

# Mission Accomplished

GRIDLEY, CA (MPG) - In August, the community of Gridley was secretly invaded by a team of engineers and scientists, led by former NASA engineer and current YouTube sensation, Mark Rober.

The covert mission was two-fold. One: Rober and his crew intended to re-take the Guiness Book of World Records title for the World's Largest Elephant Toothpaste and Two: Give one of Robers biggest fans a birthday that he would never forget.

A little over a year ago, twelve year old Fletcher Rollinson was diagnosed with an extremely rare form of brain tumor called Pineal Parenchymal Tumor with Intermediate Differentiation or PPTID for short. Fletcher and his family uprooted their lives and moved closer to St. Jude's for his treatment, where mom Megan said, "We spent a lot of time in the hospital watching Mark Rober videos." Rober's YouTube channel, dedicated to fun, science and engineering based experiments, has millions of viewers worldwide. During her son's battle with the cancerous tumor, Megan reached out to Rober, asking if he'd be willing to contact Fletcher. "Absolutely" was Rober's response and the surprise video call between Rober and super-fan -Fletcher that followed would inspire Rober to dedicate a day of record breaking fun, literally, to the young man.

Rober vowed that if Fletcher made it to his next birthday, he would throw him "the most crazy birthday party ever." On Fletcher's birthday weekend August 22nd -23rd, wearing a Fletchers Army tee and sitting along a retaining wall along a driveway in Gridley, Rober says, "SO, here we are...6 months later."

But why Gridley? Rober happens to have ties to our little town in the way of a friendship with the Leishman family. Dale and Lynne Leishman had extended the use of their property to Rober if the need for space ever arose for something "BIG." Well, it had and for 5 days, the

Leishman property became ground zero for Rober's latest project. Dale volunteered the use of his equipment as crews of engineers, chemists and physicists worked in the heat and smoke to erect structures intended to shatter the current world record of the largest (and tallest) Elephant Toothpaste and merchandise a multi-barreled contraption that would trigger a dangerously explosive Devil's Toothpaste.

Between Leishman and his neighbors, the crew had

access to anything they needed for construction. Rober says, "The community that came together for this and

What is Elephant's Toothpaste? According to Rober, Elephant's Toothpaste is the result of an exothermic reaction of hydrogen peroxide and sodium iodine. For a dramatic visual effect, soap and food coloring are added to create a "foam" that explodes at a high rate of speed from whatever container houses it - in this instance, a 20 ft tall volcano shaped flask made of steel, lumber, hurricane glass and sealed with flex-seal tape and caulk. A push of a button would mix the chemicals that would hopefully secure the new record. Devil's Toothpaste could be considered

# **PG&E Provides** \$117,000 to North State **Food Banks**

NORTHERN CALIFORNIA, (MPG) - Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E) is providing \$675,000 to 37 food banks serving communities in PG&E's service area in Northern and Central California. This grant includes \$117,000 to five food banks serving 10 North State counties.

The funding will help the nonprofit food banks provide critical food support to residents coping with the impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic. The funding also assists area food banks in preparing to serve vulnerable community members during natural disasters and potential Public Safety Power Shutoffs (PSPS), which are intended to reduce the risk of major wildfires during severe weather.

Receiving grants are the North State Food Bank (Community Action Agency of Butte County) serving Butte, Colusa, Glenn, Plumas and Sierra counties; Dignity Health Collective Living serving Shasta County; Tehama County Gleaners; Trinity County Food Bank; and Gleaners Food Bank serving Yuba and Sutter counties.

"We know that many in our communities struggle with financial uncertainty and food insecurity, in some cases created or worsened by the global pandemic. These challenges can be even more difficult to cope with during emergencies. That's why we're supporting local food banks to help them meet critical food needs during disasters and power outages," said Carl Schoenhofer, senior manager of PG&E's North Valley division.

PG&E's grants take into account whether a food bank is located in a Tier 2 or Tier 3 High Fire-Threat District as designated by the California Public Utilities Commission. These areas are at elevated or extreme risk for wildfires. To promote equity among counties with higher need, grant amounts will take into account county poverty and unemployment levels, using the California Department of Social Services' formula.

In April 2020, PG&E announced it provided a \$150,000 charitable contribution to help the California Association of Food Banks establish the California Food Bank Rapid Response Fund. The fund provides critical funding for food banks to increase their capacity to purchase food and supplies and supplement their staffing. Customers in need of assistance can call 833-544-2374.

His documentary "Trump Card," an exposé of the socialism, corruption and 'gangsterization' that now defines the Democrat Party, will be released in early October this year.



Elephant's Toothpaste on steroids - a mixture of the same chemicals but at stronger concentrations resulting in a faster, more violent and ultimately more dangerous reaction.

The day before the big show, Rober gave the Gridley Herald an exclusive run-down of the events about to unfold. "I can't sleep, I'm so excited." Rober said. The YouTube star was flying the Rawlinson family out from Ohio under the guise of visiting their "cousins" walnut farm. The Leishman family would pose as the "cousins" while Rober disguised himself as the Gridley High School Bulldog to surprise a completely clueless Fletcher.

It went off without a hitch. After arriving to be surprised by a previously unknown bunch of extended family, Fletcher was shocked when the Bulldog Mascot removed its head to reveal Mark Rober beneath. This was the first time the two had met in person and Rober quickly whisked him away, the sequence of the "best 13th-birthday-ever" events set in motion.

Fletcher was treated to a party only a mind like Rober could concoct. 





# Printing Money Solves Economic Problems

solves economic problems how come we still have economic problems?

Our money supply, basically our currency the U.S. dollar, is handled by the Federal Reserve (Fed). One of their missions is to assist in the financial stability of the system any way it can. It has limits on what it can do, yet some argue it has exceeded those limits in recent

The savings and loan bailout in the 80's, the 1997 Long Term Capital Management rescue, the dot com crash combined with the Y2K scare, then 9/11, the 08 real estate crash and now CoVid 19, the reasons for Fed intervention can be argued on each occasion. Interestingly, each subsequent crisis has been bigger than the last, and therefore each intervention by the Fed has encompassed more and more money.

The Fed has a handful of tools it can use to try and juice the economy from what ails it. Those tools include lowering overnight interest rates (Fed Funds Rate) so financial institutions can borrow money cheaply. Lower overnight rates bleed over to consumer credit rates making overall borrowing costs cheaper. The Fed can also add funds to the Repurchase Agreement mechanism (REPO) which lubricates the conduit for corporate credit. The REPO market can and has frozen up during times of severe market stress. The Fed can buy Treasury and agency debt (called Quantitative Easing (QE). QE is often mentioned in the news as a major tool of the Fed. Increasing QE increases the U.S. government deficit. It is seldom argued the tools mentioned are outside of the Feds permitted actions.

Where the Feds cross into the proverbial grey area is in the purchasing of private debt (corporate bonds and bond funds) or outright loaning money to private for-profit companies. They may also, in conjunction with the treasury department or related government entity, be buying individual company stock or stock funds outright. Most analysts agree this would definitely be outside their scope of permitted actions.

Much of the money created by the Federal Reserve is funneled to the U.S. government directly for stimulus payments and programs, infrastructure and other projects and direct assistance to consumers.

I have always said if printing money hesitant to voice concerns over reining in the Fed's actions when Americans are in dire need of assistance.

It is interesting to note that the Feds obviously feels the tools it explicitly has is not enough if it is tip toeing around in the grey areas of its mandate.

The Fed could be said to have ventured off course in the recent bailouts starting even before the 08 housing crisis without much objection. The Fed governors may be of the opinion as long as the economic needs are great enough, the rules it operates under should and will be relaxed. After all, it has repeatedly dipped its proverbial toe into other areas of influence without much fanfare throughout the many economic crisis that have occurred in recent decades.

The real question may be does the main tool of the Fed, which is manufacturing paper currency (the U.S. dollar) to throw wherever needed, really solve a crisis or is it just "papering over a symptom" of a much greater problem?

Since the bailouts are getting larger and larger with each crisis, are they using permanent solutions or are they just pushing the day of reckoning (if there is one) further out into the future?

If the next crisis is even larger, when it comes, can the same tools be used again and again without ramifications?

Experts disagree on the answer to this question but a major concern is inflation raising its ugly head sometime in the near or far future due to the massive increase in the money supply from all the bailouts.

Other countries throughout civilization who have tried monetary creation to permanently solve economic crisis have not come out unscathed. The ramifications have run the gamut to moderate inflation, creeping stagflation (economic stagnation coupled with inflation) or a complete currency collapse.

# Home Invaders: Prop 15 and 19

money. If a voter believed he had to pay off the bond himself, no revenue measure would ever pass. However, the massive nature of government, hundreds of thousands of employees and trillions of dollars in budgets obscure what is really happening to most citizens.

So, the Attorney General (AG) deceives the voters with a fraudulent ballot description of the purpose of the bond request and the citizen ignorantly votes to unlock the door for the home invaders. AG Xavier Becerra, a liar with a license, calls Prop 15 "Schools and Communities First." Your representatives are suit-wearing blood-suckers.

The survival defense is to vote against all revenue authorizing measures. The problem is not that there are too few taxes being paid. It is that most of the money is wasted. horribly managed, lost, and given as political pay-offs to unions.

The November 3rd ballot features Proposition 15 (one of thirteen statewide propositions) which will begin undoing 1978's Prop 13 tax protection for business property. Prop 15 will raise property taxes on nearly every enterprise not once, but over and over again whether they own the real estate or not. Remember, corporations, buildings and dirt do not pay taxes, people do. And those increased expenses are paid by owners and passed on to renters, lessors and finally consumers.

If passed, commercial and industrial properties would be reassessed to current market value every three years. Because Prop 13 limited annual increases in assessed values to 2% until there is a change in ownership, the owners of long-held properties will see immediate massive tax increases. Prop 15's passage would affect nearly every business where Californians are employees or customers.

Residential and ag property are exempt but ag processing facilities would be reassessed. Prop 15 would trigger higher prices and job losses as tax increases put more pressure on already struggling employers.

The California Assessors Association has taken a negative stance on Prop 15 saying it would be "impossible" to implement as written. It is too complicated to sort out exemptions, implementing costs are exorbitant and trained assessor personnel are not available to reassess all the properties

Prop 15 is step one to eventually undo Every election government wants more Prop 13 entirely by also eliminating residential protections and raising all property taxes. Ending Prop 13 will force millions of citizens from their homes and businesses.

Another State Capitol Scam is Prop 19. AG "The Liar" Becerra says the new money will go to Wildfire Agencies. How convenient. It takes away two important taxpayer protections for a billion dollar tax increase according to Howard Jarvis Taxpayers Association (HJTA). Prop 19 nullifies Prop 58, the 1986 measure that allows parents to transfer a home and other property to their children without the property being reassessed to market value.

Prop 58 protected the extended family from extreme tax increases when property is transferred. Prop 19's passage means family members would receive a new tax bill for 1% of the property's current market value. Families could avoid the measure's requirements if the inheriting children moved into the home as their personal residence within a year. That could be complicated and unreasonable for many beneficiaries.

If a quick move isn't possible, Prop 19's costs would force many families to sell the property to satisfy the government's tax bill. Prop 58 was approved by 75.7% of voters to protect families but Prop 19 would hurt them.

Prop 19 also voids another protection created by Prop 193 preventing reassessment of properties transferred between grandparents and grandchildren in the event the children's parents are deceased.

Legislators tossed in a bit of 'candy' to get the voters into their Prop 19 van. Prop 60 and 90 allows homeowners age 55 and older to transfer their 'Prop 13' tax assessment to a home of equal or lesser value in the same county or one that accepts the transfers. Proper 19 'candy' permits three transfers versus just one.

Socialist legislators have a fundamental issue with parents keeping the wealth that they have earned, payed taxes on and now want to use to help their children with an inheritance. The brown shirts really believe the state owns your property and the state deserves those assets when you die to give to others who do not or will not work.





#### **Full Accounting of Fire Losses** Will Take Some Time

Timber, grazing and ranch lands appear to have borne the brunt of the agricultural impact so far from California's destructive wildfires. A Cal Fire information officer says damage-assessment teams have begun their work, and county agricultural commissioners say a full accounting of the losses could take weeks or months. Smoke from the fires also threatens winegrapes, which can absorb chemicals that produce an off-taste in wine.

#### Farm Bureau Coalition Supports Wildfire Bill

A wildfire-mitigation bill goes before a U.S. Senate subcommittee Wednesday, and a coalition of Western state Farm Bureaus says the measure would help the region address its "catastrophic wildfire crisis." Thirteen state Farm Bureaus and the American Farm Bureau express support for the bill, the Emergency Wildfire and Public Safety Act. It would implement projects to manage forests, remove hazardous fuels and accelerate post-fire restoration and reforestation.

#### Farmers Say They've Hopeful **About Rice Crop**

Rice harvest will gain momentum in the Sacramento Valley this week. Rice farmers and marketers say they're optimistic about the crop and its prospects, though they say the pandemic has created an unusual marketing situation. In the early days of the pandemic, Americans stocked up on rice and other staple foods. That trend has eased, and demand from restaurants and other food service businesses remains low, but most export markets for the crop look promising.

#### **Produce Business Responds To Pandemic Disruptions**

The fresh-produce business has shown resilience in response to pandemicrelated swings in demand, according to a University of California professor. UC Davis assistant professor Kristin Kiesel says the pandemic caused "astonishing disruptions" to the produce business, especially as sales to restaurants and other institutions mostly evaporated. She says the overall produce business is now operating at about 20% below pre-pandemic projections..

# Robots, Veterans, Apprenticeships: What's Next for California's Job Market

It's just one facet of California's economic recovery, but the state's unemployment rate is starting to drop after an unprecedented spike during coronavirus lockdowns.

The state's jobless rate fell to 11.4% in August, the Bureau of Labor Statistics reported today, down from a record 16.4% unemployment this spring. The unemployment rate has dipped below the rate of the Great Recession a decade ago but remains more than twice the 3.9% rate in February.

The unemployment data is good news for California workers who have had to make do picking up side gigs, liquidating retirement accounts, skipping rent or meals without new economic stimulus measures from the state or federal government. Yet more than 2.5 million people remain out of work in the nation's most expensive state.

A turbulent job market also raises bigger questions about the future of work in the state. Beyond monthly employment ups and downs, how many workers are still being shut out Development Corporation; and of increasingly tech-centric highpaying jobs? Also not to be overlooked, Kim said, are small- and midsized businesses. In Los Angeles County, for instance, more than 90% of employers are small businesses, she said, and "we can't take the paradigms that work for our industrial and manufacturing economy."

#### **Turn Weaknesses Into Strength**

For many economists, variables like high veteran homelessness, a "silver tsunami" of baby boomer retirements and California's profound lack of affordable housing would be big negatives for the state's labor market. But there are efforts afoot to reinforce weak spots with new job initiatives.

Northrup Grumman is experimenting with a job transfer program for veterans coming out of the military, who often already have the high security clearances that defense contractors need.

In government, Snay said many positions are poised to open in public transportation, building affordable housing and retrofitting hotels for homeless housing, which could benefit both younger workers and people who were formerly homeless themselves.

"There are many opportunities at the state level and, more importantly, at the local level," she said.

Housing, for one, was a welcome suggestion: "Yes," Kim responded. "Please build."

# High Housing Costs Keep Californians Poor

Congratulations California, you've done it again.

The Census Bureau has once again found that California has the highest real-world poverty rate of any state, 17.2% over the previous three years and much higher than the national rate.

The "supplemental" poverty rate includes factors ignored by the outdated "official" poverty rate, such as living costs. And our skyhigh living costs, particularly for housing, impoverish at least 7 million Californians.

We topped the poverty charts even as California's overall economy was booming in the 2017-19 period. The state now is mired in its worst recession since the Great Depression, thanks to the COVID-19 pandemic, and poverty has surely increased.

A new report from the California Policy Lab at the University of California reveals that in August nearly 20% of California's workers were drawing unemployment insurance benefits, calling it "startlingly high."

Moreover, even before recession struck, the Public Policy Institute of California, using methodology similar to that of the Census Bureau, had calculated that as high as our "supplemental poverty

rate" may be, roughly the same number of Californians are in "near-poverty." Combining the two categories means that about a third of the state's residents are struggling to keep their heads above water.

The major driver of California's high poverty indices is, as mentioned earlier, that too many Californians must spend too much of their incomes on housing due to meager construction.

The reasons for the failure to meet housing demand are many but one long-ignored factor - the insanely high cost of building so-called "affordable" housing - is beginning to be recognized.

Last year, I wrote about a \$28 million city-financed project to rehabilitate 74 dilapidated, low-rent apartments in Sacramento and noted that it worked out to \$378,000 per unit, markedly higher than the median cost of a detached, single-family home in Sacramento at the

Last week, two more examples found their way into print.

The Los Angeles Times did a deep dive into the tortured history of a low-income housing project in Solana Beach, a wealthy seaside community in San Diego County. Times reporters found that it originally was to cost \$414,000 per unit, but by the time the developer pulled out after a decade of trying to line up financing and permits, it had exploded to \$1.1 million.

The Times called it "an alarming example of how political, economic and bureaucratic forces have converged to drive up the cost of such housing at a time when growing numbers of Californians need it."

"California leads the nation in the cost of building government-subsidized apartment complexes for low-income residents," the Times said, reporting that its "analysis of state data found that apartments cost an average of about \$500,000. In the last decade, the price tag has grown 26%, after adjusting for inflation."

Solana Beach is not alone. The Times reported that in Alameda, an island community in San Francisco Bay. a low-income development called Everett Commons cost \$947,000 per unit.

Meanwhile, back in Sacramento, city housing officials are still spending too much to get too little. The Sacramento Bee reported that redeveloping the downtown Capitol Park Hotel into tiny, 250-square-foot units for low-income residents costs more than \$445,000 per unit, higher than the median price for a detached single-family home. At \$1,100 per square foot of living space, it is double what a luxury suburban home would cost.

These are outrageous numbers, driven by bureaucratic tangles, misplaced environmental restrictions and high mandated labor costs, and unless state officials do something about them, we will never solve our housing shortage and we will continue to have shamefully high rates of poverty.

'Ivermectin can kill COVID-19 within 48 hours', Monash University study finds 21 April 2020 | A collaborative study led by Australia's Monash Biomedicine Discovery Institute (BDI) with the Peter Doherty Institute of Infection and Immunity (Doherty Institute), a joint venture of the University of Melbourne and Royal Melbourne Hospital, has shown that an anti-parasitic drug already available around the world kills the virus within 48 hours. The Monash Biomedicine Discovery Institute's Dr Kylie Wagstaff, who led the study, said the scientists showed that the drug, ivermectin, stopped the SARS-CoV-2 virus growing in cell culture within 48 hours. "We found that even a single dose could essentially remove all viral RNA by 48 hours and that even at 24 hours there was a really significant reduction in it," Dr Wagstaff said. "Ivermectin is very widely used and seen as a safe drug. We need to figure out now whether the dosage you can use it at in humans will be effective – that's the next step," Dr Wagstaff noted.
