End State Licensing

Mercedes Brockman, co-owner of Beyond Appearance Salon and Spa in Marysville said that the California Board of Barbering and Cosmetology threatening her stylists with loss of license if they did not stop working caused five to leave and never return. Brockman and co-owner Shenise Evans determined to defy state threats to keep from going bankrupt during the Corona shutdown.

The state's intimidation damaged Brockman and Evans' business by intimidating those employees, their most valuable assets.

Three blocks away Randy Mitchell cuts hair at his Upper Cuts Barbershop. Mitchell is the only Yuba-Sutter business owner cited by the police for staying open and has also received robo-call threats from the state along with personal calls from State Board employees.

Mitchell informed the state that it can take his barber shop's license and his personal license since he no longer recognizes their authority nor will pay fees to them in order to support his family.

The state, the county and the city have violated Mitchell's Constitutional rights to the free use of his property. And the state uses work permits as a means to control, extort money and intimidate licensees.

The State of California is nationally notorious for its excessive use of permits, licenses and fees to work. Over two million Californians must apply for permission to work in over 200 occupations from one of 42 gov-

thousands of dollars and spend years in

government-mandated classes. The State of California spends more than quarter of a billion dollars annually to regulate and license occupations ranging from tree trimmers to animal trainers. Funding comes from fees and citations issued by the licensing boards, and significant portions of licensing board budgets are used for enforcement (e.g. audits, sting opera-

tions) of board policies. Licensing often requires submitting fingerprints, paying application fees, and documentation of fulfilling certain educational and/or work experience outlined by board policies. For some occupations, the educational and work requirements may take years and thousands of dollars; for others, individuals may just need to submit fingerprints and a fee.

What ever happened to laissez-faire capitalism? Lasses-faire is a French term meaning 'let do.' It is an economic system in which transactions between private parties are absent of any form of government intervention such as regulation and subsidies. Laissez-faire embraces the following principles; The individual is the basic unit in society; The individual has a natural right to freedom; Markets should be competitive, a rule that the early advocates of laissez-faire always emphasized. The state is a free-market crusher.

The state claims for example that it "protects consumers by regulating the construction industry through policies that promote the health, safety, and ernment bureaus and boards. In the ters relating to construction." Similar

The sickening aspect is that the state actually sends in undercover staff to set-up stings to entrap hard-working people.


> There are already a myriad of laws and regulations providing recourse for consumers if damaged, exploited or defrauded by an occupation. And there are professional organizations that exist to offer training and promote best practices.

> On average, other states license less than half the occupations California does. There is no evidence proving that state licensing protects the public or enhances public safety. State licensing of businesses is about control and collecting money for enforcement. It undermines freedom, keeps prices high and reduces competition from newcomers.

> The Dhillon Law Group filed a suit to stop the state's recent harassment of barbers, salon and spa professionals for working during the Corona shutdown. Governor Newsom stopped his bullying nonsense the day before his day in court. Newsom **Announces New Policing and Criminal Justice Reforms**

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) -After a week of engagement with civic leaders and law enforcement in the wake of the killing of George Floyd and demonstrations nationwide, Governor Newsom announced his support for new policing and criminal justice reforms. Governor Newsom will work toward a statewide standard for policing peaceful protests and ending the carotid hold. This announcement follows the work California did last year to enact the nation's strongest standard for police use of deadly force.

"We have a unique and special responsibility here in California to meet this historic moment head-on," said Governor Newsom. "We will not sit back passively as a state. I am proud that California has advanced a new conversation about broader criminal justice reform, but we have an extraordinary amount of work left to do to manifest a cultural change and a deeper understanding of what it is that we're working to advance. We will continue to lead in a direction that does justice to the message heard all across this state and nation."

Governor Newsom called for the creation of new standards for crowd control and use of force in protests. Governor Newsom committed to working with the Legislature, including the California Legislative Black Caucus, the California Latino Legislative Caucus and other legislative leaders, in consultation with national experts, community leaders, law enforcement and journalists to develop those standards - much like the collaboration that produced AB 392 last year, California's nation-leading use-of-force bill.

Additionally, he called for the end of the carotid hold and other like techniques in California, directing that the carotid hold be removed from the state police training program and state training materials. He committed to working with the Legislature on a statewide ban that would apply to all police forces across the state.

BCSO Announces Arrest of Oroville Resident for Possession of Child Pornography

BUTTE COUNTY, CA (MPG) -The Butte County Sheriff's Office (BCSO) announced the arrest of Dwayne Hansen of Oroville, 49. On May 29, Butte County Sheriff's Office deputies assigned to the Marine Unit were patrolling the area of the Monument Hill Boat Launch, Oroville. Deputies located a motorhome with expired registration parked in the Monument Hill parking lot. Deputies contacted Dwayne Hansen,

living in the motorhome. A records check indicated Hansen was required to register pursuant to the Sex Offender Registration Act.

During the contact with Hansen, deputies located marijuana and methamphetamine. While searching the motorhome deputies located children's underwear. Deputies questioned Hansen about the children's underwear. Hansen told deputies he used the children's underwear while performing sexual acts. Deputies continued speaking with Hansen, at which time Hansen disclosed he had child pornography on a cell phone located inside the motorhome. After disclosing he was in possession of child pornography, Hansen stood up and attempted to run away from deputies. After a short foot pursuit, Hansen was arrested without incident.

Detectives arrived and collected Hansen's electronic devices. Detectives 530-538-7671.

the individual who was authored a search warrant for the electronic devices, and a forensic download of the devices was conducted pursuant to the search warrant. Detectives located numerous images of child pornography on Hansen's electronic devices.

> Hansen was booked into the Butte County Jail for a felony count of possession of more than 600 images of child pornography, a felony count of possession of child pornography showing the intentional infliction of pain on minor victims for the purpose of sexual gratification or stimulation, a felony count of possession of a controlled substance, a felony count of possession of nunchakus, a misdemeanor count of resisting or delaying a peace officer, and a misdemeanor count of possession of narcotics paraphernalia. 2020 Nevada County Fair Canceled Amid COVID-19 Restrictions

NEVADA COUNTY, CA (MPGF) - The Nevada County Fairgrounds Board of Directors voted to cancel the 2020 Nevada County Fair due to the COVID-19 public health crisis. The Board also voted to authorize an online junior livestock and ag mechanics auction.

The vote comes after delaying the decision two weeks ago following Governor Newsom's same-day announcement that California was moving rapidly into the next reopening stage. Since that meeting, the Fairgrounds Board and staff discussed the feasibility of different options with various Fair partners, communicated with State and public health officials, and further reviewed the Governor's executive orders and updated guidance regarding the COVID-19 pandemic and mass gatherings.

Nevertheless, according to the California Roadmap to Recovery, fairs and festivals remain in Stage 4 of the reopening plan and will not be permitted until the roadmap is complete and all shelter in place restrictions are lifted. At the Governor's May 29 daily update, he stated that "We're not ready for Stage 4 - concerts, big outdoor stadium events, festivals, and large conventions. We're simply not there. There is no sectoral guidance that's been given, no authority for local health officials to move into that phase."

"While it was an extremely difficult decision for the Board, and one that we were hoping could go in a different direction, it is the only decision we could make in light of the restrictions on mass gatherings," said Jeanette Royal, Board President of California's 17th District Agricultural Association. "The Board and staff realize that this action has a huge impact on so many – our community, local businesses,

sponsors, youth in agriculture, vendors, entertainers, local nonprofit organizations, and the Nevada County Fairgrounds itself - and we actively explored numerous possibilities before making this devastating decision. However, the Fairgrounds are state-owned property and the Board of Directors is responsible for the health and safety of our community, guests, and staff. We are following the guidelines set by the Governor and State public health directives to postpone mass gatherings until we can safely host them again."

Since the 17th District Agricultural Association was formed in 1884, the Nevada County Fair has been one of the county's most popular and longest standing events. This will be the first time since World War II that the annual Fair will not take place.

"We are deeply saddened to not be celebrating together at Nevada County's favorite event," said Fairgrounds CEO Patrick Eidman. "But until we are able to safely gather again at the Fairgrounds, our team will be exploring opportunities to hold virtual exhibit contests and other activities in the spirit of the Fair. Additionally, we are steadfastly committed to working with the Nevada County Livestock Producers to support our livestock and ag mechanics exhibitors with an online auction."

Last year, the Nevada County Fair welcomed more than 95,000 guests to the grounds, generated millions of dollars for the local economy, provided more than \$700,000 to youth in agriculture, broke record sales on Treat Street that infused almost \$1,000,000 into local nonprofit organizations, showcased local entertainers and vendors, and provided nearly 250 jobs.

has been a key priority of Governor Newsom's first year in office. He placed a moratorium on the death penalty, citing racial and economic disparities in how it was applied. He proposed to close the Division of Juvenile Justice and proposed closing two state prisons. In his May Revision budget, Governor Newsom proposed expanding opportunities for rehabilitation and shortening prison time

for offenders participating in treatment programs, in education programs and otherwise engaging in good behavior; as well as increasing access to higher education for young people who are incarcerated.

Governor Newsom acknowledged that more action is needed, and stated that additional reforms around police practices, educational equity, economic justice, health equity and more must be addressed with urgency.

Price Controls Would Prevent COVID-19 Medicine

America's biopharmaceutical industry dwarfs most other economic sectors. It's one of our nation's single biggest job creators, supporting close to a million positions across the country. And its products save countless lives each year.

Yet for some reason, politicians in both parties seem determined to snuff it out by imposing crippling price controls on medicines. That would be a disaster for employees and patients

The industry has been an economic behemoth for decades. It contributes more to GDP than the agricultural and utility industries combined. The total value of the goods and services directly produced by drug firms totaled \$560 billion in 2017, according to a new report from TEConomy Partners. And after factoring in the output from drug companies' vendors and other partners, that figure exceeds \$1.1 trillion.

The industry also generates millions of highpaying jobs. Drug companies directly employed more than 811,000 Americans and indirectly supported over

3 million others in 2017. A third of those jobs are coveted science, technology, engineering, and math positions – the occupations of the future. And average compensation in the industry exceeded \$126,500 per worker in 2017. That's more than twice the U.S. private sector average of \$60,700.

Of course, the industry isn't just an economic powerhouse. It's also the global leader in medical innovation, producing half of the world's new medicines. Right now, U.S. researchers are working on more than 4,500 new drugs.

Despite these successes, drug development remains an expensive and risky venture. The White House Council of Economic Advisors estimates the cost of developing a single new drug at \$2 billion. Firms generally dedicate 15 to 20 percent of their revenues to drug development.

ut now, some lawmakers want to weaken the industry responsible for this economic growth and medical innovation. The recent drug pricing bill passed by the House, H.R. 3, would empower the government to cap the price of 250 common brand-name drugs. The prices could not exceed 120 percent of the average prices paid in six other developed countries with governmentdominated health systems, including Canada, France, and the United Kingdom.

These price controls would reduce drug companies' revenues by \$1 trillion over 10 years, according to the Congressional Budget Office. Based on the Council of Economic

Advisors' assumptions, that means firms will devote roughly \$200 billion less to research and development, resulting in 100 fewer new drugs over the next decade.

Meanwhile, the Senate Finance Committee is pushing its own price control bill. The legislation would bar companies from raising prices faster than the rate of inflation. And it would effectively levy taxes on drug companies by increasing their cost-sharing liability in Medicare's prescription drug benefit. All told, the bill would cost biopharmaceutical firms \$100 billion over the next 10

Once these price controls, taxes, and other penalties begin depleting their revenue, firms will curtail research and development - and thus lay off American workers. According to a recent poll, 45 percent of drug firms said that "significant" reductions in research and development could force immediate job cuts and facility closures.

Let's hope our leaders in Washington reconsider proposals that would cripple one of America's largest and most innovative industries - and leave patients without the lifesaving drugs they







Sector Rotation

"Sector rotation" in stocks means money comes out of one area of investment and moves into another.

At any given time, certain areas of investing can be hot while others are not. Certainly during the period leading up to the dot.com stock mania, one could safely say technology stocks were in favor and explosive price growth was the sought after result.

Any stock with a dot.com moniker would be gobbled up by greedy investors looking for fast and furious gains. Meanwhile the old "stodgy" stocks that paid consistent dividends like utilities or oil stocks may have been shunned in favor of the hot stocks of the day. Investors thought the stalwart stock names of oil, food, autos or whathave-you did not offer the lighting-fast, explosive growth that a dot.com stock promised.

Fast forward a few years and dot.com fell from favor. They were replaced by housing stocks and its various related sectors.

Sector rotation can take place at any time and for a variety of reasons. A new discovery such as a cure for cancer could cause a sector rotation into health care or pharmaceutical stocks. History is rife with well-known sector rotations.

A decade or so back, the health benefits of grape related drinks caused a rotation into the wine and beverage sectors. Looking farther back the Texas oil bonanza caused oil and oil related equipment producers to rally. The movement to alternative energy caused related stocks in that sector to rise while hydrocarbon type stocks may have

The reality is sectors can fall in and out of favor and for a variety of reasons.

It's this ebb and flow of investor dollars that may cause stock prices in certain sectors to fall in mass for no other reason than a sector is becoming yesterday's news.

Catch a hot sector early and profits could be made. Be late to the party or stay too long, and falling stock prices reflecting investors vacating the sector for greener pastures could hurt portfo-

Early on during the CoVid shutdown, most all areas of the stock market fell in concert. A few weeks in and investor monies surfaced into a variety of stock sectors. Biotech and pharmaceutical stocks caught an early bid as did the internet communication stocks, streaming movie companies, online retailing and the companies that serviced and maintained the conduits of

Meanwhile the hardest hit sectors were the vacation and travel stocks like hotels, theme parks, airlines, cruise ships and similar sectors. Companies

that by their nature facilitate people in close proximity to each other like movie theaters and restaurants also suffered.

Sector rotation into the "stav-athome" economy stocks caused a significant river of investor dollars to flow into certain sectors while other sectors fell mercilessly.

Last week saw another sector rotation that may have taken many investors and advisors by surprise and it was fast and furious in its migration of dollars.

On Friday June 5th, the Labor Department reported that May payrolls increased by 2.5 million, shocking investors and analysts alike. Forecasters had called for another dreadful report following a sharp decline of 20.7 million lost jobs in the prior month. The gain was the largest positive number going back to 1939.

That report, coupled with the fact that all 50 states were in various stages of reopening, caused an obvious sector rotation out of the "stay-at-home" stocks into what I call the "get-awayfrom home" stocks.

Video conferencing, health care, online shopping and other related sectors fell hard with little exception or reason, while the hardest hit shutdown stocks like hotels, airlines, cruise ships, retail and other related areas rose.

The stocks in these areas had been stealthily lifting off their lows in recent days and the jobs report lit the afterburners of many of these companies.

This was a clear example of nothing more than sector rotation, based on investor expectations that the lows in some of these stocks may have already been reached and that it was time to go shopping in the bargain basement of the stock market. Meanwhile holders of the stay-at-home stocks were left scratching their heads as to what had happened to cause their recent favorite stocks to crater. The answer was nothing specifically. They were simply a victim of sector rotation.

How Do I Apply with Social Security Offices Closed?

Dear Rusty: I am 64 years old and would like advice on how to move forward to apply for Social Security now instead of waiting until I am the "magic" age of 66.5 years. Signed: Ready for Retirement

Dear Ready for Retirement: All Social Security offices are currently closed to public visits, but they are still providing telephone services (although telephone wait times are usually longer these days). You can apply over the phone if you wish. However, the most efficient way to apply for your Social Security benefit, especially during the COVID-19 pandemic, is to apply online. You will need to create your personal "My Social Security" account prior to applying online, but that is easy to do at www.ssa.gov/



myaccount. For information, Social Security uses a "two-factor" identification process for security purposes, usually by asking you to enter, in addition to your password, a special ID code sent to your cell phone (or email).. Once you have set up your personal account, you can use the online application process at www.ssa.gov/retire.

Here is a link to a short video from Social Security which explains the online application process: www. ssa.gov/hlp/video/iclaim r01.htm. When you start the online process, be sure to write down the reentry code, which will allow you to save and re-enter your online application as many times as needed before you finally submit it. Once it is submitted, Social Security will call you or write you to get any additional information they need. A couple of things I want to be sure you are aware of:



Finally, if you are still working, you'll be subject to Social Security's earnings test until you reach your full retirement age. If you start benefits mid-year 2020, you'll be subject to a monthly earnings limit of \$1520, and if you exceed that limit you won't be eligible for benefits for that month. The following years you'll be subject to an annual limit, until you reach your FRA when there is no longer a limit to how much you can earn.



Klamath Farmers Face Early Water Shutoff

With their water supplies due to run dry by mid-June, farmers in the Klamath Basin say they face the "heartbreaking" prospect of watching crops wither. Farmers planted crops based on an April allocation from the federal Klamath Project – only to have the allocation cut sharply in May. After a dry winter, project operators reduced irrigation supplies out of concern for protected fish.

Usda Analyst Says Food System Remains Resilient

Despite the shocks the pandemic has delivered to the food system, the chief economist at the U.S. Department of Agriculture says people "can continue to rely on abundant food supplies." USDA economist Robert Johansson says food markets remain well-supplied, and describes disruptions as "temporary and limited." He says the food system has weathered impacts of the pandemic well, though it's hard to predict how conditions will evolve.

Pepper Growers See Robust Demand

On-farm prices for California-grown green bell peppers have been sharply higher than a year ago, but farmers say that has more to do with short crops in other regions than pandemic-related changes in demand. In the Coachella Valley, farmers say they're harvesting red and yellow bell peppers along with green bells. Fewer peppers than expected from Mexico have been reaching market, heightening demand for the California crops.

Agritourism Farms Adapt Their Operations

As farmers adjust to how the pandemic has changed markets, those who run agricultural tourism businesses modify their operations to fit the times. With school tours and other offerings suspended, agritourism farms have focused on farm stands, subscription services and drive-through markets. A Northern California farmer who runs a pumpkin patch says he'll start planting this month and still plans to open this fall, though with some changes.
