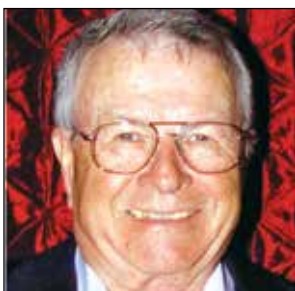

## Open, But Not Really

*Shaving, Facial Waxing, Threading  
and Facials Not Permitted at This Time*

**SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG)** - The California Department of Public Health announced on May 25, 2020 that counties that have attested to meeting the criteria for accelerated re-opening may re-open hair salons and barbershops with modifications such as mandatory face coverings for both barbers or stylists and clients. State public health leaders noted that Californians staying at home and exercising caution when out helped flatten the COVID-19 curve. Public health leaders acknowledge that today's announcement is also possible based on statewide indicators such as PPE, testing capacity, hospital surge capacity and hospitalizations.

Permitted activities include services that can be provided with both the worker and customer wearing

face coverings throughout the service. These include haircuts, hair coloring, blowouts, weaves and extensions, braiding, lock maintenance, wig maintenance and hair relaxing treatments.

Salon activities that cannot be done with face coverings on both the worker and client – or that require touching the client's face – such as shaving, facial waxing, threading, eyelash services and facials – remain prohibited at this time in all counties. Likewise, nail salons remain closed.

"Together, Californians have limited infections in our state, and because of that work, many counties may make a decision to restart modified hair and barber services," said Dr. Sonia Angell, State Public Health Officer and Director of the California Department of Public

Health. "However, COVID-19 is still present in our communities and we are still at risk. As we venture outside our homes, it is critically important to keep physical distance, wear face coverings in public, and wash hands frequently to help protect yourself and those around you."

Under the new guidance to reopen, salons and barbers must: Implement measures to ensure physical distancing of at least six feet between and among workers and customers, except when providing haircutting and other close contact services; Provide temperature and/or symptom screenings for all workers at the beginning of their shift and any vendors, contractors, or other workers entering the establishment; Encourage workers

## CHO Now Reviewing State Order on Faith and Your Haircut

**MARYSVILLE, CA (MPG)** - Now that barber shops, hair salons and houses of faith have California's permission to resume operations using specific precautions, Yuba-Sutter Health Officer Dr. Phuong Luu said she is carefully examining how her May 4 Health Order aligns with today's announcement from the State.

Dr. Luu said the scientific approach she used to create the May 4 Health Order revealed a safe path for reopening barber shops and hair salons, as long as careful guidelines were followed. The same science, however, showed the risk for spreading COVID-19 in large groups such as faith gatherings remains high.

Today's (May 25) direction from the State immediately moves up all of those activities from Stage 3 to the latter part of Stage 2. Only those California counties that received a variance from the State may reopen barber shops and hair salons. Yuba and Sutter counties plus 45 other counties currently have that variance. The variance is not required for modified faith gatherings, which are now allowed in all California counties.

"I know and appreciate that all faith based organizations in Yuba-Sutter will be eager to reopen immediately, and my job now is to make sure any process for reopening includes sufficient safeguards that balance out any risks that may come from reopening this early," Dr. Luu said.

The new State guidelines limit attendance at faith-based gatherings to 25 percent of building capacity or a maximum of 100 attendees, whichever is lower. Daycare and Sunday School programs are not allowed.

At barber shops and hair salons, hair stylists and their customers must wear facial coverings, while close-contact services such as waxing, facials, and shaving will not be allowed, since use of facial coverings is not possible. Shops will be required to post information about social distancing and infection prevention protocols. High touch items like magazines and coffee stations must be removed.

The current health order places a strong emphasis on protecting local health-care capabilities in Yuba

# News Outlook

For the first time in 20 years, the AAA offered no official Memorial Day travel forecast, citing the unpredictability caused by Covid-19. But the organization did provide a dismal outlook, saying it anticipates the lowest amount of traffic on planes, trains and automobiles in modern history. This year’s travel is likely to be a record low, said Paula Twidale, senior vice president of AAA Travel. Another tradition messed up by the current state of affairs.

\*\*\*

Last week the reported national numbers showed US unemployment (seasonally adjusted) jumped to 14.7%, California’s reported unemployment rate (seasonally adjusted) in April rose to a series high of 15.5%. The real number is probably 20%. We are in uncharted territory. Fifty-six percent of California small businesses experienced “large negative” effects from the pandemic, according to a recent Census survey that includes companies with up to 500 employees. Sectors hit hardest by initial job loss face the most severe setbacks. As small businesses, weather closures brought on by COVID-19 lock down, public policy efforts to support them will be essential for the state’s economic recovery. Perhaps it is time to roll back

anti- business regulations? Ninety-five percent of businesses are very small businesses with less than 50 employees (these businesses employ one-third of California’s workers). Unemployed Californians will need workplaces to return to after the economy recovers.

Looking at shopping patterns for Walmart and Target during March and April 2020 and comparing it to behaviour from the same months in 2019 shows some notable changes. In 2019, 40.7% of customers who visited a Walmart nationwide came immediately from home. Unsurprisingly, this number shot up by 16.2% to 56.9% for March and April 2020 as a result of stay-at-home measures. And, the impact has been felt most heavily by retailers. There was a 4.3% decline in those visiting a restaurant before a Walmart visit and a near 1.0% decline after. And a 3.2% decline in shopping at other locations before a Walmart visit. Although we continued to shop for essentials, the shopping trips themselves were cut much shorter, thus having a broader impact. So do like me, before going to the Walmart in Linda, goto Casa Carlos in Marysville, it is better for the economy to shop and eat.

Ballot measures, the unique California tool by with the people get to implement laws without the legislature or the Governor, are lining up for the November election, one of the measures before us will be a fierce political fight. “The California Schools and Local Communities

Funding Act of 2018,” also known as Schools & Communities First, is a California ballot measure that seeks to change many provisions of Proposition 13, the famous Howard Jarvis 1978 property tax limitations initiative. The initiative would raise an estimated \$12 billion for schools and local governments by changing the tax rates for commercial and industrial properties. “Changing” that would result in 12 billion dollars more“revenue” for the state. Also, the November election will have no polling places; all the voting will be done by mail.

\*\*\*

Sutter Healthcare system reports they lost 1 billion dollars this year. **Sutter Health** is the second-largest private employer in the Sacramento area, with approximately 15,500 employees in the region. Adventist - the mother-ship of Rideout Hospital reported losing \$60 million a month. Because Adventist is a faith-based non-profit hospital system, it usually only has an operating profit of 2-3%. So go back and remember that thing your doctor told you should be looked at again sometime in the future; the future is now, our hospitals are open and underutilized. The business model actually works for Adventist, but only if people show up. Colon cancer, breast cancer, and strokes make you just as dead as a mutated virus, so get ahead of those by doing your regular human body maintenance and tune-up.

Retired Sutter County Sheriff Art Brandwood passed away peacefully surrounded by his loving family on May 23rd 2020. Arthur Raymond Brandwood was born to Raymond Cecil and Estelle Brandwood in Miami, Florida on September 21, 1938. Art was raised in Miami where he attended school and graduated from Miami Jackson High School. Art started his law enforcement career in 1960 when he joined the Metro Dade Sheriff's Department. During this time Art had a daughter, Debbie, who was born in 1959. Art met and married the love of his life, Cheryl on October 24th, 1964. Art and Cheryl moved to Oakland, Ca in 1965 where Art took a job with the Oakland Police Department. Art excelled in his career with OPD and worked numerous assignments including Vice, Narcotics, Patrol and Juvenile Narcotics. Art was promoted to Sergeant with OPD on February 5th, 1969. It was in his role as a Patrol Sergeant in Oakland where Art found his true calling as a leader, mentor and witness for the lord to numerous young Oakland Police Officers and citizens whom he interacted with. Art and Cheryl welcomed two sons, the first, Art Jr., born in 1967 and the second, Randy, born in 1970. Art suffered a horrific tragedy in 1972 when he lost his 13 year old daughter Debbie in a traffic accident. Art was able to endure this tragedy with the love of his wife Cheryl and his devout faith in the Lord. Art remained at OPD until 1980 when he decided to make a change and accepted a position as a Lieutenant and then Captain with the Yuba City Police Department. Art quickly made lifelong friends and established himself as a dedicated public servant and pillar of his new community in Yuba City. While working at Yuba City PD Art enrolled in the University of San Francisco and obtained his BA in Public Administration, graduating with honors. Art ran for the position of Sutter County Sheriff in 1989 and against long odds was elected to the position and was sworn into office in 1990. Art again established new relationships and made a huge impact on the men and women of the Sheriff's Office as well as those he served in the community. Art retired as the Sutter County Sheriff in 1998 after serving two terms. Art continued to volunteer for many positions and roles within the California law enforcement community including holding a critical role with the California Police Memorial Foundation. In retirement Art was called again to bear witness to the men and women of the Yuba City Police Department in 2005 and was sworn in as the Police Chaplain. It was this position where Art was able to connect with a new generation of police officers and share his faith with countless officers and citizens in the community. Art retired as Chaplain in 2013 in order to enjoy his retirement with his wife and grandkids. Art enjoyed life to the fullest, most notably duck hunting with his grandson and his beloved dogs Susie and Luke. Art and Cheryl enjoyed travelling with their many friends. Art was preceded in death by his daughter Debbie, his mother and father. Art leaves behind his loving wife Cheryl, his two sons Randy and Art Jr, his four grandkids, Kayla (a current Oakland Police Officer), Ashley, Sonny and Sage. Two daughters in law Winter and Charlotte, and countless friends and people whose lives he had a positive impact on.

In life or death Art loved his family and his Lord Jesus. Just before his passing, unable to speak he spelled out "No Fear" There will be a public viewing on Monday, June 1, between 4 and 6 pm at Ullrey Memorial Chapel, 817 Almond St, Yuba City, CA. # Yuba Water Agency Invests in our Future in a Big Way

For decades, we’ve talked about the need for implementing modern infrastructure to the Highway 65 corridor in order to make new development there possible. My vision for the area seemed impossible to achieve. The ability to develop sports, entertainment, and industrial zones will bring good jobs to our community that we desperately needed even before the coronavirus recession hit. Now we need it more than ever.

This week, the Yuba Water Agency Board of Directors voted to approve \$3.5 million in support to the Olivehurst Public Utility District - half of that as a low-interest loan, the other half would be a grant. This money will be used to design the wastewater and water distribution system throughout this corridor. This is critical to jump-starting our economy, helping us recover from the huge hit we’ve taken in the last couple of months.

Brent Hastey, vice-chairman of the Yuba Water board, said it well when he said, “I can’t think of any project we could do that will be more impactful than this will be, as we try to dig our way out of this recession caused by the coronavirus. Having shovel-ready projects that will bring jobs to the area is going to be really important as economic recovery efforts get underway.”

As a director on the OPUD board, I really appreciate the vision of the Yuba

Water Agency board. Our shared commitment to invest in Yuba County will help spark a better quality of life for all of us. Yuba Water has always been there for us and they have always had a vested interest in our community.

During the 2008 economic downturn, Yuba County and Yuba Water stepped up to provide nearly all of the local cost-share of \$53 million dollars for the Feather River Setback Levee which has significantly reduced flood risk to an area that had been battered by flooding in 1986 and 1997. In fact, Yuba Water is spending more than \$5 million a year to repay the bonds that helped get that project completed.

That levee repair was part of a much larger project covering 29 miles of levees, with several partners, including state and local agencies, that brought a total of approximately \$600 million in improvements to our area. The last piece of that puzzle, the levee work from Simpson Lane to the Goldfields, is under construction now. Yuba Water has been a key player in efforts to help finance one of the best levee systems in California.

It’s reassuring to know that our community has this incredible asset and partner in Yuba County. I’m so glad that we finally have a reliable revenue source that exists to improve public safety, ensure a sustainable water supply and invest in our future.

These investments will be a game-changer for a community that has been at a disadvantage for far too long ★

# Second Suspect Arrested in Connection to September Homicide

MARYSVILLE, CA (MPG) - On the morning of Sunday, September 22,-2019, Marysville Police Department patrol officers were dispatched to a residence on the 1000 block of F Street in reference to a possible residential burglary in progress. When officers arrived on scene, they determined one of the residents, a Hispanic female adult, had recently been murdered. Family member of the deceased who also lived in the home provided information indicating two criminal suspects were responsible for the victim’s death and they fled the area in the victim’s vehicle.

Marysville Police Department Detectives responded to the residence and a homicide investigation was initiated. It was determined the victim was shot at a close range in the head. One suspect was quickly identified as Jesse Jaramillo, a 30-year-old Hispanic male adult from Sacramento who was known to the family. Information obtained during the course of the investigation indicated Jaramillo had

fled to and was staying somewhere in Butte County around the Oroville area. Jaramillo was ultimately taken into custody on the morning of Thursday, 9-25-2019 at the Feather Falls Casino in Oroville. Jaramillo was booked into the Yuba County Jail on multiple felony criminal offenses, including Murder in violation of California Penal Code 187 (a).

The second suspect was recently identified as Cody Dion Morris, a 27-year-old white male adult from Rancho Cordova. A Ramey Warrant for Morris’ arrest was authorized and issued. The warrant included the felony criminal offenses of Residential Burglary in violation of California Penal Code 459, Theft of a Motor Vehicle in violation of California Vehicle Code 1085 (a) and Accessory to Murder in violation of 32. Morris was located on the 3200 block of E. Woodson Road in Acampo, CA on the morning of 5-14-2020 and he was taken into custody.

Morris was transported to the Yuba County Jail and booked into the facility for the offenses listed on the Ramey Warrant.★

# Suspects Wanted for Questioning in Armed Robbery

MARYSVILLE, CA (MPG) - On 5-2-2020 at approximately 12:05 p.m., officers responded to Farmer’s Marketplace in Marysville for a report of a shoplifting that involved a suspect brandishing a knife. Officers learned that two suspects, a man and a woman, arrived at the Farmer’s Marketplace in a gray or primer-colored Ford Ranger pick-up. The man and woman entered the Farmer’s Marketplace and wandered the store for approximately ten minutes,

selecting random items from display aisles.

After wandering the store for approximately ten minutes, the man and woman proceeded to walk out of the store with unpaid items believed to be concealed in their clothes and a backpack that the woman was wearing. As they left the store together, the woman was observed holding a knife out in front of her. The man and the woman left together in the Ford Ranger pick-up, which was last seen traveling south on Covillaud Street from the Farmer’s Marketplace.

The woman is described as a white female adult in

her thirties, with shoulder-length black hair. The woman is believed to have a tattoo on the top of her right hand. The woman was wearing a red sweater, sorts and a backpack with white straps.

The man is described as a white male adult in his thirties, with short brown hair and a trimmed bran beard. The man possibly has a tattoo on the top of his right forearm. The man was wearing a gray t-shirt, black jeans and white and blue shoes.

The Marysville Police Department is asking for the public’s help in identifying these two suspects. ★

and Sutter counties. A severe surge in COVID-19 cases could quickly overwhelm the ability to care for patients.

PP has more than 1,200 employees nation-wide.

"There is no ambiguity in the legislation that passed or public record around its passage that organizations such as Planned Parenthood, whose parent organization has close to half a billion dollars in assets, is not eligible for the Paycheck Protection Program," Senator Marco Rubio (R-FLA) said.

The Small Business Administration (SBA), which oversees the PPP, has been contacting Planned Parenthood recipients, instructing them to return the loan money. The SBA is also warning that if any Planned Parenthood employee lied on an application to get approved for the loans, they and their clinic could face criminal and civil penalties.

Senator Josh Hawley (R-MO) also called for a federal investigation into the lending, and for charges to be brought against anyone found to have lied on a PPP loan application. "The money needs to be recovered and if anybody knowingly falsified applications, they need to be prosecuted," Hawley said.

Don't expect any prosecution. The SBA's reputation of being a funding black hole and loser agency is just another example of a bloated socialist regime unable to rise above boondoggles and incompetence.

The predicted coming judgement of a righteous God for the shedding of innocent blood is far more reliable than the probable reformation of our government.

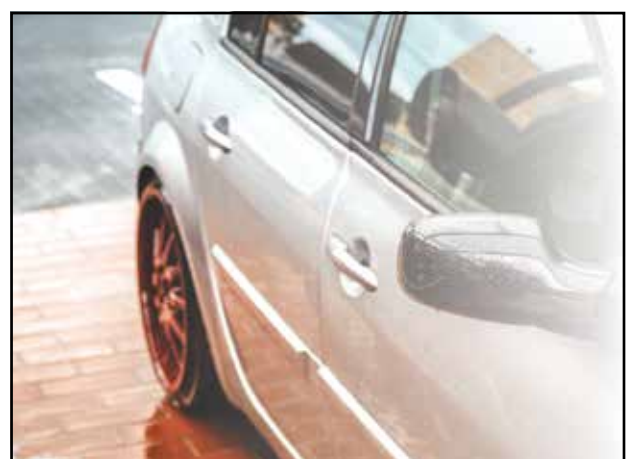

## California Fairs in Trouble

**PLACERVILLE, CA (MPG)** - Every county in our state has one. Every county in our state needs one.

But by the end of 2020, not every county in our state will have one – a local fairgrounds.

Your local Fairgrounds are the go-to place during disasters in your community – such as wildfires, floods, pandemics and other disasters. They are the hub of the community. In El Dorado County, the Sheriff utilized the fairgrounds for a press conference when Jaycee Lee Dugard was found. Domestic animals displaced by fire are housed here. Every year, local non-profits host their fundraisers, raising millions of dollars to serve our community at our fairgrounds. Hundreds of local residents walk their dogs at our fairgrounds. Local law and fire departments test and train here. The Speedway hosts races throughout the summer months, bringing fans from all over for a little clay track action. And there is our annual County Fair where local youth learn lessons that will last them a lifetime by raising and showing their livestock. Couples meet and fall in love. Longtime residents listen to the bands of their youth. Thousands of tacos are consumed. All of this could change due to the consequences of COVID-19.

In 2011, then Governor Jerry Brown eliminated ALL funding for California Fairs. For El Dorado County Fairgrounds, that constituted about 25 percent of the annual revenue. For some fairgrounds it was much more. Some fairgrounds have never

recovered. El Dorado County Fairgrounds cut spending, created new methods of generating revenue, streamlined interim rentals, run a bar during the Fair and 4th of July, and created other events, such as the popular Crab and Chowder Gala. With the shut-down THESE ALL CEASED. As of this writing, the Fair Association has lost more than \$200,000 in interim rental revenue, and that will likely rise. If the Fair Association is not able to host the annual County Fair, it will be difficult to keep the gates open.

Here are some facts about California Fairs. Statewide, more than \$35 million is generated by non-profits for their community on fairgrounds. Fairgrounds generate more than \$3.5 billion in annual economic impact while contributing over \$200 million in tax revenue to local and state government.

There is a movement within the California Fair Network to request emergency funding.

This is where you come in. The fair industry needs the public to show their support by urging their local politicians to support emergency fair funding. El Dorado County Fair has a sample letter on their website, [eldoradocountyfair.org/contact.html](http://eldoradocountyfair.org/contact.html) or simply write your own, supporting emergency funding for fairgrounds throughout the state.

Please share this with your family and friends throughout the State and urge them to write letters as well.

It is important for ALL fairgrounds in ALL California communities!

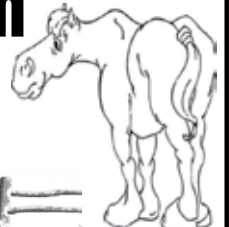
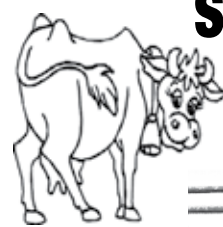

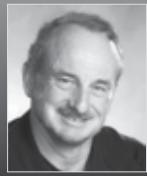

## Inflation most people know as increasing prices in the things we buy

*"Inflation is always and everywhere a monetary phenomenon in the sense that it is and can be produced only by a more rapid increase in the quantity of money..."*  
-Milton Friedman renown economist.

Inflation most people know as increasing prices in the things we buy. The actual definition of inflation is a general increase in prices and a fall in the subsequent purchasing value of money. The fall in purchasing power leads to the increase in prices.

A simple example is to imagine a small town walled off from the rest of society. It has only so many groceries for sale and no more. Everyone has about \$1,000 to spend so the bidding for groceries can only go so high as the amount of money in the economy. Prices rise as people need food and that rise in prices is called demand inflation. More demand equates to higher prices. Then imagine everyone finds another \$1,000 buried in their basement. Now the bidding for groceries resumes fast and furious as everyone now has more money. Prices rise. That increase in prices was caused by the increase in the money supply allowing the bidding to go higher as everyone has more cash. That is what Friedman refers to as monetary inflation. More money in a system means higher prices.

That said, the crisis of 2008 was addressed by the government (the FED) by printing up about five trillion dollars and buying bad mortgages with that money (among other things).

Some analysts forecasted skyrocketing inflation as five trillion dollars was a lot of money back then (and still is). But inflation never skyrocketed. In fact, it was fairly benign in many items. Commodities for instance (the basic material things are made of) actually went down continually in the years that followed as measured by certain metrics (CNBC)

It begs the question: why, in the face of trillions of dollars going into the U.S. economy, did we not see the high inflation many predicted?

For monetary inflation to occur, the money has to actually go to those spending it. You could say it has to go into the "system", which is to say into the hands of consumers.

Imagine instead printing up ten trillion and then burying it in a hole. Since the money is not "in the system", it just sits in the hole and is not spent. It's like the money in our small town before it was found. It was there but not yet in the system until the townsfolk found it. Prices only rose after they started spending it.

In 2008, although copious amounts of money was created by the FED, for the most part it went into the banking and mortgage systems to buy bad mortgages

(among other debt) and not into the hands of consumers.

There are two things the banking financial systems can do with money handed to it by the FED.

They could have loaned it out, but remember the call to "get the banks' lending again". Had they embarked on lending all that money out, it would have gone into the system (consumers) and that would have likely caused the expected inflation.

But most of the money was instead shuttled back to the FED in a mechanism called "excess reserves". Simply put, the banks elected to park much of that money back to where it came from (the FED) as the FED pays interest on any money parked there.

For those doing the easy math, the FED gave them money for the bad loans to stabilize the banking system. The banking system in turn parked it back at the FED and got interest for it instead of loaning much of it out (Rollingstone.com) and therefore not incurring any risk.

As a result, most of the money never made it into the hands of consumers and therefore never made it into the system. Hence not much inflation.

Fast forward to Corona. The FED once again is creating trillions. In fact, it is on pace and forecasted to exceed the 2008 bailout. The difference here is much of that money is going into the hands of consumers in the form of a variety of well-known stimulus, unemployment and loan programs. The money will now go into the system.

Many argue, including this analyst, that this time is different. Much of that money will now be spent. That dear reader, means there will be an increase in the money supply, and that leads us back to the possibility of inflation in our future.

Friedman's monetary inflation, the most aggressive kind, and with trillions feeding it, it has the possibility of being very severe.

## BCPH Responds to Religious Congregation Exposed to COVID-19 on Mother's Day

### Butte County Public Health

**BUTTE COUNTY, CA (MPG)** - Butte County Public Health (BCPH) COVID-19 contact tracing and investigation is underway in response to a local, in-person religious service held on Mother's Day where a person with lab confirmed COVID-19 attended.

The infected person received their positive COVID-19 diagnosis the day after the service and is now in home isolation.

The service had over 180 people in attendance. Individuals attending the service have been notified of their exposure and instructed by BCPH to self-quarantine. Information about how to monitor themselves for symptoms, how to contact BCPH and what to do if they become symptomatic has been provided.

BCPH is working with healthcare partners to establish testing for all individuals who attended the service.

"At this time, organizations that hold in-person services or gatherings are putting the health and safety of their congregations, the general public and our local ability to open up at great risk," stated Danette York, Director of Butte County Public Health. "We all need to do our part to follow the orders and

mitigation efforts so that our Reopen Butte County plan can continue to move forward. Moving too quickly through the reopening process can cause a major setback and could require us to revert back to more restrictive measures. We implore everyone to follow the State order and our reopening plan to help combat the potential spread of COVID-19."

Gatherings of any size have been disallowed by the Governor's "Stay at Home" order since March 19, 2020. The Stage 2 reopening plan for Butte County does not provide authority to allow gatherings. Those may be considered as we move forward to stage 3 in the future.

Despite the Governor's order, the organization chose to open its doors, which resulted in exposing the entire congregation to COVID-19. This decision comes at a cost of many hours and a financial burden to respond effectively to slow or stop the spread of COVID-19. Such decisions can place great risk on the County's ability to continue opening at a faster rate than the State.

If the Governor's order is not followed, these types of decisions may jeopardize BCPH's ability to respond adequately to prevent the spread of COVID-19. ★

# Social Security Matters

## What will my Wife's Survivor Benefit Be?

**Dear Rusty:** I am a 68-year-old retired male and had planned on waiting to collect Social Security benefits beginning at age 70. My wife is currently 53 years old. When I die, would my wife's spousal benefit at her full retirement age be equal to what I would be receiving at age 70 or be reduced? Also, if I were to die before 70 and before collecting social security, what would be my wife's survivor benefit at her full retirement age? **Signed: Older Husband**

**Dear Older Husband:** Your wife's survivor benefit as your widow will depend upon two things – the amount you were receiving (or were eligible to receive) at your death, and the age at which she claims her survivor benefit as your widow.

If you were receiving an increased benefit because you waited until age 70, your wife's benefit - if she has reached her full retirement age - will be 100% of the amount you were receiving at your death. If she hasn't yet reached her



full retirement age when she claims her survivor benefit (she could claim as early as age 60) the benefit will be actuarially reduced according to the number of months prior to her full retirement age (FRA) that she claims it. The amount of reduction for claiming her survivor benefit before her FRA is 0.396% for each full month earlier, which is 4.75% per year earlier than her FRA, to a maximum of 28.5%. And for clarity, your wife isn't required to take the survivor benefit immediately upon your death; she can wait until the benefit reaches 100% at her full retirement age, if desired and if financially feasible.

If your wife is also eligible for a SS benefit on her own work record and you die before she reaches her FRA, she will have the choice to take either her own Social Security benefit or her survivor benefit from you. If her survivor benefit will be her highest possible benefit, she would have the option to take her own SS retirement benefit from her own work record first and delay taking the larger survivor benefit until it reaches maximum at her FRA. Or, if her own benefit at age 70 would be more than her survivor benefit

from you, she could take the smaller survivor benefit first and delay taking her own SS benefit until it reaches maximum at age 70 and switch to her own benefit at that time. The goal is for her to get the highest possible benefit for the rest of her life.

Finally, if you were to die before you started collecting your increased Social Security benefit at age 70, your wife would still have the same options, but her survivor benefit amount would be based upon the amount you were eligible to receive at your death, even though you were not yet collecting. In other words, all those delayed retirement credits (DRCs) you are now earning (and will continue to earn until you are 70) will not be lost – the benefit you have earned up to the point you die will be what your wife's survivor benefit is based upon.

## Chico Woman Pleads Guilty to Vehicular Manslaughter

**BUTTE COUNTY, CA (MPG)** - A Chico woman charged with manslaughter in a deadly 2019 crash on East Avenue in Chico, appeared in court and pled as charged to charges of Gross Vehicular Manslaughter and Reckless Driving Causing Injury.

In April 2019, Amery May Sweany, 23, of Chico, careened down East Avenue at speeds over 70 mph. Multiple witnesses reported seeing Sweany swerving around other cars on the road and weaving in and out of traffic as she approached the intersection at Marigold Avenue. Sweany ignored the red light and ran her car into a vehicle driven by Virgil Santos, 64, of Chico. Virgil's wife, Shelly Santos, 52, was a passenger in the vehicle.

Mr. Santos succumbed to injuries sustained from the collision, and died at Enloe Hospital. Ms. Santos sustained major injuries and underwent multiple surgeries in the months following the collision.

While in custody at the Butte County Jail, Ms. Sweany assaulted two correctional officers, punching one, and spitting on the other. In court, Ms. Sweany also plead to one count

of Resisting an Officer and one count of Battery upon an Officer, both misdemeanors.

District Attorney Mike Ramsey noted Sweany's case was delayed as her defense attorney sought to have her declared mentally incompetent to stand trial. A court-appointed psychologist finally opined she was competent to stand trial. Her attorney then attempted to place her into a mental health diversion program, but the Butte County Behavioral Health Department found she was unsuitable. Once she was finally set for jury trial, Sweany changed her plea to no contest.

Ramsey said Sweany's actions were particularly egregious because although not under the influence, she nevertheless had detectable amounts of controlled substances in her system; she drove at a high rate of speed down a main street in Chico; and she showed no concern for the safety of those around her, causing death and serious injury. Ramsey said his office will seek the maximum sentence allowed at sentencing.

Sweany is scheduled to be sentenced on June 25, 2020 at 1:30. She faces a maximum term of 6 years, 8 months in State Prison. She remains in custody without bail pending sentencing. ★

# Remembering Crispus Attucks

Historians say that a dispute over a British soldier's unpaid barber bill led to the first fatal confrontation with the 'foreign' troops in Boston on March 5, 1770. The row killed five Americans escalating Colonial hostilities against England.

Today, it is ironic that local authorities with unconstitutional orders to close businesses due to the CCP (Chinese Communist Party) Flu, threatened and cited Marysville, CA barber Randy Mitchell, owner of four Upper Cuts shops. His crime was refusing to bow to Gavin Newsom to instead support his family.

Mitchell was right and the authorities were wrong. Upper Cuts remains open with a citation, a fine of \$1,000 and threats from the State Cosmetology Board and the local District Attorney.

Police say they were "just following orders" of Yuba-Sutter Counties Health Officer to close businesses, wear a muzzle and enforce 'socialist' distancing, all of which make people ill and ruin families financially. Police take an oath to defend the Constitution and are not required to enforce unlawful orders.

By obeying the unconstitutional decrees of Governor Newsom citizens rendered themselves slaves and subjects, agreeing with tyrants that rights come from government rather than God. The Constitution protects the physical and intellectual properties of citizens from being taken without due process.

(14th Amendment - No state shall make or enforce any law which shall abridge the privileges or immunities of citizens of the United States; nor shall any state deprive any person of life, liberty, or property, without due process of law; nor deny to any person within its jurisdiction the equal protection of the laws.)

In fact, the legislature never passed a law, not even an unconstitutional one to dupe the citizenry out of their freedom. It was simply taken by an order.

Government routinely violates laws with impunity trampling the rights of the people. Yuba County's illegal Measure K sales tax increase, later invalidated in Superior Court, and now on appeal by the county is a local example of tyrannical abuse of power removing \$10,000 each day from the citizens until the case is settled.

The problem with the CCP Flu orders is that the government snookered the citizens with fear (We're all going to die.) because it had no authority to coerce

people without due process. But citizens enslaved themselves voluntarily due to their ignorance and being groomed by their socialist teachers and politicians. Ignorant Americans don't know what they don't know.

On March 5, 1770, Boston was a town of around 16,000 occupied by 2,000-4,000 British troops. There was tension between soldiers and residents. (Remember that California Governor Newsom threatened his subjects with martial law should they not comply with his unlawful orders.) On that day 250 years ago a young lad began complaining that a British officer failed to pay his barber bill. (The officer denied the accusation.) When a British sentry started harassing the boy, a crowd of colonists gathered at Boston's Dock Square and began taunting the officer in return.

British reinforcements arrived. Tempers flared. The colonists began tossing snowballs, pebbles, and wood at the soldiers. Suddenly, there were gunshots. Six colonists were wounded, and another five killed.

Crispus Attucks, an escaped slave, sailor and patriot was the first killed with two bullets to the chest. Some say Attucks was the leading protester that day.

The irony is that a black / Native American familiar with the misery of slavery, and then being free, became the first to die in the fight for independence from Great Britain. Maybe his former suffering gave him a greater appreciation of being unshackled.

Did anyone remember Attucks this past Memorial Day?

Attucks, along with the four other victims – Samuel Gray, James Caldwell, Samuel Maverick, and Patrick Carr – were buried at Boston's Granary Burying Ground. The funeral procession attracted up to 10,000 people. It was recorded that "A greater number of persons assembled on this occasion, than ever before gathered on this continent for a similar purpose."

Three weeks after the massacre, Paul Revere made and distributed a print depicting the confrontation. Today, the Gilder Lehrman Institute of American History calls the illustration "Probably the most effective piece of war propaganda in American history."

This is again a time of resistance in America. We know the tyrants. Who will the next Attucks, Gray, Caldwell, Maverick and Carr's be?

# HHS Provides \$13 Million for COVID-19 Testing in Rural Communities in California

**U.S. Department of Health and Human Services**

**WASHINGTON, DC (MPG)** - The U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) through the Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA) provided \$13,107,276 to 265 Rural Health Clinics (RHCs) in California for COVID-19 testing. Nationally, \$225 million was awarded to over 4,500 RHCs across the country to support COVID-19 testing efforts and expand access to testing in rural communities. Rural Health Clinics are a special designation given to health care practices in underserved rural areas by the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) that help ensure access to care for rural residents.

This funding is through the Paycheck Protection Program and Health Care Enhancement Act that President Trump signed into law on Friday, April

24, 2020 which specifically directed these monies to be allocated to RHCs. HRSA funded RHC organizations based on the number of certified clinic sites they operate, providing nearly \$50,000 per clinic site.

“Today’s funding provides rural health clinics with resources and flexibility to boost their testing capabilities to fight COVID-19,” said HHS Secretary Alex Azar. “Further expanding testing capacity, including at RHCs, is a crucial element of safely reopening our country and helping Americans return to work and school. A safe reopening is vital for Americans’ health and well-being, and especially so for those living in rural areas, who may have struggled with access to healthcare long before COVID-19 and found care even harder to access during this crisis.”

“The funding may be used for a wide range of COVID-19 testing and related expenses including

planning for implementation of a COVID-19 testing program, procuring supplies to provide testing, training providers and staff on COVID-19 testing procedures, and reporting data to HHS on COVID-19 testing activities,” said HRSA Administrator Tom Engels. “Funds may also be used for building or construction of temporary structures, leasing of properties, and retrofitting facilities as necessary to support COVID-19 response.”

HRSA is also awarding \$500,000 to support technical assistance efforts to the RHCs as they expand testing capabilities. This includes activities such as conducting webinars, providing resources and guidance for implementation and management of testing programs.

## Signups For Pandemic Aid Program to Start Next Week

Farmers and ranchers who have suffered losses related to the COVID-19 pandemic will be able to apply for a federal aid program, beginning next week. The U.S. Agriculture Department announced Tuesday signups will start May 26 for the Coronavirus Food Assistance Program. The American Farm Bureau says many farmers have faced “unprecedented losses” from a breakdown in distribution channels during the pandemic.

## Pandemic Has Also Hurt Farmers’ Off-Farm Earnings

Along with roiling markets for farm products, the pandemic has cut off-farm income for many farm families. Most farmers or ranchers supplement agricultural income with off-farm jobs, but nearly half of those who responded to a California Farm Bureau survey said they had lost off-farm income due to the pandemic. An agricultural economist calls off-farm income “critical” for small farms, and

said many larger farms count on it, too.

## Record Blueberry Supplies Head Into A Difficult Market

Blueberry production from California farms will peak during the next two weeks and marketers say that, combined with the pandemic and a surge of imports from Mexico, has driven prices lower. The California Blueberry Commission says COVID-19 has slowed demand at both retail and restaurants as California builds toward a record crop. The commission says some farmers may have to decide whether to harvest all their blueberries this year.

## CVP Water Allocations Rise A Bit

April showers brought a slight increase in water availability for customers of the federal Central Valley Project. The U.S. Bureau of Reclamation, which operates the CVP, said Tuesday it will increase allocations for agricultural customers south of the Sacramento-San Joaquin Delta to 20%, up from 15%. The Friant water unit also will see a 5% increase in allocations, to 60%. ★

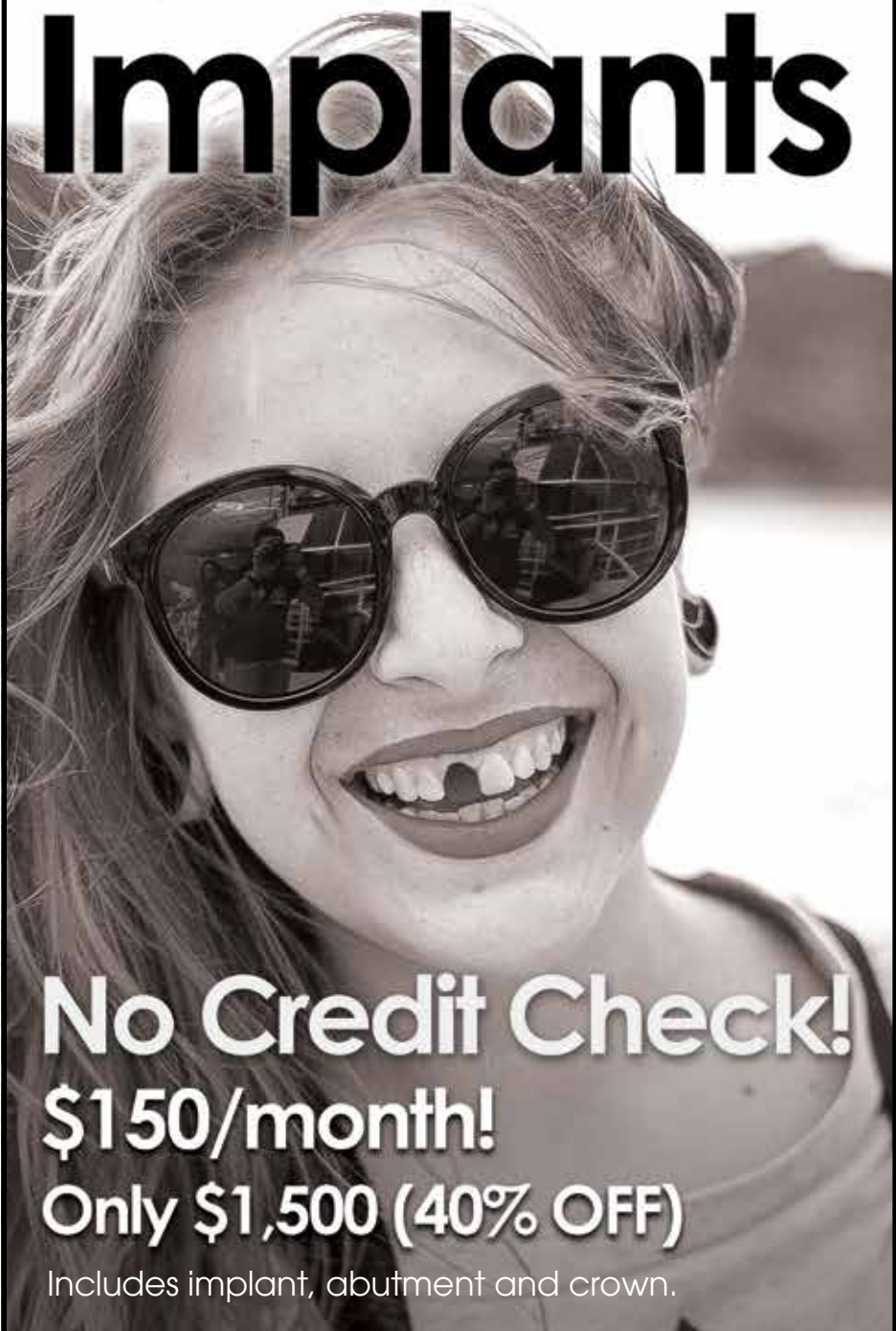
