Yuba Water Manager, Curt Aikens, to Retire

After 23 years of dedicated service to Yuba Water Agency, General Manager Curt Aikens will retire in January of 2021.

At last weeks board meeting, the agency's directors announced their acceptance of his retirement, with gratitude for his many years of service. The board also announced that they have chosen to appoint the assistant general manager, Willie Whittlesey, as the new general manager, effective July 1, 2020, at which time Aikens will assume a role focused on special projects.

"In my time here, we've grown the agency from about 20 people to around 75 to address opportunities and challenges," said Aikens. "We've done some really remarkable things in that time, which have

set Yuba County up for great success. It's been an incredible journey, and I look forward to spending my last year here really focused on a few critical projects that need extra attention to get them over the finish line."

"Curt has been such a vital part of the success of Yuba Water," said Randy Fletcher, the agency's board chairman. "During his time leading this organization, we have made incredible leaps and bounds in reducing flood risk and ensuring a sustainable water supply for the people of Yuba County. The other board members and I have 100 percent confidence in Willie as our selection to lead us into the future, as we continue to focus on those priority missions, but also transition more into other ways to improve the quality of life in Yuba County."

As the assistant general manager of Yuba Water Agency, Whittlesey assists with all aspects of agency operations and management including reducing flood risk, hydroelectric power generation, energy sales, water rights, water supply reliability, ecosystem improvements and more.

"Curt has really helped set this agency up for long-term success," said Whittlesey. "In the last three years, I've learned a lot from him, and

I'm grateful for his confidence in me, as well as the board's. I am honored, humbled and really excited about the opportunity to lead this agency into the next phase of our journey. I love managing the water and power, but am equally excited about some of the other things we are getting involved in now, like forest health, water education, economic development and other exciting new opportunities."

A registered professional forester, Whittlesey grew up in the Sierra Nevada foothills and has been working in the Yuba River watershed for 25 years in roles ranging from forestry to hydroelectric power generation. Prior to joining Yuba Water, he was with PG&E for 13 years.

Water Action Offers Opportunity for Cooperation

Bakersfield, Ca.

Last weeks signing of a record of decision coordinating federal and state water projects offers a hopeful sign, according to California Farm Bureau Federation President Jamie Johansson.

Johansson, who attended the ceremony in Bakersfield where President Trump announced signing of the document, said the action will add much-needed flexibility to operation of the federal Central Valley Project and State Water Project. He also thanked the president for signing a memo directing federal agencies to coordinate efforts to store

more water, offer regulatory certainty and improve protection of protected species.

"Farmers are optimists and this is a day for optimism," Johansson said. "The federal agencies have taken a holistic look at the California water system and offered an alternative that promises to improve the health of the environment without devastating people whose communities and livelihoods depend on reliable water supplies.

"We should embrace this new approach and give it a chance to succeed," he said. "We know all too well that the policies of the past 25-plus

years haven't worked."

Johansson said better coordination and improved flexibility of federal and state water project operations would benefit people throughout California.

"Federal and state officials need to be pulling in the same direction to assure the most efficient use of California water for fish and people," he said. "We hope people at all levels of government can cooperate on plans to enhance the environment, accommodate a growing population and maintain productive farms and ranches."

Johansson expressed disappointment in reports indicating the state government will sue over today's federal actions, and said solutions to California water problems will be found in constructive discussions, not in courtrooms.

"We have to get off the merry-go-round of endless litigation," he said. "No one benefits from that. Fisheries continue to suffer. Productive farmland goes unused. It's not a sustainable path for anyone. Farm Bureau will continue to advocate for practical, reasonable, cooperative ways to address California's water supply needs."

Ciccozzi Appellate Date No Big Deal

Yuba County Counsel Michael J. Ciccozzi wrote an opinion piece in the Appeal Democrat last week to explain why Nevada County law firm Colantuono, Highsmith and Whatley, PC, did not file Yuba's Measure K (sales tax increase) brief with the Appellate Court on time.

The brief was to explain the flaws in Superior Court Judge Stephen Berrier's September 9, 2019 ruling that Measure K was invalid. Measure K was pitched to voters as a tax for public safety (needing 2/3s approval) while touted by the county as only needing a majority vote to pass (for a general tax measure). It received 53.04% approval.

Not only is the county continuing to illegally use the people's money to hire Colantuono, Highsmith and Whatley, PC to defend the faulty measure but Ciccozzi's writing is pricy as well. His predecessor, Courtney Abril, was earning 187,378.03 annually (2018) according to Transparent California. After just 18 months on the job, Abril resigned for "family reasons" as the controversy erupted over Measure K's double-minded legalese.

Ciccozzi assures that the county will get its extension to file and says that the court's schedules are basically suggestions with grace periods attached. He further says that the extra time granted will allow the county to continue to "polish and complete" its arguments.

Although none of us are as intelligent as the County Counsel the county has had since 2017 to hone its arguments by using lawyers and public relations firms skilled at skinning the taxpayers on the citizens' dime.

Since Judge Berrier's ruling 163 days have come and gone to perfect the briefing due on February 19, 2020. That's really not enough time to produce government work according to Ciccozzi. However, for every day waiting, and now the "grace period" and then the trial Yuba County citizens lose \$10,000/day from the scam Measure.

A 15-day "grace period" costs Yuba County residents \$150,000 in additional sales taxes. Justice delayed is justice

Floods and Politics

For longtime local residents that have experienced the 1955, 1986 and 1997 floods in Yuba-Sutter Counties, you can skip all the studies and maps. These people would tell you develop more flood control, evacuate early and improve communication.

People have lacked those benefits. For newcomers, both Oroville Dam and the New Bullards Bar Dam were built after 1955 to primarily increase control of our raging rivers.

The December 24, 1955 deluge destroyed primarily Yuba City and Sutter County with the levee breaking off of Garden Hwy at Shanghai Bend. When the breach occurred, Marysville was already evacuated due to having the lowest levees. Many people and business assets relocated to Yuba City from Marysville.

In the end, 40,000 people would evacuate the surrounding area with over 600 needing to be rescued by boat or helicopter and 38 people dying in the floodwater. It was a devastating disaster and a strong lesson for the area that the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers calls "the most prone to intense flooding of any river valley in the United States."

The Feb. 20, 1986 and Jan. 2, 1997 levee breaks occurred behind the current WalMart in Linda (Yuba River) and on the Arboga levee (Feather River) at the end of Anderson Avenue. The one interesting change in flood emergency strategy after 1997 was to remove the Yuba County Board of Supervisors from making evacuation decisions.

"Two hours before the levee broke, we were told there were no problems with the levee, yet my understanding was they were working on boils at noon," said Supervisor Al Amaro in 1997.

By 11 a.m. on Jan. 2, the Feather River gauge at Yuba City reached 77.5 feet, the level at which a mandatory evacuation should have been declared. About seven hours later, Marysville, Yuba City and Sutter County ordered an evacuation. Yuba County officials didn't evacuate until the Arboga levee gave way.

Yet Sheriff Gary Tindel had requested of the Supervisors that evacuations begin one-two weeks prior. He was denied. He was also voted out next election after being the scapegoat for the Supervisors' botched decision-making.

Politicians know little to nothing about flood crises or dealing with people in extreme emergencies. After the 1997 debacle Yuba County gave the Sheriff and the Director of Emergency Services the power to declare evacuations.

The politicians wanted to avoid political fall-out from evacuations proving later to be unnecessary. In 1997, their foot-dragging cost 3 people's lives, tens of thousands of animals dying and mil-

denied. The court gave a deadline of February 19 and the county missed the date. Every day that passes is a day that taxpayers are forced and compelled to pay a tax that the Superior Court ruled unconstitutional.

Ciccozzi writes that the “citizens of Yuba County recognized the need for Measure K and a significant majority voted in favor of the Measure.” According to Judge Berrier the number of voters agreeing with Measure K was not significant enough to create a special tax.

Some believe the attorneys were instructed by County leadership to not file the brief to avoid the contents becoming campaign fodder before election-day, March 3. Three supervisors and County Administrator Robert Bendorf’s wife Melanie are campaigning for office and all supported the Measure

K sales tax increase.

Michael ‘no big deal’ Ciccozzi’s words for taxpayers and supervisors to ignore the rules haven’t always worked out. He left a wake of financial pain from his bad advice for El Dorado County (EDC) Supervisors where he previously worked. He encouraged them to ignore their responsibility to perform 5-year studies to justify charging property owners mitigation fees.

In November 2019, after he resigned from EDC, the 3rd District Court of Appeals ruled in Austin v El Dorado County that the county must refund to citizens their mitigations fees plus interest totaling about \$35 million. Why? The county did not perform the state-mandated studies to prove there was still a need for the assessments.

In opposition to the EDC Auditor-Controller’s admonition years before

that the county was in violation of the Mitigation Fees Act, Ciccozzi told the supervisors they need not do the studies and there would be no consequences.

EDC Auditor-Controller Joe Harn said recently about the ruling, “The decision is very discouraging because the county could’ve very easily avoided this costly litigation by simply following state law.” Then EDC Administrator Terri Daly, now with Yuba Water Agency and earning \$232,428.50 (2018 Transparent California), joined Ciccozzi to oppose Harn and state law.

It is rare indeed for bureaucrats and politicians to be held responsible for their neglect of duty or the law, thereby costing the citizens hundreds of millions of dollars. They simply jump to another job and sumptuous salary.

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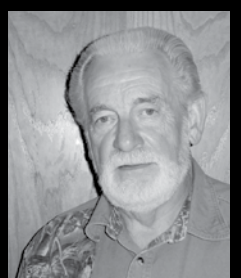

The sturgeon are beginning to show in the upper Sacramento River. We need rain to muddy up the water in order to increase the run. With no rain in sight it appears sturgeon will not be as plentiful as we had hoped for. As far as the striper run goes some fish are showing up, but it is a little early according to the calendar but maybe not according to the fish. Expect tough conditions if the rivers remain low, especially the Feather River. We do not anticipate any large releases from local dams due to the low water level of same. However, if one puts on his thinking cap there were many years when the water level was up and down as it was released on the Sacramento River when the striped bass were here.

Fishing is about the same as last week with some trout being taken in local reservoirs. Collins Lake is planting trout and will continue the program into spring. Bullard’s Bar is still on the hook for small kokanee. Lake Oroville is still slow but some are picking up a few salmon

trolling the middle of the lake down deep. A few trout are still being cooperative at Englebright Reservoir. Best bet it to troll around the houseboats.

Look for things to bust wide open due to the

warm weather ahead. Expect schools of striped bass to be available in the Sacramento River anytime soon.

Closing thought: “Sharp hooks are the name of the game for successful fishing.”

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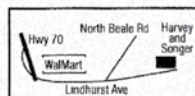
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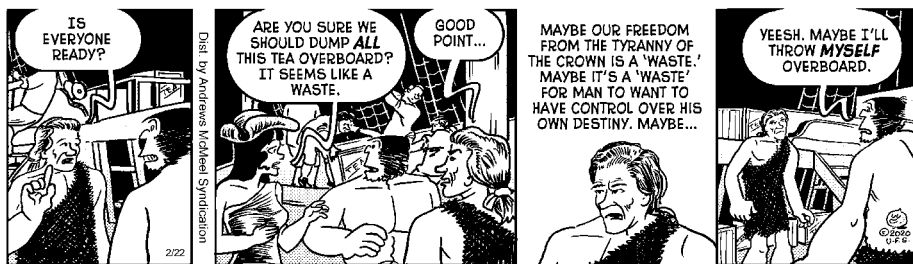

John Augustus Sutter

now Northern California. Think Suttersville, Sutter Creek, Sutter Street in San Francisco, Sutter City and Sutter streets in towns all over the state and of course, Sutter's Fort. The fort was massive, 18 feet high walls three feet thick. However, ill fortune continued to dog him. When James Marshall discovered gold in 1848 on Sutter's land in Coloma Sutter knew the news could be disastrous for him so he and Marshall tried to keep it a secret. When the gold discovery became public, workers left their tools in the fields and went immediately to search for gold. Would be miners flooded into the area from all over the world, squatted on his land, his crops went unharvested. According to Richard Dillon in Fools Gold, Sutter said "I have been robbed and ruined by lawyers and politicians...my cattle were driven off by hungry gold miners; my fort and mills were deserted and left to decay; my lands were squatted on by overland immigrants; and finally, I was cheated out of all my property. All Sacramento was once mine." Bad decisions and mountains of debt continued to plague him. Retiring to the Hock farm he had succeeded in securing a pension from the California legislature of \$250 per month. The peaceful existence he envisioned was short-lived however when arsonists burned his buildings and crops in 1865. By 1871 he and Anna moved to Lititz, Pennsylvania where he spent much of his time traveling to Washington, D.C. seeking redress and reimbursement from the federal government. In fact, he died in June, 1880 in a hotel room on one of these trips. John is buried in God's Acre, the Moravian Graveyard in Lititz. His wife died 6 months later and is buried with him.

Many portraits of John Sutter were painted dur-

ing his years in California. One of the most famous was by the well known, well respected artist William S. Jewett. Commissioned by the governor to paint John Sutter in his military finery he received \$2500 for his work. An artist's copy of this painting by Jewett was given to the Yuba County Historical Resources Commission recently and is currently hanging in Marysville City Hall. The name on the front is D. Boysza who is presumably the artist. This portrait of Sutter hung for years in the Sutter House restaurant in Yuba City and has languished in a closet for many years.

The Commission invites everyone to go by City Hall during weekdays and view this painting of one of the best known founding fathers of California; John Sutter whose generosity was paired with cruelty and exploitation and whose failures turned out to be as big as his dreams.

The Yuba County Historical Resources Commission is dedicated to preserving and highlighting the rich history of Yuba County. Commission members are appointed by the Yuba County Board of Supervisors. Legislation would enhance pest inspections

Efforts to keep agricultural pests and diseases out of California and the U.S. would receive a boost from legislation passed by Congress. The bill provides funding to add more agricultural inspectors and "sniffer dogs" at airports and seaports, to check for produce and animal products that might carry exotic pests. Supporters of the bill say invasive pests and diseases cost the economy and environment alike. President Trump is expected to sign the bill.

UC to document impact of grazing for fire prevention

More frequent and damaging wildfires have heightened the need for updated research

on how livestock grazing helps reduce fire hazard, and the University of California Cooperative Extension says it will begin such a study. A UC livestock advisor says grazing is the most widespread practice to lessen grasses and reduce the speed and intensity of fire but notes that some public land management agencies don't allow grazing.

Mushroom farmers battle rising production costs

Rising business costs have put the squeeze on California mushroom farmers. Growers say higher wages and other costs contribute to a decline in mushroom production. California remains the No. 2 mushroom producing state, behind Pennsylvania. Farmers grow

mushrooms inside, under strict climate control, with a growing cycle that usually takes 11 or 12 weeks.

Berry powder can delay ice cream from melting

To help keep ice cream from melting too fast, researchers have come up with a new, natural solution: freeze-dried strawberry powder. A scientist at a US Agriculture Department lab in Albany tried powder from several different berries to act as a stabilizer in making ice cream, and determined strawberry powder worked best. The powder could be used to complement other products now being used, though ice cream makers would need to account for the added berry flavor.

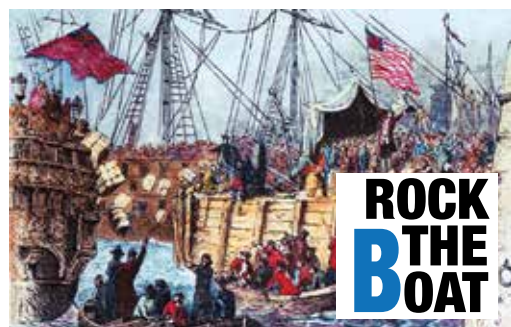

lions of dollars of damage to assets that could have been moved from harm's way.

February 7, 2017, the Oroville Dam Spillway failure caused a downstream evacuation initiated by Butte County Sheriff Kory Honea after overhearing concerned crisis managers at the dam. Being warned of the threat of a new type of flood calamity people evacuated.

Faced with the usual limited exits from cities there was gridlock while Yuba City and Sutter County gave opposing evacuation orders. The other trouble in 2017 was poor and faulty communication in general.

In spite of social media, websites, and cell phones, not being able to rely on a radio station that would simply give out facts and local instructions was a bummer. The amount of social media hearsay and fake news was worse than nothing at all and a big step backward compared to radio station briefings connected to crisis managers.

Recently, Yuba Water Agency provided a grant of \$65,000 to buy "flood and levee inundation maps and associated products" for the Office of Emergency Services. The grant request said the money was "critical for emergency response efforts for public safety." Sounds like money for a clean-up operation versus proactively preventing loss.

In reading the details it seems that the new mapping will tell where the flood water will flow and stand the deepest and longest. Hopefully the people, animals and assets are long gone by then. The study tools won't help in the middle of the crisis getting people out via the limited and overwhelmed escape routes.

It's the same problem that always has been. In fact, there are no new roads or highways being built or in the works to enhance evacuations. Due to politicians being bought-off, Marysville is the biggest choke-point in the region even on a nonemergency good day.

Taxpayers fear that so many studies and reports to save the world end up lost in a cabinet a decade later. The need that does not change in a flood is early evacuation and 'old school' radio communication. The rest is a mop-up effort.

Taking Financial Matters into your own hands

Although we are a month and half into the New Year, and covered some feel good resolutions in January, now is the time to look into another type of resolution.

Financial resolutions are good ones to make and keep. Unlike joining a gym then dropping out because it's too hard to keep going day after day, let alone the effort it takes to stay on a Stairmaster or treadmill, financial resolutions can pay huge dividends.

Like many resolutions, the task at hand should not have the proverbial bar set so high, it's discouraging. The best resolutions have easy to reach goals, gently moving you along to your final goal, whatever that is.

Taking financial matters into one's own hand should be based on the belief that "education is the cornerstone of progress".

Keeping that in mind, a good place to start is to make a promise to yourself to embark on a few simple tasks to begin your education. No need to get a degree in economics or become a stock whiz. Instead just start reading some financial websites or books on stocks and their markets. Forget the "magic systems" and trading techniques that many publications may promise are the next Holy Grail in trading profits. Instead focus on simple descriptions and explanations of what a stock is, what a bond is, what a dividend is and how stock markets work. Starting with this basic overall understanding of what investing is and how things operate. This is the starting point. Forget the complicated stuff. I find few investors understand these basics, and even some advisors and financial professionals are woefully lacking in their basic understanding of the markets they are trading in. In fact, many are just sales people, placing clients into the funds they are told to without really understanding what affects the underlying markets they play in.

Instead of a stock book, a beginning economic book might be better well suited for those wanting to get a basic understanding. I would rather have an investor that comprehends basic economics yet has little stock knowledge than someone who knows nothing about the economy but claims to have stock trading knowledge. The latter is a dangerous combination. It's like being great at paddling a kayak yet knowing nothing about how the bodies of water flow they will be navigating behave.

I have seen such "gaping holes" the body of financial knowledge exhibited by many and it can be a costly lesson. In my opinion one has to understand the economy and how it works to successfully trade or invest in the markets that represent them.

Much like the business owners that over expanded during the real estate boom, their lack of the macro-economic knowledge (the overall view of what was happening in the economy around them) proved their undoing. Despite the fact many of these business owners may have been excellent managers in their respective endeavors, their failure to comprehend the causes and effects of the boom-bust cycle that was occurring in the real estate market extracted

a heavy price on many. Thousands of companies went bankrupt during the bust and many more barely survived, having to scale down to take huge losses to prevent dissolution.

Forget the "how to trade stocks" books. Leave the "become a day trader millionaire" subscriptions where you found them. On the library shelves and websites you stumbled upon. Instead google up a Economics for dummies book, follow it up with a Stock Market for dummies publication, or something along those lines and start there. Read a few pages a day, or even a few pages a week. Forget the huge milestones and just start reading when you feel like it. Your only goal should be to read some of these beginning books without the pressure of huge milestones.

The resolution should be to start, and not nec-

essarily finish by a certain date. Those kind of firm resolutions can be discouraging if find yourself falling behind.

By starting with an easy and basic economics book or articles, and beginning to understand how economies function, you will be better prepared to move on to actual stock books later.

The Many Flaws of Prop. 13, the 2020 Imposter

A couple of months ago, this column sounded the alarm concerning the big statewide school bond on the March 2020 ballot.

Voters have already started casting their ballots on this measure, ironically identified as Proposition 13 (2020). Unlike the beneficial Prop. 13 from 1978, this Prop. 13 is a huge \$15 billion statewide school bond that threatens taxpayers in several ways. And the more we learn about this proposal, the worse it gets.

Although the amount of debt is “only” \$15 billion — setting a new record for school bonds — the total cost will be \$27 billion when interest costs are added.

We also pointed out that Prop. 13 (2020) is a huge threat to California property owners. While it is true that the bond itself, plus interest, will be repaid out of the state’s general fund, local school districts are usually required to provide matching funds. Those matching funds are generated by local bond measures, which are repaid exclusively by property owners. The threat to homeowners is that, if Prop. 13 (2020) passes, those debt limits are nearly doubled.

After our original column ran back in November concerning the debt limit increase, several taxpayers inquired as to where that language could be found in the text of Prop. 13 in the ballot pamphlet, the state’s Official Voter Information Guide. And there’s the rub. Proposition 13 (2020) was placed on the ballot by the legislature through the passage of Assembly Bill 48.

The language of the law relating to the debt limit, under the terms of the bill, takes effect if Prop. 13 passes. However, this language relating to the debt limit is nowhere to be found in the text of the ballot measure that is printed in the voter guide.

The provisions of AB48 regarding the local debt caps aren’t the only provisions not appearing in the printed text of Prop. 13. The same is true with the language relating to the preferences for construction projects that employ “project labor agreements.”

These agreements, as noted previously, can result in 25-30% higher construction costs and freeze out non-union construction companies from competing for the business. That’s money that could actually be spent building and refurbishing more school projects that benefit our children.

What’s the response to criticism that the voter guide is missing many of the important provisions of AB 48 that will take effect if

Prop. 13 (2020) passes?

First, it is argued that it’s a common practice in ballot measures to incorporate additional legal provisions by reference to them. To require that the full and complete text of the law be included in the ballot pamphlet could substantially increase the costs of printing ballot material. Second, other material in the voter guide summarizes the provisions of AB 48 that would take effect with Prop. 13’s passage.

We don’t buy it, especially in the context of Prop. 13 (2020). The provision increasing the debt limits is short and could easily have been included in the text of the measure so that voters could actually read it. At a minimum the voter guide should include a statement at the start of the printed text of the law explaining that other provisions would also become law if the proposition passes, and there should be a link printed in the booklet that allows voters to find and read the text online.

It is regrettable that there is a lack of transparency with respect to the impact the passage of Prop. 13 (2020) would have. Our political leaders have perfected to an art form the ability to keep things hidden from voters and taxpayers. They need to be held accountable at the ballot box and we can begin that process by voting no on the 2020 measure that’s labeled Prop. 13.

Tamika Hamilton Endorsed by Sutter County Republican Central Committee



Tamika Hamilton, candidate for Congress in the Third Congressional District, has been endorsed by the Sutter County Republican Central Committee. Central Committee Chairwoman Jerrie Libby said the endorsement was given because the Committee believes that Hamilton has a solid platform and the best chance

of defeating incumbent John Garamendi. Hamilton is a wife, mother, veteran and community activist. She served 14 years of active duty with the Air Force during which she was stationed at five different bases and saw two deployments in the Middle East as part of Operation Enduring Freedom, the United States Global War on Terror. She was awarded the Air Force Achievement Medal, Joint Service Accommodation Medal, Air Force Meritorious Unit Award and the Air Force Good Conduct Medal. She is now an active Air Force reservist. Tamika and her husband, Ray, live in Dixon

with their four children. Ray is a veteran of the US Navy and now serves as a local police officer. Hamilton says it was her homeless ministry, particularly her work with homeless veterans, that caused her to take a stand for her community and run for Congress. Libby says the committee will do everything possible to help Hamilton win the 3rd Congressional seat. Hamilton has been endorsed by seven of the eight Republican Central Committees in Congressional District 3 and was also recently endorsed by the California Republican Party.

Farm Bureau Opposes ‘Split-Roll’ Tax Initiative

Warning that an initiative on property taxes threatens harm to rural communities, the California Farm Bureau Federation has voted to oppose it. Known as Initiative 19-0008, the measure would establish a split-roll property tax that would reassess commercial and industrial property, including agricultural facilities. Backers are collecting signatures to qualify the initiative for the November ballot.

“It’s unusual for Farm Bureau to oppose a measure at this early stage, but our board of directors is very concerned about the impact this initiative would have on rural California,” CFBF President Jamie Johansson said. “Although its backers claim agricultural land would not be affected, the initiative would trigger annual tax reassessments at market value for agricultural improvements such as barns, dairies, wineries,

processing plants, vineyards and orchards.” Johansson said Farm Bureau opposes efforts to weaken Proposition 13, the 1978 tax-reform measure that limits property tax increases. “Proposition 13 protects California farmers by giving them certainty about their property tax bills,” he said. “The split-roll measure would increase the tax burden on California farmers at a time when family farms and ranches already face threats to their water supplies and rising costs to comply with the state’s employment and environmental regulations.” Johansson said measures that increase costs for family farmers and ranchers undermine their ability to supply jobs, especially in rural California, and their ability to supply food and farm products for customers in California and worldwide. “The split-roll tax initiative would add more economic pressure on rural areas that are already under strain, and that’s why we oppose it,” he said.

Four Local Agencies Received a Financial Boost with Help of Yuba Water Agency

Marysville, Ca.

Yuba County inundation mapping - \$65,000

A \$65,000 grant provides funding for Yuba County to procure flood and levee inundation maps and associated products, providing critical information for emergency response efforts for the safety of the people who live and work in Yuba County. This work is the result of lessons learned from the Oroville spillway incident evacuation and it will provide Yuba County with better tools to inform the implementation of evacuation routes and procedures, and to help prioritize specific areas of impact, depending on the type of flood event. \$25,000 will be used to obtain an updated, hardcopy set of potential levee breach locations in the Yuba County region. The remaining \$40,000 will be used to study the feasibility of a real-time flood inundation mapping tool that could potentially be used to simulate complex levee failure modes for training purposes and for managing actual flood events. These products will support Yuba Water’s flood protection mission through improving coordination and the effectiveness of emergency response efforts during flood events.

Camptonville Community Services District drinking water system repairs - \$51,000

Yuba Water Agency also approved a grant for the Camptonville Community Services District to help repair its drinking water system. The structure that the district uses to deliver water to the community of Camptonville, known as the Campbell Gulch diversion structure, sustained damage from high creek flows as a result of major rain events. The \$51,000 grant provides funding for the district to plan, design and repair the structure, so that the community’s drinking water won’t be compromised by another high-flow event. Yuba Water Agency is able to fund these repairs because it will help ensure a sustainable water supply for Camptonville’s residents.

Yuba County Sheriff’s Department environmental crimes investigations - \$30,000

A \$30,000 grant provides funding for the Yuba County Sheriff’s Department to investigate environmental crimes related to the cultivation of marijuana within the Yuba River watershed. The funding will specifically be used by the department to conduct searches of potential grows, limiting illegal water diversions and further damage to the Yuba River caused by the harmful chemicals that are often used. Yuba Water Agency is able to provide these funds because it will help improve water quantity and quality in the Yuba River.

Wheatland Fire Authority rescue equipment - \$10,000

This grant will help the Wheatland Fire Authority purchase a self-bailing raft and a special multipod system, which will allow first-responders to create high ground when it is not available. This new equipment will enhance the department’s rescue capabilities and improve its efficiency when responding to water-related emergencies by alleviating the need for responders to enter the water. Like all Bill Shaw Grants, the agency is able to make these funds available because the first-responders may be called upon to provide emergency support to Yuba Water Agency’s facilities and staff, or to people recreating at its lakes or on the Yuba River. Yuba Water Agency’s Bill Shaw Rescue Equipment and Training Grant Program, which was created in 2018, is designed for first-responder agencies in Yuba County and will cover the one-time costs of up to \$10,000 per applicant annually, associated with the purchase of rescue equipment and specialized personnel training. Since its inception, the program has supported 14 agencies with \$178,500 in grants.
