**Closed Again?**

**SUTTER COUNTY, CA (MPG)** - Sutter County was placed on the State of California's County monitoring list late Thursday and Yuba County will follow on Saturday, July 11. Bi-County Health Officer Dr. Phuong Luu Friday issued an amended local Public Health Order to align with these new State mandates. Both counties will remain on the monitoring list for three days for the State to see if metrics change in that time. Public Health officials do not expect that either county will be taken off the list during those three days. After the three-day waiting period, on Sunday, July 12, designated businesses will be state-mandated to alter their operations: bars and brewpubs, must close. Restaurants, card rooms, wineries/

tasting rooms, family entertainment centers, movie theaters, zoos/museums, and card rooms must close their indoor operations - outdoor operations are still allowed. The State will look at Yuba-Sutter's numbers continually during the next three weeks. If it sees improvement to the point that Yuba-Sutter is meeting all the State's metrics again, the counties will be removed and can phase back in the operations. If Yuba-Sutter continues to exceed the State metrics, the counties will remain on the State monitoring list until improvement. Metrics to be put onto County monitoring list include having greater than 100 cases per 100,000 people population in a 14-day period and less than 20 percent ICU beds available. "This is an unfortunate step back in

the progress Yuba-Sutter was making in re-opening the community," Yuba-Sutter Health Officer Dr. Phuong Luu said. "I hope residents will take this time to really practice the safety precautions we all know while at home and when they go out. The only way we can get through this is by working together to stay healthy." Local contact investigations show that 50 percent of cases are linked to social gatherings, 5 percent of infections originate from workplace outbreaks, and another 5 percent of infections originate from travel. A staggering 40 percent of cases are of unclear origin. This means Public Health officials cannot say whether someone became infected at a business or elsewhere. These cases are unclear because either contact tracers

**Human Trafficking Victims Qualify for Income Loss**

**California Victim  
Compensation Board  
News Release**

**SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG)** - Human trafficking victims in California can now qualify for up to \$20,000 in income loss paid through the California Victim Compensation Board. Signed by Governor Gavin Newsom, Assembly Bill 629 (Smith and Gonzalez) went into effect on January 1, 2020, making human trafficking victims eligible for up to \$10,000 of income loss per year, for up to two years. The bill required the Board, on or before July 1, 2020, to adopt regulations that allow it to rely on evidence other than official employment documentation in considering and approving applications for compensation. The Board adopted the regulations in May. The Office of Administrative Law approved the final regulations, ahead of the July 1 deadline. "It's clear the trauma of human trafficking extends far beyond the time having been trafficked - survivors often have faced homelessness, addiction and

mental health issues stemming from their exploitation," Assemblywoman Christy Smith said. "My bill with Assemblywoman Gonzalez removes a loophole in the victim compensation system that required survivors to obtain a note from their employer - often times this was their trafficker. The regulations adopted remove these barriers to justice and provide critical support for victims

rebuilding their lives." "Survivors of human trafficking face unimaginable obstacles when they work to put their lives back on track. They are typically on their own and have to figure out how they will pay for housing and food, apply for work, and get treatment for medical and mental health," Assemblywoman Lorena Gonzalez said. "Most human trafficking survivors

don't have the formal documentation CalVCB had previously required to collect lost income, such as a W-2 form. CalVCB's new rules, now in effect thanks to our legislation AB 629, are a just and fair way to help survivors get back on their feet and get the help they need. "CalVCB recognizes the challenges human trafficking victims face as they work to

**Newsom  
Is Out Of  
Control**

**SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG)** - Governor Gavin Newsom ordered small businesses across the state to close indoor operations including restaurants, wineries, movie theaters, family entertainment centers, zoos, museums, cardrooms and bars. The Governor also shutdown indoor operations in counties on "County Monitoring List for 3 Days" such as salons, barbershops, gyms/fitness centers and malls. In their continuing effort to advocate for employers and workers, Northstate lawmakers Rep. Doug LaMalfa (R-Richvale), Senator Jim Nielsen (R-Tehama), Senator Brian Dahle (R-Bieber), Assemblyman James Gallagher (R-Yuba City) and Assemblywoman Megan Dahle (R-Bieber) issued the following statement: "Let's be clear: It is imperative that we all do our part by practicing social distancing and acting responsibly in order to suppress this virus and protect our community. "But these efforts are undermined when the Governor is single handedly and arbitrarily crushing people's livelihoods - their ability to put food on the table, to pay rent and to pay their bills. "There is no justification for this approach. There is no evidence that any of these activities are causing an increase in Covid-19 cases. "Restaurants and churches are not the source of our increase in cases. Small businesses are hanging by a thread and this action puts all the burden of this crisis back upon them. Main Street is struggling for its very life, while Lowe's and Home Depot are packed with people and having record years. No one can make any sense of these confusing orders. "Businesses have NOT been the direct cause, they've done everything they've been asked to do successfully. These shutdown orders punish them, their customers and it completely misses the target, especially in our rural towns. "It's painful to watch the Governor constantly change his mind if counties can govern themselves or not during this pandemic. It's even more painful being forced to sit on the sidelines as the California Legislature has handed over all authority to one man. "Keep in mind that 7.5 million Californians are

rebuild their lives," said Executive Officer Lynda Gledhill. "By providing financial support, along with options for medical and mental health treatment and other compensation, CalVCB is able to play a small part in victims' recovery."

As with all claims, victims will need to provide CalVCB with evidence of a crime, including, but not limited to, a statement under penalty of perjury from the applicant, a caseworker, a licensed attorney or a witness, or a law enforcement report. Victims brought from other countries and trafficked in California may also qualify. Before AB 629 became law, victims could only prove income loss with formal employment documentation or voluntary cooperation from their traffickers, meaning most could not qualify.

AB 629 became law on January 1, 2020, allowing victims to submit income loss applications, even as CalVCB drafted the required regulations. In the months that followed, CalVCB has approved five income loss claims and compensated those survivors more than \$70,000.

Victims, advocates, representatives, and attorneys can apply for compensation in several ways:

Create an application using CalVCB Online - a secure and private portal that can

be easily accessed from a smartphone, tablet or computer; Contact a local county Victim Witness Assistance Center; Call the CalVCB Help Line at (800) 777-9229; Download an application from CalVCB's How to Apply page; E-mail CalVCB at [info@victims.ca.gov](mailto:info@victims.ca.gov).

Victims must apply within seven years of the date of the crime. Minor victims must apply by their 28th birthday. CalVCB will release funds for minor victims after their 18th birthday.

If you are a victim of human trafficking, or you suspect someone you know is being trafficked, there are a number of local, national and international organizations that offer and provide help and services, including temporary shelter, legal assistance and medical and mental health treatment.

The California Victim Compensation Board (CalVCB) provides reimbursement for crime-related expenses to victims who suffer physical injury or the threat of physical injury as a result of violent crime. CalVCB helps crime victims and their families cover unforeseen expenses such as medical bills, mental health treatment, funeral and burial expenses, income loss and more. ## Man Sentenced to Prison for Sex Trafficking and Distribution of Methamphetamine to a Minor

Department of Justice and the Office of the United States Attorney - East District of California

**SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG)** - On Monday, July 6th 2020, Christopher Ramonaguilar Lawrence, 25, of Chico, was sentenced to 14 years in prison for sex trafficking of a minor and distribution of methamphetamine to a person under 21, U.S. Attorney McGregor W. Scott announced.

According to court documents and evidence presented at trial, July and August 2017, Lawrence recruited a then 17-year-old girl to engage in prostitution for his financial benefit. Lawrence used social media to communicate with the victim, and on two occasions, he lured the victim to Chico motel rooms where he gave the victim methamphetamine, explained the methods of his prostitution business, including how to detect and evade law enforcement, and continued to recruit the victim to work for him as a prostitute. After a seven-day trial, a federal jury found Lawrence guilty on August 29, 2019.

"Sex trafficking can occur in any community, and it is an exploitive, abusive crime that treats human beings as mere commodities to be bought and sold," said Special Agent in Charge Sean Ragan of the FBI Sacramento Field Office. "Our agents work closely with our local, state, and federal partners to identify

individuals who are trafficking minors and adults for financial gain to disrupt this activity in the communities we serve. Today, as a result of our partnership with the Chico Police Department and Butte County Sheriff's Office, an exploiter who entrapped his victim in a cycle of abuse and addiction will pay the penalty for his crimes, and those he exploited can take another step towards healing."

This case was the product of an investigation by the Federal Bureau of Investigation, the Chico Police Department, and the Butte County Sheriff's Office. Assistant U.S. Attorneys Brian A. Fogerty and Quinn Hochhalter prosecuted the case.

This case was brought as part of Project Safe Childhood, a nationwide initiative launched in May 2006 by the Department of Justice to combat the growing epidemic of child sexual exploitation and abuse. Led by the United States Attorney's Offices and the Criminal Division's Child Exploitation and Obscenity Section, Project Safe Childhood marshals federal, state, and local resources to locate, apprehend, and prosecute those who sexually exploit children, and to identify and rescue victims. # Preparing for the Feather River Temple

**YUBA CITY, CA (MPG)** - The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints has recently announced that the ground breaking ceremony for its first temple in California north of Sacramento will be held July 18th, 2020.

Plans for the 8th LDS temple in California were announced in October of 2018 by church President, Russel M. Nelson, but the exact location was not made known until fall of 2019. The 38,000 square foot temple will be located at 1470 Butte House Road in Yuba City, the site of the former Stake Center.

Demolition of the Stake Center and the clearing of the 9.4 acre area has already begun. The parcel that housed the Stake Center, along with a neighboring parcel acquired from the City will be the home to the new temple, a new Stake Center/meeting house and also, a distribution

center. The temple itself will be quite large – nearly double the size Sacramento’s 19,500 sq. ft total floor area.

Church members are ecstatic over the news of the coming Feather River California temple. Previously, members were required to travel to either Sacramento or Oakland to visit and work. Other LDS temples are located even further south: Fresno, Redlands, Los Angeles, San Diego, Newport Beach. With a strong LDS population in the North State and multiple stakes north of Sacramento area, it will no doubt be highly utilized. Sacramento currently serves 22 “stakes”, composed of multiple congregations, in Northern California.

The groundbreaking will be by invitation only due to the current COVID19 crisis. Elder Scott D. Whiting of the North America West Presidency will preside. Further details about the groundbreaking will be announced as the date nears. ★

# Corona Con Illegal

Yuba-Sutter's current Corona order to again close selected businesses is arbitrary, unscientific and a violation of the owners' Constitutional rights. The threat of force without due process is unbridled discretion.

Where is the science or the reason that sitting in a church or Steele House Coffee is more risky than being at WalMart or the Casino? There is none! Government can crush the 'small guy' so it does.

According to Constitutional attorney Kris Anne Hall the government's decision to say which businesses can be open or close is "tantamount to regulatory taking." No warrant was issued to take the property and no means noted for the owner to challenge the taking of the business. The owner is effectively deprived of the economic value and use of the property.

Whenever government takes private property for public benefit both the state and US Constitutions require that the business receive due process consideration followed by just compensation equaling fair market value for that property.

Salem, Oregon Glamour Salon owner Lindsey Graham filed a federal lawsuit against her county and the Governor last week for violating her rights. "Before the Governor takes away my client's ability to take care of her family and to earn a paycheck, we think that we should get some opportunity to do it safely," said Ross Day, attorney representing Graham.

Day claims the state violated Graham's right to due process under the 14th Amendment. The government unleashed the alphabet soup of agencies on Graham including labor relations, cosmetology, occupational safety, even child protective services and nearly \$20,000 in fines.

Graham just wanted to work in spite of government abuse. Now, she is taking the offensive.

Last week in Marysville, CA the government's case against Upper Cuts Barber Shop owner Randy Mitchell was dropped. He refused to close his shop. In addition, Mitchell notified the state that he no longer recognizes it as a licensing authority over his business. Yuba County District Attorney Clint Curry had threatened to cut-off power and water to Upper Cuts until Mitchell closed.

Mercedes Brockman and Shenise Evans, co-owners of Beyond Appearance Salon, Spa and Stylique in Marysville also stayed open so far without penalty. Most businesses are conditioned via over-regulation to be afraid of the government and/or do not know their rights. Most all are closing and will likely go broke.

The government is also being arbitrary when deciding that the only "legal" assembly is 10 people or less. The right to assembly is denied when permission is needed under certain limited and confining terms to peaceably assemble. One of the most essential reasons for the right to assemble is that the assembly offers the opportunity to petition the government for a redress of grievances. It is a despotic government that can conduct unjust and

unconstitutional actions and then also possess the power to set the limits and parameters upon which the people can protest those laws.

The same is true with freedom of religion. When government can tell people when, where, and how many can "legally" meet, that government is defining religion, and that is antithetical to everything that America is founded upon. Even worse, shelter-in-place orders not only do all of that, but many have also determined that the definition of freedom of religion can be relegated and confined to an 'online meeting' and further that all those who are unable to meet this condition are simply denied their right to worship and threatened by force of government to have no assembly whatsoever.

Attorney Hall says, America's founders pledged their lives, fortunes, and sacred honor to throw off the very actions of government we are experiencing today. James Otis Jr., a lawyer whom the founders called the "midwife to liberty," waged a valiant legal battle against the laws of Parliament that attempted to authorize what our governors, supervisors, city councils, and mayors are doing today. He referred to the tyrannical overreach as "the worst instrument of arbitrary power, the most destructive of English liberty and the fundamental principles of law that ever was found in an English law-book."

It's time to resist and keep your business open.

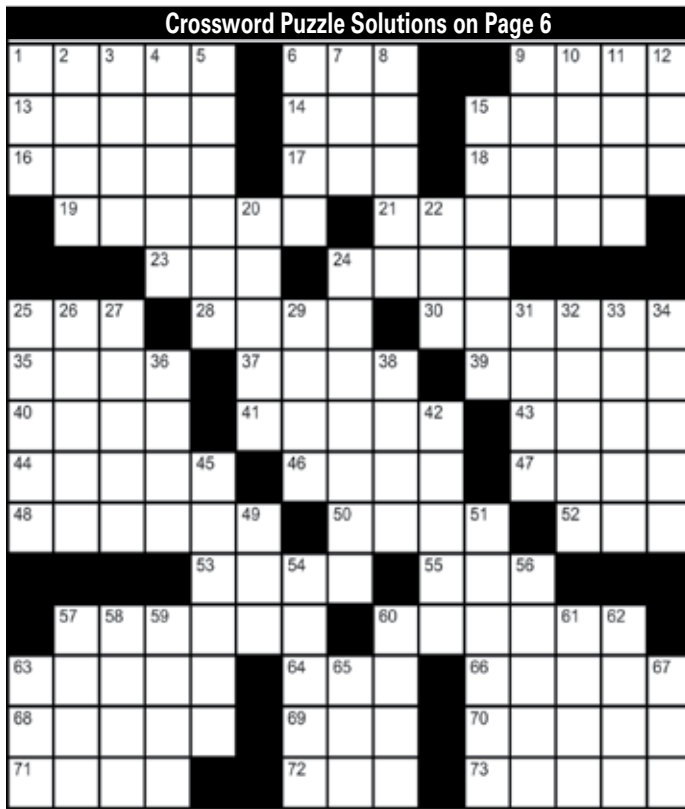

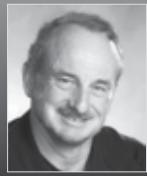

## The Dow Jones Industrial Average Continues To Baffle Many Investors

The Dow Jones Industrial Average (DJIA) continues to baffle many investors and analysts alike with its apparent decoupling from the American Economy. Off its March lows of mid 18,000 level. It stands pushing once again above the 26,000 mark. Its post CoVid correction high was a hair above 27,200 June 8th. Technology shares represent a good amount of the gains with the tech heavy Nasdaq (QQQ) already above its all-time highs. Yes, you read that right. The Nasdaq is already higher than it was pre CoVid. Analysts attribute this index's stunning move to the heavy make-up of the many technology companies in it.

Making matters worse, the tension among Americans is palatable. Racial issues, the mask debate, the very controversial upcoming Presidential elections and continuing economic inequality is adding even more stress to a populace that is probably wondering what else could go wrong.

The reasons for the recent surge of CoVid is also being hotly debated turning up the heat even farther. Some claim the mass gatherings of protestors is to blame while others blame a premature opening of shutdown restrictions helped spread the virus. Citizens are taking what seems to be extreme polar opposite positions on the mask- no mask debate, with many blaming the "anti-maskers" are at fault for the recent spread while that group insists not wearing them is an essential freedom.

In the markets, gold is reacting by assaulting a multiyear high. Gold is often bought in times of economic stress and political uncertainty.

In other news, the Trump tax reforms which reduced taxes on various companies and individuals were originally thought to reduce charitable donations due to the rework in the tax law which affected the ability to deduct contributions. Not so says Giving USA in a report that claimed Americans contributed a record 450 billion to charitable organizations last year.

Way to go America.

Economic recovery forecasters run the gamut in their prognostications of just how long we will have to wait to see things return to some semblance of normalcy. Jim Rickards of the "5" Minute Forecaster reports recent statistics bring 2023 into hopeful focus while worst case scenarios (which might get worse still should CoVid stubbornly hang around longer than expected) puts the recovery well into 2025.

Giddy investors meanwhile are coming out of the woodwork to bid up the share prices of bankrupt company stocks, and yes, public companies stock can continue to trade while the bankruptcy makes its way through the court system. The day trader has also returned in healthy numbers, usually leaning into not only the bankrupt companies in search of quick profits, but buying up the most badly beaten down stocks. These are the companies that were most affected by CoVid, such as cruise lines, airlines, restaurants and the hotel/motel chains. Fast profits and portfolio implosions usually go back and forth for such novice traders.

Despite the markets historic and head scratching run, a record amount of cash sits in investor broker accounts says Zach Scheidt of the "5". He goes onto give his opinion that this is the reason he believes the markets will run higher. Cash seeks a place to go, or better said, has a tendency to burn holes in investors pockets. If markets continue to run, investors may have the itch to put large amounts of cash to work as the greed DNA twists and turns in anticipation of higher markets.

All in all, its been quite a period for the markets and indeed most every person on the planet as a result of the Corona virus event. Where we go from here is anyone's guess.

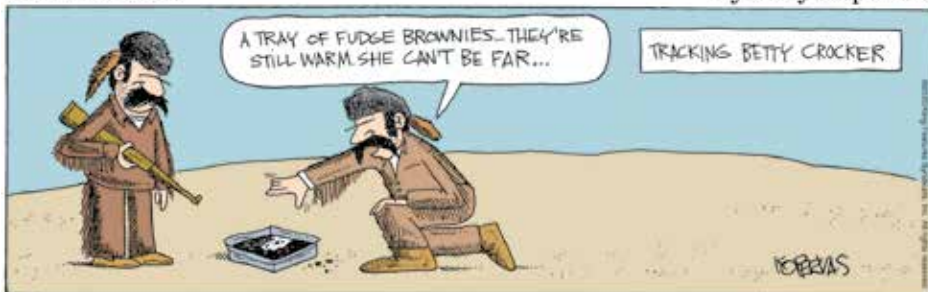

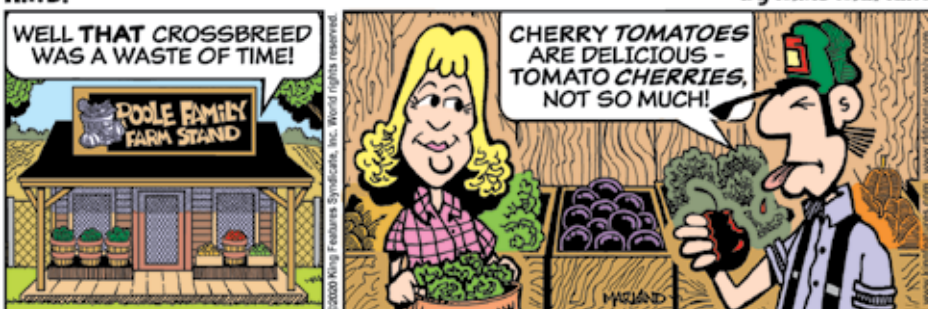

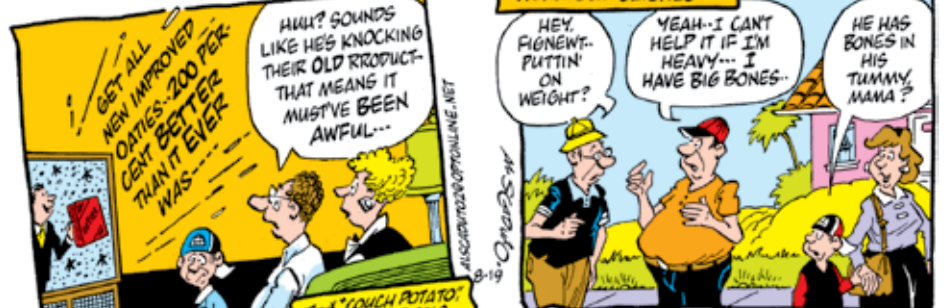

## Food & Farm News

### UC Riverside Announces Treatment for Citrus Disease

After a five-year search, scientists at the University of California, Riverside, say they have found a naturally occurring product that controls the fatal citrus disease HLB or citrus greening. The disease has devastated citrus in some regions and has so far been confined to residential trees in California. UC Riverside said Tuesday geneticist Hailing Jin found the peptide while studying plants that resist the disease.

### Grazing Cattle Reduce Wildfire Fuel

In reducing wildfire risk, cattle grazing represents an important tool, according to a study prepared by University of California specialists and a private consultant. The study says grazing cattle removed an average of 650 pounds per acre of potential fire fuel. Saying additional research could pinpoint target levels of fuel reduction, the study recommends grazing in areas of high fire severity and risk of fire ignition.

### Water Availability Drives Farmland Values

As the pandemic sends shock waves through the agricultural economy, the long-term driver of California farmland values remains access to reliable water supplies. Speakers at an online agricultural business conference said local agencies face a "daunting task" of balancing water supplies with demand. Agencies will work to increase supplies and will likely employ solutions that include land idling and water markets.

### Pandemic Brings Lingering Changes for Dairies

Americans' shopping and eating behaviors will likely be altered for the next 12 to 18 months as a result of the pandemic, and a new analysis says dairy supply chains will need to adjust. The cooperative lender CoBank says people have bought more fluid milk and processed cheese during the pandemic. With stay-at-home orders affecting restaurant demand, the report says, some dairy processors will need to retool to make products for at-home consumption. ★

cannot get ahold of the infected person, the infected person does not remember where they have been or the infected person is not forthcoming with contact tracers.

Adventist Health-Rideout issued a heartfelt letter to the community urging residents to do their part in keeping themselves and others healthy.

“We can choose to reduce the risk of this illness – which results in hospitalizations, breathing tubes, prolonged recovery, lasting deficits, and deaths of our family members and neighbors,” the open letter reads. “We can accept this as our collective responsibility to each other. By reducing the transmission and the impact of this disease, our community will benefit from an open, thriving economy and continuation of its recovery efforts.”

Leaders of other local healthcare facilities have also lent their voice to support a communitywide effort to change the path Yuba-Sutter is currently on.

“We need to be careful to not let our guard down in areas such as wearing facial

coverings and social distancing in order to keep everyone safe,” Chief Clinical Services Officer of Ampla Health Cindy Snelgrove said. “There is scientific data that reveals these measures truly do help. I do not view these measures are to impose on anyone’s constitutional rights. Instead, as a nurse, I believe this is a public health issue and we need to count on each other to do their part in protecting our public’s health.”

“We have been collaborating with Dr. Luu since the beginning of the pandemic. I have come to know her as a physician well trained in public health, a leader in the medical community and a person deeply concerned about our community” Peach Tree Chief Medical Officer Dr. Richard Fury said. “Recently, there has been a sharp increase in the number of covid-19 cases and hospitalizations in the bi-county area. To help prevent significant worsening, as has occurred in several communities in California and around the country, I fully support Dr. Luu and her order.”

The Yuba County Development Review Committee (DRC) will consider the following:

**Tentative Parcel Map TPM 2020-0003 and Conditional Use Permit CUP2020-0001** (Murry): The applicant is requesting to subdivide a 0.52 acre parcel into two parcels – Parcel 1 will be approximately 0.21 Acres and Parcel 2 will be approximately 0.23 acres. The applicant is also requesting a Minor Conditional Use Permit to add a 2,533 square foot duplex, with each unit 1,261 square feet in size, on each parcel. The project site is located at 4789 Fleming Way in the community of Olivehurst. The 2030 General Plan designates the land use as Valley Neighborhood and the zoning is Single Family Residential, (RS).

A determination has been made that the above referenced projects are exempt or categorically exempt from environmental review pursuant to the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) Section 15315 (Minor Land Division).

Any person wishing to testify on the above projects may attend the Development Review Committee by teleconference via **Go To Meeting** at the prescribed time, or may submit written comments or objections to the Community Development and Services Agency at 915 8th Street, Suite 123, Marysville, CA 95901, prior to the hearing. If the Board of Supervisors is the final Approving Authority, or if the project is appealed to the Board, the Board’s action is final.

## Partnership Preserves Vital Stream Reach for Sacramento River Salmon and Steelhead

**RED BLUFF, CA (MPG)** - On the flanks of Mount Lassen, Western Rivers Conservancy and the Lassen National Forest (LNF) protected a crucial 1,150-acre property, and a significant branch of South Fork Antelope Creek, a rare stronghold for salmon and steelhead in the Sacramento River system.

Although there were concerns that COVID-19 might delay the project, the partners were able to complete it working remotely, adding to the sense of accomplishment and relief for both sides.

The property includes 2.5 miles of South Fork Antelope Creek and its critically important spawning and rearing habitat for spring Chinook, fall Chinook, and winter steelhead. Both the spring Chinook and winter steelhead are listed as Threatened under the Endangered Species Act.

“South Fork Antelope Creek is a top-tier nursery for wild salmon and steelhead, and this effort will help keep it that way,” said Josh Kling, Conservation Director for Western Rivers Conservancy. “Even amidst a global pandemic, we’ve notched a crucial victory for Sacramento River salmon and steelhead, not to mention the rich array of wildlife that rely on this area.”

South Fork Antelope Creek flows crystal clear from the heights of Mount Lassen to Antelope Creek, which joins the Sacramento River near Red Bluff. Antelope Creek is one of only six streams that compose the Sacramento Salmon Stronghold, a suite of healthy tributary streams that contain the best remaining spawning and rearing habitat

for the Sacramento’s surviving salmon and steelhead.

Located on the western side of the LNF, the newly conserved property features old-growth ponderosa pine and incense cedar, which tower over South Fork Antelope Creek within a deep, shaded canyon. Above the canyon bottom, live oak savanna gives way to healthy grasslands that support important herds of migratory Tehama black-tailed deer and other species.

“Conserving this property was a top priority, because it contains some of the greatest biodiversity in the entire National Forest,” said Deb Bumpus, Forest Supervisor, LNF. “Now this diverse terrain is permanently protected and open for public recreational access as well as a critical reach of South Fork Antelope Creek will continue to give new life to surviving native fish runs.”

As a testament to the property’s superb habitat, OR-7, California’s first documented wolf in decades, recently spent an entire winter on the property. Combined with the Tehama Wildlife Area downstream, the property provides a critical home for mountain lion, black bear, bald eagle, golden eagle, prairie falcon, peregrine falcon, and western pond turtle.

In addition to its benefits for fish and wildlife, the project presents the opportunity to extend a hiking trail from the Tehama Wildlife Area, which would improve access for hikers, equestrians, and kayakers to explore this rugged and scenic area.

This effort was made possible through the Land and Water Conservation Fund, with funding set aside in 2013 to conserve important landscapes within the LNF for fish and wildlife. Funded primarily

by federal revenues from offshore oil and gas development, the Land and Water Conservation Fund (LWCF) was created by Congress in 1965 as a bipartisan commitment to safeguard natural areas, water resources, and cultural sites, and to provide recreation opportunities to all Americans.

Western Rivers Conservancy acquires lands along rivers throughout the West to conserve critical habitat and to create or improve public access for compatible use and enjoyment. By cooperating with local agencies and organizations and by applying decades of land acquisition experience, Western Rivers Conservancy secures the health of whole ecosystems. ## Ted Gaines Criticizes Gas Tax Increase

**SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG)** - State Board of Equalization Member Ted Gaines issued the following statement on the July 1 gas tax increase of three cents per gallon:

“California already had among the highest gas taxes in the country before the state Legislature passed SB 1 and essentially guaranteed increasing gas taxes every year. But we also had some of the worst roads. That’s a rotten combination for taxpayers, who have gotten no value from their government.

“Before raising taxes a single penny, legislators should have reformed labor and environmental rules that make California road building so incredibly expensive

compared to other states. They should have redirected the billion dollars a year of diverted weight fees to road maintenance and construction. And they should have prioritized practical road building over high-speed rail service that most drivers will never use but will pay for.

“But instead of reforms or cost savings, they just reached their hands deeper into taxpayers’ wallets.

“Three cents a gallon might not break the bank itself, but when you add it to our highest-in-the-nation sales tax, astronomical rents and housing costs, and electricity rates that are 50 percent higher than the national average, it adds up to a cost-of-living nightmare for California families and businesses.

“With California’s

unemployment rate at its highest level since the Great Recession in 2010, I can’t imagine a more ill-advised time to make daily life even more expensive, when families are simply trying to pay rent and keep food on the table.

“California politicians shouldn’t be filling up their own tanks while family budgets are running on empty. Drivers were already paying nearly 80 cents a gallon in combined state and federal taxes before today’s increase. We can build better infrastructure and a brighter future for our state with existing revenues and without higher taxes, at the pump or anywhere else.”

Ted Gaines represents 10 million people across 30 counties as the Board Member for the First Equalization District. ★

## Suspected Arsonist Arrested by CAL FIRE Investigators

**BUTTE COUNTY, CA (MPG)** - A vegetation fire was reported to the CAL FIRE/Butte County Fire Department Emergency Command Center at 3:47 pm on Wednesday, July 1. When the first engine arrived at scene of the “Swedes Fire” in Bangor, fire personnel saw an unknown female leaving the area on foot.

As firefighters were controlling the fire and holding it to a 3/4 of an acre, investigators arrived and began a

search for the female subject. She was quickly found by fire personnel in the back of a department crew bus, dressed in a CAL FIRE uniform and gathering personal belongings of firefighters.

While being questioned and placed under arrest, the female gave officers several false names. She was transported to Butte County Jail, where corrections officers positively identified her as Nicole Carol Bunch, who was previously wanted for two felony warrants in Butte County.

Bunch, age 33, of Bangor,

was booked into the jail on one count of Penal Code 451 (c), arson to forest land; one count of Penal Code 538, impersonating a firefighter; one count of Penal Code 148, resisting or delaying arrest; as well as the outstanding warrants; one count of Penal Code 273, child cruelty with possibility of injury or death; and Failure To Appear for PC 273.

Bunch is being held at the Butte County Jail in Lieu of \$90,000 bail.

Further charges may be forthcoming pending the result of a full investigation. ★
