## Forbestown Daze at the Yuba Feather Museum

Forbestown, Ca.

The first Saturday of August marks the date for the traditional celebration of gold rush history known as Forbestown Daze at the Yuba Feather Museum. Located in the foothills above Oroville, Forbestown is proud of its heritage as the destination for many immigrants from the eastern United States and from foreign lands who came seeking their fortunes among the quartz seams and tall forests of the Sierras in the 1800s.

You may have heard that the Forbestown Advisory Council is not putting on any activities this year in association with Forbestown Daze. However, the Yuba Feather Historical Association is holding its day of "living history" as it always does at the height of summer. We continue to welcome young and old, neighbors, big city folk, and anyone passing through northern California. Come up and find a respite from the heat and a relaxing day of fun in the refreshing air of the foothills.

The day begins with the traditional patriotic raising of our nation's flag at the entrance to the Yuba Feather Museum and the gateway to

Gold Trader Flat. The hoisting of the Stars and Stripes and playing of the Star Spangled Banner will be conducted by Boy Scout Troop 6400 and local Veterans of Foreign Wars George Steiner Post 10135. Then, immerse yourself in the heady days of the Gold Rush. Mingle with costumed docents, lawmen and gun fighters in Gold Trader Flat, an interpretive village lovingly constructed by descendants of the early pioneers as well as more recent transplants. Inside the Museum, curated exhibits display the lives and work of gold rush era residents from the expert basketry of the first peoples to the "green gold" of the lumber industry. This year a new exhibit will bring back happy memories with a display of old time toys. On the boardwalks and along the streets of Gold Trader Flat, visitors can tour the establishments of a typical gold rush town from chapel to saloon and homestead to hotel while listening to the strains of old time music, quenching thirst with ice cold sarsaparilla and filling up with hearty chow.

Check into the lobby of the Liberty Hotel and up the stairs you will find guest rooms

displaying male and female wardrobes of the period. In the quilting room, sit down at the quilting bee loom and put some of your own stitches on the pieced quilt project. Between the guest and quilting rooms, visitors will see a new addition to the hotel – the music room. Lacking the electronics that permeate modern lives, our forefathers depended on their own talents to provide entertainment using their own voices, instruments, and stories. Finer homes of the period had rooms such as this one and learning to play the piano was a common ingredient in a young person's education. Down in Gold Trader Flat visitors will be able to enjoy live performances by local talent.

Jeff Butterworth will be demonstrating gold panning, the enterprise that brought riches to a few and sustenance to many during the Gold Rush. Even today it provides a good excuse to hike around our beautiful mountains and dip your fingers in the refreshingly cool streams. Donna Hankins will be peddling her souvenirs and toys at the mercantile and the bake sale across the boardwalk will be offering our famous cinnamon rolls and

## Injunction Filed to Stop California Ammunition Sales Restriction

On Monday, July 22, CRPA with support of NRA, filed a motion requesting an injunction against enforcement of California's recently implemented ammunition laws. The injunction is part of the case Rhode v. Becerra, filed in April of 2018, where lead Plaintiff and gold medal Olympian shooter Kim Rhode and other Plaintiffs have asked the court to halt enforcement after

a dubious roll out of the new law on July 1st.

The entire system has been shown to be an unconstitutionally excessive burden on law-abiding gun owners with little to no law enforcement value. California ammunition retailers were given little if any guidance from the state explaining the procedures for processing ammunition sales, amounting to mass confusion

throughout the state.

If the court grants the Plaintiffs' request, it will prohibit California from enforcing its ammunition sales restrictions while the Rhode case is fully litigated. A hearing on the Plaintiffs' request is currently scheduled for August 19. A decision is expected sometime thereafter.

## Big Tech Hacks Elections

When it comes to voter fraud and stealing elections democrats certainly have the reputation for it. Dogs and dead people voting, slogans like vote early and vote often, and ballot box stuffing are infamously remembered along with the Chicago Democratic Machine and New York's Tammany Hall.

A collegiate swimmer takes a trip to check on her father during a hurricane in Florida. She outmaneuvers the law in order to accomplish her task. Little does she know of the horror that awaits her....Crawl. There is nothing like the look of hope and excitement on a young child's face as he clutches his own bag of popcorn and climbs the steps of a dimly lit theater. Giant screen flickering behind him as he eats a piece of popcorn right out of the bag without the use of hands, not knowing that in the span of an hour a lifelong phobia of alligators will be cemented into his soul.



The opening of salmon season on local rivers proved to not be as good as expected. Apparently the warm water conditions on the Sacramento had a lot to do with the bite. When the second season opens on August 1st some say it will be more productive. It is a known fact that more salmon will be moving up rivers as the run continues.

Catfish are the way to go at Collins Lake at this time. The stinker the bait the better chance to hook into a big catfish. If you use power bait the fish will also be available, but smaller. Live Oak angler Jerry Freeman caught a nice six pound cat recently at the bridge using beef brains and chicken liver. Kudos Jerry!!

Folks are limiting out on nice sized Kokanee Salmon at Stampede Reservoir. Some spinners and other small lures have been productive. Flashers seem to attract these land locked fish and the best bet is to find the schools in deep water. Angler Dave Quinn, address unknown at this time, went after mackinaw lake trout using a jig while fishing off the dam and landed a dandy 17 pounder. Congrats Dave!!

Englebright Reservoir, above Browns Valley, is having a run on rainbow trout. The fish are holding in 30 to 40

feet of water. Reports tell us drifting night crawlers is working best.

Loon Lake, which is located in El Dorado County, was planted with catchable trout last week and the North Fork of the Feather River near Lake Almanor also received a bunch of trout.

Black Butte Reservoir which is located near Orland is going crazy with the bass bite at this time even though all conditions show poor

fishing. The early morning and late evening hours are the best time with a reminder that if you wish to catch bass start before first light because as soon as the sun hits the water the surface fishing is over until evening. The lake is dropping so much it has exposed the hyacinth plants, which attract the fish.

Closing thought: "We might look good on the outside, but are we really as good on the inside."

## Food and Farm News

### Farmers visit Capitol Hill on behalf of USMCA

Seeking action on a pending trade deal, California farmers and ranchers conduct a "fly-in" to Washington, D.C., Wednesday, to urge congressional ratification of the U.S.-Mexico-Canada Agreement. Farmers will visit the California congressional delegation,

asking members to support the USMCA. Supporters say the agreement would strengthen relations with two key markets for California agricultural exports.

### New methods, law aim to reduce rural crime

Crimes of theft, vandalism and trespassing plague rural California. Farmers and sheriffs deputies use a number of techniques to combat rural crime, combining new technology with tried-and-true information sharing. Recently signed state legislation creates a new crime category--grand theft of agricultural property--and invests fines collected from those crimes into rural crime-prevention programs.

harvests to come 10 days to two weeks later than usual, because of the cooler temperatures. Individual farmers say the crop looks smaller, but the leader of a Fresno-based growers cooperative says he believes the winegrape harvest will ultimately be as large or larger than last year's record crop.

### Controlling weeds would lessen chance of wildfire

Invasive weeds worsen California's wildfire threat, and a University of California specialist says one particular group of weeds--from the genus Bromus--has become a pervasive concern. Cheatgrass and other Bromus species can be found in wide swaths of the state. The grasses can be controlled through livestock grazing, mowing, herbicides and other methods, but have to be tackled at just the right time, before their seeds mature.

have bigger heads and more fat content, bringing a higher price than the dark brown ones. A person could easily down 7 in a sitting. The meat is high in protein and low in fat.

Some use rats in a stew with herbs and vegetables to cure lower backaches. The ladies believe that rat meat contains a high amount of essential amino acids, which aids in skin regeneration for a clearer complexion, thus making them look younger and more beautiful. Rat meat contains a skin supplement!

In the Mekong Delta rodents bring higher prices than chicken. The Delta alone produces up to 3,600 tons of live rats a year, at a value of about \$2 million.

Cooks avoid rats that are sick from ingesting poison by purchasing live rats at market where they can inspect their health. A rat can live up to five days after ingesting an anti-coagulant.

Since rats can carry 60 known diseases that can also affect humans it is important that rodents are well-cooked.

At least 89 rodent species are eaten around the world, from Asia to Africa to South America to the United States, where squirrels have long been a staple.

In California, environmentalists complain that the anticoagulant found in rat poison is showing up in other mammals in the food chain - owls, coyotes and mountain lions throughout the state. Bills are being introduced to ban the use of anticoagulant rodent killers.

Will banning anti-coagulants bring back the plagues of the Middle Ages? Typhus cases are the only rodent borne disease on the rise according to the California Department of Public Health.

Urban rodent populations have flourished since the drought, likely due to winter flooding pushing the rodents to-

ward cities. If they aren't set-back using rodenticides, pest control professionals ask: how long before the state sees a spike in the plague or Hantavirus — deadly diseases that sometimes occur in California?

Of the 73 people who contracted Hantavirus in California since 1993, nearly one out of three died, health officials say.

Rats can be seen everywhere in Vietnam having their way. There were so many earlier this summer outside the CalEPA (Environmental Protection Agency) building in downtown Sacramento that officials closed its outdoor playground out of fear state employees' kids would catch rodent-borne diseases.

Building officials then set out the controversial rat poison that soon may be banned by the California Legislature. The poison didn't last long once the word spread that the state's top environmental regulators were using a poison widely condemned by California's powerful environmental groups.

Permitting rodents to live may open up a new industry of trapping, selling and consuming rat meat. Meanwhile, Typhus may not kill you but the symptoms may make you wish you were dead.



## Capitalism best for America

Famous investor Warren Buffet, in a recent article New York Times articles entitled: "Warren Buffett's Case for Capitalism", claims a capitalistic society is the best system for America. "I'm a card carrying capitalist" said Buffett.

In recent years, capitalism at least in some circles has been blamed for income inequality, the rise of excessive corporate greed and the plight of the American worker.

On the surface, the negatives to our capitalistic system seem valid. The average worker is finding it harder and harder to make ends meet as the stock market hits all-time highs. The polarization of the two seems clear and it's easy to draw the cause and effect conclusion that one has led to the other.

That would hold true if our system was truly capitalistic. And although the American economy does retain some aspects of a capitalistic system sadly, many of the most important checks and balances of capitalism have been removed or compromised by meddling governments over the decades.

Those hating on capitalism largely get their information from the many news media outlets, most of which also don't understand capitalism and hence don't report on the important aspects that are missing in today's America. Without such education and hence media exposure, Americans are left to only misinformation about their economy, and hence push unknowingly to destroy it.

Capitalism is not synonymous with corporation greed and income inequality. In fact, capitalism will correct most of both corporate greed and income inequality as well as many of the other negatives we see in today's American economy.

To begin to understand these concepts, know that at its roots, capitalism is nothing more than someone going to the store and buying something with their own money at the price they find acceptable and from someone who is willing to sell that something for a price that is acceptable to them.

Everything else the economy functions on are just offshoots of this basic premise. Some of the basic concepts of capitalism include free choice, the right to private property, the right to work and the right to negotiation. Sounds logical, and it is.

Left alone capitalism allows for and protects

these basic premises. Start tweaking capitalism and distortions arise. Think of a tire that is perfectly round and each tweak of capitalism adds a lump in the tire. The tire now starts to wobble and its efficiency wanes. The more you tweak it (add more lumps) the worse it rolls.

Such is the result of the interference in capitalism, which is usually caused by a central government.

Capitalism isn't perfect. No system is. But it is the best system. All others are worse, and some economically fatal.

But in the imperfection that mankind and our world is by nature, some think they can improve on this reality.

Of all the imperfections that is our physical world, the economic reality with the most effect is economic truth known as scarcity.

Simply put, there is not enough to go around for everyone to have everything they want. That some won't accept this fact is delusional. It's a fact, and no amount of hoping, wishing or economic manipulation will change that fact.

Enter Capitalism, the most efficient method for distributing the inherent scarcity of goods. It's not a perfect system, but it's proven to be the best there is. A perfect system would have to eliminate the reality of scarcity, but scarcity is an economic fact and it cannot be eliminated.

To accomplish the distribution of scarcity in the fairest way possible, free will must be maintained. Only the voluntary construction of goods for an agreeable exchange allows the continuance of the economy.

Introduce mandate or remove incentive and the system eventually collapses. Incentive is simply the reason people work and hence produce. Remove the incentive and forced labor by some means is the only alternative. Either that or starvation, neither of which is an improvement over scarcity. Scarcity isn't perfect, nor is it always comfortable, but it is a fact. There will always be scarcity. And instigating any system that removes incentive will lead to more scarcity. For without incentive, some will not work, and hence not produce.

Capitalism maintains incentive at its highest and therefore allows for the most production of goods and services, which minimizes scarcity the most over other economic systems.

It's the best we have.

Specifically, in capitalism, excessive profits are throttled by competition (without cost to entry which is usually increased by government), and although owners will always make more than workers (there's that incentive we talked about to start a business) in-

come inequality is reasonable by maintaining sound money where as unsound money (inflation) which increases income inequality, is brought about by government.

Reasonable employment opportunity is maintained by the healthy economy brought about by the previous two mentions and maintained by incentive (if though shall not work, thou shall not eat). Again we find government at contributory fault as government has a tendency to remove incentive through taxation and entitlement programs (free money). Criminality is punished in a capitalistic system unlike today where our lobby system and the big money get-out-of-jail card is fostered by and encouraged by government and their cronies.

The few holes in the capitalistic system (environmental and monopolies) can be easily monitored by a minimal (MINIMAL mind you) central government.

Capitalism is not a perfect system, but it's the best we have.

Its premise is liberty, which is free will and the right to perform, or not perform, as the choice may be.

You have the right to do what you want, as long as it doesn't infringe on the rights of another. Pretty simple stuff. All the other systems they're proposing are merely pipedreams.

Not surprising considering what they're allowed to smoke nowadays.

## Youth in Ag. 40 Years Serving Our Youth

In 1969, after the owner of Feather River Mills and the owner of Smidgeon Ranch in Loma Rica bought several animals at the Yuba Sutter Fair because no one would bid on them, the two—Robert Rodgers and Ken Freeman discussed ways to help those Youth in 4-H and FFA who did not have great names and thus, received very low prices.

The problem is that well known families youth receive enormous sums as businesses try to buy the favors of the wealth families, while minority youth or less known youth are lucky to get an opening bid for their project.

Thus, Youth in Ag was formed to address this low price issue. Both Rodgers and Freeman understood the value of the 4-H and FFA programs in the lives of these youth and in creating our future leaders, so wanted to help keep these youth active in these programs.

Mr. Rodgers donated two beef calves and Feather River Mills grew and fattened those animals until time to create a fund to assist those

youth receiving low prices at the Fair. Raffle tickets were created and sold to win 1/2 of beef cut and wrapped and ready to BBQ. Over \$2500 was raised to start the non profit Youth in Ag. It was originally entitled Youth Beef Project but quickly changed to help all youth.

Since 1979, over \$500,000 has been raised and distributed to 1,000's of our Youth in the Yuba Sutter area. In 2018, over 50 youth received over \$15,000 and another \$9,000 was awarded to 4-H and FFA programs to assist their youth in preparation for success, including facility repairs, trailer repairs, etc.

After each Jr. Livestock auction is complete, the committee takes the final Fair livestock results that includes the prices received and any add on funds, then determines what the committee feels is a fair price for each Youth based on break even and at least some profit to help the Youth stay in the 4-H and FFA program. Then, checks are sent to all youth falling below this level. In

addition, in many years the extreme heat has caused some animals to die just prior to or during the fair so YIA tries to send support funds to these youth as well to help them start a new project next year.

Donations are sought throughout the year and a booth is set up to take donations at the Livestock Auction. In 2018, Mike Rue of Rue and Forsman Ranch and Catlett Warehouse became our all time Number 1 donor. Thanks to Mike and Patricia as well as all the many donors helping our youth since 1979.

bias. Big Tech is an assembly of private corporations and have a right to be biased you say. True, but Congress granted them immunity from liability lawsuits because they all promise that their mission is to be a neutral public forum.

The Communications Decency Act Section 230 protects these companies from liability for illegal content posted by third parties. The largest and most powerful Internet media companies today have hundreds of thousands of employees. And they have enormous resources and advanced algorithms they can use to moderate content.

Though Big Tech representatives all claim neutrality with straight faces, the evidence is overwhelming that they are completely biased - liberal, pro-abortion, anti-Christian, anti-Trump, anti-law enforcement and anti-military, anti-capitalist and so on.

Who does Big Tech hire? Mainly liberals. Donor records reveal

Google employees gave \$1.315 million to Hillary and nothing to Trump in 2016. And the number one corporate donor to Hillary was Alphabet, parent company to Google. Big Tech's hiring is their business but they aren't a neutral Internet platform.

Dr. Robert Epstein, is an American psychologist, professor, author, and journalist. He earned his Ph.D. in psychology at Harvard University in 1981, was editor in chief of Psychology Today, a visiting scholar at the University of California, San Diego, and the founder and director emeritus of the Cambridge Center for Behavioral Studies in Concord, MA.

Epstein told Senator Ted Cruz at the hearing that he was an outspoken supporter for Clinton and is a hard-core liberal. However, Epstein says he believes in free and fair elections over a candidate or party.

Epstein is an expert on Big Tech's methodology. He believes Big Tech

intends to influence the decision-making of its users and will "hack" the 2020 election. They will utilize the search engine manipulation effect, the search suggestion effect, and the answer bot effect. It is "non-competitive manipulation," says the professor.

He testified that Google influenced a minimum of 2.6 million to 10.4 million votes for Clinton in 2016. With no big tech manipulation, Trump easily wins the popular vote as well. Epstein further suggested Big Tech was overconfident in 2016 thinking Trump had no chance, but did much better for democrats in 2018.

Twenty million votes could be affected using Google's search engine bias according to Epstein and that's just Google, the most powerful business in the world. While liberals claimed that Russians meddled in the 2016 election that was a diversion. The real election hackers are their lefty friends at Big Tech.

## Democrats Get SLAPP'd

the CRP and the firm that managed the recall petitions alleging that somehow voters who signed the recall petition were fooled into thinking they were signing a petition for the repeal of the gas tax.

The allegations in the complaint were silly on their face. Recall petitions are clearly identified as such and even include a prominent statement from the official who is being recalled. Only someone completely oblivious would fail to understand what they were signing.

It was abundantly clear from the outset that the lawsuit was not about remedying any real harm. It was about punishing those who challenge the all-powerful Democratic establishment in California and chilling any future recall efforts by forcing those who exercise their right to recall to pay large amounts of legal fees.

Lawsuits such as these are called SLAPP actions — which is an acronym that stands for strategic litigation against public participation. They are intended to censor, intimidate and silence critics by burdening them with the cost of a legal defense until they abandon their criticism or opposition.

But filing SLAPP lawsuits against an individual or organization for engaging in protected political activity is a dangerous thing. California, like many states, has an anti-SLAPP statute de-

signed to stop such frivolous legal action dead in its tracks.

Because the Democrats' complaint sought to punish First Amendment activities such as petition circulating and speaking to voters, HJTA filed a special motion to strike the complaint under the anti-SLAPP statute. While the trial judge initially ruled for HJTA in his tentative ruling, he reversed himself to permit the plaintiffs to add a claim for "intentional infliction of emotional distress."

Again, seeking to resolve SLAPP litigation quickly, the statute provides that a denial of an anti-SLAPP motion is immediately appealable.

Last week, the Court of Appeal issued its decision reversing the trial court and directing the lower court to grant the anti-SLAPP motion and dismiss the case. In a succinct ruling, the court stated that HJTA "is entitled to the grant of its special motion to strike because Plaintiffs' lawsuit arose out of Jarvis's protected petitioning activity, and Plaintiffs failed to meet their burden to establish a probability of prevailing on their fraud claim."

We hope that the outcome of this litigation serves as a wake-up call to the majority party in California. They may have virtually carte blanche political power, but they can't silence either our voices or our constitutional rights.

## (Beware of this gang culture sprouting in our neighborhoods) MS-13 Gang Members Charged with Machete Murders in Angeles National Forest

LOS ANGELES (CBSLA) – Nearly two dozen Mara Salvatrucha (MS-13) gang members who operate in the San Fernando Valley have been charged with a series of ruthless murders, some of which involved hacking people to death with machetes in the Angeles National Forest.

The 22 suspects were indicted by a grand jury in mid-July on charges of committing and/or coordinating the murders of seven people over the past two years, according to a federal RICO indictment unsealed Monday.

Federal prosecutors allege the MS-13 gang leaders and members who committed the murders were part of a subgroup known as the Fulton Clique, which operates out of the San Fernando Valley and recruited several recent Central American immigrants.

"The majority of the gang in Fulton is mostly teenagers," **one teen, who asked to remain anonymous, told CBS2.** "Sometimes, it gets heated in the streets. It gets crazy, like you hear gunshots all night. It's where most of the things happen."

The suspects murdered rival gang members and those were they believed were informers, the Justice Department reports. One of the victims was 15-years-old, the indictment reads. Another was a homeless man who was shot and killed in January while he slept at a rec center in North Hollywood, an area controlled by MS-13.

In one case, a rival gang member was dismembered and his heart was carved out, U.S. District Attorney Nick Hanna said in a news conference.

"The rival gang member was abducted, choked, and driven to a remote location in the Angeles National Forest, where six defendants hacked him to death with a machete," Hanna said. "The victim was dismembered and one of the defendants allegedly carved out his heart before throwing the body parts into a canyon."

In total, MS-13 is believed to have murdered 24 people in the L.A. metro area over the past two years, federal prosecutors say.

"This investigation has been an unqualified success," Hanna said in a

statement. "The collaborative law enforcement effort solved several murder cases and dealt a severe blow to members of the gang who engaged in acts of brutality not seen in the region for over 20 years."

### 50 Raids Nab 44

The 50 pre-dawn raids, aimed at catching suspects asleep or off guard, also focused on nabbing members of MS-13's core leadership, the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives (ATF) said.

"Today we disrupted this gang's command and control," said Eric Harden, special agent in charge of the ATF's Los Angeles field division.

Los Angeles is the US base for MS-13, which has tens of thousands of members worldwide. Authorities count the gang among the largest criminal organizations in the US.

Authorities carried out the largest crackdown of MS-13 members in Los Angeles history. They also found suspected human trafficking victims of the gang.

More than half of the 44 people arrested Wednesday are undocumented immigrants, acting US Attorney Sandra Brown said.

But the raids aimed to curb violent crime -- not immigration violations, Los Angeles Police Chief Charlie Beck said. He said MS-13 often "preys on" undocumented immigrants.

The suspects face a wide range of charges, including federal racketeering, narcotics conspiracy and homicide. If convicted, Brown said, most of those arrested Wednesday could face decades in federal prison -- and three could face the death penalty.

About 1,000 officers from the ATF, the FBI, the Drug Enforcement Administration, US Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE), the Los Angeles Police Department and the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department took part worked on the massive effort.

And they had to execute their plan in the dark of night.

### What is MS-13?

"We believe the most impact is made by targeting the mid- to upper-level hierarchy of the gang and removing them," Harden said.

"Once removed, it causes a disorganization of the gang, where it suppresses their activity for an extensive amount of time until another leader is developed or steps up."

MS-13 makes money from extortions, kidnappings, drug and weapons trafficking and human trafficking, the ATF said. Killings for the protection of the gang are common, federal authorities say, and sometimes are carried out with machetes.

Harden has faced off with MS-13 for decades, dating back to his days as a street agent.

"They've been here since the '80s and have thrived to this date," said Harden. "They're a transnational or international gang. Their level of brutality is extreme and high, similar to what we read about and hear with the drug-trafficking cartels in Mexico."

### Gang Has Become International

MS-13 began in Los Angeles in the 1980s, when El Salvadorians flooded into the United States. Its offshoot in Central America took hold when many of its members were deported.

MS-13 gang members indicted in brutal deaths of high school students

The gang counts about 30,000 members worldwide and more than 10,000 in the United States -- a number that has held steady for some years but one that officials believe is trending upward, the Justice Department said.

MS-13 is active in 40 US states, plus the District of Columbia.

The gang is known for forcing new members to endure a 13-second beating known as "jumping in," authorities say. Members beat the new member with fists and bats in videotaped beatings often lasting far longer than the touted 13 seconds. Women who join the gang either jump in or are "sexed in," having sexual relations with MS-13 members.

In the same mid-July timeline, officials said U.S. Immigration and Customs and Enforcement had arrested 1,378 people during a six-week, nationwide sweep targeting gangs — which included 104 people authorities said were affiliated with MS-13.


