## Links and Lores Two Schools of Thought

While visiting Marysville during the Emancipation Celebration on January 1, 1873, Jennie Carter of Nevada City accompanied Sophia Duplex to view the improvements made in the basement school at Mt. Olivet Baptist Church located at Sixth and High streets. Although only thirteen children attended, Carter found the schoolroom "furnished with modern furniture, maps, and a faithful teacher". It was a far cry from what she had witnessed during a previous visit in 1869.

During that year, Carter observed confusion, noise and a lack of discipline among the 22 children in attendance. The school furniture included "broken down desks and benches" with some children sitting on seats without any backs to them. The whole experience was a "disgrace to Marysville-to the Board of Education a burning shame".

In contrast, the Ne-

vada City African-American students met in a previous schoolhouse furnished with "patent desks just the same as the white school". According to Delilah Beasley in her book "The Negro Trail Blazers", the building was purchased on Pine Street and was opened on the first of January, 1860. George A. Cantine, a former Marysville resident, was the teacher with an attendance of between 14-18 students.

Carter always maintained that parents should visit the schools often and show interest in what their children were learning. "They would become accustomed to strange faces", she noted. "They could recite without so much embarrassment". She also believed that "parents give the teacher their cooperation and see that their children obey". "I can assure them they will lift great burdens from the teacher's shoulders and

reap a harvest of joy in the conduct of their children".

It was also important to Carter that parents should see that their children attended school every day. Once again, she encouraged parents to visit the school often in order to see for themselves the progress their children were making.

On February 26, 1874, a decision was rendered by Chief Justice Wallace whereas the "rights of colored children to attend schools with white children unless such separate schools be actually maintained for the education of colored children, then the latter have a legal right to resort to schools where children are instructed, and cannot be legally excluded therefrom by reason of race or color".

As soon as news of this Supreme Court decision reached the Marysville community, a group assembled and the Rev. Thomas Randolph spoke about those involved in this major effort. Among those from Nevada County were Elijah Booth, Dennis Carter, husband of Jennie Carter; and Isaac Sanks. Those representing Yuba County were Robert Saline, the Rev. J.B. Handy and the Rev. Randolph. Edward Duplex was appointed to serve on the Executive Committee. "They worked with a oneness of purpose and a unity of action until the object was accomplished", according to the Rev. Randolph.

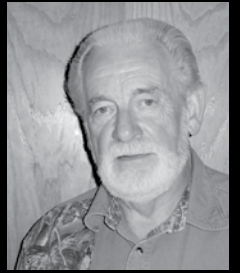
By 1875, all California schools were integrated. That year the Duplex family moved to Wheatland. Children Edward Parker Duplex Jr. and his sister Louisa often were listed on the honor rolls in the Wheatland Graphic newspaper. Old photos also reveal African American students attending the Sutter County Meridian school during the 1880s as well as pictured in the 1884 graduating class from the Garfield School in Grass Valley.

The last feature of this series--A Voice is Silenced-- will include the passing of Jennie Carter and will be in a November issue.

Reports tell us the salmon run has slowed again and is expected to pick up soon. Both the Sacramento and Feather Rivers have been slow going with the salmon bite. Some fish are being caught, but we are told it is a hit and miss situation at this time. Guides and the rest of us are waiting for October and better fishing. However, the fish that are being caught are beautiful fish, bright and silver with big boys in the mix.

We checked with our weather source and he advises the current cool weather pattern is expected to be with us for another week or so and then the warmer days will be back. He also predicted an early fall this year with showers and snow coming our way on the valley floor and up in the Sierra Nevada Mountains.

The Department of Fish and Wildlife planted Lake Davis last week with rainbow trout which included some bigger fish in the mix. The Walker fire is now almost contained and while the fire did not impact the reservoir it still caused some air traffic in the region.

The hot spot for mackinaw lake trout at Lake Tahoe is its south shore at this time. The north shore has picked up some with good to fair results. Rainbow trout are reported to be holding at around 100 feet down with some swimming in the shallower water.

Donner Lake is also putting out mackinaw lake trout for shore anglers but the fish are small.

Foul weather and high winds have really slowed down the fishing at Lake Almanor. Reports tell us only the diehards who go out in the lake are scoring some action but ba-

sically it is slow here.

Kokanee Salmon are still biting at Bullard's Bar Reservoir but are not the best bet at this time due to the changes caused by their entering spawning stage. The fish have turned dark.

Folsom Lake is producing nice bass, but the trout fishing has slowed considerably. The reservoir is still almost full and has begun to drop a bit. Water temperature is around 73 to 75 degrees. Most boat ramps are open.

selling the parts. Well, what about condoms? How many of those do we use a day Kamala? Are they found in the ocean or in the nose of a turtle? Should we ban condoms to save the flora and fauna?

## Sutter County Museum Opens Simple Objects Exhibit

This fall, the Sutter County Museum will be hosting the exhibit Simple Objects: An Excavation. This exhibit is a collaboration between Sacramento artist Stephanie Taylor, who was born in Butte County, and writer Christy Heron-Clark, who was born and raised in Paradise. Together, the pair visited Christy's two adjacent family homes in Paradise, after the Camp Fire, to find objects that might have survived. While Christy responds to these simple objects with recollections of her treasured childhood, Stephanie ponders each as it exists now, altered and transformed.

The exhibit is an installation of written recollections, photography, drawings, and rescued objects. It tells a story of the intimacy of personal loss and the impact of wildfire on communities. Simple Objects explores the concepts of what we retain when we lose, and how we can move forward with resilience.

The exhibit will be on display September 28 to December 1.

Alongside this exhibit, we will be displaying works created by artists in the Yuba-Sutter region

in response to the Cascade Fire, the Camp Fire, and other major fires that impacted Northern California in the last few years. ## Farmers, restaurants, chefs urge passage of USMCA

More than a dozen chefs and restaurants joined California food and agricultural organizations this week in urging Congress to pass the U.S.-Mexico-Canada Agreement. In a letter to the California congressional delegation, the coalition said the USMCA would include improvements that would help California agriculture to trade fairly, which benefits farmers, restaurants and their customers by assuring availability of high-quality ingredients and affordable dining experiences.

## Water year 2019 leaves reservoirs with good storage



As the water year comes to a close on Sept. 30, a California Department of Water Resources storage summary showed all but three reservoirs listed running at or above their historical average. However, the wet year did not provide full water supplies for all. Customers of the State Water Project and south-of-delta agricultural water contractors of the federal Central Valley Project had 75% supplies, a fact some agriculture advocates say points to the need for additional storage.

## Big pistachio crops find growing markets

California farmers are producing more pistachios to meet rising global demand. This year's harvest, currently underway, is expected to produce the third-largest crop in state history, and growers expect to produce the state's first billion-pound crop next year. Rising affluence in China and India, coupled with increasing health consciousness globally, are buoying demand for the nut, which has enjoyed brisk exports to China despite tariffs resulting from the ongoing trade war.

## UC Riverside and citrus sector unveil state-of-the-art lab

In a ribbon-cutting ceremony and press conference on Thursday, project sponsors will unveil a new state-of-the-art lab in Riverside aimed at protecting California's \$3.3 billion citrus sector from the fatal citrus plant disease Huanglongbing, or HLB. The result of a partnership between the state's citrus growers and University of California, Riverside, The Biosafety Level-3 Lab will enable scientists to conduct research with plant pathogens that previously couldn't be done in Southern California.

## This Month In Your Garden

Welcome to October. It is usually a nice month bringing cooler weather giving us welcome hints that fall is pushing summer into the background. Changing seasons that are noticeable certainly make the weather more interesting. October is one of the most enjoyable months for me. All of the fall color that begins creeping into the landscape is a pleasure to see. October can be a very busy month for a gardener and is the best time of the year to plant trees, shrubs and perennials. The soil retains the heat from the long hot summer on into the winter months, the air begins to cool, top growth slows, and deciduous plants lose their leaves as they go dormant. The roots, however will continue to expand in the warm soil and slow their growth as the soil cools with the winter temperatures. Not having to support the top growth of leaves, the roots will continue to grow slowly through those winter months making them almost a year ahead of a tree planted in the spring that has to support root growth as well as top growth while becoming established.

Considering that October has warmer soil, but cooling temperature as we go into the cold winter months, it is quite obvious that many things can be planted and thrive, but the planting should be done early enough that they can become established before the very cold weather comes along. Even the cool weather plants that are not fairly well established before encountering very cold temperatures might be stunted

by those cold temperatures. They withstand the very cold temperatures but may not develop and flourish until the warmer spring temperatures. All of the color and pretty foliage could have been enjoyed all winter long by earlier planting. This same message applies to other things as well, such as a winter vegetable garden, and ground covers. They do best with this early warm soil to help them become established. Plant root vegetables such as beets, turnips, carrots and radishes from seed now. Edible peas are cool weather plants, as well as sweet peas that bloom with the lovely fragrant flowers in early spring, and they all can be planted now. If you are planning a winter vegetable garden, it is time to get it done. I know some folks were anxious and have their gardens all planted by now.

The best time to plant California native plants is in the fall when they are going dormant. They then become established naturally by Mother Nature during the cooling of the warm soil. They can be more difficult to get started in the spring since most of them are quite drought tolerant and they are easily ruined by over watering them as the weather gets hotter. Let them become established naturally, and then water them being careful not to drown them during the summer months. It's much easier to let Mother Nature get them started.

This is the time to plant other things. Bulbs are available now, or soon will be. Get them planted for the beautiful variety and color they add to the yard. They are a bit of work to plant, but they

may repeat year after year. Gophers can be a problem since they like some of them. Narcissus and daffodils are in the same family and they are safe from the gophers and can naturalize in your yard. Iris are also safe from gophers. Wildflower seeds should be scattered anytime now. Because some of the seeds are very small, it is a good idea to mix them thoroughly with some sand or other medium to add some bulk to make them scatter more evenly, and also to cover a wider area. In September it was suggested that fertilizing should be done, but it was so hot that it was hard to find just the right time. It can still be done if you weren't able to do it. Realize that trees with fall coloring or falling leaves probably won't utilize it well, but all the trees with green leaves and green shrubs will be fine.

It is hard to know what is ahead with the weather, but don't stop watering with the first sign of rain. The soil is very dry after summer and it will take more than a few rainfall events to moisten it down several feet to sustain vegetation without supplemental irrigation.

The transition into to fall is such a pleasant time of the year!

## Ad Astra

Starring: Brad Pitt, Tommy Lee Jones and Ruth Negga.  
Rated: PG-13, Runtime: 2 hours, 2 minutes.

An astronaut is sent on a mission to make contact with his father, who was presumed lost on a deep space mission. Along the way he takes time to reflect on what is truly valuable when faced with the vast nothingness of the Universe. His mission takes unexpected turns and leads him down dark paths, that he must face with only this mission and his conscience to guide him.

Ad Astra, earns three out of five, Terrifying Space Monkeys. The story is long and punctuated with muted plot points that link loosely together to form a more emotional journey that hard science fiction. The acting is tremendous and nuanced and the cinematography is beautiful.

## Trump Condemns Globalism, Touts Nationalistic View of Foreign Affairs at U.N.

On my way to punch out my weekly column last Wednesday, I caught conservative talk show host Rush Limbaugh regaling President Trump about his address to the U.N. General Assembly on Tuesday, September 24th. Limbaugh said it was one of the finest speeches he had heard the President give.

Well, Jimmy Crickets, our local daily ran a half page article by the L.A. Times on that story headlined "Trump briefly attends the U.N. climate summit"... and sure enough.. President Trump's name was only mentioned once in the article, when they related Trump was not expected to attend the U.N. summit but showed up briefly to listen to India's Prime Minister and Germany's Chancellor Angela Merkel."

That sounds as if Trump had showed up....had a cup of coffee...and left.

Trump actually gave a 37 minute address and was covered by two reporters for Reuters, Anne Gearan and Seung Min Kim.

Following is their version of Trump's visit...and 37-minute address in part to the United Nations General Assembly.

UNITED NATIONS — President Trump delivered one of his harshest critiques of globalism here Tuesday at the U.N. General Assembly, promoting the "America First" ethos that has defined his presidency on issues of defense, trade and immigration before a body built on international cooperation.

Trump read his address in a somber monotone, rarely punctuating words or pausing for emphasis, but his message for the 74th session of the annual gathering of world leaders was clear as he argued that a view of the world as a global commons had "exerted a religious pull over past leaders" at the expense of their own nations.

"The future does not belong to globalists. The future belongs to patriots," Trump said. "The future belongs to sovereign and independent nations who protect their citizens, respect their neighbors and honor the differences that make each country special and unique."

In his 37-minute address, Trump stressed that all nations must take care of themselves first while adding that the United States would get involved abroad only when its own interests were threatened.

He also used his platform Tuesday to take a hard line against Iran as tensions between the two countries escalate following an attack on a Saudi oil facility this month.

The United States — joined by Britain, France and Germany this week

— has blamed Iran for the attack on the oil facility, and during Tuesday's address, Trump called Iran "one of the greatest security threats facing peace-loving nations today."

"All nations have a duty to act. No responsible government should subsidize Iran's bloodlust," Trump said. "As long as Iran's menacing behavior continues, sanctions will not be lifted. They will be tightened."

But Trump's reluctance to escalate the standoff with Tehran into a military confrontation was on display later Tuesday when he teased a potential meeting with Iranian President Hassan Rouhani, saying that Iran "would like to negotiate" but that the two sides had not agreed to that "yet."

On immigration, Trump issued his characteristic warnings to migrants from Central America making the journey to the U.S. southern border, saying, "If you make it here, you will not be allowed in; you will be promptly returned home."

His message for those who he claims advocate "open border" policies was more stark.

"Your policies are not just. Your policies are cruel and evil," Trump said. "You put your own false sense of virtue before the lives, well-being and countless innocent people. When you undermine border security, you are undermining human rights and human dignity."

He said the United States had worked with several countries in Central America and highlighted El Salvador, which signed last week with the United States in an attempt to divert some of the record numbers of U.S.-bound migrants. Trump was scheduled to meet with the country's president, Nayib Bukele, last Wednesday, September 25th.

Trump said the United States has an "ambitious campaign to reform international trade" and stressed his desire to complete separate bilateral trade agreements with Britain and Japan. He discussed the issue with British Prime Minister Boris Johnson on Tuesday, September 25th and trade is sure to surface when Trump sits down with Japanese Prime Minister Shinzo Abe on Wednesday the 25th — particularly as Japanese concerns over auto tariffs are now stalling a deal between the two

China, the president said, has "embraced an economic model dependent on massive market barriers, heavy state subsidies, currency manipulation, product dumping, forced technology transfers and a theft of intellectual property." He

called for an overhaul of the World Trade Organization, arguing that China should not be able to use it to "game the system at others' expense."

"I will not accept a bad deal for the American people," Trump said.

"Iran would like to negotiate. We haven't really worked that out. They're here, we're here, but we have not agreed to that yet. But they would like to negotiate," he said. "And it would certainly make sense, but we have not agreed to that yet."

Trump would be the first U.S. president to meet with an Iranian leader since before the 1979 revolution that launched the Islamic republic and its clerical leadership. Direct diplomacy with Iran has long appealed to Trump, as he pursues a dual strategy of tightening sanctions and leaving a door open to talks.

The president spoke Tuesday of possible intercessions or support for talks from French President Emmanuel Macron, Pakistani Prime Minister Imran Khan and German Chancellor Angela Merkel.

In his U.N. address, Trump hit on several topics that have become familiar refrains back home and during his campaign rallies — but delivered Tuesday in a much more subdued fashion.

He touted unemployment rates for minority Americans and highlighted his diplomatic efforts with dictators such as North Korea's Kim Jong Un. Trump also criticized the influence of social media companies, saying they play too much of a role in silencing voices — echoing a critique by some conservatives.

And as he referenced the turmoil in Venezuela, Trump took the opportunity to swipe at socialism, calling it the "wrecker of nations and destroyer of societies."

"Socialism and communism are about one thing only: power for the ruling class," he said. "Today, I repeat a message for the world that I have delivered at home: America will never be a socialist country."

"The United States does not seek conflict with any other nation," Trump said. "We desire peace, cooperation and mutual gain with all. But I will never fail to defend America's interests."

Charlie's Comment: Well, I guess Rush Limbaugh was right, Our President had a hard-hitting speech but open for diplomacy.

This last "blackout" of true news by our local daily is rather blatant... and another dark spectacle on high ideals of journalism.

## Forbestown Ditch Piping Project Plan Approved

Brownsville, Ca.

In a major milestone for the Forbestown Ditch Piping Project, the North Yuba Water District (NYWD) Board of Directors approved the Project plans and scope of work during a special meeting earlier this month.

Approximately two years ago, NYWD received a \$500,000 planning grant from the California State Water Resources Control Board "Prop 1 funds" to complete this engineering phase of the Project, including creation of a construction plan and final construction budget, now estimated at \$10 Million.

With help from a second grant, awarded Monday, September 23, 2019 from the Yuba Water Agency for \$225,000, the Project will continue uninterrupted into permitting and environmental reviews, the final phase before construction.

Originally dug in the 1860's, the Forbestown Ditch is an unlined, open canal, approximately 10 miles long. The Ditch conveys water to the NYWD Treatment Pond, and is the sole source of drinking water for approximately 3,100

residents of Brownsville, Challenge, Rackerby and Forbestown.

Moving to a piped Ditch will lower the possibility of breaches like the those recently experienced in 2017 and 2018. A piped Ditch will also save a significant amount of water lost from seepage and evaporation, increase the amount of water available for customers and eliminate a vast majority of dirt, trash and contamination from entering the treatment pond.

"Our customers have endured massive blowouts on the Ditch, and periods of uncertainty with their drinking water," said NYWD General Manager, Jeff Maupin. "Piping the Ditch was literally a 'pipe dream' until a few years ago. Now through the actions of our Board of Directors and the availability of Prop 1 funds, piping the Ditch is finally a possibility."

NYWD was recently designated as a Severely Disadvantaged Community (SDAC) with an annual median household income less than 60 percent of the Statewide annual income. Potential funding sources to complete the construc-

tion include an additional Prop 1 grant of up to \$5 Million from the State and a matching grant of up to \$5 Million from the Yuba Water Agency.

"This is truly an historic project for the North Yuba Water District," said Randy Fletcher, Yuba County Supervisor and Yuba Water Agency Director, "when you consider the Ditch was constructed when Abraham Lincoln was President, these residents are long overdue for a safe, secure way to receive their water."

The Forbestown Ditch has quite a storied past. First called the "Miner's Ditch," the Ditch and the District have changed ownership and names several times, and weathered numerous epic blowouts over its 150 years. Historical photos of the "Miner's Ditch" are on the NYWD website, and an actual segment of an old wooden flume, used to repair a breached segment of the Ditch, is on display at the Forbestown Museum.

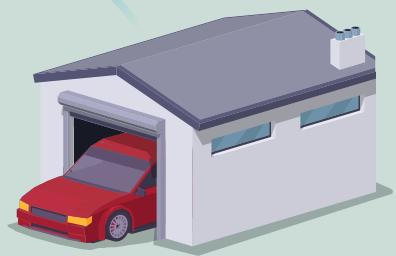

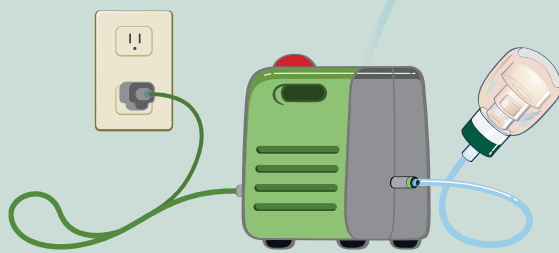

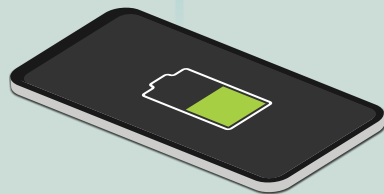
