, we believe in the importance of safe, in-person instruction for our students. We are asking for your support, to allow us to return to the business of educating our students in the safest and most normal way. Our students, our educators, and our communities need your support.







Patrol Sergeant Injured Wide Awake Geek: Computers, in Motorcycle Pursuit

LINDA, CA (MPG) - A Yuba County Sheriff Sergeant was transported by ambulance to a local hospital this afternoon with injuries sustained during a struggle with the suspect of a motorcycle pursuit in East Linda. Deputies arrested the suspect, identified as Thomas Giboney, age 30 of Linda, for Attempted Murder of a Peace Officer, Assault of a Peace Officer, and Felony Evading.

The incident began just before 1:00 p.m. on 11/18/2021, when a Yuba County patrol deputy attempted to conduct a traffic stop on Giboney, who fled on a motorcycle east bound on North Beale Rd from Hammonton-Smartsville Rd. The pursuit ended when Giboney crashed the motorcycle on Alberta Avenue. Deputies then attempted to detain Giboney, who became combative and pulled a Sheriff Sergeant into a flooded ditch, where Giboney physically assaulted and held the Sergeant under water. Additional deputies assisted and were able to rescue the Sergeant and take Giboney into

At this time, our Sergeant remains at the hospital undergoing treatment for minor injuries, including water aspiration. Giboney was transported to a local hospital for treatment of minor injuries, and he will be booked into the Yuba County Jail upon release.

Tucked away in Marysville on G Street is Wide Awake Geek (WAG): a Coworking zone for "innovators, entrepreneurs, and makers."

WAG is not new to the area but has done some amazing things over the last few years. In 2020, WAG and local partners, under the leadership of WAG owner Chuck Ferguson, designed, made, and distributed 2,000 clear face shields using their technology. These were used by first responders in the Yuba-Sutter area. In 2019 WAG partnered with the Butte County Fair in Gridley to make the Maker's Experience, held during the Fair, successful.

WAG offers offices, desks, and a podcast room for rent. Presentation space and makerspace for constructing projects are also available. Members can access hand, power and computerized tools in the WAG lab. The public is invited to learn how to use 3D printers, laser cutters, and CNC routers through a WAG membership. WAG provides workspace needs





The Economy Continues to Give Analysts Much to Dwell On

The economy continues to give is exasperating the problem. analysts much to dwell on, as it seems like almost daily we get more news, some of it making sense and some of it not so much.

Inflation rages on and is capturing headlines almost daily. Astonishing price increases are causing consumer sticker shock at the grocery store, hardware store, gas pump and just about everywhere else that sells stuff. Seems like everything is going up in price and by a lot!

In the face of these price increases, Washington continues to churn out more dollars to the order of trillions for a seemingly endless parade of stimulus programs. One would think the government had never heard of monetary inflation (the worst and most common kind) which is a result of introducing more and more currency into an economy. However, the rank and file of economic analysts using the word hyperinflation lately is definitely on the increase. Although detailed in last week's Money Matters article, if you don't know what hyperinflation, its inflation on steroids and some.

Meanwhile, record numbers of people are quitting their jobs. Some news media outlets are reporting that people are resigning to find higher paying jobs elsewhere. That is all well and good, but likely not completely true. If it were, there would not be a massive amount of job vacancies (over 10 million) while many businesses are still struggling to fill job openings. More likely and also covered widely on the evening news are the massive resignations from vaccine mandates. The mass anti-vaccine protests don't resemble the BLM crowds just yet, but they are definitely on the

A variety of economic statistics continue to illustrate a plethora of contradictions, puzzling many an analyst. The stock market plows relentlessly higher, seemingly obliv-

Prognostications of a stock market Armageddon-like crash is offset by other analysts insisting the stock market has a lot further to run. With violent stock rotations whipsawing retirement balances, it's hard for mom and pop investors to know which way to turn. The buy and hold crowd continue to oscillate between fear and greed. One month they are hammered like the 3 week, 38% wipe out of the Dow in March of 2020, while the next 12 months saw the Dow almost double to where it is now.

Meanwhile the crypto crowd runs amok, trading the hundreds of cyber coin versions that followed in the footsteps of Bitcoin. Stories of overnight zillionaires tempt many a new investor. Trading cyber coin is challenging. From talking with those that trade cyber coins, and in my limited experience, navigating the different exchanges that handle cyber coins are confusing and tricky. Probably a few experienced coin traders might tell a different story, but from most of what I hear, it is like the Wild West in the cyber coin arena.

In summary, the whole trading and investing climate seems a bit crazy right now. Wild speculation seems the order of the day, with IPO's, SPACS, cyber coin, and many more asset classes bouncing wildly. This insane action is likely reflecting the trillions in money sloshing around, most of it manufactured by the FEDs and other central bankers of the world to minimize the effect of CoVid and the subsequent economic damage it has caused.

I hope it all works out somehow, but I have to admit, I have my doubts





Recall Effort Targets Live Oak Council Member

LIVE OAK, CA (MPG) - Recently, a recall effort has been mounted against Live Oak City Councilmember J.R. Thiara, who has served on the Live Oak City Council since 2018.

Confirmed by Live Oak City Manager, Aaron Palmer, Mr. Thiara was served a Notice of Intention to Circulate Recall Petition at the Wednesday, November 17th Live Oak City Council Meeting during the public comment portion of the meeting.

The Notice of Intention to Circulate Recall Petition required 20 signatures and once served, Thiara would have 7 days to file his response with the Sutter County Office of Elections. Sutter County Registrar of Voters, Donna Johnston confirmed that once those were filed with the county, 25 percent of the registered voting population of the City of Live Oak would need to sign the petition within a 60-day time frame. If those signatures were successfully collected and verified by the office of Sutter County Elections, the matter would then go before the Live Oak City Council, which would have the obligation to call for a recall election. If they failed to do so, the responsibility to call for a recall election would then fall at the feet of the Sutter County Board of Supervisors

Thiara told the Appeal Democrat: "This process is an important constitutional right provided to every citizen," Thiara said. "I gladly welcome the opportunity to meet with, listen to, discuss, and address any comments or concerns that any citizen of Live Oak may have."

The grounds for this recall are as fol-Councilmember Thiara was investigated after the City received several complaints of Councilmember Thiara displaying abusive and erratic behavior towards employees and others. An outside attorney found that Councilmember Thiara had repeatedly engaged in bullying, threatening, and abusive behavior towards others and was subsequently banned from all City property, banned from contacting any City employees or contractors, was removed from all appointments to special committees and commissions, and is currently allowed only to attend City Council meetings. Councilmember Thiara has repeatedly refused to pass the City budget this year. He has ignored

the recommendations of staff, other Council Members, professionals in the municipal finance business, attorneys, and concerned citizens. Councilmember Thiara refuses to ask questions during open session meetings about the budget and has requested repeatedly to work behind closed doors to make changes to the budget. Councilmember Thiara has taken a budget that was proposed in May with an approximate \$700,000 surplus and has voted against Mello-Roos taxes and other assessments that has now resulted in close to a \$900,000 deficit, and has still not voted to pass the budget, leaving staff and City services in limbo since July 1. Councilmember Thiara's sole nomination and yes vote to replace an empty City Council seat was for an applicant who publicly stated his purpose was to disincorporate the City from the inside. Councilmember Thiara is abrasive towards other Councilmembers and members of staff and public in open Council meetings, often yelling at and belittling the people whom he disagrees with. Councilmember Thiara is regularly unprepared for meetings, having not studied the agenda material, and blames staff for his lack of preparation. Councilmember Thiara recently at a public celebration stated in support of a candidate for City Council that "we will have power and control over Live Oak". A Councilmember is here to serve the people, not to have "power and control" over the people have come together to take this action to remedy these misdeeds and prevent further damage to our City.

Supply Disruptions Hitting Home-Based Medical Care

WASHINGTON, DC (MPG) - The days of scrambling to secure toilet paper are over. But the pandemic is continuing to wreak havoc on supply chains. Pet food is in short supply. Restaurants are warning customers that their favorite meals may not be on the menu. Then there's the shortage of semiconductor chips, which has raised the price and curbed the availability of medical devices.

Waiting for a piece of medical equipment can be life-threatening. Our leaders must therefore make bolstering the medical supply chain a bigger priority. They can start by ensuring the companies that provide and service medical equipment are paid enough to compete for the scarce chips and raw materials that they and their patients need. Many of these companies care for homebound patients who rely on things like motorized wheelchairs, ventilators, and home oxygen. More than 63 million of these patients are covered by Medicare.

Pre-pandemic, Medicare's payment rates to home medical equipment providers were barely sufficient to keep them in business. In the last decade, some 35% of providers closed or stopped serving Medicare beneficiaries. The pandemic has exacerbated the challenges they face. Providers are waiting months to receive parts to repair things like power wheelchairs. Prices for some parts have shot up 30% since early 2020 due to limited supply.

Over the same time frame, the cost of steel for wheelchairs and hospital beds has jumped over 60%, while the cost of polycar-

tubing, nebulizers, canisters, oxygen, and PAP masks, has increased by 100%. Shipping container costs are partly to blame for these dramatic spikes. Since the pandemic began, the cost of these containers has risen over 1,200%. Then there's the chip shortage, which has disrupted production of everything from blood pressure monitors to remote-control hospital beds.

When the price of inputs rises in other industries, companies typically pass the increase on to consumers. But home medical equipment providers are bonate plastics, used for oxygen constrained by pre-determined Medicare pricing that doesn't account for today's costs. That leaves them to either stop taking on new patients or absorb the cost increases they're facing -- perhaps by curbing their workforces, shrinking their geographic service area, limiting the selection of products to meet individual's needs, reducing complimentary but essential services, and more. All those options diminish patient outcomes and access.


Congress and the administration must take action to ensure homecare remains viable and accessible for those who need it, now and into the future. That will require addressing the chip shortage. To his credit, President Biden is taking action to shore up America's supply lines. He's created task forces to identify bottlenecks and bring semiconductor chip manufacturing back to the United States.

In the meantime, Congress and the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services must make sure home medical equipment providers have the resources to compete for scarce technological inputs. That means raising payment rates. Medical device manufacturers should not be losing bidding wars over scarce electronic components to nonhealthcare providers, just because the latter have the ability to raise prices.

These devices save the health care system billions of dollars a year. It doesn't make financial sense to starve home medical equipment providers of funds. To survive, they must be paid an amount commensurate with their rising expenses.




